When he was a member of the Assembly back in 1940, he sponsored, together with Benator Desmond, the first urban redevelopment legislation in the United States. This was a measure known as The Redevelopment Corporations Act."



It was a farsighted measure which aimed to give an autonomy to local incorporated neighborhoods permitting present owners and residents to join together as an incorporated neighborhood to make a plan of redevelopment and give them power, once the democratically worked out plan was approved, to compel a recalcitrant minority to conform to the program for betterment.

Senator Mitchell has continued his interest and has worked hard and valiantly to create new tools for tackling the difficult problem of city design and city growth. Federal policy with regard to redevelopment has taken a very different course than that first proposed in New York State. Although Senator Mitcheil has cooperated in securing needed legislation so that New York might cooperate with Federal programs, he has taken pains to work on the general codification of laws dealing with city design and redevelopment.

Senator Mitchell's knowledge of the State's Law of Cities stamps him as a member of the Legislature that we cannot afford to lose.

I have done a lot of research for the National Committee on this question this is nothing new to us. If we haven't spoken about before it was only because we were hoping that the differences could have been settled. But the Chinese comrades have gone from bad to worst...they are becoming very obstinate....their left sectarianismm is becoming more dangerous every day GANNET read most of the time from prepared notes.... She quoted extensively from the Peking Review, accusing those articles as definite left sectarianism....and social democratic trend, at the same time. Quoted from KRUSCIOVS speech of 1961 in reference to the "new epoch"...the Chinese comrade just close their eyes when we speak of the new epoch....how could they not realize the new realignment in world politics? How could they miss that 14 new socialist countries have come into existence since World War II? The Soviet Union is not in the same position as she was until before World War II...the Socialist camp is big and strong.... Among other things she said: we are accused of being soft to imperialism....that the Italian Party has gone revisionist.. permit me comrades, these are stupid accusations. Anybody that knows anything about the Italian, the French or our

Party, could never make such accusations....and what about the Soviet Union? Has the Soviet Union stopped fighting imperialism?....have we stopped our class struggle?....they don't see that today is Socialism who has become the basic factor in the social development of society....have we stopped fighting American imperialism? We understand very well why imperialism has not gone to war.....it is becuase they know what will happen to them.... but we understand another thing ... we are convinced that because of the new relation of forces, socialism can be won in many other countries and eventually in the world Could we think of liberating colonies, twenty, thirty, forty years ago without revolutions? No! But today this is happening because of the new epoch, because of the Soviet Union. of the existence of 14 new socialist countries. of the strenght of communism all over the world.

We know very well that imperialism remains aggressive, bellicose. What has changed is not the basic principle of imperialism, but the new epoch has changed its approach; it is compelled to reckon with the new forces.... they know they cannot act with impunity as they did in the past.

GANNET urged those present to read the classics. Lennin, yes Stalln, but keep in mind the changing situation. We cannot remain Marxists if we become dogmatic, static in our thinking if we don't see the new relations of forces.

We can, she added, lick imperialism, in an economic, scientific competion. Co-existence does not mean, she said forgetting our class struggle. KRUSCIOV has said this again and again, and we have said the same....supporting KENNEDY on certain issues does not mean supporting KENNEDYs philosophy....fighting for peace does not mean that we are afraid...we don't want to build socialism on ashes.







was mainly devoted in showing how, or better, what it would have 670 meant for the American Party, "had we followed the advise of the Chinese comrades. GANNET quoted extensively from GUS HALL, to prove that had we followed them, our Party would have been out of existence. How could we survive in this citadel of imperialism, had we taken a left sectarian approach? They are against our united front approach, against our struggle for disarmaments, testing; we would have to give up our position of the danger of the ultra-right. In 1962 (BETTY revealed) our Party did not publish the greetings to our Party until late and we did not print it in full, because their statement was strongly left They branded KENNEDY, as an American Tojo, Mussolini & Hitler. Had we followed them, we would have become completely isolated from the people, would have become a sectarian group, yes a conspiratorial group.... How wrong they were and still are.... We could have never been able to function.

She critized the Chinese with a petty bourgeoi ideology, with a retreat into nationalism, with a continuation of the cult of personality. They thought and still think that their peasant question is different from the others, therefore giving stronger emphasis and importance to the peasantry in building socialism.

Although critizising strongly the Chinese, she urged nerverthless not to use vituperation in discussing with them. She repeated that the struggle will be long...no end is in sight. Leaders come and go...but socialism remains, the fundamentals are here to stay....There is no doubt that somekind of international gathering will be held to find a solution to these differences, or at least lessen them....

She informed that the "Worker" was coming out with a special supplement on the struggle. You comrades must read and read, don't ever become dogmatic. She suggested the World Marxist Review, Political Affairs, the statement by the 21 communist parties, etc. It is your responsibility to our Party, to our members, and to our country to have a clear understaing of Marxism as it applies to the new epoch.

On CASTRO she said! His speech before a gathering of Latin American women in Havana, was left sectarian. Although he did not say it openly, there was the Chinese approach, when he said "people make history only if you hurl-push the masses to revolution...only one path can free your country, our path... the time is here." There is too much emphasis on nationalism (she referred here about a report that J. NORTH gave on his recent return from Cuba, and how often CASTRO uses the phrase Patria o muerte (Fathernland or Death). She critizesid the way ESCALANTE was dealt with. It was somehow a rebuke to the old time bolsheviks of Cuba...You see the Chinese approach is: "You see what a few Cubans were able to do in such a short time, right before the nose of American imperialism...the same can be done in Venezuela, in Brazil, in Guatemala, etc...and CASTRO echos this approach somehow."

Well there are some justification for his approach....
there is, what comrade NORTH calls a "distinct Cuban psychology,
completely different from other Latin Americans", because of the
special aggressive and repressive role played by American
imperialism in that country....but there is no reason to be
too irresponsible, and I hope that comrade CASTRO will realize this.

The discussion followed closely the presentation made by GANNET

The advertisement reflected that AMS readers and their friends would be able to visit Hungary on a tour being organized by AMS. The various dates of the tours were listed which included a tour scheduled for May 21, (1965) by airliner.

the newspaper had originally scheduled an air tour to Hungary leaving the United States on May 21, 1965.

this tour never materialized.




