Mr. CHILDS. Yes, sir. I recall that they were very disturbed about the Smith Act, particularly Smith Act trials.

Mr. ARENS. What did the Communist Party do in regard to the trials or in regard to the act itself?

Mr. CHILDS. They were always trying to portray the trials as related to some other subject or tried to get it off the real charges that those people were under.

Mr. ARENS. What is the Daily Worker?

Mr. CHILDS. The Daily Worker is the daily newspaper which is published and supported by the Communist Party, from what I understood in the paper.

Mr. ARENS. Is the Daily Worker also a telegraph agency from Communist Party headquarters to the comrades to tell the comrades what to do and what line to take?

Mr. CHILDS. I would say that the Daily Worker reflected the party's position at that particular period—the tactical position.

Mr. ARENS. Does the Daily Worker likewise reflect the open Communist Party activities as distinguished from the undercover-activities of the Communist Party?

Mr. CHILDS. I would say that it generally reflects the open activities.

Mr. KEARNEY. Mr. Arens, at this point I would like the witness to further identify the Rosenberg case activities, unless you intend to go into it.

Mr. ARENS. I have that as the next item.

(The chairman returned to the room.)

Mr. ARENS. Mr. Childs, I have before you now a photostatic copy of an article appearing in the Communist Daily Worker for March 6, 1956, entitled, "Sobell Committee Organizer Finds New Spirit in South," which is related in an interview in the Communist Daily Worker with one Aaron, A-a-r-o-n, Schneider, S-c-h-n-e-i-d-e-r. He tells in this interview of a trip or series of trips which he made to the South, including a trip to Winston-Salem for the purpose of organizing certain activities, particularly with reference to Sobell.

Q I ask if you have any information on the basis of your background and experience respecting the Sobell committee, and its activities within this area?

You know, of course, that Morton Sobell was convicted with the Rosenbergs and is now in the penitentiary serving a 30-year sentence?

Mr. CHILDS. I do not recall having any information about the Sobell committee in my association with the party.

Mr. ARENS. Do you recall the formation of committees in the Southland respecting the Rosenbergs and clemency for the Rosenbergs and that sort of activity by the Communist Party?

Mr. CHILDS. I recall that the party attempted to get as many people as possible to write both the Supreme Court and Members of Congress to reprieve the death sentence of the Rosenbergs.

The CHAIRMAN. I think in that connection you might be interested in knowing that our investigation disclosed that the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case collected over a quarter of a million dollars, of which the children received only about \$1,200.

Mr. CLONTZ. I was answering that question. That is the first danger, the sleepers. I feel that we have the equivalent, certainly, of two enemy divisions if and when the Soviet Union starts a war. We have the equivalent of two Soviet divisions already here. The trouble is that they are wearing our clothes and going under our freedoms.

The second danger from the Communist conspiracy is the way they are able to mould public opinion.

Mr. ARENS. Do you have illustrations of that?

Mr. CLONTZ. Yes. You can get one out of any paper. It creeps in. A misconception about the fifth amendment, for example. People of intelligence, loyal Americans, actually will tell you that the legal scholars say that a man may invoke the fifth amendment who is completely innocent of any charge. The thing that bothers me is that people of intelligence could do research and find out where did they get that from. They didn't get it from any legal scholars I have ever found. Yet that is the line that the Communist Party talks.

Mr. ARENS. Can you give us an illustration or an explanation on the basis of your experience of the way the individual Communist is able to multiply his personal effectiveness through other people in obtaining a given objective?

Mr. CLONTZ. The Stockholm Peace Petition is a milder example. Over in the vicinity of Chapel Hill, Junius Scales and I together solicited signatures on this apparently innocuous document which was then presented to New York headquarters as an outpouring of sentiment in favor of the party and the party goals from North Carolina.

Another sample is the Rosenberg case. From all over the country letters poured in to, I am told, Congress. The party told me to every Government official. I heard party urgings that they be sent in. I saw committees at work urging the freedom of the Rosenbergs. Yet at the same time I attended rallies and heard this Mrs. Sobell bring messages from the death house from the Rosenbergs which in effect said, "Comrades, don't worry, we won't squeal."

I saw non-Communists sucked in on that "save the Rosenbergs" thing by having anti-Semitism thrown up as the reason why, clouding the issues, forgetting what the Rosenbergs were charged with, saying that the Rosenbergs should not be convicted because if they were executed, their children would be orphans. When most parents die, their children sort of become orphans naturally. That was thrown up as a big issue, and that they were convicted because of anti-Semitism, whereas the facts simply proved otherwise.

Mr. ARENS. I have here, Mr. Clontz, a photostatic copy of an article of the Communist Daily Worker of March 6, 1956, in which there is an interview with one Aaron Schneider, entitled, "Sobell Committee Organizer Finds New Spirit in South," in which Mr. Schneider, obviously a Communist, is testifying about what he has just recently done in setting up Sobell committees throughout the South.

Do you have any information respecting Morton Sobell and the committees which were set up to bring pressure for his release from the penitentiary?

Mr. CLONTZ. Actually I was in New York when these committees were first being started. Morton Sobell at that time was a sort of satellite. The main pitch was save the Rosenbergs, and then as a sort of second verse, they used to mention save Morton Sobell, and Mrs. Sobell traveled all over various places. But actually during my time,

Approximately 300 persons attended the 8th Anniversary Dinner of the CRC held on April 9, 1954 at Yugoslav Hall, 405 West 41st Street. ABNER GREEN, head of the ACPFB served as toastmaster and the collection speech was handled by WILLIAM ALBERTSON, convicted Smith Act subject from the Pittsburgh area. WILLIAM L. PATTERSON gave the main address of the evening in which he pledged the CRC to continue its work in defense of "victims of government persecution". He stated that the defense of the CP was the first line of defense for all those present and called on all to aid CRC in its opposition to the McCarran Act and the Subversive Activities Control Board. Greetings from MORTON SOBELL, convicted espionage subject, were delivered by his wife and a recorded interview with WESLEY ROBERT WELLS, Negro prison inmate who was earlier granted a reprieve from execution by the Governor of California, was played. JOHN DASCHBACH, Seattle CRC functionary and convicted Smith Act subject was also present at the meeting.

COMMENT:

In 1956, the Subcommittee on Welfare and Pension Funds of the Senate Labor and Public Welfare Committee investigated the embezzlement of health and welfare funds of the Distilleries Workers Union and the Laundry Workers Union. The Department held that the Bureau had no jurisdiction relative to the embezzlement of these funds.

A Federal Grand Jury in New York City has been hearing evidence for the past several months with respect to possible labor violations in the garment industry. The Bureau is conducting investigation of possible violations of the Labor Management Relations Act of 1947 and of the Anti-Racketeering Statute at the request of the U. S. Attorney in New York City predicated upon a review of the books and records of businesses in the garment industry which books and records were subpoenaed by the Federal Grand Jury.

1. Miami - Paraguay is on the verge of civil war. Dictator Stroessner's army versus university students and farmers. Blood has already been shed.
2. Havana - Doctor Castro may be married in the next six weeks. His bride-to-be may be the girl who served with his rebels for over two years.
3. Caracas - Venezuelan intelligence agents have arrested the top undercover gang for Dictator Trujillo. They were taken at pistol point.
4. Bern - The odds tonight are 2 to 1 that Khrushchev will accept the conditions of the West provided a summit conference is held. This means Khrushchev thinks he has the lead in rockets and missiles and he wants another territorial pay off.
5. Mr. and Mrs. United States - Fifty years ago an international conference meant an assembly of nations intent on the common objective of peace by agreement. But history changes the meaning of words as well as boundaries on maps. Today, an international conference means meeting the challenge to an international group where the weapons are threats to define borders by force. To millions who do not understand this, the Geneva Conference is a failure. The fact is, however, that it could never be a failure because it was never a conference in the first place. The Russians insisted on it, not to find any peaceful solution, but to intensify the crisis and then win concessions by pretending to ease the tension. In short, 1939 is repeating itself in 1959. And the really great danger

At another secret meeting held here, the communists decided to support a steel strike if strike talk stays. On June the 11, top red leaders here decided on their strategy for both parties in the 1960 national campaign. "Peace with Russia at any price." It will be rejected except, of course, by the pinks.

later a man by the name of Joseph Springer invoked the Fifth Amendment when he was subpoenaed before a congressional committee about a school for communists at Camp Tenaya at Crestline, California, a full confirmation of that tip. This is to tell the 'Crestline Courier' now to please send a reporter to that same camp on May 13th and find out who appears there. Is it the Labor Youth League, listed subversive by the Government?"

COMMENT:

Los Angeles advised on 4/19/56 that the sheriff of San Bernadino County reported there is going to be a meeting for children of six to fourteen years of age at Camp Tenaya, which is operated by Joseph Springer. The sheriff advised the Los Angeles Office that he would have two juvenile officers attend the meeting. We have instructed Los Angeles to alert its informants concerning this meeting. We have received no evidence that the meeting is sponsored by the Labor Youth League; however, the Labor Youth League in Los Angeles is concentrating on children in the six to fourteen year age group. The communist school referred to by Winchell was held on the weekend of December 5-7, 1952, and was conducted by the Los Angeles County Communist Party.

Springer is on the Security Index. He testified 3/25/53 before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in Los Angeles and claimed the Fifth Amendment when questioned concerning his communist affiliations. Springer is the subject of a current perjury investigation arising out of this testimony. This investigation has been referred to the Department for a prosecutive opinion.

WINCHELL SAID:

"Washington Post.' The American communists are trying to get the American Civil Liberties Union to fire a man named Irving Ferman, their Washington agent, because he exposed Lord Bertrand Russell as being used as a tool by the Sobell Committee. This Committee is now trying to win freedom for Sobell, the atomic spy."

Green, formerly with the Atomic Energy Commission, and with the Humphries Committee inquiring into security programs in 1955, authored a letter dated 4/3/56 in which they criticized Russell's letter.

"New York City. This is a warning to the national organization of the Parent-Teachers Associations. The communists are assigning more members to join the P-TAs without, of course, your knowledge. These communists will try to present resolutions following the Communist Party line at your next convention. Now please do not tell me that I do not know what I am talking about. I am making this public to show the communists involved that I do."

We are aware of the Communist Party's infiltration tactics in this regard. The infiltration of legitimate organizations, such as the P-TA, church, civic and similar groups, has been part of the united front program of the Communist Party. Since the Geneva Conference in July, 1955, the political climate in the United States has changed, whereby the Communist Party has accelerated its mass-type of activity which includes penetration and infiltration of legitimate organizations.

Mrs. Sobell arrived in England on 2-22-56 where she was granted permission to remain for 3 weeks by British authorities. *Don* On 4-10-56 the French communist newspaper, "L'Humanite," reported that she had arrived in Paris after traveling in England and Italy. Mrs. Sobell returned to New York City on the "Queen Mary" on 5-8-56.

The New York Office is aware of tomorrow night's rally at Carnegie Hall for Morton Sobell and will give the appropriate coverage.

"Washington. The Senate Internal Security Committee will make melodrama again this week. The chemist who recruited Harry Gold as a Red atomic spy, and who has been a Red spy for 17 years, will confess, admit, give up to everything. He's a New Yorker. His last name is Black."

The individual referred to is Thomas Lessing Black (Bufile 65-59181). He is officially registered as a foreign agent. WINCHELL SAID:

"The House Committee on Un-American Activities is going after the Broadway Commies again. Proceedings are on the way. One of Marilyn Monroe's new romances, a long-time pro-lefto, will be asked to testify."

COMMENT:

This may refer to Arthur Asher Miller (Bufile 100-333798), prominent New York author and playwright (e.g. "Death of a Salesman") whose name has been linked romantically to Marilyn Monroe recently. Miller is the subject of a closed security investigation by the Bureau. He is in the Security Index. He is reported to have been a Communist Party member in the period 1943-47. He has been active in a large number of communist fronts during the 1940's. He was denied a passport in 1954 and in 1955 was rejected by the New York City Youth Board as a writer of a film on juvenile delinquency.

WINCHELL SAID:

"New York City. District Attorney's detectives assigned to the Victor Riesel case are on their first hot lead."

COMMENT:

The Bureau is continuing its intensive investigation of the "Obstruction of Justice" case involving the attack on Riesel, and this matter is being followed very closely at the Bureau. The New York Office has been instructed to determine the substance of the lead.

"Montevideo. A. I. Mikoyan is making a very quiet tour of Latin America. He is Russia's economic minister. He is now in Uruguay. His next stop is Buenos Aires."

WINCHELL SAID:

"Washington. The communists are whipping up another pressure campaign - to win freedom for convicted atomic spy, Morton Sobell. They have ordered a barrage of letters sent to the President and to the U.S. Attorney General. This is to tell you that this spy case - Morton Sobell, along with the Rosenbergs, was reviewed more times by the highest courts than any other case in American history."

COMMENT:

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg-Sobell Case has been conducting a stepped-up campaign to free Sobell from prison, particularly within the past 6 months. As early as January, 1956, the "Daily Worker" quoted William Z. Foster as urging every worker and every other citizen to demand of the Attorney General and President a new trial for Sobell. A motion was filed on behalf of Sobell on 5-8-56 for a new trial. Arguments will be heard on this motion today in the U.S. District Court, Southern District of New York.

WINCHELL SAID:

0/S "Tips to the newspapers - Newark, New Jersey, 'Star Ledger.' Arthur F. Schroeder, Jr., the head man of the Atlas Refining Company of Newark, will be subpoenaed by the Senate Internal Security Committee. The Senators are furious at him over his firing the former Red spy - Black, mentioned by me exclusively last Sunday night, who confessed and wants to help expose other Red spies."

COMMENT:

Thomas Lessing Black (Bufile 65-59181), who has admitted engaging in industrial espionage on behalf of the USSR in testimony before the Internal Security Subcommittee, has been interviewed many times by Bureau Agents and has been cooperative. The revelations he has made in his testimony are not new to the Bureau. Black was dismissed on Friday, May 18, from the Atlas Refining Company, where he was working on an assignment for another company as a chemist. Arthur F. Schroeder furnished the information regarding the dismissal to the press, indicating that the admissions by Black in his testimony the day before were the reasons for the dismissal.

WINCHELL SAID:

"Washington. Three former communists sought refuge in this country. They were taken back to Poland this week under very mysterious circumstances. One bought a brand new car the day before he left - an obvious Red kidnapping."

"Morton Sobell's motion for a new trial will be heard next Thursday by the same Federal judge who sent the Rosenbergs to the chair."

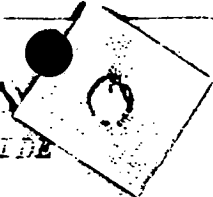

Soviet Clan Exploits Racial Strife to Invade South

By VICTOR RIESEL

Comrade Khrushchev's own clan is riding across the South. Leading the pack is the front man for a Soviet atomic spy now in Alcatraz. The Kremlin's carpetbaggers have deliberately invaded the South at its tensest moment.

Having virtually no Communist Party below Mason-Dixon—just one member in Mississippi, 96 in Alabama, 196 in Texas, 135 in Florida, 50 each in Georgia and Louisiana, 95 in North Carolina, 15 in South Carolina, 21 in Tennessee and 53 in Virginia at the latest public FBI count—the pro-Communists decided to set up a propaganda front.

They chose this moment of the South's wracking political and sociological pain to launch a new drive for the freedom of convicted Soviet spy Morton Sobell.

They sent one of their veteran labor men, Aaron Schneider, riding through community after community. In eight cities they set up headquarters for the Sovieteering National Committee To Secure Justice for Morton Sobell.

THEY'RE now ready to pour their poison into the troubled political lifestream of the South from these committee headquarters in Miami, Orlando, New Orleans, Houston, Austin, Dallas, Atlanta and Winston-Salem. These are the cities in which their own reports boast of headquarters. Their report reveals no addresses.

Schneider's trek through the South obviously coincides with the turbulence of the tragic integration conflict. The drive for Sobell's freedom was as dead as a Pompeian statue.

The Sovieteers ran through more than a \$1,000,000 collected for the atomic spies' campaign. The money has all been spent and some government agencies are mighty curious over where it all went.

The comrades were searching for other irritants, when, suddenly, they were told to get busy again on the Sobell freedom campaign. And to start in the South. They proceeded to attempt to make it appear that Jewish, Catholic and Protestant church groups and Negro and labor organizations are interested in their drive.

SCHNEIDER WAS chosen by the Sobell Committee because of his union organizing experience. He once was an officer of the pro-Communist United Office and Professional Workers Union. When he went South recently, he contacted those union officials who would hear him.

He could name no one who had contacted Sobell with the exception of Leslie Cornell, who is head of the Watson Laboratories at Red Bank, New Jersey, and a Mr. Duncan, who is head of the Helipot Corporation. He stated that all of the contacts by the above-named parties were business contacts. Seay stated that he had taken classified information home on several occasions to work on it. He denied any Communist Party activities. The Bureau has been previously furnished the information testified to by Seay.

Cleveland, New York, and Washington Field should review files to ascertain what if any connection LEVERING has with this group and refer same to SOG and Cincinnati. SOG will then consider whether contact with Congressman would be desirable.

He said that [REDACTED] had explained that the messages went from Mexico City to Dallas and from there they went "underground" to Fort Worth. As the Bureau is aware, ANITA BRENNER is an authoress who was until recently married to Dr. DAVID GLUSKER of Mexico City. The couple no longer live together and it is not definitely known as to what the marital status is at present.

Since ANITA BRENNER's name has appeared from time to time in connection with Communist matters and since, particularly, her name has recently arisen in connection with the case of PAUL FRIDERICH KIRCHHOFF, with aliases, INTERNAL SECURITY - Mexico (Bufile 40-21495), it is felt that the attached material would be of interest.

One point which might merit clarification by the Legal Attache is that wherein it is said that GUS HALL had come to Dr. GLUSKER for an inoculation (page 5). This is believed to be actually a reference to an incident in the MORTON SOBELL espionage case.

The Legal Attache subsequently interviewed Dr. GLUSKER, but Dr. GLUSKER said he was unable to recall what might have prompted the SOBELL visit to his medical offices.

This girl born March 20, 1920, Chicago, Illinois, of Lithuanian parents, came to Washington, D. C. about February, 1941, and immediately thereafter appeared to have lived in apartment with BENJAMIN and ANNA GOODMAN ALLEN, 2225 N Street, N. W., both alleged Communists and members of front organizations. Name of one BERNICE GOODMAN LEVINE, 2225 N Street, N. W., appeared in indices National Federation for Constitutional Liberties, believed identical with subject LEVIN. Personnel files OEM reflect BERNICE LEVIN moved to 1685 Crescent Place, N. W., on September 9, 1942, her last Washington address. About November, 1941, LEVIN under treatment Dr. JOSEPH WILDER, 1211 Madison Avenue, NYC, and gave her address as 1240 Park Avenue, Apartment 3-F, (28), New York.

The indices of the Washington Field Office contain no record concerning BERNICE LEVIN. [REDACTED] (b)(7)(D)

K The 1942 Washington City Directory disclosed that one BERNICE LEVIN, reporter, resided at 2225 N Street, N. W., Apartment 400. The same directory disclosed Mrs. ANNA GOODMAN ALLEN resided at this address.

A review of the file entitled "ANNA GOODMAN ALLEN, WAS, INTERNAL SECURITY, HATCH ACT" disclosed that ANNA GOODMAN also known as Mrs. BENJAMIN ALLEN, had resided at 2225 N Street, N. W., for a number of years and that two girls, namely BERNICE LEVINE and ROSE MADISON lived with her in Apartment 400. Investigation at that time indicated that both ANNA ALLEN and ANNA GOODMAN, as well as her daughter, BEVERLY GOODMAN GOLDSCHMIDT, were alleged Communists, and that the ALLENS were members of numerous front organizations in Washington, D. C. (b)(7)(C) (b)(7)(D)

An informant, [REDACTED] advised that Mrs. ALLEN held regular meetings in her apartment, which she believed were Communist meetings, and mentioned that a number of Mrs. ALLEN'S friends who lived in the apartment house then or at one time were believed to be Communists and included MORTON SOBELL, ELAINE GOLDSTEIN, MAX ELICHTER, JACOB HERMAN, BERNARD KRUG, NETTIE SUCHER, IRVING KEISER, FLORENCE HERTZOG, and WILLIAM and ANDY REMINGTON (subjects in this case). This informant mentioned that the REMINGTONS had been very active and always possessed a great deal of literature in their room. (U)

From the above, it appears that BERNICE LEVIN and BERNICE GOODMAN LEVINE, may have been identical and that subject LEVIN found it convenient to use the name BERNICE GOODMAN LEVINE.

o/s The Washington Field Office files contain no record concerning four of the references given by BERNICE LEVIN mentioned above. However, a file appears under the name of BESSIE R. BROOKS, SECURITY MATTER - C, Milwaukee origin. A review of this file reflects that BESSIE BROOKS came to Milwaukee, Wisconsin from Washington, D. C. (or Baltimore) about May, 1943, and became employed as a stenographer in the CIO Offices in
