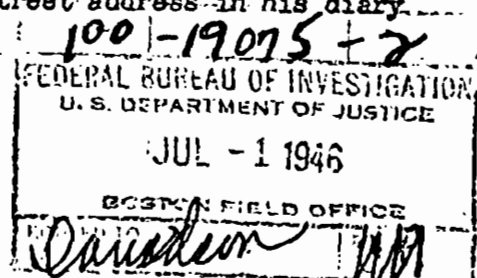
She further stated that her husband and two children are native born citizens of the United States. The AER folder gives her description as follows:

These publications identify MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ in 1942, as the editor and in 1943 as the former editor of "The Citizen." INS, NYC personnel records indicate that MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ transferred to the Social Security Board on 1/2/43.

Chicago letter to the Director, 2/8/54, captioned, "MILTON YUSEM; SM - C; (OO: CHICAGO).

This communication recounts the results of an interview with MILTON YUSEM, a suspected Communist sympathizer.

YUSEM was interviewed on 7/11/56 by SAs WILLIAM F. THOMPSON and DONALD W. AARON at 60 Ellis Avenue, Chicago. YUSEM advised that he was employed at Brothman and Associates, NYC, from June to September, 1945.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

JACOB SILVERMAN, Baltimore, Maryland, father of RAYE RUBIN and the employee, advised Immigration and Naturalization Service that the employee and RAYE RUBIN are half sisters. RUBIN is the National President of the Women's Auxiliary of the National Maritime Union and a charter member of the C.P. She is active in the affairs of the C.P. in Torrance and San Pedro. Mail covers reveal letters received by RUBIN from the employee. In her yearly trip to the East Coast RUBIN visits the employee. KATHERINE MULLER, Santa Barbara, California, advised employee a loyal American citizen.

I. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

The following investigation has been performed to establish the relationship between SARAH SHIRLEY POWELL, also known as SARAH S. SILVERMAN and Mrs. CHARLES ROBERT RUBIN, also known as RAYE RUBIN, who resides at 304 West 223 Street in Torrance, California. Los Angeles T-1, a reliable confidential informant, who will neither furnish a signed statement nor testify before a Loyalty Hearing Board, advised on May 28, 1945 that RAYE RUBIN, nee RAYE HANNAH SILVERMAN, had a sister in Washington, D.C., by the name of SARAH SILVERMAN and that SARAH SILVERMAN was employed by the United States Government as a Classification Analyst. The informant also stated that the father of RAYE RUBIN and SARAH SILVERMAN was JACOB SILVERMAN who resided in Baltimore, Maryland. It is to be noted that the employee's loyalty form reflects that she resided at Washington, D.C. during 1945 and was employed by the United States Treasury Department during the whole year.

On May 28, 1945 in connection with another matter the Federal Bureau of Investigation checked the records of the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service in Baltimore, Maryland. These records revealed that in his Declaration of Intention to become a citizen of the United States, Mr. JACOB SILVERMAN, 1804 E. Fayette Street, Baltimore, said that he was born March 7, 1871 at Kamy, Russia. He stated that his first wife SARAH was the mother of RAYE SILVERMAN and that RAYE was born in Europe, July 14, 1900. JACOB SILVERMAN indicated in this interview that he had a daughter named SARA SILVERMAN born December 29, 1912 at Baltimore, Maryland, who was born to his second wife ROSA GARWOR. It is noted on the employee's loyalty form that she was born December 29, 1912 in Baltimore, Maryland. The statements of JACOB SILVERMAN indicate that RAYE RUBIN and the employee are half sisters. It should, however, be noted that Los Angeles T-1, previously referred to, advised that RAYE RUBIN refers to SARAH SILVERMAN as her sister. Los Angeles T-1 advised that Mrs. CHARLES ROBERT RUBIN uses the name RAYE RUBIN.

The Marriage Licence Records of Staunton, Virginia reveal Mrs. CHARLES ROBERT RUBIN who is also known as RAYE RUBIN had the maiden name of RAYE HANNAH SILVERMAN.

(b)(7)(d) [redacted] a reliable confidential informant, made available to this office information concerning RAYE RUBIN's membership in the Communist Political Association on August 14, 1944. RUBIN was issued 1944 membership card #44388 in the San Pedro Club of the Communist Political Association. This informant will not testify before a loyalty hearing board nor will he give a signed statement. It should be noted that the Communist Political Association is among those organizations declared within the purview of Executive Order #9835 dated November 24, 1947 by the United States Attorney General TOM CLARK.

Los Angeles T-2, a reliable confidential informant, advises that on about June 30, 1945 that RAYE RUBIN was a member of the Harbor Club of the Communist Political Association, and was assigned 1945 membership card #46151. This informant will not furnish a signed statement or appear before a loyalty hearing board.

Los Angeles T-3, of known reliability, advises that in September of 1946 that RAYE RUBIN was Chairman of the Harbor Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party. This informant will not testify before a loyalty hearing board or execute a signed statement. The Communist Party was declared by Attorney General Clark to be within the purview of Executive Order #9835.

Los Angeles T-4, a reliable confidential informant, advised that RAYE RUBIN, 304 West 223rd Street, Torrance, California, had been a member of the Communist Party for ten years and in 1947 was a member of the Torrance Community Club, Harbor Section, of the Los Angeles County Communist Party. This informant will not testify before a loyalty hearing board or furnish a signed statement.

(b)(7)(d) [redacted] a reliable informant, stated that RAYE RUBIN advised EDDIE BAKER, who was active in the affairs of the Communist Political Association, that she was leaving for a trip to the National Convention of the Women's Auxiliary Convention of the National Maritime Union which was to be held in New York City in July of 1944. EDDIE BAKER requested RUBIN to bring to him her Party book and also the Party book of her husband, CHARLIE RUBIN, so that he could get the number from them in order that they would be issued charter membership cards in the newly formed Communist Political Association. This informant will not testify before a Loyalty Hearing Board or furnish a signed statement.

(b)(7)(d) [redacted] who is reliable, made available an official ballot of the Communist Political Association in San Pedro, California. This ballot was used for the election of officers on February 12, 1945. The ballot reflected that RAYE RUBIN was among the candidates for election to the Executive Board of the club. This informant will not furnish a signed statement nor will

she testify before a Loyalty Hearing Board.

The National Maritime Union paper called THE PILOT for April 6, 1945 carried an article in which RAYE RUBIN, as National President of the Women's Auxiliary of the National Maritime Union, urged all branches to do all in their power to raise funds for the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee. According to the article, RAYE RUBIN stated "Our brothers in the NMU (National Maritime Union) were the first to join the ABRAHAM LINCOLN Brigade to give their lives for liberty. Had the Spanish people received help from the nations who are today fighting Fascism, this war might have been averted. But we had to learn from the struggle and tragedy of the Spanish people." It should be noted that the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee and the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade are on the list of organizations declared within the purview of Executive Order 9835 by Attorney General TOM CLARK on November 24, 1947.

Los Angeles T-5, a reliable confidential informant, advised that on November 3, 1943 RAYE RUBIN received a letter from one S. SILVERMAN whose return address was 515 Roxboro Place, N.W. Washington, D.C. This informant will not furnish a signed statement or testify before a Loyalty Hearing Board.

Los Angeles T-6 advised that S. SILVERMAN was in fact SARAH SILVERMAN, and that she was employed at the U.S. Treasury Department in Washington, D.C.

It is noted from the employee's loyalty form that she was employed at the Treasury Department in Washington, D.C. on November 3, 1943. This informant will not testify before a Loyalty Hearing Board or furnish a signed statement.

Los Angeles T-5, a reliable confidential informant, advised that RAYE RUBIN received a letter from SARAH SILVERMAN, 1909 Spring Road, N.W. Washington, D.C. The letter was postmarked at Washington, D.C., May 9, 1944. The employee's loyalty form reflects that on May 9, 1944 she resided at 1909 Spring Road, N.W. Washington, D.C. This informant will not testify before a Loyalty Hearing Board or furnish a signed statement.

Los Angeles T-5 advised that on March 27, 1944 Mrs. RAYE RUBIN received a letter from SARAH SILVERMAN, 1909 Spring Road N.W., Washington, D.C. The employee's loyalty form reflects that she was living at this address on March 27, 1944. This informant will not testify before a Loyalty Hearing Board or furnish a signed statement.

Los Angeles T-1 advised that RAYE RUBIN was going to leave Los Angeles on July 10, 1944 for New York City where she would attend the convention of the Women's Auxiliary of the National Maritime Union on July 20, 1944. RUBIN advised this informant that after her stay in New York City she was going to spend another week at her sister's home in Washington, D.C., and

then return to Los Angeles August 10, 1944.

Los Angeles T-7, a confidential informant of known reliability, advised that RAYE RUBIN planned to attend the National Convention of the Women's Auxiliary of the National Maritime Union held in the East about July 19, 1945. Her itinerary included arrival at Chicago on June 22nd. She would leave Chicago immediately and arrive in Baltimore on June 23rd. She expected to remain overnight in Baltimore and then spend from June 24th through June 27th visiting relatives in Washington, D.C. and Baltimore.

Los Angeles T-7 was interviewed again on May 28, 1948 at which time he said that he knew RAYE RUBIN very well from about February, 1940 to July, 1944. In that period of time RAYE RUBIN mentioned her sister SARAH SILVERMAN on many occasions.

This informant advised that once each year, for this four year period, RAYE RUBIN journeyed to New York City in interest of the business of the Women's Auxiliary of the National Maritime Union. Each year she would be gone about a month. On each trip, RUBIN advised the informant that she was going to visit her sister in Washington, D.C. This informant will not testify before a Loyalty Hearing Board or furnish a signed statement.

KATHERINE MULLER, 828 Argallo Road, Santa Barbara, California, advised that she knew the employee during the year 1941. At this time the employee and MULLER lived in the same apartment house in Washington, D.C. MULLER advised that she became acquainted with the employee, but was never a close friend. MULLER advised that she believed Mrs. POWELL a loyal American citizen, as Mrs. POWELL had never given her any reason to doubt her loyalty.

ADMINISTRATIVE DETAILS

The interview of Mrs. H. L. KNIGHT, 726 W. 9th Street, San Pedro, California was conducted May 28, 1948 by SA ELWOOD D. LEARN.

The U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service is at this time investigating RAYE RUBIN for falsely claiming citizenship; however, it was ascertained that they have nothing pertinent to add at this time.

This has been done to further conceal the identity of the informant.

Regarding the employee obtaining housing for the AMERICAN PEACE MOBILIZATION which is reported in Washington teletype to Los Angeles dated June 4, 1948, Mrs. MULLER advised that POWELL used her telephone on frequent occasions and that possibly she overheard POWELL make remarks about housing members of the AMERICAN PEACE MOBILIZATION. She said that she could not at this time recall POWELL making such remarks. MULLER further advised that she never made a remark to an agent of this Bureau indicating that HARRY KAUFMAN and SARAH POWELL were friendly.

SA THOMAS H. THORNTON who conducted the interview felt that MULLER appeared cooperative and did not give the impression that she did not desire to talk in this matter. She appeared only unable to recall the remarks that she had made previously.

I. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

The following investigation has been performed to establish the relationship between **SARAH SHIRLEY POWELL**, also known as **SARAH S. SILVERMAN** and **Mrs. CHARLES ROBERT RUBIN**, also known as **RAYE RUBIN**, who resides at 304 West 223 Street in Torrance, California. Los Angeles T-1, a reliable confidential informant, who will neither furnish a signed statement nor testify before a Loyalty Hearing Board, advised on May 28, 1945 that **RAYE RUBIN** nee **RAYE HANNAH SILVERMAN**, had a sister in Washington, D.C., by the name of **SARAH SILVERMAN** and that **SARAH SILVERMAN** was employed by the United States Government as a Classification Analyst. The informant also stated that the father of **RAYE RUBIN** and **SARAH SILVERMAN** was **JACOB SILVERMAN** who resided in Baltimore, Maryland. It is to be noted that the employee's loyalty form reflects that she resided at Washington, D.C. during 1945 and was employed by the United States Treasury Department during the whole year.

On May 28, 1945 in connection with another matter the Federal Bureau of Investigation checked the records of the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service in Baltimore, Maryland. It should, however, be noted that Los Angeles T-1, previously referred to, advised that **RAYE RUBIN** refers to **SARAH SILVERMAN** as her sister. Los Angeles T-1 advised that **Mrs. CHARLES ROBERT RUBIN** uses the name **RAYE RUBIN**.

The Marriage Licence Records of Staunton, Virginia reveal Mrs. CHARLES ROBERT RUBIN who is also known as RAYE RUBIN had the maiden name of RAYE HANNAH SILVERMAN.

(b)(7)(d) [redacted] a reliable confidential informant, made available to this office information concerning RAYE RUBIN's membership in the Communist Political Association on August 14, 1944. RUBIN was issued 1944 membership card #44388 in the San Pedro Club of the Communist Political Association. This informant will not testify before a loyalty hearing board nor will he give a signed statement. It should be noted that the Communist Political Association is among those organizations declared within the purview of Executive Order #9835 dated November 24, 1947 by the United States Attorney General TOM CLARK.

Los Angeles T-2, a reliable confidential informant, advises that on about June 30, 1945 that RAYE RUBIN was a member of the Harbor Club of the Communist Political Association, and was assigned 1945 membership card #46151. LA T-1 advised in May 1945, that RAYE RUBIN, nee Silverman, also known as Mrs. Charles Robert Rubin, then residing at 724B West Ninth Street, San Pedro, California, was the daughter of JACOB SILVERMAN of Baltimore, Maryland. RAYE RUBIN had a sister, whose last name was SILVERMAN and who was employed in 1945 by the United States Government as a classification analyst.

The files of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, (INS), Baltimore Maryland, reviewed by SA DANIEL F. X. CALLAHAN during June 1945, disclosed that JACOB SILVERMAN, 1804 East Fayette Street, Baltimore, Maryland, born March 7, 1871 at Kamy, Russia, filed a preliminary declaration of intention to become a United States citizen on July 15, 1937. He said that his first wife, SARAH, was the mother of RAYE SILVERMAN and that RAYE was born in Europe on July 14, 1900. He arrived in the United States in 1900 and his wife, SARAH, arrived in the United States one year later. She died three or four years after her arrival here. He said that he was married to ROSA GORWOR in Baltimore, Maryland, in about 1908 and he had the following children by her, all born in Baltimore:

HARRY, born May 25, 1909;

MARY, born October 31, 1910;

SARA, born December 29, 1912;

RHODA, born October 9, 1918.

It is noted that the employee, SARAH SHIRLEY POWELL, nee Silverman, on her Standard Form 85 dated March 14, 1966, listed her date of birth as December 29, 1912, at Baltimore, Maryland.

LA T-1, recontacted on May 28, 1948, said that he knew RAYE RUBIN very well from about February 1940 to July 1944. At that period of time RAYE RUBIN mentioned her sister SARAH SILVERMAN on many occasions.

Concerning RAYE RUBIN, the following is noted:

LA T-2 advised on August 22, 1942, that RAYE RUBIN attended a Communist Party (CP) meeting in San Pedro, California on July 28, 1942, and turned in \$98.00 which she stated her branch had collected for the "People's World" fund drive.

; The "People's World" (PW) is a west coast communist newspaper.

LA T-3 advised on September 23, 1946, that RAYE RUBIN was Chairman of the Torrance Club in the Harbor Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party (LACCP). In November 1948, according to LA T-3, RAYE RUBIN remained active in the Torrance Club, LACCP.

RAYE RUBIN was interviewed on May 4, 1949, by SA JOHN J. HENRY and SA ELWOOD D. LEARN concerning an allegation that she had falsely claimed citizenship by stating that she had been born in Baltimore, Maryland, when she registered to vote, when in fact she had been born in Russia. RUBIN furnished information concerning her parents and said that she had been under the impression from other members of the family that she had been born in Baltimore, but in the summer of 1948, she learned that her father had told some authorities that she had been born in Russia. She asked her sister, RHODA CONN, 3509 14th Street Northwest, Washington, D. C., to review her father's declaration of intention to become a citizen and furnish her the information contained therein. By letter dated October 31, 1948, RHODA informed her that she had been born in Russia and came to the United States with her mother at a very young age. RUBIN said since learning that she was an alien, she did not vote in the 1948 general election.

RUBIN volunteered that she had been President of the Women's Auxiliary of the National Maritime Union and a member of the CP in New York City, New York, during the 1935 seamen's strike. She continued this membership when she moved from New York to San Pedro, California, in 1939, and she attended meetings of the San Pedro Club of the CP until she dropped out in 1945.

RAYE RUBIN was arrested on a deportation warrant on January 18, 1951, by INS and was later released on bail.

LA T-3 advised on October 16, 1962, that RAYE RUBIN was secretary of the Harbor Committee, Los Angeles Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (LACFPB) (see appendix under Los Angeles Committee for Defense of the Bill of Rights and Protection of Foreign Born).

**LOS ANGELES COMMITTEE FOR DEFENSE OF THE BILL OF RIGHTS,
formerly known as Los Angeles Committee for
Protection of Foreign Born, Los Angeles Committee for

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations", revised, December 1, 1961, pp. 103-104 describes this committee as follows:

"A 'branch' of the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born found to be under the 'actual management, direction and supervision' of Communist Party members. The Los Angeles Committee was reorganized in October, 1950, and reported that it 'shall be affiliated to the national organization known as the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born ***' The American Committee and the 'various area or local committees * * * constitute * * * one organization within the meaning of the * * * statute (Internal Security Act)' under which the Subversive Activities Control Board found to be a 'Communist-front organization' and ordered it to register as such with the Attorney General."

(Subversive Activities Control Board, Docket No. 109-53, Report and Order with respect to the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born, June 27, 1960, pp. 41, 8, 12, and 51.)

"Cited as a 'regional' organization of the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born and one of its 'most complex affiliates.' 'The Committee on Un-American Activities found that in early publications the local affiliates frankly identified themselves as chapters of the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born' their representation of themselves as independent groups came only after enactment of the Internal Security Act which would have required them as affiliates to register as Communist-front organizations."

"Control of the local organizations * * * was made possible primarily by virtue of the fact that the leaders of the local group were Communist Party members and therefore, subject to the discipline of the Party * * * The local affiliates * * * were actually little more than administrative staffs, whose purpose it was to implement the program of the Communist Party in their respective areas.

"The Lamp of January, 1950, reported that the Los Angeles Committee for the Protection of Foreign Born had been established on November 29, 1949. Publicly identified Communist ROSE CHERNIN served as 'the operation head' since the time of its organization.

(Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 1182 on Communist Political Subversion, August 16, 1957, pp. 86, 87, 55, 33, 54, 58, and 59; also cited in Annual Report for 1956, House Report #53, February 11, 1957, p. 5.)"

The "People's World", a West Coast communist newspaper, issue of 4/23/66, contained an account of results of the 16th Annual Conference of the Los Angeles Committee for Defense of the Bill of Rights and Protection of Foreign Born which was held 4/16/66. The accomplishments include a change of name for the organization to Los Angeles Committee for Defense of the Bill of Rights, inasmuch as Defense of the Bill of Rights is all inclusive.

A source advised on 4/25/66 that the Los Angeles Committee for Defense of the Bill of Rights, still referred to by many individuals as the Los Angeles Committee for Protection of Foreign Born, is currently active in the Los Angeles area.

"Control of the local organizations * * * was made possible primarily by virtue of the fact that the leaders of the local group were Communist Party members and therefore, subject to the discipline of the Party * * * The local affiliates * * * were actually little more than administrative staffs, whose purpose it was to implement the program of the Communist Party in their respective areas.

"The Lamp of January, 1950, reported that the Los Angeles Committee for the Protection of Foreign Born had been established on November 29, 1949. Publicly identified Communist ROSE CHERNIN served as 'the operation head' since the time of its organization.

(Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 1182 on Communist Political Subversion, August 16, 1957, pp. 86, 87, 55, 33, 54, 58, and 59; also cited in Annual Report for 1956, House Report #53, February 11, 1957, p. 5.)"

The "People's World", a West Coast communist newspaper, issue of 4/23/66, contained an account of results of the 16th Annual Conference of the Los Angeles Committee for Defense of the Bill of Rights and Protection of Foreign Born which was held 4/16/66. The accomplishments include a change of name for the organization to Los Angeles Committee for Defense of the Bill of Rights, inasmuch as Defense of the Bill of Rights is all inclusive.

A source advised on 4/25/66 that the Los Angeles Committee for Defense of the Bill of Rights, still referred to by many individuals as the Los Angeles Committee for Protection of Foreign Born, is currently active in the Los Angeles area.

The U. S. Immigration Service, New York City has advised of the arrival at LaGuardia Field on July 26, 1946 from Paris on TWA Plane NC 45436 of the following passengers:

ANATOLI YAKOVLEV. YAKOVLEV gave his title as Assistant Consul General at the Russian Consulate, New York City and his destination as the Russian Consulate, New York City. He had U. S. Diplomatic Visa Number 244, issued by the State Department in Washington, D. C. on May 21, 1945. The New York indices revealed that ANATOLI ANTONOVICH YAKOVLEV was born in Borisoglevsk, U.S.S.R. on May 31, 1911, that he arrived in the United States on February 4, 1941 and assumed clerical duties at the New York Russian Consulate on February 8, 1941. YAKOVLEV is believed to be a Russian agent operating from the Russian Consulate, New York City, and is presently under investigation by this office.

IVAN PARASSENKO. Age 28, Male, gave his occupation as a diplomatic courier and his destination as the Russian Consulate, New York City. He was travelling on Russian passport to expire April 26, 1947 and had in his possession Government Official Visa Number 198 issued by the U. S. State Department, Washington, D. C. on November 26, 1945. He further stated that his stay in the United States would be indefinite. The New York indices revealed that PARASSENKO is a diplomatic courier assigned to the New York Russian Consulate and makes frequent journeys from Moscow to New York City.

LOUKA PALMARPCHAU. Age 44, gave the occupation of journalist and was travelling on Russian passport to expire December 9, 1946 and a U.S. Transit Visa Number 11, issued July 9, 1946 by the American Embassy at Moscow, Russia. The passenger gave his destination as the Russian Consulate, Montreal, Canada, and stated that he would merely be in the United States while he was in transit to Canada. The New York indices were negative.

ZOIA GAYDAI: Female, Age 44, occupation actress, was travelling on Russian passport to expire December 9, 1946 and on Transit Visa issued July 20th by the American Embassy in Moscow bearing Number 12. The passenger stated that she was in transit to Canada and that her final destination was in care of the Russian Consulate at Montreal. The New York indices were negative.

ANDREI MALUCHKO: Male, Age 34, occupation actor, writer, and poet, was travelling on Russian passport to expire December 9, 1946 and Transit Certificate bearing Number 13 issued on July 20, 1946 by the American Embassy, Moscow, Russia. He advised that his destination was the Russian Consulate at Montreal and that he would remain in the United States only while in transit to Canada. The New York indices were negative.

SEMION STEPANYK: Male, Age 42, occupation actor, was travelling on Russian passport to expire January 9, 1947 and U. S. Transit Certificate bearing Number 15 issued by the American Embassy at Moscow on July 20, 1946. He gave his destination as the Soviet Consulate in Montreal and stated that he would remain in the United States only a sufficient time to travel to Canada. The New York indices were negative.

IVAN PATORJONSKI: Male, Age 50, occupation actor, was travelling on Soviet passport to expire January 9, 1947 and U. S. Transit Certificate bearing Number 14 issued by the American Embassy at Moscow on July 20, 1946. He advised that he was destined to the Soviet Consulate at Montreal, Canada, to which address he would proceed directly. The New York indices were negative.

4. VIATCHESLAV MIKHAILOVICH MOLOTOV: The Foreign Minister of the U.S.S.R., who arrived the same date as MANUILSKY.
5. V. PAVLOV: VLADIMIR PAVLOV, interpreter for above.
6. P. Y. PRIMAH: This man first entered on August 29, 1946 with Ukrainian Delegation, headed by MANUILSKY; then departed September 14 and reentered by plane at New York on October 20, 1946.
7. D. SHADRIN, (or CHADRINE) This man, an Army officer, entered with MOLOTOV on the QUEEN ELIZABETH.
8. M. TVOROGOV: This man, who entered as MIKHAIL TVOROGOV, another Army officer, also entered with MOLOTOV.

Subject was interviewed by INS officials at Vienna, Austria, during the period October, 1957 to February, 1958, and furnished the following background information concerning himself as well as details concerning his activity in the Communist movement:

JOHN SANTO was born in Hungary, 5/13/08 as DESIDERIU HAMMER. He emigrated to the US in 1927. He became a CP member early in 1928, at Chicago, Illinois, and remained a member of the CP until the Hungarian uprising in 1956. In 1933, SANTO held the position of Secretary, Section 5, Bronx Court, NY CP. He took over a CP assignment to organize the Transit Workers in NYC in 1934. He became organizational director of the TWU of America. Deportation proceedings against SANTO were begun by INS in 1941. He voluntarily departed from the US, 6/10/49, while under a deportation warrant charging him with being an alien Communist. Following his deportation he became an official in the Hungarian Ministry of Supply. He resided in Hungary from 1949 to November, 1956, and left Hungary following the abortive Hungarian revolt in the Fall of 1956.

This file revealed that SANTO was re-admitted to the United States on 1/8/53, as a parolee under the Refugee-Escapee Provisions of the Act of July 14, 1960 (PL 86-548). SANTO's parole was authorized by the District Director, INS, Frankfurt, Germany, on 1/2/63.

JOHN SANTO also testified before HCUA, Washington, D.C., 3/1,4,5/63. His testimony before HCUA appears in a publication of the HCUA entitled "A Communist in a Worker's Paradise"--John Santo's own Story".

Information furnished by SANTO to INS regarding the below listed individual has been excerpted from his testimony and is attached hereto. Where the individual concerning whom SANTO furnished information resides, in the area covered by another Bureau field office, a copy of this memorandum and the pertinent testimony is being forwarded to that Division.

This letter is signed by LEONARD WALKER of 905 Fairdale, St. Louis, Missouri, and asks for the cancellation of the deportation order against Mr. HYUN.

A Los Angeles letter to St. Louis dated January 7, 1956 states that on May 26, 1956 the INS office of Los Angeles made available to their office copies of communications received by that service from various individuals protesting a deportation order in the case of one DIAMOND KIMM. One of these communications was from LEONARD A. WALKER, 905 Fairdale, St. Louis, Missouri. The Los Angeles letter advised that DIAMOND KIMM is presently under order for deportation as an undesirable alien, in that he was formerly a member of the Communist Party.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

It is recommended that the copies of the memoranda be routed to the Supervisor handling the respective case files for necessary action. It is suggested that one copy of each memorandum be furnished the office of origin in each case. In some cases, it may be desirable to interview Crouch for additional information concerning the extent of his association with the individual mentioned.

SUBJECT: RUDY BAKER, alias Raymond Baker, alias Zimmerman; Comintern agent.

A memorandum on subject has been submitted sometime ago by this Consultant. Attention is called to the following new facts:

1-- While going through passport photographs at the Central Office on October 8, 1952, I recognized photograph No. 1603, issued to Raymond Baker, as being -- almost beyond doubt -- a picture of RUDY BAKER, a Communist leader and Comintern agent I knew during my party membership since the fall of 1927. I first met Baker in Detroit during the fall of 1927, when he was District Organizer of the Communist party. In the winter of 1928 I met him again in Moscow, where he was a student in the Lenin School. During the Thirties he was for a time liason man between Canada and the United States for the Communist International.

It has become a matter of public knowledge that during the 1924-44 period Baker was in the United States as Comintern representative, living at Peekskill, N. Y. under the alias of Zimmerman. His name has been associated with atomic espionage and a report from Steve Nelson to "AP" is believed to have been intended for Baker. It has been generally believed in informed circles (for example, by the California Un-American Activities Committee as late as 1950) that Baker had been out of the United States since 1944.

Although Baker has claimed birth in the United States, former Communist leaders who were once associated with him are of the general opinion that he is a native of Russia.

The passport photograph, No. 1603, and accompanying material gave no indication that "Raymond Baker" was also known as Rudy Baker or had used any other alias.

2-- John Lautner, in conversation on a recent visit to this office, told me that Rudy Baker was in the United States again as late as 1949, and that in 1949 he had only a phony "break" with the party so that he could go to Yugoslavia in the role of an "ex-Communist" in order to live in Yugoslavia as a secret agent of the Kremlin. Lautner said this information was been given to the Central Intelligence Agency. From the viewpoint of this Service the matter may be important to determine how Baker entered the United States again and how he left in 1949 for Yugoslavia, also with view to possibility he may again seek to enter this country. Baker is one of the most important leaders in the international Communist movement.

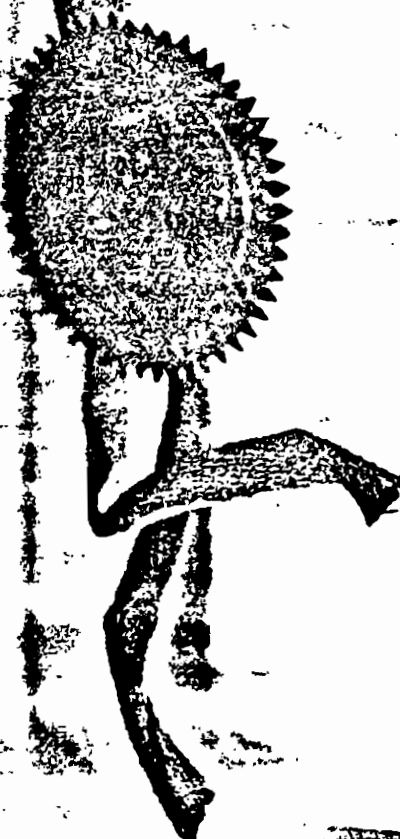
