

## NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE FOR MORTON SOBELL IN THE ROSENBERG CASE

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of January 2, 1957, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case:

"1. Following the execution of atomic spies ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG in June 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon MORTON SOBELL, ' the ROSENBERGS' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case -- a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States -- was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October 1953 and then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case. National headquarters remained at 1050 6th Avenue, New York City. Co-chairmen of the newest organization were DANIEL MARSHALL and JOSEPH BRAININ. (Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, "Trial by Treason: The National Committee to Secure Justice for the Rosenbergs and Morton Sobell," August 25, 1956, pp. 118 and 120; also cited in Annual Report for 1955, House Report 1648, January 17, 1956, originally released January 11, 1956, p. 30.)

Gandy \_ There is attached an editorial which appeared in "The Commercial Appeal, "Memphis, Tennessee, for 11/29/59. This editorial, entitled "Time Enough Then," mentions attempts made by friends of Morton Sobell to contact the White House and the Department of Justice requesting parole for Sobell. The editorial points out that Sobell will not be eligibl for parole until 1962 which will be time enough to consider the problem of parole.

Morton Sobell was convicted along with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg of conspiracy to commit espionage and was sentenced to thirty years in Federal penitentiary in 1951. The editorial points out that Sobell escaped the "just end" of execution "solely because he cooperated with the Governmen after the ring was uncovered."

It appears the editor has confused Morton Sobell with David Greenglass. Sobell never cooperated with the Government. At the time of his sentencing in 1951 Judge Kaufman, Trial Judge, stated that he was not imposing the death penalty because the evidence did not link Sobell with the theft of atomic secrets. Judge Kaufman did add that he wanted to make a statement for whatever it was worth that in his opinion Sobell should never be paroled. David Greenglass, brother of Ethel Rosenberg, was a co-defendant in the trial. He entered a plea of guilty and appeared as a Government witness. He was sentenced to fifteen years in 1951 and has been defied parole. Both Greenglass and his wife appeared as Government witnesses and both are still cooperating with the Government.

### ACTION:

It is recommended this memorandum be forwarded to Assistant Director C. D. DeLoach who may desire to contact the editor of "The Commercial Appeal" and point out to him the fact that he has confused Sobell with Greenglass and, thus, set the record straight.
