[REDACTED] Veterans Administration, 128 North Broad Street, advised on May 29, 1950 that a clerk by the name of [REDACTED] had told her about a week previously that he had met two Indian scientists who were friends of HARRY GOLD. [REDACTED] could furnish no further information concerning the incident.

EDWARD MODEL, 6608 Lynford Street, advised on May 29, 1950 that about two years previously he had visited the GOLD home and had met two Indian scientists who were friends of HARRY GOLD. MODEL said that he visited the GOLD home because GOLD's mother had died and it was an old Jewish custom to bring food to the bereaved family.

He said that he met these scientists through JOE GOLD, brother of HARRY, but that he had paid little, if any, attention to them at that time. He said they were introduced to him by JOE as friends of HARRY GOLD. He also said that he understood that these scientists were working in New York at that time. He said that he was present only a few minutes when the scientists left GOLD's home. He described one of them as being about 5'7" or 5'8", thin build, light complexion and wearing glasses. He described the other one as about the same height and complexion, but with a stocky build. He could recall no more information concerning these two men. He repeated that they were only in the home a few minutes after he arrived there. He said he attached no significance to the meeting at the time and, therefore, did not pay very much attention to these men.

On August 31, 1951, the U. S. Veterans Administration file for [REDACTED] (Claim No. [REDACTED]) was reviewed at V. A. Headquarters in Paris.

The V. A. file reflects that [REDACTED] has completed the necessary formal actions to transfer under the G.I. Bill from the Ecole Normale de Musique, 114 Bis Boulevard Malesherbes, Paris 17, France to the AKADEMIE FUR MUSIK UND DARSTELLENDEN, Lothringerstrasse 18, Vienna III, Austria.

[REDACTED] claimed, in his request for the above transfer, that he desired to study German classical and romantic literature of the piano, and also indicated that the cost of living in Paris was too high for him.

The V. A. file in Paris indicates that [REDACTED] is presently receiving his mail from the V.A. in Paris at the American Legation in Vienna, Austria, but that he is actually living in care of [REDACTED]

The V. A. file in Paris indicated that [REDACTED] plans to resume his studies at the above named school in Vienna on October 1, 1951.

In view of the foregoing it is suggested that the Bureau may wish to request the Bureau representative in Frankfurt, Germany to handle the desired reinterview of [REDACTED] in Vienna.

Accordingly, in the absence of instructions from the Bureau to the contrary, instant matter is being placed in a closed status by the Paris office.

In accordance with your telephone request of March 13, 1951 regarding a surveillance of ERNEST PATAKI at the Emerson Radio and Phonograph Corporation, Jersey City, New Jersey, the following surveillance was conducted by agents of this office on March 13, 1951.

At 5:20 p.m. PATAKI left the plant of the Emerson Company and proceeded alone on foot to a bus stop at Fourteenth Street and Jersey Avenue in Jersey City, New Jersey. At that point he boarded a Public Service bus and left this bus in Newark at the corner of Raymond Boulevard and Mulberry Street. He proceeded alone on foot to Nat's Fine Food Restaurant, 232 Market Street, Newark, New Jersey, where he had dinner with an unidentified male who was approximately 40 years of age, 5 feet 3 inches tall, 150 pounds in weight, and who had black hair which was combed straight back. It was also noted that he walks with a limp in his left leg.

At approximately 6:40 p.m. PATAKI and this unidentified individual entered a building at 218 Market Street in Newark which is the location of the Madison Institute, a Radio and Television School, as well as a Tailoring School. It appeared that the unidentified individual who entered the building with PATAKI was an instructor in this school.

His schedule calls for him to conduct classes in radio and television on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday of each week and the classes commence at 6:45 p.m. and are dismissed at 11:15 p.m.

The following background information contained in the records of the Madison Institute are set forth below:

ERNEST PATAKI was born on June 5, 1915 but the place of his birth was not noted in those records. He attended a business high school at Szeged, Hungary from 1921 to 1933. He attended the Cooper Union College in the Night School from 1936 to 1944. He received a Bachelor of Electrical

Engineering Degree from this college in 1944. He lists membership in the IRAE.

Concerning previous employment, he advised that he was employed from June, 1944 to August, 1950 as an engineer in the Federal Telecommunications Laboratories, Inc., Nutley, New Jersey, in the Engineering Department under the supervision of A. M. LEVINE. From August, 1950 to October, 1950 he was employed by the Tele-King Corporation, 601 West 26th Street, New York City.

From November, 1950 to the time of his employment with the Madison Institute he was employed by the Emerson Radio and Television Company in the Quality Control Division under the supervision of one F. LESLIE.

FATAKI's residence is listed as 217 East Nineteenth Street, New York City, and he lists former residence as 54 West 91st Street, New York City, but the date of this residence are not indicated in these records. He noted that he was single and that his telephone number was SF 7-0961.

His references are ALBERT SHADENITZ, 1 Adams Court, Nutley, New Jersey, and P. McGEE, 28 St. Marks Place, New York City.

On May 13, 1951 Special Agent JAMES H. HIGDON, JR. had occasion to interview Mr. JAMES P. LOYD, Director of Personnel, Federal Telecommunications Laboratories, Inc., Nutley, New Jersey, on another matter. At that time LOYD advised that some months ago, the exact time he cannot remember, he received a telephone call from a representative of the Cooper Union College relative to ERNEST FATAKI who was at that time under consideration for some teaching position with this institution. LOYD stated that he gave FATAKI the usual employment reference as was indicated by his satisfactory record in the laboratories and that several months subsequent to that time he telephonically contacted the Cooper Union College in an effort to ascertain if FATAKI had been given employment at that college. At that time he learned from an unknown official at the Cooper Union College that FATAKI was no longer under consideration for a position with this college.

Mr. LOYD furnished Special Agent HIGDON with a copy of a photograph of ERNEST FATAKI which was taken in 1944. There is being

Mr. F. R. CERTO, Employment Manager, Emerson Radio and Phonograph Corporation, Fifteenth Street, Jersey City, New Jersey, advised that ERNEST PATANI has been employed as an engineer in the Quality Control Division. PATANI was originally employed by the company in New York City but since approximately February 15, 1951 he has been employed in this company in the Jersey City plant. CERTO stated that PATANI has been with the company for such a short period of time that they know very little about him. CERTO advised that PATANI is considered by his superior, Mr. FRANK LESLIE, to be quiet and reserved and an individual who keeps "pretty much to himself."

MALCOLM S. STEVENS, Department of Industrial Cooperation, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Cambridge, Massachusetts, on February 4, 1952, verified DAYTON's employment as of that date as staff member on United States Navy unclassified research project in Laboratory of Nuclear Science and Engineering at Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

DAYTON works in Room 036 of Building 24 at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and according to STEVENS, DAYTON works a five-day week.

STEVENS said Professor ROSSI is in charge of the research and Assistant Professor WILLIAMS is ROSSI's assistant.

Informants T-1 and T-2 of known reliability on February 17, 1952, advised BRUCE DAYTON continued to reside at 45 Orchard Street, Jamaica Plain, Massachusetts.

## II. DAYTON'S LANDLORD

T-1 and T-2 both advised the house in which DAYTON resides is currently owned by the ZEYTOONTZIAN family, who also reside at 45 Orchard Street. Both agree it was previously

owned by the TALIANIAS family, who reside at 47 Orchard Street, Jamaica Plain, Massachusetts. The Informant said that DAYTON has no obvious acquaintances with any other family in the neighborhood.

The 1951 Police List for the City of Boston lists the following residents at 45 Orchard Street:

MARY ZEYTOONTZIAN, housewife, age 50, resided in 1950 in Woodville (Mass.)

PETER ZEYTOONTZIAN, baker, age 68, resided in 1950 in Woodville.

WALTER ZEYTOONTZIAN, baker, age 24, resided in 1950 in Woodville.

The 1951 Police List also indicates the following persons reside at 47 Orchard Street:

ANDRONIKI TALIANIAS, housewife, age 68, resided in 1950 in Greece.

ANTHONY TALIANIAS, proprietor, age 45, resided this address in 1950.

NIKI TALIANIAS, housekeeper, age 29, resided this address in 1950.

TOULA TALIANIAS, housewife, age 45, resided this address in 1950.

ARISTEDES ANGELUS, manager, Ezone Cleaners, Copley Square, Boston, Massachusetts, who is well acquainted with the Greek population in Boston, informed SA JOHN C. HESSIN, that ANTHONY TALIANIAS of Jamaica Plain is past



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president of the Council of St. John's Greek Orthodox parish in Boston. He had no further information concerning TALIANIAS.

### III. CURRENT ACTIVITIES

Informants T-1 and T-2 stated they have no reason to question subject's loyalty to the United States. They indicate that DAYTON resides at 45 Orchard Street with his two children, a daughter DERRY about ten years of age and a son ERIC about five years of age. They have no information concerning Mrs. DAYTON except to note that DAYTON's daughter had mentioned that her mother was in Arizona for her health and that they never wrote to her or received mail from her.

Both Informants had observed an unidentified woman bring DAYTON's son ERIC home at noon on numerous occasions and had seen her around DAYTON's house several times on Sundays and during the evenings.

It is T-1's impression that the woman had remained overnight a few times. The woman was identified by T-1 as follows:

The woman drives a small yellow foreign-made auto. The license number was not known to the Informants, but T-1 recalled that it was a New York license.

T-2 said neighborhood gossip indicates that DAYTON and this woman had been seen embracing on the side porch of DAYTON's house.

T-1 stated he had observed DAYTON carrying a B-4 or flight bag in the direction of the nearest bus stop to his home, although DAYTON owns a car, one Wednesday, which the Informant believed was February 6, 1952.

T-1 again observed DAYTON carrying the same or similar luggage toward his home the following Saturday (February 9, 1952).

The Informant is not certain of the dates, but to the best of his recollection, they are correct.

#### IV. DAYTON'S HOUSEKEEPER

Informants T-1 and T-2 have noted that DAYTON has a housekeeper who comes about noon and leaves when DAYTON returns home in the evening. His return is normally about 5:30 or 6 p.m., but occasionally it is much later.

The Informants are not aware of the identity of the housekeeper but have heard DAYTON's children refer to her as MARY. They described the housekeeper as follows:

T-2 has had a few brief conversations with the housekeeper and received the impression she is an intelligent individual.

It was previously reported in this investigation that DAYTON had made a \$20 check payable to Mrs. MARY A. DONOVAN on October 18, 1951. The check was endorsed MARY A. DONOVAN, 29 Catherine Street, Roslindale.

It was also previously reported that DAYTON had mentioned his housekeeper at 45 Orchard Street was Mrs. DONOVAN.

The 1951 Police List for Boston lists the following information for the occupants of 29 Catherine Street, Roslindale, Massachusetts:

MARY A. ~~DONOVAN~~, housewife, age 53.

GEORGE F. ~~DONOVAN~~, student, age 24

WALTER ~~DONOVAN~~, retired, age 60

WALTER F. ~~DONOVAN~~, student, age 25

The 1945 City Directories for the City of Boston list WALTER DONOVAN, 29 Catherine Street, as a chauffeur in the City Department of Public Works, Street Cleaning Division.

PAUL L. CARTY, City Retirement Board Office, City Hall, Boston, Massachusetts, made available retirement records of WALTER DONOVAN, which contained the following information:

DONOVAN was 42 years old in 1929 and in that year resided at 698 Shawmut Avenue, Roxbury, Mass. He was then employed in the Street Cleaning Dept.

DONOVAN's date of birth was listed as December 27, 1888, and his birthplace was listed as Boston, Massachusetts. His father is listed as PATRICK and his mother's maiden name as CATHERINE HART.

The file indicates DONOVAN was hired July 25, 1929, as a laborer, and was a citizen of the United States and served in the United States Navy from July 9, 1917, to February 14, 1919, receiving an honorable discharge.

On December 7, 1939, DONOVAN held the position of chauffeur. His wife is listed as MARY AGNES ~~TAYLOR DONOVAN~~, who in 1939 resided at 29 Catherine Street, Roslindale.

WALTER DONOVAN retired from city employment in 1946 due to a disability, being employed in the Sanitary Division of the Public Works Department prior to his retirement.

Informants T-3 and T-4 of known reliability advise that they have no personal knowledge of WALTER or MARY DONOVAN but are aware the DONOVANs are regular in their attendance at the St. Andrew's Roman Catholic church, Roslindale, Massachusetts.

T-5 of unknown reliability stated he has observed Mrs. DONOVAN at 29 Catherine Street, Roslindale, on a few occasions. She impressed the Informant as being the dominant personality of her family and as being somewhat aloof from the neighbors. T-5 has no reason to question Mrs. DONOVAN's loyalty or the loyalty of any member of her family.

According to T-5, Mrs. DONOVAN gives the impression of steady emotions and of being a person who would not be un-nerved in an emergency. He also believes Mrs. DONOVAN would be discreet but has no knowledge of whether she would be cooperative with the FBI. The Informant stated that Mr. DONOVAN is a retired city employee and feels he

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is loyal and reliable and could be trusted where discretion is involved.

The Informant said the DONOVANs have two boys, both veterans. The taller of the two impresses the Informant as being aloof and cool. The Informant also stated that this boy receives mail from Paris, France, the mail including letters and magazines in French.

It is the Informant's observation that Mrs. DONOVAN receives the periodical "JUSTICE", published by an unknown labor union.

Informant T-6 of known reliability stated he is very slightly acquainted with Mrs. DONOVAN, who is the housekeeper at 45 Orchard Street, Jamaica Plain, Massachusetts. The Informant stated Mrs. DONOVAN appears to take care of the house at 45 Orchard Street when the DAYTON children are home.

According to the Informant, DAYTON is also employed at Boston University, although the Informant has no further details.

It was the Informant's observation that the week of approximately February 4 to 9, 1952, Mrs. DONOVAN apparently remained at 45 Orchard Street constantly.

T-7 of known reliability had no pertinent information concerning MARY A. DONOVAN.

T-8 of known reliability stated that [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] was born June 16, 1924, at Boston, Massachusetts. His parents were listed as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was a corporal in the United States Air Force from April 10, 1947, to May 20, 1948, and received an honorable discharge and disability compensation.

From July 13, 1942, to January 13, 1946, this individual was a seaman first class in the United States Navy, receiving an honorable discharge.

The Informant also advised that [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] of [REDACTED] was born February 25, 1926, at Boston, Massachusetts, and was an aviation ordnance man second class in the United States Navy from May 6, 1943, to February 13, 1947, receiving an honorable discharge.

This individual, according to the Informant, has no disability compensation, has had no serious illnesses, and has a normal nervous system.

Records of the Credit Bureau of Greater Boston, Incorporated, 11 Beacon Street, Boston, Massachusetts, were checked by SE FRANCIS L. X. MANNIX but contained no additional information concerning the DONOVANS.

Records of the Massachusetts Board of Probation, Boston, Massachusetts, a central repository for all criminal records in the state of Massachusetts, were checked by SE FRANCIS L. X. MANNIX but contained no information identifiable with any of the DONOVAN family.

#### V. DAYTON'S TELEGRAM TO SACRAMENTO, CALIFORNIA

It was previously reported in this investigation that DAYTON sent a telegram from his home telephone to Sacramento, California, September 5, 1951.

T-9 of known reliability stated the following telegram was sent from the home of BRUCE DAYTON, Jamaica Plain, Massachusetts, on September 5, 1951, to ELSIE CORE, 3309 Twenty-second Avenue, Sacramento, California.

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The message reads:

"Hope you can arrange visit when in Boston. MIT phone X2396. Home phone listed. Write us your plans when definite. Unlimited hospitality."

VI. INTERVIEW WITH ROSE COSETTE SEGURE

On January 21, 1952, Miss ROSE COSETTE ~~SEGURE~~ was interviewed by SA WILLIAM J. PANTTAJA and the writer.

Miss SEGURE specifically declined to state whether she was or ever had been a member of the Communist Party or to state whether her former associates were or had been members of the Communist Party.

Concerning BRUCE DAYTON, she did state she was only casually acquainted with him and cannot now even remember what DAYTON looks like. She has heard nothing of him since their association on the Science for Victory Committee in California except that he had secured employment at a college in upper New York State. She would furnish no further information concerning DAYTON.

Regarding the Science for Victory Committee, Miss SEGURE acknowledged that she was officially an organizer for this committee but indicated she was never very active or effective in that capacity. According to Miss SEGURE, the committee was composed chiefly of scientists, and the purpose of the organization was to assist the war effort during World War II.

Miss SEGURE remarked that those days were the days of the united front, 1943 to 1944. The war effort was to be furthered by this committee by

the committee's helping industry and the Government in the developing of new arms and devices for the armed forces. The status of the committee was intended to be that of a technical and scientific adviser to the Government and industry.

Miss SEGURE advised she was not aware of any plans or aims on the part of the committee to secure access to important laboratories or to observe weapons under battle conditions. She said she had no reason to suspect the committee or any of the individual members therein of securing or planning to secure classified information for transmittal to any foreign country or for any unauthorized disclosure.

Miss SEGURE stated the committee included many persons who would be in the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians at the Radiation Laboratory at Berkeley, California. She indicated the Science for Victory Committee somewhat took the place of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians. She said that she had no personal knowledge of any request by the Government of the committee for a list of its members but believed that had the list been withheld from the Government, it probably was withheld on the basis that union membership should not be disclosed to the Government.

Miss SEGURE would not, however, acknowledge that the Science for Victory Committee was an attempt to organize a union at the Radiation Laboratory in contravention of that agreement between the C. I. O. and the United States Government.

Miss SEGURE stated the Science for Victory Committee included many persons who were not qualified for membership in the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians.

Miss SEGURE declined to discuss further the Science for Victory Committee or any of its members.

T-11 also noted a communication was received by T-11 on February 25, 1952, from SARANT, 3014 Douglas Road, Coral Gables, Florida, dated February 14, 1952, marked on this communication. T-11 also noted on February 20, 1952, a communication from Coral Gables dated February 19, 1952, to subject, and under date of January 8, 1952, another communication to subject from Miami, Florida, dated January 7, 1952.

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Informant T-10 of known reliability on October 16, 1951, stated the officials of the Progressive Party of Massachusetts, are known to the Informant to have been in close contact and association with officials of the Communist Party, Boston, Mass., and that according to the Informant the Progressive Party of Massachusetts follows the Communist Party line.

LASLO TISZA is a physicist at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, as is subject, and it is noted both attended the 1949 American Physical Society meeting at New York City.

LASLO TISZA is to be interviewed by the Boston office in the near future and will be questioned concerning DAYTON. A decision will be made at that time as to the advisability of interviewing VERONICA B. TISZA.

For the information of the San Diego office, WELDON BRUCE DAYTON has been identified as being present at 65 Morton Street, New York City, in January, 1950, with WILLIAM PERL, an alleged member of the JULIUS ROSENBERG espionage ring. It was at this address that the ROSENBERG ring maintained an apartment for use in connection with espionage activities.

DAYTON's wife, CAROL, and ALFRED SARANT, another member of the ROSENBERG group, left the United States together for Mexico while SARANT was being questioned by Bureau agents concerning his connection with the ROSENBERG group.

Since September, 1950, DAYTON has been engaged in unclassified nuclear research at MIT. During World War II he was engaged in various research projects in California for the Navy at Mare Island and at California Institute of Technology. He completed his work on his Ph.D. at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, in 1950, and while in Ithaca he was a next-door neighbor of SARANT.

1. This form (Standard Form 84) is promulgated by the United States Civil Service Commission at the request of the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the purpose of carrying out the responsibilities with respect to incumbent employees under Part VI of Executive Order 9835.
2. A separate form (Standard Form 85) will be used for applicants or persons appointed after September 30, 1947, as provided in Part I of Executive Order 9835, except for accepted employees where investigation is conducted by the agency.
3. The employee's fingerprint chart, Standard Form 85, must be submitted to the Federal Bureau of Investigation with the original and two copies of this form. The third carbon copy of the form should be retained by the agency.
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5. If the requesting agency has previously received loyalty information from any Government agency (including the Federal Bureau of Investigation) concerning the employee named in this form, the name of the agency which furnished the information and the date of the report should be shown in Item 14.
6. Item 15 is reserved for the use of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in reporting on this request when no derogatory information is developed.
7. Whenever derogatory information is developed the report will be covered in Item 17, above.
