"NEGOTIATE — NEGOTIATE!" Those three words make up the title and are also the concluding words of the editorial in the current issue of the Communist monthly magazine, "New World Review". The editorial tells all Communists and fellow travelers:

"The truce in Korea (already broken by the Communists — Ed) is a shining example of the triumph of negotiations over force....We must press threats of war. Let the voices of Americans swell the cry of hundreds of millions of people throughout the world — Negotiate — Negotiate — Negotiate!"

This Communist demand for negotiations is not new. It was announced earlier this year by the Kremlin's World Council of Peace, which met in Budapest on June 15-20...and declared:

"The World Council of Peace has decided to launch a world wide campaign for negotiation....Only the peoples, by increasing action, can make negotiation, agreement and Peace prevail."

How much support is the campaign for "negotiation" with the Kremlin getting? Consider these few (of the many of their kind) recent news items:

Sept 15. ADLAI E STEVENSON (speech in Chicago): "We owe it to ourselves and to our anxious, weary friends to...confer when we can. The door to the conference room is the door to peace. Let it never be said that America was reluctant to enter."

Sept 26. JACOB S POTOFSKY, Vice-Pres of CIO and President of the CIO's Amalgamated Clothing Workers Union, addressed that union's convention: "There are no international conflicts which, in the final analysis, cannot be resolved by negotiation. If we are resolved to deal with others in terms of human dignity, have regard for their problems as well as our own, I think we can make this progress toward peace."

Sept 28. V K KRISHNA MENON, Indian representative to the U N General Assembly, addressed that body and said that negotiation by the Big Four "is what humanity cries for".

Sept 28. Ex-President TRUMAN, in his Freedom House speech: A "basic pillar" of U S foreign policy is "the willingness...to seek in all sincerity solutions of our differences with the Soviet bloc through patient and peaceful negotiation."

Newspapers and radio commentators have taken up the negotiation cry. Communists in all parts of the country are writing letters to the editors of newspapers urging "negotiation" to settle U S-USSR "differences".

This week Moscow tried to capitalize on its intense campaign for "negotiation" by proposing a Big Five conference (including Communist China) to "lessen international tensions". The U S wisely rejected this bid and expressed doubt of its implied good intentions.

COMMUNISTS WILL CIRCULATE BOOK DEDICATED TO ROSENBERGS IN ALL PARTS OF THE WORLD. In its issue of July 31, COUNTERATTACK warned that the Communist Party was preparing a propaganda and agitation campaign to win a new trial for MORTON SOBELL, who was convicted with the ROSENBERGS of conspiring to deliver U S secrets to Moscow and is now in Alcatraz prison. Here are some of the latest developments in that campaign.

Communists staged a Rosenberg-Sobell "Dedication" rally at NYCity's Randall's Island Stadium on Sept 16th. This rally marked the first appearance of the illustrated "Rosenberg Dedication Book", which contains the names of persons in all parts of the country who have contributed \$5 and plodged to help spread the "truth" in the Rosenberg case and win "justice" for MORTON SOBELL. The Nat'l Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case has announced that the book "will be distributed throughout the world". Moscow intends to use this book and the "martyr" line on the ROSENBERGS to spread distrust and hatred of the U S in all parts of the globe...and to whip up sentiment for SOBELL.

A two-day national conference on the Rosenberg-Sobell case has been set for Chicago on October 10-11. Professors ANTON J-CARLSON and STEPHEN S LOVE of the Univ of Chicago will be the "stars" of the conference.

Ja 1 10 40 - 2 1 111 JOHN WEXLEY wrote the prologue to the "Rosenberg Dedication Book". which was published by Cameron and Kahn, Inc (COUNTERATTACK, May 29, 1953). This firm, by the way, is now boasting that it has sold over 18,000 copies of "The Game of Death" by Communist ALBERT EXAMN, thus pushing that Communist propaganda work into the "best seller" class.

WEXLEY wrote "The Last Mile", the famous play against capital punishment which had a successful Broadway run in the Thirties, and also the play "They Shall Not Die"...a propaganda production about the Scottsboro Case which also ran on Broadway (the Communist Party's theatrical agency, People's Drama", staged revival of this play in late 1949 - after Doubleday & Co published EARK CONRAD's "Scottsboro Soy", a pro-CP version of the case).\_\_\_

WEXLEY has supported numerous fronts since the early Thirties when he was a member of the advisory board of the CP's Film and Photo League and a speaker for the John Reed Club (named after one of the founders of the U S Communist Party). He has supported professed CP members for public office and contributed to party-line publications. In 1943 he taught at the school for writers run by the League of American Writers which, in the Thirties, openly proclaimed its belief in the violent overthrow of the U S Govt.

WHAT CHANCE DO THE ROSENBERG CHILDREN HAVE? It was announced last week that a trust fund had been set up to provide for the two children of the executed atom/spies. The trustees of the fund are:

EMANUEL BLOCH, attorney for the atom spies and many other Communists, who has been tied up with CP fronts since the late Thirties. He has accused Pres EISENHOWER of murdering the ROSENBERGS.

SHIRLEY GRAHAM, contributing editor to "Masses & Mainstream", the CP's cultural monthly. She is also the wife of identified CP member Dr W E B

DU BOIS, who last week acclaimed PAUL ROBESON as a "Soldier of Discontent" when ROBESON was given the Stalin Peace Prize.

JAMES ARONSON, executive editor of the party-line weekly, "The National Guardian". He refused on May 14 to tell Senate Investigations subcommittee whether he is a CP member. ARONSON taught journalism at Long Island University...until he refused to answer the \$64 question.

Prof MALCOLMASHARP of the Univ of Chicago Law School who has a Communist front record dating back to the Thirties. He petitioned Pres TRUMAN to free all Pleaders convicted of conspiracy under the Smith Act and also urged the President to commute the death sentence of the ROSENBERGS.

SURIX SOFIL, lecturer and author. His "One Foot In America" was serialized in the now defunct Communoid "Daily Compass". Macmillan will publish SUHL's latest book, "Cowboy on a Wooden Horse", on Oct 20. SUHL has written for an officially cited Communist Party publication, has been billed as a speaker for a Communist Party unit and has been active in fronts. Last December he chaired a meeting held in honor of V. JOEROME, the party's cultural commissar.

The plight of the Rosenberg children is pitiable. Although Americans, they have a very slim chance of ever learning the truth about this country and such concepts as freedom and democracy. What chance would your children have with "trustees" such as these?

U S ARMY HAS FAILED TO PROTECT RETURNED POWS. The American Veterans for Peace, a Communist front, recently held a meeting in NYCity. The notice of this affair sent to all the organization's members and sympathizers contained the following statement:

"The 25,000 American GIs who lost their lives in the senseless carnage of the 'police action' in Korea cannot join us in our work for peace, but...the millions of Korean and World War II Vets can, and must....

"Help us plan the proper approach to Korean Vets so that they are not left to the 'BRASS' of the Legion, VFW...and Hearst propaganda."

The Communist Party knows the name and address of every POW returned from Korea. It knows which ones went wholly or partly over to the Communist side while in the prison camps — and just which ones were subjected to "brain-washing" techniques. Now it is laying its plans to follow up on these men and every other veteran of the Korean war.

Yet the U S Army decided to make no effort to straighten out those POWs released in Operation Big Switch who were brain-washed or showed signs of having succumbed to the party line. It just turned them loose, thus greatly increasing the chances that Communists in this country will be able to complete the poisoning of their minds begun in Korea.

Is this the way the U S Army rewards the men who fought Communist aggression in Korea?

This Committee's avowed purpose is to commemorate JUIIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and to secure the release from prison of MORTON SOBELL, all of whom were convicted in the United States District Court of violation of the Espionage Act of 1917 in that they conspired to transmit United States atomic data to the Union of Soviet Socialist Republic.
