1. ROSENBERG COMMITTEES AROUND THE COUNTRY: There are now almost 25 committees to secure justice in the Rosenberg Case around the country. Among these are New York, Chicago, Los Angeles, Chapel Hill (N.C.), New Orleans, Baltimore, Washington, D.C., Cleveland, St. Louis, Detroit, Denver, Milwaukee, Cincinnati, Newark, Portland, San Francisco and other committees presently being formed in Minneapolis, St. Paul, Boston, Richmond and Norfolk (Va.), Asheville, Durham and Winston-Salem (N.C.), Houston and Austin (Texas), and other cities. In virtually everyone of these cities we find members and officers of conservative, as well as progressive, civil liberties and Jewish organizations, such as local ACLU, B'nai B'rith, American Jewish Congress, NAACP and others. Big public meetings have recently taken place or are being planned in all of these cities, participated in by rabbis, ministers and other leading community figures.

2. THOUSANDS OF AMICUS BRIEF SIGNATURES have come to the office from all over the country signed by men and women of all walks of life. Among the signatories so far are; Rabbi Jacob Hoffman, N.Y., Judge Norval K. Harris, Prof. H.C. Landau of the Univ. of Chicago, Mrs. Dorothy Day, Editor of the Catholic Worker, Charlotta A. Bass, Albert Maltz, Paul Robeson, Howard Fast, Rev. Amos Murphy, Boston, Rev. Frank Glenn White, N.Y., Prof. Ephraim Cross of the College of the City Of New York, Dr. Gene Weltfish, and a very large number of doctors and lawyers.

It is imperative that all petitions be sent to the national office by May 30th.

Please be sure to call our attention to the names of any local notables who signed the petition.

3. FUNDS: As you may know a great deal of money had to be borrowed to meet the \$12,000 cost of printing the court record for the Supreme Court appeal, all of which was due by May 1st. This expenditure leaves us without funds for additional legal expenses, publicity and other campaign expenses, to say nothing of the assistance given by the Committee towards the up-keep of the Rosenberg children and the Sobell family.

We further must realistically face the inescapable fact that financial collections fall off during the summer months. It is therefore imperative that funds be raised for the Committee's work, through public meetings, house parties, dinners, individual solicitations and other means.

4. REACHING THE PEOPLE: Committees and individuals around the country have now taken literature in hundreds of thousands of copies. The public meetings in various cities have attracted so far a total of more than 100,000 people. If current plans for public meetings continue at the same rate as before, a similar number of persons will be reached by them within the next few months.

Please continue to keep in touch with us to give us the benefit of your experiences and advice and to call upon us for whatever assistance you feel we may be able to give you.

For Immediate Release -- A group of women went to Sing Sing prison today to request the special privilege of visiting Ethel Rosenberg, but they returned without success, bringing back with them the gifts of flowers, fruit and candy meant for the young mother who has been in Sing Sing's death house for nearly a year.

The women, themselves wives and mothers, including one double Gold Star Mother of World War II, were told by prison authorities that the great bunch of spring flowers they brought could not even be turned over to the prison matron in charge of Mrs. Rosenberg so that she might at least glimpse them. Nor would prison regulations permit delivery of a message declaring the women's resolution to bring alleviation of her cruel confinement during the coming months while her case is being appealed.

The visit to see Mrs. Rosenberg was part of a nationwide expression of concern for her and her children which in more distant communities across the country took the form of Mother's Day cards and letters to the imprisoned woman.

Mrs. Rosenberg and Julius, her husband, were convicted last year on charges of "conspiracy to commit espionage" and sentenced to death. Their case, together with that of Morton Sobell, who was convicted with them and now faces 30 years imprisonment, will be presented to the U.S. Supreme Court next month.

The group of women resolved to make every effort to secure a special order from the N.Y. State Supreme Court, which, prison officials indicated was necessary to permit visits and delivery of gifts. Among the group who made the trip to Ossining, N.Y., were Mrs. Ruth Bassis, Mrs. Ida C. Solomon, Mrs. Pat Miles, Mrs. Rose Stieglitz, Mrs. Edith Marzani and Mrs. Emily Alman.

The message, which was finally put in the mail to Mrs. Rosenberg in the hope that officials in charge of correspondence would approve its delivery on Monday, declared:

"We have come to see you on the occasion of Mother's Day. The thought of you, a wife and mother, separated from your two small sons for almost two years, in solitary confinement for the longest portion of that time, has become more than we -- mothers, too -- can bear in silence.

"We want you to know that we believe in your innocence. We are determined that during the long months ahead, while your innocence and your husband's innocence is being established before the courts of the land as well as the people, a more humane and reasonable relationship shall be arranged for you and your children.

"We take deep pride, as women and mothers, in your inspiring courage and strength, unbreakable in spite of a death house solitude which it is beyond our capacities to imagine. We cannot rest until this cruel confinement is alleviated, and you are permitted contact once more with your loved ones.

"During the normal hours of happiness and sorrow with our own families, we think of you, and we measure our own security by the tragedy that has overcome your young life. Finally, we want you to know of the thousands of women all over America who have wept for Ethel Rosenberg and who work with resolution and love to restore you to your rightful place with your family and friends."

There are two major points which we wish to submit for your consideration and action.

1. We now have until June 30 to submit the nationwide Amicus Brief to the Supreme Court. From representatives of the Committee who have been in the South, West and Midwest, from the reports we get from local committees around the country and from many individual letters, we believe that it is possible to obtain a tremendous number of signatures to this Amicus. We are not speaking of tens of thousands of names, but of many scores of thousands.

We think that the first order of business of Rosenberg Committees and persons active on their behalf is the securing of these signatures by June 30.

We know that you will appreciate the difference between bringing an insignificant number of names to the Supreme Court and bringing a number so great that it must be respected.

What will you do to get these signatures by June 30?

2. There are now some 25 Rosenberg Committees throughout the country. In addition to that there are many informal groups, individuals, other interested organizations, etc., and we think that it might be advisable to hold a series of regional conferences, possibly in July or August. It is possible that one-half dozen such regional conferences, properly situated geographically, could lay the groundwork for an intensified campaign beginning in the late summer or early fall.

If these regional conferences can be organized over a series of consecutive weekends across the country, it would be possible for representatives of the National Committee to attend them.

We would appreciate your thinking on this suggestion, as to desirability, feasibility, time and place. Please discuss these two important matters with your associates, and write to us very soon.

ANTI-SEMITES CALL FOR LYNCHING OF ROSENBERGS

THREATEN SUPREME COURT JUDGES IF NEW TRIAL GRANTED

A long, ornately printed "poem" being sent through the mails, published by "Pentagon Patriots", Washington, D.C., calls for lynching Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, and threatens the judges of the Supreme Court if they should grant the Rosenbergs and Morton Sobell a new trial, it was revealed today by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.

Should a new trial be granted, the "poem" says, "An outraged nation with a yell / shall drag them from their prison cell / And hang them high / Beyond life's hope / To swing and die / And dangle from / The Hangman's rope."

Of any judge who votes for a new trial, it says, "We'll brand his brow / With marks of guilt / And link his name / with traitors / In the sewers of shame."

The "poem" also threatens the defense attorney with these words, "But such a shyster (mark him well) / Is paid with gold that comes from hell / So with God's lash, he, too, should share / Death with this Communistic pair." When this is done, the "poem" concludes, "Our natives shall rejoice and sing / And shout while these two traitors swing."

The Committee also revealed that it was in possession of a "sticker" being circulated in Boston, Mass. The sticker reads in part, "Why do you think the long list of JEWISH Marxists (whose names such as Rosenberg, Greenglass, Sobell, Gold, Weinbaum, et al, daily appear in newspaper headlines) betray our atomic secrets...?" The sticker, unsigned, calls for action against the Jewish people.

Such language is not confined to any "lunatic fringe", The Committee pointed out. Similar utterances appeared in a review by Sterling North, syndicated book reviewer, in the NY World Telegram on May 7, 1952. In his review of "The Atomic Spies" by Oliver Pilat, North in one place refers to "the CCNY (City College of New

2.

York) boys who sold out their country." Elsewhere he says, "If an immigrant does not learn how to read or write English after 34 years in this country, he or she deserves such children as some of those sharp-witted gutter rats." He concludes his review by lending credence to the anti-Semitic legend which makes radicalism a Jewish phenomenon by dismissing the claim that radicalism arises out of environmental factors.

The Committee pointed out that this was similar to anti-Semitic utterances by government officials, as quoted in the NY Times of Dec. 26, 1951, who laid the absence of spies at the Oak Ridge atom-bomb plant to "a predominance of pure Anglo-Saxon stock in East Tennessee..."

Further proof that anti-Semites are using the Rosenberg convictions to spread hate-propoganda is contained in letters going through the U.S. mails. One of these reads in part, "Build a strong wailing wall with four sides and put dear little mammala and papala Rosenberg in the big middle of this wailing wall in Sing Sing and let them wail and wail and wail." The letter asks, "What does the Jew\$ do in return" for being "permitted" to live in the United States. "He is without exception the spy, the Saboteur, 'Commies', Left Wingers, Infiltrators, hate mongers and all around trouble makers. To say nothing of their intense Zionism which makes Hitler look like an amateur."

The Committee will ask the Post Office Depratment to look into these threats and hate-letters, and asks that they be informe d of other anti-Semitic material, related to the Rosenberg Case, which may be circulated.

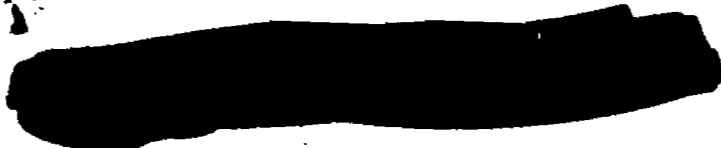

## An open Letter to the officers of the American Civil Liberties Union

**GENTLEMEN:** On May 20 the American Jewish Congress circulated to its affiliates throughout the country copies of a "memorandum" on American Civil Liberties Union stationery under the headings: "To whom it may concern—from Herbert Monte Levy, Staff Counsel—subject: Rosenberg, Atomic Espionage Case."

This "memo" will make sick at heart thousands of Americans who have rallied to the ACLU motto: "Eternal vigilance is the price of liberty." Described as "an effort to cover all matters which have been raised with us or could conceivably be raised," the 2½-page document "takes no position on the guilt or innocence of the Rosenbergs" as if that were a side issue. From this admitted superficiality it quickly develops into a low-level political diatribe with a gratuitous libel of the NATIONAL GUARDIAN which, seeking facts according to its policy, brought the case to national attention.

THE GUARDIAN is accustomed to such libels, as any fact-finding American paper must be in this period. But two questions are raised which we submit you have a responsibility to answer soberly, concerning this "memo" on a case involving the lives of two American citizens and parents:

- The effect of the "memo" by Staff Counsel Levy is to give positive support to a death-sentence conviction. Do you approve of this departure from ACLU's 30-year practice of either taking up a case or refraining from comment on it? Do you think it is the function of a civil liberties organization to comment publicly in favor of a death sentence for an alleged crime never before so punished in this nation's history?

- The "memo" is filled with demonstrable inaccuracies and downright misrepresentations of fact. Do you approve of such a document being circulated throughout America as an apparently official statement by ACLU?

For example:

- "... That perjured testimony was knowingly used against the Rosenbergs . . . was not raised by the attorneys for the Rosenbergs." (THE FACT: The basic contention of the defense throughout the trial was that the key witnesses, David and Ruth Greenglass, lied to save themselves; and in the oral argument on the appeal, attorney Emanuel Bloch flatly charged the existence of a "deal" between the prosecutor, the Greenglasses and their attorney, Q. John Rogge.)

- "FBI kidnapping of a witness. This contention again is not raised in the brief for the Rosenbergs." (THE FACT: Of course not; it was co-defendant Sobell whom the FBI kidnapped, and it was raised in the Sobell brief.)

- "The contention has been made that somehow a penalty of death violates civil liberties. . . . But . . . persons have been sentenced to death for this [espionage] in the past." (THE FACT: No such sentence has ever been imposed in American history. Levy is here confusing "espionage" with "treason," although he makes the clear distinction between them on the vital Constitutional issue—see below.)

- "Membership in the Communist Party was expressly introduced as evidence of motive, which we felt under the circumstances was perfectly proper." (THE FACT: This is a double misrepresentation. The tendentious testimony introduced to show the Rosenbergs had Left sympathies was submitted to the jury as evidence of "intent"—which any law student knows refers to a general state of mind and is quite different from "motive." No testimony whatever that the Rosenbergs were CP members was introduced, as the GUARDIAN has repeatedly pointed out.)

THE point in which the Levy "memo" most significantly lends ACLU prestige to government legal hair-splitting is the vital Constitutional issue concerning "treason." Says the "memo":

"Conviction for atomic espionage does not involve civil liberties. . . . This was a conviction for espionage, which we believe to be the proper way to deal with communist totalitarianism."

Because "the crime of atomic espionage was a different crime from that of treason," the "memo" rejects the defense contention that the Rosenbergs were deprived of due process under the Constitution, which lays down that treasonable acts must be confirmed by the evidence of two independent witnesses. But the defense has pointed out that—while the Rosenbergs were carefully charged with a crime other than treason, since the government knew it could not produce two such witnesses—the fact that it was really a "treason" trial was clear when prosecutor Saypol called the Rosenbergs "traitors" both in opening and in summation and Judge Kaufman did the same in summing up.

Thus the trial was conducted in what Supreme Court Justice Jackson has referred to in another connection as the "passion-arousing" atmosphere of a treason trial, while defendants were denied the

rights the Constitution guarantees in such a trial.

FINALLY, may we point out that the Levy "memo" is in head-on conflict with the Natl. Lawyers Guild, which has officially approved the filing of an amicus curiae brief before the Supreme Court (based on a careful study of the trial record which ACLU apparently never made) just because it found that the Rosenberg Case does involve civil liberties on three counts: (1) on the "treason" issue, (2) on the introduction of vague but inflammatory "Communist" testimony, (3) on the issue of "cruel and unusual punishment"?

Is ACLU prepared to say and prove that the Natl. Lawyers Guild decision is not borne out by the facts or the law?

Is eternal vigilance still the price of liberty? Can liberty be bought with political spitefulness and an admitted refusal to investigate all the facts?

Does Staff Counsel Levy speak with your authority? If he does not, you owe it to the people of America—tens of thousands of whom have rallied to the Rosenbergs' defense after examining the facts in the case—to say so. If he does, then we submit that a serious re-evaluation of the American Civil Liberties Union—which has won richly-merited laurels for its implementation of its motto in the past—is called for.

In spite of the gratuitous libel to ourselves in the Levy "memo," we address this to you without bias or bitterness, out of our sole desire for cooperation between all defenders of America's beleaguered civil liberties.

THE EDITORS OF THE NATIONAL GUARDIAN

The GUARDIAN urges readers concerned about the Rosenberg Case to contact personally or by letter officials of the ACLU and of organizations circulating the Levy "memo"; to bring the above Open Letter to the attention of acquaintances who are members of these organizations; and to insist on full and frank answers to the questions raised.

We further urge members of Jewish organizations to ask them why, equipped as they are with more than adequate legal staffs, they do not take a position on the Rosenberg Case on the basis of a proper study of the trial record by their own legal advisers, rather than to give endorsement to the inaccurate, unobjective "memo" of ACLU's Staff Counsel who admittedly has not studied the record.

Dear Friend:

1. We are approaching the third milestone in the road that may lead to a new trial for the Rosenbergs and Morton Sobell.

The first milestone was passed when the faith of those in the death house that their fellow-Americans would learn and spread the truth in the case, was realized. Our literature distribution alone is now crowding the quarter million mark, to say nothing of our ads, meetings and material issued by various committees around the country.

The second milestone was passed a few weeks ago, when \$12,000 was needed to insure the printing of the trial record for the Supreme Court.

The third milestone, concrete, tangible and widespread sentiment for a new trial - taking the form of an Amicus Brief - has a deadline - June 30th.

We are approaching this deadline much sooner in time than in signatures. And we must ask you to do something about it. We must ask you to take these Amicus petitions, or draw up Amicus petitions of your own, and get hundreds and thousands of signatures to them, and send them on to us by June 30th.

The young couple in the death house await word eagerly, each week, of what progress we have made towards getting signatures. No matter how difficult it may seem to us to get these signatures, we must remember that the Rosenbergs face a much more difficult situation. They can do nothing to stop the hand of the executioner. We can. We mustn't fail them. Our own liberties and lives are as much at stake as theirs.

2. On June 17 and June 19 two big public meetings will take place in New York City, one in Brooklyn, one in Manhattan, to which thousands of people are expected to come. In addition to getting the truth to these people and getting them to sign the Amicus, we are going to ask them for the funds with which to keep the campaign for a new trial rolling. We need money for new legal expenses, for advertisements, for printing new pamphlets (one in Jewish, one on the "scientific" evidence, one on the death house letters of Ethel and Julius),



for reprinting the existing material, for assistance to the Rosenberg and Sobell children, and for a thousand other things. You can well imagine the effect on those two New York meetings of letters from you who are unable to be present because of distance, letters filled with money, letters pledging more. To say nothing of the possibilities these funds open up to us, the projects it permits - even the justice it may pay for. (Incidentally, quite a bit of money is owed to the Committee for literature. It would help considerably if these bills were paid).

Won't you and your friends get together and see to it that by the time these New York meetings take place you can give the National Committee the kind of financial assurance it will need to be effective over the summer months.

3. As you may have seen from one of our previous press releases, anti-Semitic groups, basing themselves on the Rosenberg trial, have been calling for violence against the Jewish people. Under this kind of pressure, a number of liberal Jewish organizations have issued statements disclaiming any interest in the case, and even going so far as to say that our Committee has injected a false issue - anti-Semitism - into the case.

In replying to these organizations, we suggest that every attempt be made to induce them to study the facts, and to consider the meaning of the trial, the verdict, the death sentences very carefully.

Secondly, we wish to point out that it was not our Committee which first raised the question of anti-Semitism. Many months before our Committee was formed, and before the Reuben articles appeared in the National Guardian, the JEWISH DAILY FORWARD, the JEWISH DAY, the CHICAGO SENTINEL and other Jewish and anglo-Jewish papers raised this question. (See our "Fact Sheet on Anti-Semitism in the Case.").

Third, these organizations have not studied the question that every Jew, and non-Jew, must face in this respect. Why were there no Jewish jurors on the jury? Why was the first death sentence ever imposed on a charge of conspiracy to commit espionage by a civil court, imposed on two Jews? Is it not a fact that Prosecutor Irving Saypol, now Judge Saypol, was reprimanded by the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in the Remington case, for anti-Semitic behavior?

4. Several communities have already written us in respect to the Regional Conferences we urged for July and August. We must have more opinions on this before going ahead. Please discuss this with your friends and tell us what you think.

Dear Friend,

You are one of 1500 men and women in our country whose combined assistance and interest has made an appeal to the Supreme Court possible in the Rosenberg-Sobell case.

We must ask you now to take two immediate and urgent steps on behalf of those in the Death House.

1) We are enclosing five Amicus Briefs on which you can obtain 50 signatures. We must gather a minimum of 100,000 to make an impreciable impact. At this moment we are far short of the required number. For the sake of saving lives, we must ask you to get these five Amicus Briefs signed -- and returned to us by June 30th.

Are there 50 people -- friends, neighbors, relatives, colleagues, shopmates -- whom you can get to help save two lives? We know there are.

2) Our Committee cannot be idle this summer. Too much is at stake, too little time is left. These are our expenses until September: Legal expenses, \$15,000; printing expenses (a pamphlet in Jewish, one on scientific aspects of the case, one on the letters of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg), \$3,000; assistance to the Rosenberg and Sobell children, \$2,000; overhead (postage, travel, rent, phone, stationery, salaries) \$3,000; advertising (Anglo-Jewish press, New York Times, Washington Post, etc.) \$1,500.

Altogether we need some \$25,000 to keep the case before the public until September.

We must count on you to make this possible.

# *AMICUS BRIEF\** in the *ROSENBERG CASE*

**WE BELIEVE** that the trial of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg and Morton Sobell on a charge of conspiring to commit espionage, which resulted in death sentences for the Rosenbergs and a 30 year sentence for their co-defendant, lacked guarantees of fairness which all Americans have a right to expect under the Constitution.

**WE BELIEVE** that the Prosecutor and Trial Judge permitted fear and prejudice to dominate the trial by 1) attributing to the defendants social beliefs which are today the target of virtually every public tribunal, and 2) attributing to them reversals and casualties suffered in Korea.

**WE BELIEVE** that transient political and social passions have no place in our courts, that to deprive even one American of the right to a fair trial is to injure the rights of all Americans.

**WE THEREFORE** authorize the inclusion of our names in an Amicus Brief to the Supreme Court of the United States, petitioning that the verdicts and sentences be set aside, and that a new trial be ordered based on Constitutional guarantees of impartiality and fairness in accordance with the best traditions of American justice.

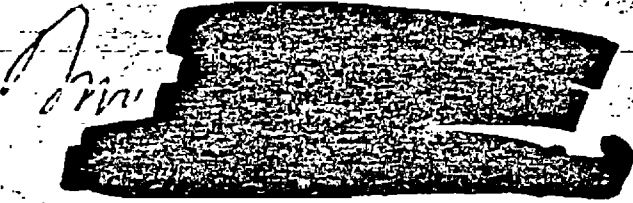

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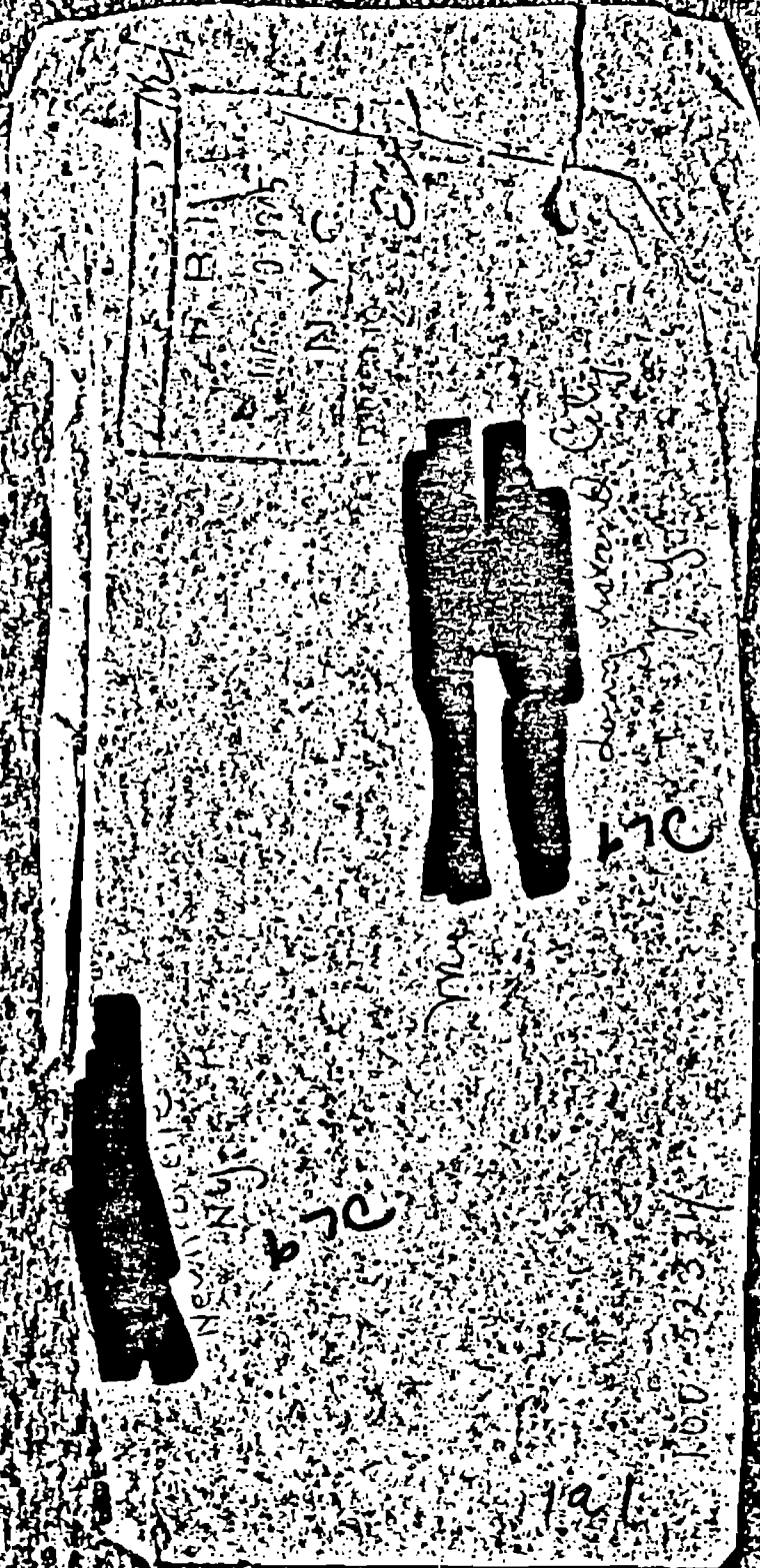

"F" (6 months) and "M" (1 year) are most often found on THE WORKER subs, also "K" (10 months).

EXAMPLE: 7-14-47 M W refers to a Sunday Worker sub for one year, expiring July 14, 1947.

7-14-47 F $\frac{1}{2}$  W refers to a 6 mo. Worker sub which will run for an extra week over the 6 months, and which expires July 14, 1947.

For subscriptions that are renewed within two weeks after expiration, the symbol "R" is used, to show that no copies are missed, e. g., 7-14-47 FR.



It was her recollection that VIVIAN PATAKI, during the union meetings, was extremely outspoken and active, and associated with persons who Mrs. HARRIS believed were Communists or pro-Communist.

This information was merely hearsay on the part of Mrs. HARRIS and she stated she was unable to furnish any other information concerning VIVIAN PATAKI'S activities and associates while both herself and VIVIAN PATAKI were employees of the United Service for New Americans.

VIVIAN PATAKI was assigned to the Case Work Division while she was assigned to the Immigration Division and they had no contact. According to Mrs. HARRIS, the union in which VIVIAN PATAKI was active was the United Office and Professional Workers of America.

*Mr. T-1*  
T-1, of known reliability, has advised that on October 30, 1953, two individuals identified as VIVIAN and ERNEST visited at the apartment of MAX and ANNETTE FINESTONE, 106 Bedford Street, New York, New York. The informant believes that VIVIAN and ERNEST are VIVIAN and ERNEST PATAKI.

MAX FINESTONE has previously been identified by T-2, of unknown reliability, as probably having been the last person recruited by JULIUS ROSENBERG into his espionage apparatus. ROSENBERG was executed at Sing Sing Prison on June 19, 1953 for conspiring to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union.

T-3, of known reliability, advised that on December 3, 1953, correspondence was delivered to subject's residence in the name of [REDACTED] This correspondence was from [REDACTED]

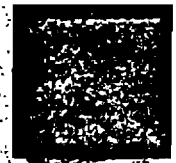

MEMORANDUM

The post office at Philadelphia, Pa. has a record of one [redacted] having been employed as a special delivery messenger, for which position he made application on February 14, 1925, giving his age as sixteen (16).

On the date of application he showed current employment at the Western Union Telegraph Company, 21st and Market Streets, Philadelphia, Pa.

His references were given as [redacted] and [redacted] gave his address as [redacted]

He was appointed on September 3, 1925 and was frequently admonished by his supervisors for failure to observe instructions. His delinquencies became more frequent and he was removed on January 10, 1928. His delinquencies included -- failure to observe instructions; insubordination; falsifying time of delivery of the special article; failure to leave proper notices concerning the placing of special delivery articles in mail receptacles or slots; using the bicycle of another messenger; failure to take proper care of the Government mail satchel; and loitering.

He was given another opportunity and was reinstated on January 20, 1928. However, he returned to his erring ways described above and was again removed on February 18, 1929.

[redacted] record shows injuries, as follows:

- (1) October 27, 1925 - Bicycle which he was riding broke throwing him to the ground. Sustained bruised right arm and chest. Treated at St. Agnes Hospital, Broad and Mifflin Streets, October 28, 1925.
- (2) May 3, 1927 - Bicycle which he was riding was struck by an automobile. Suffered injury (apparently slight) to left knee. Immediately taken to Jefferson Hospital and sent to United States Public Health Service Dispensary at 410 Chestnut Street.

(3) July 7, 1927 - Bicycle which he was riding was hit by a wagon, resulting in bruises on lower left leg. Treated immediately at United States Public Health Service.

(4) January 17, 1929 - Bicycle which he was riding while delivering mail at Philadelphia Navy Yard skidded on ice, resulting in bruised left shoulder. He was treated immediately at the St. Agnes Hospital by Dr. [REDACTED]

During the period in question the Post Office Department did not require particular records as to the place and date of birth of special delivery messengers or other employees who were hired on a temporary basis or who did not have the benefit of classified Civil Service status.

While the age of the [REDACTED] whose record is given above, does not agree with the newspaper accounts of the [REDACTED] now in custody, it can be presumed that the subject falsified his age in order to gain employment.

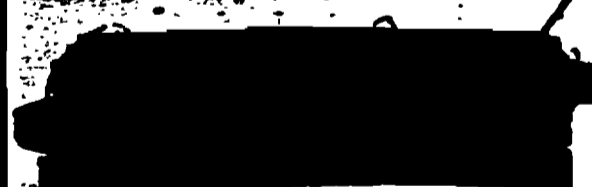
