In Newark Cinels of 11/12/66 and 11/13/66, Newark reported that a group in Union County attempting to revive interest in the MORTON SOBELL case had planned a meeting to be held at the home of MORTON STAVIS, Elizabeth, N.J., on 11/24/66, at which YURI SUHL, of the SOBELL Committee-New York, was to speak on the subject "The Prisoner on Your Conscience--MORTON SOBELL".

Confidential Informant reported to SA HERBERT L. BLOM and SA LYNN G. TWIDEN on 11/27/66 that YURI SUHL had appeared at the home of MORTON STAVIS on 11/24/66 and reviewed for the 26 people present his version of the injustice to which MORTON SOBELL had been subjected.

According to this informant, it was announced at this meeting that \$65.00 had been raised to assist MORTON SOBELL and that the Union County group, which organized this meeting, had set a goal of \$500.00 to be raised for the assistance of MORTON SOBELL.

At this meeting, according to the informant, it was announced that there was to be a MORTON SOBELL hearing at Foley Square, New York City, on December 5, 1966, and that an effort would be made to arrange for a "carload" of people to go to New York on that day to "pack the courtroom".

Within the past couple of months I recall reading in the newspapers that this outfit had been cited by the Justice Department or a similar body, as being a communistic organization. It further was accused of fleecing the public out of a considerable sum of money through donations. My hope therefore is that since they continue to request funds, and that they now are doing so by mail, your office may be able to take some action against them.

I am a Patrolman N.Y.C.P.D., and while receipt of such disgusting material would insult the intelligence of any patriotic citizen, it particularly galls me.



In further reporting on the above meeting, [REDACTED] stated that ESTHER STAVIS explained the purpose of the meeting by stating that MORTON SOBELL is in prison and that the speaker, YURI SUHL, would explain the whole matter inasmuch as he has been in constant contact with HELEN SOBELL and was very close to the case. YURI SUHL said he would speak on three points. He said HELEN SOBELL was, at that moment, in California, visiting her husband at Alcatraz Prison and he would say, without contradiction, that her talk with her husband would be on three points: first, concerning the children; second, concerning the hearing to obtain a new trial and third, what was being done to help him secure a new trial.

SUHL said that in getting back to the first point, he is sure that HELEN SOBELL was telling her husband how their daughter was doing in college and describing their son, inasmuch as MORTON SOBELL had not seen him in the past six years. SUHL said that HELEN SOBELL would also be describing their son inasmuch as he is growing up, telling him what their son is doing and the fact that their son is always asking when his daddy is coming home. SUHL said that HELEN SOBELL took her son with her so that he could look out over the bay and at least see and know that his father is out there on the rock somewhere, because the law prohibits his son from visiting him. HELEN SOBELL, he said, only visits her husband three times a year because of the expense and time element. However, SUHL said that when she does go to visit her husband that she stays for two weeks on the coast with friends and attends meetings in homes to explain her husband's plight and to raise funds.

SUHL stated that his second point is that HELEN SOBELL is discussing details concerning new evidence uncovered to be presented at a hearing for a new trial on 12/5/56, at Foley Square. He said a brief would be presented showing that MORTON SOBELL was kidnapped from Mexico, and framed by the Justice Department. He said that MORTON SOBELL and his wife left the United States for Mexico on a vacation in June, 1950, and that they had purchased a round-trip ticket on American Airlines. SUHL said that SOBELL carried his Social Security card in his own name; a membership card of the New York Academy of

Sciences and that at the Border he declared a camera, which he had with him so that he would not have to pay duty on his return to America. This, he said, is proof that SOBELL was not fleeing the country as the headlines proclaimed and as the Justice Department had charged.

What had actually happened, he said, was that MORTON SOBELL had been kidnapped by FBI Agents. He said SOBELL had rented an apartment for which he had a rent receipt, but when he saw the headlines about ROSENBERG he panicked like many people did during the MC CARTHY hysteria and, therefore, tried to rent another apartment under another name. He also tried to get information about another job somewhere outside the USA under another name because he knew he would be persecuted inasmuch as he was a classmate of ROSENBERG. It was, at that time, that the FBI Agents broke into his apartment, told him he was JOHN JONES, that he had held up a bank, stolen \$15,000, hit him over the head when he protested and wanted to contact the American consul in Mexico, and was dragged out of the apartment and rushed by automobile to the Border; where he was told to sign a statement that eventually turned up in court stating he was deported from Mexico although the statement originally did not state so. He said that during testimony during the trial, the Customs Agent admitted he had stamped "deported" on the statement after SOBELL had signed the statement inasmuch as he had assumed that SOBELL was deported from Mexico.

In the meantime, HELEN SOBELL stayed in the apartment with other Agents while they ransacked the place. They then took her in another car and drove to the Border without stopping despite Mrs. SOBELL's pleas to stop for milk for the baby. When she asked what this was all about, the Agents told her everything would be all right if she cooperated with them. When she asked "cooperate about what," the Agents told her she knew what it was about. She said that despite her pleas they did not tell her anything.

SUHL said it took many months before SOBELL was brought to trial and that appeals by his lawyers were turned down when they wanted to know the nature of the charges in order that they could prepare for the trial. Finally, two weeks before the trial they were told that he was being charged with espionage.

SUHL said that when SOBELL came up for trial he was amazed, as was his wife, to see ELICHTER as they thought he

was a friend inasmuch as he had helped them financially by buying their furniture when they needed money for their attorneys. They were shocked when he testified against SOBELL. ELICHTER, SUHL said, admitted on the stand he had perjured himself when he had applied for a Government job and denied he belonged to the CP of which he was actually a member, therefore, ELICHTER was afraid and had to cooperate with the Government in order to get off easy inasmuch as they had threatened to "throw the book at him."

According to SUHL, it was the perjured testimony of witnesses that convicted SOBELL inasmuch as the Judge in charging the Jury said that the Jury must either believe ELICHTER's testimony or let SOBELL go free.

SUHL also said that during the trial, the Government lawyers were a party to the frameup inasmuch as they knew that SOBELL was kidnapped from Mexico. ROY COHN was one of the lawyers. Also that they assumed that Dr. UREY, Atomic Scientist, and other Atomic Scientists would be present at the trial in order to give the impression that they were there to back up the Government case, but that these scientists did not know that they were being used. SUHL said that Dr. UREY later at a fund-raising dinner for SOBELL, said that SOBELL was framed; that he deserved a new trial, and by a diagram showed not only that SOBELL could not have been engaged in espionage but also that the ROSENBERGs were innocent and if anyone was engaged in espionage it was GREENGLASS.

SUHL said that the ROSENBERG case was discussed at two Presidential Cabinet meetings as a result of the 3,000,000 letters and telegrams sent to the White House protesting the ROSENBERG trial. J. EDGAR HOOVER, Head of the FBI, SUHL said, tried to minimize the amount with a magazine article by saying that only 600,000 had protested and that he was amazed that that many people sympathized with the ROSENBERGs.

The third point, SUHL said, was that HELEN was discussing with SOBELL what was being done to get him a new trial. SUHL stated that he is sure HELEN SOBELL is telling her husband that many meetings, such as this one, are being held all over the country and at this moment while he, SUHL, was speaking, SOBELL's mother was speaking at another meeting in Syracuse, New York. He said money is being raised inasmuch as many people are now attending meetings because the MC CARTHY era is a thing of the past. He said that she is probably also telling her husband of the many meetings at which she speaks in order to raise money.

The informant advised that YURI SUHL concluded his speech at 10:45 p.m.

The informant advised that ESTHER STAVIS then thanked YURI SUHL and introduced LESTER GOLDBERG, whom she said was responsible for this successful meeting.

LESTER GOLDBERG said he was happy to see so many people in attendance and could not add anything to what SUHL had said other than that money was needed. GOLDBERG told how he, BILL WANKO and IRVING DOLGOW had gone visiting door to door in order to solicit funds for SOBELL. He asked everyone to "dig deep and give." The informant said that LESTER GOLDBERG and MORTON MANN made this collection at the meeting. The informant said that CLARA DOLGOW waved a \$10 bill and said that BETTY SHACKTOMAN (PH) had contributed \$10 when she arrived at this meeting and had just contributed another \$10 after hearing Mr. SUHL speak. \$165 was collected.

The informant advised that MORTON MANN then asked YURI SUHL what could be done to help SOBELL. SUHL said to ring doorbells and to hold meetings to get money. MORTON MANN then asked when the hearing was coming up and where it would be held and whether anyone could attend. SUHL replied that the hearing is scheduled for December 5, 1956. According to the informant, MORTON STAVIS cut in at this point and explained how a hearing is conducted and that anyone who so desired could attend. He said the hearing would be held at Foley Square. MORTON MANN later said that he wanted to help "pack the courtroom" and would try to get a carload of people to go with him.

The informant also advised that YURI SUHL had stated that they have a statement from the Mexican Government showing that MORTON SOBELL was never deported from Mexico. He also said he had two copies of the petition that would be presented at the hearing. These copies, he said, contained photostats of the above Mexican statements as well as credentials that SOBELL had carried with him.

Pertinent information in the above report was furnished the Bureau by airtel dated 12/6/56, captioned, "CP, USA (ATTACK ON THE FBI) under Cinal."

The meeting started about 9:45 pm.

ESTHER STAVIS introduced LESTER GOLDBERG. GOLDBERG then gave some brief background information concerning the main speaker of the evening, YURI SUHL.

SUHL then gave an impassioned address concerning MORTON SOBELL, his wife, and children. SUHL stated SOBELL's mother, RCSE, was speaking to a gathering in Syracuse, New York that same evening, and also that other meetings were being held throughout the country that same evening concerning this case. SUHL advised that SOBELL's wife had visited him at Thanksgiving, 1956, and told him not to worry and informed him of many meetings to be held in his behalf. SUHL condemned the Government

for placing SOBELL in Alcatraz and implied that this was done because SOBELL would not confess and also to make it more difficult for SOBELL's family and lawyers to visit him.

SUHL announced that the FBI had hit SOBELL over the head and had kidnapped him from Mexico and brought him over the border to the U.S. SUHL stated that SOBELL was not a fugitive or fleeing as the Government claimed when he went to Mexico but had entered as a tourist and that they had documents to prove this. SUHL advised that the Government also claimed that SOBELL had been deported from Mexico; however, this was not true.

SUHL informed those present that evidence had been collected to prove SOBELL's innocence and that SOBELL would soon have a hearing in New York City to try to get a new trial. SUHL also stated that the testimony of MAX ELICHTER was not to be believed because ELICHTER had admitted that he had previously committed perjury.

LESTER GOLDBERG then got up and told of the expenses incurred in this fight and asked for money. GOLDBERG told those present that he, BILL WANKO, and IRVING DOUGOW had lately been active in knocking on doors trying to get contributions for the SOBELL case. GOLDBERG stated that they had been using an old PROGRESSIVE PARTY list as a source for contacting people in this regard.

GOLDBERG said that when they were contacting people for money, someone had told him that they did not know if they cared to give any money as they did not like what was going on in Hungary at the present time. GOLDBERG said that he told this person that they were not concerned with what was going on in Hungary--that they were merely trying to right an injustice that had been done in the SOBELL case.

A collection was taken up for the SOBELL case, and \$175 was collected from those present.

At 2:55 PM, 3/1/57, while I was engaged in another telephone conversation, Miss NORMA ABRAMS of the NEW YORK DAILY NEWS furnished the following information to my secretary:

Miss ABRAMS received a telephone call, this date, from a man named TED JACOBS, who said that he represented the Committee for Morton Sobell. He gave his telephone number as Algonquin 4-9983. He called to alert Miss ABRAMS to be present in the Circuit Court of Appeals on Monday, where he said that in addition to the American lawyers who are representing SOBELL in a motion for a new trial, there would be a DR. LUIS SANCHEZ PONTON. He described the man as former Minister of Education in Mexico, former Mexican diplomat and currently a Professor of Law in the University of Mexico. He said he would appear on SOBELL's behalf and would take the position that no Mexican authorities had anything whatsoever to do with SOBELL's departure from Mexico, that he had been kidnaped.
