



The 14th annual Peoples World Banquet, sponsored by the So. Calif. PW Committee, was held on Sunday, Oct. 11, 1970 at the Miramar Hotel, Wilshire and Ocean Ave, Santa Monica, Calif.



Helen Travis was chairlady and made opening remarks and said that Morton Sobell would not be present because he was stopped by the parole board. She also said Urey would not be present but Idid not get the reason.

Frank Wilkinson spoke on Sobell and Urey saying that he was angry against his government because of this, and want on and on talking about many things with the main thing winding up to a collection pitch

Irving Sarnoff read a letter supposedly written by Sobell in which it said that the McCarthy days will not return because the people will not permit them too; that history does not repeat itself. It was a long letter all along the same lines. After the letter the people stood up in honor of Pobell.

Frank Wilkinson also reported that by Nov. 15th Pres. Nixon will have signed legislation which is repressive and very dangerous as it affects all progressive forces. He also said that he was going into the south soon to form or join a group to fight all repressive legislation.

Celia Rodriguez, Charwoman of the Barrios Defense Committee, spoke on the police brutality, attacks on the chicanos, touched on the Aug. 29th affair, and said that her committee was doing all it can to help people in the east side. She also spoke on the Soledad Bros.

Some musical entertainment and then affair started to break up about 4:45 P. M.



"HELEN introduced Tame" (VALLERA TAMOU MITCHELL) who related the details pretaining to the Soledad prison brothers. TAMOU then introduced the mothers & some of the relatives of two of the Soledad brothers. The third mother was late arriving, so TAMOU was re-called to the speakers stand to introduce this third mother.

"CELIA or CECELIA RODRIQUEZ was introduced by HELEN as the Chair lady of the Chicano organization or movement fighting for the rights of the Chicano people & against Repression & Police Brutality against the Chicano people. CELIA pointed out various incidents of police brutality, etc. against the Chicanos.

"FRANK WILKERSON talked on the Civil Rights & Civil Liberties of the people. He dwelled into the Governments - parole boards refusal to allow MARTIN SOBELL to come to L.A. to speak today at the Peoples World Banquet. FRANK then made the pitch.

"The Southern California Committee for the People's World paper, held a 14th Annual Donor Banquet; Sunday, Oct. 11, 1970-1:00 P.M. at the Miramar Hotel, Ocean & Wilshire Blvds. - Santa Monica, Calif. There were approximately 1000 people present; the names of those whom I saw & knew are as follows:

LA 97-16

"The M.C. for the P.W. 14th Annual Donor Banquet was HELEN TRAVIS; she began the program by introducing the honored guest who were seated on the platform, which included the three Families of the 3 Black men in Soledad prison who are charged with murder of a white prison guard; TAMU 'VALLERA' MITCHELL, introduced the Families of the three Black men in Soledad prison; she also talked in behalf of support for the Freedom of these 3 Blacks & to free all political prisoners: JAMES 'JIM' JACKSON, was also introduced by HELEN TRAVIS, (M.C.) as a National C.P. leader, along with LOU DISKIN; C.P. District Organizer.

"CELIA? RODRIGUES, a Mexican-American young woman & a member of 'the Chicano Movement against repression & Police Bruitality'; was introduced by HELEN TRAVIS, to talk briefly about this Chicano movement against repression etc., and about the Chicano Moratorium march & riot: This woman talked so long about Chicano repressions by the powers that be & about the police establishment of Los Angeles County, causing the riot during the Chicano March against the war on Aug. 29, 1970; time had to be called on her by the Chairlady of the P.W. Bnaquet; CELIA RODRIGUES, was asked to cut her talk until some other time.

"FRANK WILKERSON, gave the pitch talk for the collection of funds & special contributions of sums of money from the audience in order that the P.W. paper can survive; during his pitch talk, FRANK WILKERSON, spoke on the question of why MORTON SOBELL, could not appear on this P.W. Banquet program as the honored guest speaker: FRANK WILKERSON, said that MORTON SOBELL, was forbidden to speak here as a political prisoner out of jail on Bail, for reason that he (FRANK WILKERSON), who also

has been a political prisoner & because he is now married to DONNA WILKERSON: the P.W. circulation manager for Southern California & that he 'FRANK WILKERSON', is also to appear on this P.W. Banquet program, this is the reason the 'Powers that Be', forbid or deny MORTON SOBELL, the privilege to speak on this P.W. Banquet program, because he will come in contact with another political prisoner publicly, in the person of himself - FRANK WILKERSON; and this is against the law.'

"FRANK WILKERSON, blasted the U.S. Federal laws & said that MORTON SOBELL, was framed & not guilty as charged.

"During the call of larger donations of money to the P.W. paper; FRANK <u>WILKERSON</u>, called several names of persons who contributed large sums of money; to name a few as I remember are the following:

"DORIS PIKE; \$1500.00
ART SILVER & wife - \$200.00
HELEN ROSS, - \$500.00
ROSA HILL, - \$500.00
ANNA MANDELMAN - \$100.00

"Also, \$200.00 was given in memory of the late RUEBEN W. BOROUGH: And \$200.00 were given in memory of the late JAMES 'JIM' T. ALLEN.

"HELEN TRAVIS, the chairman announced that over \$4000.00 were taken up in the special collection of Funds for the People's World paper: The price of the Banquet dinner was \$12.50 per plate & youth admission: \$5.00.

"IRVING SARMOFF; head of the Peace Action Council (PAC) was introduced by the Mistress of Ceremonies, HELEN TRAVIS, to read a special letter from MORTON SOBELL, telling his reason for not appearing as guest speaker for the 14th Annual Donor Banquet for the People's World:

"TRVING SARNOFF, read a very lengthy letter written by MORTON SOBELL; in which expressed his deep feeling of being honored as guest speaker for this occassion & his regrets of not being allowed to travel as a political prisoner on Bail, to speak at this P.W. Annual Banquet.

"MCRTON SOBELL; like FRANK WILKERSON, also blasted the U.S. Government & it's laws; which the labeled as unjust; he urged everyone to continue the fight for Social justice & to wipe out Repression against Black people & other minority groups in the U.S.A.: stating that this can only be done by a 'Revolution to Socialism' in this country.

Since his release from prison, subject has been engaged in writing a book. Information obtained concerning the book reflects that subject signed a contract with Charles Scribner's Sons, NYC, for publication of the book. Subject is to receive \$21,000 plus 15% of proceeds on all copies sold over 7500. He received a \$7,000 advance from the publisher.

Information obtained by sources from the subject 87C

reflects that the above book is to be mostly an autobiography, but will also cover the work of the Committee To Free Morton Sobell, and some of the political aspects of the bosenberg case. Subject has engaged a Literary Agent by the name of LYNN NESBITT

The most recent information available from the subject concerning the status of the book, is that he has completed his writing, but the publisher believes downed it is too long, and he is now in the process of shorten his first draft. Date of probable publication is not known in the process of shorten his first draft.

The Bureau has requested the NYO to attempt to obtain a prepublication of subject's book, and pointed out that in the past the Bureau has cooperated with the above concern in furnishing data for various books published by the Scribner firm.
