While in Denmark, he visited the Astronomical Observatory, Mineralogical Institute and the Agricultural College, all in Comenhagen. While there, he contacted

In Sweden he attended and delivered a paper at the International Congress on Pure and Applied Chemistry at Stockholm. He also visited the Technical High School, the Geological Museum and the Atomic Energy Commission Laboratory, all located in Stockholm. He contacted

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In Switzerland, he stated he attended a Geochemical Conference, attended by approximately fifty delegates from several nations.

of the United States Geological Survey reportedly was one of the presiding officers of this group.

Dr. Urey said that he met a Professor and of the University of Zurich. He made short visits to the Technical High School and the Physics Laboratory of the University of Zurich.

While in England, Dr. Urey said he visited Professor at Cambridge University and Professor at Oxford University. He also delivered an informal lecture to the Chemical Group at the Atomic Energy Establishment at Harwell. While in London, he stated he visited of the Pergamen Press.

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

Dear Mr. Hoover:

Reference is made to your letter of Scotember 17, 1953. concerning Dr. Harold Urey, which requested possible identification of documents which Dr. Urey allegedly furnished relating to research progress in the U.S. atomic energy program; whether documents of this type were charged to Dr. Urey and whether they have been returned; and also, an evaluation of the security significance of information in Dr. Urey's possession.

Based on the data furnished in your letter, it has not been possible to identify the documents which were allegedly passed, since the information furnished is too general.

A listing of Research and Development reports furnished Dr. Urey from several AEC and AEC Contractor offices is being compiled and will be compared with a document inventory of Dr. Urey's material which is presently being obtained by our Chicago Security Office. When this inventory is completed, we will _ be in a position to advise on the accountability of pertinent documents furnished to Dr. Urey. It will be recomized, however, that such advice will include only Research and Development reports. Otherwise, it will be necessary to contact a considerable number of project personnel and obtain a complete listing of all other types of classified communications sent to Dr. Urey.

As you are aware, Dr. Urey has been associated with the atomic energy project since its inception, having been appointed a member of the Committee on Uranium by the National Defense Research Committee in October 1940. His subsequent participation in the Manhattan Engineer District and the AEC program have afforded him considerable access to classified atomic ener information

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Or. Urey is an expert in the field of applied chemistry and is presently a member of the Isotope Separation Committee and a consultant to the Washington Division of Research as well as the Oak Fidge and Chicago Operations Offices.

Dr. Urey is fully informed concerning research and development in the separation of uranium isotopes. He has also had full access to Research and Development data on the Alloy Development Program. Such access could indicate to him, in a general way, the direction of a phase of the thermonuclear program. His knowledge of U²³⁵ operations at Oak Pidge would make it possible for him to arrive at approximate production rates, due to his familiarity with the process.

Because of Dr. Urey's association with many project scientists and attendance at various classified meetings, sometimes involving other phases of atomic energy work, he has acquired some knowledge of progress in the Atomic Energy program outside of the fields mentioned above. Specific information on this point is being obtained and will be furnished you.

In sum, Dr. Urey is currently well informed on two major phases of security significance in the Commission program: (a) uranium isotope separation, (b) one major segment of the thermonuclear weapon program.

We will appreciate your continued expeditious investigation of this matter.

This will supplement our letter of October 19, 1953, concerning Dr. Urey. As indicated in this letter, a listing of Research and Development reports has been obtained from appropriate AEC Operations Offices and compared with the log record of classified documents kept by Dr. Urey's office. In addition, the AEC Chicago Security Office made a physical inventory of such documents and none were found to be missing.

Since Dr. Urey shares a suite of offices and a safe repository with Dr. General Advisory Committee member, an inventory is also being made of documents in spossession. Preliminary reports from the AEC Chicago Security Office indicate that several of the documents charged to cannot be immediately located. The inventory is continuing and you will be advised of the results as soon as the inventory is completed. In this connection, steps are being taken to furnish with a separate safe repository.

In referenced letter you were advised that specific information would be obtained to determine whether Dr. Urey has had access to classified information in fields other than mentioned therein. Based on additional reports received from pertinent AEC Operations Offices on this point, it does not appear that any change in the evaluation previously furnished you is required.

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

I have so stated publicly and will do so again in the future. In this activity I have not been a formal member of any group and have paid my own expenses.

During the Spanish Civil War I held the view that the Loyalists were a less dark shade of gray than Franco and his followers, and I still hold to this view. At the end of the Spanish Civil War I dropped all connectio and activity of any kind with groups interested in these problems, and hav had no connection with any such group since then. I have no memory of having belonged to any of the various organizations interested in the Spanish Civil War and listed by the Attorney General, but I may have had such connections and have forgotten them. I have had no active contact with any such organizations since before World War II.

Reference is made to the Bureau's memorandum of November 11, 1955, returning Personnel Security Questionnaires executed by the abovenamed individual on October 21, 1955 in connection with his employment with the Union Carbide Nuclear Company, X-10 Plant, Oak Ridge, (Tennessee.

It is also noted that the "loyalty" report prepared by Special Agent Mario Gregorio at Chicago, Illinois, dated March 15, 1952, on page 10, reflects that Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability and a well respected and successful individual in the Chicago area, advised that Drey is outspoken when among other scientists and may possibly unknowingly divulge security information; that he is basically honest and sincere, but because of his past affiliations with questionable organizations, informant felt that Urey may possibly unknowingly align himself with other questionable organizations or individuals. It is requested that this informant be recontacted for any information he may be able to furnish concerning Urey at this time.

The report prepared by Special Agent Howard Fletcher, Jr., at Washington, D. C., dated February 3, 1954, reflects that the records of the Passport Division, Department of State, contain a letter from Urey dated August 18, 1952, in which he stated that since the war he had been Director of the Atlantic Union Committee. Any information that can be furnished concerning the Atlantic Union Committee will be most helpful.

It is further noted that the "Daily Worker" of February 25, 1954, carried an article entitled "Urey Urges Spread of Truth on Rosenbergs". This article indicates that Urey sent a telegram to be read at a memorial service held for Emanuel Block, Attorney for the Rosenbergs. The telegram urged that the memory of Lawyer Block be honored by informing the American people of the "great injustice" done to Ethel and Julius Rosenberg. The Washington, D. C. 

Poar Mr. Hoover:

Reference is made to your letter of March 1, 1951, subjectas above, in which you requested the identity and location of the facilities, both AEC and privately owned, which were engaged in and had knowledge of FEPA. This will also confirm the discussion between Special Agents Lamphere and Emrich and members of my staff on this subject.

A history of NEPA (Nuclear Emergy Propulsion of Aircraft) may be useful as background for your investigation. The EMEPA Division of Pairchild Engine and Eirplane Corporation under contract to the U.S. Air Force was established and moved into the S-50 Area of Cak Ridge, Termossee, in the fall of 1946. The initial efforts of the LEPA staff were devoted to literature surveys, compilation of nuclear and other data from AEC sources, its analysis and development of a comprehensive program. By the middle of 1947 most of these surveys, analyses and some basic experimentation had been performed by Northrop, Frederic Flader, MIT and the MEPA group.

Fy the fall of 1948, the basic research program was well under way in the MEPA Project. (Appendix A lists key officials during 1948-50 period.) To aid in this program, Member Companies to MEPA were to participate. (Appendix B lists these

<u>,</u>

companies with the nemos of key officials, and Appendix C lists the companies only.) In addition, a number of scientists prominent in their respective fields were retained as consultants. (See Appendix D.)

During Tate 1947 and early 1948 the AEC entered into a contract with the Essachusetts Institute of Technology to form a group known as the Lexington Projectato investigate the status of nuclear energy for the propulsion aircraft and to make recommendations as to the future course of studies to be made in this field. This study was conducted at Loxington, Lassachusetts, under the Chairmanship of Dr. Walter C. Whitman, Mead, Department of Chemical Engineering, HIT. The work was performed by members of the faculty of HIT and from many other sources. The group completed its work and submitted its report to the Commission on September 30, 1943. Attached as Appendix E is a list of technical personnel of the Lexington Project.

The report submitted to the Commission was titled "Muclear-Powered Flight" and is classified SECKET. Chapter III of the report concerned "Power Plants." This chapter was expanded upon in a supplemental report titled "Appendices to Chapter III - Power Plants, Nuclear-Powered Flight." The supplement is a mathematical analysis of a nuclear power plant, and is also classified SECKET.

Collowing the report, on December 2, 1208, the Ad Hoo Cormittee for the APP (Aircraft Suclear Propulsion) was formed consisting of representatives of the Air Force, Havy Eureau of Aeronautics and the EACA, under the Chairmanship of Dr. L. E. Bathatad, Director, Division of Meactor Development, AdC. This committee was to act as the general policy forming committee for the over-all AMP Program participated in by the ALC, Department of Defense and MACA.

The AEC portion of the program was instituted at Calt Minge Entional Laboratory under the technical direction of Dr. Alvin Meinberg (see Appendix F); the FACA program at the Lawis Flight Laboratory, Clevaland, Ohio, under the technical direction of Dr. Abe Silverstein; and the Air Force was to centinue at the FYPA Division of the Fairchild Engine and Airplane Corporation at Cak Ridge with various supcontractors to FEPA. The subcontractors are detailed in Appendices B and C.

for Lexington Project report referred to above contains an appendix reflecting visits and discussions made by Lexington Project personnel with individuals in other organizations. Those discussions which concerned nuclear power plants were extracted and are contained in Appendix G.

The informant further advised that efforts were being made to compile a listing of research and development reports furnished Doctor UREY from several Atomic Energy Commission and Atomic Energy Commission contractor offices. Then this inventory is completed the informant will be in a positi on to advise on the accountability of pertinent documents furnished to Doctor UREY.

The informant stated that Doctor UREY has been associated with the Atomic Energy project since its inception having been appointed a member of this Committee on Uraniam by the National Defense Research Committee in October, 1940. His subsequent participation in the Hanhattan Engineerithm District and the Atomic Energy Commission Program have afforded him considerable access to classified Atomic Energy information. UREY was described by the informant as an expert in the field of applied chemistry and a present member of the Isotope Separation Committee and a consultant to the Washington Division of Research as well as the Oak Ridge and Chicago Operations office. The informant related that UREY was fully informed concerning research and development in the separation of uraniam isotopes and has also had full access to research and develoment data on the Alloy Development Program. In the informant's opinion, such access could indicate to UREY in a general way the direction of a phase of the Thermonuclear Program. Also UREY'S knowledge of U-235 operations at Oak Ridge would make it possible for him to arrive at approximate production rates due to his familiarity with the process. a Di Lamer

Because of UREY'S association with many project scientists and attendants at various classified meetings sometimes involving other phases of Atomic Energy work he has acquired some knowledge of progress in the Atomic Energy Program outside of the fields mentioned above and the informant advised that specific information on this point was being obtained.





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

REFERENCE:

Memorandum from Mr. Hennrich to Mr. Belmont dated July 12, 1951, recommending that Liaison make inquiry of the Atomic Energy Commission in connection with above investigation. The following information has been received from the AEC in answer to the five questions in referenced memorandum.

"(1) The exact date when the NEPA #4 Report was completed and disseminated by AEC."

"(4) If appropriate charge out records were maintained, do these records indicate that a copy was furnished to NACA, Cleveland, to the Pupin Physics Laboratory, Columbia University, or to Dr.
Theordore Van Rarman, who was serving as an advisor to the Department of the Air Force?"

Answer: " AEC records at Oak Ridge and Washington do not reflect that a copy of NEPA #4 was furnished to NACA, Cleveland, to the Pupin Physics Laboratory, Columbia University, or to either Dr. Theodore Von Karman or the Department of the Air Force."

"(5) If the charge out records do not indicate that copies were directly submitted to any of the foregoing, how many copies of the NEPA #4 Report were distributed to NACA in Washington and the Department of the Air Force?"

Answer: "To determine how many copies of NEPA #4 were distributed to NACA in Washington and the Dept. of the Air Force, NEPA organization records would have to be checked."

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that this memorandum be furnished to the Espionage Section.

You-will-recall that, on the bolds of information received that in 1948 Rosenberg allegedly had received the mathematics on the NEPA (Nuclear Energy for the Propulsion of Airplanes) Project, an extensive investigation has been conducted with view of determining the exact phase of the NEPA Project which Posenberg may have obtained and the identity of the doormant or report which served as the source of his information. To this end, a thorough check has been made as to the possible availability of the socalled "Lexington Report" to Villian Perl, who was indicated as having been the person from whom Rosenberg obtained the NEPA material.

As you are arms, this investigation to date has been unproductive. in developing any indication that Perl actually had access to the "Lexington Report," wither through his employment at NACA (National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics), Lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory, Cleveland, Ohio, or his association with Dr. Theodore Von Karman of the Pupin Physics Laboratory, Columbia University, Hew York City. One of the principal inconsistencies which has arisen in this investigation was with respect to the time element. It is noted that, according to David Greenglass, confessed Soulet agent, Rosenberg is supposed to have had the LEPA material early in 1948, whereas the "Lexington Report" was not completed until September 30, 1948. In view thereof, efforts have been made through AEC and NACA to determine whether any other report on NEPA may have been available prior to the date of the completion of the "Lexington Report."

During a recent contact with Bobert Bell, Security -Office# for NACA, 'it was learned that there had been an emplier report on the NEPA Project which was known as NEPA #4. According to Bell, ithis report was completed in 1947 or early 1948.

C., together with the dates that they is the received these reports. The exact periods that these copies of the NEPA #4 report were in the possession of the library should be ascertained, as well as the identity of any and all persons who may have charged out the report during those periods. It should be specifically determined whether there is any record indicating that Perl, Dr. Von Karman, or any scientist or employee of the Pupin Physics Laboratory may have charged out this document.

The New York division should likewise contact
Dr. Theodore Yon Karman at the Pupin Physics Laboratory in
New York City for any information in his possession concerning
the MEPA #4 report. In the event it is determined that he
was furnished withan copy of this report, you should ascertain
where this document was kept while in his office and the possible access which Perl may have had to this report. The exact

Reurlet September 22, 1951, wherein you requested the Hashington Field Office to interview Er. Theodore Von Karman—with the view of seeking his authority for the Bureau to examine the various MACA reports made available to his office during the period that subject Ferl served as his assistant.

You were advised by Bulet to the Legal Attache, Paris, France dated October 1, 1951, a copy of which was designated for your office that Von Karman was now located in Paris, France and that the Legal Attache has been requested to appropriately interview him along the lines suggested in reflet.

It was noted in your letter that a Major Meyer of USAF, who was possibly a Security and Intelligence Officer from Rashington, D. C., assisted Von Karman in June, 1951, in reviewing, packing for shipment or destroying the latter's files and records formerly maintained in the Pupin Laboratory at Columbia University, New Tork. For your information, one Alfred Randolph Bobrowski was resently interviewed by the Detroit Division with reference to the possibility that subject may have had access to the "Lexington Report" pertaining to the NEPA (Nuclear Energy for Fropulsion of Airplanes) Project while a copy of this report was in the possession of Bobrowski, then an employee of the Lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory of the National Advisory Committee For Aeronautics (NACA) at Cleveland, Chio.

Euring the course of this interview Bobrowski confidentially advised that as a matter of speculation the information relative to the NEPA Project on the "Lexington Report" might have been made available to unauthorized persons such as Perl through an individual named (FNU) Turkel, a librarian for NEPA and co-author of a paper. According to Bobrowski, Turkel was a graduate of CCNY and to his knowledge Turkel had on one occasion visited the NACA Laboratory in Cleveland.

It might be mentioned that Bobrowski stated he had no reason to question Turkel's loyalty but was merely furnishing this information for what it might be worth.

A check of the Eufiles reflects that in 1947 an investigation was conducted relative to one Solomon Henry Turkel as an applicant under the Atomic Energy Act. It is noted from a review of this file that Turkel attended CCNY from September, 1929, to June, 1934, and that at the time of the investigation Turkel was being considered for employment as an applicant in the NFPA Division of the Fairchild Engine and Airplane Corporation, Mak Pidge, Tennessee. In view of this information it appears that Solomon Henry Turkel is possibly identical with the (FNU) Turkel referred to by Bobrowski. (116-23343)

Pursuant to the Bureau's request the Knozville Office contacted G. A. Gocdgin, Plant Protection Officer, NEPA, Fairchild Engine and Airplane Corporation, Oak Ridge, Tennessee. Goedgin advised—that he—did—not—personally know—Turkel—but—that—the HEPA records reflected Turkel voluntarily resigned his position at Oak Ridge on February 18, 1949. No forwarding address was available in the NEPA files. According to the NEPA records Turkel was employed as a Director of Technical Information for a period of time but during the latter part of his employment period had actually worked as a Senior Physicist in the capacity of Special Assistant to a Mr. Arthur Niller. The over—all dates of Turkel's employment with NEPA at Oak Ridge were from July 1, 1946, to February 18, 1949.

It was suggested by the Knoxville Division that the Dureau may be able to ascertain the present whereabouts and place of employment of Solomon Henry Turkel through a review of his AEC file in Fashington, D. C.

An appropriate check was made of the AFC records,
Washington, D. C. and it was determined that as of November,

was employed as a Research Physicist
and member of the Senior Staff of Operations Research Office,

Inasmuch as a check of the Bufiles as well as the files of the Knoxville Division have failed to indicate any identifiable subversive record with respect to Turkel, it is desired that your office conduct an immediate interview of Turkel concerning this matter. During the course of this interview you should ascertain whether he was acquainted with subject Ferl and had any contact with Perl at the time of his visit to the Lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory in Cleveland, Ohio. In the event he is acquainted and had contact with Perl he should be further interrogated concerning the possibility of his having made available to Perl any information concerning either the HEPA Project or the "Lexington Report."

This letter advised in substance that the NACA reports receipted for by PERL at NYC on 7/3/48 were not available in the files of NACA, Washington, and requested investigation to determine the present location thereof including an interview with Dr. THEODORE/VON KARMAN.

Reference is also made to Eureau letter to New York, 8/21/51, a photostatic copy of which is enclosed herewith for the Washington Field Office for its information. This letter concerns the availability to PERL of the Lexington Report dated September 30, 1948 (designated by NEPA as Lex P-1) and of the NEPA No. 4 Technical Report dated May 14, 1947. This letter also requests an interview with Dr. THEODORE VON KARMAN.

It has been determined that VON KARMAN is currently at the Pentagon in Washington and the Washington Field Office is, therefore, being requested to make this contact. In this regard the attention of the Washington Field Office is directed to New York letter to the Bureau dated 8/2/51 which requested the obtaining of these NACA reports for transmittal to the FBI Laboratory.

Inquiry of Professor CARL F. KAYAW. Heed of the Legartmen Columbia University, NYC, revealed that Dr. VON KARMAN maintained an office in the laboratory from February, 1947 to June, 1951. He was physically present on the campus during the period February to June, 1947, when he acted as a guest lecturer in a class designated as "Physics 212-Aero Thermodynamics", which class met on Monday evenings. Thereafter, he has visited the campus only at irregular intervals; however, he has maintained files at the laboratory during the entire period.

These files were kept in an official U. S. Air Force safe approximately 3 cubic feet in measurement with a combination lock and in one 4-drawer metal file cabinet with key lock and in one 2-drawer metal file cabinet, also with a key lock. The latter two cabinets were the property of Columbia University. During the above period VON KARMAN'S files were maintained in the space allocated to him in Room 831, later Room 1020 and since the fall of 1948 in Room 429.

In June, 1951, at which time VON KARMAN came to NYC en route to Yale University to receive an honorary degree, he, together with a Major NEYER, USAF, reviewed and sorted VON KARMAN'S files and records. The above safe was locked and crated for shipment to VON KARMAN'S office in the Pentagon. The contents of the two file cabinets were placed in cartons, some of which were shipped to the Pentagon and some were sent to VON KARMAN'S home in Pasadena.

A portion of the material was taken by VON KARMAN and Major MEYER and Professor KAYAN to the furnace in the power plant at Columbia University and burned. Professor KAYAN stated that he was present but did not actively participate in the above project and for this reason he does not know the identity of those files shipped to Washington and Pasadena and those which were burned.

Professor K.YAN, could not further identify Major
MEYER but believes he is an Air Corps Security or Intelligence
Officer either from NYC or Washington, D. C. Inquiry at
the OSI, USAF, New York City, revealed that he is not
attached to the New York area and that no information as to
his identity is available.

Professor KAYAN advised further that he recently heard that Dr. VON KARMAN is due to arrive in Washington from Pasadena on or about September 22 instant and that he intends to depart for Europe in the near future.

The Washington Field Office is requested to make : inquiry at the Pentagon for Dr. VON KARMAN and to determine

from him the present location of instant MACA reports. In the event Major MEYER is also located at the Pentagon, it is suggested that he may be of assistance in this regard. If Dr. VON KARMAN has possession of these reports, it is requested that they be obtained in accordance with Bureau instructions contained in Bulet dated 8/30/51.

In the event these reports are now located in Pasadena, the Washington Field Office is requested to obtain authority from VON KARMAN for the Los Angeles Office to obtain the reports from VON KARMAN'S office in Pasadena and to so advise Los Angeles.

Both the Washington Field Office and the Los Angeles Office are cautioned that if these reports are located, a record of the chain of custody be maintained for possible future use as evidence.

For the information of Los Angeles, the reports referred to above as "NACA reports" are those MACA reports listed in the report of SA JOHN P. BUSCHER, 9/21/50, Washington, D. C., pages 32-36. One photostatic copy of New York letter to bureau dated 8/2/51 is forwarded with copy hereof to Los Angeles for its information in the event future inquiries to locate the NACA reports are requested of that office.

The Washington Field Office is also requested to cover the leads set forth for the New York Office in Bulet to New York dated 8/21/51 on page 5 involving the interview of Dr. VON KARMAN concerning the NEPA No. 4 Technical Report. In this connection the Knoxville Office has advised that the NEPA records at Oak Ridge, Tennessee, of the original dissemination of NEPA No. 4 do not include Dr. THEODORD VON KARMAN, the Pupin Physics Leboratory or the NACA, Cleveland.

The Washington Field Office is also requested to discuss with Dr. VON KARMAN information set forth on page 2 of Bureau letter of 8/30/51 concerning any NACA reports not presently located in the possession of Dr. VON KARMAN in view of the information received from GREGORI A. TOKAEV, the Soviet defector.

AEC Classified Library at NYC failed to reflect that NEPA No. 4 was ever in the possession of PERL, Von KARMAN or any scientist or employee of the Pupin Laboratory. It was learned that only two copies of this report have ever been in the library and they were maintained in a sealed condition and not disseminated. Likewise, these records do not reflect dissemination of any copy of the Lexington Report (Lex P-1) dated September 30, 1948, to PERL, VON KARMAN or any scientist or employee of the Pupin Laboratory.

Investigation at Columbia University is continuing to determine who of the individuals known to have had possession of the Lex P-1 and the NEPA No. 4 reports may have been at Columbia University in an official or unofficial capacity during the pertinent period.

In view of VON KARMAN'S anticipated departure for Europe the Washington Field Office is requested to give immediate attention to the leads set forth herein.



In view of the fact that his records have not been transferred, he apparently has not obtained other General Meetric Company employment. The records reflect that he resided at 1204 Union Street in 1949; 1466 Nott Street in 1949; and 66 Bradford Road in 1950.

You will recall that David Greenglass, confessed Soviet agent, testified in the recent New York espionage trial that, sometime during 1948, Julius Rosenberg told him he, Rosenberg, had the mathematics on the problem of atomic energy for airclanes which problem had just been completed by the scientists. At the time of a subsequent interview of Greenglass, it was learned that this statement was probably made to him by Rosenberg in September or October, 1948, but there was the possibility the information may have been received in the Spring of that year.

In addition, you are advised that Jerome Eugene Tartakow, a fellow prisoner with Rosenberg in the Federal Nouse of Detention in New York City, has reported certain information which he claims to have received through his conversations with Rosenberg. Accor ing to Tartakow, Posenberg recently advised him that Ferl had furnished him (Rosenberg) much valuable information, including the plans for the use of nuclear fission to propel airplanes. He also stated that Rosenberg told him Perl was a brilliant man in the field of serodynamics and that some of the material furnished to him (Rosenberg) by Perl was "terrific."

As a result of the aforementioned statement by Greenglass, an inquiry has been made of AEC as to the exact nature of the information to which Rosenberg may have made reference in his conversation with Greenflass. As a result thereof, it was learned that the material undoubtedly pertained to the highly confidential NEPA (Nuclear Energy Propulsion of Aircraft) Project. It was further indicated that the mathematics pertaining to the project would undoubtedly refer to the mathematics of the power plant in the NEPA Project. [According to AEC, the final report on the NEPA Project, which was known as the "Lexington Report" and was entitled "Nuclear Fower Plant." was completed on September 30, 1950. It was learned that Chapter III of this report concerned "power plants" and that the mathematical

analysis of a nuclear power plant appeared in a supplemental report entitled "Appendices to Chapter III - Power Plants, Nuclear-Powered Flight." The AEC has advised that all of the aforementioned reports pertaining to the NEPA Project were then and are now classified secret.

Pursuant to a request by the Bureau, the AEC is presently making a routine security check to determine the initial and original distribution that was made with respect to the "Lexington Report," as well as the present location of all copies of this report, including the copies of the appendices to Chapter III. For your information and assistance in connection with the hereinafter requested investigation, there is being attached hereto a copy of the letter which was received from AEC dated March 30, 1951, together with its various enclosures.

You will note in Appendix 2 of the reference ANC letter there appear the names of the technical personnel of the Lexington Project. This list contains the name of one Addison E. Rothrock of NACA, who was indicated as having been on loan to AEC. It will also be noted that Appendix G of this referenced communication indicates that, in July and August, 1948, Abe Silverstein and E. J. Manganiello of NACA, Cleveland, were consulted by Lexington Project personnel relative to the power plants in the NEPA Project.

Inasmuch as a previous inquiry by the Cleveland division at NACA lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory, Cleveland, Ohio, has reflected that Rothrock, Silverstein, and Manganielle were all employees at that laboratory during 1948, it would be of interest to determine exactly what information pertaining to the mathematics of the power plant with respect to the NEPA Project was available to the NACA Laboratory in Cleveland during this period, as well as the approximate dates when such material was available there.

To this end, the Washington Field division is requested to thoroughly interview Addison Rothrock, who was reported as having handled the lisison for NACA between Cleveland and Washington, D. C. It is also

requested that the Cleveland division similarly interview Dr. Abe
Silverstein, who was the technical director of this program at
NACA, Cleveland, and Eugene J. Manganiello, who was directly connected
with the development of the program at that laboratory. During the
course of these interviews, it should be specifically determined what
reports as to the mathematics of the power plants pertaining to the NETA
Project were available, the approximate dates, and in whose custody such
reports were maintained. Further, these persons should be questioned as
to whether the appendix of Chapter III of the Lexington Report was in
the possession of the NACA Lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory, Cleveland,
either in rough draft form or as a finished report, and, if so, the date
this report was available and in whose custody it was maintained. They
should be directly interrogated as to the possibility of any such information pertaining to the NEPA or Lexington Projects being available to
William Perl.

For the information of the Detroit division, it was ascertained at NACA, Cleveland, that Alfred R. Bobrowsky, a former employee of NACA, performed the analytical work on shielding and was also engaged in material studies for the project. Further, that his report on the method of computation for the shielding was distributed, after being reduced to report form. According to the Bureau's information, one of the principal drawbacks to the production of the plane involved in the NEPA Project was the excessive weight caused by the shielding surrounding the source of nuclear energy which, it might be noted, was apparently the phase of the work assigned to Bobrowsky. It has been pointed out to the Bureau that, in view thereof, such information would have been of considerable value to any person interested in the project, since it could evert unnaccessary research and experimentation.

The Detroit division was previously authorized to interview Bobrowsky concerning William Perl by Bureau letter of January 15, 1951. This interview should immediately be conducted by experienced agents of that office, and full information should be obtained from him as to the nature of the work he performed on the NEPA Project, the identity of the

NACA employees who may have assisted him in the work, the types of the report or reports which he prepared and the approximate dates thereof, and the availability of such reports to other employees at NACA, particularly William Perl. During this interview, the extent of his association with Perl should be ascertained, as well as any information which he might have concerning the participation of or his discussion with Perl concerning the NEPA Project.

The Cleveland office should also ascertain further information as to the nature and exact dates of all reports known to have been submitted by Bobrowsky as a result of his research in the NEPA Project, together with any available information as to the possible access of Perl to such reports.

This matter should be given expeditious attention, in view of the iminence of the trial of Ferl for perjury in SDMY, which is tentatively set for the early part of May, 1951.

NOTE: Check Bufiles on Rothrock and Manganiello failed to develop any information of a derogatory, subversive nature. Both were investigated under AEA. Cleveland has also advised nothing derogatory in its files re these persons.

Bufile search previously made as to Abe Silverstein and only derogatory information located appears in AEA file wherein he was alleged to have made a pro-Soviet speech on 3/12/31 before the Kiwanis Club in Fampton, Virginia.

Silverstein has been previously interviewed by Cleveland office relative to Perl. (65-59312)

The files of the Atomic Phergy Commission, Chicago Operations Office, Lemont, Illincis, reflect that HARDLD CLAYTON UREY was granted Q clearance December 1,1947 while employed as a consultant by the Brookhaven National Laboratory, Upton, New York. Those files further reflect that on Pobruary 17, 1949 G-2 Section, Fifth Army needquarters, Chicago, Illinois, requested clearance information regarding UREY who was to be processed for clearance for work of interest to the Army by reason of his employment or consultantship for the Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland.

According to the above files, Dr. Jamy was reinstated for a clearance February 3, 1949 and reaffirmed for Q clearance on July 1, 1950 and May 25, 19pt inasmuch as he is presently employed by this office on a consultant pasi...

great enjoyment in appearing in the public press, radio and television. These individuals advised that because of his obtaining of enjoyment through publicity, he is prone to accept numerous invitations and may frequently make statements which would be quoted in the press and other-channels of publicity. Andividuals interviewed, however, stated that Dr. UREY during the past-four or five years not been more careful than ever in being wrongfully associated with questionable organizations or individuals. They stated, however, he is often misquoted by the press but no rarely asked for a retraction of his misquotes or any explanation whatspever.

During the course of this investigation numerous files and newspaper articles were reviewed. Activities prior to 19h7 were not mentioned in the body of the report in accordance with Bureau instructions.

Information in Chicago files (Chicago file 107-2552) refleats a memorandum, subject "SECHRITT FACILITIES OF THE AVOID ENERGY COMMISSION - ATOMIC EXEMOT MATTERS". This memorandum concerns the explanation of the jurisdiction of the Bureau with respect to atomic energy matters as discussed by SA W. RUKON PAXMAN with various individuals whose names appear on the Atomic Energy Cosmission Facility List.

In accordance with the above, Dr. HARDLD CLAFTER URBY was interviewed by SA W. RULON PAXMAN on August 7, 1950. The same random reflects that after the discession relative to Bureau jurisdiction Dr. URBY stated that in his opinion the FBI should be given authority to summarily arrest and interme all Communists and fellow travelers in case World War. 3 should break out. He further stated that he had been delighted at the Director's centinging endeavors to maintain the FBI as a purely investigating agency.
