Hungarian born JOHN LAUTNER, former Chairman of the Review Commission, Communist Party (CP), New York State, who was expelled from the CP in January, 1950, advised on October 12, 1950, that among Hungarian Communists in the United States, the "Magyar Jovo" (Hungarian Daily Journal) was regarded as their best important item of endeavor. It was published daily by the Hungarian Daily Journal, Incorporated, 130 East 16th Street, New York, New York. ZOLTAN DEAK was Editor and ALEXANDER ROSNER, Business Manager of the publication. LAUTNER advised that DEAK and ROSNER were recognized Communists.

The May 27, 1953, issue of the "Magyar Jovo" announced it would cease publication as of June 9, 1953, and indicated that a new weekly, the "Amerikai Magyar Szo" would replace it.



This will acknowledge your recent letter, with enclosures, requesting information from FBI files on behalf of Robert and Hichael Mecropol. Your request was received on February 27, 1975.

On page two of the request of Messrs. Meeropol, a demand was made for all FBI records relating to several individuals, other than Mr. and Mrs. Rosenberg, who were closely connected with this investigation. With regard to the release of these records, I must decline at this time to make them available.

As you may know, this Eureau presently has under consideration a request by Professor Allen Weinstein for our records relating to the Ethel and Julius Rosenberg investigation. A review of the voluminous records concerning this case was initiated in response to Professor Weinstein's request. We have encountered many complex and troublesome problems in attempting to resolve the questions of invasion of the personal privacy of the individuals who were the focus of this investigation, as well as the numerous individuals who cooperated with this Eureau and the Department of Justice in the investigation and presecution of the case. Additionally, substantial portions of our investigation involve information furnished by individuals with express assurances of confidentiality or under circumstances where such assurances may reasonably the inferred.

Professor Weinstein has instituted a suit against the FBI and Department of Justice, in connection with his reject, to compel production of these records.

In view of the above, I feel that any release of documents to you at this time which relate to individuals other than the Rosenbergs could interfere with this pending litigation. The recently smended Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Title 5, U. S. Code, Section 552, specifically excupts from the disclosure requirements information contained in investigatory files the release of which would: interfere with an impartial adjudication, constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of an individual, or disclose the identity of, or information furnished by, a confidential source [Subsection 552 (b) (7) (B), (b) (7) (C), and (b) (7) (D)].

If you wish to resubmit your request for information relating to these individuals at a later date, after the pending litigation in this matter is resolved, we would be gled to reconsider your inquiry at that time.

You may appeal my decision in this matter by writing to the Attorney General, Attention: Freedom of Information Appeals Unit, Washington, D. C. 20536. The envelope and the letter should be marked "Freedom of Information Appeal." Additionally, judicial review is thereafter available either in the district in which you reside or have your principal place of basiness or in the District of Columbia, the location of the records to which you seek access.

In response to the portion of the request for FBI records concerning Julius and Ethel Resemberg, different considerations are present. Being the sons of Ethel and Julius Rusenberg, the Mecropole stand in a unique position. No investon of privacy concerns need be considered with respect to records which relate solely to Hr. and Hrs. Rosenberg. However, the other exemptions provided in the current FOIA would be applicable in the remaining the information which could be disclosed.

As you can imagine, our records in this case are income. A page-by-page review of them is necessary before as of any documents in order to protect the left interests.

Correspondent, who represents Michael and Robert Meeropol, ons of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg) is requesting in fremely broad terms all of the records relating to the Thel and Julius Rosenberg case. It is noted that access to the Rosenberg files is currently at issue in a pending suit filed by Professor Weinstein under the FOIA (Weinstein v. Saxbe, U. S. D. C., D. C. Civil Action #2278-74). Although we wish to resist the release of any documents to the Meeropols which would be detrimental to our position in the pending suit, due to the unique position the Meeropols occupy as the natural sons of the Rosenbergs, it is felt a further review of the Rosenberg files should be undertaken in response to their request. This matter is being coordinated with Assistant U. S. Attorney Michael Ryan, Washington, D. C. who is handling the Weinstein case, and he has interposed no objection to this response. Ryan will be kept advised and any proposed release of documents will be cleared through him to insure no prejudice to the suit results.
