

(A check was made of the Bureau files and references concerning Morris H. Berkman. This review reflected that Berkman was born May 10, 1899, in Ukraine, Pussia, and was indicated as having been naturalized as a United States citizen on February 24, 1939. He is a graduate of George Washington University, Washington, D. C. and also attended University of Maryland and National University. From June 1926 to 1936, he was employed as a supervisor in an architectural office in Washington, D. C. From 1936 to 1940, he was employed as a public buildings administrator in Washington, D. C. and from 1941 to 1943, as an employee of the Federal Fublic Housing Authority in Washington, D. C. During the period from 1944 to 1946, he was employed at the War Flants Reconstruction Finance Corporation, Cleveland, Ohic. On March 4, 1947, he worked as a structural engineer in the city of Clandale, California, and remained in that position until /pril 15, 1045. According to the latest information in the Bureau files he returned to Washington, D. C. in 1948 for the purpose of setting himself up in business as an architectural engineer.

On October 12, 1964, at New York, New York Vago was issued passport E 700007. On the application for this passport, dated September 20, 1964, at New York, New York, Vago did not list any travel plans.

Vago was born on February 27, 1898, at Budapest, He immigrated to the United States in January, Hungary. 1933, and resided continuously at New York, New York, and Washington, D. C. He was naturalized as a United States citizen on September 29, 1938, before the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, receiving Certificate of Naturalization number 4320335. He listed his permanent residence as 164-13 73rd Avenue, Flushing, New York, and his occupation as civil engineer.

He listed his father as Morris Vago, born 1858 in Hungary and his mother as Mathilde Goldstein, born 1860 in Germany. Neither of his parents is a United States citizen. Vago

He was last married on March 31, 1928, to Claire Weisman, who was born on January 31, 1907, at Budapest, This marriage has not been terminated. Hungary

This passport is valid for travel to all countries except Albania, Cuba, and those portions of China, Korea, and Viet-Nam under communist control. It will expire on release that October 11, 1967, and may be renewed for two years.

I. BACKGROUND

By means of a direct inquiry to the subject's former employer, JOHN GRAHAM, Architect and Engineer, 444 5th Avenue, New York, New York, it was learned that the subject is now retired and continues to reside at 164-13 73rd Avenue, Queens, New York.

Foreign Travel

The Passport Office, United States Department of State (USDS), provided information indicating that OSCAR JOHN VAGO, born February 27, 1898, at Budapest, Hungary, was issued a passport, numbered A304185, on March 16, 1970, at New York.

In his application for the passport, Mr. VAGO indicated that he planned to depart the United States (US) on May 30, 1970, via air for a six week trip to Hungary, France, England, Germany, Poland, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR), and Denmark. He indicated he planned to visit relatives.

The July 25, 1970, issue of "Magyar Hirek" (Hungarian News), published in Budapest, Hungary, by the Hungarian World Federation, contained a photograph with the caption "Happy Postprandial Conversation". Identified was OSCKAR VAGO, leader of a New York Hungarian social club tour.
