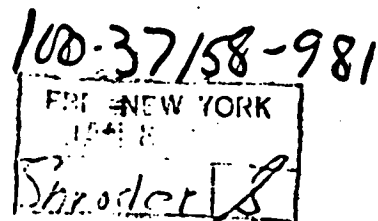

On Jan. 6, 1951 BENJAMIN ZUCKERMAN
appeared at this office and requested to
speak with the writer. He was inter-
viewed by the writer and SA JAMES
P. LEE.

Zuckerman stated he is presently employed
by the Watson Laboratories in New Jersey, but
that in the near future, Watson is moving
their plant to Rome, N.Y. He does not desire
to leave N.Y.C. so approximately 8 months ago,
when he heard of the contemplated change, he
applied for a position with the U.S. Signal
Corps, Fort Monmouth N.J. at that time
officials at Fort Monmouth told him he had
the necessary clearance and that the job was
waiting for him.

approximately a month ago
he accepted for the position
at Fort Monmouth.



but was informed by the commanding officer that there was some question raised concerning his clearance to handle classified government contracts. Tuckerman was told that rather than wait for an investigation to clear or prove the allegations against ^{himself} the position at Ft. Monmouth would be filled by another engineer. According to Tuckerman, no explanation was made as to why he had clearance 8 months ago, but not at the present time.

Tuckerman stated he felt this situation was promulgated by his association with MORTON SOBELL, and his admitting this association to the F. B. I.

He asked the interviewing agents if ~~he~~ advised the security officers at Watson & the Signal Corps office associations with SOBELL & if so, what was the nature of the allegations. He also said that he is considering applying for another position, with a friend who operates a contracting firm classified contracts & does not to be embarrased by being refused this job on security grounds.

He also wanted to know if we would
interview for him, by speaking to the
security officer at Watson and explaining
the situation as it exists.

Zuckerman was informed of the Bureau's
participation in security clearances and
that it would be impossible for us the
F.B.I. to interview for him in this matter.

SA Rex I. Shroder was telephonically advised of the above and stated he would have information concerning ZUCKERMAN available for ASAC Whelan first thing Thursday AM.

Re memorandum concerning information received from Colonel Sommers, OSI, on 1/10/51.

BENJAMIN ZUCKERMAN is an engineer employed at the Watson Laboratories, Red Bank, N. J. He was first interviewed by agents of this office when it was learned he was a classmate of MORTON SOBELL'S at CCNY and also that he had lived with SOBELL for a short period in Washington, D.C. Subsequent investigation disclosed that SOBELL had been an overnight guest at his home in New Jersey. ZUCKERMAN is also closely associated with one AARON NOVIKOFF, a known member of the Communist Party.

ZUCKERMAN has denied any affiliation with the Communist Party or front groups, but admitted infrequent association with SOBELL.

ZUCKERMAN has been informed by the Security Officer at Evans Signal Laboratory (where he is attempting to obtain a position) that there is some doubt as to his clearance to handle classified information. He felt this was due to his association with SOBELL and wanted the FBI to intercede for him and clarify the situation. The Bureau's policy in these matters was discussed with ZUCKERMAN.

No information has been developed indicating ZUCKERMAN is a member of the ROSENBERG network. We are not contemplating any investigation on ZUCKERMAN and any investigation conducted by OSI would not interfere or compromise our case in any manner.

It is requested that OSI furnish any information they develop concerning their investigation of ZUCKERMAN.

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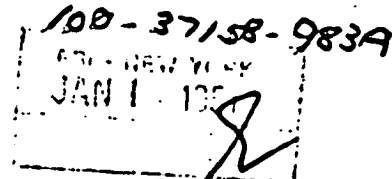

On November 29, 1950, GERTRUDE SUSSMAN, wife of NATHAN SUSSMAN, was interviewed at her home, 56-55 205th Street, Bayside, Long Island, by SAs JAMES T. O'BRIEN and CHARLES P. SILVERTHORN.

Concerning NATHAN SUSSMAN, DAVID GREENGLASS, who is awaiting to be sentenced after pleading guilty to espionage, has advised that NATHAN SUSSMAN was in periodic contact with JULIUS ROSENBERG from 1938 until some time in 1947. GREENGLASS also advised that NATHAN SUSSMAN was a member of the Steinmetz Hall Branch of the Young Communist League at the City College of New York.

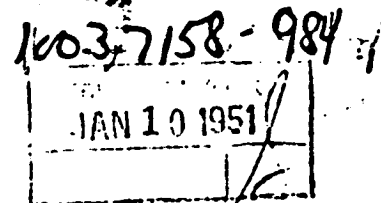
Concerning ROSENBERG, agents of the New York Office on July 17, 1950, arrested ROSENBERG. On August 17, 1950, JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife, ETHEL ROSENBERG, were indicted by the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York on a charge of conspiracy to commit espionage.

As set forth in the report of SA BERT S. TAYLOR entitled, "NATHAN SUSSMAN, was; ESPIONAGE - R," dated October 20, 1950, ND 301 on March 3, 1947, advised that NATHAN SUSSMAN and his wife, GERTRUDE SUSSMAN, of 43-09 47th Avenue, Queens, Long Island, were members of the Sunnyside Section of the Communist Party for the year 1946.

Under the caption "MORTON SOBELL, was; ESPIONAGE - R," Bureau permission was requested and was received to simultaneously but separately

interview NATHAN SUSSMAN and his wife, GERTRUDE SUSSMAN.

While NATHAN SUSSMAN was being interviewed at his place of employment, the Fairchild Aviation Corporation, Farmingdale, Long Island, on November 29, 1950, by SAS REX I. SCHROEDER and BERT S. TAYLOR, GERTRUDE SUSSMAN was being interviewed at her home.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN advised she met her husband, NATHAN, in 1942 while both were riding in a car pool while employed at Western Electric in New Jersey. She stated that ALFRED SARANT and JOEL BARR were also in the same car pool. She and her husband used to visit ALFRED SARANT and JOEL BARR in their apartment at 65 Morton Street in Greenwich Village, New York City. She met JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG through her husband, NATHAN, and she indicated that she and her husband often visited the ROSENBERGS in their apartment at 10 Monroe Street in Knickerbocker Village, New York City, both before and after her marriage to NATHAN SUSSMAN. She indicated she married NATHAN SUSSMAN in December 1943.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN was vague as to the number of visits with the ROSENBERGS and the approximate dates of these visits. She indicated that she and her husband stopped seeing the ROSENBERGS about 1947. She stated that she and her husband were shocked by the arrest of JULIUS ROSENBERG, and although she knew ROSENBERG was a Communist, she did not think he would engage in espionage.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN also identified ALFRED SARANT and JOEL BARR as being Communists.

In addition to BARR and SARANT being present at ROSENBERG'S home on the occasion of their visits, GERTRUDE SUSSMAN stated that a MORRIS SAVITSKY also visits the ROSENBERGS. She identified SAVITSKY as an engineer and a person who lived in a project in Brooklyn and who was employed at the Brooklyn Navy Yard at that time. She could not state definitely if SAVITSKY was a Communist, but remarked that since all of the rest of the individuals were Communists, he must have been also.

She also indicated a person by the name of GENE MARKAVI (phonetic) was also present at the ROSENBERG home when the SUSSMANS were there. She identified MARKAVI as a person living on the East Side who was not an engineer but who worked in a personnel department for the Government. She did not know what branch of the Government

this person worked for.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN identified photographs of the following individuals:

JULIUS ROSENBERG
ALFRED SARANT
JOEL BARR.

She specifically denied knowing MORTON SOBELL, VIVIAN GLASMAN, WILLIAM PERL, MIKE and ARI SIDOROVITCH, MAX ELITCHER and WILLIAM DANEIGER.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN volunteered the information that, while she was attending Brooklyn College, she was a member of the American Student Union. She mentioned that it was a popular idea in the 30's and 40's to be sympathetic towards Communism, and, therefore, she had been active in leftist activities while in college as most of the other students were at that time.

She stated that after she was married in approximately 1944 or 1945 she took some graduate work at Columbia University. She remarked that she had taken a course in sociology, and that she had written a paper for her sociology class, which paper was entitled, "The Communist Party." She advised that in order to get material for this paper she joined the Communist Party. She indicated that she resided at 43-09 47th Avenue, Sunnyside, Long Island, at the time she joined the Communist Party.

She volunteered the information that she attended Communist Party meetings for about six months, and that she had taken her husband, NATHAN, to several of these meetings. She stated that after she had compiled enough material for her paper she resigned from the Communist Party.

She also mentioned that her husband in addition to being a member of the Communist Party at this time had also been a member of the Young Communist League while a student at the City College of New York.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN was vague as to the number of times and the dates on which she visited JOEL BARR and ALFRED SARANT in their apartment in Greenwich Village.

In accordance with Bureau instructions, the interview with GERTRUDE SUSSMAN was conducted from the standpoint of NATHAN SUSSMAN, her husband, having been a classmate of MORTON SOBELL at the City College of New York. She was not questioned closely concerning her own Communist Party activities or Communist Party activity on the part of her husband, and the information that she did furnish in this regard was furnished voluntarily on her own part.

Concerning GENE HARKAVI (phonetic), HARKAVI appeared to be identical with the subject of New York case file 121-616, entitled, "EUGENE HARKAVY, aka: Eugene Harkovy, Classifier, War Assets Administration, Washington, D. C.; LOYALTY OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES." A review of this file indicates that HARKAVI attended City College of New York and was graduated in June of 1939 with an M.S. Degree in Education.

It is to be noted that whereas subjects in the JULIUS ROSENBERG network were graduates of the Electrical Engineering Course at City College of New York, HARKAVY received his degree in Education. GERTRUDE SUSSMAN mentioned that the GENE HARKAVI she knew was a person who was not an engineer.

A review of the HARKAVY loyalty file indicates that he resided at 10 Monroe Street from 1934 until 1939 with his father and mother. It is also to be noted that JULIUS ROSENBERG has continuously resided at 10 Monroe Street, New York City.

By letter dated December 9, 1950, the New York Office advised the Bureau under the caption "EUGENE HARKAVI, aka: Eugene Harkovy, Classifier, War Assets Administration, Washington, D. C.; LOYALTY OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES," of the information furnished by GERTRUDE SUSSMAN concerning GENE HARKAVI (phonetic).

It is to be noted that during the interview of NATHAN SUSSMAN by Bureau Agents, he was not too cooperative. He volunteered no information beyond specific questions asked of him, and in many instances he would not definitely commit himself by stating that he knew an individual but usually prefaced the remark with "I might have."

Concerning ROSENBERG, agents of the New York Office on July 17, 1950, arrested ROSENBERG. On August 17, 1950, JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife, ETHEL ROSENBERG, were indicted by the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York on a charge of conspiracy to commit espionage.

As set forth in the report of SA BERT S. TAYLOR entitled, "NATHAN SUSSMAN, was; ESPIONAGE - R," dated October 20, 1950, ND 301 on March 3, 1947, advised that NATHAN SUSSMAN and his wife, GETRUDE SUSSMAN, of 43-37 47th Avenue, Queens, Long Island, were members of the Sunnyside Section of the Communist Party for the year 1946.

Under the caption "MORTON SOBELL, was; ESPIONAGE - R," Bureau permission was requested and was received to simultaneously but separately

interview NATHAN SUSSMAN and his wife, GERTRUDE SUSSMAN.

While NATHAN SUSSMAN was being interviewed at his place of employment, the Fairchild Aviation Corporation, Farmingdale, Long Island, on November 29, 1950, by SAS REX I. SCHROEDER and BERT S. TAYLOR, GERTRUDE SUSSMAN was being interviewed at her home.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN advised she met her husband, NATHAN, in 1942 while both were riding in a car pool while employed at Western Electric in New Jersey. She stated that ALFRED SARANT and JOEL BARR were also in the same car pool. She and her husband used to visit ALFRED SARANT and JOEL BARR in their apartment at 65 Morton Street in Greenwich Village, New York City. She met JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG through her husband, NATHAN, and she indicated that she and her husband often visited the ROSENBERGS in their apartment at 10 Monroe Street in Knickerbocker Village, New York City, both before and after her marriage to NATHAN SUSSMAN. She indicated she married NATHAN SUSSMAN in December 1943.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN was vague as to the number of visits with the ROSENBERGS and the approximate dates of these visits. She indicated that she and her husband stopped seeing the ROSENBERGS about 1947. She stated that she and her husband were shocked by the arrest of JULIUS ROSENBERG, and although she knew ROSENBERG was a Communist, she did not think he would engage in espionage.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN also identified ALFRED SARANT and JOEL BARR as being Communists.

In addition to BARR and SARANT being present at ROSENBERG'S home on the occasion of their visits, GERTRUDE SUSSMAN stated that a MORRIS SAVITSKY also visits the ROSENBERGS. She identified SAVITSKY as an engineer and a person who lived in a project in Brooklyn and who was employed at the Brooklyn Navy Yard at that time. She could not state definitely if SAVITSKY was a Communist, but remarked that since all of the rest of the individuals were Communists, he must have been also.

She also indicated a person by the name of GENE HARKAVI (phonetic) was also present at the ROSENBERG home when the SUSSMANS were there. She identified HARKAVI as a person living on the East Side who was not an engineer but who worked in a personnel department for the Government. She did not know what branch of the Government.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN identified photographs of the following individuals:

JULIUS ROSENBERG
ALFRED SARANT
JOEL BARR.

She specifically denied knowing MORTON SCHELL, VIVIAN GLASSMAN, WILLIAM PERL, MIKE and ARIE SIDOROVITCH, MAX BLITCHER and WILLIAM DANETGER.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN volunteered the information that, while she was attending Brooklyn College, she was a member of the American Student Union. She mentioned that it was a popular idea in the 30's and 40's to be sympathetic towards Communism, and, therefore, she had been active in leftist activities while in college as most of the other students were at that time.

She stated that after she was married in approximately 1944 or 1945 she took some graduate work at Columbia University. She remarked that she had taken a course in sociology, and that she had written a paper for her sociology class, which paper was entitled, "The Communist Party." She advised that in order to get material for this paper she joined the Communist Party. She indicated that she resided at 43-07 47th Avenue, Sunnyside, Long Island, at the time she joined the Communist Party.

She volunteered the information that she attended Communist Party meetings for about six months, and that she had taken her husband, NATHAN, to several of these meetings. She stated that after she had compiled enough material for her paper she resigned from the Communist Party.

She also mentioned that her husband in addition to being a member of the Communist Party at this time had also been a member of the Young Communist League while a student at the City College of New York.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN was vague as to the number of times and the dates on which she visited JOEL BARR and ALFRED SARANT in their apartment in Greenwich Village.

In accordance with Bureau instructions, the interview with GERTRUDE SUSSMAN was conducted from the standpoint of NATHAN SUSSMAN, her husband, having been a classmate of MORTON SOBELL at the City College of New York. She was not questioned closely concerning her own Communist Party activities or Communist Party activity on the part of her husband, and the information that she did furnish in this regard was furnished voluntarily on her own part.

Concerning GENE HARKAVI (phonetic), HARKAVI appeared to be identical with the subject of New York case file 121-616, entitled, "EUGENE HARKAVY, aka: Eugene Markov, Classifier, War Assets Administration, Washington, D. C.; LOYALTY OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES." A review of this file indicates that HARKAVY attended City College of New York and was graduated in June of 1939 with an M.S. Degree in Education.

It is to be noted that whereas subjects in the JULIUS ROSENBERG network were graduates of the Electrical Engineering Course at City College of New York, HARKAVY received his degree in Education. GERTRUDE SUSSMAN mentioned that the GENE HARKAVI she knew was a person who was not an engineer.

A review of the HARKAVY loyalty file indicates that he resided at 10 Monroe Street from 1934 until 1939 with his father and mother. It is also to be noted that JULIUS ROSENBERG has continuously resided at 10 Monroe Street, New York City.

By letter dated December 2, 1950, the New York Office advised the Bureau under the caption "EUGENE HARKAVY, aka: Eugene Markov, Classifier, War Assets Administration, Washington, D. C.; LOYALTY OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES," of the information furnished by GERTRUDE SUSSMAN concerning GENE HARKAVI (phonetic).

It is to be noted that during the interview of NATHAN SUSSMAN by Bureau Agents, he was not too cooperative. He volunteered no information beyond specific questions asked of him, and in many instances he would not definitely commit himself by stating that he knew an individual but usually prefaced the remark with "I might have."

By teletype dated November 29, 1950, the Bureau was advised of the results of both the interviews of NATHAN and GERTRUDE SUSSMAN. In this teletype the Bureau was also advised that no further interviews with NATHAN SUSSMAN were contemplated by the New York Office until the entire investigation regarding SUSSMAN was completed at which time permission for another interview with NATHAN SUSSMAN would be requested.

Reurlet October 20, 1950 setting forth information re SOBELL's trips on behalf of General Electric while he was employed by that company.

With regard to SOBELL's contact at the Bureau of Ships on January 13, 1945, in connection with Servo Amplifiers, the following individuals have been contacted in an effort to ascertain the identities of the persons or offices visited by SOBELL at that time: Mr. E. G. LAFHAM, presently Deputy Executive Secretary, Committee on Ordnance, Research and Development Board; formerly Senior Civilian Engineer, Fire Control Radar Branch, Bureau of Ships; Mr. L. WHITELOCK, Senior Civilian, Special Applications Branch, Bureau of Ships. These men advised they did not know SOBELL, and from the information furnished in reflet, they could furnish no information as to the identities of persons or offices at the Bureau of Ships which might have been visited by SOBELL.

With regard to SOBELL's contact at the Navy Department on November 7, 1946, in connection with Navy Sonde, DR. ERNEST KRAUSE, formerly Chairman of the V-2 Upper Atmosphere Research Committee, advised that he does not know SOBELL and has never met him. He also was unable to furnish any information concerning the identities of persons or offices visited by SOBELL on this trip.

As previously reported, the Pentagon Building Directories for 1946, were checked for a Captain A. D. COLLINS and no such person was listed as having been assigned to the Pentagon Building during 1946. These Directories have been rechecked with the same results. In addition to checking the Army officer records for a Captain A. D. COLLINS, the results of which were reported previously, the Navy officer records section was contacted and it was ascertained that it would be almost impossible to check for a Navy Captain by this name unless a first or middle name was available. Navy officer records are maintained on the basis of the full name of the officer and there could be so many names which would fit the initials "A. D." that it would be an almost impossible task to check these records.

It would be appreciated if the Albany office would give this office the benefit of any additional information developed in connection with these trips made by the subject in order that many needless contacts and interviews can be eliminated. It has been found that as a general rule the research and other work carried on in connection with these projects were handled by a large number of people in various branches and sections of the Bureau of Ships, Bureau of Ordnance, Naval Research Laboratory, etc., and it would be of great assistance in conducting the requested investigation if more identifying data could be supplied. Therefore, unless advised to the contrary, the investigation requested in reflet will be held in abeyance pending receipt of additional information from Albany, or until advised that such additional information is not available.

Mr. LAWRENCE J. LEVINE, Project Engineer and member of the Engineering Committee, Reeves Instrument Co., 215 East 91st Street, New York City, was interviewed January 9, 1951 by writer. Mr. LEVINE advised that he presently resides at 1054 Scott Drive, North Valley Stream, N.Y.

MR. LEVINE advised that he first met subject MORTON SOBELL in the offices of the Reeves Instrument Company, New York, sometime during 1947 or 1948. At that time LEVINE was employed by a research laboratory at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, which was working closely with the Reeves firm on a project for the United States Navy.

LEVINE never actually worked with SOBELL; the two were employed on different projects for Reeves. LEVINE left M.I.T. in 1949 and accepted a position at Reeves doing work similar to that which he was engaged with at M.I.T. He occasionally met SOBELL in the Reeves Laboratories, but beyond a customary greeting there was little further contact.

LEVINE gained the impression that SOBELL was a capable engineer, but very "arrogant" sort of person who had decided opinions on any subject and who "knew all the answers". SOBELL was a great talker, and, according to LEVINE, seemed unable to keep his mouth closed.

LEVINE advised that he was at a loss to understand how such a talkative individual could possibly be an efficient spy.

LEVINE never had any contact with SOBELL socially either outside or within the REEVES Laboratory. SOBELL never gave LEVINE any cause to suspect that he was engaged in undercover activities or that he was other than a loyal American. LEVINE was not acquainted with any members of SOBELL'S family, although he had heard that SOBELL'S wife had worked for REEVES at one time. The only associate of SOBELL'S known to LEVINE was MAX ELITCHER, who is employed at Reeves under LEVINE'S direct supervision. ELITCHER told LEVINE that he and SOBELL lived in houses in Westchester, whose back yards were adjacent. LEVINE also knew that SOBELL and ELITCHER took turns driving to work.

LEVINE considered ELITCHER an extremely capable engineer. At the time of SOBELL'S arrest, LEVINE was most apprehensive that ELITCHER would be released from his position at Reeves, because of his association with SOBELL. Luckily, according to LEVINE, this has not happened. LEVINE added that it would take two engineers to replace ELITCHER. LEVINE was also relieved to note that ELITCHER was not unduly distraught when he heard SOBELL had been arrested, and was willing to speak freely about his friendship with SOBELL. This served to indicate to LEVINE, that ELITCHER was not involved in the same illicit activity with which SOBELL had been charged.

LEVINE could furnish no additional information of value.

On January 5, 1951, Mrs. WINIFRED DURAND, nee Smith, 946 Freeman Avenue, Bronx, New York, was interviewed by SA LESTER O. GALLAHER and the writer for any information she might have concerning MORTON SOBELL.

It should be noted that the signature card for MORTON SOBELL'S checking account at the Manufacturers Trust Company, 1511 Third Avenue, New York City, reflected that SOBELL was introduced to the bank by a WINIFRED SMITH.

At the time that SOBELL'S account was examined at this branch, Assistant Manager CHOINSKY advised that WINIFRED SMITH had been employed at this branch at the time the checking account was opened on June 23, 1947. Since SMITH was a platform stenographer, CHOINSKY considered it unusual that a stenographer's name would appear on the signature card as having introduced the customer. He stated the possibility existed that she may have been acquainted with SOBELL.

Mrs. DURAND advised agents her maiden name had been WINIFRED SMITH that she had been employed at the Manufacturers Trust Company for approximately ten years. Prior to her resignation in August, 1948, she had been at the branch at 1511 Third Avenue, New York. She had been transferred there about November, 1946, and had served as a typist-stenographer. One of her duties was to receive and assist the bank's customers. She said in the course of her duties she met many of the bank's customers.

Mrs. DURAND was questioned as to whether she was acquainted with a MORTON or HELEN SOBELL and if she had recalled opening this account. She said that she did not recognize the name SOBELL and the pictures of the SOBELLs were exhibited to her and she was unable to identify them.

The signature card of MORTON SOBELL'S account which had been made available by the Manufacturers Trust Company under subpoena was exhibited to DURAND and she was questioned regarding the fact that her name appeared on the line which stated "introduced by -- reference". Mrs. DURAND said she could not remember having introduced this account at the bank. She explained that probably at the time the account was opened, an officer had requested her to type a signature card for this new account, then when she had typed the card, she had inserted her name in the above-mentioned place. She pointed out that ordinarily her initials would appear on the card as having typed this card, and on the subject's signature card her initials do not appear, only her name.

Mrs. DURAND further stated that each typist has an individual style and after examining the style of typing on this card, she felt sure that she had typed the card. She did not recall typing this card.

Dear Sirs:

"I would like to bring to your attention the Russian born father of an American born man who worked with me at MAY B. MILLER & CO., INC., 501 Fifth Avenue, New York, N.Y.

"The son is PETER NICHOLAS CAMP who I imagine is pro-American.

"The father, who I have never met, may be above reproach, but in about 1942 when MAY B. MILLER & CO. was designing an aviation tube oil refining plant for Amtorg on Lend Lease from the Treasury Department, the father (so his son related) spoke to a friend of his who worked at Amtorg about giving his son a job as interpreter for a group of Russian engineers who were to make an inspection tour of various refineries in the United States.

"The son was given the job. This connection with Amtorg is all I know and may be innocent, but I feel it my duty to report.

"In 1942 the son, PETER, was living at his parents home on Long Island, N.Y.

"I understand that my identity will be kept confidential."

There was no reference to PETER NICHOLAS CAMP in the Los Angeles indices.

For the information of the Cincinnati Office under Lend Lease arrangements of the Treasury Department E. B. Badger and Company, Solomon Towers, 500 Fifth Avenue, New York, during 1942-1944 trained Soviet engineers in oil production and refining. The engineers were officially attached to the Soviet Government Purchasing Commission whose offices and personnel were generally identified with Amtorg.

The assistant in charge of the Soviet personnel working out of the Badger Company offices was SEMEN M. SEMENOV. SEMENOV has been identified by HARRY GOLD as his Soviet Espionage superior SAM. The name SAM would appear to have no significance since he used different aliases to each new contact; ROBERT to ALFRED DEAN SLACK, SIMON to ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, GEORGE to FRED BLACK.

SEMENOV apparently concentrated in developing information along chemical engineering lines particularly fuels. It was known he at one time was very much interested in the "HOUSERY PROCESS" which was considered confidential in 1942-44.

There are enclosed photographs of SEMENOV which Cincinnati is requested to exhibit to PETER CAMP. In the event he can identify SEMENOV information should be developed as to SEMENOV'S contacts and activities. Verify son's obtaining an interpreters position through his father's contact at Amtorg and ascertain identity of said contact.

The New York files contain a memorandum reflecting that PETER N. CAMP graduated from the College of the City of New York engineering school in 1938. It will be recalled JULIUS ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL and other members of their espionage group were graduates of the engineering school of CCNY in 1938-1939.

Reference is made to NY letter to the Director dated September 22, 1950, in the case entitled "MORTON SOBELL, was.; ESPIONAGE - R", copies of which with photographs enclosed were furnished Cincinnati. The photographs should be exhibited to CAMP and he should be interrogated along the lines requested in-referenced letter.
