

Mrs. ALFRED SARANT has advised in interview that KUNTZT was formerly a student at Cornell University, Ithaca, MY.

On 8/15/50, SA NORBET T. DEMBINSKI contacted DAN McCLINCHEY. elevator operation at 201 West 16th Street. Mr. McCLINCHEY advised that the DALE referred to above is DALE GALSTON, son-in-law of EDWARD KUNTZ, Chairman of the ALP. He nelated that GALSTON, upon his return from the Navy, married EDWARD KUNTZ'S daughter and resided at his father-in-law's apartment for two years.

Mr. McCLINCHEY further stated that GALSTON and his wife then left for California where they remained until June, 1950, at which time GALSTON and his wife returned to NYC enroute to Stockholm, Sweden, where they presently reside (8/15/50).

He stated that GALSTON is the father of two children and described him as being about 30 years of age, 5'10" tall, 150 pounds. dark complexion, black wavy hair, a round face, and a good dresser.

The current Manhattan telephone directory reflects that VA 9-7557 is subscribed to by BEATRICE KUNTZ, 201 West 16th Street.

On 6/21/51 SA ROBERT F. ROYAL ascertained through the utilization of a telephone call to Mrs. BEATRICE KUNTZ, 201 West 16th Street, WA 9-7557, that her daughter, is DALE GALSTON and not her son-in-law. The GALSTONS are currently residing in California; however, Mrs. KUNTZ declined to furnish their home 17E address or any further identifying data.

On 6/22/54, Mr. EVERT HANSEN, superintendent of the 201 West 16th Street apartment building, was contacted by SA ROYAL. He stated that DALE GALSTON is the daughter of EDWARD and BEATRICK KUNTZ who are tenants in his building. The GALSTONS lived with her parents for a short period of time, approximately three or four years, and it is his recollection that they have at least one child. He stated that he did not know where the GALSTONS are currently residing nor did he know DALE GALSTON'S husband's first name.

Mr. FRANK DIVONA, elevator operator at the 201 West 16th Street apartment building, advised SA ROYAL on 6/22/54, that DALE GALSTON is the daughter of EDWARD and BEATRICE KUNTZ and she is believed to be residing with her husband in Pasadena, California, where he is a teacher in some unknown name college or university. He believes that DALE GALSTON'S husband has his Doctor's Degree; however, he does not know his first name.

It is Mr. DIVONA'S recollection that Dr. GALSTON was in Stockholm, Sweden several years ago in connection with the Stockholm Peace Movement.

Mr. THOMAS GRADY, evening elevator operator at the 201 West 16th Street apartment building, advised SA ROYAL on 6/22/54 that DALE GALSTON is believed to be the daughter of EDWARD and BEATRICE KUNTZ. He stated he did not know/GALSTONS current address nor did he know DALE GALSTON'S husband's first name. He believes that they have two children and resided with her parents in this apartment building several years ago. He believes that the GALSTONS spent about one year in Sweden in approximately 1950.

On 6/22/54 SA ROYAL made inquiry at the Old Chelses Station, 217 West 18th Street, NY 11, NY. There was no return address card

In the "Daily Worker" issue of 9/29/52, page 2, columns 2,3, and 4, an article entitled, "93 Notables Ask Attorney-General To Release Martin Young on Bail" appeared. Among the signers was Professor ARTHUR W. GALSTON from California.

The indices of the NYO failed to reflect any additional references to DALE KUNTZ GALSTON. Her father, EDWARD KUNTZ, Sr., is the subject of a closed SM-C investigation, NY 100-57153, Bufile 100-332402. He is an SI subject.

Mr. T. AVERY, INS, NYC. advised SA ROBERT G. GRANVILLE of this office, on 2/14/51, that who was then employed for INS and who is a defected Communist, stated that he was a member of the CP in 1936 and 1937, and, at that time, he knew EDWARD KUNTZ, the attorney for MORTON SOBELL, was likewise a member of the CP. 17d

It is recalled that MORTON SOBELL is currently serving 30 years at the US Penitentiary at Alcatraz, for conspiracy to commit espionage against the US.

Concerning BEATRICE KUNTZ. nee GAVBER, wa: Mrs. EDWARD KUNTZ, Sr. of known reliability, furnished SAS CHRISTOPHER J. PAPPIANOU and WILLIAM F. ROEMER, Jr. on 4/8-9/53, information to the effect that during the course of an investigation (June, 1951 to April 16, 1953) into suspected Communist affiliations, which was conducted by the NY School Board of Education concerning their teachers Mrs. EDWARD KUNTZ, 201 West 16th Street, NY, resigned her teaching 67d position.

DORIS MILLER, clerk, Columbia University, has advised that during the summer of 1950 the registration card for PAUL. M. MEDOW, 13h West 97th Street, New York City, reflected that he was taking all graduate economic courses. He was born March 10, 1926, in Prague, Czechoslovakia. He listed himself as a United States citizen and his mother's name as "MRS. CH. KROTKOV". The registration card further reflected that he had attended College of the City of New York before the war and graduated from Cornell in 1950 with a BA degree.

The central files of INS, Washington, D. C., have reflected that PAUL MICHAEL MEDOW, eka; PAUL MANCFORT, was born on March 10, 1926 in Prague, Czechoslovakie and received Certificate of Naturalization #6161104, admitting him to United States citizenship on August 19, 1944 at United States District Court for the Northern District of Alabama at Anniston, Alabama. The name of Professor GLEM KROTKOV, 280 Kingston, Onterio, Canada, who appears to be AUGUSTINA KROTKOV'S brother was noted. MRS. KROTKOV is the mother of PAUL MEDOW.

INS, New York City files reflect that CHRISTINA RROTKOVA TANCFORT, 134 West 97th Street, New York City, in a statement to be used by the Clerk of Court in filing her netition for naturalization, dated March 3, 1945, stated that she had divorced her husband, JOSEPH FRANCFORT, whom she had married December 28, 1928 and that he resided at an eddress which was unknown to her. She advised that her son, Corporal PAUL MEDOW, ASN #12137604, was in the United States Army Hospital Plant #1114, APO 204, in care of the Fostmaster.

Mr. MORRIS STEINER, beinting contractor and landlord, 13h West 97th Street, has advised that during the summer of 1950, PAUL MIDOW was allegedly taking engineering or chemistry was transferred from some school in the south. STEINER related that MEDOW'S face was scarred dur to a bad explosion which allegedly happened in a school laboratory some time previously. He stated that MEDOW is about 21 or 22 years old (approximately in 1950) and apparently was born in France. He was described as 5' 11" tall, 195 to 200 lbs., dark brown or blond hair, scars on face and heavy build.



The requested interview with FAUL MeDOW is being held in abeyance until the above mentioned investigation pertaining to CHRISTINA KROTKOVA has been conducted after which time, consideration will be given to requesting Bureau authorization to interview PAUL MEDOW.

In connection with the Unsub OLA investigation, interviews with JOHN DAVIDALYLE, HAROLD LINDSLY GATTY, MRS. JAMES M. P. SHERWOOD, the former MARION HARRIET FORTER and possibly ARTHUR EANKS pertaining to PAUL MEDOW are being considered.

A Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation inquired from Vivian Glassman Pataki on September 25, 1967, at her residence at 62-15 53rd Avenue, New York, New York, and she indicated that she had already been on a summer European trip from July 29, 1967 through the middle of August, 1967.

Vivian Glassman Pataki, who was born on January 30, 1919, in Brooklyn, New York, currently resides with her husband, Ernest Joseph Edaki, in an apartment at 62-15 3rd Avenue, Maspeth, Queens, New York. She married Ernest Pataki in New York City on January 19, 1952. She has listed her occupation as "housewife" since that date. She had formerly been employed as a social worker. She studied Sociology at Hunter College, New York City, and Columbia University.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished information on March 22, 1951, which disclosed that Julius Rosenberg had advised the source that he had furnished his Soviet contact with the name of William Perl as a person to be helped to flee the United States. The source disclosed that Rosenberg stated his Soviet contact had selected Vivian Glassman as the courier to contact Perl. Vivian Glassman Pataki later admitted to Special Agents of the Rederal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) that she had traveled by air to Cleveland, Ohio on July 22, 1950, and offered William Perl \$2,000.00 to flee to Mexico. Glassman advised that the money was received from an unknown man, but refused to assist in identifying this unknown individual.

William Perl was convicted in 1955 for having committed perjury before the United States Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York, in that he denied knowing Julius Rosenberg.

Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States and were executed at Sing Ring Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953.

In view of supplemental information furnished, the Philadelphia Office was able to develop this additional background information regarding DANIEL DAVIDAROSENBERG of 6233 Carpenter Street.

The Philadelphia Office of the Invigration and Naturalization Service has a record pertaining to ROSENBERG. This record consisted of an index card reflecting ROSENBERG had alien registration number 7719837 and had entered the United States at Philadelphia on 6/22/43. The complete Immigration file on ROSENBERG is reportedly at Brooklyn, N. I., and bears number 2770-P-191099.

The Naturalization Office, United States District Court, reflects that under Petition number 191099, filed on 8/26/48, DANIEL DAVID ROSENBERG of 6233 Carpenter Street, Philadelphia, made application for citizenship. This was granted on 12/14/48.

It should be noted that at the time of application for citizenship ROSENBERG stated he had not been out of the United States since his arrival. This application requires that absences from the United States for periods longer than six months be entered thereon.

ROSENBERG did also at the time of application petition for a change in name. His request for a name change to DAMIEL DAVES, ROSARD was granted at the time of his naturalization.

It is suggested that, prior to Bureau authorization for the interview of ROSENBERG, also known as ROSARD, the New York Office review the Immigration file on ROSENBERG and the Bureau search its indices on DANIEL DAVID ROSARD.

The Philadelphia cross-reference telephone directory current as of instant date reflects DANIEL DAVID ROSARD in residence at 6244 Washington Avenue, Philadelphia.

The indices of the Philadelphia Office contain no record regarding DANIEL DAVID ROSARD.

JOSEPH HARPOLE, Immigration and Naturalization Service, (INS) Tilewild Airport, Queens, New York, advised Investigative Clerk (IC) in August, 1960, that JAMES weinstein, born July 17, 1926, arrived at Idlewild Airport at Far 5:45 P.M., August 15, 1960, aboard Cubana Airlines Flight 998. The subject's destination was listed as 771 West End Avenue, New York, New York.

II. INTERVIEWS WITH SUBJECT

On October 23, 1959, the subject was interviewed by SAS DOUGLAS L. BURAU and WILLIAM E. FOLKNER. WEINSTEIN stated he joined the Labor Youth League (LYL) in approximately 1950, "while in New York", and at one time, held the position of Organizational Secretary of the New York County LYL. The subject did not specify the exact dates he held the position of Organizational Secretary.

WEINSTEIN advised he joined the Communist Party (CP) in about 1953, and attended club meetings on the Lower East Side on practically a monthly basis. The subject did not elaborate regarding the location where the meetings were held nor the business discussed at the meetings.

According to WEINSTEIN, the CP organization did not advocate the overthrow of the United States Government by force, although there were some individual members who did advocate a forceful overthrow of the Government. Continuing, he stated the CP, USA never admitted to dominance by the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR), but in his opinion, the CP, USA in practice was controlled by the USSR.

WEINSTEIN stated he withdrew from CP and LYL activity in approximately 1956. He explained he never took any formal







Fire. ANNA SEGAL, 2-16 Avenue N, Brooklyn, advised that recently, while looking for something else, she came across, in an old suitcase, a receipt book concerning her operation of the buildings at 123-125 and 141-143 West 9-th Street and proxised to make this available for examination in connection with instant investigation.

Mrs. SEGAL advised that of the photographs shown her, that of KRASIVOV appears definitely familiar to her. She stated that it is her recollection that this individual visited the apartment on the ground floor at 141 West 90th Street. She doubted that this individual was a tenant of here in the building. She recalled that this individual wore a uniform cap as though he also might have been a chauffeur.



Mrs. SEGAL also advised that the photographs of KRIUKOV and EGOURHOVSISO seem familiar to her, but that sime is unable to place them and can provide no information concerning either.

Mrs. SEGAL also stated that the photograph of SCLOVIKV is definitely familiar to her. She stated that she is positive that he, on several occasions, visited the building at 141-143 best 90th Street. She does not believe that he resided there. She was unable to say which apartment or which persons in the building he might have visited.

It is noted that Mrs. SEGAL had previously stated that she is certain NIKOLAI KARPERCY also had been a visitor in that building. It is noted also that Mrs. DOROTHY FELIER, a tenant in that building, described the photograph of KARPERCY as familiar to her.

It is further noted that Mrs. GRACE LONG, 45 Fifth Avenue and Miss HELEN WILCOX, 15 East 36th Street, both former English teachers at Antorg Trading Corporation and both well acquainted with SOLCVIEV and KARPEKOV as students of theirs, both described the two as very close friends. They both also described KARPEKOV as a handsome, polite, charming, friendly individual, which is almost identical with Mrs. SEGAL's description of the person she had in mind was as identical with KARPEKOV.

Mrs. SEGAL also advises that the photograph of PANCHENKO is familiar to her, but was unable to say whether he was a tenant or a visitor. She is confident that she knew him.

She further described the photograph of CHOUNDENKO as familiar to her and explained that she recalled the individual she has in mind as wearing glassos. It is her recollection that this individual visited the building at 141-143 West 9-th Street and that on several occasions used the telephone in the hall outside her office on such visits.

Protographs of KRIUKOVA or KRASIVOVA is that of her tenant in the ground floor apartment at 141 west 9 th Street. She stated that she is positive of this. Concerning this tenant, Mrs. SECAL advised, when the question was raised with her, that the family undoubtedly did, in fact, leave the United States, not on the ship which carried CERHARDT RISLER, but rather on the ship on which Madam KASENKINA was scheduled to leave the United States with the Soviet children.

When shown photographs as listed above, advised that only the photograph of GOUSEVA is familiar to her. She said that it was her impression that this individual was a visitor in the building probably of the SARYTCHEVS and possibly a relation of theirs. At any rate, she said she is confident that she has seen GOUSEVA speaking to Russian tenants who resided in the building, whether the SARYTCHEVS or others.

WILLIAM FREDERICK WEISS, drugglet, 173 Manhattan Avenue, advised that of the photographs shown him only that of LEPEDEVA seems at all familiar and that he is not sure of it. He stated that he was unable to provide any information about the person he has in mind.

Avenue, St. Albans, Long Island, advised that none of the photographs listed above seem familiar to her with the possible exception of that of KRIUKOVA. She advised that in her opinion, KRIUKOVA was not the Russian woman who occupied the ground floor apartment at 141 West 90th Street. She advised, however, that there is some resemblance between the two persons although the hairdo was entirely different. She stated that the photograph of KRASIVUVA is definitely not that of the woman who occupied the ground floor apartment at141 West 90th Street.

Mrs. DCROTHY FELLER, 31 West 84th Street, advised that of the photographs shown to her, none are familiar. She added that she is certain that the Russian woman who lived in the ground floor apartment at 141 West 9 th Street is not pictured among those shown to her.







The 1917 New York City Directory lists MORRIS RICH 982 Aldus Street, Bronx, as a "druggist, sundries", 132 Nassau Street, Room 514. The 1925 New York City Directory, the last one published, lists MORRIS RICH, Salesman, 982 Aldus Street, Bronx.

The records of the U. S. D. C., S. D. N. Y. maintained at 70 Columbus Avenue, and the I. N. S. records at the same address, reflect that one MORRIS RICH, born September 15, 1883 in Russia entered the United States at New York City June 20, 1893 and was naturalized July 6, 1906. At the time of his naturalization he resided at 945 Jackson Avenue, Bronx, New York and the witness to his naturalization was LOUIS FINKELSTEIN, 49 Catherine Street, New York City. His coccupation was given as a druggist. It will be noted that MORRIS RICH, the father of the subject, according to the 1917 City Directory was also listed as a "druggist."

In view of this and the fact that no other MORRIS RICH was naturalised around 1899, the reported date of subject's father's naturalization, it is believed the above MORRIS RICH is the subject's father.

The voting registrations contained in the New York City Record for 1924, 1927, and 1928 were checked for MORNIS RICH 982 Aldus Street, Bronx, New York, but neither MORRIS RICH nor his wife, MINNIE LAZAMEFF RICH Pregistered in these years. The election maps prior to 1924 were not available at the Municiple Public Library. In 1924, 982 Aldus Avenue, Bronx, was in the 17ED/5AD; in 1927 it was in 17ED/5AD and in 1928 it was in 15ED/5AD.

Thorough file review on SEMENOV, SHUMOVSKY, and MALISOFF made without locating any logical suspects for "FRED". Brief background information set out on ILIA STEPANOV, friend of GAIK OVAKIMIAN, and JACOB MINDEL, New York area Communist, and photographs of both men located. Background information regarding ALEXANDER BUCHMAN's Trotskyite activities set out.

DETAILS:

REVIEW OF INFORMATION CONCERNING FELDMAN-OVAKIMIAN CASE

A review of the ARMAND LABIS FELDMAN-GAIK B.

OVAKIMIAN case was made in an effort to develop
any logical suspects for instant unknown subject.

As a result of instant review it is felt that a photograph of ILIA
STEPANOV, a frequent associate of OVAKIMIAN, should be displayed to
HARRY GOLD, despite the fact that his description varies from that
furnished by GOLD in certain respects.

TLIA STEPANOV, according to Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, arrived in the United States on the "Normandie" on November 18, 1936, destination Amtorg, New York City. His age at that time was 32, he was married, an engineer by profession, and he intended to stay in the United States only nine months. T-1 stated that several extensions of stay were granted STEPANOV and he finally left the United States on August 31, 1938. His applications for extensions of time showed that he had been sent to the United States by Amtorg in Moscow for the purpose of placing

equipment. STEPANOV returned to the United States on February 25, 1939 on the "Acquitania". At that time, according to T-1, STEPANOV was 34 years old, 5'10" tall, and had fair complexion, dark hair, and blue eyes. It is noted that if GOLD's description of FRED is accurate, STEPANOV would be four inches too tall and too light in complexion.

However, it should be pointed out that a photograph of STEPANOV, date of which is unknown, indicates the possibility that he may have had a medium, rather than fair complexion. Also, it appears in instant photograph that STEPANOV had sagging jowls and a stocky build, as described by GOLD. It is not felt that lack of a mustache in this photograph is important in eliminating STEPANOV as a suspect.

In connection with STEPANOV's activities in the United States, a review of the FELDMAN-OVAKIMIAN case discloses that MAURICE B. COOKE, a chemical engineer, advised that STEPANOV on March 11, 1941 asked him to write an article concerning Toluol, an ingredient of paints as well as a component part of certain explosives. COOKE said that he did not do any work on such an article for STEPANOV. COOKE admitted that beginning in 1935 he had furnished considerable data in the field of petroleum to the Russians, and had stolen some oil data from the M. W. Kellogg Company, an oil firm. COOKE was a contact of GAIK OVAKIMIAN beginning in 1935.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised in 1941 that ILIA STEPANOV was head of Technopromport at Amtorg, and seemed to be a person of authority there.

According to Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, on March 4, 1941 OVAKIMIAN entered Willoughby's camera store, 110 West 32nd Street, New York City, and left a roll of films for development. Instant films included shots showing OVAKIMIAN, STEPANOV, Mrs. STEPANOV, and the STEPANOV child.

Confidential Informent T-4, of known reliability, advised that on February 28, 1941, OVAKIMIAN picked up Mrs. STEPANOV at the STEPANOV apartment, New York City, and took ther for a ride to Playland Park, Rye, New York, and the two were seen embracing on the way.



REVIEW OF INFORMATION CONCERNING SEMEN SEMENOV, STANISLAUS SHUMOVSKY, AND WILLIAM MALISOFF

A thorough review was made of the New York files for information pertaining to contacts and activities of SEMEN SEMENOV, STANISLAUS SHUMOVSKY, and WILLIAM MALISOFF, but no logical suspects for "FRED" were developed.

CORROBORATIVE EVIDENCE OF GOLD'S CONNECTIONS WITH "FRED"

When HARRY GOLD's residence at 6823 Kindred Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, was searched on June 3, 1950, a sheet of paper was located bearing the heading "CARL BUCHMAN". On June 17, 1950, GOLD advised that the writing on this sheet was his, and he recalled that he had written the name "CARL BUCHMAN" in connection with an assignment he had been given by "FRED". At this time it was GOLD's recollection that BUCHMAN was possibly a Trotskyite about whom "FRED" asked.

Subsequently, on February 2, 1951, GOLD was interviewed at City Prison, New York City, at which time he viewed a photograph of CARL BUCHMAN and advised that he had never seen this individual. GOLD was questioned for further information he might have concerning BUCHMAN, and he said that he remembers that his espionage superior, "FRED", had described BUCHMAN as a cold, calculating, dangerous man. He said that "FRED" warned him to proceed with caution when checking on BUCHMAN. He further recalled that he, GOLD, did a certain amount of investigation of CARL BUCHMAN at the request of "FRED", including an investigation in BUCHMAN's neighborhood. Upon the occasion of this interview, GOLD said that he understood from "FRED" that CARL BUCHMAN was active in the Trotaky-ite movement.

On December 7, 1951, CARL BUCHMAN was interviewed by SA HERMAN C. LITTLE JOHN and SA PHILLIP J. CROAK in another matter. He advised that he was aware of the beliefs of his brother, ALEXANDER BUCHMAN, regarding Trotskyism, but he did not know that he was acquainted with TROTSKY or had visited the home of TROTSKY while he was in Mexico. He stated that he has seen ALEXANDER on only two occasions in twenty-four years, and sorresponded with him irregularly during this period.

BUCHMAN advised that he was never interested in Trotakyism and, to his knowledge, has never associated with any members of the Communist Party or followers of TROTSKY.

Concerning ALEXANDER BUCHMAN, it is noted that he was interviewed at Los Angeles, California, on October 18, 1950 at the Los Angeles Office at his own request and furnished his own background and personal history. Concerning his connections and activities with the Trotskyite movement, he reported as follows:

ALEXANDER BUCHMAN recalled that he went to Japan in 1933, but was deported and went to Shanghai in August, 1933. BUCHMAN advised that during his stay in China he met HAROLD BRACS a few times and ISAACS greatly influenced his thinking along the lines of Trotskyism. He also stated that he met FRANKAGLASS during this period and GLASS, too, had a great influence in shaping his mind along the lines of Trotskyism. BUCHMAN said that ISAACS and GLASS were both confirmed Trotskyites, and he spent many hours, mostly with GLASS, discussing the principles of Trotskyiam. When questioned as to any positive action he had taken with regard to his Trotskyite beliefs, ALEXANDER BUCHMAN admitted that while in Shanghai he had agreed to act as a mail drop for GLASS. GLASS, being watched as a radical and Trotskyite by the 🐰 🖔 Shanghai Police, was hampered in both sending and receiving Trotskyite literature, and it was for this reason that GLASS had BUCHMAN rent a Shanghai Post Office box where GLASS could receive this literature.

ALEXANDER BUCHMAN said that subsequent to his return from China, he made a trip to Mexico in September, 1939. He stayed at the home of LEON TROTSKY from September, 1939 until April, 1940, and he agreed that he must have been a trusted member of the group to gain entrance to TROTSKY's home and remain for an indefinite period. BUCHMAN said that his primary reason for going to Mexico was to get some pictures of TROTSKY. However, he said that he stayed on at the TROTSKY household as a sort of handyman, and did some work on the electrical warning system which had been installed for the protection of TROTSKY.

ALEXANDER BUCHMAN asserted that he disassociated himself from all Trotskyite activity in about 1941, and he now has no further interest in Communism or Trotskyism.

In view of ALEXANDER BUCHMAN's close connection with the Trotskyites and his position in 1939 within the TROTSKY household, it is possible that "FRED" was interested in CARL BUCHMAN because of the fact that he was ALEXANDER's brother, and for this reason asked GOLD to investigate CARL BUCHMAN.

BACKGROUND OF JACOB MINDEL

It has been noted that the physical description of Dr. JACOB MINDEL is similar in many respects to that of the unknown subject, with the main discrepancy being in age.

In 1943 Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised that on August 22, 1942, MINDEL furnished the following information about himself. He was born on September 18, 1881 in Russia. He stated that he had been engaged in general dental practice from 1914 until 1932, and had been a paid teacher in the Workers School, 35 East 12th Street, New York City, since 1933. T-6 further advised that the following was a physical description of MINDEL:

FLORENCE-MINDEL, daughter

It is noted that the above physical description does not mention a moustache. However, in 1945 Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised that MINDEL had a moustache, and a photograph of MINDEL taken in 1931 shows that he had one. HARRY GOLD has said that "FRED" had a moustache. However, it should be noted that the major discrepancy between MINDEL's description and that of "FRED" is

that MINDEL is approximately twenty years too old. Nevertheless, the physical characteristics are quite similar, making it advisable to display MINDEL's picture to HARRY GOLD.

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised in May, 1942 that MINDEL was a Socialist from early youth in Russia, and at the turn of the century was sentenced to a Siberian concentration camp as a revolutionist. He escaped and came to the United States. He became a Communist at the time of the Russian Revolution in 1917, and was one of the founders of the Communist Party in the United States.

At one time MINDEL was chairman of the Central Committee of the Communist Party and subsequently became Director of the Workers School in New York City.

Confidential Informant T-7 also stated that MINDEL was at one time associated with the Freiheit Publishing Company in New York City. It should be noted that this is the Yiddish language publication of the Communist Party.

Confidential Informant T-7 further recalled that MINDEL returned to Russia with his family in the early 1930's and remained for several years, then returned to the United States.

Confidential Informant T-0, of known reliability, stated in 1943 that he first met MINDEL when MINDEL joined the Communist Party in 1921. Because of his interest in Communism, MINDEL gave up a lucrative dental practice in 1930 and devoted his time to Communist activities. T-8 said that in his opinion MINDEL is basically honest and fine, but his fenaticism and devotion to Communism makes him a decided menace to the American way of life. The Informant said that in his opinion MINDEL is capable of anything which would further the cause of Communism.

In February, 1950, Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised that MINDEL was in poor health, and seldom left his apartment. He said that MINDEL had told him that he had few visitors, and was not aware of what was happening in the Communist Party.


In connection with another case, Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, in March, 1953 furnished two rolls of 16 MM motion picture film and a number of still photographs which he had taken of Amtorg personnel and other Russians in the period of 1934 and 1935. T-5 stated that these pictures were made, for the most part, at Amtorg picnics and other activities. It is noted that these motion pictures were clear enough to make it possible to print still photographs from many shots. The period during which these movies and photos were made makes it possible that "FRED" may be shown in one of them.
