SS #577-22-6246. Baltimore advised at that time that following her employment at the Tuller Contracting Company, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, LAINE GOLDFARE was employed by MARK SPERO of London, 1287 Second Avenue, New York City, from the period June, 1941 to March, 1942.

A [redacted] interview at this establishment revealed that LAINE GOLDFARE is the step-daughter of MARK SPERO, that she is presently married to GEORGE M. FRIEDMAN, and resides at 30-21 87th Street, Jackson Heights, Long Island, New York. SPERO further stated LAINE GOLDFARE was born in London, England, and arrived in the United States in 1929 on the SS Washington. b7c

The records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, 70 Columbus Avenue, New York City, reflect that LEAN GOLDFARE arrived at New York City on October 12, 1949, on the SS Washington. A notation opposite her name on the manifest indicates that she claimed citizenship through her parents.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability supplied the following information concerning LAINE GOLDFARE:

A review of the files of the Central Office, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, reflect that LAINE FRIEDMAN filed application for Derivative Citizenship claiming that she derived citizenship in the United States on March 28, 1929, through the naturalization of her father, WILLIAM GOLDFARE on that date, she then being a minor and having resided permanently in the United States since August 21, 1924. She further set out that she arrived in the United States through the port of New York, under the name LILLY GOLDFARE on August 21, 1924 via the vessel SS Olympic. The application reflects that she was born in London, England, May 2, 1920, the daughter of WILLIAM GOLDFARE and CHARLOTTE DUSHMAN GOLDFARE. She also stated that she had used the names of LEAN and LILLY, in addition to the name LAINE, and it was under the name LILLY that she was listed on her father's Certificate of Naturalization.

The application further shows that she was absent from the United States from May to September, 1929, when she was in Southampton, England, visiting her family, and was again absent from the United States from April, 1934, to October, 1939, when she attended school in England. She claimed to have arrived in the United States last, via the SS Washington, from Southampton, England, traveling on a United States Passport. The application lists her occupation as housewife, age 24, color - white, complexion - medium, eyes - brown, hair - black, 5' 8" tall, 145 pounds, married, former nationality - British.

The application reflects that her father was born at Lunza, Poland, July 12, 1890, and her mother was born in London, England, July 26, 1900. Her husband, GEORGE MORRIS FRIEDMAN, was born at Hartford, Connecticut, October 3, 1913. They were married at Queens County, New York, May 29, 1942.

Certificate of Derivative Citizenship #127633 was issued LAINE FRIEDMAN on December 5, 1944. At that time she was residing at 3706 89th Street, Jackson Heights, New York.

The marriage records for Queens County, Jamaica, Long Island, reflect that GEORGE MORRIS FRIEDMAN and LAINE GOLDFARB were married on May 29, 1942 by FRANK R. Mc GLYNN, Deputy Chief Clerk, 2077 45th Street, Long Island City, New York.

T-1 has also advised that he learned from a highly reliable source in July of 1945, that LAINE FRIEDMAN was elected President of the Queensbridge Club of the Communist Political Association on January 23, 1945. T-1 also stated at that time that LAINE FRIEDMAN held membership card #34667 in the Corona Club of the Communist Political Association, Queens, New York, and that she was transferred from the Corona Club to the Queensbridge Club. T-1 added that LAINE FRIEDMAN was selected for attendance at a State Personnel Training Course for Party Leadership, Communist Political Association. LAINE FRIEDMAN, in June, 1944, was one of the dominant figures in the Corona Inter-Racial Committee.

This informant also advised that he learned on

September 11, 1945, that LAINE FRIEDMAN was in touch with HEINRICH RADATZ, 6 Parliament Court, Parliament Hill, London, E. W. 3. RADATZ was described as a known member of the German Communist Party and a prominent member of Gruppe Deutsche Seeleute (Group of German Sailors), a German Communist organization affiliated with the Party-controlled movements, the free German League of Culture, and the Free German Movement in the United Kingdom.

A review of the indices of the New York Office reflects that LAINE FRIEDMAN, 41-03 Vernon Boulevard, Long Island City, Election District #58, Assembly District #2, on August 9, 1946, signed the Communist Party Nominating Petition.

Reference is made to ROMAN S. TUMARKIN, 645 Riverside Drive, New York City, whom GEORGE TOUMAKIE contacted in March, 1951, while in New York City.

It will be recalled that ANNE SIDOROVICH stated that she was employed in 1939 as a maid by a TUMARKIN family in the Washington Heights Section of New York City.

The files of Immigration and Naturalization Service, New York City, reflected that ROMAN S. TUMARKIN, born 8/28/88, Moscow, Russia, arrived in the United States 1/6/41, from Havana, Cuba. The Immigration and Naturalization Service files also reflected that in 1941, ROMAN S. TUMARKIN resided in Miami, Florida, and at West 67th Street, New York City, and that from 1941 to 1945, he resided at 24 Riverside Drive, New York City. None of these addresses are in the Washington Heights Section of New York City.

The United States Attorney, Southern District of New York, advised that he contemplates no action against the SIDOROVICHs until final disposition is made on the ROSENBERG appeals and at that time he will reconsider any possible prosecutive action.

Accordingly, this case is being considered RUC.

The past activities of the SIDOROVICHs will be closely followed in the ROSENBERG, PERL, and related cases and any information developed concerning the SIDOROVICHs will be reported under the SIDOROVICH caption. RUC

Richard Hill, Supervisory Investigator, INS, Cleveland on this date advised that in connection with the INS investigation of ARTHUR SPRIGMAN, (CV 105-364), INS New York had requested INS Cleveland to interview subject.

INS, Cleveland has contacted subject, and he informed INS that he recalled ARTHUR SPRIGMAN being present at "street meetings" many years ago, and that SPRIGMAN had borrowed ten or twenty dollars from him that he had never repaid. INS interest in subject is based upon his potential as a witness against SPRIGMAN, however subject has not furnished any information of evidentiary value.

SPRIGMAN had applied for naturalization which has been denied, and INS interest in him is based upon possibility that he may be deportable.

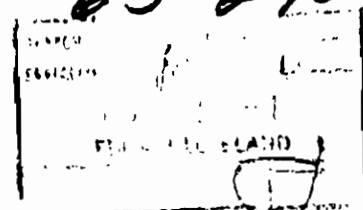

She continued that he had resided in this area for a number of years. It was the informant's impression that Mr. and Mrs. CROSS are people of good character and reputation. She knew of no reason to question their loyalty. b7d

Confidential Informant San Diego T-3, of known reliability who is familiar with Communist Party affairs in Orange County, California, advised [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] The informant stated that CROSS is a very peculiar individual who tends to have very peculiar ideas. The informant continued that CROSS is very much to himself and apparently has little to do with anyone. According to this informant, CROSS has never been known to be involved in any subversive activity. b7d

Confidential Informant San Diego T-3 advised that CROSS's son DAVID, a student at the University of California, has had considerable mental trouble and is now or has been confined in a mental institution.

Miss CELINE KONZOL, Clerk, Business Men's Association (Credit Bureau), Santa Ana, California, advised that the records of that Association reflect that CROSS has resided in the Newport Beach, California, area since at least 1941.

Mrs. VERNA KUNZE, Clerk, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Santa Ana, California, advised that the records of that office reflect no record of CROSS.

Reference is also made to the report of SA Robert F. Royal, New York, dated 10/6/50, wherein on pages 136 and 137 information is set forth pertaining to Mr. and Mrs. WILLIAM MOODY. It was pointed out that Mrs. MOODY was believed to be identical with NORMA HANNON.

At that time, he had Alien Registration #1516104 and held Resident Alien Identification Card #239965, which was issued July 7, 1941 by the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Ellis Island, N.Y.

This file further reflects that Dr. FELDMAN advised that he was divorced by court order in Budapest, Hungary on June 23, 1938 and that his former wife was MARGARIT, who was born in Budapest on March 21, 1898. He has one daughter, JUDIT ZSUZSANNA, who was born January 12, 1928 at Budapest. He advised that he had formerly resided in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

The file further reflects that he declared his intention of becoming a U. S. citizen on September 21, 1939 in the United States District Court at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Declaration #153415. He filed his petition for naturalization on June 8, 1944, Petition #40771. His previous residences were Pittsburgh; Pa. from April, 1939 until November, 1940; from November, 1940 to September, 1941, in New York City; and, from September, 1941 until May, 1942, the date of his application for his border crossing card, at Rochester, N.Y.

The files of the Naturalization Clerk, Supreme Court of New York, at Rochester, N.Y., reflect that Dr. FELDMAN filed Petition #40771 on June 8, 1944 and was naturalized a United States citizen on November 28, 1944, obtaining Certificate #6401966. At the time he was naturalized, he gave his residence as 292 Oxford St., Rochester, N.Y., his occupation as that of a physician, stated that he was of Hungarian nationality and had lived in the United States since April 14, 1939 and in the State of New York since September, 1941.

The official bulletin of the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry reflects the following information relative to Dr. FELDMAN:

It reflects that Dr. SANDOR S. FELDMAN is an associate professor of psychiatry and that he received his diploma from the Royal Hungarian Medical University in Budapest in 1915, was Chief Ward Surgeon, Ward for Nervous Diseases, Orthopedic Institute, from January, 1916 to 1918 and was Imperial Royal Chief Surgeon of the Army. However, the dates for this position are not given. It also reflects that for a time Dr. FELDMAN was connected with the Second University Medical Clinic, as well as the Psychoanalytic Clinic, University of Budapest, being a staff member after 1915. The bulletin also reflects that he was connected with the New York Psychoanalytic Institute at an unidentified time and was an instructor in medicine at the University of Rochester from 1941 to 1946 and an instructor in psychiatry from 1946 to 1947. According to the bulletin, he is on a part-time basis at the School of Medicine and Dentistry, University of Rochester, as an associate professor of psychiatry.

The files of the Credit Bureau of Rochester, N.Y. failed to reflect any information on a SALAMAN S. FELDMAN or SANDOR S. FELDMAN. However, the files do reflect information concerning an individual known as SANDOW S. FELDMAN, who, in 1943, resided at 292 Oxford St., Rochester, N.Y. According to this information, this individual came to Rochester from Pittsburgh, Pa. in 1943 and had formerly lived at 1135 King Avenue, Pittsburgh. As of 1943, he was not a citizen of the United States; however, he had been practicing medicine for approximately 25 years, having come to this country some time in the late 1930's. The files of the Credit Bureau reflect that he has a very good credit rating and that he is associated, probably as a consultant, with the University of Rochester Medical School.

The files of the Identification Bureau of the Rochester Police Department reflect that on January 5, 1942, one BYRON PIERCE, who resided at 292 Oxford St., Rochester, N.Y., advised the Rochester Police Department that a Dr. FELDMAN, who lives on the third floor of 292 Oxford St., has many visitors at his residence. There was no allegation made relative to un-American activities or disloyal sympathies on the part of Dr. FELDMAN. [REDACTED] b7d
[REDACTED] Rochester Police Department, advised that in view of the nature of the information furnished by BYRON PIERCE, no investigation was undertaken by the Rochester Police Department. He stated that there is no other record of Dr. FELDMAN in the files of the Rochester Police Department.

The Rochester City Directories for 1941 and 1942 failed to reflect any information relative to a SANDOR or a SALAMON S. FELDMAN. The 1943 Directory reflects that one SANDOW S. FELDMAN, a physician, resides at 292 Oxford St. However, the street section of the 1943 Directory reflects that one SANDON S. FELDMAN resides in Apartment 21, at 292 Oxford St. The City Directory for 1944, 1945 and 1946 failed to reflect any information relative to one SALAMON FELDMAN. However, it does reflect that one SANDOR S. FELDMAN, an instructor at the University of Rochester Medical and Dental School, resides in Apartment 21 at 292 Oxford St. The alphabetical section of the 1947 Directory reflects that one SALAMON S. FELDMAN resides at 230 Dartmouth St. The street section of the same directory reflects that one SANDOR S. FELDMAN, an instructor at the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry, resides at 230 Dartmouth St. The Directories for 1948, 1949 and 1950 reflect that one SALAMAN S. FELDMAN, a physician, resides at 230 Dartmouth St., Rochester. There is no mention of a SANDOR S. FELDMAN in the Directory from 1948 through 1950.

Rebulet October 16, 1950 captioned as above which enclosed a copy of a letter dated September 27, 1950 from the San Juan Office reflecting that the Customs stops on the captioned individuals had not been effectively placed at the port of San Juan.

With regard to JOEL BARR, reference is made to Washington Field Office report dated September 7, 1950 wherein it is reported that Immigration and Naturalization Service had advised that a stop or lookout notice placed with them on a United States citizen would have no effect, as INS maintains no checks against the movement of U.S. citizens.

Mr. DANIEL J. KELLY of INS advised that when a lookout notice at all ports of entry is requested by the FBI, such lookout notice includes San Juan, Puerto Rico. In the particular case of YAKOVLEV, the absence of a stop at San Juan, Puerto Rico, according to KELLY, has in all probability been due to a delay in processing at INS resulting from a lack of personnel and appropriations at that Agency. Mr. KELLY added that the lookout notice on YAKOVLEV finally did go out on October 13, 1950.

With respect to the Customs stops at San Juan, Puerto Rico, it has been learned that the Mechanical Section of the Bureau has the responsibility for mailing the stop notices to the various Collectors of Customs, and that San Juan, Puerto Rico is included in all unlimited stop notice dissemination. Accordingly the Collector of Customs office was not contacted in this regard.

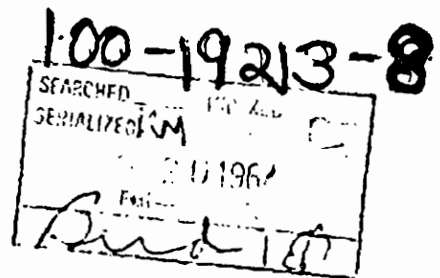

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

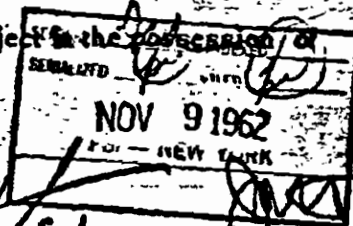

It will be recalled that Louis F. Budenz has advised Bureau agents and also has set out on pages 126 to 129 of his book, "Men Without Faces," the episode of when, in 1938, a Soviet agent, Roberts, and Budenz arranged for Ruby Weil, a trusted Communist, to go to Paris, France, with Sylvia Ageloff to attend the International Trotskyite Conference. Sylvia Ageloff was a special courier for the Trotskyites traveling to Canada, Europe and Mexico, according to Budenz.

When Ruby Weil arrived in Paris, according to Budenz, she was met by a Soviet agent known as Gertrude who gave her the assignment of introducing Frank Jackson, wa., (killer of Leon Trotsky) to Sylvia Ageloff. After a rapid courtship, Jackson induced Sylvia to get him into Mexico through the help of the Trotskyites. Sylvia introduced Jackson to the Trotsky household at Coyoacan, Mexico, and Jackson murdered Trotsky on August 20, 1940.

Budenz identified a photograph of Dr. Gregory Iworich Rabinovitch as Roberts on November 10, 1950. Thomas L. Black, admitted Soviet agent, identified the photograph of Rabinovitch as the person who was his Soviet superior in 1938 and as a person who tried to interest him in penetrating the Trotsky household in Coyoacan.

Black advised that his next Soviet superior after Rabinovitch was an individual known only to Black by the name of John, the Unknown Subject of this case. Black stated that John contacted him a few times in 1939 and reappeared briefly in 1940.

A review of the file on Frank Jackson, wa., reveals that according to the Immigration and Naturalization Service records at Ellis Island, New York, Frank Jackson entered the United States September 9, 1939, at New York City aboard the Ile de France. (65-29162-171)

I. BACKGROUND

A photograph of a suspect [REDACTED] was not available at the time BLACK was questioned on July 9, 1953. Therefore, the description [REDACTED] detailed recollection of this individual's habits were furnished to BLACK. At that time BLACK stated he did not believe this individual was identical with his superior "JOHN" for the following reasons:

II. INFORMATION CONCERNING NIKOLAI NIKOLAEVICH ERCHOV

Mr. HOWARD JACKSON, Files Division, Bureau of Immigration, Ellis Island, made available a file on NIKOLAI NIKOLAEVICH ERCHOV. A review of this file revealed ERCHOV arrived in the United States on January 19, 1938, and was admitted for a temporary period of nine months as a non-immigrant, Class 2, Section 3, Immigration Act of 1924. On September 23, 1938, ERCHOV executed an application to extend the time of temporary stay in this country. He stated the circumstances requiring his presence in the United States are as follows:

"I came to the United States for the purpose of studying at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Cambridge, Mass." (4)

ERCHOV desired an extension of time to stay in order to continue his studies. His address was given as 294 Harvard Street, Cambridge, Mass. Similar applications were also executed by his wife, EKATERINA NIKANDROVNA ERCHOVA. Similar applications for extension of stay were executed by ERCHOV and his wife on September 28, 1939, and March 1, 1940. Another extension was requested on September 16, 1940, in which ERCHOV indicated that he came to the United States for the purpose of studying at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and that he was working at the Machinimport, U.S.S.R., for the purpose of purchasing technical machinery. He also indicated he was employed by Amtorg Trading Corporation.

A review of the Immigration and Naturalization Service files on NIKOLAI ERCHOV reflected that he departed from New York City destined for

BLACK immediately advised that this was a photograph of his Soviet superior "JOHN." BLACK stated he was "definitely certain" of this identification. He added the photograph is an "exact likeness" of "JOHN." BLACK was asked to relay all the information he could remember concerning "JOHN." BLACK related that he met "JOHN" possibly only four or five times during the approximate period 1939 or 1940. BLACK described "JOHN" as a "non-communicative individual." By this BLACK stated he meant "JOHN" told him nothing about himself. As a result, BLACK states he learned very little about "JOHN'S" activities. All the meetings which he did have with "JOHN" were in the midtown area of Manhattan, possibly between 33rd and 42nd Streets. "JOHN" or ERCHOV displayed an interest in shooting galleries, pinball machines, and generally was found in the amusement centers which are operated along 42nd Street, New York City. For this reason BLACK has the impression that he met "JOHN" in these amusement centers, although BLACK could not specifically recall such a meeting. BLACK states he remembers that "JOHN" definitely had the appearance of a Sicilian or an Italian and, according to BLACK, this is borne out by the photograph which was displayed to him.

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Regarding associates or contacts of "JOHN," BLACK states he has the definite impression that "JOHN" or ERCHOV was an alternate contact for his Soviet superior "JACK," whom he previously identified from a photograph as JOSEPH KATZ. BLACK states his best recollection, at this time, is that "JACK" brought "JOHN" to midtown New York to meet him. BLACK also has the impression at this time that "JOHN" was only to meet BLACK when "JACK" could not make it. In this regard, BLACK states "JACK" frequently took trips to other parts of the country and while on these trips "JOHN" was assigned to contact him, BLACK. For this reason BLACK believes that "JOHN" or ERCHOV was an alternate contact for his Soviet superior "JACK." BLACK was unable to furnish additional information regarding any contacts of "JOHN."

BLACK was reminded that when interviewed by SAS ROBERT W. HOLMES and WILLIAM B. WELTE, JR., in 1950, he stated that his Soviet superior "JOHN" followed Dr. SCHWARTZ and that "JOHN" was in turn followed by "KARL." "JOHN" was supposed to have re-appeared briefly. BLACK was also reminded that he stated "JOHN'S" chief interest appeared to have been in the Socialist Workers Party, that "JOHN" put pressure on BLACK to make some effort to fulfill the Mexico City assignment regarding LEON TROTSKY.

In answer, BLACK stated in 1950, just after he had been questioned the first time, he was extremely upset and his recollection was affected to the extent that the chronological order of his Soviet superiors was effected. Even now BLACK advised that since such a great period of time has elapsed he is not exactly certain of the order of his Soviet superiors. However, at the present time, his best recollection is that "JACK," JOSEPH KATZ, brought "JOHN" around to meet him, exact place in New York not recalled. Thereafter, "JOHN" met him when "JACK" could not make it. BLACK has the impression that "JOHN" only met him "to keep the contact alive." BLACK is unable to recall any particular instructions or interests that "JOHN" had. BLACK does recall "JOHN" giving him expense money for contributions to the Socialist Workers Party. BLACK added that his recollection of "JOHN" is much vaguer than the other Soviet superiors since he met "JOHN" on so few occasions.

BLACK continued that he has a definite recollection of "JOHN'S" face in that it had the appearance of a "gangster" and the features were either Sicilian or Italian. These features are borne out by the photograph of ERCHOV, according to BLACK, and he states he is definitely sure that ERCHOV is "JOHN." BLACK states that at this time he is unable to recall that "JOHN" tried to get him to go to Mexico City in an attempt to infiltrate TROTSKY'S household. BLACK has the recollection that that assignment was

given to him by "JACK." BLACK states at this time his best recollection of his Soviet superiors for that period is as follows:

Dr. SCHWARTZ, whom he has identified as Dr. GREGORY RABINOVITCH

"JACK," whom he has identified as JOSEPH KATZ.

"JOHN," whom he has just identified as NIKOLAI NIKOLAEVICH ERCHOV.

"KARL," whom he has not identified as yet.

"JOHN" again for possibly one or two meetings sometime in 1940.

Finally "JACK."

As mentioned above, "JOHN" or ERCHOV, according to BLACK, "did not seem to be interested in too much of anything." BLACK has the impression now that he had to carry most of the conversation as far as "JOHN" was concerned. "JOHN" told him nothing about himself. The only specific item BLACK recalls at present is that "JOHN" gave him expense money to make contributions to the Socialist Workers Party. BLACK estimates he last saw "JOHN" sometime in 1940.

Regarding the description of "JOHN," BLACK states he still feels "JOHN" was 5'7" tall, and 140 pounds. He was soft spoken and had a slight accent. BLACK also added "JOHN'S" habits were not obviously those of a foreigner but his mannerisms seemed like any other New Yorker. When asked to elaborate on this remark, BLACK stated, "JOHN" did not give the impression that he was "just off the boat." In other words, BLACK states his dress and his speech were more like those of a New Yorker. BLACK again definitely stated the photograph of NIKOLAI NIKOLAEVICH ERCHOV is that of his Soviet superior "JOHN."

IV. MISCELLANEOUS

A photograph of NIKOLAI NIKOLAEVICH ERCHOV was exhibited to DAVID GREENGLASS and HARRY GOLD, inmates, U.S. Federal Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pa., on January 4, 1954, by SA WAYNE G. HUNT; however, both stated they were unable to recognize ERCHOV as any person they had ever known.

I. BACKGROUND

[REDACTED] has been interviewed by Agents of the Chicago Office intermittently since November 1952.

[REDACTED] is between 30 and 40 years of age, from 5'10" to 6' tall, from 150 to 160 pounds, slender build, dark complexion, dark brown hair, brown eyes, and appeared to be a Russian. [REDACTED] said he had a very heavy dark beard which he always kept very closely shaved. He spoke English with a Slavic accent.

THOMAS L. BLACK, admitted Soviet Agent, has advised Agents of the Philadelphia Office that an individual named "JOHN" was his Soviet principal for a short period in 1939 or 1940. **BLACK'S** "JOHN" was described by him as

[redacted] said that the photograph of ERCHOV shows [redacted] to have much more hair than [redacted] recalls, but otherwise [redacted] has no doubt that ERCHOV [redacted]

It is noted that INS records indicate ERCHOV left the United States on 9/16/42, and there is no record of his having returned to the U.S.

Previous reports in this case and the [redacted] case have reflected that [redacted] was of the opinion [redacted] saw [redacted]. However, it has been frequently pointed out by this office [redacted] is and has been quite vague concerning dates, and accordingly it is the opinion of the NYC that the discrepancy in dates should in no way rule out the identification of ERCHOV [redacted]

Information concerning ERCHOV is contained in the case entitled, "NIKOLAI NIKOLAEVICH ERCHOV, was; ESP-R," Bufile 65-61847, NY file 65-16301.

A report in the ERCHOV case will be submitted in the near future.

DETAILS:

In reference teletype it was reflected that ROBERT HEINEMAN while at Swarthmore College, Swarthmore, Pennsylvania, was a member of the Young Communist League from 1935 to 1938 and while there, associated with NANCY CARDOZA, MARY IVANS and TED VELTFORT.

With reference to the above, the Philadelphia Office files reflect the following:

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MARY IVINS MORRELL

From articles appearing in the "Swarthmore Phoenix", a newspaper published by the students of Swarthmore College, it was ascertained that MARY IVINS, '38, was a member of the Executive Board of the Swarthmore Chapter, American Student Union. In addition, the articles contained information that she planned to participate in the American Youth Congress "Youth Pilgrimage to Washington" to secure passage of the American Youth Act; that she conducted several "labor investigations" instituted by the chapter.

Philadelphia Confidential Informant T-1, a State Agency which conducts intelligence investigations, advised that MARY IVINS became District Secretary of the American Student Union in 1941 and she was an active member of the Young Communist League. MARY IVINS married ROBERT MORRELL on September 23, 1940, according to T-1.

Philadelphia Confidential Informant T-2, a reliable Informant, advised in December, 1946, that he believed that MARY IVINS MORRELL was assigned Communist Party Membership Book #77446 for the year 1947 and that at that time, she had been a member of the Communist Party for a period of ten years.

In June, 1947, Philadelphia Confidential Informant T-3, a reliable Informant, advised that as of that time, MARY IVINS MORRELL was the Section Organizer for Section #10 of the Communist Party USA, District #3.

As of late January, 1950, Philadelphia Confidential Informant T-2 stated that MARY MORRELL was still active in the Germantown Section of the Communist Party USA, District #3.

THEODORE ERNST VELTFORT, JR.

The "Swarthmore Phoenix" under date of October 20, 1936 stated: "Swarthmore's leading Communist ... THEODORE VELTFORT '37, is opposed to forming a Communist Party at Swarthmore. He feels that it is not through rallies that encouragement should be given but through the personal touch."

(It should be noted that the American Student Union was formed approximately one week after this announcement appeared in the local college newspaper, and VELTFORT was one of the organizers).

The "Swarthmore Phoenix" under date of October 12, 1937 stated: "THEODORE VELTFORT '37, who is now fighting with the Loyalist forces in Spain ... was secretary of the ASU, and was active in starting the organization here. He was also an organizer for the Steelworkers Organizing Committee in Chester (Pennsylvania). He gave a radio talk last year under the auspices of the Young Communist League."

VELTFORT
The 1937 "Halycon", annual yearbook published by the Swarthmore College students, commented: "Despite the fact that he wears a black shirt, TED talks of class struggles, internationales, bewhiskered commissars and other anathemas of the DAR."

Philadelphia Confidential Informant T-4, who is believed reliable, advised that the name of THEODORE ERNST VELTFORT, JR., 28 Dogwood Lane, Westport, Connecticut, appeared on a list of members of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade, which was part of the International Brigade in Spain during the Spanish Civil War.

The Abraham Lincoln Brigade was cited by the Attorney General on April 21, 1949 as a Communist organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

NANCY CARDOZA

There is no information available in the files of the Philadelphia Office concerning NANCY CARDOZA.

In reference teletype it was pointed out that KRISTEL FUCHS HEINEMAN while at Swarthmore College, had a close friend named OLGA who married a man named RADENMACHER. Indices of this office indicate that this person is OLGA RADENMACHER.

The records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Philadelphia, reflect that OLGA PETRUSCHKA FREY RADEMACHER was born at Wilhelm, Germany on September 11, 1902 and that she married Dr. HANS ADOLPH RADEMACHER on August 10, 1934 at Wustrov, Germany.

He had been a Professor at the University of Breslau in Germany until 1934 at which time he was dismissed by the Hitler government because of his membership in a German pacifist group. In a signed statement given to INS on May 25, 1943, he named the pacifist group as the "LIGA FUR MENSCHENRECHTE" (League for the Rights of Man). He stated that the purpose of this group was to support German democracy and combat attempts of the military caste in Germany to regain power. In addition, he said he belonged to "FRIEDENS - GESELLCHAFT" (Society of Friends), which society, he stated, advocated a type of World form of government similar to the League of Nations.

Since coming to the United States, RADEMACHER stated that the only organization he belonged to other than professional societies, was the Religious Society of Friends.

The RADEMACHERS had visited the United States from January, 1935 to June, 1935 and returned to the United States at the Port of New York on September 10, 1935. On September 12, 1940, both filed Petitions for Naturalization and both were granted United States citizenship on June 10, 1943.

From 1935 to 1937 HANS RADEMACHER was an exchange professor at Swarthmore College and later became a Professor of Mathematics at the University of Pennsylvania. The Rockefeller Organization which was trying to place dismissed German professors, recommended Dr. RADEMACHER to the University of Pennsylvania.

There is no information available in this office that the RADEMACHERS have been divorced.

Records of INS reflect that ELMA ANNA DOROTHE IDA CHRISTEL FUCHS applied for a visa to enter the United States on May 18, 1938 and stated in this application, that she intended to join Dr. and Mrs. HANS RADEMACHER at 611 Ogden Avenue, Swarthmore, Pa.

DETAILS:

This investigation is predicated on receipt of information from Mr. W. F. MOSS, Acting Chief, Investigative Section, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Honolulu, T. H., who on October 21, 1951 advised that the flight manifest for Pan-American World Airways Flight No. 4, scheduled to arrive in Honolulu on October 21, 1951, listed the name EMANUEL SCHWARTZ. Mr. MOSS further advised that he is in possession of an Immigration and Naturalization Service "Lookout Notice", office of issue, San Francisco, California, which indicates that one EMANUEL SCHWARTZ, a naturalized citizen of the United States, born August 23, 1914, is an alleged member of the Soviet espionage group.

AT HONOLULU, T. H.

On the basis of information furnished by W. F. MOSS, Immigration and Naturalization Inspectors JOHN LEAD and LLOYD HAYES, both assigned Honolulu International Airport, were contacted. HAYES

advised that no further information is available concerning MANUEL SCHWARTZ in the files of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Honolulu. He stated that the lookout notice described above was issued by Immigration and Naturalization Service, San Francisco, and further information concerning this individual should appear in San Francisco INS file 1300-11305.

HAYS verified the fact that Pan-American World Airways Flight No. 4 from Hong Kong and Tokyo was scheduled to arrive at Honolulu International Airport at 1:55 p.m., October 21, 1951. HAYS agreed to question arriving passenger EMANUEL SCHWARTZ in order to determine whether this individual is identical with the subject.

The flight referred to above arrived on schedule, and Inspector HAYS questioned Passenger EMANUEL SCHWARTZ, receiving the following information:

EMANUEL SCHWARTZ was traveling under Adjutant General's Office travel order A-202955, and is an employee of the United States government. He was born September 4, 1927 at Chicago, Illinois, and his present legal residence is 1529 South Ridgeway Avenue, Chicago. EMANUEL SCHWARTZ served in the United States Navy Construction Battalion, Detachment 1040, and formerly had USN Serial No. 8550162. EMANUEL SCHWARTZ was described as follows:

Hair	Brown
Eyes	Brown
Nose	Prominent
Scars and marks	None easily identifiable.

Mr. LAWRENCE LOOK, Passenger Agent, Pan-American World Airways, advised that EMANUEL SCHWARTZ was scheduled to continue on PAA Flight 4, departing Honolulu 6:30 p.m., October 21, 1951, enroute to San Francisco, California. Mr. LOOK later advised that EMANUEL SCHWARTZ was checked aboard Flight 4 and departed Honolulu on schedule.

As no information concerning EMANUEL SCHWARTZ was available at Honolulu, the San Francisco Division, as well as the Bureau, was advised of this matter on October 21, 1951.

The San Francisco Division advised on October 22, 1951 that investigation at San Francisco reflects the Immigration and Naturalization Service was in

possession of a lookout notice for one EMANUEL SCHWARTZ born December 28, 1917 at Winnipeg, Canada. This lookout notice, however, was cancelled on October 19, 1951. INS files at San Francisco do not contain a lookout notice for MANUEL SCHWARTZ, and INS, San Francisco, advised that EMANUEL SCHWARTZ, who departed Honolulu via Pan-American World Airways, Flight 4, October 21, 1951, is not identical with the individual for whom the lookout notice had previously been in effect. INS, San Francisco, advised that the information pertaining to MANUEL SCHWARTZ appeared on lookout notice at Honolulu due to typographical error.

No further action was taken.
