Informant advises that SOBELL, prior to being transferred to Alcatraz Prison on 11/26/52, was considering cooperating with the Government. Subject's wife, HELEN SOBELL, residing 506 West 135th Street, Apartment 34, and is currently engaging in lectures on behalf of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case. On 12/31/52 and 1/2 and 12/53 subject's wife and mother visited him at Alcatraz. [Subject's camera was shipped to the LaUnion Quimica Agency, Mexico City, on 7/25/53. Records of Quimica Agency unavailable for pertinent period.]

D. INFORMATION CONCERNING SUBJECT'S CAMERA

It will be recalled that SOBELL at the time he departed the United States en route to Mexico City on June 22, 1950, had in his possession a Leica camera number 248674. The source of this camera is unknown. ~~SECRET~~ (u)

Confidential Informant T-6, another government agency, advised that the records of the Leitz Company indicated that Leica camera number 248674 was shipped from the Leitz factory on July 25, 1937, to the La Union Quimaca Company, Mexico City, Mexico. ~~SECRET~~ (u) *released per army*

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that the La Union Quimaca records no longer exist for the years prior to World War II and accordingly there is no way of tracing the receipt of subsequent sale of this camera. ~~SECRET~~ (u)

VII. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION CONCERNING
MORTON SOBELL

It is noted that MORTON SOBELL was convicted with JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG on March 29, 1951 in the Southern District of New York of conspiracy to commit espionage for the Soviets. On April 5, 1951 MORTON SOBELL was sentenced to a term of thirty years. All his appeals for reversal and new trials in the Court of Appeals, Second Circuit and applications to the Supreme Court for writs of certiorari, have been denied. There are no known applications for relief now pending in any court. SOBELL is currently incarcerated at the United States Penitentiary at Alcatraz.

The records of the Naval Records Center, Washington, DC reflect that SOBELL was employed as an Junior Electrical Engineer and as an Assistant Electrical Engineer for the Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, DC from January 27, 1939 to October 1, 1940. He resigned this position to attend the University of Michigan where he secured a Masters Degree in Science.

The records of the employment office of the General Electric Company, Schenectady, New York reflect that SOBELL was employed by that company as a Test Engineer from June 15, 1942 to July 5, 1943 and as an Engineer in the Marine and Aeronautics Division from July 5, 1943 to June 13, 1947. A General Electric employment card showed that in 1947 SOBELL was assigned to the Meteorological Radar work in the Electrical Control Section, working on US Navy restricted contracts on naval research.

The records of the Reeves Instrument Company, 215 East 91st Street, New York City reflect that SOBELL started employment with this company on June 16, 1947 as an Electrical Engineer and last appeared for work on June 16, 1950.

On March 8, 1951 MAX ELITCHER testified as a Government witness in the case of the United States vs. JULIUS ROSENBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG, MORTON SOBELL, ET AL.

In the morning session of this trial on March 8, 1951, MAX ELITCHER testified that he met MORTON SOBELL at the General Electric Company at Schenectady, New York in the early part of 1946 when ELITCHER visited General Electric on government business. On this occasion ELITCHER stayed overnight at SOBELL'S home. He and SOBELL talked of their work.

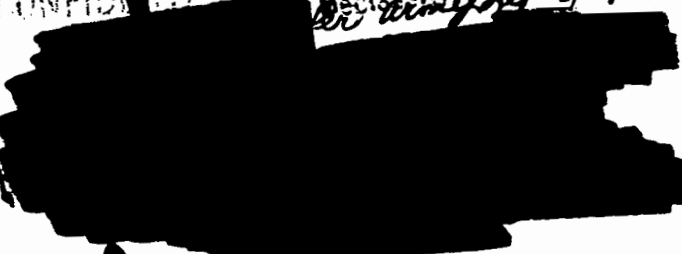

It has been learned that Ponton visited the American Embassy, Mexico City, at 3 p.m. on February 1, 1957, and requested a visa for the purpose of visiting the United States to see an eye specialist and consult with a "colleague." He made no mention of the instant case. Due to derogatory information concerning him, Ponton was informed by the visa officer that an investigation would have to be conducted before the visa was issued. 

By letter of 10-21-57 Benjamin Mandel, Research Director, Internal Security Subcommittee, forwarded to Mr. Nichols an anonymous letter received by that Subcommittee signed "Disgruntled American" and Mr. Mandel requested if there was any possibility that info could be supplemented in such a way that it could be used at a hearing.

The letter suggested the activities of Mrs. Symie Amitin be checked. She had a strong connection with Morton Sobell from 1950-1955 when both worked on Project Cyclone at Reeves Instrument Company. The letter described Mrs. Amitin as the only secretary in Project Cyclone and although she had Secret clearance, she handled all typing including Top Secret. Further, she knew where Sobell went when he ran. Letter indicated she might be known in the Party as Sadie or Selma or Sylvia Schwartz or Black.

The letter also referred to Benjamin Heimlish or Benjamin Hemlock described as a husband of Mrs. Amitin's sister and claims he was arrested for distributing communist literature and hides behind the fact his brother is a lieutenant colonel in the Air Force.

The letter names Dr. Julius Jaffe, another brother-in-law, as "the mind" behind all of them and states Jaffe and his wife have been active in the support of the Rosenbergs and Sobell. The letter concludes Mrs. Amitin has sent her son to a communist front camp for the past six years and identifies this as Camp Woodland operated by Norman Studer who was investigated recently for activities with children.

Bufiles contain one reference to Symie Amitin which reflects that in October, 1950, she was a librarian at Reeves Instrument Company. One Benjamin Hemlock, 1145 Clay Avenue, Bronx, communicated with the United States Pardon Attorney in 1941 asking a pardon for Earl Browder, head of the Communist Party. One Benjamin Hemlock born in 1901 joined International Workers Order Lodge Number 5211, Bronx, New York, in November, 1943, and was a member of that lodge in 1952.

Regarding [redacted] mentioned in one anonymous letter, Bufiles reflect one [redacted] was the subject of a Voice of America investigation in 1949 which reflected he served in the United States Army as a [redacted]. [This investigation developed information that he was responsible for the removal of "Goebbels Diaries" from the European Command without authority and with intention of profiting from the removal. [redacted] was investigated in 1951 as a result of an allegation by the Army that he furnished classified documents to an unauthorized individual in Germany.] Prosecution was declined by the Department of Justice. On 11-9-53 former SA Nulty, who in 1954 was with the investigative staff of the Senate Appropriations Committee, furnished the Bureau information concerning Frank Wisner, former Deputy Director of CIA, and others and the original source of this information was Heimlich. Heimlich was interviewed by the Bureau on 11-12-53 and the information pertaining to Wisner was given to CIA on 11-18-53. [On 1-4-54 Allen Dulles of CIA advised our liaison agent Heimlich had called on him to advise he had been interviewed by Bureau Agents regarding Wisner and was most surprised to learn the Bureau was investigating a top official of CIA and he wanted Dulles to be apprised of the situation.] By letter of 7-18-55 to the Director, Heimlich advised that he was the head of radio Rias in Berlin until 1949 when he was forced out of this position as a result of a dispute over U.S. public information policies in Germany. He claimed he wrote this letter to the Director in order that this information could be made a matter of record. Heimlich also testified before a public session of the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee (Jenner Committee) on 5-18-54 on the subject "Strategy and Tactics of World Communism."

In the course of an investigation relating to BIALOKOZ, the records of the National Cash Register Company, Dayton, Ohio, which were reviewed by SA ROBERT A. TRAUBER in the Fall of 1954, reflected that BIALOKOZ resided at 67 Adrian Avenue, New York City, in March, 1952.

On April 5, 1955, a pretext call was made to Mrs. JULIUS JAFFE, 67 Adrian Avenue, at which time she advised that BIALOKOZ and his wife resided with Dr. JULIUS JAFFE at 67 Adrian Avenue for about six months in 1952. According to Mrs. JAFFE, BIALOKOZ was working at the National Cash Register Company at the time and left the JAFFE residence to take an assignment abroad.

According to Mrs. JAFFE, BIALOKOZ left the country owing Dr. JAFFE a small sum of money on a dental bill. BIALOKOZ sent JAFFE an unsigned check for the amount.

By letter dated 10-21-57 Ben Mandel, research director, Senate Internal Security Subcommittee, forwarded to Mr. Nichols an undated anonymous letter which the Committee had received stating that the activities of one Symie Amitin should be investigated as there was a strong connection between Amitin and Morton Sobell, convicted Soviet agent, from 1950 to 1955 while both worked at Reeves Instrument Corporation. The letter mentioned that Amitin's brother-in-law, Benjamin Hemlock, and another brother-in-law, Dr. Julius Jaffe, were procommunists. Mr. Mandel asked for any information to supplement this information in such a way that it could be used for a hearing.

By memo of 10-24-57 a review of Bufiles was set forth which reflected no information on Amitin; certain information reflecting Communist Party membership on the part of Benjamin Hemlock and pro-communist sympathy on the part of Dr. Jaffe. This memo was forwarded to Mr. Nichols' office and Mr. Mandel was advised orally on 10-29-57 concerning it.

Attached report made at New York, 12-13-57 by SA William D. Dinohue developed information that Amitin was employed Reeves Instrument Corporation from 2-1-50 until her resignation 11-19-54. Thus, Amitin and Sobell both worked at that company from 2-1-50 until Sobell left on 6-18-50 on his flight to Mexico. No information was developed that Amitin and Sobell were known to each other. Report reflects that Symie Amitin signed CP nominating petitions in 1939 and 1941 and that one Mrs. H. Amitin, believed identical with Symie Amitin, had her name included on a list obtained on 5-21-48 which list was either a mailing list or membership list of the La Pasionara Club, Yorkville section of the CP.

Report also reflects that one Eugen De Bialokoz, [redacted] lived

with Dr. Julius Jaffe for about 6 months in 1952. The report also includes information reflecting that Jaffe signed a CP nominating petition in 1939, in 1941 and in 1942. Further, that he was a member of the IWO in September, 1949, and also contributed to the Joint Antifascist Refugee Committee in 1950. Information reflecting pro-
