It is recalled that agents of this office contacted Reeves during the initial stage of the investigation concerning MORTON SOBELL. Considerable difficulty of the investigation concerning attempting to interview BELOCK.

not overly cooperative and attempted to minimize the situation with regard to SOBELL. At that time, BELOCK'S association with SOBELL and the subject's general background were discussed with various Reeves employees. He was generally characterized by them as being a brilliant man, astute in business, and the backbone of the corporation.

DELOCK began proselytizing Reeves employees. He was competing with Reeves on bids for government contracts and seriously hampered Reeves productivity by requesting their employees to slow down work.

Recent: inquiries at the Reeves Corporation concerning BELOCK have revealed that apparently in light of the situation created by BELOCK, the Reeves people have become incensed. It is obvious from various interviews that the Reeves Corporation realizes that the Belock Company is a real threat to their existence. It is suggested that Reeves may have considered that a form of retribution is to now inform the FBI of certain alleged irregularities on BELOCK'S part which were heretofore known, but were not reported during previous investigation.

It is further suggested that Reeves by condoning BELOCK'S alleged activities while employed there benefited from his services; now, however, he is a thorn in their side.

The above facts are being brought to the Bureau's attention not to minimize the allegations against the subject, but rather to give the Bureau an idea of the friction existing between these two organizations. It is believed the Bureau could be placed in an embarrassing position of having the Belock Company infer that the Reeves Coroporation used the FBI as an instrument to further their business enterprises while supressing those of a new and competitive firm.

The New York Office, unless advised to the contrary, will continue the espionage investigation on the subject. The Bureau is requested to advise this office of the action as desired in regard to the alleged violations of fraud against the government against the subject.

HARRY BELOCK was the former Executive Vice President and General Manager for the Reeves Instrument Corporation located in New York City. While at Reeves, BELOCK personally hired a number of Communists for key engineering positions, one of which was MORTON SOBELL, who was recently sentenced to a term of 30 years for violation of the espionage conspiracy statute. Upon leaving the employ of Reeves, BELOCK, although not authorized to do so, took with him a number of classified contracts and job specifications being produced by Reeves for the armed forces. Later BELOCK organized his own company known as the Belock Instrument Corporation located in College Point, Long Island, which he may Shortly after incorporating, his organization was awarded a classified namy contract. BELOCK is alleged to have a sister, MARY BELOCK CALE, who is a known member of the Communist Party. BELOCK advised an efficial at Reeves of his sister's participation in the Party and on occasions has boasted and condoned her activity. BELOCK is the only son in the BELOCK family and during 944 he was employed by the Signal Corps as an engineer. There is set forth below, for your information and assistance, the following pertinent data furnished to the Bureau by the New York Office concerning the captioned subjects

Harry Belock was the former Executive Vice President and General Manager for the Reeves Instrument Corporation located in New York City. While at Reeves, Belock personally hired a number of Communists for key engineering positions, one of whem. was Morton Sobell, who was recently sentenced to a term of 30 years for violation of the espionage conspiracy statute.

Upon leaving the employ of Reeves, Belock, although not authorised to do so, took with him a number of classified contracts and job specifications being produced by Reeves for the armed forces. Later Belock organised his own company known as the Belock Instrument Corporation located in College Point, Long Island, which he now operates. Shortly after incorporating, his organization was awarded a classified navy contract. Belock is alleged to have a sister, Mary Belock Gale, who is a known member of the Communist Party. Belock advised an official at Reeves of his sister's participation in the Party and on occasions has boasted and condoned her activity.

Belock is the only son in the Belock family and during 1944 he was employed by the Signal Corps as an engineer.





PURPOSE

To advise results of a telephone call received from ASAC Whalen, New York Office, at 5:30 P.M., March 22, 1951.

**DETAILS** 

On March 22, 1951, pursuant to your instructions, I took a call from ASAC Whalen, New York Office, at 5:30 P.M., at which time he related the following information concerning individuals working at the Reeves Instrument Company requested by the Bureau on March 21, 1951.

At the outset Mr. Whalen pointed out that any civilian contractor can hire whatever personnel he desires even though he is working on classified contracts for the armed forces and must get clearance before such individuals may work on such contracts. The procurement section of the Army, Navy, or Air Force, whichever has a contract with the facility involved, is responsible to see that security checks are made on employees who will be employed in or will have access to restricted areas.

Harry D. Belock

Belock was employed by the Reeves Company in 1944 and left in October, 1950.

When the Bureau directed a letter to the New York Office in 1948 with regard to the Procli Program on this particular concern, the New York Office contacted the president and the general manager at which time the jurisdiction of the FBI was explained to them. Me. Whalen pointed out that the company was eligible for contracts and whether they had them or not did not concern the office at that time as we did nothing more than explain the FBI's jurisdiction to them.

SAC Letter No. 62 dated August 31, 1950, regarding plant informants advised that all of our contacts in the Procli Program should be made plant informants.

No indices check was necessary at that time and even though a check had been made there was no derogatory information concerning Belock himself.

New York submitted a report on July 3, 1943, concerning this subject. A request was received for information from the Navy in 1947 and also from G-2 in the same year. Available information at that time was furnished to the Navy and G-2. It was pointed out by Mr. Whalen that information was made available to the interested agencies during the time Meyler was employed at the Reeves Company. In addition, Mr. Whalen pointed out that an investigative report had been received from the Navy in 1948 from the Third Naval District. He also stated that an LGE investigation was instituted on April 4, 1949, but was discontinued on April 21, 1949.

#### Lewis Reese

Reese was sales representative for the Reeves Company and the subject of a security investigation. Reports of our investigation were disseminated locally to ONT. OST. and G-2.

Reese was employed by the Reeves Company in April of 1948 and resigned February 23, 1951. The Army, Navy, and Air Force were aware of the fact that the FBI had a pending case on Reese and were alerted to the derogatory information available in the DIO files which had been previously disseminated by the Bureau. Reese was never given clearance. Reese was never authorized to have access to classified contracts because the Navy had not cleared him.

### Morton Sobell Pons. MICRTC ASOBELL

Clearance was issued for Sobell in 1949. However, a certificate of denial was later issued. Sobell appealed the issuance of this certificate and his case was brought before a three-man board in Washington, D. C. He subsequently received clearance.


The Navy actually wrote a letter to the admiral in charge of ONI making a particular protest of Sobell's case. Commander Lenhardt was particularly interested in Sobell's case. Mr. Whalen pointed out that the Bureau is in good shape with regard to Sobell inasmuch as the other intelligence agencies were furnished with pertinent information in this regard. The Navy is also in the clear" inasmuch as they had made several protests regarding Sobell.



WARFORD, entitled HAROLD DUCORE, Aka; LGE, dated 12/16/52 (Bufile 121-26108), which is a supplemental investigation requested by the Army, who advised DUCORE's case is being considered by the Army Loyalty-Security Screening Board along with other loyalty cases.

There was no additional substantial disloyal information developed during this supplemental investigation, and there was no information developed regarding a violation of the espionage statutes.

This case was presented to the Department of Justice on 10/17/51, and a reply was received from Assistant Attorney General JAMES M. MC INERNEY, Criminal Division, on 12/4/51, which noted there were no facts to support the belief that DUCORE was deliberately causing a delay in the development of radar equipment in the section he supervises at the Evans Signal Laboratory, Belmar, N. J.

J., the former organization having been reported as being highly infiltrated with Communists. DUCORE reportedly attended at least one meeting of the United Public Workers of America.

DUCORE has been interviewed with regard to MORTON SOBELL and JULIUS ROSENBERG, convicted espionage subjects. DUCORE attended CCNY in New York City during part of the time ROSENBERG and SOBELL were students and stated he vaguely recalled their photographs. DUCORE has never been interviewed concerning himself.

Investigation to date has developed no substantive information concerning which DUCORE could be interviewed. It is the opinion of the Newark Office that this case should be placed in a closed status.

of 1949, the JASIKs visited at the SOBELL residence in Flushing, New York and had spent several hours with the SOBELLs. Informant did not know whether SOBELL had ever approached HENRY JASIK to recruit him into espionage work but felt that it was a distinct possibility that he had done so, particularly because of the Communist Party sympathies of ESTHER JISIK. Informant continued by stating that no inquiries had ever been made concerning the subject but added there would have been no necessity to inquire about the subject since he was known to SOBELL.

MORTON SOBELL, mentioned above, was sentenced on April 5, 1951 to thirty years imprisonment for conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. SOBELL is presently incarcerated in Alcatraz Penitentiary, San Francisco, California.

When interviewed by Bureau Agents on June 30 and July 1, 1953, JASIK recalled that while residing in Washington, D.C. in 1939-1940, he had been introduced to MORTON SOBELL who was then residing in Washington, D.C. and was employed at the Bureau of Ordnance. He explained his contacts with SOBELL were extremely limited and was unable to furnish any information concerning SOBELL's activities.

His next contact with SOBELL, according to JASIK, occurred in the year 1949 at the meeting of the Institute of Radio and Electrical Engineers held in the Grand Central Palace, New York, New York. He termed this to be a casual meeting. His recontact with SOBELL occurred early in the Summer of 1949 at a neighborhood food store. Shortly thereafter, Mr. and Mrs. JASIK visited at the SOBELL residence in Flushing, New York. The SOBELLS in turn visited the JASIK residence, 67-18 J 195 Lane, Flushing, New York. This visit occurred in January or February, 1950.

JASIK believed that in the **Spring** of 1950, possibly about May, the JASIKS revisited the SOBELL residence. He explained the visits were all of a general nature and at no time did SOBELL appear to be attempting to obtain information concerning his (JASIK'S) work.

Investigation at Polytechnic Institute of Brooklyn, 90 "ivingston Street, reveals that in the Spring of 1950, during the period of February to June, MORTON SOBULL was instructor in the Electrical Engineering School. His class concerned the matter of "Feed Back Amplifiers." This class was held on Monday evening during the hours of 8200 P.M. to 10:00 P.M. in Room K-202.

Professor A. B. GIORDAMO, Electrical Engineering Department, Polytechnic Institute, advised that DONALD HERR had previously taught the class in Feed Back Amplifiers. HERR, according to GIORDAMO, was contemplating moving from New York City and had suggested the name of MORTON SOBELL as a substitute teacher. GIORDAMO, himself, did not recall that it actually came to pass that SOBELL taught here. He could only recall the fact that HERR had suggested SOBELL as a substitute teacher.

According to GIORDANO, TERR had been formerly employed by the Reeves Instrument Company, New York, New York, and presently operates the American Electronic



Manufacturing Company, 9503 West Jefferson Boulevard, Culver City, California.

Mrs. V. TALTS, Registrar's Office, in addition to making the above information available concerning SOBELL'S teaching at Polytechnic Institute, furnished the scholastic record for HENRY JASIK which reflected that in the Spring term of 1949-1950, JASIK was a student in the following classes:

There was no indication in the school records that he had attended the class in Feed Back Amplifiers taught by SOBELL. Attempts were made to determine the dates on which JASIK attended the school to determine if possible he was in attendance on the Monday evening when SOBELL taught. However, according to Mrs. TALTS, these records have been destroyed.

Mrs. TALTS also advised that on June 10, 1953, HENRY JASIK received a degree as a Dector of Electrical Engineering at Polytechnic Institute.

T-1, of known reliability, has advised that the subject had received correspondence from the following parties. This correspondence was received at his place of business, 30 Sylvester Street, Westbury, Long Island. It should be noted that JASIK presently is self-employed, operating as a consulting engineer.
