The indices also reflect that one HAROLL SHEVERS, President or Treasurer of this firm was a contact of LILY STEIN in the investigation of the INCASE.

The indices also reflect that JULIUS TREUMAN, Industrial Relations Manager, was contacted by an Agent of this Office on January 31, 1950 in a plant survey.

ECONOMIZER PRODUCTS 24 East 23rd Street New York City

The indices of this Office are negative, but it is noted that the ECONOMIZER PRODUCTS had a contract with the PITT MACHINE PRODUCTS for the manufacture of soda faucets.

The indices also reflect that in the issue of "The Willitant" for Lecember 1, 1947, an article entitled "Explains to Shapira Why 'Trojan Horse' Theory Won't Work", was written by HAROLD GOLD of New York.

The indices of the New York Office reflect that in 1944, a JACK GILL was Vice President of Local 60, Delicatessen and Countermen's Union, New York City.

SCOVILL MANUFACTURING COMPANY Chrysler Building New York HUGH McDONALD, JR.

The indices of the New York Office reflect that the name of JOSEPH BIUM, born 1903, is listed as being a member of IWO Lodge, for December 23, 1947, according to Confidential Informant ND 425.

The indices also reflect that the name of one JOSEPH BLUM, 108 Division Avenue, New York City, appeared on a Communist Party Nominating Petition, New York State, August 1946.

The indices also reflect one JOSEPH BIUM, 1451 Wilkins Avenue, Bronx, was a signer of a 1942 election petition for the Communist Party in New York State.

The indices also reflect that on November 23, 1949, JOSEPH BLUM was listed as a Representative of Local #18, Book and Magazine Guild, Greater New York CIC Council.

The indices also reflect a case file entitled, "H.NRY J. BLUM, wa, SECURITY MATTER - C". HERRY ELUM uses the alias JOSEFN BLUM. BLUM was employed by the Progressive Printing Company, 290 Pearl Street, was a member of the Queens County Communist Party Club in April, 1948, and was a member of INO Lodge 607 in July of 1949. He was born May 14, 1916 at Brooklyn and resided at 41-42 42nd Street, Sunnyside, Long Island.

The indices also reflect the name JOSEPH BIUM was an alias used by SIDNEY KRAUSS, an outstanding jewel thief.

The indices also reflect an Atomic Energy Act - Applicant investigation conducted concerning a JOSEPH BIUM who was born in Bronx, New York, March 7, 1919 and attended DeWitt Clinton High School from 1933 to 1936; College of the City of New York from 1930 to 1940, and George Washington University, Washington, D. C. from 1945 to 1948. A review of this file reflects that BLUM lived at 1829 Washington Avenue, Brooklyn during 1939 and 1940 and at 8753 Bay Parkway, Brooklyn until November of 1941, at which time he moved to Washington, D. C. and lived in Washington and Virginia until March of 1949. Investigation was conducted inasmuch as BLUM was an applicant for a position as a mathematician at the University of California, Atomic Energy Commission, Los Alamos, New Mexico. Investigation conducted in New York in this case reflected no derogatory information concerning BLUM.

These facts set forth above concerning BLUM are set forth because it is noted that JULIUS ROSENBERG is a graduate of DeWitt Clinton High School and the College of the City of New York and resided in Washington from 1940 to 1943, and it is suggested that contact made with BLUM be discreet.

It is recommended that the above named persons and companies be interviewed to determine the extent and nature of all contacts had with JULIUS ROSENBERG or the PITT MACHINE PRODUCTS CO., 370 East Houston Street, New York City.

ETHEL and JUHIUS ROUMBIRG, mentioned above, were convicted in the Federal District Court, Southern District of Now York, on March 29, 1951 on charges of espionage; on April 5, 1951 they were sentenced to death which sentence was upheld by the United States Circuit Court of Appeals on February 25, 1952. After various unsuccessful appeals they were executed on June 19, 1953.

T-3, who is in a position to suply the following information, advised that the subject was born in Geneva, Duitzerland on March 16, 1923; that her occupation is that of literary agent; that she resides at 154 East 74th Street, New York City; that her Paris address is 18 Rue Desaix, Paris 15, France; that her passport number is 71063 and that it was issued at Paris on June 23, 1949 by prefect of police.

T-3 advised on October 22, 1953 that the subject advised the French Consulate that she was leaving for France the following day and that she wanted a visa. T-3 adviced that she was told she could pick up her visa in Paris. T-3 also advised that he would contact his sources abroad regarding the subject, her husband, JRAN CLAUDE COLDER, and the APIA for fur Deer information.

T-4, who is familiar with Communist activities in New York City, advised that the subject and her husband are unknown to him.

T-5, who is in a position to sumply the following information, advised that JET CLAUDE CHERT entered on duty at the United Nations on September 16, 1950. He is employed as an Information Officer, Press Divition, Burden of Press and Publications, Department of Public Information, United Nations. His salary in this position is 27600 a year plus allowances of 2600 and his position was made permanent as of December 1, 1953.

He entered the United States with French passport number V315549, type 3(7) at Idlewild Airport, New York City on September 16, 1950. His residence address in Paris was licted as 13 Rue Desain, Paris 15, France. His birth place is shown as Geneva, Switzerland on August 19, 1922 and he is a French citizen. His wife's name and date of birth are ANKE MARIE COMMEN, nee WAL MS, born March 16, 1923. He has a son, JEAN-PIENNE, born April 3, 1940, and a daughter, SOMHE, born February 1, 1950.

His personal background data reflects that he was a member of the French Underground from 1941 through 1943; that he was a prisoner of war at Buchenwald from July, 1943 until April, 1945 and that from 1946 until 1950 he was employed by "France-Soir", a newspaper.

Information available to T-5, reflects that he listed the following as references:

ANDRE RABACHE Agency France-Presse 50 Rockefeller Center New York City

In November, 1953 T-6 advised that two United Nations Secretariat employees, whose reliability is not known, had expressed to the informant their alarm over the extent of Communist infiltration into the United Nations. Both of these em loyees claimed that HOWORIO ROIGHT of the "Languago Services Division." to be pro-Communist.

T-7 on June 7, 1950 adviced that ANDRE RABACHE was known to have sponsored around that period the admission of Communist newspaper correspondents into the Foreign Press Association of which RABACHE was at that time President.

T-7 advised on June 21, 1950 that he had been acquainted with RABACHE for several years in his capacity as head of the French Press News Agency. The informant stated that RABACHE, in his conversations, has indicated

that he is liberal in his political thinking and in fact it appears that his political ideas might be quite left of center. The informant advised that this is entirely his own opinion and that he had never received any information to indicate that RIBACHE was engaged in any activity which might be considered against the best interest of the United States.

T-5 advised that he personally knows the subject's husband and that he would not trust him on the basis of his association with anti-American Fronch Nationals, whose names he could not then recall.

T-8, T-9 and T-10, all of whom are familiar with the subject's husband in his capacity as an employee at the United Nations, adviced that they had no pertinent data or in ormation regarding the subject or her husband.

T-11 and T-12, who are mamiliar with Communist Party activities in New York City, advised that the subject and her husband are unknown to them.

The records of Immigration and Naturalization Service, New York City, were checked concerning the subject and her husband by SE FEFER C. HITESEER on February 26, 1954 and no record concerning either was found.

The records of the Bureau o Special Services and Investigation, New York City Police Department, and the records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York were checked on January 5 and 6, 1954, respectively, concerning the subject and her husband with negative results.

### Dr. Paul Rosbaud

- 1. Information dated November 1945, source un nown, described Subject as pro-American and anti-"the present regime in Russia. " Subject had a job with FIAT OMGUS, for which he had been sought out by Allied scientists in Berlin. At that time he had access to information on German scientists who had been taken to Russia.
- 2. A reliable source reported 8 March 1948 that Subject had formerly been the scientific editor for The Springer Publishing Co. in Berlin and was then editor of a new British journal of research The Pergamon Press. Subject intended to return to lerlin and Dr. GOUDSMIT, senior physicist at the Brookhaven Long Island Dational Laboratory, wished to know when Subject left for Berlin and whether this return would be permanent:
- 3. A usually reliable source reported 27 August 1948 that before and during the war Subject was head of the Scientific Publications Section of lange & Springer Company, located in what became the Soviet Sector of Berlin. As of August 1948 he had twice been back to Berlin from England, where he had emigrated at the end of the war. He has a wide general knowledge of the scientific research field and of the personalities therein. In October 1945, Subject, fearing kidnapping by the Russians, was escorted from Berlin to London with the assistance of the British.
- 4. Information dated 2 September 1948 source unidentifiable, reported that Subject in the Fall of 1945 concerning German scientists and research institutions and Russian interest therein. At that time it was stated that Subject probably had more knowledge of local (German) scientific personnel then anyone in Berlin.

even though had not had some connections with the Russians shortly after they occupied Berlin. Subject explained these connections by saying he had been afraid that two tons of heavy water then in German hands might be lost to the scientific world; therefore he informed the Russians of its existence. In addition, he gave them the names of Germans who had been connected with atomic research. He claimed that he instructed the Russians to pass this information on to the British authorities and wrote Peter-KAPITZA, a Russian physicist, to that effect, but received no answer. The report expressed the opinion that Subject was forced to cooperate with the Russians, since he was living in the Russian Sector and was under their jurisdiction.

- 5. On the other hand, in a reliable source that subject had approached the Soviet authorities about the possibility of going to Russia, and that he, RIEHL, had recommended Subject accordingly.
- 6. In correspondence with the Subject stated that upon his return to Berlin' his address would be Berlin'Steglitz, Duenther Strasse 7/1.

Subject's politics were believed to be somewhat liberal, although he was not believed to be a Communist. Further questioning resulted in a letter from the source dated June 1950, which stated that Subject was apparently a that he was a German emigrant and a that he was known to have a close relationship with Prof. Robert ROMPE, who visited him every time Subject was in Berlin; and that he had another contact in Berlin, one Ruth LANGE (see above)

10. On 22 May 1950 a usually reliable source, who had known Subject 3 reported the following:

"Subject married a Jewish woman, and refusing to be separated from her during the Nazi period, took her and their ten-year old daughter to England. He returned to Germany and during the war corresponded with his wife through neutral countries.

"About 1936 Subject joined the publishing firm of Springer as a free lance writer. After his wife left Germany, he moved in with Ruth LANGE, whose sister is Hilder BENJAMIN, an active East German Communist, and present head of the East German Ministry of Justice. Both Miss LANGE and Subject are on "thou" terms with Prof. Robert ROMPE.

"As of Mry 1950 Subject was manager of the firm Autterworth and Springer, London, and in addition, earned money by writing book reviews and articles. He was described as "a Bohemian type."


"On his visits to Berlin he was believed to move freely in the Soviet Sector. His many visits to German scientists are reasonably explained by his professional activity. In April 1950 ROMPE's office made inquiries in West Berlin for Subject's



private address in London, and was not satisfied with obtaining only his business address.

"After the war Subject let it be known that he had done a lot for the British during the war. This activity was not known to his friends during the war. There is no doubt about his strong anti-Hazi attitude."

11. Another acquaintance of Subject reported or 1950 that in his opinion, personal conversations which he had had with Subject did not show Subject to be a convinced Communist. However, he added, "Subject might be in that group of 'honest liberals' who are willing to cooperate."



- 14. In December 1952, Subject, in the course of a conversation with an Germany brought up the topic of Prof. ROMPE. He said that ROMPE was kept virtually a prisoner in East Berlin, and that ROMPE's wife was primarily to blame for the strong Communist line in the family. Subject said that he had attempted to have ROMPE visit him in West Berlin during the meeting of the German physicists there in October 1952, but that Prof. MOEGLICH, ROMPE's superior, had vetoed such a visit. Instead, MOEGLICH had offered to take Subject to ROMPE. Subject declined.
- 15. Subject said that upon his instigation the University of Manchester had some time previously invited ROMPE for a six-month lecture tour. ROMPE let the invitation go unanswered.
- 16. In the general conversation that followed Subject stated that he was anti-Communist, as he had been anti-Nazi, but that, unfortunately, even teing a liberal these days brought suspicion upon me.
- lationship, dated 10 December 1952, that he "believes that suspicions about Subject may be the result of his unpopularity in certain German circles". (Subject had had a falling out with the Springer firm over the publishing of a book.) "These suspicions are aided by the fact that his mistress, Ruth (LANGE) MENJAMIN, has a Communist sister with whom neither Subject nor, as lar as can be determined, his mistress, has any contact. Subject has never attempted to hide his relationship with Ruth (LANGE) BENJAMIN, and is open and articulate about his attachment to the ideals exemplified by British and the United States."

Gunnar Billen is certainly one of the top inorganic chemists in Bushen During World War II, he was in charge of war gas research in Sweden. With two essistants, he did as such work on war gas as was done in the US. He told we that, after the war, he compared notes with US eclentists and learned that be had even kept pace in some war gas discoveries. In August 1952, he was still working on these gases but I know no details of his work. I do know that he was giving a class on field tests for war gad. In addition to his job at the Institute, Sillen also works for the Swedish government in the Forsvarets Forsningsanstalt (FOM), mear Stockholm. Siller is a man of about 40 years. He is narried and sas three children. Be lives in Djurabola which is a suburt of Stockhola. He took his degree at the University of Stockholm. He taught inorganic elemistry at the University of Stockholm until 1951 when he joined the faculty of the Boyal Institute of Technology. He speaks many languages, including Russian. He is a very efficient worker; his office is beautifully organized with all sorts of time-saving devices. He carries a vire recorder with him at all times in order to be able to dictate at any time. Actually, Sillen is more interested in administration than in research. He is known among Evedish eclentists as the business-man themist in addition to hisinterest in chemistry, he has made extensive studies of methods of aducation in various countries and is very informed on changing educational systems. leadership in educational reform, Billén has earned for himself from his colleagues the title, "Bad Boy of Stockholm". Sillén has applied for permission to visit the USSR to study their educational system but, so far, the Soviet government has not granted it. He is very interested in the USSR and has gotten many books on Soviet education. He may he visited the IESE years ago. His uncle- Sjohn-Bannfelt, who is now a general in the Swedish army, was on the staff of the Swedish ambassador to Moscow.

- 2. Also at the Royal Institute of Technology is Professor Dr Ole Albert amm who is professor of physical chemistry. He is an authority on diffusion and, when I visited his laboratory, I saw there some of the finest diffusion apparatus I have ever seen. This apparatus would be hard to get anywhere but it was built by the Institute's machine shops. It was composed of a series of coils, rather than verticle tubes, and took up very little space. It separates isotopes (in gas form) with the highest efficiency and could produce several pounds in six months' time.
- 3. Others at the Royal Institute in Stockholm are Holger Gustar Erdtman an organic chemist specializing in wood chemistry (his particular field is cellulose) and Dr. George Mederman, one of the many Hungarian and Baltic refugees now in Sweden. Riederman told me that he would very much like to come to the US.
- 4. The Chemistry laboratories at the University of Uppsala have very modern equipment, better in some respects then that of the IS. For example, its ultra-centrifuges are better than those of the US. The Netherlands and Manupaly some of the equipment at Uppsala, but the University brishe machine shops and mechanics are marvelous. 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- 7. The University of Lund has deteriorated. Its equipment is not as good as Uppsala's. On the staff at Lund is E arsson from who is a not so-good organic chemist. A man named promeus from, who is not a professor, is a good inorganic chemist. His field is complex ions. Stig Arms Summer, who holds a rating at Lund probably equivalent to that of an assistant professor in the US, is a good organic chemist. His particular field is sulphur chemistry. Both men are about thirty-five years of age. I can only explain their being at Lund by the fact that there are no openings elsewhere. Birge Adell (I do not know that he ever used the name by Wilk Indexs), formerly at Lund, is now dead.
- 8. The University of Stockholm has Arne Clander (I have never heard that he had the name, Gustav) who is a physical chemist. Also at Stockholm is an organic chemist named Morbach [fmu]. Georg Charles You Hevesy [note: not "de" Hevesy was a giant at Stockholm in 1920-30. He is not so active now. Hans Karl You buler-Chelpin, blochemist, is also older and, although still at Sundholm; is no longer so active.
- 9. The Caroline Institute is primarily a medical school. It has there Rugo Theorell who is the best biochemist in Sweden.
- 10. Gothenburg is another not-so good. It is a jumping-off place to good positions elsewhere. Arvin Redvall (I never knew him to use the name, Johan), who is an inorganic chemist, is now retired from their staff. Cyril Prosect-is-also as inorganic chemist and now represents Schmill., Schmittering Russia and is a naturalized citizen of Sweden. He may have been a White Russian; I know he left Russia when he was very small. By Olds Commelson is an agricultural chemist at Cothenburg.
- II. The Nobel Institute is just outside of Stockholm. It is, of course, endoved by Nobel and is not a government institute. Nost of its work is done for the government, however. 

In this connection, Exphas Aben learned that a letter was recently received in the present residence of Louise Sorant, wife of subject; which letter was addressed to her mother, Wrs. Victor Was, 1. Ress. The envelope bore the postmark of New York City, August 249 2051, and the return address of Rossarnt or Rossanti Niptel Earle, New York City. It appears that this communication emanated Monithe Murray J. Rassants, who are known to have registered in that hotel on Assart 17, 1951.
