

On 1/21/55, ARTHUR SCHOTTLAFELD was interviewed by SAS BLAZE J. TOWASONI and ARNOLD L. BRANLT at his place of business, Arthur Schottenfeld & Company, 226-228 39th street. Brooklyn, NY.

SCHOTTENFELD advised that he was born 1/19/13 in Austria and came to this country when he was hine months old. he is a naturalized emerican citizen by virtue of mis father's naturalization which occurred about 1926. BunOTTLE FLLD was educated in public grammar scnools in Brooklyn and the New Utrecht nigh School. we is also a graduate of the College of the City of New York where he graduated in approximately 1936 or 1937. He was married about 1938 or 1939 to the former LILLIAN BROOKS.

SCHOTTLNFLLD, it was observed, is approximately 6 feet tell, weighs approximately 190 pounds, has gray eyes, black hair, has a dark complexion, weers glasses, and a close cropped black mustache. During the entire interview, SCHOTTENFELD gave the appearance of friendly cooperation. Whenever he indicated lack of knowledge concerning a particular question, he protested that he was not trying to evade answering the question, out that it was just a question of having forgotten or never having known the answer.

# Screenmakers

SCHOTTENFELD advised that Screenmakers was an organization which was started by GLORGE TILLETT, SCHOTTENFELD, and SCHOTTENFELD'S brother-in-lew, MARRY BROOKS, in approximately 1942. The concern was really the brainchild of GLORGE TILLETT who was extramely talented in the screen printing field and with whom SCHOTTENFELD had become acquainted in about 1940. The business was slow in getting started, but after a few months, GLORGE THALETT developed a system of printing on metals which was important to the war effort of the U.S. and while the concern never ind any direct contracts with the Government, it did do considerable work as a sub-contractor.

At about the time that business began to boom, SCHOTTENFELD'S other brother-in-law, SAM BROOKS, and an attorney friend of his named HARRY ELLIS joined the concern. Most of the business management was left in the hands of SAM BROOKS and ELLIS, and SCHOTTENFELD was principally concerned with the mechanical aspects of operations.

The business was continued until approximately 1945 or 1946 when with the cessition of instillities, business dropped off and it was decided to dissolve the organization. SCHOTTENFELD received approximately 7,500 for his interest in the business with which he started a new concern which was called the Silk Screen Guild and Silk Screen, Ltd. SCHOTTENFELD said that he had a partner named SADIL SAMLROFF. This business continued until approximately 1952 when SIKOTTENFELD moved to Brooklyn and started his present business, of which he is the sole proprietor.

The interviewing agents discussed the reasons why the Screenmakers partnership went from a partnership to a corporation and then to a partnership and then back to a corporation. SCHOTIANTLED related that he was not at all aniliar with business matters during that period of his

Tife and that he-relied upon the advice of his brother-in-law, SAM BROOKS, and BROOKS' friend, HARRY ELLIS. In instances where it was necessary for SCHOTTENFELD'S signature to appear on documents, he signed such documents as BROOKS or ELLIS asked him to, however, he never engaged outside counsel for advice, but relied on the other principals and the firm's auditors.

With respect to the directors of the first corporation who were listed in 1942 as HARRY ELLIS, ALEXANDER E.
KASTEL, MAX BLOOM, LOUIS RUBENSTEIN, and SAMULL GONDON on
papers filed with the New York County Clerk's Office,
SCHOTTENFELD advised that only Eldis was known to him and
the others were strenge names. It was pointed cut that in
1943 a partnership was formed in which GLORGE TILLLIT, merril
ELLIS and SAM EROOKS were listed as general partners, and
HARKY BROOKS, PLANCHE JEZER, ARCHIE LASSEE and ARCHUR
SCHOTTEMELLE were listed as limited partners. \_\_CLOTTEMELLE
related that BLENCHE JEZER was the wife of one merch JEZER
who acted as Attorney for the corporation, and ARCHIE
LASSER was a friend of JEZER and SAM BROOKS who invested
money in the firm.

Concerning the individuals included in the limited partnership, which was filed with the County Clark's Office on 3/1/45, the general partners are listed as SAM BROOKS, ELLIS and SCHOTTENFELD. The following limited partners are also listed:

FLORENCE ELLIS, whom SCHOTTENFELD identified as the wife of HARRY ELLIS.

LILLIAN SCHOTTENFELD, who was identified as -SCHOTTENFELD'S wife.

HELLN ALICE BROOKS, whom SCHOTTENFELD identified as the wife of HARRY PROOKS.

PIANORE SEZER and ARCHIE LABBER, who neve been previously mentioned, and PAULINE LASSER, whom SCHOTTENFLLD identified as the wife of ARCHIE LASSER.

partnership is BLHNARL SCHUSTER. SCHOTTENFELD advised that this name was unknown to him.

# Titian, Incorporated

SCEOTTENFELD advised that this was a concern started after the dissolution of Screenmakers by SA, BROOKS and BERNARD KUSHNER. SCHOTTENFELD stated that he felt since some of the Screenmaker money had been used to organize Titian, he should have been permitted to share in the profits of this enterprise. However, he never did get any share or any part of this company and he feels that SAM BROOMS charted him in this particular transaction.

Vith respect to other someone much have been closely associated with Tition, such as Saxony Screen Printers and T & T Strips Printers, SCLOTTEXFELD advised that he has no knowledge of these concerns.

Advance Scientific Fublishers, Icc.

SCHOTTENFELD identified this enterprise as an idea that Sam BHOOKS had for insertment purposes of which nothing ever come.

Copyking Corporation of America

SCHOTTENTELD adviced Copyking was enother enterprise which Saw DHOMS had put nome of the Scriennakers money into and which also proved to be a financial failure.

# Printex Corporation of America

SCHOTTENFILD identified this concern as enother enterprise financed by SAM BRUOKS with the Screenmakers money which was involved in screen printing and which supposedly failed. SCHOTTENFELD pointed out that he had recently learned that the Printex Corporation is presently operating in Ossining, New York, and has been fairly successful.

# SAMUEL BROOKS

SCHOTTENFELD-identified BROCKS as his brother-in-law with whom he had his only real contact through the business enterprises mentioned above. SCHOTTENFELD stated that he had met his wife approximately five years before their merriage and had met other members of her family, nowever, SAM was more or less of a lone wolf who had very little contact with his family, and SCHOTTENFELD does not believe that he even met him prior to his marriage. As noted above, SCHOTTENFELD facts that SAM BROOKS cheaved him, and, as a result of this, he has had little contact with BROCKS for the last four or Tivo years. As said when he last heard of SAM, SAM was supposedly residing in mexico.

# GEORGI TILLETT

SCHOTTENFELD first met GEORGE TILLETT in approximately 1940 through Sam BROUKS. SCHOTTEMFILD pointed out that at about this time he was out of work and TILLETT offered him a job as a laborer making 420.00 per week in a company called Brooke-Cadwillder which was a concern in which TILLETT was a partner. When TILLETT left this concern and started Screenmakers, SCHOTTENFILD accompanied him. As set forth above, SCHOTTENFILD considers TILLETT an extremely talented man in the screen printing field, but a man who likes to be on the move in a business sense.

TILLETT left the Screenmakers organization in about 1944 because the operation had become too well organized and too "placid" to suit TILLETT'S artistic mood. SCHOTTENFELD said he was unaware of any business differences between TILLETT on the one hand and BROOKS and ELLIS on the other which caused TILLETT to withdraw from this firm. 3ChOTTENFELD said that he has met ChORGE'S son LESLIE TILLETT on one or two occasions and he understands there is a second son who is in maxica. SCHOTTENFELD said that he could not comment or the political sympathies of any of the TILLETTS.

# PERMARE ROSTUST OF

As previously noted, ACECTTENFELD said that the name BERNARD SCHOSTER was completely unfamiliar to him. The name BERNARD CHEATER was also unknown to SCHOTTENFELD and he was unable to identify a photograph of SCAURTER as anyone known to him.

When it was reinted out that Some Supposedly had made investments in Same summakers, ascerding to records on file with the County district Office, of the Said and that if this were thus, SCHUSTER had pur money into the company without any knowledge on his, SCHOTTERFRUD'S, part. He said the only people whom he knew as investors in Screenmakers were the people who have been mentioned above.

In a discussion of whether it would have been possible for an outsider to have invested money in Screen-makers or for an outside group such as the 37 to enve received some of the profits from the enterprise, SCHOTTEN-FELD readily stated that although he had no personal knowledge that such had ever occurred, he supposed that it was possible because of his lack of experience in business during that period that BROOKS and ELLIS may have cone almost anything with respect to the financial and of the business without his knowledge.

SCHOTTENFELD identified CARL BRISTED as a men who had been connected with the Copyking Corporation, mentioned above, and it was his understanding that BRISTED was supposed to be a very accomplished prolicity man who would help this enterprise become very successful. He identified a photograph of Sam BECKER as the person known to him as 0. The BRISTED, however, he admised that he had never hears of the name Sam BECKER and was arrawage for any sympastics FMISTED might have for the 65 or any other subvectors cannoticus.



SCHOTTENFELD was likewise unfamiliar with National Mercentile and Trading Company elthough he advised that at one time Brooks had indicated his interest in organizing an export and import company.



With respect to his own sympathies, SCHOTTENFELD advised that he had never been a member of the CP, however, it was possible that either he or his wife or both may have, on some occasion, registered with the LP. SCHOTTENFELD pointed out that during the period of approximately 1940 - 1946 he had no knowledge of what the CP stood for anymore than he had any knowledge of or interest in the Fascist or Nazi farties. He said he might have been considered to be liberal in his political thinking, but he thought that a better description would be that he had no knowledge at all of things political, nor did he have interest in such matters. He also advised that it was possible that he may have contributed to the Valle. He said that It seemed to





him that he had a recollection of giving at least once a small amount, probably a dollar, to the aLB inasmuch as it was his feeling now that when the Loyalists were fighting in Spain against FRANCO, he had the impression that the Loyalists were idealistic people and that the fight against FRANCO was a fight of idealism. He pointed out that at that time he had no knowledge that the CP was in any way involved with the Spanish Loyalists or with the Abraham Lincoln Brigade.



Considering the additional information concerning ALFRED SARANT's espionage activities, which has been furnished

with the RUSENBERGS, EARR, GLASSMAN, TERL and FINESTONE, his CP and CPA memberships, his flight from the United-States subsequent to JULIUS ROSENBERG's arrest, statements made during his interviews, and his part in the Morton Street apartment operation, it is reasonable to believe that SARANT was a member of the ROSENBERG espionage network and therefore to consider him a coconspirator of ROSENBERG and PERL. It is also believed that LOUISE SARANT should be considered a coconspirator of ROSENBERG and PERL.

The information concerning the reported whereabouts of JOEL BARR was set forth in rerep for the purpose of possibly assisting in the location of SARANT; inasmuch as BARR and SARANT are believed to have been associated in Soviet espionage as a team during the 1944-46 period in NYC, it is believed that BARR and SARANT may have been reunited in Switzerland.





DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS have stated they met ANNE SIDOROVICH at JULIUS ROSENBERG's apartment during the early part of January, 1945 and that shortly after she left, ROSENBERG stated that she, ANNE, would act as courier between the GREENGLASSes and ROSENBERG.

HARRY GOLD, who in fact did act as the courier involved, stated his Soviet superior, ANATODI A. YAMOVLEV, in response to

his, GOLD's, apprehension in contacting both KLAUS FUCHS and GREENGLASS, stated that the person who had been selected was unable to make the trip. ANNE SIDOROVICH has admitted suffering from a nervous breakdown during this period.

Confidential informant has advised as follows:5%

JULIUS ROSENBERS has stated he had advanced money to a young couple to open a business in the west and that the man had been a school companion of his and was a veteran of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade. According to ROSENBERS this couple operated a business for years building a front in the city and during difficult times he had to supply this couple with money. This man was a "drop" between the west and east for ROSENBERG.

ROSEMBERG also said that the SILOROVICHES are key people in the Russian espionage setup and are about as important as he. They were receiving information of the same calibre as he and were copying it with their Leica camera and sending it to the Scviets.

ROSENBERG also told the informant that the SIXXROVICH woman cannot possibly confess since it would involve her "entire family" and repeated that the SIXXROVICHES enjoyed the same position as did ROSENBERG.

ROSENBERG indicated the SIDOROVICHes had been contacted after his errest and had been told they would not confess (there is still the extant possibility that this may have involved GEORGE TOUMAKINE, who is known to have been in Cleveland, Ohio on March 24, 1951).

The informant also learned that on the 4th of July, probably 1949, SIDOROVICH was called into New York from out of town with his camera and he joined ROSENBERG, MAXWELLY FINESTONS and PERL in recording material obtained by PERL from Columbia University.

That the SIIOROVICHes were involved in the ROSENBERG parallel is further strengthened with their denial before the Federal Grand Jury of any knowledge of WILLIAM PERL. Mr. and Mrs. ROBERT E. VELEGER, their neighbor Mrs. MARIE BEIER, all of


The known violations of the SIDOROVICHes are therefore:

# 1. ESPIONAGE

This would now most probably require a confession on the part of the subjects or a person who was directly involved with them.

- C. MICHAEL and ANNE SIDOROVICH are well acquainted with JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG (Admissions as well as DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS)
- D. WILLTAM PERL was associated with JULIUS ROSENBERG (MAX and HELENE ELITCHER)
- E. SIDOROVICHES and PERL are known to each other ("Studebaker transactions")

F. Using the pseudonym Mrs. S. GOLDBERG, VIVIAN GLASSMAN came to Cleveland on July 22, 1950 and on July 23, 1950 went to the apartment occupied by WILLIAM PERL, where she informed PERL that she had \$2000 to cover his expenses in leaving the country, suggesting Mexico as his destination. All of her instructions were written on a pad and she included the name JULIUS ROSENEERG in her writing.

GLASSMAN performed this task at the instruction of a "stranger" (possibly MAX FINESTONE), who told her that "John" had sent him. She was given the \$2000 and told to go to Cleveland and see "the aeronautical engineer and friend".

If the conspiracy can be proved, it is suggested that the admissions of JULIUS ROSENBERG to and to DAVID of GREENGLASS may then be admissible against any co-conspirator of ROSENBERG such as the SIDOROVICHES, PERL, GLASSMAN or FINESTONE.

As was previously recommended, in view of the SIDOROVICHES' adament protestations of innocence, it might be of value to suggest a polygraph examination to them even though the information secured therefrom would not be admissible evidence.



PETAILS: PAUL C. EMMONS, Chief Aerodynamicist, Engineering Department, Bell Aircraft Corporation, Miagara Falls, New York, advised that the Bell Aircraft Corporation was aware of the existence and design of the General Plectric I-40 turbo-jet engine almost from the moment of its introduction to the industry. Mr. EMMONS recalled that Bell had manufactured the XP-59 plane, which was said to be the first turbo-jet plane and which was said to have been equipped with the I-16 motor. Mr. EMMONS stated that the I-16 motor was the predecessor of the I-40 and that since these two engines were closely related, he felt certain that Bell had followed the progress of the I-40-from-its-beginning.

Mr. EMBONS advised further that the I-40 engine was used in the Bell plane P-83, which was flown in January, 1945. Computing from the ate of flight, Mr. Elions estimated that full particulars concerning the I-40 would have been received by Bell no later than June, 1944. Mr. Elions advised with reference to the XP-81 that Bell would have been in possession of information that such a plane was being developed although it probably did not have any specifications concerning this plane in 1944.

RAND MIPH HALL, Engineer, Bell Aircraft Corporation, Niagara Falls, N. Y., after examining old records of the Engineering Department, discovered a secret memorandum dated August 13, 1943 pertaining to the prospective use of the General Electric I-40 engine in the Bell plane known as the D-16, which was then in the design stage. According to Mr. HALL, the D-16 plane was never actually produced but studies conducted in connection with this design eventually led to the design and production of the P-63. The memorandum dated August 13, 1943, was prepared by H. L. Salles, then in charge of Preliminary Design.

Mr. HALL stated that Mr. BUNERS has since left the employ of the company and his present whereabouts are unknown although he is believed to be in the employ of the Civil Aeronautics Authority. The memorandum did not specify the source of Mr. BUNER'S information but it was the opinion of Mr. HALL that the information incorporated in the memorandum would have been received from either the Army or the General Electric Company.

Mr. HALL stated that the memorandum had been prepared for the use of what was known as the "Special Projects Group" of Bell, which was maintained at that time in quarters located on Main St., Buffalo, N.Y. and thus physically separated from the Miagara Falls Flant of Bell. The face of the memorandum indicated that distribution was made to Mr. EUDNS, Mr. MALL, JULIA STEEDER, HELIAI MALL, ED RHODES and ANTHUR IRVIN.

and 1944, dell Aircraft Corp., Niagara Falls, N.Y., advised that he was among those who participated in the design and development of the D-16 plane and its successor, the 2-53. He stated that the development of those designs was conducted by the Special Projects Group at the Lain St. offices of Bell. He recalled that the P-83 was powered with a General Electric I-40 engine. He advised further that books published by the General Electric Company concerning the I-40 and the TG-100 had been received by Bell in 1944, probably between February, 1944 and August, 1944. He stated that those books would have been received by HARLAN POYER, former Chief Engineer at Bell, who now resides at RFD, Ithaca, N.Y.

According to Mr. STDISON, the Bell Aircraft Corp. never gave any serious study to the TG-100 engine although some experimental study may have been made.

With reference to the possession of information by Bell in 1944 concerning the XP-81, Mr. STINSON advised that Bell engineers were aware that the plane was being developed at Consolidated-Vultee Aircraft Corp. He stated that to his knowledge Bell was not in possession of any specifications of the XP-81 at that time.





W. ATD ARD SMMA, Office Manager, Purtiss-Wright Records Warehouse, Buffalo, N. Y., advised that the plant formerly operated by the Purtiss-Wright Corporation at Checktowaga (Williamsville), N. Y., had been discontinued in 1.45 and transferred to Columnus, Dhio. Mowever, Mr. SMEA advised that the Columbus Plant of Purtiss-Wright had since been sold to North American Aviation, Inc.

FINING LANGITZ, former Experimental Engineer at Curtiss-Wright and presently associated with FREDERICA FLADER, Inc., North Tonawanda, N. Y. advised that in 1944, the Curtiss-Wright-Corporation at Checktowaga, N. Y. was in the process of building some jet planes. He recalled that the only purtiss-Aright design which used any of the engines of interest to this case was the C-46, one of whose four motors was said to be a TG-100 turbo prop installation. He stated that this plane was given the Curtiss-Wright project designation XC-113.

He explained that the purpose of this project was to determine the feasibility of equipping the C-46, a plane which was normally built with conventional engines, with a TG-100, a turbo proplengine. He advised that this experimental project on the C-46 had not been completed prior to the shutdown of the Curtiss-Wright Plant. It was his recollection that construction of the revised C-46 had begun around August, 1944 but that other Curtiss-Wright departments concerned with the planning of the revised C-46 would have been working on it for at least six months prior to the date that construction began.

He stated that the I-40 engine and never been used by Surtiss-Wright in Buffalo on any finished product although it may have been studied and considered for use in some experimental design.

Mr. LA. WITH recalled further that Curtiss-Wright had constructed other designs using jet engines but such jet engines were recalled as the British Halford jet and the R-2800. Mr. LAND-ITZ stated that whatever information and knowledge pertaining to the IG-100 and the I-40 may have been in the possession of Curtiss-Wright would have been maintained in the Curtiss-Wright Halford Library, - which was transferred to Columbus, Ohio at the time the Physictowaga Plant moved to Columbus.

He stated that generally speaking, he did not become concerned with any developments and designs until the planes had been perfected and the design was ready for construction. He suggested that WELTER TYDON, now the Chief Engineer of the Fairchild Engine and Airplane Co., deperstown, Maryland and a former Design Engineer for Curtiss-Wright, would have been familiar with studies being made at Curtiss-Wright from their inception.






BARR:

He was a member of the Communict Party as of 1914; had lived in New York City; had worked for two years in the Signal Corps Laboratory, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey; was dismissed from Fort Monmouth for Communist activities, and was reported, on various occasions during this period, to be both married and single. (U)

With respect to BARR'S dismissal from Fort Monmouth for Communist activities, it is pointed out that in the report of SA EDWARD E. KACHELHOFFER, dated October 28, 1948, at St. Louis, Missouri, a review of BARR'S personnel file at the Civilian Personnel Records Branch, Adjutant General's Office, Department of the Army, St. Louis, revealed that BARR contended at this time that his dismissal was based on his union activities and not on any membership in the Communist Party.

The records of the Bureau of Vital Statistics, Brooklyn, New York, indicate that JOEL BARR, Certificate #2575, was born at Brooklyn, New York on January 1, 1916. His father was BENJAMIN BARR, born in Russia, whose age, in 1916, was 30, and his mother was BECKY DOBROWOLSKY born in Russia, who gave her age at that time as 26. This date indicates that BARR was 28 years of age in 1944



By letter dated March 9, 1949, the Newark Office advised that Mr. DAVID M. DLUGO, owner of 145 Broadway, Long Branch, New Jersey, and his wife, ROSE, were both interviewed. Both stated that they recalled people whom they referred to as JOEL and EIAINE BARR had occupied a three room apartment at that address sometime during 1940 and 1941. The DLUGOS further recalled that BARR was employed during this time at Fort Monmouth. (A)

Mrs. DLUGO described EIAINE BARR as having a thin face, approximately 57 5" tall, very slender build, dark hair, drawn tight over the head, and that upon her head she usually wore a bandanna. (u)

This letter further indicates that Mr. ANDREW REID, Chief Investigator, Post Intelligence, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, checked all files available to him under the name of BARR and GOLDFARB and was able only to locate a 3 x 5 card with the name ETAINE-GOLDFARB. This card indicated that she had been possibly hired during February, 1941 and had worked at the Quartermasters Corps. This card further indicated that she was residing at 145 Broadway, Long Branch, New Jersey with JOEL BARR and SAM GACK.

This letter further states that Mrs. MARJORIE SMITH, owner of Hudson House, 95 Hudson Avenue, Red Bank, New Jersey, recalled that Mrs. JOEL BARR registered there on July 1, 1940 and that during the short period of their residence there some mail was received addressed to GOLDFARB which was tlaimed by Mrs. BARR.

Mr. RAY B. LIPPINCOTT, Personnel Manager, TULLER CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, 95 Monmouth Avenue, Red Bank, New Jersey, produced for Agents of the Newark Office, a 3 x 5 card which was made out in the name of IAINE GOLDFARB, 145 (4)

Proadway, Long Branch, New Jersey. This card reflected that she was hired on November 25, 1940 as a stenographer and discharged on April 11, 1941.

Mr. LIPPINCOTT stated that IAINE GOLDFARB had worked for her entire period of employment at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey where the TULLER CONSTRUCTION COMPANY was completing a project. (LL)

This card contained information to the effect that the employee was 20 years old, a citizen, born May 2, 1920, and was issued Social Security No. 577-22-6246. (4)



It should be noted that in the report of SA H. DUDLEY PAYNE, dated November 15, 1948, at Washington, D. C., it was pointed out that the records of the Passport Division of the State Department reflect that JOEL BARR was issued Passport #133825 on December 8, 1947. BARR, in applying for this passport, stated that he was an engineering student and was considering broadening his background by continuing study in Europe. (U)

In the previously mentioned REBECCA BARR on January 13, 1949, Mrs. EARR stated that her son was presently in Europe and was not expected back in the United States for at least one year. (U)

In this respect, it is pointed out that a step was placed with the Collector of Customs, New York City on October 19, 1948, requesting that the New York Office be advised of BARR'S reentry into the United States. (())

The records of the Clerk of the New\_York State Supreme Court, Southern

District of New York indicate that JOEL BARR'S father, BENJAMIN BARR, arrived in the United States on March 10, 1899 from Hamburg, Germany aboard the SS IATONIA; that on April 19, 1917, he-filed Petition for Naturalization #63892 at New York, indicating his address at that time as 65 Forsyth Street, New York City, his occupation as contractor, and his date and place of birth as May 18, 1875 at Volin, Russia. The witnesses on this application were MOSES GOLDMAN of 291 Henry Street, New York, and MORRIS CAROSHENSKY, 169 East Broadway, New York City.

The review of this file reflects that MICHAEL SIDOROVICH was interviewed by Bureau Agents on April 24, 1950, and August 2, 1950. MICHAEL and ANNE SIDOROVICH also testified before the Federal Grand Juy, Southern District of New York in August and September, 1951, and they denied knowing WILLIAM PERJ. They also testified before the McCarthy Committee in Executive Session on December 10, 1953, in Washington, D.C., and denied any knowledge of espionage activities and took refuge in the Fifth Amendment.

WICHAEL and A'ME SIDOPOVICH were also interviewed by Bureau Agents on January 22, 1957, and they stated that they have had no contact with any Soviets for any purpose whatsoever. They also stated that they are cognizant of the FBI's jurisdiction in matters involving espionage and the internal security of the United States and they would advised the FBI if they are contacted any time in the future.

The SIMPOVICHes are included on the security Index of the Cleveland office and are presently tabbed for Detcom in view of their past activities and involvement in the ROSEMBERG espionage ring and also because they represent a potential source of danger to this country in the event of hostilities with the U.S.S.R.

In view of the fact that investigation in this matter over the past five years has developed nothing new in their activities, this case is being placed in a closed status and will be reopened in a year to report their current activities. UACB.

PURPOSE:

To recommend the retention of William Perl in the Special Espionage Section of the Security Index.

DETAILS:

In connection with the investigation relative to the Julius Rosenberg network, information was received through avid Greenglass, a confessed espionage agent, that Rosenberg maintained two apartments in New York City for his espicnage activities. Further that one of these apartments was located in Greenwich Village. The investigation as to various members of the network developed that one Alfred Sarant maintained an apartment at 65 Morton Street, in Greenwich Village from 1943 to January 1950. It was learned that this apartment was turned over to Joel parr during the years 1944 and 1945, and the rent for the apartment was paid by William Perl from 1945 witil the latter part of 1948. According to Max Elitcher he attended social gatherings in this apartment with Rosenberg, and that Earr, Perk, Sarant and Morton Sobell were present at these gatherings. It was Elitcher's opinion that all of these individuals were cooperating with Rosenberg in his espionage activities.

William Perl was born in New York City, NY on October 1, 1918. His parents Abraham and Sarah Mutterperl were both born in Poland and were naturalized as citizens of the U.S. He received Bachelor and Master of Science degrees in Electrical Engineering at the City College of New York in 1939. Upon graduation he entered the employ of the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, and was employed as an engineer with that organization until the Fall of 1950, with the exception of a period of several years when he attended school in California and received his PhD degree from Columbia University.

Perl is presently employed as a Professor in Columbia University, New York City, New York and is residing at 610 Cathedral Parkway in New York City, New York.

The matter of prosecuting Perl for violation of the Federal Perjury Statute is presently under consideration by the Department.

All of the remaining factors appearing in the memorandum of September 28, 1950, have been given appropriate consideration.

### RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that William Perl be retained in the Special Espionage Section of the Security Index as his immediate apprehension in the event of hostilities would prevent the identification of his Soviet Espionage contacts and associates, and interfere with the determination as to the extent of his participation in Soviet espionage.


In the course of establishing the confidential plant informant program at the Lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory, National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, Cleveland, Ohio, the name of ALFRED RANDOLPH BOBROWSKY has arisen. While checking indices on BOBROWSKY it was ascertained that until June, 1949 he was employed at the Lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory as Section. Chief of the High Temperature Materials Section and it was noted that BOBROWSKY was the subject of an AEAA investigation in September, 1947 and again in August, 1950. His PSQ reflects he was graduated from the College of the City of New York in February of 1939. As you are aware, this is the same class of which the subject and the majority of the principals of the ROSENBERG parallel were members.

The AEAA investigation in 1950 reflects BOBROWSKY was then employed by the University of Michigan in a research capacity at Willow Run and was engaged primarily in the preparation of an extensive program combining nuclear energy aspects with certain phases of combustion and engineering mechanics.

Investigation in 1947 revealed that THOMAS D. WEIR, Director of Public Safety and Service, Rocky River, Ohio, a suburb of Cleveland who was given as a reference by BOBROWSKY, stated he would not recommend BOBROWSKY for a position of trust or confidence, and in his opinion BOBROWSKY considers loyalty secondary and is strongly pro-Russian. He advised that BOBROWSKY had said in so many words that "Russia's way of government was the modern way", and "things aren't as bad in Russia as we are led to believe". No other derogatory information was developed in Cleveland, however the investigation was conducted in several field divisions.





Subject, when interviewed by Bureau Agents in 1950,24-12 stated that he was not then a member of the Communist Party (CP). He admitted that he was a member of the Communist Political Association (CPA) for approximately 18 months sometime between 1943 and 1945 in Greenwich Village, New York City. Mr. and Mrs. NATHAN SUSSMAN, Bayside, Long Island, advised in 1951 that they were members of Branch 16B of the Industrial Division of the CP in New York City from 1942 to 1944. They stated that among the small membership of this group were JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and ALFRED SARANT. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were executed in July, 1953, for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States. ${\cal U}$ 

Subject was interviewed in connection with the investigation of the JULIUS ROSENBERG espionage network in July, 1950. A permissive search of subject's residence at that time resulted in locating an address book containing the entry, "Rosenberg, Julius and Ethel, 10 Monroe Street, New York 2." SARANT admitted that the ROSENBERGS were casual acquaintances in New York City. He denied ever assisting ROSENBERG or anyone else in any way in obtaining information for the Russian Government and denied having knowledge of any espionage activity on the part of ROSENBERG or anyone else.

On July 25, 1950, subject advised that he was leaving for New York City the next day for a short vacation. After arriving in New York City, he was joined by CAROL DAYTON, the wife of his next door neighbor in Ithaca. On August 4, 1950, subject and DAYTON left New, York City for Tucson, Arizona, arriving there on August 7, 1950. On August 9, 1950, subject and DAYTON entered Mexico at Hermosillo. Subject's whereabouts since that time have never been determined. a fundled RECORDED-35



On December 28, 1950, New York advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG told him that there were two Soviet espionage units operating in the New York City area, that he, himself, headed one group, and that the other group was headed by two men, adding that one of these men was in Europe at the time of his (ROSENBERG'S) arrest (July 17, 1950), and the other man fled subsequent to his arrest. It is noted that subject fled the United States approximately two weeks after ROSENBERG'S arrest.

This informant further advised on that ROSENBERG had confided that ALFRED SARANT was "a member of his organization." Informant interpreted this phrase to mean that SARANT was a Soviet espionage agent affiliated with the ROSENBERG group. ROSENBERG also told the informant that he had made two trips to Ithaca, New York to see ALFRED SARANT to make "pick ups" which the informant interpreted to mean that SARANT was furnishing espionage material to ROSENBERG.

ROSENBERG told this informant that SARANT had fled to Europe, leaving his wife and children.



### C. RECOMMENDATION:

Retain in Security Index. Facts have been developed which clearly and unmistakably depict the subject as a dangerous individual who could be expected to commit acts

inimical to the national defense and public safety of the United States in time of emergency. Subject fled the United States after questioning by Bureau agents. Investigation has proved his association with JULIUS ROSENBERG, who has identified him as a member of his organization. It is believed that an apartment rented by subject at 65 Morton Street, New York City, was used by the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus in its activities. It is believed that an individual who has acted as an espionage agent in the past should always be regarded as dangerous to the national defense and public safety.

### D. DETCOM TABBING:

Subject is/presently tabbed for Detcom; however, no recommendation has been made pursuant to SAC Letter 55-12. Although subject's whereabouts are not known, it is believed that he should be tabbed under the new standards since his alleged espionage activities clearly and unmistakably depict him as a potential espionage agent.

By attached letter 5/31/55 the Albany office recommends retaining subject's name on the Security Index due to information from an informant of unknown reliability that Julius Rosenberg described her, in 1951, as an active Russian agent and, further, she claimed the Fifth Amendment when questioned about espionage activities on the part of her husband and herself before the McCarthy Committee in 1953.



He advised Rosenberg told him on 3/22/51 there was a woman in Ithaca named Sarant who was an active Russian agent and her husband was in Europe. He also told of going to Ithaca to pick up espionage material from Sarant and stated Mrs. Sarant was present.

An intensive investigation has been conducted of the activities of Mrs. Sarant in an effort to locate her husband and has failed to develop information indicating she is now engaged in espionage or is a member of the Communist Party. On interview she admitted former membership in the CP in 1944-45. She claimed the Fifth Amendment in appearances before a grand jury in June, 1951, and the McCarthy Committee in October and Lecember, 1953, when questioned about espionage activities of her husband and herself. She said she understood the Fifth Amendment was for the protection of the innocent. It is

noted that invoking the Fifth Amendment may be an overt act, however, no evidence has been developed to show the following:

CP membership within the past 5 years;

That Mrs. Sarant possesses anarchistic or revolutionary beliefs;

That she is clearly and unmistakbly depicted as a dangerous individual who could be expected to commit acts inimical to the national defense and safety of the U.S. in time of emergency.

In view of the above, it is believed her name should be deleted from the Security Index.



Sarant was born New York City, 1918 and graduated from Cooper Union with a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering degree in 1941. He was employed by Western Electric Company, June to September, 1941; United States Signal Corps Laboratory, 9/41 to 9/42; Western Electric Company, 9/42. In 10/42, he was transferred to Bell Telephone Laboratory, New York City and remained there until 9/46, when he moved to Ithaca, New York and was self-employed until 1950. Sarant was associated with Julius Rosenberg and members of the Rosenberg espionage network. He occupied an apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City and after he left New York in 1946 it was rented in his name until 1950. Rent for this apartment was paid by different members of the Rosenberg network. The apartment has been identified as a conspiratorial headquarters for the Rosenberg ring. Sarant fled the United States in 8/50, after preliminary questioning by the Bureau and his present location is not known.

WALTER TYDON, Chief Engineer, Fairchild Aircraft, Hagerstown. Maryland advises TG-100 didn't come to attention until 1945 or 1946 at Columbus, Ohio and suggests contacts with one RUNKEL presently with Boeing Aircraft at Seattle and GEORGE PAGE, presently in England for Curtiss-Wright. I-4C came to TYDON'S attention about March 1, 1944 when he was made assistant Chief Engineer for Curtiss-Wright.at Cheektowaga, New York. ROBERT STEVENS, Cornell Research Group, Cheektowaga, also worked on I-40. ROBERT DARBY, design engineer at Fairchild who worked on I-40 for Curtiss-Wright recalls I-40 was originally in Bell Aircraft YP-83 which was undergoing flight test at Wright Field, Dayton, Ohio in March 1943. DARBY suggests contact with ROY SCHULTZ presently with ARO CORP. who obtained original information on I-40 in England for General Electric who thereafter forwarded data to Bell Aircraft. JOHN F. EVANS, design engineer at Fairchild worked on I-40 in YP-83 at Bell but doesn't recall dates. TiDON has no knowledge of XP-81 but produced article from Aero Digest Magazine which reflects design started in September 1943, models tested in California Technical wind tunnel probably in mid 1944 and test flown at Muroc Lake, California in February 1945.

DETAILS:

### AT HAGERSTOWN, MARYLAND

WALTER TYDON, Chief Design Engineer, Fairchild Aircraft Corporation, advised that he was previously associated with the Curtiss-Wright Corporation for a period of approximately twenty-four years. He was last associated in the capacity of Chief Design Engineer at Columbus, Ohio.

TYDON stated that the TG-100 originally came to his attention at the Columbus\_Ohio\_plant\_in\_late\_1945\_or\_early\_1946\_when-he-was-made-Chief Design-Engineer. At that time the TG-100 was undergoing tests on a C-46. These tests were made on one side of the C-46 and the plane was never flown for test.

TYDON advised that the tests on the C-46 were unsuccessful. For future information it is to be noted that the C-46 is a twin engine cargo-type aircraft, and not a four engine aircraft as previously set forth.

TYDON recalled that the original experimentation with the TG-1CO was done at the St. Louis plant of Curtiss-Wright and suggested that an individual whose last name was KUNKEL was the "closest to the job." RUNKEL is presently employed by the Boeing Aircraft Corporation, Seattle, Washington.

Further, GEORGE/PAGE, who is still with the Wright Aeronautical Corporation originally supervised the installation of the TG-100 on the C-46 at St. Louis. PAGE should know the history and background of this work. PAGE, who is presently in England for the Curtiss-Wright Corporation can be contacted through General E. M. POWERS, Vice President and director of engineering, Curtiss-Wright Corporation.

Concerning the I-40, TYDON advised that this engine first came to his attention when he was made head of the development group at the Buffalo plant of Curtiss-Wright in his capacity as Assistant Chief Engineer. This was on March 1, 1944. He could not state definitely but was of the opinion that Curtiss-Wright was probably in receipt of information concerning the I-40 prior to this time. TYDON advised that ROBERT STEVENS, presently at the Cornell Research Laboratory, Cheektowaga, New York was head of the "Power Plant Grup" and would therefore be able to determine more exactly when information concerning the I-40 was brought to the attention of Curtiss-Wright.

ROBERT DARBY, Design Engineer at Fairchild, and previously associated with Curtiss-Wright in the same capacity advised that the I-40 engine was initially installed in a Bell aircraft, the YP-83, at Buffalo, New York. He recalled that general publicity concerning this development was given to the press sometime in 1943 or 1944. The information was only available to Curtiss-Wright after it had been publicly announced. He further recalled that the YP-85 was definitely flying at Wright Field, Dayton, Ohio in March 1943 and therefore assumed that information concerning the I-40 was in Bell's possession prior to that time.

Both TYDON and DARBY advised that ROY SCHULTZ originally with the General Electric Company went to England as that Company's representative and obtained the original information on the I-40 engine from the British. Thereafter, this information was forwarded to Bell Aircraft by the General Electric Company.


SCHULTZ is presently associated with the ARO Corporation. This Company was formed to operate the new Air Force test field at Tullahoma, Tennessee which will be operated as an aircraft engineering development center. SCHULTZ can be contacted through the engineering firm of SVERDRUP and PARCEL, Inc., Syndicate Trust Building, St. Louis 1, Missouri.

JOHN F. EVANS, formerly with Bell Aircraft, and presently a design engineer at Fairchild stated that he worked on the YP-83 with the I-40 engine at Bell but was unable to recall any dates.

Concerning the XP-81, TYDON was unable to give any first nand information. However, a review of clippings from aircraft magazines maintained by TYDON reflected an article from a copy of Aero Digest Magazine (date unknown) pertaining the XP-81. This article captioned "ZP-81, Jet Project Model" reflected that design started in September 1943 on a proposal submitted to the Army. Air Force by Consolidated Vultee Aircraft. Under development at the same time (according to this article) was a gas turbine engine with a propeller (turbo-prop) which was to be used in conjunction with the XP-81. (TYDON states that this refers to the TG-100). However, this engine was not ready for test at that time and another power plant was substituted.

This article further states that models of the XP-ôl were first tested at California Institute of Technology in a wind tunnel operated by the Consolidated Vultee Field Division in cooperation with the Engineering department of ATSC. Further, the XP-ôl was test flown in February 1945 at Muroc Lake, California with a Rolls Royce Merlin and the I-40 engines. In December 1945 this craft was flown at Muroc with the TG-100 in place of the Merlin engine.

From the above, TYDON estimated that the wind tunnel tests in California Tech would probably have been made sometime in mid 1944.





Copies of this report are being furnished to the Knoxville Office inasmuch as investigation at St. Louis may reflect that ROY SCHULTZ is commentated in currently residing at Tullahoma, Termessee.

Reurlet July 12, 1951, enclosing the originals of certain correspondence concerning research on pilotless guided missiles, and reports entitled "Rem Jet Conference Winutes," all of which were obtained from the files of the (i) National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics (NACA) in Cleveland, Ohio,

It was of interest to note that in a conference on August S4, 1944, Perl discussed with the group the layout which he had made relative to the Whittle unit to be located in the Pear and to use an annular inlet and an axial jet. Further, etc. at this same conference Abe Silverstein, WACA, furnished the epinion that the anticipated speed of 550 mph might be a little (a) high even with the use of a Whittle unit.

It might also be mentioned that in the minutes of the conference on August 23, 1944, Dr. George 3. Lewis of MCA securities and the conference that he had received a call from Colonel Keirn and had been advised that the first Ford built unit would be ready in a day or two.

The aforementioned whittle unit and Ford built unit are essumed to possibly refer to the jet system of fastallation which was to be used to propel this guided missile, known at the JB-2 bomb. It is therefore desired that the Cleveland division make an affort to ascertain through EACI the exact contemplated or octual dimensions (length and diameter) of the Whittle unit, Ford built unit, or any other jet unit unit, and consideration for use on the JB-2 bomb prior to September 15, 1944.

The Detroit division is requested to make a similar check of the appropriate Ford Company files pertaining to their participation in the production of the jet system for the JD-3 bomb under subcontract with USAF. From information made engils able through EACA it appears that a motor or jet assembly produced by Ford Company for the JB-3 bomb had the dimensions for pulse jet plus burners of 16 inches in length and 8 to 9 inches in diameter. It should be determined whether this was the paly jet assembly or unit produced by that company for the JB-3 toub and the dimensional specifications with respect to any other white made by that company for this bomb. Further, it should be ascertained whether the original specifications for this unit may have eatled for a shopter length and smaller diameter.

records which were made available by MACA concerning
this project.


It was pointed out that one of the Photostats furnished by MACA was a nemorandum prepared by Abe Silverstein, Perl's immediate superior at the Lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory, Cleveland. This memorandum which was dated January S, 1945, was entitled "Visit to Bright Pield, December G, 1944, by Abe Silverstein and Billiam Mutterperl of Ingine Installation Research Regarding Army Air Force's Program on MACA Long-Range Guided Missilse." It is noted that one of the references cited in this report was the secret progress report of the Army Air Force, dated April S, 1945, which was entitled "Guided Missiles Development, Status, and Availability."

According to Mr. Robert Bell, Security Officer, NACA, Washington, D. C., it is of some dignificance to note that according to the records of NACA, Bashington, D. C., and according to a distribution list by the Air Materiel Command dated January E8, 1945, pertaining to the abovementioned quided missiles report there was no record that any copy was ever made auditable to the Lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory of NACA, in Cleveland; however, Mr. Bell stated that he has been advised through their Security Officer in Cleveland that records of the Cleveland Laboratory reflect that two copies of this report were received by that Laboratory on October 27, 1942, which copies were power destroyed on June 28, 1851.

In view of the above information, it is requested that the Cleveland Office immediately contact Ur. K. Burton Bracy, Security Officer of the Cleveland NACA Laboratory for any information available as to the course of that Laboratory's two copies of instant guided missiles report. An examination should also be made of any available charge out records which might reflect that a copy thereof was at may time made available to Abe Silverstein, killiam Perl, or to Bilverstein for Perl. During this inquiry you should also accertain under whose instructions and for what reason the two copies of this report which had been available at the Cleveland NACA Laboratory were destroyed, on June 26, 1951.

The above information is believed to be of some significance bearing in mind the previous information made available to your office to the effect that copy No. 55 of instant guided missiles report which had been issued to MACA's Langley Field Laboratory has been missing since the latter part of 1944 or the early part of 1945. Further, it is significant to note that on or about the latter part of August or the first part of Sentember, 1944, Robert L. Jones, one of the aeronautic entineers from Langley Field into whose reseasion No. 55 was known to have been entrusted during the latter part of 1944, make a trip to Gleveland where he visited the Cleveland NACA Laboratory.

It is also desired that the Cincinnati Office make an appropriate check at the Fright-Patterson Air Base for any record which may be available there reflecting that will be two copies of instant guided missiles report was made available to FACA in Cleveland. In the event no such record is located,

it is suggested that it be determined whether any copy thereof was furnished to their liaison officer with WASA in Cleveland in which event it night be possible that he made his copy-available to that Laboratory for photostating.

It is requested this matier be given your immediate attention.
