
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
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
The New York Office by letter dated September 23, 1952, has recommended that the Rossant case be closed; further, that no interview of Mrs. Rossant be conducted inasmuch as it is believed it will not serve any useful purpose.

OBSERVATIONS:

It is felt that Mrs. Rossant should be interviewed by the New York Office before consideration is given to closing this case. In view of the possibility, however remote, that Mrs. Rossant may have information in her possession concerning Alfred Sarant, it is felt that we have nothing to lose by interviewing her concerning her relations with Mrs. Ross and Louise Sarant. It should be noted that Mrs. Rossant previously lived abroad for several years, spent time in London, Paris, and Florence, Italy, and has numerous contacts in Europe. Further, mail covers have indicated that she has considerable foreign correspondence. According to Mrs. Rossant also has several relatives residing in Israel.

It should be further noted that according to an informant of unknown reliability, Julius Rosenberg stated that Alfred Sarant had gone to Europe by way of Mexico. If Sarant is in Europe, it is highly conceivable that Mrs. Rossant could be the medium through whom Sarant can get word to his wife as to his present whereabouts.
