



Subject was released from prison in 1969, after having served 18 years of a 30 year sentence for conspiracy to commit espionage in behalf of the USSR. He has never cooperated with the United States Government. Since his release from prison, his activity has been limited by the terms of his conditional release, however, he has given evidence of retaining a strong sympathy for the communist movement. It is believed that in time of national emergency, he would represent a threat to the United States, and is therefore being retained in Category III of ADEX.





28 U.S.e. §1331(a); and 5 U.S.C. §701 et seq. to compel defendants respondents to permit Morton Sobell to inspect Exhibits 1-10 introduced in evidence against him by the United States Government in United States v. Rosenberg, et al., C. 134-245. Jurisdiction is conferred upon this Court by 28 U.S.C. §1361; 28 U.S.C. §1331(a), there being rights in controversy valued at more than \$10,000, exclusive of interest and costs; and 5 U.S.C. §701 et seq. (The Administrative Procedure Act).

Parties

2. Plaintiff-Petitioner, MORTON SOBELL, a co-defendant in <u>United States v. Rosenberg</u>, <u>supra</u>, was sentenced, on April 5, 1951, to 30 years in prison for conspiring to transmit national defense information to the Soviet Union between 1944-1950. He was mandatorily released from prison on January 14, 1969, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §4161, and, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 4161, he will remain subject to the jurisidction of the United States Parole Board until September 26, 1980.

3a. Defendant-respondent, WILLIAM B. SAXBE, is the Attorney General of the United States and, upon information and belief, is generally responsible for the custody and control of the exhibits introduced into evidence by the United States Government against the defendants in <u>United States</u> v. <u>Rosenberg</u>, et al.

3b. Defendant-respondents, PAUL J. CURRAN and SILVIO

J. MOLLO, are the United States Attorney and Chief Assistant

3c. Defendant-respondent, RAYMOND BURGHARDT, is the Clerk of the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York and, upon information and belief, is generally responsible for the custody and control of the exhibits introduced into evidence by the United States Government against the defendants in United States v. Rosenberg, et al.

THE INCIDENTS AT ISSUE Plaintiff-petitioner has, within the past year, on numerous occasions, requested defendants-respondents to make available to him for inspection Exhibits 1-10 introduced into evidence against him by the United States Government in United States v. Rosenberg, et al. 5. When plaintiff-petitioner's imitial attempts to gain access to the Exhibits in question failed, counsel agreed to correspond with defendants-respondents in the hope of resolving the problem without resort to litigation. 6. Accordingly, on or about January 17, 1974, counsel wrote to defendant-respondent MOLLO, requesting permission for plaintiff-petitioner to examine and reproduce portions of the exhibits in question. A copy of said letter is annexed hereto as Exhibit I. Unfortunately, defendant-respondent MOLLO did not respond to counsel's letter. 7. On or about March 1, 1974, coursel, once again, wrote to defendant-respondent MOLLO, requesting permission for plaintiffpetitioner to examine and reproduce portions of the exhibits in question. A copy of said letter is annexed Hereto as Exhibit II. Unfortunately, defendant-respondent MOLLO, once again, failed to respond to counsel's letter. On Friday, March 22, 1974, coursel telephoned defendent-respondent MOLLO's office and demanded that Mr. Mollo respond to counsel's inquiries. On Monday, March 25, 1974, counsel was informed, in a telephone conversation with Mr. Mollo, that the exhibits in the Rosenberg case could not be found. When counsel

expressed incredulity that the records of perhaps the most notorious criminal prosecution in recent years could become lost, Mr. Mollo reiterated that the records were not available. Counsel, thereupon, requested Mr. Mollo to inform him of the nature of the search which had been made and to inform him of the steps which would be taken to find the "lost" Rosenberg exhibits. Mr. Mollo declined to do so. 10. Accordingly, plaintiff-petitioner is compelled to . seek judicial assistance in seeking the right to examine the Government exhibits which caused him to be sentenced to 30 years in prison. CAUSES OF ACTION 11. Defendants-respondents' refusal to permit petitione plaintiff an opportunity to inspect the exhibits introduced against him at trial constitutes a failure to perform a duty owed to plaintiff-petitioner under the Fifth and Sixth Amendments to the Constitution of the United States. WHEREFORE, plaintiff-petitioner respectfully prays that this Court issue an order in the nature of a mandamus directing defendants-respondents to make Exhibits 1-10 introduced into evidence by the Government in United States v. Rosenberg, et al., available for plaintiff-petitioners' inspection forthwith. 






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

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Morton Sobell, who was convicted along with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg in 1951 on espionage charges, appeared on the "Today" show this morning. Sobell was interviewed by NBC commentators Barbara Walters and Jim Hart concerning Sobell's new book entitled "On Doing Time."

Hart began the interview by noting that Sobell had received a 30-year prison sentence, had served 18 years of the sentence, and was released about five years ago. Sobell recounted his relationship with the Rosenbergs at the City College of New York in the 1930s. He said he was brought into the case because he was a friend of the Rosenbergs and because he had been associated with the Communist Party.

Sobell, in attempting to explain his conviction, said the Government was looking for an explanation as to why the Soviets had obtained atomic bomb secrets and said he and the Rosenbergs were the scapegoats. "The Rosenbergs and I were absolutely innocent of any type of espionage," Sobell stated. He added, however, that there was no way of showing that they were positively innocent because the strength of the Government's case rested on David Greenglass' testimony. Sobell said he did not take the stand in his own defense because his lawyer would not let him. Sobell said he was not bitter about his conviction.

Sobell discussed his years in Alcatraz Penitentiary and said he maintained his same carrying on his fight for release.

There was no mention of the BI during the interview. — 775
Sobell appeared to be more interested in promoting his book than in discussing the facts of his case.

On May 28, 1975, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Morton Sobell had received authority from the United States Board of Parole, to travel from New York, New York, to Paris, France.

According to source, Sobell indicated that he will depart from New York City, on May 30, 1975, accompanied by his wife, Helen Sobell, and will travel via Trans World Airlines Flight Number 800. His departure will be from John F. Kennedy International Airport, New York City, to Paris, France. He is scheduled to return from Paris to New York City, via Trans World Airlines Flight Number not yet ascertained. Sobell indicated his date of return was not certain, but would probably be on June 8, 1975.

Source advised that the purpose of subject's trip is to appear on a French national television program to discuss the Rosenberg case, and to promote the sale of a book recently written by Sobell entitled "On Doing Time".

Morton Sobell was convicted on March 29, 1951, in United States District Court, Southern District of New' York, for conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and was sentenced on April 5, 1951, to thirty years imprisonment. He was conditionally released from Lewisburg Federal Prison, on January 14, 1969, and remains under the supervision of the United States Probation Office, Southern District of New York, until May 14, 1981.



This is in further response to your pending administrative appeals under the Freedom of Information Act from the manner in which your request for access to the complete file on the case of Morton Sobell was handled by Director Kelley of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and from his failure to respond separately to the undated letter of Helen Sobell joining in Morton Sobell's request for records "as they pertain to me and my relationship with my husband." This letter is in response to the letters from both of you dated April 28, 1975.

After careful consideration of your appeals, I have decided to affirm the action of Director Kelley in this case. I have, however, requested him to ensure that future communications from the Bureau pertaining to your requests are addressed to both of you.

The files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation pertaining to the Sobell case are part of and inextricably interrelated with other pertions of its files on the Rosenberg case. As Director Kelley advised you, these omnibus files are voluminous, extending to some 44 sections of records, each containing an estimated 150-200 pages. There are, in addition, approximately 4,000 other sections of files containing references to specific individuals whe are themselves part of or related to the Rosenberg case. The process of reviewing these records has begun and dean advised that the first five sections of the Rosenberg files have been reviewed to date. All material which Theory 1975 exempt under the Act is to be released. Furthermore, as I have advised other requesters for this same material, the

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final decision whether er not actually to withhold records in this case will be made consistently with the spirit of the Department's Policy Regarding Investigatory Records of Historical Interest [28 C.F.R. 50.8]. Although the "letter" of this provision has been evertaken in many respects by the recent amendments to the Freedom of Information Act, its policy of encouraging maximum discretionary release of such records remains the policy of the Department of Justice.

You will be advised by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, at intervals of not more than 30 days, of
the progress being made in its processing of the Rosenberg
files. As soon as possible, records within the scope of
your particular requests will begin to be released to you.
This process will continue as additional such documents
become available.

Under the present circumstances of this case, I consider that any final decision on the merits of these appeals would be premature. I have directed that these appeals are to be maintained in an open status so that you may make any further challenge that you consider appropriate to either the pace or results of the records review. are entitled to consider this response as a denial of your appeals, should you desire to do so, and to seek judicial review of my decision. Such review is available to you in the United States District Court for the judicial district in which you both reside, or in which you have your principal place(s) of business, or in the District of Columbia which is where the records you seek are located. I hope that you will take into consideration the magnitude of the problem confeonting the F.B.I. in processing this request. As you may be aware, the recent amendments to the Act do permit a court to allow an agency additional time to complete its review of requested records "if the Government can show exceptional circumstances exist and that the agency is exercising due diligence in responding to the request

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
