#### Writings

The following article captioned "Unprecedented Sentence", signed PAULINE BOYER, appeared in the Baltimore Sun on January 30, 1953. CP Line

"To The Editor of the Evening Sun--Sir: It is the unprecedented death sentence given to the Rosenbergs that disturbs and makes me uneasy. Never before in the history of our country has a civil court sentenced anyone to death for espionage. In cases similar to that of which the Rosenbergs were accused, no death penalties were imposed. David Greenglass, Harry Gold, Dr. Klaus Fuchs, all confessed spies, received comparatively light prison sentences. Ruth Greenglass, who admitted her guilt under oath, was never brought to trial.

"Most incongruous of all, ten years' imprisonment was deemed sufficient punishment for Tokyo Rose and Axis Sally, guilty of treason during World War II. Many Nazi slaughterers of American war prisoners, 6,000,000 Jewish community has continued Jews and numberless others have felt the grace of American mercy and had their sentences

"The Supreme Court's refusal, with Justice Elack dissenting, to review the death sentence of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. is a monstrous decision. comes as a climax to a fraudulent prosecution by the Department of Justice and a trial rigged in anatmosphere of hysteria ....

"The Rosenbergs, the first Americans ever to be given the death sentence in peace time on such charges, were the victims of a plot to whip up a war drive and promote repression and anti-Semitism here at home.

"Even those who are not certain of the real facts in the case. are nevertheless horrified by the treatment given these two Jewish parents of small children. Virtually, the entire the savagery of the sentence.

commuted. In view of this, I feel that it would be a grave transgression of the laws of mankind to single the Rosenbergs out for death and orphan their two small children.

"It has been pointed out by logal and other eminent authorities who studied the court record, that irregularities occurred during the trial. I think that too many doubts have been raised to risk irrevocably destroying the only chance of ever righting a wrong, if one has been done. Men of stature of Albort Einstein, Dr. Harold Urey, Rabbi Abba Hilled Silver, and many others have expressed great concern over the fate of the Rosenbergs and have spoken out for clemency. I parnestly hope our Prosident will exercise the fullest measure of mercy and commute the death sentence.

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



Confidential Informant T-8

Baltimore: Committee to Urge Clemency for the Rosenbergs, aka Baltimore Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg-Sobell Case

On May 13, 1954, Confidential Informant T-8, of known rolliability, advised that the Communist Party-USA issued instructions during December, 1952, that the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case should be given all-out support by Communist Farty members, and that Communist Party members should participate in overy way possible in support of ... activities to secure clemency for JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. T-8 stated that the Baltimore Committee to Urge Clemency in the Rosenborg Case was controlled and dominated by members of District 4, Communist Party, and that the local organization was affiliated with the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case. T-8 stated that the Baltimore organization changed its name to the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg-Sobell Case during 1953 in order to work on behalf of MORTON SOBELL and that as of 1954 the local organization continued to be active.

#### Confidential Informant T-7

Informant advised in December, 1952 MILTON BATES, Supra, told him there were 5,000 leaflets from the Rosenberg Committee at PAULINE BOYER's home to be distributed within the next few days. According to the informant, BATES stated that the leaflets are copies of a message drawn up by several leading Rabbis and addressed to the President in reference to saving the lives of the Rosenbergs.

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Informant advised on 4/2/53 that he received the following "Amicus Brief" from PAULINE BOYER on 4/1/53. The instant Brief is herein set out.

"AMICUS BRIEF#

#### IN THE ROSENBERG CASE

"We believe that the trial of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL on a charge of conspiring to commit espionage which resulted in death sentences for the ROSENBERGS and a 30 year sentence for their co-defendant, lacked guarantees of fairness which all Americans have a right to expect under the Constitution.

"The U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals has called the Prosecutor's conduct 'reprehensible.' Justice JEROME N. FRANK stated, 'There are substantial Questions of law. I would certainly not want to preclude their appeal to the Supreme Court. I would not want that to be on my conscience.'

"The F.B.I. admitted on December 2, 1952, that an important witness committed perjury under eath. Scientists all over the world call into doubt the scientific value of the alleged evidence and its credibility.

"We believe that transient political and social passions have no place in our courts; and to deprive even one American of the right to a fair trial is to injure the rights of all Americans.

"We therefore authorize the inclusion of our names in an Amicus Brief to the Supreme Court of the United States, petitioning that the verdict be set aside, and that a new trial be ordered based on Constitutional guarantees of impartiality and fairness in accordance with the best traditions of American justice.

The informant advised the instant letter specified that the forwarding of any monetary contribution could be sent payable to Mrs. PAULINE BOYER, Post Office Box 2521, Arlington Station, Baltimore 15, Md.

#### Confidential Informant T-9

Informant advised on 2/6/53 that on 12/24/52 PHIL BOYER requested him to go to Washington, D.C. to picket the White House in an endeavor to get President TRUMAN to save the lives of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. According to the informant, BOYER stated that his wife, PAULINE BOYER was a member of the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case. Informant continued that PAULINE BOYER was in Washington, D.C. on 12/28/52 to picket the White House, but that he did not observe her on the picket line.

Informant advised on 6/22/54 he attended the Rosenberg Memorial rally on 6/19/54 at Morgan Hall, Pennsylvania and North Avenues, Baltimore. Present was PAULINE BOYER.

#### Confidential Informant T-10

Informant advised on 2/16/53 that he attended a meeting of the Beltimore Committee to Urge Clemency for the Rosenbergs on 2/11/53 at the Little Folks Theater, 1314 West North Avenue, Baltimore, Md. Present was PAULINE BOYER, who was Chairman of the meeting, and who introduced the speaker, HELEN SOBELL, wife of MORTON SOBELL, arrested and tried with the Rosenbergs.

Informant advised on 3/26/54 he received a letter dated 3/13/54 signed by PAULINE BOYER, Secretary, Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL in the Rosenberg Case. Informant advised this letter was received by him through the mail.

Informant advised on 5/20/54 he visited 1703 Gwynns Falls Parkway, the residence of PHIL and PAULINE BOYER, and observed numerous books on display which he described as a representative selection of Communist, pro-Communist, and "Progressive" literature. According to the informant, PAULINE BOYER requested him to sign a petition calling for the removal of MORTOW SOBELL from Alcatraz to some other penal institution.

Freedom Associates, Inc., located at 139 W. 125th Street, New York, New York, has chapters located in various cities in the United States. The organization issues a monthly publication called "Freedom".


"Freedom", a monthly newspaper published by Freedom Associates, was introduced in November, 1950. The purpose of this publication is promoting Negro matters; the selecting and writing of all material from the viewpoint that it is interesting rather than necessary to the Negro workers; and the importance to the Negro people of their alliance with the labor movement of the working class. ("The Worker", issue of December 31, 1950. "The Worker: is the Sunday edition of the "Daily Worker", an east coast Communist newspaper.)

Confidential Informant T-31, of known reliability, advised in December, 1950, that the editorial board of "Freedom" newspaper was composed of Communist Party members and Communist Party sympathizers. According to T-31, "Freedom" was intended as a replacement for the Harlem edition of "The Worker". T-31 further advised in January, 1953, that PAUL ROBESON was chairman of the editorial board and writes the main article for "Freedom".

Informant advised on May 18, 1954, he attended a meeting of the State Executive Committee of the Progressive Party of Maryland on May 10, 1954, at 1703 Gwynn Falls Parkway, Baltimore, Maryland. Present was PAULINE BOYER.


Informant advised on May 25, 1954, he attended a meeting of the Finance Committee of the Progressive Party of Maryland on

May 17, 1954, at 1703 Gwynns Fails Parkway, Baltimore, Maryland Present was PAULINE BOYER who explained the MORTON SOBELL case and stated that the Rosenberg-Sobell Committee is working in Baltimore to have SOBELL moved out of Alcatraz. She stated the Rosenberg-Sobell Committee was going to have meetings at her house on Tuesday evening, May 18, 1954, and Saturday evening, May 22, 1954. She invited everyone to attend the meeting on Saturday and asked that everyone donate food or money as it was to be a fund-raising party. She also mentioned that the Rosenberg-Sobell Committee is having a meeting on June 19, 1954, in Baltimore, Md. with a speaker from New York. Informant stated he believed from the way PAULINE spoke that she was a main figure behind the Rosenberg-Sobell Committee.

B. Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case

Concerning the above committee the following information is set forth:

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, with DAVID GREENGLASS, ANATOLI YAKOLEV, and MORTON SOBELL, were indicted



on July 17, 1950, for conspiring between 1944 and 1950, to violate Title 50, United States Code, Section 34, by combining to communicate to the USSR documents and sketches relating to the national defense of the United States with intent and reason to believe that it would be used to the advantage of the USSR. The ROSENBERGs were sentenced to death and were executed on June 19, 1953, and MORTON SOBELL, a co-defendant, was sentenced to thirty years in prison. The Washington Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case is an affiliate of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.

Confidential informant T-12, in 1953, reported that the New York headquarters of the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg-Sobell Case was advised that the Rosenberg-Sobell Committee of Washington, D. C., was formed for the purpose of continuing the fight to vindicate the ROSENBERGS; to free MORTON SOBELL; and to establish a fund for the ROSENBERG children.

Confidential informant T-13, on May 13, 1954, advised that the CP USA issued instructions during December, 1952, that the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case should be given all-out support by CP members, and that CP members should participate in every way possible in support of activities to secure clemency for JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. The informant stated that the Baltimore Committee to Urge Clemency in the Rosenberg Case was controlled, and dominated by members of District No. 4, CP, and that the local organization was affiliated with the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case. The informant stated that the Baltimore organization changed its name to the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg-Sobell Case, during 1953, in order to work on behalf of MORTON SOBELL, and that as of 1954, the local organization continued to be active.

Confidential informant T-7 advised that on May 10, 1953, the subject attended a "clemency concert" sponsored by the Washington Committee to Secure Justice for the Rosenbergs which was held at Odd Fellows Hall, 9th and T Streets, N. W. According to the informant the "facts" of

the ROSENBERG case were reviewed.

(Confidential informant T-8 can corroborate the subject's attendance at the above concert.)

Confidential informant T-7 advised that on June 19, 1953, the subject took part in picketing the White House which picketing was sponsored by the Washington Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.

Confidential informant T-6 reported that on April 7, 1954, the subject attended a mass meeting held at Odd Fellows Hall, 9th and T Streets, N. W., sponsored by the Rosenberg-Sobell Committee of Washington, D. C. According to the informant the subject took part in a skit attempting to show how MORTON SOBELL was being treated in Alcatraz.

(Confidential informants T-5 and T-7 can corroborate the subject's presence at the above meeting.)

Confidential informant T-5 advised that the subject was among those present at a New Year's party sponsored by the Rosenberg-Sobell Committee of Washington, D. C., and held at 4230 Chesapeake Street, N. W. According to the informant those present were asked to contribute money and a total of \$350 was collected.

Confidential informant T-14 advised that on June 19, 1954, the subject attended a meeting of the Rosenberg-Sobell Committee of Baltimore, Maryland, held at the Little Folks Theater in Baltimore, Maryland.

Confidential Informant T-2 advised that in January 1952 the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case was formed. The claim of the committee was that the ROSENBERGS were convicted because they were sews and because of their political beliefs. According to T-2 the aim of the committee was to secure a new trial for clemency for the ROSENBERGS.

Confidential Informant T-2 also advised in January 1952 that the subject was one of the organizers of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case. Informant further stated that as soon as the committee was set up the subject retired from it.

"The Worker" dated March 9, 1952, page 8, column 1, section 1, contained an advertisement sponsored by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case announcing a public meeting "to hear the truth in the Rosenberg case" to be held at 135 West 70th Street, New York City, on March 12, 1952. #### **APPENDIX**

#### COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE FOR MORTON SOBELL

"Following the execution of atomic spies ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG in June, 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon MORTON SOBELL,' the ROSENBERGS' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case - a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953 and then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg case'..."

("Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" dated January 2, 1957, issued by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, page 60.)

In September, 1954, the name "National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sebell" appeared on literature issued by the Committee. In March, 1955, the current name, "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sebell", first appeared on literature issued by the Committee.

The 1959-1960 Borough of Manhattan telephone directory lists the "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" as being located at 940 Broadway, New York, New York.

A scurce advised that the Seattle Sobell Committee was fermed during April, 1959, by an organizer of the Sobell Committee from Los Angeles. JODY HEATLIE, a member of the Socialist Workers Party in Seattle, was named Chairman, and CAROLINE CANAFAX was named Secretary.

The Socialist Workers Party and the Communist Party have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

A second source advised that CAROLINE CANAFAX was a member of the Communist Party in November, 1959, in Seattle.

A third source advised that the Seattle Sobell Committee met at Seattle on April 21, 1960.

This same source advised that this Committee's purpose since its inception has been to raise funds and obtain public support for the release of MORTON SOBELL from prison.

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On October 15, 1971, Subject attended a PW benefit at the Glide Memorial Church, 330 Ellis Street, San Francisco, to honor MORTON SOBELL, who also was the main speaker. SOBELL spoke of his imprisonment and his desire to come to San Francisco to thank the prople who had worked to free him.

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ANGELA DAVIS is a self-admitted member of the Southern California District, CP, USA (SCDCP), who faces murder - kidnapping charges at Marin County, California.

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This Committee's avowed purpose is to commemorate the memory of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, and to secure the release from prison of MORTON SOBELL, all of whom have been convicted in U. S. District Court of violation of the Espionage Act of 1917, in that they conspired to transmit United States atomic data to the USSR.
