95 In the memorandum from Mr. Clegg to Mr. Tolson dated 10/20/53 in the matter entitled, "Suspected Espionage, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey and Federal Telecommunications Laboratories, Nutley, New Jersey," it was recommended and approved that the "Domestic Intelligence Division should obtain and promptly review the findings of the McCarthy Committee with a view to determining whether any information not previously known to the Bureau regarding matters within its jurisdiction has been developed by this committee. The details should be promptly brought to the attention of the Director and in the event it appears this committee has obtained such information an explanation should be given as to why the Bureau did not know about it."

In order that the Domestic Intelligence Division can discharge its responsibilities there is attached hereto Photostats of pages 484 to 519 of the McCarthy Committee proceedings containing the testimony of the above captioned subject on 10-13-53. This testimony should be reviewed by the substantive Supervisor who should thereafter submit a memorandum analyzing the results of this review.

Where there has been substantial information not previously known to the Bureau developed in this testimony and an explanation is required in accordance with the above instructions, the explanation should accompany the memorandum of analysis.

Copies of all memoranda submitted as a result of this review should be designated for F. L. Jones, Room 2710, and D. J. Sullivan, Room 7644. Copies also should be designated for Bureau file 65-61685 and for the subject's case file.

As indicated above, this review should be handled in a most expeditious manner. The copies of the testimony should be attached to the memorandum of analysis.

FRANK PRIMA, Civilian Assistant for Inspection, Signal Corps Supply Agency, 225 South 18th Street, Philadelphia, Pa., advised November 23, 1953, that he recognized the subject's name as one of three thousand Signal Corps Inspectors who were under his indirect supervision during World War II. He said he does not recall having any personal contact with LEVITSKY or remember him as an individual and advised that he was unable to furnish any additional information concerning him.

In regard to JULIUS ROSENBERG, executed Soviet espionage agent, PRIMA stated that he recalled ROSENBERG as one of the inspectors for the Signal Corps during World War II and that the same comments he furnished regarding the subject applied to ROSENBERG.

PRIMA stated that unless an inspector rose very rapidly to a supervisory position or was involved in a personnel situation, his attention would not be drawn to the individual. He said that in the normal situation he would have little or no contact with the average inspector.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

JOSEPH LEVITSKY on 11/24/53 testified at a public hearing held in NYC by the Senate Permanent Subcommittee On Investigations (McCARTHY Committee). LEVITSKY admitted using the name of JULIUS ROSENBERG as a reference to secure employment at plant identified by Senator Mc CARTHY as (Federal) Telecommunications Laboratory, Nutley, NJ. He refused to answer 22 questions dealing with espionage, claiming the 5th Amendment against self-incrimination. LEVITSKY, while employed by the Federal Works Agency in 1940 used the name **JOSEPH LARKIN**.

DETAILS: The "New York Journal-American", a daily newspaper published in New York City, edition of November 24, 1953, carried the following article which reads in part as follows:

"Ex-U. S. Aide Balks McCarthy Mornmouth Quiz, by Howard Rushmore.

"A former Government scientist, who as recently as last February worked at a plant engaged in secret projects, today refused to tell whether he was a spy or a Communist, or whether he had committed espionage 'in the past thirty years.

"The witness, JOSEPH LEVITSKY of 65 Rutgers Pl., River Edge, N. J., also declined an answer when asked if, after the arrest of ~~Executed~~ traitor JULIUS ROSENBERG, he exclaimed, 'There, but for the grace of God, go I.' . . .

"Statement Read. /

"The hearings are being conducted by Senator McCARTHY (R. - Wis.), chairman of the Senate Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations, in the Federal Courthouse in Foley Square. . . .

". . . About the only admission LEVITSKY made was that he knew ROSENBERG and used his name as a reference when he sought jobs as an electronics engineer.

"At times haughty and belligerent, LEVITSKY took refuge behind the Fifth Amendment in refusing answers to vital questions.

"The hearing was televised, but the cameras were turned away from LEVITSKY at the demand of his attorney, LEONARD BODIN. /

"At the outset, McCARTHY told LEVITSKY that 'some very serious charges have been made against you in executive session regarding espionage, Communist conspiracies and Communist activities.

"LEVITSKY countered with a long statement, challenging the 'legality' of the committee to question him, charging it was taking over the function of 'a grand jury.'

"'Are you serious?' was LEVITSKY's sarcastic reply.

"'Did you ever sign a statement which read in part, 'I agree to submit to the Communist Party and engage in activities regarding its work?' McCARTHY asked.

"Can I see it first?" LEVITSKY asked. 0/5

"Do you mean you might run the risk of committing perjury before admitting signing it?" McCARTHY demanded.

"LEVITSKY then declined to answer.

"Other refusals included whether LEVITSKY was ever a member of a Communist ring with ROSENBERG; whether he ever asked any person to commit espionage; if he had introduced three persons to ROSENBERG and attempt to recruit them as spies; and whether on March 9 and 11 of this year, he had discussed with a 'HARRY HYMAN' the recruitment of others for espionage work. 125

"HYMAN was not further identified. But McCARTHY ordered BOUDIN to produce him tomorrow under a threat of contempt if he didn't. 0/5

"LEVITSKY also refused to answer when asked if he knew 'CARL GREENBLUM' and if he took GREENBLUM to New York and introduced him to three members of the ROSENBERG espionage ring.

"ROSENBERG and his wife, ETHEL, were electrocuted last June for giving atomic secrets to the Russians."

In addition to the above the "New York Herald-Tribune" of November 25, 1953, in an article captioned "Engineer Defies Probe By McCARTHY On Spies," stated in part as follows:

"... The engineer - the only witness really 'grilled' yesterday - was identified as JOSEPH LEVITSKY, of 65 Rutgers Place, River Edge, New Jersey, who worked for the Signal Corps in Philadelphia from 1940 to 1943 and until last February for an International Telephone and Telegraph Company subsidiary doing government work. 0/5

"He admitted he had been friendly with ROSENBERG but claimed he was 'innocent of any crime.' He refused to answer twenty-two questions dealing with espionage, claiming the Fifth Amendment against self-incrimination and challenging the jurisdiction of the Senate Permanent Investigations subcommittee to ask such questions.

JOEL BARR, Identification Number 569059, Hopkins Avenue, Brooklyn, New York on September 29, 1938, was requested by the WPA to report for work on September 30, 1938, at Project W.P. WSSS-3, described as a sub-surface survey of streets of New York City. BARR was classified as a junior draftsman - 242. He was assigned to Project Number 665-97-3-32. On May 24, 1939, the WPA prepared reclassification slip for JOEL BARR, 553 Hopkins Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. His identification number at the time was 569059R. He was then working as a junior draftsman Grade 242 on Project 665-97-3-32 at 35 East 58 Street, Manhattan. At the time he was reclassified from the previously-mentioned grade to draftsman Grade 419.

On March 15, 1940, a notice of termination for BARR's employment was prepared by the Federal Works Agency, inasmuch as BARR had resigned for outside employment. At that time BARR held Identification Number 569059 - relief.

Concerning JOEL BARR, previously mentioned, it is to be noted that DAVID GREENGLASS, who is presently serving a 15 year sentence for transmitting certain classified data relating to the atomic bomb project at Los Alamos, New Mexico, to HARRY GOLD, a confessed Soviet spy has advised as follows:

GREENGLASS learned through conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG, executed Soviet Agent, that during the period 1946 - 50 ROSENBERG was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage. GREENGLASS learned from JULIUS ROSENBERG that JOEL BARR was an active Soviet espionage agent in the United States. BARR in July, 1948, left the United States for Europe ostensibly to study music. In June, 1950, BARR left his Paris residence and has not been seen since. During 1940 BARR was a laboratory technician employed by the United States Signal Corps, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey.

HODES stated that he attended City College in New York from 1932 - 1937, at which time he received a degree in Electrical Engineering. Following graduation HODES was employed from 1939 - 1940 at the Naval Gun Factory, Washington, D. C. From 1940 to 1943 he was employed by the Signal Corps as an inspector in which capacity he worked in Brooklyn, New York, Newark, Philadelphia, Chicago and Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. In 1943 - 1946 HODES served in the United States Navy. Following his separation he attended an institution of higher learning in California and in 1950 was attending the University of Chicago.

HODES stated that MORTON SOBELL was vaguely familiar to him as a fellow student at the City College of New York, College of Engineering, and it was his recollection that SOBELL had been in his class in electrical engineering. To the best of HODES' recollection, he met SOBELL in 1935 or 1936 and he stated that he did not become friendly with SOBELL, since all of his associations were classroom associations. HODES pointed out that there was little or no social activity at the College of Engineering, City College of New York, most of the students living at home and commuting by subway to the institution. As a result, he said, he did not develop any close personal friends during this period when he was at City College of New York.

A photograph of MORTON SOBELL was displayed to Mr. HODES and he stated that the photograph resembled the MORTON SOBELL that he had known at the City College of New York.

A photograph of JULIUS ROSENBERG was displayed to Mr. HODES. HODES stated that the individual pictured resembled an individual whom he vaguely recalled as having known at the City College of New York. HODES stated that his recollection of this man was very vague with respect to the City College of New York and it was his impression that he had known ROSENBERG while both might have been employed by the United States Signal Corps as inspectors. HODES added that, to the best of his recollection, he felt he had met or come to know ROSENBERG while both were undergoing a two week course of instruction at the Signal School of the United States Army located at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. HODES said that he was unable to recall any activities either at the City College of New York or in the Signal Corps on the part of JULIUS ROSENBERG.

ISIDORE HODES, Research Associate in Physics, Univ. of Ill., Urbana, advised he attended CCNY 1934-38 and while there was acquainted with JULIUS ROSENBERG, MORTON SOBELL, CARL GREENBLUM, Et Al. HODES acquainted with LEVITSKY from approximately Oct., 1940 to March, 1941 as fellow student and employee of Signal Corps and had limited social contact with him from March, 1943 to March, 1946. HODES advised GREENBLUM was classmate at CCNY and fellow employee in Signal Corps from summer 1940 to March, 1941, and social acquaintance from March, 1943 to March, 1946. Unable to furnish any information concerning subversive activities at CCNY on part of LEVITSKY or GREENBLUM. HODES denies ever having attended dinner party at JULIUS ROSENBERG apartment during period both were students at Fort Monmouth in 1940. Information concerning service in U. S. Navy 1943-46 set out. HODES unable to recall any such individuals as AARON H. COLEMAN as student at CCNY 1934-38.

INTERVIEW OF ISIDORE HODES

I. YOUNG COMMUNIST LEAGUE ACTIVITIES AT COLLEGE OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK

ISIDORE HODES, Research Associate in Physics, University of Illinois, Urbana, Illinois, advised that he has been so employed since September, 1, 1953.

HODES advised that he attended the College of the City of New York from 1934 to 1938, receiving the Bachelor of Science Degree in February, 1938. While at CCNY, HODES stated he was never aware of or connected with activities of the Young Communist League. HODES advised he was never approached by any person at CCNY and asked to join the Young Communist League. He was acquainted with ~~STANLEY RICH~~, ~~JULIUS ROSENBERG~~, ~~MORTON SOBELL~~, and ~~GERALD MOLEAR~~, but does not recall of these individuals having been connected with the Young Communist League while he knew them as students at CCNY. HODES stated he faintly recalls ~~WILLIAM DANZIGER~~, ~~NATHAN SUSSMAN~~, and ~~JOEL BARR~~ as having possibly been acquaintances of his while at CCNY. He could not remember ever being associated with ~~J. GARFINCKEL~~ or ~~M. BOYLEN~~ while at CCNY.

II. EMPLOYMENT - NAVAL GUN FACTORY, WASHINGTON, D. C., 1939-1940

HODES advised that subsequent to his graduation in February, 1938 from CCNY, he took many Civil Service examinations, and in February, 1939 received an appointment as a welding engineer at the Naval Gun Factory, Washington, D. C. During the period February, 1938 to February, 1939 he was unemployed. HODES stated that he was not associated with ~~JULIUS ROSENBERG~~, ~~JOEL BARR~~, ~~STANLEY RICH~~, ~~MAX ELICHTER~~, or ~~MORTON SOBELL~~ while employed at the Naval Gun Factory from February, 1939 to March, 1940.

HODES stated that his close associates while at the Naval Gun Factory were:

1. ~~CHARLES LINDEN~~ (phonetic), Junior Engineer, Production Office, who resided with HODES in Washington, D. C.
2. Three or four other Junior Engineers in Production Office, whose names HODES could not recall.

III. CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING OBTAINING EMPLOYMENT AT SIGNAL CORPS - 1940

HODES advised that while still employed at the Naval Gun Factory he filed application for position in his field of training which was as an electrical engineer. He could not recall whether the application form submitted by him specified employment in the Signal Corps.

In March, 1940 he received appointment with the Signal Corps as a civilian engineer and was sent first to Brooklyn, New York, where he was assigned as a travelling inspector to visit plants manufacturing radio parts for the Signal Corps, and make tests to determine if specifications were being met. The area covered by HODES was the northeastern part of the country. HODES advised that when there was a shortage of work he would return to Brooklyn, where he would sit around the Signal Corps office until work became available.

IV. ASSOCIATES WHILE AT SIGNAL CORPS TRAINING SCHOOL, FORT MONMOUTH

HODES advised that sometime in the fall of 1940 he was assigned, with other Signal Corps inspectors, to attend a training school at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, which lasted for approximately one month. HODES recalled the names of the persons listed below as having attended this class also:

V. RESIDENCE WHILE AT FORT MONMOUTH TRAINING SCHOOL

HODES advised on first arriving at Fort Monmouth he stayed in a single room in a hotel in Long Branch, the name of which he does not recall. It is possible that CARL GREENBLUM stayed at this hotel also, but HODES advised he recalls the names of no other fellow students who resided there.

He stated that JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife did not stay at the hotel but advised that both those who lived in the hotel and those who lived in other places ate dinner together often in the hotel dining room.

After a short period in the Hotel, HODES stated he moved to a private residence in Deal, New Jersey, a city adjacent to Long Branch. He advised that approximately three other students resided in this residence, operated by a lady whose name he could not recall who served breakfast and packed lunches for the roomers. HODES stated that the three fellow students residing with him in Deal were among those identified by him from the group photograph. HODES stated that he owned a 1934 Ford Roadster Coupe with rumble seat, in which he daily drove the three other students residing with him to work daily at Fort Monmouth.

VI. GENERAL ACTIVITIES WHILE AT FORT MONMOUTH

Dinner With ROSENBERGs

HODES advised that his closest associate while at this training school was CARL GREENBLUM, who he had known from classes at CCNY. HODES stated that on week ends he went home to Brooklyn where his family resided at 718 Alabama Avenue.

HODES stated that he cannot recall ever having been invited to anyone's apartment for dinner while he was assigned at Fort Monmouth. He specifically stated he never had dinner in the ROSENBERGs' apartment or JOEL BARR's apartment. HODES reiterated that he had no idea where the ROSENBERGs resided while JULIUS ROSENBERG was assigned to Fort Monmouth.

HODES stated that it is possible that he could have stopped in at the apartment of any fellow student or employee at Fort Monmouth for an evening but never for dinner. HODES stated he could not recall specifically ever visiting in anyone's apartment for the evening while at Fort Monmouth.

HODES advised that there were few eating places in the vicinity of Fort Monmouth and that the Signal Corps student inspectors often ate together, either in the hotel dining room or restaurants. HODES advised he recalls having eaten dinner with JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG under such circumstances, however, he cannot recall any specific date or place and has no recollection of any conversation that might have taken place between those dining together.

VII. ASSIGNMENT TO PHILADELPHIA OFFICE - SIGNAL CORPS - LATE 1940 TO MARCH, 1941

Acquaintances

HODES advised that on completion of his training at Fort Monmouth in late 1940 he was transferred to the Philadelphia Office of the Signal Corps and assigned to inspection duties at the RCA Plant, Camden, New Jersey.

HODES stated the following persons from the training school were also assigned to Philadelphia with him and worked at the RCA Plant:

1. MARCUS EPSTEIN
2. CARL GREENBLUM
3. LEONARD DI SESA
4. JOSEPH LEVITSKY
5. ~~AL WALKER~~

HODES stated that he does not recall the following persons being assigned to the Philadelphia office of the Signal Corps during the period he worked there from late 1940 to March, 1941:

1. JULIUS ROSENBERG
2. ~~KERMIT BYNES~~
3. ~~SIDNEY METZGER~~

Places of Residence

HODES stated on first arriving in Philadelphia he, along with most of the other personnel from the Signal Corps Training School who were assigned to the Philadelphia office, resided in a hotel, the name of which he could not recall, until they located more permanent quarters. He stated that LEVITSKY resided in this hotel.

HODES advised that in a short time he moved to an apartment in the vicinity of 18th Street, south of the main East and West street of Philadelphia and South and West of the center of the city. He advised that this apartment was several flights up from the ground floor in an old tenement-type building and contained two bedrooms, living room and a wall kitchen.

HODES advised that the following persons shared this apartment with him:

1. MARCUS EPSTEIN
2. CARL GREENBLUM
3. (Name unknown) Person whose name he cannot recall but who had attended Signal Corps training at Fort Monmouth and had been assigned with him to Philadelphia.

HODES stated that neither LEVITSKY or JULIUS ROSENBERG lived in the same apartment with him while in Philadelphia. He advised that LEVITSKY lived in the same general neighborhood and that LEONARD DI SESA also lived in another nearby apartment.

HODES advised that in March, 1941 he was reassigned to a plant in Marion, Indiana, at which time he moved out of the apartment in Philadelphia. He stated he does not know who took over his place after he left the apartment.

Car Pool

HODES advised that while residing in Philadelphia he rode to work in a car pool. The car most generally used was owned by MARCUS EPSTEIN, make and model unknown. Occasionally they would use his car, a 1934 Ford Roadster.

HODES stated the members of this car pool were:

1. MARCUS EPSTEIN
2. CARL GREENBLUM
3. LEONARD DI SESA
4. AL WALKER
5. JOSEPH LEVITSKY (probably)
6. Himself

HODES stated that any of the Signal Corps inspection personnel who resided in the vicinity of the apartment occupied by him and EPSTEIN, Et Al, could have ridden in the car pool at various times.

He stated that on week ends he would ride with EPSTEIN and other members of the car pool who were going to New York City to spend the week end. On Friday evenings he would get out of the car after EPSTEIN had driven well into Brooklyn. When returning from a week end in Brooklyn, HODES advised he recalls going from Brooklyn by subway to the Holland Tunnel, where EPSTEIN would pick him up en route to Philadelphia.

HODES advised that he does not recall JULIUS ROSENBERG riding in this car pool at any time, either to or from work or on week ends when going to Brooklyn.

VIII. MEMBERSHIP IN FEDERATION OF ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, CHEMISTS AND TECHNICIANS SOCIETY

OK

HODES advised that he does not recall being a member of this organization while at CCNY. He stated it is possible he was a member of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians during his senior year at CCNY, but that if he was a member he was not active in the organization.

HODES stated he could not recall knowing of JULIUS ROSENBERG being associated with or active in this organization.

IX. MILITARY SERVICE U. S. NAVY, MARCH, 1943 TO MARCH, 1946

HODES advised he was commissioned an Ensign in the USNR at New York City in March, 1943 and served until March, 1946, at which time he was released from active duty with the rank of Lieutenant Junior Grade.

Duty Stations

HODES advised he was assigned to the following stations on the dates listed:

March to April, 1944
6. U.S.S. Piedmont - Destroyer Tender - Radar Officer
May, 1944 to December, 1945 (Pacific Area)
7. Terminal Leave and Discharge from USN
December, 1945 to March, 1946

HODES stated that his closest associates while on duty in the United States Navy were one HAROLD RING, Lieutenant Junior Grade, a fellow radar officer aboard ship, and other officers whose names he cannot recall.

HODES advised that, with the following exceptions, he did not maintain contact or associate with the individuals he worked with while in the Signal Corps at Fort Monmouth or Philadelphia:

ASSOCIATION WITH LEVITSKY

HODES advised that he either met LEVITSKY at Fort Monmouth or possibly on some small inspection job that he accompanied LEVITSKY on when he was working out of the New York Signal Corps office in the summer of 1940. HODES stated he was associated with LEVITSKY as a student at the Fort Monmouth training school and also while assigned to the Philadelphia office of the Signal Corps until March, 1941. He advised that he has had no further contact with LEVITSKY, either professional or social, with the exception of the three incidents in March, 1943, February, 1944, and March, 1945, previously described herein.

HODES stated that, as he recalls, LEVITSKY's closest associates were:

1. MARION EPSTEIN
2. CARL GREENBLUM

3. JULIUS ROSENBERG

HODES stated he can recall the names of no other associates of LEVITSKY.

HODES advised that to the best of his knowledge he, HODES, was possibly acquainted with a person by the name of JOEL BARR while at CCNY, but that he cannot recall the name JOEL BARR being associated with LEVITSKY. It was pointed out to HODES that on October 5, 1950 he had stated the name JOEL BARR was familiar to him as a student at CCNY who had been in his classes. HODES advised that as of this date he has only a faint recollection of a person by the name JOEL BARR.

HODES stated that to his knowledge LEVITSKY never engaged in any Communist or subversive activity, and that LEVITSKY certainly never said or did anything that would lead him to think LEVITSKY was sympathetic to the Communist Party. HODES stated that he considered LEVITSKY to be liberal, based on statements and views expressed by LEVITSKY.

HODES stated that he has never been requested to furnish a recommendation for LEVITSKY or any other associate from the Signal Corps and that he has never given any recommendation in connection with employment applications for LEVITSKY or other associates from the Signal Corps.

XI. ASSOCIATIONS WITH CARL GREENBLUM

HODES advised that CARL GREENBLUM was a classmate of his at CCNY and that both worked on class problems in the same laboratory. He stated that he cannot recall GREENBLUM being connected with the Young Communist League while at CCNY. HODES stated that GREENBLUM was very much like LEVITSKY in that he

D. The Cleveland Sobell Committee

The National Committee to Secure
Justice in the Rosenberg Case, (NCSJRC)
Aka., The National Committee to Secure
Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg
Case, National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee,
The Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were
convicted in the United States District Court, Southern

District of New York, on March 29, 1951, of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. The ROSENBERGS were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951, and MORTON SOBELL to 30 years imprisonment on the same date. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953, and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California.

~~XXXXXXXXXX~~, a newspaper reporter with the "New York Journal - America" advised in January, 1952, that the NCSJRC was formed on January 2, 1952, for the purpose of obtaining a new trial for the ROSENBERGS.

Source T-9 on June 7, 1954, advised that the NCSJRC was attempting to keep alive the ROSENBERG case and fight for the release of MORTON SOBELL. Source stated that the Communist Party takes an extremely active part in assisting the committee.

Source T-10 advised on June 15, 1954, that the Communist Party directs the activities of the NCSJRC. On June 30, 1955, T-10 advised that the NCSJRC continues to maintain a national office at 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York City, and continues to be fairly active in major cities throughout the United States. According to T-10 the committee's objectives are to free SOBELL and to continue protesting the innocence of the ROSENBERGS.

Source T-9 on August 4, 1955, advised that the Communist Party continues active interest in the NCSJRC and was attempting to secure the transfer of MORTON SOBELL from the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California, to the East Coast.

Sources, on May 25, 1956, advised that the Ohio ROSENBERG Committee, an affiliate of the NCSJRC was first initiated in Cleveland in 1952, for the purpose of raising funds and circulating pleas for clemency on behalf of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. Subsequent to the conviction of the ROSENBERGS, the committee directed its pleas for funds for the continued defense of the ROSENBERGS.

co-defendant MORTON SOBELL and to set up a trust fund for the ROSENBERG children. Source advised that the committee is not known to be currently active in the Cleveland area.

On June 29, 1955, Source advised that on June 18, 1955, the subject attended a special meeting of the Cleveland Sobell Committee, held at the Sterling Hotel, East 30th and Prospect Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio.

Source advised that ANGUS CAMERON spoke on the need to prevent another execution like that of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG.

Source further stated that JOHN MEXLEY, author of the book, "The Judgment of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg", stated that the ROSENBERGs did not receive a fair trial because of the lies of RAY COHEN, ELIZABETH BENTLEY and HARRY GOLD.

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951, of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. The ROSENBERGs were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951 and MORTON SOBELL to thirty years imprisonment on the same date. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953 and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California.

HOWARD RUSHMORE, a newspaper reporter with the "New York Journal-American" advised in July, 1952 that the NCSJRC was formed on January 2, 1952 for the purpose of obtaining a new trial for the ROSENBERGs.

A source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on May 9, 1956 that the NCSJRC was attempting to keep alive the ROSENBERG Case and to fight for the release of MORTON SOBELL. He stated that the Communist Party took an extremely active part in assisting the Committee.

A source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on April 6, 1953 that the St. Louis Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG Case was controlled by the CP and CP sympathizers in St. Louis and that these groups were giving their continued support to the committee.

On December 17, 1953, the source advised that shortly after the execution of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, this committee assumed the name of the St. Louis ROSENBERG-SOBELL Committee. On May 27, 1954, this informant advised that the CP sympathizers continued to control and support the organization.



Concerning her contact with MORTON SOBELL, ESTHER [REDACTED] related that, prior to 1940, her family was residing

at 740 Caldwell Avenue, Bronx, New York. This residence was a short distance from a drugstore operated by the father of MORTON SOBELL. She recalled that on one occasion her mother returned from the drugstore and advised her that there was a nice young man working in the store.

ESTHER, being single, paid a visit to the store and met MORTON SOBELL. However, she stated, she was not particularly impressed with SOBELL, and had no further interest in him. She stated that Mrs. SOBELL and her mother were friends, and that both mothers were anxious to promote a match between ESTHER and MORTON SOBELL.

MORTON SOBELL is presently serving a 30-year sentence at Alcatraz Penitentiary for conspiracy to commit espionage for the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

Her next contact with SOBELL, she stated, occurred in May 1940, when she left New York City by train for Washington, D.C. Upon the arrival of the train at Union Station, Washington, D.C., she was greeted by MORTON SOBELL and her cousin, who also was residing in Washington, D.C.

Mrs. JASIK refused to furnish the interviewing agents with the name of her cousin.

As to how Mr. SOBELL knew she was arriving on that particular train, etc., ESTHER JASIK stated that she was at a loss to explain. First she stated it might have been a mere accident, but she also surmised that possibly either her mother or SOBELL'S mother had advised him of her departure from New York City.

Prior to her meeting HENRY JASIK, ESTHER stated, she recalled attending a musical concert at "The Watergate" held in Washington, D.C., in the company of MORTON SOBELL. She also attended one musical held at MORTON SOBELL'S apartment in Washington, D.C., but stated that she could not identify any of the other individuals who attended this concert, although there were many people present. She could furnish no information as to the location of this apartment, other than it was in the Northwest section of Washington, D.C. Mrs. JASIK was unable to recall how she got to the musical. Possibly SOBELL picked her up after work and drove her there. However, she did not recall if SOBELL owned a car at that time.

Mrs. JASIK stated that she was unable to furnish any information concerning SOBELL'S activities and friends. Further, that she has never cared for SOBELL, and, after meeting her husband in 1940, she had no further contact with SOBELL.

The indices of the NYO failed to reflect any references to SY FROST. The indices do reflect two references to a SEYMOUR FROST, apparently identical with the SY FROST mentioned in rebulet and enclosure as a "very enthusiastic Communist" who "worked for the Reeves Instrument Company in NY."

Report of SA JULIAN B. ENGELSTAD, 8/31/50, at Cincinnati, captioned "MORTON SOBELL; ESPIONAGE -R," Bufile 101-2483, reflects that one ANDREW CIMA, Electronics Maintenance Technician attached to Wright-Patterson AFB, Dayton, Ohio, reported to OSI in 1949 that he had visited the Reeves Instrument Corporation in NYC regarding the provisioning of parts being developed and produced by Reeves under a classified contract. In this connection, CIMA was in contact with MORTON SOBELL, on two occasions. It was indicated that most of the business transacted by CIMA at Reeves was with SEYMOUR FROST.

The NY indices also reflect that on 10/18/54 an unsigned post card mailed in NYC was received at this Office which stated:

"Gentlemen:

"Why is a rabid Communist like Seymour Frost of 1477 Plum Lane, East Meadow, Long Island, permitted to work on Top Secret defense work for Reeves Instrument Company....the company that employed Morton Sobell? Can't the Government stop this treason.

"This man's entire background reeks from Communism.

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were convicted of violating the War Time Espionage Act and sentenced to death.

FRANCIS FINK, CP/organizer for Sonoma County, was chairman for the committee. The purpose of the meeting was to collect funds for the ROSENBERG children and for MORTON SOBELL, who was convicted of violating the War Time Espionage Act and was at that time serving a Federal sentence. "Following the execution of atomic spies Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, in June, 1953, the 'communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon Morton Sobell,' the Rosenbergs' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case - a communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg - Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953, and 'then the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case' . . ." ("Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," dated December 1, 1961, issued by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, page 116.)

o/s [In September, 1954, the name "National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" appeared on literature issued by the Committee. In March, 1955, the current name, "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell," first appeared on literature issued by the Committee.
