He is presently connected with the Commission in the capacity of a consultant. Investigation conducted by this Bureau in July, 1947, and February, 1954, developed that Urey has been affiliated with numerous Communist front and Communist-dominated organizations and his associates include known Communists.

On November 12, 1943, NY T-2 advised that ANDREW ONDA had stated on the above date that ARTHUR KINCY had formerly been a full-time worker in the CP. NY T-3 had previously advised that ANDREW ONDA was an active CP member in the State of Connecticut during 1943 and President of the Communist Political Association in Connecticut in 1944.

The Communist Political Association has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

"Following the execution of atomic spies ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG in June, 1953, the Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon MORTON SOBELL, the ROSENBERGS' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case - a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953, and then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case'...."

The "UE Shop Steward Guide," UE Publication Number 212, Sixth Edition, 1952, reflects on pages 32-34, "UE - the United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America was established in 1936 at a convention in Buffalo, New York. At that time the organization was called the United Electrical and Radio Workers of America. Shortly after a large group of AFL machinists' locals joined the UE and the full name became the United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America, (UE).

"The UE is known as an 'International Union' because companies of both the United States and Canada are under contract."

"100 Things You Should Know About Communism and Labor", prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., 1951, reflects on pages 80 and 81, "In 1944, the Committee on Un-American Activities found the following unions to have 'Communist leadership. . .strongly entrenched:'

"United Electrical, Radio, and Machine Workers of America (CIO).

"The following unions have been expelled from the CIO because of their Communist domination:

"United Electrical, Radio, and Machine Workers of America."

The "Internal Security Annual Report for 1957, Report of the Subcommittee to Investigate the Administration of the Internal Security Act and other Internal Security Laws, of the Committee on the Judiciary, United States Senate" on page 61, refers to UE as "one of the strongest Communist controlled unions in America".

The International Headquarters of UE is located at 11 East 51st Street, New York, New York, according to the April 24, 1961, edition of "UE News", official organ of UE.

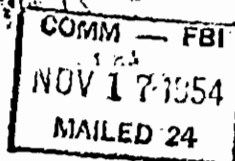

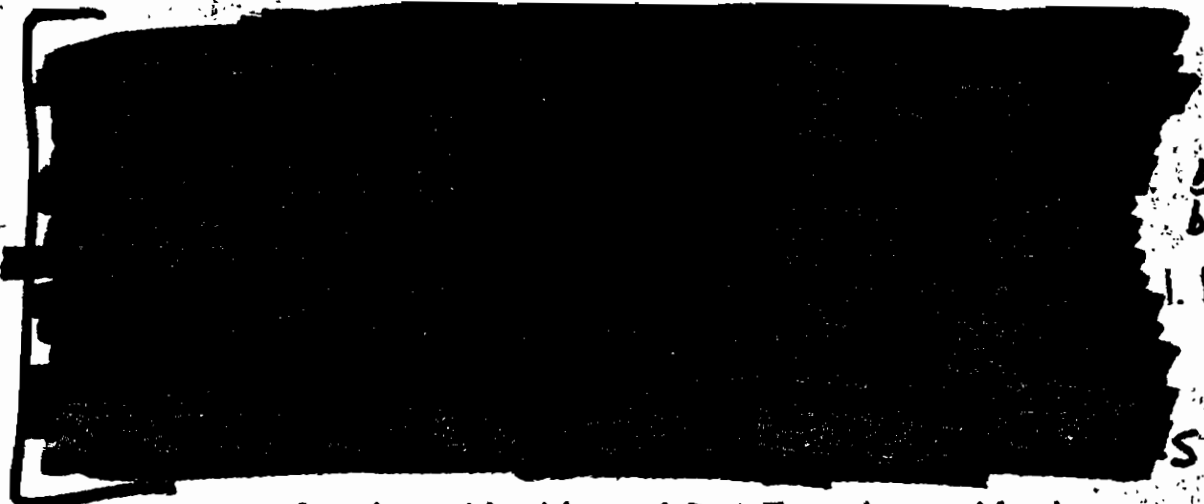

Dr. Urey was one of the original scientists in the Manhattan Engineer District program during the war. He has had an AEC clearance since 1947. You will recall that the Bureau developed information reflecting Urey's association with numerous Communist front organizations, as well as association with known Communists. Urey is now in Europe on a trip.

On August 9, 1954, [redacted] of the CIA inquired of Liaison Agent Papich as to what action should be taken by the CIA in the event that agency received information indicating that Urey was traveling behind the Iron Curtain. Agent Papich advised [redacted] that if the CIA had not made up its mind on such a problem, then it should seek the guidance from the AEC. [redacted] stated that the CIA would contact the AEC on this particular item.

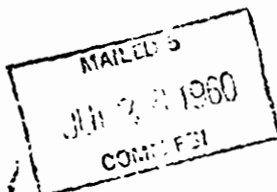

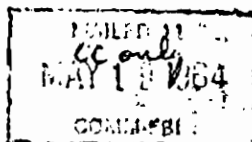

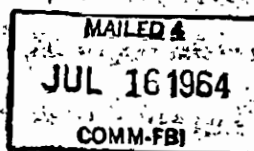

Dayton has been identified by four witnesses as having been in an apartment in New York during January, 1950, which apartment was used by Rosenberg and members of his ring for espionage purposes.



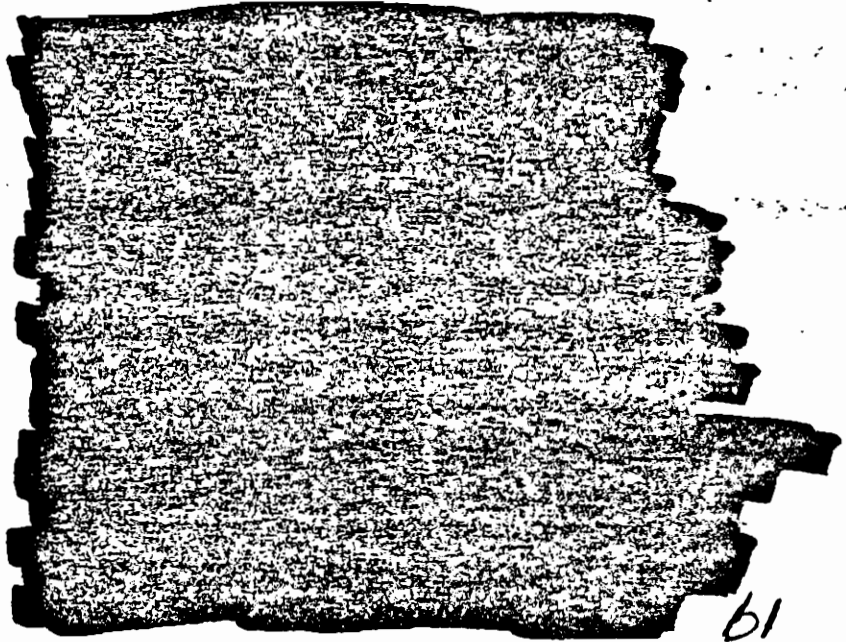

For the information of the Springfield Office Dr. JEFFREY ZHEW (ph) who was called from subject's phone at Urbana on March 29, 1956 may be identical with CHUAN CHU, was. Jeffrey Chuan Chu, J. C. Chu, CHU Chuan-Chu who was the subject of an AEA-E and IS-CH investigation at Chicago.

The IS-CH investigation was based on information furnished by CIA to the Bureau by report classified "Secret" to the effect that CIA had learned from a fairly reliable source that ROBERT TONG, wa. T'ANG Chien-wan, who returned to Hong Kong from Peking, China in June, 1951, and was said to be awaiting an appointment from the Chinese Communist Minister of Foreign Affairs in Connection with the United Nations had approached J. C. CHU's mother, who then lived in Shanghai China, for the purpose of ascertaining CHU's address in the United States. This informant advised that J. C. CHU, Aka CHU Chuan-chu then resided at 885 Forest Ave, Naperville, Illinois and was believed to be connected with atomic research in Illinois.

Subsequent investigation concerning CHU failed to reflect that he had any pro-Chinese Communist sympathies or that he was ever subsequently contacted by ROBERT TONG.

As of May, 1954 CHU was residing at 885 Forest, Naperville, Illinois and was employed as an electrical engineer in charge of construction of electronic computers, Physics Department, Argonne National Laboratories, Lemont, Illinois, where he has worked since 1949 having been granted clearance on June 30, 1949.




OBSERVATIONS:

It is felt that Mrs. Rossant should be interviewed by the New York Office before consideration is given to closing this case. In view of the possibility, however remote, that Mrs. Rossant may have information in her possession concerning Alfred Sarant, it is felt that we have nothing to lose by interviewing her concerning her relations with Mrs. Ross and Louise Sarant. It should be noted that Mrs. Rossant previously lived abroad for several years, spent time in London, Paris, and Florence, Italy, and has numerous contacts in Europe. Further, mail covers have indicated that she has considerable foreign correspondence. According to [REDACTED] Mrs. Rossant also has several relatives residing in Israel. ()
