a. Interview with Subject

The subject was interviewed on January 28,-1954-by-SA HARVEY_N. JOHNSON and the writer.


Subject stated he was willing to cooperate in any way he could with the Federal Bureau of Investigation and that he felt it was his responsibility to furnish any information in his possession which would help the security of the United States.

The subject stated that he was suspended from the 3151st Electronic Group, Griffiss Air Force Base, Rome, New York in October, 1952. He exhibited to the agents his letter of suspension which indicated that he was suspended for security reasons and that he was not being suspended because of any doubt to his loyalty. Subject stated also that he was appealing this suspension because he felt that others would believe him a loyalty risk if he did not appeal.

Subject stated, however, that because of his association with MAX ELLITCHER, MORTON SOBEL, AARON NAVIKOFF, WILLIAM DANSINGER, that he was, in all probability, a security risk to the country and that he felt that if this association would make him a security a security risk, then the government had the right to suspend him. The subject also stated at this time that besides MAX ELLICHER, MORTON SOBEL, AARON NAVIKOFF, MILLIAM DANSINGER, he also knew AARON COLEMAN of Long Branch, N.J. and HENRY JASCIK, New York City.

He stated at this time he mentioned COLEMAN and JASCIK's names because he had seen their names in the newspaper but that he did not know COLEMAN and JASCIK and does not know them not to be Communist Party members or interested in any way in the CP or other subversive organizations. He stated that as far as ELITCHE'S, SOBEL, MANTKOFF, and DAESHES R were concerned, he never knew them to be CP members while he lived with them and that he would not remain in the same building with them in Washington if he did know them to be Communists.

III. ADS AND OBJECTIVES

On 4/5/51 JULIUS and ETHEL ROSKHERD were sentenced to death and MORTON SCHELL was sentenced to 30 years in a Federal prison.



ORIGIN, SCOPE, AND GENERAL ACTIVITY OF THE ROSENBERG COMMITTEES IN NEW JERSEY AND THEIR CONNECTION WITH THE NATIONAL COMMITTEE IN NEW YORK

Information in this section is set out in chronological order inasmuch as it does not suggest appropriate subdivisions.

I.

An article in the 3/30/52 issue of the Worker, N.Y.C., captioned, "Pledge Fight To Save Rosenbergs," states that a second public meeting, sponsored by a committee recently formed in the area by fraternal, farmer, and civic leaders, was held Monday, 3/24/52, at Carpenters Hall, Lakewood, N.J. The meeting was addressed by JOSEPH BRAINING, "Prominent writer and author," and Mrs. HELEN SOBELL, "whose husband was given a 30-year prison sentence in the same frame-up trial." Intensive local activity to save the ROSENBERGS was reportedly pledged by farmers and townspeople at this meeting.



Newark Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, stated that at the above meeting, JOSEPH BRAININ, one of the speakers, stated, "A vote of thanks should be given to BEN BACH who has worked so hard to make this meeting in Lakewood a success."

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case (this committee will hereafter be referred to as the NCSJRC) had an advertisement in the 3/27/52 Montclair Times Weekly, Montclair, N.J., alleging the ROSENBERGS were innocent and stating that a local committee was being formed. This article included a clipping which offered to send documentary facts, the sale of a pamphlet captioned, "To Secure Justice In The Rosenberg Case," and solicited the receipt of contributions to "help secure justice in this case." These clippings were to be sent to instant committee in care of Mrs. RICHARD E. HENRY, 59 William St., East Orange, N.J.

Dr. LEONARD TUSHNET, Maplewood, N.J., a member of the national committee, announced, according to an article appearing on Page 14 of the 3/26/52 issue of the Newark Evening News, that an organizational meeting of an Essex County Branch NCSJRC would be held at his home, Friday, 3/28/52.

The 4/6/52 issue of the Worker, N.Y.C., on Page 1, contained an article confirming formation of the above group referred to as the Essex Branch of the NCSJRC. Dr. TUSHNET was referred to as a member of the National Group.

SA BERT P. STICKLER a mimeographed letter, received by mail, announcing an memergency meeting to save the ROSENBERGS 1/30/52 at 516 Clinton Ave., Newark, N.J. The printed letterhead of this mimeographed sheet read, "Committee To Secure Justice In the Rosenberg Case, 216 5th Ave., Room 1/11, New York 1, N.Y." and noted JOSEPH BRAININ was Chairman, and DAVID AIMAN was Excutive Secretary of instant committee. A list of sponsors on this letter included the names of Mrs. BESSIE-MITCHELL and Dr. LEONARD TISHNET. The letter requested additional contributions be sent to AMANDA HENRY, 59 William St., East Orange, N.J.

Newark Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, related that approximately 150 people attended this meeting and that DAVID ALMAN, described as a noted author, and HELEN SOBELL, wife of MORTON SOBELL, were two of the speakers. T-3 stated that the following literature was distributed at this meeting: A pamphlet entitled, The Rosenberg Committee — A Fact Sheet; a 32-page pamphlet entitled, Secure Justice In the Rosenberg Case by WILLIAM A. REUBIN; a leaflet entitled, A Fact Sheet On Anti-Semitism In the Case; Newspaper Comment. All the above items were published by the NCSJEC, New York City, N.Y.

Newark Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised in that BEN BACH was then in charge of propaganda for the ROSENBERGS in Lakewood, N.J., and the M.ddlesex County, N.J. area. T-4 also noted that PERRI KAISER, of New Brunswick, N.J., was assisting BACH in the New Brunswick area.

B. C. JONES that BEN BACH on 6/28/52 was distributing circulars in Toms
River, N.J., assued by the Committee to Secure Justice In The Rosenberg
Case, N.Y.C., N.Y.

Newark Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, stated that approximately 200 people attended the above meeting and Dr. L. TUSHNET was Master of Ceremonies; DAVID ALMAN, National Executive Secretary, instant organization, gave an account of the Rosenberg Case, generally following the account in the pamphlet issued by the NCSJRC entitled, The Facts In the Rosenberg Case."

LOTTIE GORDON, the second speaker, identified herslef as a representative of the Civil Rights Congress, stating that the Civil Rights Congress was joining the above committee to see that justice was served.

Other speaker included Mrs. MCRTON SOBELL; Rabbi Dr. MEYER SHRAFF, Temple Nasha Pokatitof, Brooklyn, N.Y.

Six hundred and nine dollars was collected during instant meeting and signatures for an Amicus Brief, to be submitted to the Supreme Court, were solicited as persons entered and left the hall.

The following literature, according to T-7, was distributed at instant meeting which was published by NCSJRC, N.Y.: A pamphlet entitled, "The Letters of Julius and Enel Rosenberg;" a pamphlet, "A Statement On The Rosenberg Case By A Distinguished Leader of Orthodox Jewry, Kabbi Dr. MEYER SHRAFF;" a mimeographed sheet, "A Fact Sheet On Anti-Semitism In The Case; Newspaper Comment;" a circular, "Press Release," dated 6/12/52; and a pamphlet, "The Facts In The Rosenberg Case."



T-8 noted that in the past the committee had been stressing the fact that the ROSENBERGS were innocent of the charges in the indictment.

Newark Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised in 12/52 that the NCSJRC is sometimes referred to as the National Committee for Clemency in the Rosenberg Case.

made available identical mimeographed letters dated 10/20/52 received by them from the New Jersey Committee For Clemency in the Rosenberg Case, LEONARD TUSHNET, M.D., 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N.J. The letter asked the above to join other religious leaders of all faiths in a plea for mercy in the Rosenberg case.

stated that the above was apparently a circular valetter sent to all clergymen of Newark in reference to the Rosenberg Case.

"Father CLARENCE E. DUFFY, Catholic Priest," was listed in the letter as a religious leader who had joined the above plea for mercy.

stated that this individual's name could not be found in the Catholic Directory for 1952.

An article on Page 41 of the 11/3/52 issue of the Newark Evening News reveals that Dr. L. TUSHNET, Irvington, N.J., was Chairman of the New Jersey Committee For Clemency For The Rosenbergs and that this committee planned a mass meeting to appeal to President Truman for clemency for JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. Dr. TUSHNET asserted, according to this source, that citizens would be asked to sned letters and telegrams to the President urging commutation of the death sentence.

Newark Confidential Informant T-10, of known reliability, advised that approximately 200 people attended the above meeting at Wideway Hall, Newark, N.J. A large telegram to the President, urging Executive clemency was hung in back of the speakers' platform and blank telegrams were on each seat. The speakers included EMILY ALMAN, wife of DAVID ALMAN, Executive Secretary of the NCSJRC, who stated that 12,000 circulars on the case were sent out in New Jersey and that all of the clergy were circularized. She, together with other speakers, Reverend HARRY WARD, Professor Emeritus of Union Theological Seminary, and YURI SUHL, spoke in favor of clemency. Mrs. ALMAN gave the collection speech, stating that it cost \$27,000 to carry the ROSENBERG case to the Supreme Court and to obtain executive clemency; more money was needed. She also urged everyone to send at least five telegrams per week to President Truman requesting Executive clemency.

Newark, N.J. Police Department, reported that L. TUSHNET was Chairman of the above meeting.

Newark Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, made available a mimeographed letter with three enclosures from LEONARD TUSHNET, M.D., 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N.J., State Chairman of the New Jersey Committee For Clemency In The Rosenberg Case, via South Jersey Committee For Clemency, dated 1/3/53.

The last paragraph of the above letter requested the recipient to immediately wire or write President Truman to halt the execution of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG.

The enclosures were three 4-page leaflets published by the NCSJRC, 1050 6th Ave., New York City, N.Y., entitled, "Comments From The Jewish Press on Clemency For Ethel and Julius Rosenberg," "Mercy For the Rosenbergs By Abraham Cronbach," and "The Facts In The Rosenberg Case."



Newark Confidential Informant T-12, of known reliability, stated that on 12/19/52, LEWIS MORCZE, at the Civil Rights Congress Headquarters, Newark, N.J., received instructions from the New York Office of instant committee to the effect that there was to be a change in the plan for a mass crusade to Washington, D.C., on behalf of the ROSENBERGS due to the difficulty in arranging housing and a meeting place for thousands of expected delegates. A plan was being considered for a meeting of 300 prominent persons in Washington and to have those other individuals who might have participated in the trip secure ten to fifteen letters or telegrams addressed to President Truman calling for clemency in the ROSENBERG case and to submit these over the week-end of 1/3/53.

Newark Confidential Informant T-13, of unknown reliability, on 12/31/52, made available a circular captioned, "A Call To A National Clemency Gathering," Monday 1/5/53, Inspiration House, Washington, D.C. This was addressed to "The People of New Jersey" and asked them to attend the above meeting sponsored by the NCSJRC, 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N.J.

Jersey Central Railroad Police, Jersey City, N.J., advised SA REESLE L. TIMMONS on 1/3/53 that a special B & O train for the "Labor Committee For the Rosenbergs" was to leave the Communipaw Terminal of Jersey City at 7:00 AM, 1/5/53 for Washington, D.C., and return 11:30 PM, that evening.

An article in the Newark Evening News on 1/6/53 reported a delegation of New Jersey citizens visited New Jersey Republican Senators HENDRICLSON and SMITH, 1/5/53, asking to have the death sentence of the ROSENBERGS commuted by Presidential clemency. The group reportedly included 30 or 40 men and women, led by Dr. LEDNARD TUSHNET, 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N.J. They claimed affiliation with no organization. Dr. TUSHNET is quoted as saying that the individuals of the group were there in an individual capacity.

Radio WKDN, Camden, N.J., Edvised Special Agent MALON IUCAS JENNINGS in 1/53 that they were contacted on behalf of the South Jersey Committee For Clemency In The Rosenberg Case, of which GEURGE FISHMAN is Chairman, for some radio time.

The Asbury Fark Evening Iress, 1/12/53 issue, on page 11, contained a quarter page ad captioned, "Must The Rosenbergs Die." This ad included an appeal for elemency from various American and foreign sources. At the bottom were instructions to write or wire the Fresident urging commutation of the death sentences. This ad quoted that "this advertisement was paid for by public subscription and published by the Monmouth and Ocean County Committee to Secure Clemency For the Rosenbergs."

Dr. TUSHNET was identified as a sponsor of the MCSJMC in an advertisement by said committee in the 3/27/52 issue, Montclair Times Weekly, Montclair, N.J.

T-7 stated that on 9/11/52, Dr. TUSHNET was Chairman of a state-wide mass meeting of the N.J. NCSJEC at Newark, N.J.



AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The advertisement of the NCSJRC, appearing in the 3/27/52 issue of the Montclair Times Weekly, Montclair, N.J., directs committee leaders to fact now; let us do these things today:

- "(1) Write to the President and ask him to commute the death sentence;
- *(2) Write for the pamphlet setting forth the FACTS in this case and spread the FACTS;
- *(3) Support the ROSENBERGS in their legal rights for a review of the sentence and let us call for a new trial.*

The Newark Evening News, in an article on Page 30 of the 5/1/52 issue, reported a meeting on 4/30/52 at 516 Clinton Ave., Newark, N.J., called by the Essex County Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case. Said meeting protested the guilty verdict and death sentence of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG. Those present reportedly sent a petition asking the Supreme Court to set aside the verdict. An amount of \$1,146.50 was allegedly collected to help pay legal fees. "The High Court" is scheduled to hear an appeal for a review of the case the Monday following 5/1/52.

T-6 advised in 10/52 that in the past, instant committees have stressed the fact that the ROSENBERGS were innocent of the charges in the trial. He stated that at a 10/15/52 meeting of the Bergen County Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, at Teaneck, N.J., stated that from now on they are going to play down the innocence of the ROSENBERGS and play up the racial issue and the fact that such traitors as TOKYO ROSE have received relatively light sentences.

It is noted that T-1, in 12/52, stated that the NCSJRC is sometimes referred to as the National Committee For Clemency In The Rosenberg Case.

The Mimangraphed letter, dated 10/20/52, received by

New Jersey Committee for Clemency in the Rosenberg Case, included the following message:

*Dear Sir:

"JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG will die in the electric chair in a few weeks unless President Truman intervenes.

"All the political and legal arguments in this celebrated case mean nothing. What remains is the human question. Here are two people -- husband and wife, father and mother -- sentenced to death. The judgment need not be inflexible. We must plea for mercy.

"Already joined in this plea for mercy are religious leaders of all faiths including (names of 13 individuals).

"We ask you to write immediately to President Harry S.
Truman requesting him to exercise his executive clemency
to commute the death sentence of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.
We urge you to help us by letting us know what action you
have taken."

T-6 stated that of the Following five steps which you must take now:"

- "(1) Return to all in your city who have shown interest and concern in this case by phone, mail, and meetings. Discuss with them what you and they can do to save the lives of the Rosenbergs. Make the reaching of more people a paramount point.
- "(2) Collect funds immediately to place the largest possible adds in your local newspaper. Quarter-page adds are the minimum effective adds. In these adds appeal to President Truman to set aside the death sentence by executive clemency. Use the enclosed draft of an add as your guide.
- "(3) Organize a wife and letter campaign to President Truman, asking that the death sentence be set aside. Point out the unprecedented nature of these death sentences. Do as large a mailing as possible to key lists who can get similar action.
- "(4) In these letters to President Truman, urge him to direct the Attorney General to consent to a new trial in the event that any new motions come before the courts.
- "(5) Rush funds to our office. We will need collections of thousands of dollars within the next few weeks in a nation-wide clemency appeal."

A. Connection With The Communist Party

Newark T-9 advised on 12/9/52 that the NCSJRC is sometimes referred to as the National Committee for Clemency in the Rosenberg Case and that the New Jersey sections of this committee are Communist Party inspired and controlled organization.

The Communist Party, will hereinafter be referred to as the CP, and has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as an subversive organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Newark Confidential Informant T-15, of known reliability, advised in 1952 that the "Committee To Save the Rosenbergs", Newark, N.J., on 4/25/52 paid for a \$1.05 subscription to the Daily Worker "What's On" notices.

The Daily Worker is an East-Coast Communist daily newspaper.



No information is available to the Newark Office reflecting any deviation of views by the New Jersey Committees from the published views of the NCSJRC. It is noted that the New Jersey committees, as reflected in the above sections, have disseminated literature of the NCSJRC and development of this fact is therefore left to the discretion of the New York Office.

MISCELLANEOUS

A. Connection Of The Civil Rights Congress With Instant Committees

It is noted that the Civil Rights Congress, hereinafter noted as the CRC, has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as comint within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Newark Confidential Informant T-21, of known reliability, advised 4/3/52 that LOTTIE GORDON and LEWIS MOROZE were concerned about the scheduling of a meeting of the CRC and the Essex County Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case on the same date. MOROZE intended to discuss this matter with Dr. LEONARD TUSHNET of the latter committee to make certain the two affairs do not compete with one another for attendance.

Newark Confidential Informant T-22, of known reliability, related that a CRC rally was held by Nature Friends of America, Camp Midvale, N.J. on 7/13/52.

Mrs. HELEN SOBELL, wife of MORTON SOBELL, made a special appeal for funds to help her husband fight for freedom. Thereafter a collection was taken by eight women who asked for nothing less than a dollar. 1-22 estimated that \$300 was collected.

T-22 recalled that WILLIAM PATTLASON, National Secretary of the CRC, followed Mrs. SOBELL as a speaker. At the end of his speech, PATTERSON made an appeal for the contribution to the NCSJRC. No collection was taken however. A booth was set up at the clubhouse at the camp for the purpose of taking pledges and accepting contributions to be forwarded to the committee.

T-2 noted that the majority of literature disseminated at this rally concerned the ROSENBERG case. He made available a pamphlet obtained at the rally entitled, The Rosenberg Case—A Fact Sheet," published by the NCSJRC.

Newark T-2, on 8/14/52, stated that LEWIS MOROZE, at CRC Head-quarters, Newark, N.J., was preparing a ticket to be printed for a meeting on the Rosenberg Case to be held Thursday, 9/11/52, at Wideway hall, 929 Broad St., Newark, N.J.

Newark Confidential Informant T-23, of known reliability, related that a Bonds for Israel Rally at Untermann Field, Newark, N.J. was held 8/18/52. At the east gate of this field, four men were distributing pamphlets. From this distribution, T-23 obtained two pamphlets published by the NCSJRC entitled,

"A Statement On The Rosenberg Case" by Rabbi Dr. Meyer Shraff; and "The Rosenberg Case—A Fact Sheet." To the latter was stapled a ticket inviting the receiver to a meeting at Wideway Hall, Newark, N.J., 9/11/52; This meeting to be sponsored under the auspices of the Rosenberg Committee, RD 2, Box 148, Toms River, N.J.

Newark T-12 stated on 8/20/52 that LEWIS MOROZE had that day reported to an individual at the headquarters of the NCSJRC, in New York, that the New Jersey group had a successful distribution at a Bonds For Israel Rally and a successful meeting of the Rosenberg Committee in Stelton, N.J.

It is to be noted that in Section I of this report, T-7 stated that at the 9/11/52 meeting of the New Jersey Committee To Secure Justice In The Rosenberg Case, LOTTIE GORDEN was the second speaker, who identified herself as a representative of the CRC, stating that the CRC was joining the Rosenberg Committee to see that justice was served.

LEWIS MOROZE was also present at this meeting, according to T-7.

At this meeting of 9/11/52, T-7 received a throwaway announcing a "Constitutional Day Rally For The Repeal of the Smith Act", which throwaway was published by, and which rally is being conducted under the auspices, of the Civil Rights Congress of New Jersey, 188 Belmont Ave., Newark 3, N.J.

Newark Confidential Informants T-24 and T-25, of known reliability, related that they attended a "Constitutional Day Rally For Repeal of the Smith Act" at 188 Belmont Ave., Newark, N.J., 9/17/52, sponsored by the CRC. LEWIS MOROZE was Chairman of this rally. He and another individual circulated a petition for the ROSENBERGS at the rally.

Newark T-12 stated that when LITTLE GORDEN heard via the radio that the Supreme Court decided not to review the ROSENBERG Case, she called a meeting at 8:00 p.m. at her home to be attended by LEWIS MOROZE and MARY ADAMS TAYLOR for the purpose of initiating some action on behalf of the New Jersey Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case and for the purpose of taking the initiative before orders were received by the National Office of the NCSJRC directing some action.

T-12 also stated that on 10/14/52 LEWIS MOROZE received instructions from the NCSJRC regarding steps that should be taken in New Jersey to increase the activity on behalf of the Rosenbergs as a result of the Supreme Gourt's decision not to review that case.

According to T-12, MOROZE instructed MARY ADAMS TAYLOR to arrange with a SHIRLEY MILLER for action in the Jewish community to assure a good cross-section and large attendance at a meeting scheduled for Passaic County, N.J.

IEWIS-MOROZE-also-ordered from the NCSJRC-copies of a letter—from the ROSENEERGS, which copies were to be distributed. 100 of these letters are to be sent to Farmingdale and to Lakewood, N.J. The copies for Lakewood were to be distributed at a meeting scheduled in the Lakewood area 10/18/52.

In October, 1952, T-12 related that LEWIS MOROZE sent a telegram as a dayletter to President HARRY S. TRUMAN, White House, Washington, D.C., 10/22/52, with the following message: "Julius and Ethel Rosenberg are innocent. They must not suffer fate of Sacco and Vinzetti. Urge executive clemency to commute death sentence." Signed, "Civil Rights Congress of New Jersey, Lewis M. Moroze, Secretary, 188 Belmont Ave., Newark, N.J."



In November, 1952, T-12 stated that LEWIS MOROZE was assisting in the preparation of a rally "To Save the Rosenbergs for Executive Clemency." T is rally was to be held 12/11/52 at the Broadway Veterans Hall, 145 Broadway, Paterson, N.J. MOROZE intended to prepare and order the tickets for the occasion. He further expected to contact a group in New York associated with the CRC in an effort to obtain a speaker for this occasion and hoped to obtain HELEN SORELL.

According to T-12, MOROZE and Dr. TUSHNET conferred concerning a leaflet which was being planned for distribution in New Jersey in regard to an effort by the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case to have the death sentence commuted.

T-12 observed that in November, 1952, LEWIS MOROZE was contacting individuals for the purpose of obtaining statements which might be used in the efforts of the Committee to Secure Clemency for the Rosenbergs to have their death sentence commuted. MOROZE is believed to have obtained statements from 12 prominent people.

On 11/20/52 T-12 stated that MOROZE made the contact noted hereinafter.

MOROZE conferred with Rabbi MOSESSON (PH), Newark, N.J., who is associated with a Gouncil of Rabbis, to ebtain names of Rabbis who would aid Dr. LEONARD TUSHNET, Irvington, N.J., in the work of the Rosenberg Committees to free the Rosenbergs. Rabbi MOSESSON advised MOROZE that the matter of the ROSENBERGS was taken up at a recent council meeting and it-was-decided-not-to-speak in the name of the Council, but to leave action, if any, in the hands of individuals Rabbis. Rabbi MOSESSON suggested that MOROZE send ROSENBERG case material to the man who is on a subcommittee handling matters of this type.

MOROZE also conferred with Rabbi BENJAMIN PLOTKIN, Jersey City, N.J., concerning the ROSENBERG case and discussed an article he said he saw in two newspapers indicating a number of Rabbis from Israel sent an appeal to President TRUMAN on behalf of the ROSENBLRGS. MOROZE alleged that a number of leading Rabbis in the Newark area sent letters to President TRUMAN on behalf of the ROSENBERGS. Rabbi PLOTKIN said that he discussed this case with some of his congregation and was surprised that everyone was sympathetic toward them. MOROZE solicited Rabbi PLOTKIN'S signature to a joint statement on behalf of the ROSENBERGS, which the Rabbi could review. Rabbi PLOTKIN suggested that MOROZE contact Mrs. REITMAN, who was very active in the National Women's League on Social Action, and through her contact the Chairman of the National Women's League. MORDZE did this and mentioned to Mrs. REITMAN an article appearing in the "Jewish Day" indicating that 22 leading Rabbis in Israel sent appeals to President TRUMAN on behalf of the ROSENBERGS. MOROZE advised Mrs. REITMAN that he had conferred with leading Rabbis in the Newark area, and that a group of Rabbis had taken it upon themselves to send letters to President TRUMAN asking for clemency for the ROSENBERGS. He also indicated that Rabbis of the Newark Council had organized a subcommittee to look into the Rosenberg Case, but were afraid to publicize their feelings due to the hysteria of the present times. Mrs. REITMAN agreed to contact by Special Delivery letter Mrs. THEODORE KROHN, National Social Action Committee Chairman, 3080 Broadway, New York City, and Mrs. EMANUEL SINER, President, National Women's League of United Synagogues, 3080 Broadway, New York City.

T-12 stated that in regard to the above matter, MOROZE concluded this effort by contacting the NJSJRC and advising them that the National Women's League of United Synagogues, at the above address, had expressed inverest in the HOSENBERG matter and should be contacted on a national level.

LEWIS MOROZE advised T-12 that he requested literature from the NCSJRC for an affair in New Jersey on 11/22/52.

On that date, T-12 stated, that LEWIS MOROZE was actively organizing a motorcade for the ROSENBERGS. This motorcade started at Jelliff St. and 18th Ave., Newark, N.J., at 12:00 noon. MARY ADAMS TAYLOR was stationed at the CHC Headquarters, 188 Belmont Ave., Newark, to advise the participants of the marshalling point noted above.

Newark Confidential Informant T-26, of known reliability, stated that he saw 7 vehicles containing 15 adults and 3 children in a motorcade, led by L-W MOROZE in his vehicle, start from the above-described point and proceed through downtown Newark and the Clinton Hill Section. This motorcade ended at 1:30 PM in front of the CRC headquarters, 188 Belmont Ave., Newark, N.J. All the vehicles had signs on the side or rear, stating in substance "We are innocent. Julius and Ethel Rosenberg;" "Write resident Truman Mercy for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg;" and "Spare Ethel and Julius Rosenberg."

According to T-21, early in December, 1952, Dr. LEDNARD TUSHNET assigned LOTTLE GORDON to speak on the ROSENBERG case at a meeting of a peace group in Irvington, N.J.

LEW MOHOZE, according to T-12, in December, 1952, planned to meet with a Lakewood group serving for a Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case in that area.

T-12 related that on 12/19/52 LEW MOROZE at CRC Headquarters received instructions from the New York office of the NCSJRC relative to changes in plan for the mass crusade to Washington, D.C., on behalf of the ROSENBERGS, which plans were discussed under Section I. It is noted that instant committee advised LEW MOROZE concerning new plans and their desire that 10 or 15 letters or telegrams be addressed to President TRUMAN asking clemency, and that these be dispatched over the week-end of 1/3/53 by persons who would have attended the cancelled crusade in Washington.

T-21 related in January, 1953, that LOTTIE GORDON was then arranging for a kOSENBERG motorcade scheduled for 1/10/53, which would be assembled at Jelliff 5t., between Waverly and 18th Aves., Newark, N.J., at 10:00 AM, 1/10/53. GORDON has already acquired some assistance and was instructing that contacts be made with trade union people in an effort to have a large turnout, and the assignment has been made to secure cars and volunteer workers.

Newark Confidential Informant T-27, of known reliability, stated that the above motorcade started at 11:00 AM, 1/10/53 and contained about 40 or 50 cars, most of which had signs on the side and/or rear with one of the following messages:

Write to President Truman to

- "(a) free the Rosenbergs
- "(b) spare the Rosenbergs
- "(c) clemency for the Rosenbergs."

The motorcade, according to T-27, was led by LEWIS MOROZE in his vehicle and passed through downtown Newark, through the Clinton Hill Section of Newark, and distanded at its point of origin at approximately 1:35 PM.

2. CP Affiliation of Principals Acting for the CRC in its Aid to the Rosenberg Case.

LEWIS M. MOROZE

Newark Confidential Informant T-28, of known reliability, advised in May, 1951, that he knew LEWIS MOROZE to be a CP member.

On 1/29/52 T-23 stated that MOROZE, at that time, without doubt was a member of the CP of New Jersey.

It is noted that T-7, in Section I, related that LOTTIE GORDON made a speech at the 9/11/52 meeting of the New Jersey Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case at Newark, at which time she referred to herself as a representative of the CRC.

It is also noted that the "Newark Evening News" of 9/12/52 identified her in an article captioned, "A-Spy Verdict Called Unjust," as a member of the Newark Branch of the CRC.

T-7 stated that at the above meeting, LOTTIE GORDUN also stated that she and her family were members of the International Workers Order (IWO).

The IWO has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

According to the 5/4/48 issue of the Daily Worker, LOTTIE GORDON is a CP Organizer.

MARY ADAMS TAYLOR

The 11/0/51 issue of the "Newark Evening News," identifies MARY ADAMS TAYLOR as Secretary of the Essex County Branch of the CRC of New Jersey.

T-28 stated in May, 1951 that MARY ADAMS TAYL R is a member of the CP.

In 1951, T-9 stated that MARY ADAMS TAYLOR was Chairman of the 3rd Ward Club of the CP in Essex County, N.J.

B. Activities of Other Committees On Benalf of the Rosenberg Case

1. New Jersey Women for Peace

T-2h and T-25 related that on 9/7/52 they attended a New Jersey Women for Peace picnic at Johnson Park, Highland Park, H.J., where a petition recommending the respening of the Rosenberg case was circulated.

The American women for Feace has been cited by the Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities on 4/1/51 as "an advance wave to establish a beachhead for other left-wing organizations scheduled to descend on Washington in observance of a Communist declared *Peace Week.*"

2. Progressive Party

The Progressive rarty's connection with the CP has already been set out under Section IVAL.

ORIGIN, SCOPE, AND GENERAL ACTIVITY OF THE ROSENBERG COXXITTEES IN NEW JERSEY AND THEIR CONNECTION WITH THE NATIONAL COXXITTEE IN NEW YORK

Information in this section is set out in chronological order inasmuch as it does not suggest appropriate subdivisions.

An article in the 3/30/52 issue of the Worker, N.T.C., cantioned, "Pledge Fight To Save Rosenbergs," states that a second public meeting, "sponsored by a committee recently formed in the area by fraternal, farmer, and civic leaders, was held Monday, 3/21/52, at Carpenters Hall, Lakewood, N.J. The meeting was addressed by JOSFPH ERAINING, "Prominent writer and author," and Mrs. HELEN SOBELL, "whose husband was given a 30-year prison sentence in the same frame-up trial." Intensive local activity to save the ROSENBTRGS was reportedly pledged by farmers and townspeople at this meeting.



Newark Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, stated that at the above meeting, JOSEPH ERAININ, one of the speakers, stated, "A vote of thanks should be given to BEN BACH who has worked so hard to make this meeting in Lakemood a success."

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case (this committee will hereafter be referred to as the NCSJRC) had an advertisement in the 3/27/52 Montclair Times Reekly, Montclair, N.J., alleging the ROSENBERGS were innocent and stating that a local committee was being formed. This article included a clipping which offered to send documentary facts, the sale of a pamphlet cautioned, To Secure Justice In The Rosenberg Case, and solicited the receipt of contributions to Thelp secure justice in this case. These clippings were to be sent to instant committee in care of Mrs. RICHARD E. HENRY, 59 William St., East Grange, N.J.

Dr. LTINARD TUSHNIT, Waplewood, N.J., a member of the national committee, announced, according to an article appearing on Page 14 of the 3/26/52 issue of the Newark Evening News, that an organizational meeting of an Essex County Branch NCSJRC would be held at is home, Friday, 3/28/52.

The 1/6/52 issue of the Worker, N.Y.C., on Page 1, contained an article confirming formation of the above group referred to as the Essex Branch of the MCSJRC. Dr. TUSHNET was referred to as a member of the National Group.

The printed letterhead of this mimeographed sheet read, "Committee To Secure Justice In the Rosenberg Case, 216 5th Ave., Room blil, New York 1, N.Y." and noted JOSEPH BRAININ was Chairman, and DAVID ALMAN was Excutive Secretary of instant committee. A list of sponsors on this letter included the names of Trs. DESSIE MITCHELL and Dr. LYDNARD TUSHNYT. The letter requested additional contributions be sent to AMANDA HENRY, 59 William St., East Orange, N.J.

Newark Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, related that approximately 150 people attended this meeting and that DAVID ALMAN, described as a noted author, and HELEN SOBTIL, wife of MORTON SOBTIL, were two of the speakers. T-3 stated that the following literature was distributed at this meeting: A pamphlot entitled, "The Rosenberg Committee -- A Fact Sheet;" a 32-page pamphlet entitled, "Secure Justice In the Rosenberg Case" by WILLIAM A. REUBIN; a leaflet entitled, "A Fact Sheet On Anti-Semitism In the Case; Newspaper Comment." All the above items were published by the NCSJRC, New York City, N.Y.

Newark Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised that BEH BACH was then in charge of propagands for the ROSENBERGS in Lakewood, N.J., and the Maddlesex County, N.J. area. T-4 also noted that PERY KAISER, of New Brunswick, N.J., was assisting BACH in the New Brunswick area.

Newark Confidential Informent T-7, of known reliability, stated that approximately 200 people attended the above meeting and Dr. L. TUSHNET was Jaster of Ceremonies: DAVID ALMAN, National Executive Secretary, instant organization, gave an account of the Rosenberg Case, generally following the account in the pamphlet issued by the NCSJRC entitled, The Facts In-the-Rosenberg Case.

LOTTIF GORDON, the second speaker, identified herslef as a representative of the Civil Rights Congress, stating that the Civil Rights Congress was joining the above committee to see that justice was served.

Other speakes included Mrs. MORTON SOBELL, Rabbi Dr. MEYFR SHRAFF, Temple Nasha Pokatitof, Brooklyn, N.Y.

Six hundred and nine dollars was collected during instant meeting and signatures for an Amicus Brief, to be submitted to the Supreme Court, were solicited as persons entered and left the hall.

The following literature, according to T-7, was distributed at instant meeting which was published by NCSJRC, N.Y.: A pamphlet entitled, "The Letters of Julius and Fhel Rosenberg;" a pamphlet, "A Statement On The Rosenberg Case By A Distinguished Leader of Tthodox Jewry, Rabbi Dr. MEYER SHRAFF;" a mimeographed sheet, "A Fact Sheet On Anti-Semitism In The Case; Newspaper Comment;" a circular, "Press Release," dated 6/12/52; and a pamphlet, "The Facts In The Rosenberg Case."



T-8 noted that in the past the committee had been stressing the fact that the ROS TOTINGS were innocent of the charges in the indictment.

Newark Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised in 12/52 that the NCSJRC is sometimes referred to as the hational Committee for Clemency in the Rosenberg Case.

by them from the New Jersey Committee For Clemency in the Rosenberg Case, LEONARD TUSHNET, M.D., 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N.J. The letter asked the above to join other religious leaders of all faiths in a plea for mercy in the Rosenberg case.

stated that the above was apparently a circulary letter sent to all clergymen of Newark in reference to the Rosenberg Case.

*Father CLARENCE F. DUPFY, Catholic Priest, was listed in the letter as a religious leader who had joined the above plea for mercy.

stated that this individual's name could not be found in the Catholic Directory for 1952.

An article on Page 11 of the 11/3/52 issue of the Newark Evening News reveals that Dr. L. TUSHNET, Irvington, N.J., was Chairman of the New Jersey Committee For Clemency For The Rosenbergs and that this committee planned a mass meeting to appeal to President Truman for clemency for JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. Dr. TUSHNET asserted, according to this source, that citizens would be asked to sned letters and telegrams to the President urging commutation of the death sentence.

Newark Confidential Informant T-10, of known reliability, advised that approximately 200 people attended the above meeting at Wideway Hall, Newark, N.J. A large telegram to the President, urging Executive clemency was hung in back of the speakers' platform and blank telegrams were on each seat. The speakers included EMILY ADVAN, wife of DAVID ALMAN, Executive Secretary of the NCSJEC, who stated that 12,000 circulars on the case were sent out in New Jersey and that all of the clergy were circularized. She, together with other speakers, Reverend HARRY WARD, Professor Emeritus of Union Theological Seminary, and YURI SUHL, spoke in favor of clemency. Mrs. ALMAN gave the collection speech, stating that it cost \$27,000 to carry the RISTIBERO case to the Supreme Court and to obtain executive clemency; more money was needed. She also urged everyone to send at least five telegrams per week to President Truman requesting Executive clemency.

Newark, N.J. Police Department, reported that L. TUSHNOT was Chairman of the above meeting.

Newark Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, made available a mimeographed letter with three enclosures from LEDNARD TUSHNET, 4.D., 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N.J., State Chairman of the New Jersey Committee For Clemency In The Rosenberg Case, via South Jersey Committee For Clemency, dated 1/3/53.

The last paragraph of the above letter requested the recipient to immediately wire or write President Truman to halt the execution of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG.

The enclosures were three 4-page leaflets published by the NCSJRC, 1050 6th Ave., New York City, N.Y., entitled, "Comments From The Jewish Press on Clemency For Ethel and Julius-Rosenberg,"—"Mercy For the Rosenbergs By Abraham Cronbach," and "The Facts In The Rosenberg Case."



Newark Confidential Informant T-12, of known reliability, stated that on 12/19/52, LEWIS MOROZE, at the Civil Rights Congress Headquarters, Newark, N.J., received instructions from the New York Office of instant committee to the effect that there was to be a change in the plan for a mass crusade to Washington, D.C., on behalf of the ROSENBERGS due to the difficulty in arranging housing and a meeting place for thousands of expected delegates. A plan was being considered for a meeting of 300 prominent persons in Washington and to have those other individuals who might have participated in the trip secure ten to fifteen letters or telegrams addressed to President Truman calling for clemency in the ROSENBERG case and to submit these over the week-end of 1/3/53.

Newark Confidential Informant T-13, of unknown reliability, on 12/31/52, made available a circular captioned, "A Call To A National Clemency Gathering," Monday 1/5/53, Inspiration House, Washington, D.C. This was addressed to "The People of New Jersey" and asked them to attend the above meeting sponsored by the NCSJRC, 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N.J.

Jersey Central Railroad Police, Jersey City, N.J., advised SA REESIE L. TIMMONS on 1/3/53 that a special B & O train for the "Labor Committee For the Rosenbergs" was to leave the Communipaw Terminal of Jersey City at 7:00 AM, 1/5/53 for Washington, D.C., and return 11:30 PM, that evening.

An article in the Newark Evening News on 1/6/53 reported a delegation of New Jersey citizens visited New Jersey Republican Senators HENDRICKSON and SMITH, 1/5/53, asking to have the death sentence of the ROSENBL GS commuted by Presidential clemency. The group reportedly included 30 or 40 men and women, led by Dr. LEDNARD TUSHNET, 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N.J. They claimed affiliation with no organization Dr. TUSHNET is quoted as saying that the individuals of the group were there in an individual capacity.

Agent MALON | UCAS JANNINGS in 1/53 that they were contacted on behalf of the South Jersey Committee For Clemency In The Rosenberg Case, of which GMRGE TICH AN is Chairman, for some radio time.

The Asbury Tark Evening Iress, 1/12/53 issue, on page 11, contrined a quarter page ad captioned, "Must The Rosenbergs Die." This ad included an appeal for elemency from various American and foreign sources. At the bottom were instructions to write or wire the Fresident urging commutation of the death sentences. This ad quoted that "this advertisement was paid for by public subscription and published by the Monmouth and Ocean County Committee to Secure Clemency For the Rosenbergs."

On page 1 of the 4/6/52 issue of the Worker, N.I.C., Dr. TUSHNET is identified as a member of the national group who had announced the formation of an Essex Branch of NCSJRC, in his home the preceding week.

Dr. TUSHNET was identified as a sponsor of the NCSJEC in an advertisement by said committee in the 3/27/52 issue, Montclair Times Weekly, Montclair, N.J.

T-7 stated that on 9/11/52, Dr. TUSHNET was Chairman of a statewide mass meeting of the N.J. NCSJRC at Newark, N.J.

In the 11/3/52 issue of the Newark Evening News, Newark, N.J., Dr. TUSHNET identified as Chairman of the New Jorsey Committee For Clemency For The Rosenbergs.

T-11 related that a letter from the New Jersey Committee For Clemency For The Rosenbergs and the South Jersey Committee For Clemency, dated 1/3/53, identified Dr. TUSHNET as the State Chairman of the above mentioned committee.

Ben Bach R.D. 2, 148M Toms River, N.J.

T-4, on 5/27/52, stated that BEN BACH was in charge of the hipropaganda for the ROSENBERGS in Hiddlesex County, N.J. and Lakewood, N.J. area.

FACH in 6/52 distributed literature of the NCSJEC An Toms Sizer 3.

Nevark Confidential Informant T-14, of known reliability, advised on 11/4/52 that in the Summer of 1952, BEN BACH was carring for the ROSENBERG children and claimed that he is employed full time by the NCSJRC.

T-6 stated on various dates in 1952 that distributed literature and collected contributions on behalf of the NCSJRC and N.J. Committies To Secure Justice In The Rosenberg Case.

circular in 4/32 bearing the needing of the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, announcing a meeting on 4/30/52, Newark, N.J., and soliciting that additional contributions be sent to AMANDA HENRY at the above address.

Section IVA of this report contains information reflecting the Communist Party affiliations of the above officers of instant committies where such information has been previously reported.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The advertisement of the NCSJRC, appearing in the 3/27/52 issue of the Montclair Times Weekly, Montclair, N.J., directs committee leaders to "act now; let us do these things today:

- "(1) Write to the President and ask him to commute the death sentence;
- "(2) Write for the pamphlet setting forth the FACTS in this case and spread the FACTS;
- "(3) Support the ROSENBERGS in their legal rights for a review of the sentence and let us call for a new trial."

The Newark Evening News, in an article on Page 30 of the 5/1/52 issue, reported a meeting on 4/30/52 at 516 Clinton Ave., Newark, N.J., called by the Essex County Committee to Secure Justice in the Bosenberg Case. Said meeting protested the guilty verdict and death sentence of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG. Those present reportedly sent a petition asking the Supreme Court to set aside the verdict. An amount of \$1,146.50 was allegedly collected to help pay legal fees. "The High Court" is scheduled to hear an appeal for a review of the case the Monday following 5/1/52.

T-6 advised in 10/52 that in the past, instant committees have stressed the fact that the ROSENBERGS were innocent of the charges in the trial. (He stated that at a 10/15/52 meeting of the Bergen County Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, at Tenneck, N.J., stated that from now on they are going to play down the innocence of the ROSENBERGS and play sup the racial issue and the fact that such traitors as TOKYO ROSE have received relatively light sentences.

It is noted that T-4, in 12/52, stated that the NCSJRC is sometimes referred to as the National Committee For Clemency In The Rosenberg Case.

The Mimmographed letter, dated 10/20/52, received by

New Jersey Committee for Clemency in the Rosenberg Case, included the following message:

"Dear Sir:

"JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG will die in the electric chair in a few weeks unless President Truman inter-

"All the political and legal arguments in this celebrated case mean nothing. What remains is the human question. Here are two people — husband and wife, father and mother — sentenced to death. The judgment need not be inflexible. We must plea for mercy.

"Already joined_in_this plea for mercy are religious leaders of all faiths including (names of 13 individuals).

"We ask you to write immediately to President Harry S.
Trumah requesting him to exercise his executive clemency
to commute the death sentence of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.
We urge you to help us by letting us know what action you
have taken."

The stated that ______, NCSJRC, advised ______, NCSJRC, advised _______, of the Tollowing five steps which you must take now:"

- *(1) Return to all in your city who have shown interest and concern in this case by phone, mail, and meetings. Discuss with them what you and they can do to save the lives of the Rosenbergs. Make the reaching of more people a paramount point.
- "(2) Collect funds immediately to place the largest possible adds in your local newspaper. Quarter-page adds are the minimum effective adds. In these adds appeal to President Truman to set aside the death sentence by executive clemency. Use the enclosed draft of an add as your guide.
- "(3) Organize a wife and letter campaign to President Truman, asking that the death sentence be set aside. Point out the unprecedented nature of these death sentences. Do as large a mailing as possible to key lists who can get similar action.

"(4) In these letters to Fresident Truman, urge him to direct the Attorney General to consent to a new trial in the event that any new motions come before the courts.

"(5) Rush funds to our office. We will need collections of thousands of dollars within the next few weeks in a nation-wide clemency appeal."

SUBVERSIVE PARTFICATIONS

A. Connection With The Communist Party

Newark T-9 advised on 12/9/52 that the NCSJRC is sometimes referred to as the National Committee for Clemency in the Rosenberg Case and that the New Jersey sections of this committée are a Communist Party inspired and controlled organization.

The Communist Party: will hereinafter be referred to as the CP, and has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as an subversive organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Neverk Confidential Informant T-15, of known reliability, advised in 1952 that the "Committee To Seve the Rosenbergs", Neverk, N.J., on 4/25/52 paid for a \$1.05 subscription to the Daily Worker "What's On" notices.

The Daily Morker is an East-Coast Communist daily newspaper.

1. CP Affiliations Of Frincipal New Jersey Officials

Dr. Leonard Tuchnet

advised in 1943 that he knew TUSHNET and regarded him as a Communist although he could not offer frevidence to support his contention. He seid that it was prumored around the Beth Israel Hospital, Newark, N.J., where Dr. TUSHNET was associated, and in medical circles in Essex County, N.J., that TUSHNET was a Communist and active in Communist circles

and magazines in TUSHRAT's Unvice were concerning Communism or Soviet Russia, and that TUSHRET had little else in this office to read.

Newark Confidential Informants T-16 and T-17, both of known reliability, advised in the Fall of 1950 that Dr. LEONARD TUCHNET had been at that time a member of the Communist Party on and off for approximately ten years.

Newark Confidential Informant T-20, of known reliability, stated that GEORGE FISHMAN attended various meetings during 1949 and 1950 held at the Camdon County Readquarters of the CP and at the State Headquarters of the CP in Newark, N.J.

B. Implementation Of CP Line

No information is available to the Newark Office reflecting any deviation of views by the New Jersey Committees from the published views of the NCSJRC. It is noted that the New Jersey committees, as reflected in the above sections, have disseminated literature of the NCSJRC and development of this fact is therefore left to the discretion of the New York Office.

MISCELLANEOUS

A. Connection Of The Civil Rights Congress With Instant Committees

It is noted that the Civil Rights Congress, hereinafter noted as the CRC, has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

1. Activity of the CRC To Aid The Rosenbergs

Newerk Confidential Informent T-21, of known reliability, advised 4/3/52 that LOTTIE GORDON and LEWIS MOROZE were concerned about the scheduling of a meeting of the CRC and the Essex County Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case on the same date. MOROZE intended to discuss this matter with Dr. LEONARD TUSHNET of the latter committee to make certain the two affairs do not compete with one another for attendance.

Newark Confidential Informant T-22, of known reliability, related that a CRC rally was held by Nature Friends of America, Camp Midvale, N.J. on 7/13/52.

Mrs. HELEN SOBELL, wife of MORTON SOBELL, made a special appeal for funds to help her husband fight for freedom. Thereafter a collection was taken by eight woman who asked for nothing less than a dollar. T-22 estimated that \$300 was collected.

T-22 recalled that WILLIAM PATTERSON, National Secretary of the CRC, followed Mrs. SOBELL as a speaker. At the end of his speech, PATTERSON made an appeal for the contribution to the NCSJRC. No collection was taken however. A booth was set up at the clubhouse at the camp for the purpose of taking pledges and accepting contributions to be forwarded to the committee.

T-2 noted that the majority of literature disseminated at this rally concerned the ROSENBERG case. He made available a pamphlet obtained at the rally entitled, The Rosenberg Case—A Fact Sheet, published by the NCSJRC.

Newerk T-2, on 8/14/52, stated that LEWIS MOROZE, at CRC Head-quarters, Newark, N.J., was preparing a ticket to be printed for a meeting on the Rosemberg Case to be held Thursday, 9/11/52, at Wideway hell, 929. Broad St., Newark, N.J.

Newark Confidential Informant T-23, of known reliability, related that a Bonds for Israel Rally at Untermann Field, Newark, N.J. was held 8/18/52. At the east gate of this field, four men were distributing pamphlets. From this distribution, T-23 obtained two pamphlets published by the NCSJRC entitled,

"A Statement On The Rosenberg Case" by Rabbi Dr. Meyer Shraff; and "The Rosenberg Case—A Fact Sheet." To the latter was stapled a ticket inviting the receiver to a meeting at Wideway Hall, Newark, N.J., 9/11/52; This meeting to be sponsored under the auspices of the Rosenberg Committee, RD 2, Box 148, Toms River, N.J.

Newark T-12 stated on 8/20/52 that LEWIS MONOZE had that day reported to an individual at the headquarters of the MCSJRC, in New York, that the New Jersey group had a successful distribution at a Bonds For Israel Rally and a successful meeting of the Rosenberg Committee in Stelton, N.J.

It is to be noted that in Section I of this report, T-7 stated that at the 9/11/52 meeting of the New Jersey Committee To Secure Justice In The Rosenberg Case, LOTTIE GORDEN was the second speaker, who identified herself as a representative of the CRC, stating that the CRC was joining the Rosenberg Committee to see that justice was served.

LEWIS MOROZE was also present at this meeting, according to T-7.

At this meeting of 9/11/52, T-7 received a throwavey announcing a "Constitutional Day Rally For The Repeal of the Smith Act", which throwavey was published by, and which rally is being conducted under the auerices, of the Civil Rights Congress of New Jersey, 188 Belmont Ave., Neverk 3, N.J.

Newark Confidential Informants T-24 and T-25, of known reliability, related that they attended a "Constitutional Day Rally For Repeal of the Smith Act" at 188 Belmont Ave., Newark, N.J., 9/17/52, spensored by the CRC. LEDIS MOROZE was Chairman of this rally. He and another individual circulated a petition for the POSENBERGS at the rally.

Newark T-12 stated that when LITTLE GORDEN heard via the radio that the Supreme Court decided not to review the ROSENBERG Case, she called a meeting at 8:00 p.m. at her home to be attended by LEWIS MOROZE and MARY ADAMS TAYLOR for the purpose of initiating some action on behalf of the New Jersey Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case and for the purpose of taking the initiative before orders were received by the National Office of the NCSJEC directing some action.

T-12 also stated that on 10/14/52 LUWIS MOROZE received instructions from the MCSJRC regarding steps that should be taken in New Jersey to increase the activity on behalf of the Mosenbergs as a result of the Supreme Court's decision not to review that case.

INK 100-36202

According to T-12, M-ROZE instructed MARY AFAMS TAYLOR to arrange with a SHIRLEY MILLER for action in the Jewish community to assure a good cross-section and large attendance at a meeting scheduled for Passaic County, N.J.

IEWIS EMROZE also ordered from the NCSJRC copies of a letter from the ROSENBERGS, which copies were to be distributed. 100 of these letters are to be sent to Farmingdale and to Lakewood, N.J. The copies for Lakewood were to be distributed at a meeting scheduled in the Lakewood area 10/18/52.

In October, 1952, T-12 related that LUWIS MURCHE sent a telegram as a dayletter to Frecident HARRY S. TRUMAN, White House, Washington, D.C., 10/22/52, with the following message: "Julius and Ethel Rosenberg are innocent. They must not suffer fate of Sanco and Vinzetti. Urge executive clemency to commute death sentence." Signed, "Civil Rights Congress of New Jersey, Lewis M. Moroze, Secretary, 188 Belmont Ave., Hewark, N.J."



In November, 1952, T-12 stated that LEWIS EMBOZE was assisting in the preparation of a rally "To Save the Rosenbergs for Emecutive Clemency." It is rally was to be held 12/11/52 at the Broadway Veterans Hall, 115 Broadway, Paterson, N.J. AMEOZE intended to prepare and order the tickets for the occasion. He further expected to contact a group in New York associated with the CHC in an effort to obtain a speaker for this occasion and hoped to obtain HELEN SOMELL.

According to T-12, WCROZE and Dr. TUSHRFT conferred concerning a leaflet which was being planned for distribution in New Jersey in regard to an effort by the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case to have the death sentence commuted.

T-12 observed that in November, 1952, LEWIS WORDE was contacting individuals for the purpose of obtaining statements which might be used in the efforts of the Committee to Secure Clemency for the Rosembergs to have their death sentence commuted. MOROZE is believed to have obtained statements from 12 prominent people.

On 11/20/52 T-12 stated that MOROZE made the contact noted hereinafter.

MOROZE conferred with Rabbi MOSESSON (PH), Newark, N.J., who is associated with a Council of Rabbis, to ebtain names of Rabbis who would aid Dr. LEON/RD TUSHNET, Irvington, N.J., in the work of the Rosenberg Committees to free the Rosenbergs. Rabbi MOSESSON advised MOROZE that the matter of the ROSENBERGS was taken up at a recent council meeting and it was decided not to speak in the name of the Council, but to leave action, if any, in the hands of individuals Rabbis. Rabbi MOSESSON suggested that MOROZE send ROSENBERG case material to the man who is on a subcommittee handling matters of this type.

MOROZE also conferred with Rebbi BENJAMIN PLOTKIN, Jersey City, N.J., concerning the ROSENRERG case and discussed an article he said he saw in two newspapers indicating a number of Rabbis from Israel sent an appeal to President TRUMAN on behalf of the ROSENBERGS. MOROZE alleged that a number of leading Rabbis in the Newark area sent letters to President TRUMAN on behalf of the ROSENBERGS. Rabbi PLOTKIN said that he discussed this case with some of his congregation and was surprised that everyone was sympathetic toward them. MOROZE solicited Rabbi PLOTKIN'S signature to a joint statement on behalf of the ROSENBERGS, which the Rabbi could review. Rabbi PLOTKIN suggested that MOROZE contact Mrs. REITMAN, who was very active in the National Women's League on Social Action, and through her contact the Chairman of the National Women's League. MOROZE did this and mentioned to Mrs. REITMAN an article appearing in the "Jewish Day" indicating that 22 leading Rabbis in Israel sent appeals to Fresident TRUMAN on behalf of the ROSENBERGS. MOROZE advised Mrs. REITMAN that he had conferred with leading Rabbis in the Newark area, and that a group of Rabbis had taken it upon themselves to send letters to President TRUMAN saking for clemency for the ROSEMBERGS. He also indicated that Rabbis of the Newark Council had organized a subcommittee to look into the Rosenberg Case, but were afraid to publicize their feelings due to the hysteria of the present times. Mrs. REITMAN agreed to contact by Special Delivery letter Mrs. THEODORE KROHN, National Social Action Committee Chairman, 3080 Broadway, New York City, and Mrs. EMANUEL SINER, President, National Women's League of United Synagogues, 3080 Broadway, New York City.

Information in this section is set out in chronological order inasmuch as it does not suggest appropriate subdivisions.

An article in the 3/30/52 issue of the Morker, N.Y.C., captioned,

""ledge Fight To Save Rosenbergs," states that a second public meeting,
sponsored by a committee recently formed in the area by fraternal, farmer,
and civic leaders, was held Monday, 3/21/52, at Carpenters Hall, Lakewood,
N.J. The meeting was addressed by JOSEPH BRAINIWA, "Prominent writer and
author," and Mrs. HELEN SOBILL, "whose husband was given a 30-year prison
sentence in the same frame-up trial." Intensive local activity to save the
ROSENBERGS was reportedly pledged by farmers and townspeople at this meeting.

Newark Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, stated that at the above meeting, JOSEPH BRAININ, one of the speakers, stated, "A vote of thanks should be given to BEN BACH who has worked so hard to make this meeting in Lakewood a success."

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Bosenberg Case (this committee will hereafter be referred to as the NCSJRC) had an advertisement in the 3/27/52 Montclair Times Neekly, Montclair, N.J., alleging the ROSENBEROS were innocent and stating that a local committee was being formed. This article included a clipping which offered to send documentary facts, the sale of a pamphlet cautioned, "To Secure Justice In The Rosenberg Case," and solicited the receipt of contributions to "help secure justice in this case." These clippings were to be sent to instant committee in care of Mrs. BICHARD F. HYNRY, 59 Milliam St., East Trange, N.J.

Dr. LTDURED TUSHNET, Maplewood, N.J., a member of the national committee, announced, a coording to an article appearing on Page 1h of the 3/26/52 issue of the Newark Evening News, that an organizational meeting of an Essex County Branch NCSJRC would be held at is home, Friday, 3/28/52.

The 1/6/52 issue of the Worker, N.Y.C., on Page 1, contained an article confirming formation of the above group referred to as the Essex Branch of the MCSJRC. Dr. TUFHNTT was referred to as a member of the National Group.

Newark Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, related that approximately 150 people attended this meeting and that DAVID ALMAN, described as a noted author, and HELEN S'B'LL, wife of MORTON SOB'LL, were two of the speakers. T-3 stated that the following literature was distributed at this meeting: A pamphlet entitled, The Rosenberg Committee — A Fact Sheet; a 32-page pamphlet entitled, Secure Justice In the Rosenberg Case by WILLIAM A. RUUBIN; a leaflet entitled, A Fact Sheet On Anti-Semitism In the Case; Newspaper Comment. All the above items were published by the NCSJRC, New York City, N.Y.

Newark Confidential Informant T-I, of known reliability, advised that BEN BACH was then in charge of propaganda for the ROSENDERGS in Lakewood, N.J., and the Maddlesex County, N.J. area. T-II also noted that PERY KAISER, of New Brunswick, N.J., was assisting BACH in the New Brunswick area.

LOTTIP GORDON, the second speaker, identified herslef as a representative of the Civil Rights Congress, stating that the Civil Rights Congress was joining the above committee to see that justice was served.

Other speaker included Mrs. MORTON SOBELL, Rabbi Dr. MEYER SURAFF, Temple Nasha Pokatitof, Brooklyn, N.Y.

Six hundred and nine dollars was collected during instant meeting and signatures for an Amicus Brief, to be submitted to the Supreme Court, were solicited as persons entered and left the hall.

The following literature, according to T-7, was distributed at instant meeting which was published by NCSJRC, N.Y.: A pamphlet entitled, "The Letters of Julius and Phel Rosenberg;" a pamphlet, "A Statement On The Rosenberg Case By A Distinguished Leader of Orthodox Jewry, Rabbi Dr. MEYER SHRAFF;" a mimeographed sheet, "A Fact Sheet On Anti-Semitism In The Case; Newspaper Comment;" a circular, "Press Release," dated 6/12/52; and a pamphlet, "The Facts In The Rosenberg Case."

An article on Page 11 of the 11/3/52 issue of the Newark Evening News reveals that Dr. L. TUSHNIT, Irvington, N.J., was Chairman of the New Jersey Committee For Clemency For The Rosenbergs and that this committee planned a mass meeting to appeal to President Truman for clemency for JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. Dr. TUSHNET asserted, according to this source, that citizens would be asked to seed letters and telegrams to the President urging commutation of the death sentence.

Newark Confidential Informant T-10, of known reliability, advised that approximately 200 people attended the above meeting at Wideway Hall, Newark, N.J. A large telegram to the President, urging Executive clemency was hung in back of the speakers' platform and blank telegrams were on each seat. The speakers included FHILY ALMAN, wife of DAVID ALMAN, Executive Secretary of the MONTEC, who stated that 12,000 circulars on the case were sent out in New Jersey and that all of the clergy were circularized. She, together with other speakers, Reverend HARRY WARD, Professor Emeritus of Union Theological Seminary, and YERI SUHL, spoke in favor of clemency. Mrs. ALMAN gave the collection speech, stating that it cost \$27,000 to carry the RYFHSTRO case to the Supreme Court and to obtain executive clemency; more money was needed. She also urged everyone to send at least five telegrams per week to President Truman requesting Executive clemency.

Newark, N.J. Police Department, reported that L. TUCHNIT was Chairman of the above meeting.

Newark Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, made available a mimeographed letter with three enclosures from LYMARD TUSHNIT, M.D., 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N.J., State Chairman of the New Jersey Committee For Clemency In The Rosenberg Case, via South Jersey Committee For Clemency, dated 1/3/53.

The last paragraph of the above letter requested the recipient to immediately wire or write President Truman to halt the execution of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG.

The enclosures were three 4-page leaflets published by the NCSJRC, 1050 6th Ave., New York City, N.Y., entitled, "Comments From The Jewish Press on Clemency For Ethel and Julius Rosenberg," "Mercy For the Rosenbergs By Abraham Cronbach," and "The Facts In The Rosenberg Case."



Newark Confidential Informant T-12, of known reliability, stated that on 12/19/52, LEMIS MOROZE, at the Civil Rights Congress Headquarters, Newark, N.J., received instructions from the New York Office of instant committee to the effect that there was to be a change in the plan for a mass crusade to Washington, D.C., on behalf of the ROSENBERGS due to the difficulty in arranging housing and a meeting place for thousands of expected delegates. A plan was being considered for a meeting of 300 prominent persons in Washington and to have those other individuals who might have participated in the trip secure ten to fifteen letters or telegrams addressed to President Truman calling for clemency in the ROSENBERG case and to submit these over the week-end of 1/3/53.

Newark Confidential Informant T-13, of unknown reliability, on 12/31/52, made evailable a circular captioned, "A Call To A National Clemency Gathering," Monday 1/5/53, Inspiration House, Washington, D.C. This was addressed to "The Feople of New Jersey" and asked them to attend the above meeting sponsored by the NCSJRC, 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N.J.

Jersey Central Railroad Police, Jersey City, N.J., advised of Resolf L. TIMMONS on 1/3/53 that a special B & O train for the "Labor Committee For the Rosenbergs" was to leave the Communipaw Terminal of Jersey City at 7:00 AM, 1/5/53 for Washington, D.C., and L-7-D return 11:30 PM, that evening.

An article in the Newark Evening News on 1/6/53 reported a delegation of New Jersey citizens visited New Jersey Republican Senators HENDRICKSON and SMITH, 1/5/53, asking to have the death sentence of the ROSENBELGS commuted by Presidential elemency. The group reportedly included 30 or 40 men and women, led by Dr. LEDNARD TUSHNET, 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N.J. They claimed affiliation with no organization/ Dr. TUSHNET is quoted as saying that the individuals of the group were there in an individual capacity.

Radio WKDN, Camden, N.J., advised Special Agent MALON IUCAS JENNINGS in 1/53 that they were contacted on behalf of the South Jersey Committee For Clemency In The Rosenberg Case, of which GEURGE FISHMAN is Chairman, for some radio time.

The Asbury Fark Evening Fress, 1/12/53 issue, on page 11, contained a quarter page ad captioned, "Must The Rosenbergs Die." This ad included an appeal for elemency-from various American and foreign sources.

At the bottom were instructions to write or wire the Fresident urging commutation of the death sentences. This ad quoted that "this advertisement was paid for by public subscription and published by the Monmouth and Ocean County Committee to Secure Clemency For the Rosenbergs."

On page 1 of the 4/6/52 issue of the Worker, N.Y.C., Dr. TUSHNET is identified as a member of the national group who had announced the formation of an Essex Branch of NCSJRC, in his home the preceding week.

Dr. TUSHNET was identified as a sponsor of the NCSJRC in an advertisement by said committee in the 3/27/52 issue, Montclair Times Weekly, Montclair, N.J.

T-7 stated that on 9/11/52, Dr. TUSHNET was Chairman of a statewide mass meeting of the N.J. NCSJRC at Newark, N.J.

In the 11/3/52 issue of the Newark Evening News, Newark, N.J., Dr. TUSHNET identified as Chairman of the New Jersey Committee For Clemency For The Rosenbergs.



AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The advertisement of the NCSJkC, aprearing in the 3/27/52 issue of the Montclair Times Weekly, Montclair, N.J., directs committee leaders to "act now; let us do these things today:

- "(1) Write to the President and ask him to commute the death sentence;
- "(2) Write for the pamphlet setting forth the FACTS in this case and spread the FACTS;
- "(3) Support the ROSENBERGS in their legal rights for a review of the sentence and let us call for a new trial."

The Newark Evening News, in an article on Page 30 of the 5/1/52 issue, reported a meeting on 4/30/52 at 516 Clinton Ave., Newark, N.J., called by the Essex County Committee to Secure Justice in the Bosenberg Case. Said meeting protested the guilty verdict and death sentence of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG. Those present reportedly sent a petition asking the Supreme Court to set aside the verdict. An amount of \$1,146.50 was allegedly collected to help pay legal fees. The High Court is scheduled to hear an appeal for a review of the case the Monday following 5/1/52.

T-6 advised in 10/52 that in the past, instant committees have stressed the fact that the ROSENBERGS were innocent of the charges in the trial. He stated that at a 10/15/52 meeting of the Bergen County Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, at Teaneck, N.J.;

Stated that from now on they are going to play down the innocence of the ROSENBERGS and play up the racial issue and the fact that such traitors as TOKYO ROSE have received relatively light sentences.

It is noted that T-q, in 12/52, stated that the NCSJRC is sometimes referred to as the National Committee For Clemency In The Rosenberg Case.

New Jersey Committee for clemency in the hosenberg Case, included the following message:


"Dear Sir:

"JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG will die in the electric chair in a few weeks unless President Truman intervenes. "All the political and legal arguments in this celebrated case mean nothing. What remains is the human question. Here are two people -- husband and wife, father and mother -- sentenced to death. The judgment need not be inflexible. We must plea for mercy.

"Already joined in this plea for mercy are religious leaders of all faiths including (names of 13 individuals).

"We ask you to write immediately to President Harry S.

We urge you to help us by letting us know what action you
have taken."

- *(1) Return to all in your city who have shown interest and concern in this case by phone, mail, and meetings. Discuss with them what you and they can do to save the lives of the Rosenbergs. Make the reaching of more people a paramount point.
- *(2) Collect funds immediately to place the largest possible adds in your local newspaper. Quarter-page adds are the minimum effective adds. In these adds appeal to President Truman to set aside the death sentence by executive clemency. Use the enclosed draft of an add as your guide.
- "(3) Organize a wife and letter campaign to President Truman, asking that the death sentence be set aside. Point out the unprecedented nature of these death sentences. Do as large a mailing as possible to key lists who can get similar action.
- "(4) In these letters to Fresident Truman, urga him to direct the Attorney General to consent to a new trial in the event that any new motions come before the courts.
- "(5) Rush funds to our office. We will need collections of thousands of dollars within the next few weeks in a nation-wide clemency appeal."

The Communist Party will bereinafter be referred to as the CP, and has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as an subversive organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Hewark Confidential Informant %-15; of known reliability, advised in 1952 that the "Committee To Save the Rosenbergs", Newark, K.J., on 4/25/52 paid for a \$1.05 subscription to the Daily Worker "What's On" potices.

The Daily Worker is an East-Coast Communist daily newspaper.



Newark Confidential Informant T-20, of known reliability, stated that GEORGE FIGHMAN attended various meetings during 1949 and 1950 held at the Camden County Beadquarters of the CP and at the State Headquarters of the CP in Newark, N.J.

MISCELLANEOUS

A. Connection Of The Civil Rights Congress With Instant Committees

It is noted that the Civil Rights Congress, hereinafter noted as the CRC, has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as comint within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

1. Activity of the CRC To Aid The Rosenbergs

Newark Confidential Informant T-21, of known reliability, advised 4/3/52 that LOTTIE CORDON and LEWIS MOROZE were concerned about the scheduling of a meeting of the CRC and the Essex County Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case on the same date. HOROZE intended to discuss this matter with Dr. LEONARD TUSHNET of the latter committee to make certain the two affairs do not compete with one another for attendance.

Newark Confidential Informant T-22, of known reliability, related that a CRC rally was held by Nature Friends of America, Camp Midvale, N.J. on 7/13/52.

Mrs. HELEN SOBELL, wife of MORTON SOBELL, made a special appeal for funds to help her husband fight for fruedom. Thereafter a collection was taken by eight women who asked for nothing less than a dollar. T-22 estimated that \$300 was collected.

T-22 recalled that WILLIAM PATTERSON, National Secretary of the CRC, followed Mrs. SOBELL as a speaker. At the end of his speech, PATTERSON made an appeal for the contribution to the NCSJRC. No collection was taken however. A booth was set up at the clubhouse at the camp for the purpose of taking pledges and accepting contributions to be forwarded to the committee.

T-2 noted that the majority of literature disseminated at this rally concerned the ROSANBERG case. He made available a pamphlet obtained at the rally entitled, The Rosenberg Case—A Fact Sheet," published by the NCSJRC.

Newark T-2, on 8/14/52, stated that LEWIS MOROZE, at CRC Headquarters, Newark, N.J., was preparing a ticket to be printed for a meeting on the Rosenberg Case to be held Thursday, 9/11/52, at Videway hall, 929 Broad St., Newark, N.J.

Newerk Confidential Informant T-23, of known reliability, related that a Ronds for Israel Rally at Untermann Field, Newerk, N.J. was held 8/18/52. At the east gate of this field, four men were distributing pamphlets. From this distribution, T-23 obtained two pamphlets published by the NCSJRC entitled,

"A Statement On The Rosenberg Case" by Rabbi Dr. Meyer Shraff; and "The Rosenberg Case—A Fact Sheet." To the latter was stapled a ticket in—viting the receiver to a meeting at Wideway Hall, Newark, N.J., 9/11/52; This meeting to be sponsored under the suspices of the Rosenberg Committee, RD 2, Box 148, Toma River, N.J.

-----Newark T-12-stated on 8/20/52 that LEWIS MOROZE had that day reported to an individual at the headquarters of the NCSJEC, in New York, that the New Jersey group had a successful distribution at a Bonds For Israel Rally and a successful meeting of the Rosenberg Committee in Stelton, N.J.

It is to be noted that in Section I of this report, T-7 stated that at the 9/11/52 meeting of the New Jersey Committee To Secure Justice In The Rosenberg Case, LOTTIE GORDEN was the second speaker, who identified herself as a representative of the CRC, stating that the CRC was joining the Rosenberg Committee to see that justice was served.

LEWIS MOROZE was also present at this meeting, according to T-7.

At this meeting of 9/11/52, T-7 received a throwavay announcing a "Constitutional Day Rally For The Repeal of the Smith Act", which throw-away was published by, and which rally is being conducted under the auspices, of the Civil Rights Congress of New Jersey, 188 Belmont Ave., Newark 3, N.J.

Newark Confidential Informants T-24 and T-25, of known reliability, related that they attended a "Constitutional Day Rally For Repeal of the Smith Act" at 188 Belmont Ave., Newark, N.J., 9/17/52, sponsored by the CRC. LEGIS MOROZE was Chairman of this rally. He and another individual circulated a petition for the ROSENBERGS at the rally.

Nevark T-12 stated that when LITTLE GORDEN heard via the radio that the Supreme Court decided not to review the ROSENBERG Case, she called a meeting at S:00 p.m. at her home to be attended by LEMIS MCROZE and MARY ADAMS TAYLOR for the purpose of initiating some action on behalf of the New Jersey Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case and for the purpose of taking the initiative before orders were received by the National Office of the NCSJEC directing some action.

T-12 also stated that on 10/14/52 LEWIS MOROZE received instructions from the NCSJRC regarding steps that should be taken in New Jersey to increase the activity on behalf of the Rosenberge as a result of the Supreme Court's decision not to review that case.

According to T-12, MCROZE instructed MARY ADAMS TAYLOR to arrange with a SHR!EY MILLER for action in the Jewish community to assure a good cross-section and large attendance at a meeting scheduled for Passaic County, N.J.

LEWIS MUROZE also ordered from the NCSJRC copies of a letter from the ROSENBERGS, which copies were to be distributed. 100 of these letters are to be sent to Farmingdale and to Lakewood, N.J. The copies for Lakewood were to be distributed at a meeting scheduled in the Lakewood area 10/18/52.

In October, 1952, T-12 related that LEWIS MERCZE sent a telegram as a dayletter to President HARRY S. TRUMAN, White House, Washington, D.C., 10/22/52, with the following message: "Julius and Ethel Rosenberg are innocent. They must not suffer fate of Sacco and Vinzetti. Urge executive clemency to commute death sentence." Signed, "Civil Rights Congress of New Jersey, Lewis M. Moroze, Secretary, 188 Belmont Ave., Newark, N.J."



In November, 1952, T-12 stated that LEWIS ROMOZE was assisting in the preparation of a rally "To Save the Rosenbergs for Executive Clemency." T is rally was to be held 12/11/52 at the Broadway Veterans Hall, 11:5 Broadway, Paterson, N.J. MOROZE intended to prepare and order the tickets for the occasion. He further expected to contact a group in New York associated with the CHC in an effort to obtain a speaker for this occasion and hoped to obtain HELEN SOMELL.

According to T-12, MCROZE and Dr. TUSHIFT conferred concerning a leaflet which was being planned for distribution in New Jersey in regard to an effort by the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenburg Case to have the death sentence commuted.

T-12 observed that in November, 1952, LFWIS EDROZE was contacting individuals for the purpose of obtaining statements which might be used in the afforts of the Committee to Lecure Clemency for the Rosenbergs to have their death sentence commuted. MOROZE is believed to have obtained statements from 12 prominent people.

On 11/20/52 T-12 stated that MOROZE made the contact noted hereinafter.

MOROZE conferred with Rabbi MOSESSON (PH), Newark, N.J., who is associated with a Gouncil of Rabbis, to obtain names of Rabbis who would aid Dr. LEONARD TUSHNET, Irvington, N.J., in the work of the Rosenberg Committees to free the Rosenbergs. Rabbi MOSESSON advised MOROZE that the matter of the HOSENBERGS was taken up at a recent council meeting and it was decided not to speak in the name of the Council, but to leave action, if any, in the hands of individuals Rabbis. Rabbi MOSESSON suggested that MOROZE send ROSENBERG case material to the man who is on a subcommittee handling matters of this type.

MOROZE also conferred with Rebbi BENJIMIN PLOTKIN, Jersey City, N.J., concerning the ROSENBERG case and discussed an article he said he saw in two newspapers indicating a number of Rabbis from Israel sent an appeal to President TRUMAN on behalf of the ROSENBERGS. MOROZE alleged that a number of leading Habbis in the Newark area sent letters to President TRUMAN on behalf of the ROSENBERGS. Rabbi PLOTKIN said that he discussed this case with some of his congregation and was surprised that everyone was sympathetic toward them. MOROZE solicited Rabbi PLOTKIN'S signature to a joint statement on behalf of the ROSENBERGS, which the Rabbi could review. Rabbi PLOTKIN suggested that MOROZE contact Hrs. HEITMAN, who was very active in the National Women's League on Social Action, and through her contact the Chairman of the National Women's League. MOROZE did this and mentioned to Ars. REITMAN an article appearing in the "Jewish Day nindicating that 22 leading Rabbis in Israel sent appeals to Fresident TRUMAN on behalf of the ROSENBERGS. MOROZE advised Mrs. REITMAN that he had conferred with leading Rabbia in the Newark eres, and that a group of Rebbis hed taken it upon themselves to send letters to President TRUMAN esking for clemency for the ROSINBERGS. He also indicated that Rabbis of the Newark Council had organized a subcommittee to look into the Rosenberg Case, but were afraid to publicize their feelings due to the hysteria of the present times. Mrs. REITMAN agreed to contact by Special Delivery letter Mrs. THEODORE KROHN, National Social Action Committee Chairman, 3080 Broadway, New York City, and Mrs. EMANUEL SINER, President, National Women's League of United Synagogues, 3080 Brosdway, New York City.

T-12 stated that in regard to the above matter, MOROXE concluded this effort by contacting the NJSJRC and advising them that the National Women's League of United Synagogues, at the above address, had expressed in: erest in the ROSE/BERG matter and should be contacted on a national level.

LEWIS MOROZE advised T-12 that he requested literature from the NCSJRC for an affair in New Jersey on 11/22/52.

On that date, T-12 stated, that LIMIS MOROZE was actively organizing a motorcade for the ROSENEWRGS. This motorcade started at Jelliff St. and 18th Ave., Newark, N.J., at 12:00 noon. MARY ADAMS TAYLER was stationed at the CAC Headquarters, 188 Belmont Ave., Newark, to advise the participants of the marshalling point noted above.

Newark Confidential Informant T-26, of known reliability, stated that he saw 7 vehicles containing 15 adults and 3 children in a motorcade, led by L'W MOROZE in his vehicle, start from the above-described point and proceed through downtown Newark and the Clinton Hill Section. This motorcade ended at 1:30 PK in front of the CEC headquartens, 188 Relmont Ave., Newark, N.J. All the vehicles had signs on the side or rear, stating in substance "We are innocent. Julius and Ethel Rosenberg;" "Write resident Truman Nercy for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg;" and "Spare Ethel and Julius Rosenberg."

According to T-21, early in December, 1952, Dr. LFONARD TUSHNET assigned LOTTIE GOHDON to speak on the ROSFUBERG case at a meeting of a peace group in Irvington, N.J.

LIN MOROZE, according to T-12, in December, 1952, planned to meet with a Lakewood group serving for a Committee to Decure Justice in the Rosenberg Case in that area.

T-12 related that on 12/19/52 LFW MOROZE at CRC Headquarters received instructions from the New York office of the NCSJRC relative to changes in plan for the mass crusade to mashington, D.C., on behalf of the ROSFNERGS, which plans were discussed under Section I. It is noted that instant committee advised LEW MOROZE concerning new plans and their desire that 10 or 15 letters or telegrams be addressed to President TRUMAN asking clemency, and that these be dispatched over the week-end of 1/3/53 by persons who would have attended the cancelled crusade in Washington.

T-21 related in January, 1953, that LOTTIF COMMON was then arranging for a HOSTNITE motorcade scheduled for 1/10/53, which would be assembled at Jelliff St., between Waverly and 18th Aves., Newark, N.J., at 10:00 AM, 1/10/53. COMMON has already acquired some assistance and was instructing that contacts be made with trade union people in an effort to have a large turnout, and the assignment has been made to secure cars and volunteer workers.

Newark Confidential Informant 7-27, of known reliability, stated that the above motorcade started at 11:00 AV, 1/10/53 and contained about 10 or 50 cars, most of which had signs on the side and/or rear with one of the following messages:

Write to President Truman to

- "(a) free the Rosenbergs
- m(b) spare the Rosenbergs
- "(c) elemency for the Rosenbergs."

The motorcade, according to T-27, was led by LRIS LOROZE in his vehicle and passed through downtown Newark, through the Clinton Hill Section of Newark, and distanced at its point of origin at approximately 1:35 PM.

2. CP Affiliation of Principals Acting for the CRC in its Aid to the Rosenberg Case.

Newark Confidential Informant T-28, of known reliability, advised in May, 1951, that he knew LEWIS MORDZE to be a CP member

On 1/29/52 T-28 stated that MOROZF, at that time, without doubt was a member of the CP of New Jersey.

It is noted that T-7, in Section I, related that LOTTIE CHIDON made a speech at the 9/11/52 meeting of the New Jersey Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case at Newark, at which time she referred to herself as a representative of the UKC.

It is also noted that the "Newark Evening News" of 9/12/52 identified her in an article captioned, "A-Spy Verdict Called Unjust," as a member of the Newark Branch of the CRC.

T-7 stated that at the above meeting, LOTTE GORD N also stated that she and her family were members of the International Workers Order (INO).

The American Roman for Peace has been cited by the Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities on L/1/51 as "an advance wave to establish a beachiead for other left-wing organizations scheduled to descend on Rashington in observance of a Communist declared *Peace Reek.**

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case will be referred to as the NCSJRC hereinafter for the sake of brevity.

I. ORIGIN, SCOPE, AND GENERAL ACTIVITIES

A. Origin

The October 10, 1951 issue of the "National Guardian" contained, at the end of an article captioned, "TheLetters of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg", an announcement as follows: "... Last week the formation began of a National Committee to Secure Justice for the ROSENBERGS. WILLIAM A. REUBEN, noted author of the Guardian series on the case, will act as provisional chairman. The formation of this committee was stimulated by the Guardian series on the case, and at the Guardian's suggestion, every effort will be made to enlist the committee from among rank and file people who are concerned over the case".

On January 3, 1952,

furnished a copy of a press release dated December 31, 1951 Which announced the formation of
the NCSJRC with offices at 246 Fifth Ave., New York, New York,

The California Committee on Un-American Activities in its 1949 report, page 394, cited the "National Guardian" as "a publication launched in New York in 1948, aimed at national circulation, which, from its inception, was notoriously Stalinist in its staff, writers, management, and content".

On March 29, 1951, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were convicted in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York of conspiracy to commit espionage. They were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951 and were electrocuted at Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953.

advised that a Baltimore Committee to Save the Rosenbergs was organized by woman representative from the New York Committee to Save the Rosenbergs in charge of setting up Rosenberg Committees throughout the United States:

The Communist Party, hereinafter referred to as the CP, has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The January 4, 1953 edition of the "Sunday Star", Wilmington, Delaware, contained an article captioned "Clemency Plea for Spy Pair Mailed Here", on page 1, column 4, which stated that an anonymous source in Wilmington was mailing out pamphlets published by the NCSJRC in New York asking clemency for JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG.

On January 12, 1953, Confidential Informant T-30 advised that MARCELLA AVNET recently stated that the local Rosenberg Committee had been able to raise only \$120 of the \$500 needed to advertise urging executive clemency for the ROSENBERGs.

Confidential Informant advised that MARCELLA AVNET wast a Section Organizational Secretary of b7 District 4, CP, and was a member of the Organizational Secretaries Commission, District 4, CP.

On February 2, 1953, the Honorable SAMUEL N. FRIEDEL, House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., advised that MARCELLA AVNET, LUCILLE NICHOL, and MARY ROBERTS visited his office on January 31, 1953 to intercede for the ROSENBERGS.





According to T-34, SWOGELL stated that loaflets, petitions, and postcards were being printed and that loaflets would be distributed in downtown Baltimore on May 28 and 29, 1953, as well as in the coutlying sections of Laltimore.

On June 4, 1953, Confidential Informant T-34 advised that GERT SWOGELL stated that a huge delegation from 50-cities——was to be in Washington, D.C. on that date to see their representatives and senators as well as President EISENHOWER in connection with the Resembers case. Informant advised that Baltimore delegates were to assemble at the hone of PHIL BOYER in order to go to Washington, D.C., for this activity and to attend a large meeting there.

T-30 advised that the Baltimore Rosenberg Committee continued to send individuals to Washington, D.C. by auto to participate in the ROSENBERG vigil around the White House on June 18, 1953. Stated that upon arrival in Washington, on June 18, 1953, the picketers were sent to 1867 Kalerama Road. NW, to receive instructions and were then placed in the picket lines around the Treasury Building and the White House for two hour shifts.

Confidential Informant estimated that there were 570 approximately 6000 individuals participating in the vigil and that there was no disorder.

During June, 1953, Confidential Informant T-17 advised. that during May and June, 1953, LILLIAN FI N contributed 290 to the MCSJRC at New York City,

On August 17, 1953, Confidential Informant furnished by information concerning the Eastern Scabord Conference of the MCSJRG held on August 15, and 16, 1953, at New York City. Indivised that a speaker from Baltimore spoke on August 15, 1953, and stated that "people who were favorable to the MOSET MRGs are the ones we must return to in the case of MORTON LOBELL." Informant described this speaker as female, 34 years, 5'6", and having dark brown hair. On August 9, 1953, Confidential Informant T-36 advised that the purpose of the above meeting was to assemble the people of the castern seabord to exchange experiences and to discuss why they did not save the MOSETBERGS. Informant also advised that it was planned to discuss methods to get the support of the labor movement in order to secure justice for MONTON SOBELL.

On Soptember 28, 1953, Confidential Informant advised that the Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG - 80BELL case, was circulating a letter urging the reader to write to the Attorney General urging him not to empose the motion for a new trial for MORTON SOBELL. Confidential Informant advised that this leaflet was being widely distributed by the local committee and that the leaflet was urging the transfer of SOBELL from the "inhuman conditions of Alcatrez":

During September, 1953, Confidential Informant T-17 paivised that PAULICE LOYER paid \$52.82 during September, 1953 to the NCSJRC at New York City, and that JOSEPH SCHEK contributed and during July, 1953.

Confidential Informant advised the the local Rosenborg Committee was handling the sale of the book entitled "Death House Letters of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENDERG" in Baltimore: Informant stated that the book was supposedly a compilation of the letters of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG written to each other while they were confined in prison prior to their execution.
