SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

The article of 18 June 1954: Vile propaganda pamphlets and outright requests for money have been mailed by Communist organizations to the relatives of many New England servicemen who remain Communist captives in Asia, the Boston Post learned. Not only has the vicious propaganda reached those who have reason to believe their loved ones are still alive in the hands of the Communists but relatives of other servicemen killed in action or who have died in prison camps have been receiving the same unrelenting taunts. The propaganda's steady flow from Red sources has caused mixed emotions of anger and dismay among families of the men. They felt that while they have been unable to get any definite word of their loved ones from Washington, the Communists indicate by mail bombardment that they have some information about the fate of unaccounted American POW's. Some parents have been getting propaganda pamphlets for the past three years. The Communist propaganda reaching the relatives in this area has been postmarked from London; New York; Czechoslovakia; Little Rock, Arkansas; and California. One of those receiving the propaganda from Communist organizations is William D. SCOTT, Wakefield, Massachusetts, father of Sergeant Gerald F. SCOTT, who escaped a Communist prison camp and whose whereabouts is unknown. It was mailed from New York, seeking "justice" for Morton SOBELL, who is now serving a life sentence in Alcatraz. SCOTT has also received propaganda literature assailing the Vatican, The Pentagon, and Wall Street. This was posted in Colorado. SCOTT said he believes he is on the Communist mailing list because they feel he is dejected, disgusted and ripe for conversion to Communism. He received the plea for "justice" from the NEW YORK ROSENBERG-SOBELL COMMITTEE, 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York 18, New York. He was directed to forward his contribution to Joseph BRAININ, chairman, at the same address. Other relatives receive pamphlets urging them to join the fight "for world peace."

The article of 19 June 1954: Most of the 944 American servicemen that the United States charges are still held hostage by the Communists in Asia are highly-trained experts in the operation of top-secret military weapons, service records disclosed. At least one of the 27 missing New Englanders is a highly qualified specialist in the operation of one of the nation's most secret weapons used in the Korean war—shoran. Another is a brilliant lead navigator, a top instructor of World War II. Still another was an exceptional student at Massachusetts Institute of Technology who is possessed with a "photographic memory." Another of the missing was a P-86 Sabre jet pilot. Another was one of this country's ablest military instructors loaned to Syngman RHEE to train ROK troops.

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

The Boston Post newspaper published a series of articles from 15 June 1954 to 19 June 1954, inclusive, pertaining to the prisoners of war still believed to be in the hands of the Communists. Following is a summary of each of the articles.

The article of 15 June 1954: "The United States government is giving 'the kiss of death' to 944 American youths, including an estimated sixty New Englanders, whose fate after their capture is still undetermined," stated Commander Vincent A. HARROLD of the Massachusetts Chapter of the American Prisoners of War. The government is "carefully and systematically erasing the names of these young men from the records" he charged, as he announced a mass protest meeting will be held on 20 June 1954 at the State House, Boston, Massachusetts. "Repeated requests about the fate of these youths have been answered with a lot of double-talk and issue-dodging."

The article of 16 June 1954: A hitherto secret list of names of American soldiers—over and above the famous 944—still held by the Chinese Reds, is being withheld by the government. Mrs. Stella ROBARGE of 20 Edison Street, Lowell, Massachusetts, and Vincent A. HARROLD, of the Massachusetts POW chapter, said the second list included "hundreds of specialists and instructors." Mrs. ROBARGE's husband, Major Paul ROBARGE, missing in action in Korea since July 1953, does not appear among the 944 names listed by the government as still held by the Communists. Major ROBARGE had been serving as military advisor to the Republic of Korea. Branding the State and Defense Departments as guilty of "two-faced cowardice" HARROLD said the second secret list "almost certainly contains the names of Major ROBARGE." HARROLD said, "We believe these men are being held by the Chinese Communists—not the North Koreans—as political prisoners and will never be released until we submit to direct negotiation with the Chinese government that we do not now recognize."

The article of 17 June 1954: The names of 24 New England men who are among the 944 Americans the United States has charged are still held prisoners by the Communists in Korea, are disclosed by the Boston Post today for the first time. The identity of the New England men, kept from their own families in almost every instance, and from the general public, has been known to the Defense Department since 24 September 1953. On that date General Mark W. CLARK handed the list of 944 names to the members of the Red Armistice Commission in Korea, and demanded they be returned "or else." The list of 944 American fighting men contains the names of 15 from Massachusetts, one from Maine, two each from Vermont and New Hampshire, and four from Connecticut. Despite the fact the Department of Defense has told the Reds it has evidence the 944 are still prisoners, the families of almost 660 of these men have received "official" word from the government that they are "presumed dead." The names, never before revealed to the general public, are in addition to almost four thousand other names of Allied fighting men that the Defense Department claims are still held by the Reds.

The files of the NYO reflect the following information in regard to JOSEPH L. DANIELS:

On 3/16/51, in an interview in the NYO, DANIELS advised SAs Robert L. Stevenson and Robert W. Coholan that he met MORTON SOBELL in September, 1943 when he started working at the General Electric plant in Schenectady, N.Y. He stated that SOBELL was already employed there and since they were both working in the same department, namely Aeronautic and Marine, they became acquainted. DANIELS stated that he was working on the design of a D-29 computer and believed SOBELL was working on radar and their work was classified secret and top secret. DANIELS further stated that he saw SOBELL every day at work and became friendly with him. He advised that he invited SOBELL to his home for dinner on one occasion but nothing unusual occurred and the conversation was casual.

In connection with his employment at General Electric, DANIELS stated that he never had any reason to suspect SOBELL as he had never said or done anything that he would consider subversive. On this occasion DANIELS also told the interviewing agents that he had resigned his position at the AVION INSTRUMENT CORPORATION on 3/16/51; that he could not get along with his boss, and thought that it was best for him to leave. RICH explained that economic conditions were poor as a result of the existing depression, and that many persons, particularly young college students, were concerned over the economic situation of the country and added that like many other young students, he soon became engaged in "leftist activities" at CCNY and participated in many student rallies, such as advocating aid for Loyalist Spain and maintenance of academic freedom. RICH eventually became President of the CCNY Technology Council and in this capacity spoke for Loyalist Spain at a rally conducted by the Young Communist League. RICH stated that he was considered a "figure head" and unreliable by those engaged in leftist activities, and added that the status of unreliability undoubtedly resulted from his insistence of independent thinking. RICH stated that while a student at CCNY, he became a member of the Steinerts Club. This organization was named after the great engineer whom RICH described as a well-known Socialist. The Club participated in left wing movements and sponsored rallies parallel to the Communist line. The organization became affiliated with the Young Communist League, and became a unit of that organization. RICH attended meetings of the group but denied he was an officer of the organization. RICH stated that his membership in the Young Communist League lasted from a period of four to seven months in his senior year at CCNY. RICH stated that at the time he was a member of the Steinerts Club, he was assured that members did not have to be Communists, but instead, sympathetic to the general Marxist views on life. RICH has not held these views since student days. (A-2)

Mr. REID stated JOEL BARR was employed as assistant electrical engineer at Fort Monmouth from July 1st, 1940 to February 23, 1942, at which time he was dismissed for Communist Party activities. He stated that another man was dismissed in 1942 by the name of [REDACTED] because of moral charges brought against him by his wife and [REDACTED] who was suspected by REID of subversive activities.

REID advised that the personnel files of these two individuals were no longer located at Fort Monmouth. The New York Office was requested to locate their files at Governors Island, New York.

A Security Matter (C) case is maintained in the New York Division on JOEL BARR, New York 100-29040, Bureau file 100-77232.

By letter dated July 3rd, 1942, under the caption "BARR JOEL, Security Matter (C), Custodial Detention", the Bureau forwarded to the New York Office two copies of a report prepared by Military Intelligence Division of the War Department. Subject of this report was JOEL BARR, 145 Broadway, Long Branch, New Jersey. The report indicated that BARR was a civilian employee in the Signal Corps Laboratories at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, and that the investigation was predicated upon a request by G-2, Washington, D. C. The report was dated January 16th, 1942.



There was no record of JOEL BARR having been born on January 1, 1916 in Brooklyn, Kings County, New York.

The records of the Office of Registrar, Columbia University, New York, New York, revealed BARR enrolled as a student in the School of Engineering for one academic year from September, 1945 to June, 1946. The University records showed BARR's birth date as January 1st, 1916, Brooklyn, New York.

On July 7, 1947, the records of WESTERN ELECTRIC COMPANY, 100 Central Street, Kearny, New Jersey, reflected that BARR was employed from March 16, 1942, to October 10, 1945 as an engineer and resigned to attend college and to receive his doctor's degree. He was rated "very good" for performance of service.

On September 2, 1947, JOSEPH GIMLIN, file clerk, personnel department, Bureau of Public Works, New York City searched the files of that department, and stated there was no record that JOEL BARR did work but added it is possible that BARR worked on a WPA project as a part-time draftsman, in which case there would be no record in the Bureau of Public Works.



Continuing the report stated on September 3, 1947,

[REDACTED] stated BARR was employed as an electrical engineer, rating P-2, \$2000 per annum from July 1st, 1940 to February 23rd, 1942, on which date he was discharged after investigation by the A.C. of S, G-2, disclosed BARR to be an active Communist. K-1 ID stated BARR was definitely not eligible for rehire, and definitely was not believed to be loyal to the United States. BARR's name appeared on a list of undesirable employees received by the Intelligence Office, SCGSA, from Post Intelligence Office, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. BARR was definitely not recommended for a position of trust and confidence and was a close associate of one [REDACTED] member of the Communist Party in the 9th Assembly District, 16th Election District, New York City in 1936, and who was also discharged from SCGSA on June 12, 1941. The report stated that as of July 2, 1947, the BANK OF COMMERCE, 56 East 42nd Street, New York, New York, advised that since 1941, BARR had been extended credit in sums as high as three figures, secured by co-makers.

As of September 2, 1947, the records of the NATIONAL BANK OF NEW YORK, 96th Street and Broadway, New York, New York, reflected BARR has a special checking account there #5103 opened on April 6, 1944, with an initial deposit of \$100. He was not well known by the bank credit personnel.

On September 2, 1947, Miss I. COLITTI, secretary to the treasurer, DOLSON & COMPANY, 241 West 72nd Street, New York, New York, advised her records showed BARR rented an apartment at 241 West 97th Street. This building was owned by the instant firm, and Miss COLITTI had no personal knowledge of BARR.

On July 15, 1947, R.J. SCHEKARZ, one of BARR's references, advised that he had known BARR socially and in business since September, 1945, but that his acquaintance was too slight to be of any assistance to the investigator. He added BARR was his student in a graduate course in electrical engineering at Columbia, and he had seen BARR only twice since June, 1946, when BARR received his degree.

On July 17, 1947, JOHN E. MELVILLE, project engineer, 531 West 211th Street, New York City, one of BARR's references, advised he had known BARR for four years. He considered BARR of good reputation, and believed he was entirely loyal to the United States.

On July 3rd, 1947, Dr. PAGAZINI, assistant professor of electrical engineering, Columbia University, New York City, advised he had known BARR for approximately one year and considered him loyal to the United States and would recommend him for a position of responsibility.

On July 3rd, 1947, Mr. FRED FATH, building superintendent, 241 West 97th Street, New York City, where BARR resides, stated that as far as he knows, BARR was honest, dependable and trustworthy. He added BARR did not mix with the other tenants in the large apartment house at this address and was very individualistic. He stated he would recommend BARR for a position of confidence.

On July 3rd, 1947, a neighborhood check at 241 West 97th Street, revealed four other neighbors of BARR had never heard of him.

On September 17th, 1947, Mrs. ANNA DAUKENTAS, landlady of the house located at 85 Bristol Street, Brooklyn, New York, where BARR

lived from 1941 to 1943, stated BARR did reside there, but she only knew him casually.

She stated the entire BARR family were all Communists and very active in Communist activity; that BARR and his family often participated in Communist rallies; that the neighborhood was full of Communist sympathizers, and that the circulation of Communist pamphlets in the neighborhood was very common. [REDACTED] added BARR was not loyal to the United States, and she definitely would not recommend him for any position requiring trust and confidence. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C)

She concluded by stating that she had often heard JOEL BARR and members of his family speak openly against the United States Government, and that BARR's father was discharged from his job as an insurance collector because he "stole his clients' premiums instead of turning them into the firm."

Confidential Source A

The report stated the records of the confidential agency (G-2, 1st Army, Governors Island) revealed BARR had been discharged with prejudice per Act of Public 671, 76th Congress of the United States, from the Signal Corps Laboratories, Belmar, New Jersey, in 1942.

Continuing, the report stated that on July 3, 1947, a check of the records on file, the confidential agency (FBI, New York) revealed that JOEL BARR, born January 1, 1916 at Brooklyn, New York, had been transferred from Branch 16-B of the Industrial Division of the Communist Party to Community Clubs, 9th A.D. Section of the Communist Party of Manhattan, 9th A. D. Club.

It should be stated here that the above information which came from this office was obtained on 3/15/44 from a highly confidential source having access to the headquarters of the New York County Committee of the Communist Party, 147 Fourth Avenue, New York City.

Continuing, the report stated that on June 26, 1947, the records of a confidential agency (identified at the end of the report as U.S. Civil

The report stated the New York City Police Department and the District Intelligence Office, 3rd Naval District, Brooklyn, New York, had no record of JOEL BARR.

The attention of offices receiving copies of this letter is called to the Bureau's instructions that this case receive intensive investigation. The attention of the New York Office, in particular, is directed to the leads for it to furnish Albany with all information available to that office concerning the Subject, as well as concerning MAX ELITCHER and JULIUS ROSENBERG. In that regard the attention of the New York Office is called to the report of SA JOHN E. LEE made 1-30-50 at Newark in the case entitled, "JOEL BARR - ESPIONAGE - R", New York file 65-14872, in which a thorough review of SARANT's personnel record at the Western Electric Company, Kearny, New Jersey, is set out. If the material concerning SARANT in New York file does not include interviews of his references listed in Western Electric Company records, appropriate neighborhood inquiry, as well as inquiries of ONI and G2, should be conducted by the New York Office.

All offices receiving copies of this letter are requested to afford leads set out foregoing and expeditious coverage, and to advise Albany of the results by summary teletype, followed as soon thereafter as possible by complete investigative report.

Personal History

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, made available the following background information concerning Subject, appearing in the Western Electric Company files in Kearny, New Jersey:

Subject was born September 26, 1918 in New York City. He attended Arner Street School, Freeport, New York, September 1924 to June 1932; Hempstead High School, Hempstead, New York, September 1932 to June 1936; Cooper Union, New York City, September 1936 to June 1941; Stevens Institute of Technology, Hoboken, New Jersey, September 1941 to December 1941. SUBJECT holds a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering Degree.

ADMIN.

SARANT was hired by the Western Electric Company on June 16, 1941, and resigned September 20, 1941 "in order to pursue laboratory work". He was re-hired September 30, 1942, was transferred to the Bell Telephone Laboratories, West Street, New York City, on October 15, 1945; resigned that position on September 11, 1946 to enter the teaching profession. At that time he gave his address as 422 Eddy Street, Ithaca, New York. At the time of his employment, SARANT stated he was not married.

Previous employments listed on SARANT's 1942 application filed with the Western Electric Company are:

Allen Berg (Florist, as greenhouse attendant, Hempstead Avenue, Hempstead, New York, from May to September 1939, leaving to attend school;

Universal Form Clamp Company, 161 Park Avenue, New York City, as engineering assistant, doing drafting and concrete form calculation for a Mr. E. KORTHIGER, dates not given, leaving to attend school.

On this first application SARANT stated that he had had his own work shop, and since the age of 12 years, had designed and constructed many electrical devices, such as circuit breakers, string oscillograph, and thermo coupler meter. In high school he claimed to have constructed such items as a test coil, an automatic spot welder, and a small synchronous motor.

On his application for re-employment in 1942 filed with the Western Electric Company, SARANT listed the Signal Corps Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, as an employer from September 22, 1941 to September 5, 1942, doing research and development work on signal equipment, under L. F. CATTANI, supervisor.

On his two applications filed with the Western Electric Company, SARANT gave the following references:

Hanover, New Hampshire.

His file reflects that he was recommended to C. H. STELLING, Employment Manager, Kearny Works, Western Electric Company, by one OTTO CARPENTER, having been referred to CARPENTER by a Mr. WATERS of the Bell Telephone Laboratories.

The Western Electric Company files reveal that SARANT had the following relatives:

Father, NONDA GEORGE SARANT, born Greece, naturalized citizen;
mother, PHILOMEL CRISANTHOS, born in Greece and naturalized by marriage;
brothers, GEORGE, RAYMOND, WILLIAM, and RICHARD, all born United States; sister,
ELECTRA MARIE, born United States.

At Western Electric Company SARANT worked in 1941 as a switchboard engineer, and in 1942 as an assistant engineer in Test Planning at the Bayonne Plant. In 1944 he was promoted to engineer on test planning on the fifth floor of the Eleventh Avenue plant in New York City. In December of 1945 he was transferred to the Bell Telephone Laboratories, 463 West Street, New York City.

Western Electric files contain retail credit investigation conducted on SARANT in October 1942. This indicated that his parents, born in Greece, were naturalized, had made no trips abroad, and that SARANT was bitterly opposed

to the axis nations. He was also reported as not an active church member, single with no dependents, leading a quiet home life, and living with his parents, who were well regarded.

The Western Electric files contain a letter addressed to SARANT signed by First Lieutenant JOHN T. FREEMAN, dated September 17, 1942, which advised SARANT that his services had been terminated at the Signal Corps Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, with prejudice, on September 4, 1942, for failure to comply with orders to proceed to Detroit, Michigan for temporary duty at a specified time and date. They also contain a teletypewriter reply dated October 6, 1942 from the Signal Corps answering a Western Electric message of September 30, 1942, stating, "Employment not recommended. Further information on request. Signed, Maier." On the bottom of this teletype is the following notation, "Refused to travel. Captain Wogan, Signal Corps, located at Kearny, advises okay to employ per Mr. Horton." (It should be noted that Mr. Horton was an employee of the Kearny Works at Western Electric Company at that time.)

The file also contained a letter from the Signal Corps dated October 13, 1942 addressed to Mr. C. A. JAMES at Western Electric Company, stating in part, "This man is not recommended for employment in the war effort and will not pass investigation by competent authority. It is requested that this letter be kept strictly confidential. Signed, H. E. Timmerman, Captain, Military Intelligence Post Intelligence Officer."

The Kearny files also reflect that SARANT wrote a letter to Mr. A. S. OLSON, Department 1330, Kearny, New Jersey, requesting a letter of recommendation from the Western Electric Company in order to get a Naval commission as a radar technician. He requested that the letter consist of an original and three copies, and that they be addressed to the Commandant, Third Naval District, but that they be sent to him.

The files contain a letter by W. A. HILLETT, Supervisor, Kearny Works Personnel Records, dated June 23, 1942, to the effect that SARANT worked for Western Electric Company from June 16, 1941 to September 20, 1941, as an engineer on telephone equipment, did satisfactory work, and resigned.

The file also contains a non-Communist Party and German-American Bund affidavit dated September 29, 1942, and a copy of the Espionage Act, Title 50, Chapter 4, dated September 23, 1942.

Western Electric files reflected the following residence addresses for SARANT:

23 Colony Street, West Hempstead, New York, June 1941;
105 Clinton Avenue, Newark, New Jersey, September, 1941;
84 West 33rd Street, Bayonne, New Jersey, October 28, 1942;
65 Horton Street, New York City, March 1944; and
422 Eddy Street, Ithaca, New York, September 1946.

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised that the records on SARANT, a civilian employee of the Signal Corps, Ground Signal Agency, who had been discharged with prejudice, effective September 3, 1942, could now be located at Governors Island, New York. However, this Informant stated that a card record indicated that a letter from the Intelligence Officer at the Signal Corps, General Development Laboratory, dated September 3, 1942 stated, "He was a most undesirable employee in that he is arrogant, refuses to obey orders, causes dissension and unrest among the other employees, boasted that he would receive a commission, and presided at a secret meeting of about twenty employees."

Investigation conducted by the New York Office at the Marriage License Bureau, City of New York, reflected that SARANT was married on July 3, 1945

in New York City to LOUISE J. ROSS, 60 Morton Street, New York City, who was born April 2, 1923 at New York City. The record indicated that this was the first marriage for both parties.

Inquiry at 65 Morton Street Realty Company (that address having appeared for SARANT in Western Electric Company files as of March 1944), 310 East 55th Street, New York, reflected that SARANT relinquished his apartment at 65 Morton Street as of January 26, 1950. Company files contain a communication to that effect from SARANT on a paper, whose letterhead reads, "ALFRED SARANT, General Contractor, Cayuga Heights Road, Ithaca, New York."

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, stated on June 8, 1944, that AL SARANT, 46 Monroe (?) Street, New York, was transferred in December 1943 from Branch 16B of the Industrial Division of the Communist Party to the Village Club of the 1st Assembly District Section of Manhattan, Transfer No. 12348.

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, another Government Agency which conducts security investigations, advised that no information concerning ALFRED SARANT was available.

The following investigation was conducted by SA PETER F. MAXSON:

AT ITHACA, NEW YORK

ALFRED SARANT is not listed in the current (1949) City Directory. However, he is listed in the 1947 Director as: ALFRED SARANT (LOUISE J.) - student - 422 Eddy Street. The 1948 Cornell Staff Director contained the following: A. SARANT - Electric Engineer, Laboratory of Nuclear Studies - 422 Eddy Street (5334). The 1949-50 Ithaca Telephone Directory contained the following listing: ALFRED SARANT - Cayuga Heights Road - Telephone No. 7466.

A check of the records of the Secretary's Office, the Registrar's Office and the Alumni Office, all Cornell University, indicated that SARANT was never a student or faculty member at the University. Miss A. A. KING, Secretary to the Director, Department of Physics, Cornell University, an established contact of the Albany Office, advised that SARANT was employed approximately two years ago as a Laborer and Draftsman at the Nuclear Laboratory. She said this employment was apparently terminated because SARANT wanted to become a member of the faculty although not qualified.

Mr. C. J. KEMERSON, Secretary, Ithaca Chamber of Commerce and Mayor of Cayuga Heights, advised that SARANT is unknown to him and to his office.

Miss JANE MC MULIFFE, Manager, Ithaca Credit Bureau, furnished the following information from SARANT's file at that Bureau. He owns real estate in South Lansing which adjoins the Town of Ithaca on R.D. 1, Cayuga Heights Road. He is a self-employed painter and contractor. He has an account with the Ithaca Savings Bank and he has given E. R. RUMSEY AND SONS as a business reference. He was married to LOUISE JACQUELINE ROSS, daughter of VICTOR K. D. ROSS in July, 1945, has two children, and the SARANTS formerly lived with the ROSSes at 422 Eddy Street, Ithaca.

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that he had met SARANT but doesn't know his present occupation. Informant said he assumed from what SARANT's father-in-law had told him, that SARANT had become a contractor in order to save expenses in building his own house.

Dr LYMAN R. FISHER, 210 North Aurora Street, advised that SARANT, assisted by

ADEN.

one W. BRUCE DAYTON, has built two modernistic homes on the Cayuga Heights Road, town of Lansing, beyond the Ithaca town line. Dr. FISHER said he had never met SARANT but he has noticed that the SARANTs and the DAYTONs appeared to be very close friends. He explained that the DAYTON home was built first and that both families resided in this house while the second was under construction.

These two residences were observed and were noted to be located on the right side of Cayuga Heights Road in the Town of Lansing, approximately one and one-half miles beyond the Ithaca city line. They are ultramodern in construction, about fifty feet apart, set back about sixty yards from the highway, and neither appears to be completely finished.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, advised that the S.R.A.N.Ts have lived at the present address from six to seven months; that they appear to be very closely acquainted with the DAYTON family, and that SARANT received an extraordinary amount of mail.

Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised on April 11, 1950 that SARANT was Treasurer of the Wallace for President Committee, as of May 22, 1948, resigning on August 4, 1948, and being succeeded by SARAH GINSBERG, 120 Blair Street, Ithaca.

This informant furnished a photostatic copy of an undated photograph and an article which appeared in the Binghamton, New York Press Newspaper during the 1948 Presidential Election Campaign. The article pointed out that JOHN SARANT, Electrical Engineer from Cornell University, was a speaker at a Triple Cities Wallace for President Committee meeting. The article includes a picture of SARANT in a group photograph of persons at the meeting. Inasmuch as Cornell University files reflect no present or former staff or faculty member named JOHN SARANT, this individual is believed to be identical with the subject.

Confidential Informant T-10, of known reliability, advised that he is personally acquainted with SARANT, who is self-employed as a painting contractor in Ithaca, and who has been so employed since about the first of the year. Informant stated that SARANT employs two men, and reportedly has an interest in La Rock's Paint and Wall Paper Company, 537 West State Street, Ithaca, New York. Informant said that he has seen some of SARANT's work, and that it is highly satisfactory. He added that SARANT is mechanically very gifted, and that his new home, which he constructed himself, is a showpiece. According to the informant, SARANT told him that SARANT's

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father is quite well-to-do, and that his brother has one of the largest Ford agencies in Long Island. The informant advised that SARANT has little money, and that his home and property are mortgaged to the limit. He said that SARANT has two children, both quite young, and he has impressed the informant as a respectable individual. SARANT also told informant that he intended to remain in Ithaca and hopes to gradually increase his contracting business.

Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, advised that SARANT is now engaged in a contract to paint the premises at 112 Cascadilla Street, Ithaca, New York, a job which will take at least three weeks. Informant also advised that SARANT told him he has another job of approximately the same length lined up after he finishes this one.

Confidential Informants T-12 and T-13, both of known reliability, who are Communist Party members with an extensive knowledge of Communist activities in the Ithaca, New York area, have advised that SARANT is unknown to them.

Confidential Informant T-14, of known reliability, advised that on March 5, 1950, SARANT sent telegrams to United States Senators IRVING IVES and HERBERT LEHMAN containing the following message: "Urge you work for defeat of the Mundt Bill which would destroy freedom while claiming to protect it."

He now resides next door to the subject on Cayuga Heights Road.

Dr. BERNARD PETERS, INTERNAL SECURITY - R" (Bureau File 100-190625) resides at 172 Salina Street, Rochester, New York, and is employed as Assistant Professor of Physics, University of Rochester.

It is to be noted that Confidential Informant T-8 has advised that the DAYTONs have lived at that address from nine to ten months and appear to be very friendly with the SARANT family.



Personal History

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, made available the following background information concerning Subject, appearing in the Western Electric Company files in Kearny, New Jersey:

Subject was born September 26, 1918 in New York City. He attended Arner Street School, Freeport, New York, September 1924 to June 1932; Hempstead High School, Hempstead, New York, September 1932 to June 1936; Cooper Union, New York City, September 1936 to June 1941; Stevens Institute of Technology, Hoboken, New Jersey, September 1941 to December 1941. SALANT holds a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering Degree.

SARANT was hired by the Western Electric Company on June 16, 1941, and resigned September 20, 1941 "in order to pursue laboratory work". He was re-hired September 30, 1942, was transferred to the Bell Telephone Laboratories, West Street, New York City, on October 15, 1945; resigned that position on September 11, 1946 to enter the teaching profession. At that time he gave his address as 422 Eddy Street, Yonkers, New York. At the time of his employment, SARANT stated he was not married.

Previous employments listed on SARANT's first application filed with the Western Electric Company are:

Allen Berg (Florist, as greenhouse attendant, Hempstead Avenue, Hempstead, New York, from May to September 1939, leaving to attend school;

Universal Form Clamp Company, 101 Park Avenue, New York City, as engineering assistant, doing drafting and concrete form calculation for a Mr. E. BOETHIGER, dates not given, leaving to attend school.

On this first application SARANT stated that he had had his own work shop, and since the age of 12 years, had designed and constructed many electrical devices, such as circuit breakers, string oscillograph, and thermo coupler meter. In high school he claimed to have constructed such items as a test coil, an automatic spot welder, and a small synchronous motor.

On his application for re-employment in 1942 filed with the Western Electric Company, SARANT listed the Signal Corps Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, as an employer from September 22, 1941 to September 5, 1942, doing research and development work on signal equipment, under L. P. CATTAN, supervisor.

On his two applications filed with the Western Electric Company, SARANT gave the following references:

His file reflects that he was recommended to C. H. STELLING, Employment Manager, Kearny Works, Western Electric Company, by one OTTO CARPENTER, having been referred to CARPENTER by a Mr. WATERS of the Bell Telephone Laboratories.

The Western Electric Company files reveal that SARANT had the following relatives:

Father, FONDA GEORGE SARANT, born Greece, naturalized citizen; mother, PHILOMEL CRISANTHOS, born in Greece and naturalized by marriage; brothers, GEORGE, RAYMOND, WILLIAM, and RICHARD, all born United States; sister, ELECTRA MARIE, born United States.

At Western Electric Company SARANT worked in 1941 as a switchboard engineer, and in 1942 as an assistant engineer in Test Planning at the Bayonne Plant. In 1944 he was promoted to engineer on test planning on the fifth floor of the Eleventh Avenue plant in New York City. In December of 1945 he was transferred to the Bell Telephone Laboratories, 463 West Street, New York City.

Western Electric files contain retail credit investigation conducted on SARANT in October 1942. This indicated that his parents, born in Greece, were naturalized, had made no trips abroad, and that SARANT was bitterly opposed

to the axis nations. He was also reported as not an active church member, single with no dependents, leading a quiet home life, and living with his parents, who were well regarded.

The Western Electric files contain a letter addressed to SARANT signed by First Lieutenant JOHN T. FREEMAN, dated September 17, 1942, which advised SARANT that his services had been terminated at the Signal Corps Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, with prejudice, on September 4, 1942, for failure to comply with orders to proceed to Detroit, Michigan for temporary duty at a specified time and date. They also contain a teletypewriter reply dated October 6, 1942 from the Signal Corps answering a Western Electric message of September 30, 1942, stating, "Employment not recommended. Further information on request. Signed, Maier." On the bottom of this teletype is the following notation, "Refused to travel. Captain Wogan, Signal Corps, located at Kearny, advises okay to employ per Mr. Horton." (It should be noted that Mr. Horton was an employee of the Kearny Works at Western Electric Company at that time.)

The file also contained a letter from the Signal Corps dated October 13, 1942 addressed to Mr. C. A. JAMES at Western Electric Company, stating in part, "This man is not recommended for employment in the war effort and will not pass investigation by competent authority. It is requested that this letter be kept strictly confidential. Signed, H. E. Timmerman, Captain, Military Intelligence Post Intelligence Officer."

The Kearny files also reflect that SARANT wrote a letter to Mr. A. S. OLSON, Department 1330, Kearny, New Jersey, requesting a letter of recommendation from the Western Electric Company in order to get a Naval commission as a radar technician. He requested that the letter consist of an original and three copies, and that they be addressed to the Commandant, Third Naval District, but that they be sent to him.

The files contain a letter by W. A. MILLETT, Supervisor, Kearny Works Personnel Records, dated June 23, 1942, to the effect that SARANT worked for Western Electric Company from June 16, 1941 to September 20, 1941, as an engineer on telephone equipment, did satisfactory work, and resigned.

The file also contains a non-Communist Party and German-American Bund affidavit dated September 29, 1942, and a copy of the Espionage Act, Title 50, Chapter 4, dated September 23, 1942.

Western Electric files reflected the following residence addresses for SARANT:

23 Colony Street, West Hempstead, New York, June 1941;
105 Clinton Avenue, Newark, New Jersey, September, 1941;
84 West 33rd Street, Bayonne, New Jersey, October 28, 1942;
65 Horton Street, New York City, March 1944; and
422 Eddy Street, Ithaca, New York, September 1946.

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised that the records on SARANT, a civilian employee of the Signal Corps, Ground Signal Agency, who had been discharged with prejudice, effective September 3, 1942, could now be located at Governors Island, New York. However, this Informant stated that a card record indicated that a letter from the Intelligence Officer at the Signal Corps, General Development Laboratory, dated September 3, 1942 stated, "He was a most undesirable employee in that he is arrogant, refuses to obey orders, causes dissension and unrest among the other employees, boasted that he would receive a commission, and presided at a secret meeting of about twenty employees."

Investigation conducted by the New York Office at the Marriage License Bureau, City of New York, reflected that SARANT was married on July 3, 1945

in New York City to LOUISE J. ROSS, 60 Morton Street, New York City, who was born April 2, 1923 at New York City. The record indicated that this was the first marriage for both parties.

Inquiry at 65 Morton Street Realty Company (that address having appeared for SARANT in Western Electric Company files as of March 1944), 310 East 55th Street, New York, reflected that SARANT relinquished his apartment at 65 Morton Street as of January 26, 1950. Company files contain a communication to that effect from SARANT on a paper, whose letterhead reads, "ALFRED SARANT, General Contractor, Cayuga Heights Road, Ithaca, New York."

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, stated on June 8, 1944, that AL SARANT, 46 Monroe (?) Street, New York, was transferred in December 1943 from Branch 16B of the Industrial Division of the Communist Party to the Village Club of the 1st Assembly District Section of Manhattan, Transfer No. 12348.

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, another Government Agency which conducts security investigations, advised that no information concerning ALFRED SARANT was available.

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The following investigation was conducted by SA PETER F. MAXSON;

AT ITHACA, NEW YORK

ALFRED SARANT is not listed in the current (1949) City Directory. However, he is listed in the 1947 Director as: ALFRED SARANT (LOUISE J.) - student - 422 Eddy Street. The 1948 Cornell Staff Director contained the following: A. SARANT - Electric Engineer, Laboratory of Nuclear Studies - 422 Eddy Street (5334). The 1949-50 Ithaca Telephone Directory contained the following listing: ALFRED SARANT - Cayuga Heights Road - Telephone No. 7466.

A check of the records of the Secretary's Office, the Registrar's Office and the Alumni Office, all Cornell University, indicated that SARANT was never a student or faculty member at the University. Miss A. A. KING, Secretary to the Director, Department of Physics, Cornell University, an established contact of the Albany Office, advised that SARANT was employed approximately two years ago as a Laborer and Draftsman at the Nuclear Laboratory. She said this employment was apparently terminated because SARANT wanted to become a member of the faculty although not qualified.

Mr. C. J. KEMERSON, Secretary, Ithaca Chamber of Commerce and Mayor of Cayuga Heights, advised that SARANT is unknown to him and to his office.

Miss JANE MC MULIFFE, Manager, Ithaca Credit Bureau, furnished the following information from SARANT's file at that Bureau. He owns real estate in South Lansing which adjoins the Town of Ithaca on R.D. 1, Cayuga Heights Road. He is a self-employed painter and contractor. He has an account with the Ithaca Savings Bank and he has given E. H. RUMSEY AND SONS as a business reference. He was married to LOUISE JACQUELINE ROSS, daughter of VICTOR K. D. ROSS in July, 1945, has two children, and the SARANTS formerly lived with the ROSSes at 422 Eddy Street, Ithaca.

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that he had met SARANT but doesn't know his present occupation. Informant said he assumed from what SARANT's father-in-law had told him, that SARANT had become a contractor in order to save expenses in building his own house.

Dr. LYMAN R. FISHER, 210 North Aurora Street, advised that SARANT, assisted by

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one ~~W~~ BRUCE DAYTON, has built two modernistic homes on the Cayuga Heights Road, Town of Lansing, beyond the Ithaca town line. Dr. FISHER said he had never met SARANT but he has noticed that the SARANTs and the DAYTONs appeared to be very close friends. He explained that the DAYTON home was built first and that both families resided in this house while the second was under construction.

These two residences were observed and were noted to be located on the right side of Cayuga Heights Road in the Town of Lansing, approximately one and one-half miles beyond the Ithaca city line. They are ultramodern in construction, about fifty feet apart, set back about sixty yards from the highway, and neither appears to be completely finished.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, advised that the SARANTs have lived at the present address from six to seven months; that they appear to be very closely acquainted with the DAYTON family, and that SARANT received an extraordinary amount of mail.

Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised on April 11, 1950 that SARANT was Treasurer of the Wallace for President Committee, as of May 22, 1948, resigning on August 4, 1948, and being succeeded by SARAH GINSBERG, 129 Blair Street, Ithaca.

This informant furnished a photostatic copy of an undated photograph and an article which appeared in the Binghamton, New York Press Newspaper during the 1948 Presidential Election Campaign. The article pointed out that JOHN SARANT, Electrical Engineer from Cornell University, was a speaker at a Triple Cities Wallace for President Committee meeting. The article includes a picture of SARANT in a group photograph of persons at the meeting. Inasmuch as Cornell University files reflect no present or former staff or faculty member named JOHN SARANT, this individual is believed to be identical with the subject.

Confidential Informant T-10, of known reliability, advised that he is personally acquainted with SARANT, who is self-employed as a painting contractor in Ithaca, and who has been so employed since about the first of the year. Informant stated that SARANT employs two men, and reportedly has an interest in La Rock's Paint and Wall Paper Company, 537 West State Street, Ithaca, New York. Informant said that he has seen some of SARANT's work, and that it is highly satisfactory. He added that SARANT is mechanically very gifted, and that his new home, which he constructed himself, is a showpiece. According to the informant, SARANT told him that SARANT's

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father is quite well-to-do, and that his brother has one of the largest Ford Agencies in Long Island. The informant advised that SARANT has little money, and that his home and property are mortgaged to the limit. He said that SARANT has two children, both quite young, and he has impressed the informant as a respectable individual. SARANT also told informant that he intended to remain in Ithaca and hopes to gradually increase his contracting business.

Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, advised that SARANT is now engaged in a contract to paint the premises at 112 Cascadilla Street, Ithaca, New York, a job which will take at least three weeks. Informant also advised that SARANT told him he has another job of approximately the same length lined up after he finishes this one.

Confidential Informants T-12 and T-13, both of known reliability, who are Communist Party members with an extensive knowledge of Communist activities in the Ithaca, New York area, have advised that SARANT is unknown to them.

Confidential Informant T-14, of known reliability, advised that on March 5, 1950, SARANT sent telegrams to United States Senators IRVING IVES and HERBERT LEHMAN containing the following message: "Urge you work for defeat of the Mundt Bill which would destroy freedom while claiming to protect it"

Confidential Informant T-15, of known reliability advised that SARANT has received the following mail during the period, April 5, 1950 to date:

MORSE, a student at Cornell University, as the occupant of the apartment
at this address. The files of the Registrar's Office, Cornell University,
reflect that MORSE is in the School of Electrical Engineering, Class of
1952. He was born September 24, 1922 at Stamford, Connecticut, entered
Cornell in the Fall of 1940, from Phillips Academy, Andover, Massachusetts,
and he was on leave of absence from the University from September, 1942 to
June, 1943. His file contained no derogatory information. The files of
the Albany Office contained no record on MORSE.

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Investigation has further determined that 103 McGraw Place, Ithaca, is the address of Water Margin, Inc., a fraternal organization affiliated with Cornell University.---This fraternity is said to be constantly expounding the cause of equal rights and to oppose racial discrimination, but nothing of a derogatory nature is known concerning it.

She stated that prior to assuming his law practice, he was a salesman for a wholesale company not identified. She said that in 1945 ROSS was a candidate for County Judge on the American Labor Party ticket.

Confidential Informant T-7 advised that he is personally acquainted with ROSS who is not a member of the Tompkins County Bar Association because he is not well liked by many of his colleagues. This informant stated that he considers ROSS as being "somewhat of a liberal", a term which he did not define further, and added that to his knowledge, ROSS has never been suspected of any Communist Activities.

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resides at 1833 Los Robles Boulevard, Sacramento, California. DAYTON's employment record is as follows:

Physics Department, University of California, as Teaching Assistant, 1941.

Degaussing Project, U.S. Navy, San Francisco, California, as Research Physicist, 1941-1944.

Rocket Project (OSRD), California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, California, as Research Physicist, 1944-1945.

DAYTON has been employed as a Research Assistant at the Laboratory of Nuclear Studies, Physics Department, Cornell University, Since March 1, 1946. He formerly resided at 404 Panoramic Way, Berkeley, California, according to the files of the Ithaca Credit Bureau, and in Ithaca, he first resided at 805 South Plain Street. He now resides next door to the subject on Cayuga Heights Road.

The Albany Files reflect that DAYTON has been a frequent contact of Dr. BERNARD PETERS. PETERS, the subject of the case entitled "BERNARD PIETROWSKI, wa. Dr. BERNARD PETERS, INTERNAL SECURITY - R" (Bureau File 100-190625) resides at 172 Salina Street, Rochester, New York, and is employed as Assistant Professor of Physics, University of Rochester.

Confidential Informant T-17, of known reliability, reported that on June 19, 1949, PETERS visited the home of DAYTON, R.F.D. 1, Cayuga Heights Road, Lansing, New York. It is to be noted that Confidential Informant T-8 has advised that the DAYTONs have lived at that address from nine to ten months and appear to be very friendly with the SARANT family.

Albany CI T-9 advised on April 11, 1950 that he had learned that DAYTON was President of the Central Labor Union and a delegate from the Cornell University Group of the Teachers' Union to the Central Labor Union. The informant also advised that DAYTON was reported to be a stooge of PHILIP MORRISON, Cornell University nuclear scientist.

EDGAR HOOVER criticizing the newspaper for publishing an advertisement by this committee and attacking our committee for stating, 'The F.B.I. agent JOHN HARRINGTON admitted on Dec 1, 1952, that he helped an important witness in the case to lie under oath.'

"Mr. HOOVER admits and the trial record shows that Mr. HARRINGTON sat passively by while the photographer SCHNEIDER on direct and on cross examination stated that he had never seen the ROSENBERGs from the middle of June 1950 until Mar. 27, 1951. The affidavit Mr. HOOVER refers to proves that Mr. HARRINGTON brought a witness into court for the purpose of identifying the defendants on the previous day; it proves that Mr. HARRINGTON made no attempt to offer any correction of the testimony, in spite of the fact that such testimony, as it stood, was damaging to the defendants. It is the duty of the public servants in the Department of Justice to see that justice is done; it is criminal to allow a witness to perjure himself.

"The Supreme Court, not J. EDGAR HOOVER, will decide whether the statement is a prostitution of the truth. As a matter of fact, one of the chief bases for appeal is that the prosecution knowingly used false testimony to bring about the conviction of the ROSENBERGs. Whether Mr. HARRINGTON acted with malicious intent is irrelevant; the fact remains that two people's lives were at stake.

On April 1, 1953, the Newark Office of the F.B.I. received a letter from Newark Confidential Informant [REDACTED] who advised he had received a mimeographed sheet dated March 17, 1953, from LEONARD TUSHNET, M.D., Chairman, New Jersey Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs, alleging no higher court had reviewed the facts of the ROSENBERG case. Also received by [REDACTED] was a leaflet entitled "The Rosenberg Case" published by the New Jersey Committee for Clemency for [REDACTED]


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the ROSENBERGs, 572 Prospect Street, Maplewood, New Jersey, stating in part the appeal to the Supreme Court is based partially upon the prosecuting authorities knowingly used false testimony to bring about their conviction, in December, 1952, as FBI Agent JOHN A. HARRINGTON admitted in a sworn affidavit that a Government witness had committed perjury in court with the knowledge of the FBI.

The January 23, 1953 issue of the "Jewish News", Newark, New Jersey, contained a whole-page advertisement on page 14, published for the New Jersey Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs, 572 Prospect Street, Maplewood, New Jersey. In the same issue, on page 4, an editorial was printed "Fraudulent Propaganda" relating in substance the "Jewish News" published the ad paid for by the New Jersey Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs and editorially reflected some well-meaning people sincerely believed that the sentence in the ROSENBERG case was too harsh but that the ROSENBERG case had become a major tool of the kremlin in its "Hate America Campaign."



The February 13, 1953, issue of the "Newark Evening News", a Newark, New Jersey newspaper, page 2, contained an article reflecting Dr. LEONARD TUSHNET, of Irvington, New Jersey, Chairman of the New Jersey Committee for the Rosenbergs, reported some activities of his committee, including the planned renewal of the vigil at the White House announced at a February 12, 1953 meeting of the Committee at 516 Clinton Avenue, Newark, N.J. TUSHNET further announced distribution of literature by members and the formation of a fund-raising committee.

Attached is a two-page summary of a speech given by Mr. O. JOHN ROGGE, former Special Assistant to the Attorney General, on April 27, 1947, at Columbus, Ohio.

ROGGE's speech was sponsored by the Columbus Council for Democracy. The summary was furnished this office by Major TAYLOR C. T. HAYES, C.I.C., Second Army, Fort Hayes, Columbus, Ohio.

It will be noted that ROGGE allegedly stated that he was not a Communist, but that he opposed aid to Greece and Turkey; further, he stated that HENRY WALLACE had done some of his best work recently, and was doing a good service to democracy by his trip to Europe; also that the civil liberties of GERHARD EISLER have been shamefully violated. In addition, he allegedly referred to himself as an "appeaser."

The Columbus Council For Democracy held a meeting on 22 April, at 2000 hours, at the YMCA Auditorium, South Fifth Street, Columbus, Ohio. The speaker was O. John ROGGE, Special Assistant to the United States District Attorney and Chief Prosecutor at the Sedition trial of Wm. Dudley Pelley, George Sylvester Viereck, etc.

ROGGE chose for his subject, Sedition and Conspiracy in the United States. His first statement was, "If I should confine my talk strictly to my subject, the talk would be extremely brief since, under the Supreme Court regulations, it is almost impossible for a man to be guilty of sedition in this country". He told of his fight against Fascism during the last four years and explained how the chief Nazi Confidential Agent, George VIEREK, had been able, with the help of Senator Lundeen of Minnesota, to spread Nazi propaganda in this country. He added that the Franking privilege had been abused greatly by Lundeen and many other government officials in their efforts to aid VIEREK in his campaign of hate in the United States. Twenty-four United States Senators aided VIEREK in his work. Four of them undoubtedly knew what they were doing and the remaining twenty helped, either unknowingly or otherwise. It is not definitely known that these Senators deliberately aided the Fascist cause but it has been proved that they assisted VIEREK and his Nazi crowd, either directly or indirectly. ROGGE stated that he was told by Attorney General Tom Clark that his report on Fascist Penetration into the United States would be made public but that when the report was completed, the Attorney General ruled that it should be considered confidential information and should be filed in the Department of Justice files. His point was that this report would definitely embarrass many of the United States Senators and this is not good policy since the Department of Justice must look to the Senate for appropriations with which to operate. ROGGE stated that this information should be made public in order that the people will know what type of men represent them in Washington and so the voters will know for whom to vote. Incidentally, he said, many of these guilty government officials were returned to their high positions at the last election because this information was withheld from the people and they did not realize for what type of men they were voting.

ROGGE stated that he was not a Communist but that he opposes the proposed aid to Greece and Turkey. It is nothing but power politics, and is not proposed for humanitarian reasons but with an eye on the oil fields of the Middle East. He believes that we have nothing to fear from the Communists in this country but that the present witchhunt is a smokescreen to divert the minds of the people away from the anti-labor legislation and other nefarious doings of the legislators in Washington. He believes that Henry WALLACE has done some of his best work recently and is doing a good service to democracy, by his trip to Europe. He believes that the Civil Liberties of Gerhart EISLER were shamefully violated in the recent trial. Our government allowed and even abetted the abuse of civil liberties by the Fascists during the last war and ROGGE can not understand why the civil liberties of the Communists and other minority groups must be curbed at present. He stated that he had been asked to represent Gerhart EISLER in his recent trial but that he had refused, due

to the fact that he knew he would be branded a Communist and it would injure his reputation as an attorney. He referred to himself as an "appeaser" and stated that if he had the courage of Henry WALLACE, he would have taken this case.

ROKE stated that most Fascists are frustrated and in many cases they turn to Fascism because they are not able to "make the grade" in a normal society. He believes that this Fascist threat to our country can be eliminated only through education and Psychiatry. Most of the Fascists are mentally immature and need to be psychoanalyzed. He named the Ku Klux Klan, The Columbians, and the recent Fascist coup in Georgia, as good examples of the extent to which this Fascist ideology has taken root in our midst.

This meeting was attended by approximately 125 persons. Many of them were colored. More than one half of the audience consisted of middle aged, or older, people and the remainder was the usual group of young people. Several members of the American Veterans Committee were present and many familiar "liberal" faces were observed.

The attached pamphlets were made available to all in attendance and a general invitation to join the organization was extended. The audience apparently agreed wholeheartedly with the speaker's views. The applause was noted when Henry WALLACE was mentioned favorably and also when the civil liberties of the Communists and other minority groups were commented on by the speaker. The applause at the conclusion of the speech was long and loud.

3. On 27 September 1951, a discreet check at the Pension Wienerheim revealed that SUBJECT was registered at that Hotel from 21 July 1951 to 15 September 1951. While residing there, SUBJECT let it be known that he had come to Vienna from Paris to enter the Academy of Music and Dramatic Art in Vienna. SUBJECT remained in his room most of the time and he did not associate with other tenants. When he left the Hotel, he usually went to the American Express Company for mail or to the US Consulate where he was making arrangements to enter school. SUBJECT received only one guest, (fnu) [REDACTED] a colored US student, while he resided in the pension. SUBJECT played the piano for four or five hours each day and mentioned that he wanted to continue his piano training in Vienna. (AGENT'S NOTE: The photograph of Joel BARR was shown to the chamber maid and she stated that she had never seen BARR in the pension) (F-6)

4. A check with [REDACTED] b7D revealed that [REDACTED] is a colored student who studies music in the Academy of Music and Dramatic Art, Vienna III, Lothringerstrasse 18. [REDACTED] is studying under the GI Bill of Rights and has been in Vienna for about one year. [REDACTED] came to Vienna from Paris where he also studied music. (B-2)

5. On 28 September 1951, a check of the files of the Vienna Central Police Registry revealed the following registration for [REDACTED]

6. On 28 September 1951, a check of the files of the Veterans Administration, US Consulate, Vienna, revealed that SUBJECT had inquired about entering the Vienna Academy of Music and Dramatic Art. He had expressed a desire to continue his piano studies in Vienna rather than Paris because the cost of living in Vienna was much lower. SUBJECT stated that he had been studying at the Ecole Normale Music School in Paris for two years under the GI Bill, [REDACTED]. He also stated that he was making arrangements to transfer from the Paris School to the Music Academy in Vienna.

These files also revealed that [REDACTED] is studying at the Vienna Academy of Music and Dramatic Art under the GI Bill of Rights. [REDACTED] entered that school on 1 October 1950 to study voice. He is regarded as an outstanding student and is highly praised by the Austrian instructors in the academy. [REDACTED]'s GI Bill claim No. is [REDACTED] and his US address is listed as [REDACTED] (B-2)

7. On 28 September 1951, the files of the Passport Section, US Consulate, revealed that SUBJECT renewed his passport on 16 August 1951, valid until 16 August 1953. His passport, No. [REDACTED] was issued in New York City on 24 August 1949. He listed his US address as [REDACTED]

These records also revealed that SUBJECT was issued Gray Pass No. [REDACTED] on 17 August 1951, valid for three months. This Pass was valid only for travel between Inns, Austria, and Vienna. (B-2)

8. On 1 October 1951, Dr. Eva WINTER, Secretary for Foreign Students, Vienna Academy of Music and Dramatic Art, Vienna III, Lothringerstrasse 18, was interviewed under a pretense. During the interview Source gave information on numerous students of the academy, two of which were SUBJECT and [REDACTED]. Source said that SUBJECT had been to see her twice for information about entering the academy. He stated that he wanted to enter the semester starting on 1 October 1951. He stated that he had previously studied at the Ecole Normale Music School in Paris. SUBJECT said that he would take the entrance examination, but as yet has not complied. Source said that US students may take the entrance examination anytime during the semester and that SUBJECT will probably return to the academy later in October.

Source stated that [REDACTED] was considered to be an outstanding student and was highly praised by his instructors. [REDACTED] has a

very good reputation and makes every effort to prove that the American negro has an equal chance to succeed both in Europe and in the United States. Source said that [REDACTED] never took part in political discussions that arose during school gatherings and everyone believes that he is a good American citizen. Source said that [REDACTED] entered the academy on 1 October 1950; he formerly studied at the Ecole Normale Music School in Paris. (C-2)

9. On 28 September 1951, the files of the following agencies were examined concerning SUBJECT, Joel BARR and [REDACTED], with negative results:

CONCLUSIONS:

Investigation revealed that SUBJECT came to Vienna to make arrangements to enter the Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts. It could not be determined if he met Joel BARR, but a check of all available Austrian and USFA agency files failed to reveal any registration for BARR in Vienna. SUBJECT associated with [REDACTED] colored US student, and probably knew [REDACTED] from Paris where they both attended the Ecole Normale Music School. SUBJECT made arrangements to enter the Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts, but as yet has not returned to take the entrance examination.
