ADDITIONAL DEROGATORY INFORMATION IN NEWARK FILES:

1) ON REFERENCES:

[REDACTED] On 6/18/52, [REDACTED] could not account for whereabouts of a "Secret" document charged to him.

In May, 1952, he requested clearance for a photographer to photograph the atomic artillery weapon. [REDACTED]'s superior stated there was absolutely no necessity for photographing the weapon.

[REDACTED] stated he was in favor of any system of government which would do the most for the greatest number of people and that if Communism was that system, he was in favor of it.

[REDACTED] and wife were members of the UOPWA-CIO in 1946 and 1947, which organization was infiltrated and dominated by the CP; [REDACTED]'s wife distributed UOPWA-CIO literature in 1946 and was secretary of that union in 1947; during 1946 [REDACTED] was friendly with [REDACTED], a CP member at work. From 1943 to 1947, [REDACTED]'s wife was associated with [REDACTED] a CP member; two subordinate employees not convinced loyal to U. S. and two other employees believe [REDACTED] responsible for "slowdown" in development of radar equipment under his supervision. Subject and wife not known to have ever been members of CP.

CIC says he is "liberal thinker with tendency toward Communism". *any*

MORTON SOBELL:

MAX ELITCHER, a self-admitted CP member and associate of both JULIUS ROSENBERG and SOBELL, stated that he was recruited into the CP by SOBELL. ELITCHER advised that ROSENBERG had informed him that SOBELL was aiding ROSENBERG in espionage work. ELITCHER further stated that SOBELL had attempted to enlist him in espionage work by turning over information to SOBELL obtained by ELITCHER in the course of his employment with the Navy Dept., Bureau of Ordnance, Washington, D. C. ELITCHER stated that SOBELL requested him to furnish the names of possible recruits for purposes of engaging in espionage work. (SOBELL was an associate of BERNICE LEVIN(E), Dept. Of Labor, Washington, D. C.)

who was named by ELIZABETH BENTLEY, New York informant, as an individual who had furnished information to Soviet espionage networks. Various classmates of SOBELL at CCNY identified him as "liberal" and "leftwinger" while attending the college.) SOBELL fled to Mexico in June, 1950 after the arrest of JULIUS GOLD, one of the participants of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus in May, 1950. SOBELL was arrested by Bureau Agents on 8/18/50 at Laredo, Texas. On 10/10/50, the Grand Jury, SDNY returned a true bill charging MORTON SOBELL, JULIUS ROSENBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG, ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEV and DAVID GREENGLASS with conspiracy to commit espionage. SOBELL was tried and convicted and sentenced to 30 years imprisonment on 3/29/51.

JULIUS ROSENBERG

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were members of a Russian Espionage Apparatus and were convicted of Conspiracy to commit espionage against the U. S. They were convicted in U. S. Federal Court sentenced to death and electrocuted on 6/19/53 at Sing Sing Prison, New York.

SAMUEL POMERANTZ

A SAMUEL POMERANTZ, 416 East 13th St., NYC, registered as a CP member in NYC in 1936 and signed a CP petition in 1939. A person of the same name registered as a CP member in 1939. It was not established that subject POMERANTZ was the one who is mentioned above.

SAMUEL POMERANTZ, subject, attended an American Veterans Committee meeting in 1947 where many CP members were in attendance. POMERANTZ was a classmate of MORTON SOBELL at CCNY and was acquainted with SOBELL and JULIUS ROSENBERG.

BENJAMIN ZUCKERMAN

This individual was very friendly with MORTON SOBELL (ROSENBERG Espionage Ring). He was denied clearance for employment at Ft. Monmouth in 1/51 on the above basic. ZUCKERMAN is alleged to have associated with other known and suspected Communists at Ft. Monmouth.

RECOMMENDATION:

An appropriate communication will be directed to the Bureau recommending that the Bureau consider reopening the LGE case on the subject. It is felt that further investigation as

to the disposition of the missing documents from LEVINE's section at Ft. Monmouth should be initiated and additional investigation into subject's sister, SHIRLEY CEPINKO's, association with subversive elements should be conducted.

SAMUEL LEVINE

Files of CIC, Department of the Army, fail to reflect any additional derogatory information not already in Bureau files.

Samuel Levine was the subject of an ICH investigation during 1950 and 1951. Bureau file 121-24999, Newark file 121-2656, New York file 121-10172. The Newark Office is in possession of all reports and the pertinent information therein has been briefly mentioned Newark and New York memoranda. Reports of the above investigation were furnished to the USCSC by letter dated January 29, 1951. The USCSC advised June 27, 1952, that the disposition of the above investigation was that subject was held "Eligible on Loyalty." Review of Bureau files fails to reflect any additional pertinent information concerning the subject not already briefly mentioned in New York and Newark memoranda.

References, Dr. Harold A. Zahl, Lillian D. Gould, and Harold Ducore, and associates, Irving Stokos, Aaron Coleman, Morton Sobell, Julius Rosenberg, Samuel H. Pomerantz and Benjamin Zuckerman are the subjects of separate memoranda, (see notes).

Bureau files fail to reflect any additional pertinent information concerning associate Stanley Robert Rich and subject's sister, Shirley Cerinko, to that briefly set forth in Newark and New York memoranda.

DISCRETIONARY INFORMATION CIC FILES

ON SUBJECT

While attending CCHY Subject was affiliated with the FAECT. Subject participated in peace strikes instigated by the American Student Union and Young Communist League. Subject registered as a member of the ALP 1938 and 1939. Subject alleged to be a "loft-winner" while at CCHY. The 12-38 issue of "Technical America" listed one SAMUEL LEVINE as Financial Secretary of Chapter #31 FAECT. In 1939 one SAMUEL LEVINE was listed as above in Volume 2, #16 in FAECT edition of CIC News. An informant stated the SAMUEL LEVINE mentioned above in the FAECT possibly had Communist connections on 4/23/42. One SAMUEL LEVINE was listed as one of the leaders who had been active in handling the affairs of the FAECT at the Federal Yards and other large plants in the metropolitan area. On 12/31/44 SAMUEL LEVINE

of 1135 Metcalf Ave., NY, N.Y., was on the mailing list of the PAECT. On 6/13/52 Subject was asked to produce 15 secret documents charged out to [redacted] from LEVINE's section. LEVINE could produce only 8. One of the 7 missing, according to LEVINE, had never been received. Another had been returned to the mail and records section.

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DEROGATORY INFORMATION IN NEWARK FILES

ON SUBJECT

An LGE investigation was conducted on the subject by the Newark and New York Offices in 1950-51 based on information the subject was "left-winger", supported "leftist" causes, and was friendly with JULIUS ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL. The investigation disclosed that an informant, of unknown reliability, stated subject was a "left-winger" at CCNY and a member of PAECT. Another informant, of known reliability, reported one SAMUEL LEVINE to be Financial Secretary and a member of the Executive Board of Local #31 PAECT. Other informants, of unknown reliability, report subject a "left-winger" while at CCNY; that he supported a program of social change through democratic process, and that he supported peace demonstrations sponsored by the YCL and the American Student Union. Subject is not known to have been a member of either of these organizations.

Subject was reported by these informants to be sympathetic to the Loyalist Cause during the Spanish Civil War. He is reported to have attended several meetings of the Steinmetz Club, a Marxist organization affiliated with the YCL, while at CCNY. Membership in the CP or YCL was not necessary for attendance at or membership in the Steinmetz Club.

Subject is reported, by a reliable informant, to be a member of the Federation of American Scientists, an organization of scientists who support dissemination of Atomic information, and who oppose Loyalty Oaths for scientists and clearance for scientists in non-secret fields.

Subject registered as an ALP voter 1938-39. Subject, by his own admission, states he was friendly toward MORTON SOBELL and JULIUS ROSENBERG while at CCNY and that ROSENBERG attempted to recruit him into the Communist movement.

One S. LEVINE, no address given, is listed among Lakewood, N.J. petitioners who protested the action of Judge HAROLD R. MEDINA,

U.S. Federal Court, SDNY, in jailing a number of the Communist Party leaders on trial.

Reported by informant of unknown reliability to be active with Communists, participated in Communist activities, and engaged in Communist recruiting drives at CCNY. Another informant, of unknown reliability, who has furnished reliable information, states RICH is known to him as a "loftist" who is known to MORTON SOBELL. SOBELL, according to the informant, knew the nature of RICH's work. The informant was not aware of whether RICH had ever been contacted by ROSENBERG or SOBELL, but he has indication RICH had. Informant states RICH might have been CP member, but of late has deviated. Speculating, the informant stated, that the deviation may be for the purpose of engaging in espionage. RICH was neighbor of ROSENBERG during 1942 and 1943 in NYC.





However, with reference to one of the secret documents that could not be produced, namely, S-3308, the Systems Section stated that it has no record of ever having received it as no notation of its appearance on its Mail Register. Also, the Systems Section stated that as far as Secret document S-3470 is concerned, it returned that document to the Mail and Records Section Evans Signal Laboratory on 4 December 1950.

The December 1938 issue of "Technical America" listed the Executive Board of Industrial Chapter #31, FAECT, among which was SAMUEL LEVINE, who was listed as Financial Secretary.

In volume 2, No. 10 of the FAECT edition of the CIO News, dated November, 1939, a list of the officers of the Industrial Section of the New York Chapter #31 was published. SAMUEL LEVINE was listed as Financial Secretary.

An informant stated the same Levine, among others, has been with the FAECT in New York City and that he might possibly have Communist connections inasmuch as many of the FAET members joined the FAECT.

LEVINE was born in 1918 while attending the College of the City of New York. LEVINE was affiliated with the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians, participated in peace strikes instigated by the American Student Union and Young Communist League.

Levine has been registered as a member of the American Labor Party in 1938 and 1939.

2. Education Taken

LEVINE was recommended by Fort Monmouth, and concurred in by the First Army; the Chief Signal Officer and D2, Department of the Army that LEVINE is not a security risk and should be retained in government employ.

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SAMUEL LEVINE was employed in March 1940 as Electrical Engineer Draftsman in SCCL. On 20 Apr 61, in accordance with SR 620-220-1 this headquarters recommended retention of LEVINE in government employ. It was alleged that LEVINE while at college in the State of New York was affiliated with the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians. He participated in Peace strikes instigated by the American Student Union and Young Communist League and was considered a left-winger. The Secretary of the Army Loyalty-Security Screening Board concurred in this recommendation of retention.

While attending CCNY Subject was affiliated with the FAECT. Subject participated in peace strikes instigated by the American Student Union and Young Communist League. Subject registered as a member of the ALP 1938 and 1939. Subject alleged to be a "left-winger" while at CCNY. The 12-38 issue of "Technical America" listed one SAMUEL LEVINE as Financial Secretary of Chapter #31 FAECT. In 1939 one SAMUEL LEVINE was listed as above in Volume 2, #46 in FAECT edition of CIC News. An informant stated the SAMUEL LEVINE mentioned above in the FAECT possibly had Communist connections on 4/28/42. One SAMUEL LEVINE was listed as one of the leaders who had been active in handling the affairs of the FAECT at the Federal Yards and other large plants in the metropolitan area. On 12/31/44 SAMUEL LEVINE

of 1135 Metcalf Ave., N.Y., N.Y., was on the mailing list of the FAECT. On 6/13/52 Subject was asked to produce 15 secret documents charged out to [redacted] from LEVINE's section. LEVINE could produce only 8. One of the 7 missing, according to LEVINE, had never been received. Another had been returned to the mail and records section.

DEROGATORY INFORMATION IN NEWARK FILES

ON SUBJECT

An LGE investigation was conducted on the subject by the Newark and New York Offices in 1950-51 based on information the subject was "left-winger", supported "leftist" causes, and was friendly with JULIUS ROSENBERG and MORTON SORELL. The investigation disclosed that an informant, of unknown reliability, stated subject was a "left-winger" at CCNY and a member of FAECT. Another informant, of known reliability, reported one SAMUEL LEVINE to be Financial Secretary and a member of the Executive Board of Local #31 FAECT. Other informants, of unknown reliability, report subject a "left-winger" while at CCNY; that he supported a program of social change through democratic process, and that he supported peace demonstrations sponsored by the YCL and the American Student Union. Subject is not known to have been a member of either of these organizations.

Subject was reported by these informants to be sympathetic to the Loyalist Cause during the Spanish Civil War. He is reported to have attended several meetings of the Steinmetz Club, a Marxist organization affiliated with the YCL, while at CCNY. Membership in the CP or YCL was not necessary for attendance at or membership in the Steinmetz Club.

Subject is reported, by a reliable informant, to be a member of the Federation of American Scientists, an organization of scientists who support dissemination of Atomic information, and who oppose Loyalty Oaths for scientists and clearance for scientists in non-secret fields.

Subject registered as an ALP voter 1938-39. Subject, by his own admission, states he was friendly toward MORTON SORELL and JULIUS ROSENBERG while at CCNY and that ROSENBERG attempted to recruit him into the Communist movement.

One S. LEVINE, no address given, is listed among Lakewood, N.J. petitioners who protested the action of Judge HAROLD R. MEDINA,

U.S. Federal Court, SDNY, in jailing a number of the Communist Party leaders on trial.

Another informant, of unknown reliability, who has furnished reliable information, states RICH is known to him as a "leftist" who is known to MORTON SOBELL. SOBELL, according to the informant, knew the nature of RICH's work. The informant was not aware of whether RICH had ever been contacted by ROSENBERG or SOBELL, but he has indication RICH had. Informant states RICH might have been CP member, but of late has deviated. Speculating, the informant stated that the deviation may be for the purpose of engaging in espionage. RICH was neighbor of ROSENBERG during 1942 and 1943 in NYC.

Re New York letter to Bureau dated 1/30/53 requesting Norfolk to forward sufficient information for appropriate documentation concerning Norfolk Informant T-1 which appears in the report of SA JOSEPH P. CARRIG at Norfolk dated 5/1/43 in the case entitled "Communist Infiltration of AASW".

A review of the report of SA JOSEPH P. CARRIG dated 5/1/43 at Norfolk entitled "Communist Infiltration of AASW, IS-C" reflects that the information in that report was received from Confidential Informant R-1. The report also reflects that the activities of this organization were confined to the government reservation at Langley Field, Virginia, and the investigation of this organization was being conducted by Confidential Informant R-1. This report does not identify R-1. However, other correspondence in the file on this organization reflects that this organization was being investigated by Major EDWIN A. HARTLEY, an Intelligence Officer, Headquarters, Army Air Base, Langley Field, Virginia. Therefore, it appears evident that the R-1 referred to in the report dated 5/1/43 was Major E. A. HARTLEY, S-2, Officer, Langley Field, Virginia, who furnished this information to SA JOSEPH P. CARRIG in February, March and April 1943.

It is noted that the report of SA MORRIS W. CORCORAN dated 1/30/53 at New York entitled "WILLIAM PERL, wa. ESPIONAGE - R PERJURY" reflects on Page 30 that T-2 who is identical with R-1 referred to above advised that WILLIAM MUTTER PERL now known as WILLIAM PERL was a member of the AASW at Langley Field prior to May 1, 1943 and that PERL during interview in July 1950 denied membership in this organization. The report dated 5/1/43 at Norfolk lists the officers of the local chapter of the AASW and lists WILLIAM MUTTER PERL as secretary.

The information furnished by R-1 in Norfolk report dated 5/1/43 is not contained anywhere except in that report which is Norfolk file 100-3119-3.

~~George Sokolsky called me at home Sunday afternoon to advise that Benjamin Ginsberg, a Staff member of the Hennings Committee, arrived in New York, called him on the telephone, and then came out to see him. George was in Columbia with Ginsberg in his college days; that in those days the boys called Ginsberg "God" because he knew everything.~~

~~George stated that Ginsberg visited with him for two and one half hours and as he was leaving, he asked George to come down and testify on the evils of guilt by kinship. George refused. Ginsberg then asked George to endeavor to influence Roy Cohn to talk to him about a conflict in dates in an alleged letter written by Ludwig Ullman to William Henry Taylor. Ginsberg asserted that the letter is reported to have been written variously on November 1, November 4, November 11, and December 12; that the Treasury Department says they have no such letter although Cohn told Taylor, when he appeared before the New York Grand Jury, that Cohn had gotten such a letter from the FBI. (Sokolsky did not get the year in which the letter was written.) Sokolsky told Ginsberg that he could see Roy himself. (Letter has been subject of memo 88, 18/55 9/12/55 Stanley To Rosen in case of William Henry TAYLOR 1/38-348), cover date of letter is 12/12/46. (as obtained from Treasury)~~

~~George then stated that Ginsberg is carrying the torch for Taylor although he wants to clear Taylor without using Elizabeth Bentley. Ginsberg then talked about Elizabeth Bentley's discrepancies in her testimony and discrepancies in the record statements explaining that the Director had testified that Bentley had related certain information in November of 1945 whereas Bentley in testifying before the House Committee on Un-American Activities earlier had related that this information was furnished to the FBI in August. I told George that this has been reconciled long ago; that Bentley was careless in her statements.~~

~~Among other things discussed, was the fact that Senator Hennings, himself, is not too interested in the Committee but Hennings' Administrative Assistant, Langdon C. West, is the individual who is pushing matters. George~~

told Ginsberg that he would not accomplish anything; that he should resign. Ginsberg on the other hand stated that the pressure to stop the inquiry on Freedom of Religion should not have been applied because the Committee had nothing. Ginsberg then argued that if he could save one life it would be worthwhile to stay on the Committee and in addition to the Taylor case, he is interested in the case of Walter K. Novak who was in the guided missile program and which case apparently has been cleared up. Ginsberg admitted that the Novak case was one that could have been a mistake.

Sokolsky told him that in a big system a program is only as good as the weakest link. Ginsberg replied by inquiring what about human justice. Sokolsky stated Ginsberg then asked him if Elizabeth Bentley was a lesbian. George stated he had never gone to bed with her but he could swear that she was not. He then took Ginsberg to task for blackening Bentley's character when he had nothing but gossip and it was at this point that Ginsberg asserted that he wanted to handle the Taylor case without bringing Bentley into it. He states flatly that he does not know whether Taylor was a Communist, he feels Taylor is not very smart; that he might have been a "darn fool;" but there should be a Statute of Limitations in talking about ^{the} discrepancies of the letter. George asked him why he did not go to the FBI. Ginsberg stated that there was an axis between the FBI and the Internal Security Subcommittee and that his committee did not want to be a part of the axis. George stated that when he looked back over the two and one half hours, he is forced to come to the conclusion that the above-mentioned matters were not the real reason for his trip; that sandwiched in between various things, Ginsberg talked about Maurice Rosenblatt, the campaign director for the National Committee for an Effective Congress. — D.C. - born 8/8/15 NY.NY. - Summary

Ginsberg asserted that Rosenblatt bribed Senators with whisky and women; that Rosenblatt was the one who got Marshall McDuffie interested in coming with the committee and then helped to murder him; that Rosenblatt is very close to Senator Hennings who likes him and Rosenblatt furnishes Hennings with liquor and furnished women to Senator O'Mahoney. At one time, there was a tieup between Rosenblatt and Senator Charlie Potter. Potter is reported to have called one of Rosenblatt's girls "Miss Committee for an Effective Congress." He further asserted that there is an internal fight among the Staff of the Subcommittee on Constitutional

Rights and Rosenblatt has the ear of Senator Henning's, not the Staff.

In our summary on the National Committee for an Effective Congress dated 8/11/54, the following is set forth on Maurice Rosenblatt:

"No investigation has been conducted by the FBI concerning Maurice Rosenblatt, who has been connected with the National Committee for an Effective Congress as campaign manager or director since that Committee was organized in 1948. Rosenblatt was born in New York City on August 8, 1915. In 1951, an informant of unknown reliability advised that Rosenblatt was a registered lobbyist for Randolph Associations and secretary for the National Committee for an Effective Congress. The informant stated that he had heard Rosenblatt described as a professional campaign fund-raiser. Washington, D. C., traffic arrest records during 1950 and 1952 reflected Rosenblatt's occupation as 'public relations.'

New York Coordinating Committee for Democratic Action in 1939 (merged with Friends of Democracy, Inc., in 1942), a self-appointed investigative organization supported and backed by former Vice President Wallace and formed to combat anti-Semitism and expose individuals and organizations which it considered pro-Nazi. According to G-2, the Committee attempted to show a tie-up between the Catholic Church and Fascist groups of the United States, and sought to compile, by its investigations, a list of prominent Congressmen, Senators, Army and Navy officials and civilian employees of the Federal Government whom it termed 'undesirable' and to smear them through periodicals such as 'PM.'

subversive groups, individuals and operations in New York.

"G-2's report also stated that [redacted] had attempted to evade the draft by various means, claiming physical defects and a necessity of contributing to the support of his mother and also appealing to President Roosevelt to intercede. Subsequent investigation by G-2 revealed that his mother was wealthy. Vice President Wallace reportedly did intercede when [redacted] had difficulty in passing an Army physical examination and obtained a waiver for him. At the time of his registration for the draft [redacted] indicated that he was closely associated with the Alien Squad of the New York City Police Department and the Department of Justice in Washington, D. C. The Alien Squad of the New York City Police Department considered him a troublemaker. Bufiles reflect no information concerning any connections with the Department of Justice. In filling out a Personal History Statement [redacted] revealed that he had used the name of A. C. Walden as an investigator of subversive activities, apparently in connection with the publishing of the afore-mentioned bulletin. A reputable detective agency in New York City, founded by [redacted], had no knowledge of him but it is believed that he used the name of [redacted] for undercover investigations. "Investigation by the Bureau from December, 1945, to March, 1951, of the American League for a Free Palestine, Inc., and its parent group, the Hebrew Committee of National Liberation (both now dissolved), under the provisions of the Registration Act, reflected that Rosenblatt was the Executive Secretary and Vice President of the American League for a Free Palestine in 1947 and described himself as an agent for the Hebrew Committee of National Liberation in 1950. Investigation disclosed that Rosenblatt was a former associate of an official of this Committee who returned to Israel in February, 1949, and that his only apparent function was to receive occasional mail addressed to the Committee. The stated purposes of the American League for a Free Palestine were to bring about the creation of a Jewish state in Palestine and to assist Jews throughout the world in settling there. (100-390025-3, page 3)

"An informant of unknown reliability, when interviewed by Bureau Agents on February 23, 1954, advised that Rosenblatt was one of the individuals

SA RICHARD F. HUFFORD advised that he was present in the court during the perjury trial of MARION LLOYD EDWARDS in United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, on November 19, 1954, to December 2, 1954. EDWARDS was tried for perjury in denying under oath in a previous court action that he had ever been a member of the CP. The testimony in the case was to the effect that EDWARDS was a member of the CP, 1945 to 1948, at Miami, Florida. He was acquitted of the charge. He was defended by MILTON H. FRIEDMAN about whom T-2, who has given reliable information in the past, advised on November 11, 1946, that FRIEDMAN was a member of the Queens County CP. During EDWARDS' trial the subject, HAGELBERG, was identified for the records as the Legal Assistant of FRIEDMAN, who stated, however, that the subject was not an attorney.



Membership and Associations

T-5, who has furnished reliable information in the past, on June 22, 1954, advised the subject was a member of the IWO as of late 1953. His address then was known to the IWO as 40 West 73rd Street, New York City. He was a member of Lodge number 593D. He joined the IWO in 1949.

Speeches, Public Appearances and Identification in Press

On January 6, 1950, the "Daily Compass" carried an article written by the subject, concerning the visit around that time to the United States of the Shah of Iran. The article, which was accompanied by a photograph of the subject, concluded that the visit of the Shah was another step by the United States in furtherance of the "cold war."

The "Daily Compass" was a New York publication which began publication in May, 1949, and ended in November, 1952.

T-6, who when active was in a position to furnish reliable information, stated on December 1, 1949, that the editorial and reportorial staff of the Compass was composed in the majority of Communists and sympathizers. He said "rewriter men gave the news a pro-Soviet slant and there was constant trading of news with the "Daily Worker."

The "Daily Worker" of March 19, 1950, page eight, column four, carried a notice headed by the name of the subject spelled GERNARDT HEGGELBERG. The

article advertised the subject as a long resident of the Far East and a contributor to various papers and advertised his coming speech on the "Liberation of China - Its Meaning for the American People." The speech was to be Sunday, March 19, at 201 Second Avenue, New York City.

On May 27, 1955, T-7, who has given reliable information in the past, said the "Daily Worker" and "The Worker", which is its Sunday edition, have been and continue to be under the complete domination and control of the CP, United States of America and constitute the primary medium for bringing the CP "line" to the rank and file of party membership on a day to day basis particularly in the East and Midwest.

T-1, mentioned above, furnished a copy of a mimeographed sheet on August 7, 1950, which advertised a speech that same day by the subject at 80 5th Avenue. The mimeographed sheet appeared to have been issued by the IWO and advertised an eye witness account of a deportation hearing concerning an IWO member.

SA CHESTER A. REILLY identified the subject as one of the marchers in the 1950 May Day Parade.

Relative to the May Day Parade, on April 30, 1951, JOHN LAUFNER, advised that this parade is sponsored and directed by the United May Day Committee.

The United May Day Committee comes within the purview of Executive Order 10450.

He said the parade is a CP function. JOHN LAUFNER was a CP member for 20 years and at the time

of his expulsion from the Party in January, 1950,
was Chairman of its New York State Review Commission.

On January 28, 1951, "The Worker" on page six, column three, carried a notice of a speech to be delivered by the subject on "China and World Peace." The speech was to be part of "American Labor Party Forum's Second Evening" at 87 Second Avenue.

T-8, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on September 9, 1954, that from the time of its inception in 1936, there existed within the American Labor Party a struggle for power among three groups. These were the Communist Party, the Socialist Party and the Social Democrats. By the early 1940's, the Communist Party emerged as the controlling force within the American Labor Party in the major industrial areas in New York State. Generally these were the areas around Albany, Buffalo, Jamestown, Rochester, Schenectady, Syracuse, Troy, the Hudson River Valley, Columbia, Dutchess, Nassau and Westchester Counties, and New York City with the exception of Brooklyn. In 1942 the Communist Party was able to capture the American Labor Party in Brooklyn. T-8 knew this situation to continue up until at least 1949. The American Labor Party never developed into an organization of any real consequence in the nonindustrial areas of New York State.

T-9, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on May 9, 1955, that the Communist Party today, as in the past, through its members in key positions in the American Labor Party, constitutes the force that controls it.

On October 19, 1951, T-10, who has given reliable information in the past, stated that he had attended a rally of the American Labor Party (ALP)

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on that date at 55-39 Myrtle Avenue, Ridgewood. At that rally, the subject spoke about Germany and charged that the United States was placing former high Nazi leaders in power and was preparing Germany as a base from which to attack the Soviet Union.

On April 25, 1952, the "Daily Worker," page seven, column one, carried an article advertising the subject's speech on "Germany and World Peace" at Academy Hall, 853 Broadway, room 18E. Subject was identified as Associate Editor of the "Progressive" German language newspaper, "The German-American," and author of the recent pamphlet "Germany: Hope or Peril."

The California Committee on Un-American Activities in its report/1948, page 225, found the publication, "The German-American," "Communist initiated and controlled or so strongly influenced as to be in the Stalin Solar System."

On May 21, 1952, T5:, mentioned above, advised that the subject participated in the 1952 May Day Parade.

T-11, who has furnished reliable information in the past, on June 30, 1952, advised that the subject in the capacity of Associate Editor of "The German-American" made a statement before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. The statement was delivered on June 17, 1952, and opposed United States policy in Germany and urged German unification. In the statement the subject opposed ratification of the Protocol to the North Atlantic Treaty concerning West Germany.

The "Daily Worker" on December 2, 1952, page eight, column two, carried a notice of a meeting marking the third anniversary of the German Democratic Republic. The meeting was to be held on December 7, 1955, at

- Yugoslav Hall. The subject was listed as one of the speakers. This notice also appears in "The Worker," December 7, 1952, section one, page eight, column four and five.

The "Daily Worker," March 17, 1953, carried an article on page eight, column two, entitled "Spy Operations in East Europe Bared In 'Jewish Life'."

The "Daily Worker" article discusses the "Jewish Life" article recently published by the subject.

"Jewish Life" has been cited by the Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications, May 14, 1951, prepared and released by the House Committee on Un-American Activities. It quoted the California Committee on Un-American Activities report, 1948, pp. 49 and 225 as follows: "Among typical examples of the Communist press and publications." The paper was stated to be published by the Morning Freiheit Association, Incorporated.

The "Daily Worker" on June 24, 1953, page eight, column four, carried a notice of a forum entitled "Germany -- Powder Keg or Peace Buffer?" at the Yorkville Temple at which HAGELBERG was to speak.

Communist Party Membership and Activity

On June 17, 1949, SA JOHN E. KEARY reviewed reports of [redacted] identified above b7D as [redacted] of the then Bureau of Special Services and Investigation, New York City Police Department. These reports were maintained by Lieutenant THOMAS CRANT. It was ascertained that a member of the Borough Hall Section, Kings County CP, had the name JERRY KRAMER and resided at 154 or 156 Hicks Street, Brooklyn, New York.





Confidential informants T-1, T-2, T-3, T-4; T-5, T-6, T-7, T-8, T-9, T-10, and T-11, all of known reliability, advised that they could not assist in the identification of the unknown subject from the artist's conception and physical description:

Confidential informants T-12 and T-13, of known reliability, advised that in their opinion the artist's drawing of "JOHN" is very similar to the appearance of RALPH WILFRED BETTELHEIM. A review of the information available in the New York files concerning BETTELHEIM eliminates him as a suspect for "JOHN", in view of the fact that [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] according to Confidential Informant T-14, another government agency which conducts security investigations, was born December 26, 1909, in New York City. This informant further reported that in October, 1942, he was transferred from a government position in New York City to a post with the Office of Imports, Board of Economic Warfare, Washington, D.C. b7D

Confidential Informant T-14 also stated that [REDACTED] was inducted into the United States Army at Fort Myer, Virginia on November 11, 1943. In December, 1943, he was transferred to the Infantry Replacement Center, Camp Croft, Virginia, and on April 28, 1944, he was transferred to Fort Meade, Maryland. On June 21, 1944, he was transferred outside the continental limits of the United States. He served in the European Theater from June 21, 1944 until the 27 of October, 1945, and was discharged from the Army at Fort Jay, New York, on November 14, 1945. b6 b7C

The above information puts BETTELHEIM in the military service away from New York for over one year of the time during which [REDACTED] and during seven months of this period BETTELHEIM was in the European Theatre, which would have made it impossible for him to [REDACTED] b7D

Confidential informant T-15, of known reliability, advised that the artist's conception of "JOHN" resembles one SERGEI MIKAILOV, alias WILLIAMS, a Comintern agent. He further stated that WILLIAMS was sent to the United States in the late 1920's or early 1930's in order to assist in the rearrangement of the Communist Party at the time of the ousting of JAY LOVESTONE. WILLIAMS was very close to EARL BROWDER, according to the informant.

The informant also said that WILLIAMS was primarily a political personage and was not known to the Confidential Informant as an intelligence operative. He was reputedly a personal confidante of STALIN, himself, and executed political missions in Canada, Mexico, and the United States. Because of this type of work which WILLIAMS was doing, the Confidential Informant doubted that he would be identical with unknown subject "JOHN".
