Kinoy resides at 266 West End Avenue, New York, New York and is employed by the law firm of Kuntsler and Kuntsler, 511 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York. He is also an Instructor at the Rutgers University Law School, Newark, New Jersey.

Kinoy is described as a white, male, American, 45 years old, 5'4", 125 pounds, black hair and brown eyes. He is married to Susan Knopf Kinoy.

The records of the Passport Office, Department of State, reflect that Kinoy was issued Passport Number G 632703 on June 3, 1966, for travel to England, Scotland, Italy and Greece for the purpose of pleasure and tourism. Kinoy indicated he planned on leaving the United States on June 17, 1966, for six weeks and planned on traveling by ship and plane.

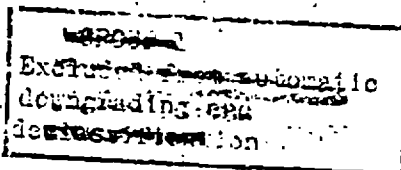

COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE
FOR MORTON SOBELL

"Following the execution of atomic spies ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG in June, 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon MORTON SOBELL', the ROSENBERGS' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case - a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg - Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953, and 'then the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case'..."

("Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications", dated December 1, 1961, issued by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, page 116.)

In September, 1954, the name "National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" appeared on literature issued by the Committee.

NATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the National Lawyers Guild:

"National Lawyers Guild

- "1. Cited as a Communist front.
(Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 1311 on the CIO Political Action Committee, March 29, 1944, p. 149.)
- "2. Cited as a Communist front which 'is the foremost legal bulwark of the Communist Party, its front organizations, and controlled unions' and which 'since its inception has never failed to rally to the legal defense of the Communist Party and individual members thereof, including known espionage agents.'
(Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 3123 on the National Lawyers Guild, September 21, 1950, originally related September 17, 1950.)
- "3. 'To defend the cases of Communist lawbreakers, fronts have been devised making special appeals in behalf of civil liberties and reaching out far beyond the confines of the Communist Party itself. Among these organizations are the * * * National Lawyers Guild. When the Communist Party itself is under fire these offer a bulwark of protection.'
(Internal Security Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Handbook for Americans, S. Doc. 117, April 23, 1956, p. 91.)"

A second source has advised that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America (DCA) was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention. The aims of this organization, as set forth in the preamble to the constitution are, "It is our belief that this nation can best solve its problems in an atmosphere of peaceful coexistence, complete disarmament and true freedom for all peoples of the world, and that these solutions will be reached mainly through the united efforts of all democratic elements in our country, composed essentially of the working people allied in the unity of Negroes and other minorities with whites. We further fully recognize that the greatest threat to American democracy comes from the racist and right wing forces in coalition with the most reactionary sections of the economic power structure, using the tool of anti-Communism to divide and destroy the unified struggle of the working people."

Over the Labor Day weekend, 1965, the DCA held a conference in Chicago, Illinois, and a new slate of officers was elected to the National Executive Committee (NEC) of the DCA. Since Labor Day, 1965, identities of those serving on the NEC has varied; however, according to a third source as of May, 1966, thirteen of the fifteen members of the NEC were members of the CP in the San Francisco Bay area.

As of May, 1966, the headquarters of the DCA was located at 1830 Fell Street, San Francisco, California.

For the Bureau's confidential info, Mr. NICHOLAS advised that the matter of a PP for AGRIN was first brought to his attention by BLANCH FREEDMAN, NYC Attorney, that the PP Office had no adverse info re AGRIN in its files and would have issued a regular 2-year unrestricted PP to her, but decided on the above-stated course of action re AGRIN in view of identity of her attorney and the under-lying purpose of her trip.

AGRIN stated born 5/23/23, at Brooklyn, NY, and furnished permanent residence as 30 East 9th St., NYC. Requested PP be mailed to her at 220 Broadway, NYC. Listed her father as JOSEPH AGRIN, born in Russia in 1896, immigrated to the U.S. in 1905, resided U.S. since then, naturalized at NYC, now residing with her. The files of the Passport Office, United States Department of State, were reviewed on October 19, 1966, by a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and disclosed the following information:

On May 16, 1966, at New York, New York, Rose Sobell was issued passport G 488138 for proposed two and one-half months' travel to Russia and Western Europe for the purpose of pleasure. She indicated on the passport application, dated May 16, 1966, at New York, that she would depart by ship on July 4.

This passport is valid for travel to all countries except Albania, Cuba and those portions of China, Korea and Vietnam under communist control. The passport will expire on May 15, 1969, and may be renewed for two years.

Sobell, born July 30, 1894, in Russia, listed her permanent residence as 142 Laurel Hill Terrace, New York, New York. Her occupation was given as housewife. She listed her parents as Michael Pasternak and Ida Chanam, both of whom were born in Russia. Neither of her parents are United States citizens.

In event of death or accident, she requested that her daughter, Beverly Crystall, be notified at 379 Congress Street, New Milford, New Jersey.

She indicated that she was last married on May 22, 1915, to Louis Sobell, born 1889 in Russia. This marriage was terminated by death on April 11, 1955.

She was previously issued passport E 177412 on April 9, 1964, at New York, New York, for proposed three months' pleasure travel to England, France, Italy and Israel. She indicated that she would depart in the Summer of 1964 by ship.

When applying for her 1966 passport, Sobell submitted an affidavit in which she stated that her apartment had been broken into two weeks earlier and her 1964 passport had been stolen along with other articles.

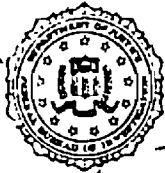

Dear Sir:

While in conference on other investigative matters with Mr. ASHLEY J. NICHOLAS, of the Fraud Section of the Passport Division of the Department of State, the latter furnished Special Agent LOUIS LOEBL with the following information which is believed will be of interest to the Bureau in connection with its Key Figure program inasmuch as it relates to members of the Communist Party whose transportation to Russia in 1935 and thereabouts was handled by the World Tourists agency in New York City and charged to accounts of the Communist Party:

During the winter of 1939-40, in connection with the investigation of passport frauds committed by EARL BROWDER and other leading Communists, the United States Attorney for the Southern District of New York at New York City, at the request of the State Department, subpoenaed the records of the World Tourists, Inc., a travel agency which had been established about 1927 under Communist auspices. At the time the records of the World Tourists, Inc., were thus obtained JOSEPH BRODSKY was the president of the corporation, CECIL WELLS WARSZOWER, alias WILLIAM WEINER, alias A. BLAKE, was vice-president, and JACOB RAISIN, alias J. N. COLOS, was general manager. In questioning witnesses for the grand jury it was ascertained that the accounts of the World Tourists' books in the name A. BLAKE, PRIMOFF, PRIMOFF STUDENTS and TRADE UNION UNITY LEAGUE DELEGATES were actually the accounts of the Communist Party.

6. The Primoff Account refers to GEORGE PRIMOFF, who was for a number of years the financial advisor of the Communist Party. He is a certified public accountant in New York City and his name was at that time listed in the New York telephone directory. A. BLAKE was identical to WELLS WARSZOWER, who under the name of WILLIAM WEINER, was the financial secretary of the Communist Party, as well as the vice-president of the World Tourists, Inc., and president of the International Workers Order. Besides PRIMOFF and WARSZOWER the principal contact man of the Communist Party with the World Tourists, Inc., was MAX KITZES, the auditor of the Communist Party who used the alias A. BENSON. He was known by both names at

The World Tourists, Inc., maintained accounts with the Fifth Avenue Branch of the Corn Exchange Bank and Trust Company and with the Chase National Bank. The Communist Party had accounts with the Amalgamated Bank of New York in the names WILLIAM WEINER and A. BENSON. The deposits in the latter account were made by KITZES but the checks were signed, A. BENSON by WELLWELL WARSZOWER. The World Tourists account was also used by WARSZOWER in connection with Communist Party funds and copies of the deposit slips of these accounts covering a period of years are on file at the State Department.

Mr. NICHOLAS also advised that the Passport Division has in its files photostatic copies of the travel orders and of the ledgers covering the account relating to each person, as well as negatives of the photographs of the persons mentioned in the various accounts, all of which information and material can be made available to the Bureau for perusal.

In connection with the above information there are transmitted herewith two copies of each of the above-mentioned accounts for any disposition the Bureau desires to make with respect thereto. The Washington Field Division did not keep copies of these accounts.

MEMORANDUM

March 3, 1944

During the winter of 1939-1940 in connection with the investigation of passport frauds committed by Earl Browder and other leading Communists the United States Attorney in New York, at our request, subpoenaed the records of the World Tourists Inc., a travel agency which had been established about 1927 under Communist auspices.

At the time of our obtention of the World Tourists records Joseph Brodsky was the president of the corporation; Wellwell Warszower, alias William Weiner, alias A. Blake was vice president; and Jacob Rabin, alias J. N. Golos was general manager.

In questioning witnesses for the grand jury we ascertained that the accounts on the World Tourists books in the names A. Blake, Primoff, Primoff Students, and Trade Union Unity League delegates were actually the accounts of the Communist Party.

The Primoff account refers to George Primoff, who was for a number of years the financial adviser of the party. He is a certified public accountant and was at that time listed in the New York telephone directory. A. Blake was Wellwell Warszower, who, under the name of William Weiner, was the financial secretary of the Communist Party as well as the vice president of the World Tourists and president of the International Workers Order. Besides Primoff and Warszower the principal contact man of the Communist Party with the World Tourists was Max Kitzes, the internal auditor of the Communist Party who used the alias A. Benson. He was known by both names at Communist Party headquarters where I phoned him several times to come in as a witness. Kitzes was also a notary public and several fraudulent affidavits of birth submitted in connection with passport applications had been executed before him.

We have in our files copies of the deposit slips of these accounts covering a period of years.

We also have in our files photostatic copies of the travel folders of most of the persons whose transportation was charged to the Communist Party and photostatic copies of the pages of the ledgers covering several accounts.



Rebulet December 15, 1950 in which this office was requested to review the State Department file concerning ISAIAH LITVACKOFF for the purpose of determining whether the State Department had secured information concerning JOSEPH HIAT, ELIAS SHAPIRO, or SONIA DOBBS.

Mr. ASHLEY J. NICHOLAS, Fraud Section, Passport Division, Department of State, made available his confidential records pertaining to the case involving ISAIAH LITVACKOFF, alias, NATHAN ROSENBERG. Mr. NICHOLAS advised that to the best of his recollection, no investigation was conducted concerning JOSEPH HIAT, ELIAS SHAPIRO, or SONIA DOBBS.

The file on LITVACKOFF contained the following information concerning these individuals:

JOSEPH HIAT was the identifying witness on the passport application filed under the name of NATHAN ROSENBERG and dated May 10, 1937. This application shows HIAT's address as 19 East 16th St., New York City. In executing this application, ROSENBERG requested the State Department to mail the passport to him, care of SHAPIRO, 126 Ft. Washington Ave., New York City.

Concerning JOSEPH HIAT, a report dated November 6, 1939 reflects that a State Department Investigator conducted an investigation at 19 East 16th St., New York City in an effort to locate HIAT. However, persons at that address reported that no such person ever lived there and such a person was not known at that address. Inquiry at the post office was also made without success. This was apparently the extent of the investigation conducted to locate the identifying witness to the passport application.

Mr. NICHOLAS' file on LITVACKOFF contained no photograph under the name JOSEPH HIAT or JOSEPH KATZ. From passport applications executed by JOSEPH KATZ in 1939 and 1945 photographs were secured and are being enclosed for the Bureau and New York Division.

Three photostatic copies of the passport application of NATHAN ROSENBERG dated May 10, 1937, on which the name of JOSEPH KATZ appears as the identifying witness, are being enclosed for the Bureau and the New York Division in accordance with instructions in reflet.

With regard to ELIAS SHAPIRO, the above-mentioned file contains the following information:

In a passport application dated July 1, 1938, SHAPIRO advised that he was born July 29, 1879 in Kartuz-Berezor, Grodno, Russia, and he emigrated to the United States July 9, 1901. He was naturalized in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York on November 16, 1907. He gave his residence as 286 Ft. Washington Ave., New York City. This application reflects that his father, SCHACHNO YOSSEL SHAPIRO, was born in Russia and resided at Kartuz-Berezor, Russia, (now Poland). SHAPIRO applied for a passport to go to France, England, and Poland for a vacation. The identifying witness on this application was HELEN STAWSKY, 1603 Macombs Road, Bronx, New York. SHAPIRO was described as five feet, five inches; brown hair-graying; blue eyes; occupation-dentist. Passport No. 955675 was issued to SHAPIRO on July 17, 1938.

Mr. NICHOLAS' records reflect that SHAPIRO's proposed trip was handled by World Tourists, Inc., 175 5th Ave., New York City. One itinerary prepared by World Tourists shows that SHAPIRO was to leave New York on the SS Aquitania on August 3, 1938 and go to Cherbourg, France. From there he was to go to Warsaw, Poland. He was to leave Gdynia, Poland September 7, 1938 and return to New York City via Southampton, England. The return trip was to be on the SS Aquitania also. Another itinerary prepared by World Tourists, Inc., reflects that SHAPIRO was to leave New York City August 3, 1938 on the SS Aquitania and proceed to Moscow via Southampton, London, Copenhagen, Stockholm, Helsingfors, and Leningrad. He was to spend August 15 and 16 in Leningrad and from August 17 to August 21 in Moscow. He was to go then to Poland where he would remain from August 22 to September 2 thereafter returning to New York City via Paris and Cherbourg, France.

Also contained in these records was what appeared to be a copy of an application for a Soviet visa for ELIAS SHAPIRO. This application gives his date and place of birth as September 29, 1879 at Kartuz-Berezor, Grodno Lub, Poland. His father's name is shown as SCHACHNO YOSSEL SHAPIRO.

SHAPIRO was described as a United States citizen whose occupation was that of a dentist. In this application, it was stated that SHAPIRO desired to make a pleasure trip to Russia; that it would be a seven-day tour-third class; and that he would spend the seven days in Leningrad and Moscow. This application also reflects that SHAPIRO was never a citizen of the USSR; that he left Kartuz-Boreza as a student in 1901; that when he left he had a tzarist passport enabling him to go to an aunt in America; and that he had relatives in the USSR, but their location was unknown. His point of entrance into the USSR was to be Leningrad and the point of exit was to be Moresco. It was noted that by letter dated June 14, 1938 addressed to SHAPIRO, he was advised by World Tourists, Inc., that he had been refused a Soviet visa and that there was nothing more World Tourists could do. This letter was signed by S. J. DOBB.

In the above-mentioned State Department Investigator's report dated November 6, 1939, there is contained the results of investigation conducted at 286 Ft. Washington Ave., New York City, in an effort to identify NATHAN ROSENBERG. During this investigation, it was ascertained that Dr. ELIAS SHAPIRO, dentist, had been a tenant at that address for six years and had been located in the neighborhood for 15 years. He was interviewed and recalled that about two years prior to the time the investigation was conducted, a man believed to be ROSENBERG made a short and unexplained visit to SHAPIRO. SHAPIRO was shown photographs of ROSENBERG and LITVACKOFF, and he stated he believed this was the man who visited him. He could not recall just what name the caller had used, but thought he used the name ROSENBERG. This man told SHAPIRO he had come to New York City from Philadelphia where he was living; also that he originally came from Kartuz-Boreza, Grodno, Poland, the place SHAPIRO came from. He said he and SHAPIRO had attended school together in Poland. He told SHAPIRO he was expecting to receive some mail at SHAPIRO's address, and SHAPIRO advised this man had received at least one piece of mail at that address. SHAPIRO said he had no idea what became of this man and that he had not seen him or heard from him since that time.

This State Department report reflects that efforts to locate the witnesses of the real NATHAN ROSENBERG naturalization were unsuccessful as well as efforts to locate ROSENBERG.

Dr. EDWARD KALLMAN

Mr. NILS TEGNER, Superintendent at 130 West 57th Street, New York City, advised that Dr. EDWARD KALLMAN, a dentist, had occupied a suite of offices in this building for approximately 15 years. Based on various conversations which he has had with KALLMAN, TEGNER is of the opinion that KALLMAN is at least strongly in favor of Communism. TEGNER furnished KALLMAN's description as follows:

Inasmuch as the description above fails to match that of the unknown subject, "Charlie" as given by ELIZABETH BENTLEY, no further investigation regarding Dr. EDWARD KALLMAN is contemplated.

Reference is made to Bureau letter dated December 15, 1950, and Washington Field letter dated February 23, 1951, in the case entitled, "JOSEPH KATZ, was., ESPIONAGE-R", in which there is set forth information pertaining to Dr. ELIAS SHAPIRO who lived at 286 Fort Washington Avenue, New York City. Information set out in these letters reflects that SHAPIRO was the designated addressee of a passport issued to ISAIAN LITVACKOFF under the name NATHAN ROSENBERG in 1937. LITVACKOFF's witness on this passport was JOSEPH MIAT, this name being an alias for JOSEPH KATZ, who has been ascertained by investigation to be identical with ELIZABETH BENTLEY's espionage principal, "Jack".

Subsequent to his obtaining this passport, LITVACKOFF was convicted and served a prison sentence for passport fraud. Investigation conducted by the State Department brought out the fact that LITVACKOFF's transportation had been obtained through World Tourist, this having been the organization of which JACOB GOLOS was the head. The State Department file on LITVACKOFF contains the following information with regard to ELIAS SHAPIRO:

He was to leave Gdynia, Poland, on September 7, 1938, and return to New York via Southampton, England, aboard the S.S. "Aquitania". Another itinerary prepared by World Tourist reflects he was to leave New York City on August 3, 1938, on the S.S. "Aquitania" and proceed to Moscow via Southampton, London, Copenhagen, Stockholm, Helsingfors, and Leningrad. He was to spend August 15th, 16th, in Leningrad and from August 17 to 21, 1938, in Moscow. He was then to go to Poland where he would remain August 22nd to September 2nd, 1938, returning to New York City via Paris and Cherbourg, France.

Other information in the file indicates SHAPIRO applied for a Soviet visa but that he was advised by World Tourist that he had been refused such a visa.

A State Department Investigator's report dated November 6, 1939, reflects investigation conducted at 286 Ft. Washington Avenue, New York City. During this investigation, it was ascertained that Dr. ELIAS SHAPIRO had been a tenant at that address for six years and had been located in the neighborhood for approximately 15 years.

IRVING MAYER, a postal clerk, residing at Apartment 2F, 286 Ft. Washington Avenue, New York City, stated that Dr. ELIAS SHAPIRO had formerly been a tenant at that address but now resided at another address on Ft. Washington Avenue, New York City. He stated that SHAPIRO is a member of a group which meets in Washington Park of which he, MAYER, had been a member although he was not particularly well acquainted with SHAPIRO.

The New York Telephone directory reflects that ELIAS SHAPIRO, Dentist, now resides at 536 Ft. Washington Avenue, New York City.

Mrs ALBERTA KENDIG, 540 Ft. Washington Avenue, New York City, Superintendent, 536 Ft. Washington Avenue advised she is acquainted with Dr. SHAPIRO who resides and has an office at the latter address. He advised that SHAPIRO's daughter resides with him at that address. Mrs. KENDIG states she had heard rumors to the effect that SHAPIRO is a Communist and she has observed that he buys various Communist publications the names of which were unknown to her at the time of the interview. She described SHAPIRO as follows:

HERBERT I. PALEY, 54 Audubon Avenue, New York City, advised he is the president of a Men's Civic Club which meets on Sundays at Ft. Washington Park. He stated he has been acquainted with Dr. ELIAS SHAPIRO, who is also a member of the club, since he, PALEY, joined the club about 8 years ago. He stated that to the best of his recollection SHAPIRO has never during that period had any illnesses which would necessitate an operation, nor has he heard any mention of SHAPIRO ever having had such an illness prior to the time he, PALEY, became acquainted with him.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York were checked with negative results regarding SHAPIRO by SA GORDON C. LUND.

The records of Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, have been checked but to date no record of SHAPIRO has been located.

A photograph of Dr. ELIAS SHAPIRO was obtained from State Department files and will be displayed to ELIZABETH BENTLEY.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, furnished information that ISAAC STAMLER, born 1884, was a member of IWO Lodge #337 as of August, 1949. It was noted that this Lodge meets at the Hunt's Point Palace, Southern Boulevard and 163rd Street, Bronx, New York, according to information furnished by Confidential Informant T-2.

Dayton was denied passport facilities by the Passport Office on
April 14, June 24 and October 12, 1954. An appeal was filed and Hear-
ings were held on January 18 and March 29, 1955 before the Board of
Passport Appeals at which subject appeared personally and was repre-
sented by counsel.

After a review of the entire record and on the basis of all the
evidence, including that contained in confidential reports of investi-
gation and that adduced at the Hearings, the Secretary of State disap-
proved the subject's request for passport facilities under Section 51.135
of the passport regulations. The subject was informed of this decision
by letter dated September 7, 1955.
