On April 17, 1948, Confidential Informant T-77, of known reliability, advised that the handwritten names GARFINKEL and WOLLIN appeared among 118 names on four-ruled sheets of paper as follows:

The informant advised that the exact significance of these notations is not known. However, it is believed because of the notations "In" and "Out" that it indicates an attendance of a meeting or school and that "In" and "Out" reflects the arrival and departure from this school or meeting.

It is also possible that 23 and 41 refers to election districts and that those above individuals were watchers at election polls for the Communist Party.

MICHAEL WOLLIN, 103 Rockaway Parkway, Brooklyn, applied for a position with the FFI as a Special Agent in 1942, and an interview was scheduled for him on April 2, 1942. It is to be noted that WOLLIN failed to appear for this interview.

On December 1, 1946, Confidential Informant T-78, of known reliability, advised that ~~MICHAEL~~ WOLLIN, an Attorney for the American Labor Party, 23rd Assembly District, spoke at an ALP street meeting November 30, 1946 at Hopkinson and Pitkin Avenues, Brooklyn.

On January 12, 1949, Confidential Informant T-77, mentioned previously, advised that ~~MICHAEL~~ WOLLIN, 103 Rockaway Parkway, is the Chairman of the 23rd South Assembly District, American Labor Party Club.

On August 16, 1949, Confidential Informant T-9, mentioned previously, advised that MICHAEL WOLLIN was American Labor Party candidate for Municipal Court Judge for the 4th District.

On September 27, 1949, Confidential Informant T-10, mentioned previously, advised that MICHAEL WOLLIN, 103 Rockaway Parkway, was ALP candidate for Municipal Judge, 4th Election District, in the 1949 municipal elections.

On November 23, 1949, Confidential Informant T-79, of known reliability, advised that MICHAEL WOLLIN, 103 Rockaway Parkway, is the American Labor Party representative for the 23rd Assembly District.

On August 19, 1949, Confidential Informant T-9, mentioned previously, advised that MICHAEL WOLLIN, born in 1914, is a member of the International Workers Order, Lodge #193. The informant stated that his membership was under date of August, 1949.

On February 6, 1950, Confidential Informant T-80, of known reliability, advised that MICHAEL WOLLIN's name appears among a group of attorneys in submitting a brief of Amici Curiae in connection with the appeal of HARRY STACHNE, RICHARD GLADSTEIN, GEORGE W. CROCKETT, JR., LOUIS F. McCABE, ABRAHAM J. ISSELMAN, and EUGENE DENNIS, who represented the Communist Party leaders in the case entitled, "UNITED STATES vs WILLIAM Z. FOSTER, ET AL".

XV. INFORMANTS

Photographs of ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT were exhibited to both DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS by SA JOHN A. HARRINGTON on September 14, 1950. The GREENGLASSES were neither able to identify these photographs nor could they furnish any information pertaining to the SARANTS.

Photographs of MAX FIRESTONE were exhibited to DAVID GREENGLASS on August 31, 1950, by SA LEO H. FRUTKIN. GREENGLASS was unable to effect identification or furnish any information pertaining to FIRESTONE.

On September 7, 1950, SAs VINCENT J. CAHILL and CHARLES P. SILVERTHORN exhibited photographs of ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT to HELENE ELITCHER, who resides at 164-18 72nd Avenue, Flushing, Long Island, New York. She identified photographs of ALFRED SARANT. Considerable information had been previously furnished by HELENE ELITCHER pertaining to SARANT, which was set forth in the writer's report dated August 7, 1950. Mrs. HELENE ELITCHER was unable to identify a photograph of LOUISE SARANT.

On July 24, 1950, MAX ELITCHER, HELENE's husband, advised SAs CAHILL and JAMES T. O'BRIEN that after viewing photographs of ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT, he was unable to identify the photograph of LOUISE SARANT. In regard to SARANT's photograph, he indicated that he was not absolutely sure, but believed that the photograph was that of ALFRED SARANT whom he had met at the Morton Street apartment. Other information furnished by MAX ELITCHER pertaining to SARANT has been previously reported.

Confidential Informant T-81, of known reliability, advised on August 3 and 4, 1950 that he did not know ALFRED SARANT, nor could he identify his photograph.

Confidential Informant T-82, of known reliability, advised on September 27 and October 3, 1950, after viewing photographs of ALFRED and LOUISE SARANT, that their photographs were familiar to this informant. However, he was unable to elaborate regarding this familiarity.

For the information of the Dallas office, ALFRED SARANT, the subject of this investigation, is believed to be a member of the JULIUS ROSENBERG Soviet Espionage Parallel. SARANT and CAROL DAYTON, the wife of his next-door neighbor, in Ithaca, New York, entered Mexico on August 9, 1950. The location of ALFRED SARANT and CAROL DAYTON is unknown, and the reason given for their flight into Mexico was to evade giving testimony against a close friend of SARANT.

In this connection, it is believed that possibly during this weekend that SARANT and DAYTON planned their flight to Mexico which emanated at Baldwin, Long Island, on the evening of August 4, 1950, and possibly that BAILEY might be of assistance in the location of SARANT.

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The JOHNSONS recalled that JAMES YATES, who was the successor to SARANT Laboratories, was observed in the store building with SARANT and/or BARR on numerous occasions. They were of the opinion that through SARANT and BARR, YATES was able to obtain this store building. It is to be recalled that JAMES YATES has denied knowing ALFRED SARANT; however, he has advised that he knew JOEL BARR. Mrs. JOHNSON believed that YATES is a Communist due to the fact that a neighbor of hers had advised that YATES had been seen marching in some type of Communist Party parade.

The JOHNSONS stated that a laboratory was operated next door to the SARANT Laboratories under the name of Products Development Company. They stated that the Products Development Company windows had been painted a dark blue.

2. Reinterview of JEROME HARRIS

2. Reinterview of Jerome Harris

On November 8, 1950, the writer recontacted JEROME HARRIS of the Sidney A. Harris Company, 161 Seventh Avenue South, telephone number CH 2-7470, at which time it was ascertained that the Products Development Labs, Inc., had rented the store next door to the SARANT Laboratories from May, 1945 to September, 1950 at 227 West 11th Street, New York City. HARRIS stated that from 1948 to September, 1950, the building had been used for storage. He indicated that the Products Development Labs was operated by one SEDWITZ and a FRANK PIERSON. He believed that they did photographic and radio work. According to HARRIS, SEDWITZ could possibly be located at the Radio Labs or some similarly named organization at 155 Perry Street, New York City. He was unable to furnish an address for FRANK PIERSON; however, he did state that he received a telephone inquiry from a Mr. AUBREY, Brooklyn Navy Yard, telephone number MA 5-4500, extension 2081, pertaining to a recommendation for one FRANK PIERSON, which might possibly be identical with FRANK PIERSON who was connected with Products Development Labs, Inc.

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Mr. MAGNUS JOHNSON, Treasurer and Sales Manager for the Hogan Laboratories, Inc., 155 Perry Street, New York City, advised the writer on November 3, 1950 that the Hogan Laboratories had formerly been known as Radio Inventions, Inc., and that an individual by the name of IRA M. SEDWITZ, who resides at 101 West 60th Street, New York City, had been employed by his firm as a senior project engineer from May 8, 1945 until October 10, 1950.

IRA M. SEDWITZ, 101 West 60th Street, New York City, Apartment 6G, was contacted by the writer on November 8, 1950. He stated that he and an individual by the name of CARL OZOLS, an engineer who currently resides at Brooklyn, New York and is employed somewhere on Long Island, had formerly been the owners of Products Development Labs, Inc., 227 West 11th Street, New York City, from 1945 until 1948. He stated that an individual by the name of FRANK PIERSON, whose address he does not recall, took over the building in 1948.

SEDWITZ identified a photograph of JOEL BARR as an individual whom he had met in connection with the SARANT Laboratories. He recalled that he had received some mail for SARANT Laboratories and that he had contacted BARR for the purpose of delivering this mail. He believes that the mail consisted of bills, circulars, etc.

Concerning the equipment in the SARANT Laboratories, he recalls that there was a drill press which was placed near the front window.

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised on or about July, 1945 that the names of IRA and EVE SEDWITZ, 106 West 60th Street, New York 23, New York, appear on a list of names which was believed by the informant to be the membership list for the Thomas Jefferson Club, Communist Political Association, New York, New York.

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Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised on February 4, 1946 that IRA and EVE SEDWITZ, 101 West 60th Street, were members of group number one of the Jefferson Section, Communist Party, USA.

On September 12, 1949, [REDACTED] superintendent, [REDACTED], New York City, advised Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, that she had known [REDACTED] for five or six years. She stated she heard rumors from persons whom she considered reliable that [REDACTED] was a Communist and actually engaged in activities of the Communist Party. She believes [REDACTED] receives daily issues of the "Daily Worker", an East Coast Communist newspaper, and other Communist literature.

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Concerning CARL OZOLS, on December 11, 1936 ROLLS ELMAS RACENIS of Latvia who was being detained by the Federal Immigration authorities at Gloucester, New Jersey, advised SA J. F. MC DEVITT of the Philadelphia Office that CARL OZOLS, whose full name is KARLIS VOLDEMARS OZOLS, had an uncle who was an engineer and a high-ranking officer in the Russian OGPU. He advised that OZOLS received mail from his uncle, who is a supervising construction engineer somewhere in Russia, and that those letters were destroyed after reading. OZOLS was arrested by SA T. H. TRACY and Immigration and Naturalization Service Inspector MONTGOMERY on April 1, 1937 and charged with making a false oath in that he did swear on July 1, 1936 when enlisting in the New York National Guard that he was born in the United States, whereas he was born in Latvia.

OZOLS, upon questioning, admitted that he was born September 17, 1910 in Latvia.

On May 27, 1937, Assistant United States Attorney MALONEY of the Southern District of New York, caused dismissal of United States Commissioner's complaint in view of impending deportation of OZOLS.

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The records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service at New York City indicate that OZOLS voluntarily left the United States on the SS YUCATAN February 25, 1938 for Havana, Cuba. He was readmitted on March 8, 1938, having been a passenger on the SS ORIENTE in possession of a quota immigration visa and was later admitted to citizenship in the United States District Court at Washington, D. C., on August 5, 1941.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, advised on November 27, 1943 that ██████ admitted to illegal entry into the United States in 1929, having come to the United States to join his mother via Danzig on the SS POLONIA. He stated that in regard to his uncle, one ██████, who resided in Russia, that he is an engineer and not a GPU man, and that he had never corresponded with him, though his mother, ██████, had done so.

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Confidential Informant T-8 further advised that ██████ was being considered, as of November 27, 1943, for a research engineer position--Airborne Instruments Lab, Columbia University, Division of War Research.

The informant further advised that as of 1941, ██████ had been residing at ██████ Brooklyn, New York, for two years. The current Brooklyn Telephone Directory indicates a listing for ██████ at the ██████ address.

On December 23, 1945, Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised that KARLIS V. OZOLS, born in 1910, had been a member of IWO Lodge #500 prior to December, 1946. The informant stated that the word "suspended" appears beside OZOLS' name.

The Communist Party and the International Workers Order have been declared by the Attorney General to be within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

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III. INTERVIEW OF WARREN J. OESTREICHER
ON OCTOBER 18, 1950

On October 18, 1950, WARREN J. OESTREICHER, an engineer at the Tele King Television Corporation, 601 West 26th Street, New York City, was interviewed by SA FRANK P. WILLETTE. He advised that he met ALFRED SARANT in 1943 when they were both employed at the Western Electric Plant in Bayonne, New Jersey. He stated that they worked together for about two years and became quite friendly. OESTREICHER visited SARANT at his apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City. He estimated that he had visited the Morton Street apartment on about five occasions.

OESTREICHER advised that he met JOEL BARR at the Morton Street apartment. He recalled that SARANT and BARR went into business together and tried to obtain Government contracts. Their business was known as "SARANT Laboratories", and their letterhead advertised "Projections in Depth". OESTREICHER advised that although he is an engineer, he did not know what "Projections in Depth" meant and SARANT and BARR were very secretive about it.

OESTREICHER reported that he never met anyone at the Morton Street apartment except Mrs. SARANT and JOEL BARR. He stated that he kept calling at this apartment because at that time he hoped to go into business for himself and perhaps SARANT might take him in.

OESTREICHER recalled that while in Bayonne, SARANT contacted a serious case of trench mouth. Mrs. SARANT, who is a nurse, moved into the apartment and took care of SARANT. They lived together several months before they were married.

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OESTREICHER reported that he would have liked to have become more friendly with SARANT, but SARANT and BARR kept him at arms length. He felt that SARANT and BARR considered themselves superior to him. OESTREICHER stated that he considered SARANT a liberal and nothing more. In his opinion, SARANT was not a Communist.

OESTREICHER further reported that he recalled seeing photographic equipment in the apartment at 65 Morton Street, and stated that SARANT was always acquiring hobbies and felt that this was another one of SARANT'S numerous hobbies. OESTREICHER stated that he was married in 1943 and since he felt that his wife would not like SARANT, he and SARANT sort of drifted apart. He stated that he has not seen SARANT since 1944.

It is to be noted that OESTREICHER is apparently confused as to some of his dates. As an example, SARANT was not married until July 6, 1945, and for this reason it appears that he would be unable to report on happenings after that date when he states he has not seen SARANT since 1944.

IV. SARANT'S PRAXIDOS PHOTOGRAPHIC ENLARGER

A. Introduction

It is recalled that ALFRED SARANT has advised that he purchased a Praxidos Enlarger from JACK (?) ROSENBAUM while he was employed at the United States Signal Corps, General Development Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. According to SARANT, ALICE KATZ, who was then residing in Long Branch, New Jersey, and was also employed in the Signal Corps Laboratories, told him that a girl friend, whose husband was going into the Army, had an Enlarger for sale. He added that the man's name was JACK ROSENBAUM. SARANT recalled that he purchased the Enlarger for \$25.00, and ROSENBAUM lived "way out east" on 32nd or 33rd Street, New York City.

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B. Interview of ALICE KATZ BARKSY

Mrs. SIDNEY BARKSY, nee ALICE KATZ, who resides at 1475 Metcalf Avenue, Bronx, New York, telephone number Tivoli 2-2251, was reinterviewed on November 2, 1950 by the writer. It is recalled that she had formerly been interviewed on August 10, 1950 by SA CHARLES D. VANCE, at which time she had advised that she had formerly been employed by the United States Army Signal Corps at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. At that time she stated that she could not recall anyone by the name of JACK ROSENBAUM.

On reinterview Mrs. BARKSY now recalls that an individual by the name of LEON ROSENBAUM, who currently resides at 20-45 21st Street, Astoria, Long Island, New York, telephone number Astoria 8-0188, had sold her former boyfriend, ALFRED SARANT, a Praxidos Enlarger prior to his going into military service. She stated that ROSENBAUM is a friend of hers, as was his former wife, RUTH FROMA. RUTH FROMA is now connected with the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization in Paris, France. She stated that ROSENBAUM remarried, and that his second wife's name is PAULINE. She advised that ROSENBAUM is an architect by profession.

Mrs. BARKSY reported that she first met SARANT in 1942 in one of the Laboratories at the Signal Corps at Fort Monmouth. She stated that shortly thereafter he left the Signal Corps and was employed by the Western Electric Company. Mrs. BARKSY further stated that

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their friendship continued up until her marriage in September, 1943. She stated that she left the New York City area and joined her husband, who was in the United States Army, stationed at that time in Alabama.

Mrs. BARSKY stated that she had visited SARANT and BARR at the 65 Morton Street apartment on occasions of musicals, in approximately 1944 and 1945. She stated that she had attended several of these musicals. However, she did not believe that the number exceeded six. She related that she had met SARANT'S wife, and that prior to her (Mrs. BARSKY'S) marriage, she had met SARANT'S immediate family, who are currently residing at Baldwin and Freeport, Long Island. Mrs. BARSKY stated that she met BETTY SANDERS at one of the musicals at SARANT'S apartment.

Concerning SARANT'S photographic equipment, at the outset Mrs. BARSKY advised that she is a professional photographer in addition to being a physicist by profession, having been one of the first women photographers at the New York City night club, Billy Rose's Diamond Horseshoe. She stated that she had also taught photography. Mrs. BARSKY related that in addition to the Praxidos Enlarger, he had an Argus C camera and complete developing and printing facilities. She related that SARANT'S photography work had been confined mostly to the snapshot variety, and she does not recall any indoor work or document type of photography performed by SARANT.

Concerning JOEL BARR, she stated that she had met him through SARANT while he was working at the Western Electric Company. She knew VIVIAN GLASSMAN as the "girl friend" of BARR'S. Mrs. BARSKY indicated that BARR had a similar interest in photography. VIVIAN GLASSMAN, according to Mrs. BARSKY, had reactivated her interest in photography through her friendship with JOEL BARR; however, it was her impression that VIVIAN GLASSMAN had been exposed to photography while a student at Hunter College. She stated that she doesn't believe that VIVIAN

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GLASSMAN, at that time, had any photographic equipment, other than what was available to JOEL BARR. She stated that she could not be definite as to what type of equipment he had. Possibly his equipment was that which SARANT had. Mrs. BARSKY did not recall that either BARR, GLASSMAN, or SARANT ever had a Leica camera.

Mrs. BARSKY stated that SARANT was not a member of the Communist Party at the time she knew him, by reason that she believes that if he had been he would have tried to have recruited her into the Party. She explained that the only type of political activity which she knew that he was interested in was that he had morally supported her in her efforts to establish a union at the United States Signal Corps in Fort Monmouth, New Jersey.

Mrs. BARSKY stated that VIVIAN GLASSMAN, who she still maintains social contact with, had taken her to the apartment of one of SARANT'S former girl friends by the name of GLADYS FENNER sometime in 1944. She indicated that GLADYS FENNER lived on Waverly Place in New York City, with her sister, whose name she believes to have been ARLINE.

Confidential Informant T-26, of known reliability, advised on November 21, 1947 that the name of SIDNEY R. BARSKY, 1000 East 181st Street, Bronx, New York, appears on an addressograph stencil at the Communist Party, USA, District No. 2 Headquarters, New York City. The informant stated that the exact significance of this stencil is not known, but it is believed to be part of the Communist Party or affiliated organization mailing list. It is noted that the address of 1000 East 181st Street, is the residence of Mr. and Mrs. HARRY KATZ, parents of ALICE KATZ BARSKY, and that prior to living at 1475 Metcalf Avenue, Mrs. BARSKY stated she and her husband resided with her parents.

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C. Interview of LEON ROSENBAUM

LEON ROSENBAUM, 20-45 21st Street, Astoria, Long Island, New York, was contacted by the writer on November 9, 1950. He stated that prior to entering the Army, he had sold his Praxidos Photographic Enlarger to ALFRED SARANT for \$20.00 in approximately May or June, 1943. He stated that he had met SARANT in Long Branch, New Jersey, through ALICE KATZ BARSKY.

ROSENBAUM stated that he was only slightly acquainted with SARANT, and that he did not know JOEL BARR. He indicated that he had met VIVIAN GLASSMAN through Mrs. BARSKY.

ROSENBAUM stated that he was not familiar with any of the photographic equipment which SARANT had at that time.

V. INTERVIEW OF BERNARD GARFINKEL
ON OCTOBER 5, 1950

BERNARD GARFINKEL, who resides at 801 Hopkinson Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, was interviewed at the office of his attorney, MICHAEL WOLLIN, 215 Montague Street, Brooklyn, New York, by SA JOHN A. HARRINGTON, and the writer on October 5, 1950.

GARFINKEL identified SARANT'S photographs as an individual he had known as "AL". However, he was unable to recall his last name. When the name of SARANT was suggested he advised that this individual was identical with ALFRED SARANT, whom he had met through JOEL BARR. He recalled having attended musicals on one or two occasions at the SARANT apartment in the Greenwich Village area. The address of 65 Norton Street was suggested to him, and he stated that this was SARANT'S address.

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GARFINKEL related that he did not know SARANT very well, and he could not recall any of the individuals who attended the musicals at either BARR'S or SARANT'S apartment. He indicated that he definitely did not recall that SARANT was married. A photograph of LOUISE SARANT was exhibited to GARFINKEL, and he advised that he did not know this individual.

GARFINKEL stated that he was born on July 15, 1917 in Brooklyn, New York. In January of 1938 he graduated from the College of the City of New York with a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering Degree, and continued studying at the College of the City of New York for one additional semester, at which time, he passed a Civil Service examination and received an appointment of Junior Marine Engineer at the New York Naval Yard, Brooklyn, New York, in approximately June of 1938. This employment continued until August, 1946, at which time, he was released from Government employment for causes of "reduction in force".

Concerning his Government employment, he advised he had never been approached by anyone to supply any information pertaining to this employment, and stated that he doubted if any information which he could have furnished would have been of any value because he had never worked on anything of a classified, restricted or secret nature while employed at the New York Naval Yard. In answer to a question "Have you ever been a member of the Communist Party?", he stated that he would "rather" not answer this question. In answer to the question "Are you now a member of the Communist Party?", he stated he would "rather" not answer this question.

Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, advised on March 27, 1941 that he had ascertained from MIRIAM REIF, Branch Organizer for the Bensonhurst Branch of the Communist Party in Brooklyn, on September 3, 1940 that BERNARD GARFINKEL, an employee of the New York Naval Shipyard, was an active Communist.

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MIRIAM REIF advised the informant that GARFINKEL was a Junior Engineer in the Drafting Room at the New York Naval Shipyard, and that he was from the East New York Section of Brooklyn, New York.

Confidential Informant T-11 advised on October 30, 1940 that the Junior Naval Architects in the New York Naval Shipyard were under the leadership of MORRIS BAYLEN, BERNARD GARFINKEL and ALBERT GROSS, all members of the Communist Party, and were organized to demand immediate promotion and raise in salary.

The informant further advised that an organizational meeting took place at the headquarters of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians, 592 Fulton Street, Brooklyn, and after this meeting there was an informal get together of BAYLEN, GARFINKEL, GROSS, and others.

Confidential Informant T-11 stated that GUSTAVE JURIST, who was head of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians at the New York Naval Shipyard, Brooklyn, New York, spoke at the latter meeting and addressed the persons present as "We, Communists".

Confidential Informant T-12, of known reliability, advised on May 3, 1948 that BERNIE GARFINKEL, who had worked in Building number 77 at the Brooklyn Naval Yard, was a member of the Carlson Club, number 2, Communist Party, as of the Summer of 1947. This informant stated that GARFINKEL'S Party name was GEORGE BENNETT, and he lived at 801 Hopkinson Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. He stated that his telephone number was DI 6-8779. This informant further advised that the Carlson Club, number 2, Communist Party, was composed of professional and white collar workers employed at the Brooklyn Naval Yard.

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Confidential Informant T-13, of known reliability, advised in 1942 that [REDACTED] was being considered for a commission in the Signal Corps of the United States Army as of that year. The informant stated that he was at that time employed as an [REDACTED] in the New York Naval Yard. His parents were stated to be [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] This informant indicated that [REDACTED] was a prominent [REDACTED] New York Naval Yard chapter, and said to be intimately associated with directors and members of the group in control, some of whom, according to the informant, were later determined to be connected with Communist Party activities outside of the Naval Yard.

Confidential Informant T-14, of known reliability, advised on October 29, 1945 that ARNOLD HERSCH contacted ANDRI IVONOVICH GALIGAN, clerk at the USSR Consulate in New York City. The informant stated that HERSCH related to GALIGAN that he and BERNARD GARFINKEL were changing their apartments.

Confidential Informant T-12, previously mentioned, advised in late 1947 that ARNOLD HERSCH, Engineer, P.-3 Grade at the Brooklyn Naval Yard and who at that time worked at 90 Church Street, was and still is, as of late 1947, a member of the Carlson Club, Number 2, of the Communist Party. This informant stated that HERSCH'S name is registered with the Communist Party as HENRY ADAMS. This informant also advised that ARNOLD HERSCH and his wife were members of the International Workers Order.

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VI. INTERVIEW OF FRED KOHLER
ON OCTOBER 24, 1950

LEWIS WOLFE GLEEKMAN, 10 Caldwell Place, Newark, Delaware, advised SAs FRANK A. STANTON and JAMES L. REINHART on August 16, 1950 that FRED KOHLER, a former roommate of his in New York City prior to his marriage, had recently returned to New York City from Mexico City. KOHLER, according to GLEEKMAN had attended musicals with him at ALFRED SARANT'S Morton Street apartment during the period from June, 1944 until February, 1945.

On October 24, 1950, SA VICTOR TURYN and the writer interviewed FRED KOHLER, owner of the Plastic Welding Corporation, Sixth Floor, 407 Broome Street, New York City, telephone number Canal 6-1227. KOHLER stated that his home address is 131 East 31st Street, New York City, telephone number Murray Hill 5-2077.

KOHLER related that he had returned from Mexico in July of 1950, having gone to Mexico City on a vacation in January of this year. He recalled that he met ALFRED SARANT through LEWIS GLEEKMAN and had gone to SARANT'S apartment on one occasion to attend a musical. He stated that he did not know SARANT'S wife.

A photograph of LOUISE SARANT was shown to Mr. KOHLER, and he stated that he had known her from somewhere; however, he did not connect her with ALFRED SARANT.

KOHLER stated that JOEL BARR'S name is familiar; however, he was unable to recognize any photographs of JOEL BARR.

KOHLER, when shown photographs of MAX ELITCHER, MORTON SOBELL, and ETHEL ROSENBERG, stated that their photographs were familiar; however, he was unable to furnish any information pertaining to these individuals.

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KOHLER stated that he is a graduate Chemical Engineer, having graduated from Cooper Union in 1942. He advised that he had never been approached to furnish any information pertaining to any of his employments, and that he is not now or has he ever been a member of the Communist Party.

Concerning GLEEKMAN, KOHLER stated that he knew he was in sympathy with the Communist Party, although GLEEKMAN had never admitted that he was a member. He believed that GLEEKMAN was a member, but he could not positively state this. However, GLEEKMAN'S political philosophy was such that he could not have helped but have taken some positive action. Such action would have been for him to have been actively engaged in Communist Party activities.

Concerning SARANT'S Communist Party membership, KOHLER stated that it was common knowledge that he was a Communist. However, again he was unable to offer any positive proof as to this knowledge.

VII. ADDITIONAL INVESTIGATION OF SARANT'S
APARTMENT 6I, 65 Morton Street,
Greenwich Village, New York City

A. 65 Morton Street Realty Company

On October 30, 1950, SA HERMAN C. LITTLEJOHN JR. interviewed ROBERT GARLOCK, President and Managing Agent, 65 Morton Street Realty Company, 310 East 55th Street, New York City. He stated that EDWARD HARRISON, a former superintendent at 65 Morton Street, had rented apartment 6I to ALFRED SARANT in October, 1943.

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GARLOCK indicated that he had had no contact with SARANT until possibly September of 1946 when he happened to be at 65 Morton Street and observed a moving van. GARLOCK asked his superintendent, FLOYD ELWYN, Senior, concerning this van, and he learned that SARANT was moving.

GARLOCK said he went to Apartment 6I alone, and saw ALFRED SARANT in the hall. SARANT, at that time, advised him that he was being transferred by the Bell Telephone Laboratories to Ithaca, New York, and that he was going to sublet his apartment for six months to a year. He indicated that his transfer was not permanent and wanted the apartment when he returned to New York. GARLOCK said that at the time he talked to SARANT, he noted through the open door of the apartment that it was practically empty, but said he saw packing barrels in the apartment.

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GARLOCK said he told SARANT he could not sublet, and SARANT argued with him. GARLOCK said that SARANT told him he would be responsible for the rent, and would send a check each month for the rent. Mr. GARLOCK said he asked SARANT why he had not notified the Real Estate office of his pending transfer, and SARANT told him that this transfer came very suddenly. GARLOCK said that he told SARANT that he would investigate and find out about the transfer. Mr. GARLOCK said he did investigate. He advised the interviewing agent that he had written to Bell Telephone Laboratories, New York City, and he produced a copy of a letter dated September 19, 1946, addressed to the Bell Telephone Laboratories, in which GARLOCK had requested information concerning ALFRED SARANT, stating that SARANT had told GARLOCK that he was being sent to Ithaca, New York, on a special assignment that would take from three to five months. GARLOCK asked the Bell Telephone Laboratories for a verification of this transfer. Mr. GARLOCK advised that he had received an answer from this inquiry; however, he could not locate a letter from Bell Telephone, and stated that he had probably received the information by telephone.

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It was on the basis of the information that he received that he wrote the letter dated December 27, 1946, previously reported, in which he told SARANT that Bell Telephone Laboratories had stated that SARANT had left their employ September 11, 1946, advising that he was planning to enter the teaching profession.

Mr. GARLOCK stated that he does not recall receiving an answer to this letter although he is sure that it was answered, and that SARANT told him he would be back to New York in six months to a year. GARLOCK stated that he then forgot about apartment 6I, except that he wrote numerous letters to SARANT concerning the fact that his rent was overdue. He said that copies of all of these letters were not kept.

Mr. GARLOCK stated that in the latter part of 1949, probably in either October or November, the superintendent at 65 Morton Street, FLOYD ELWYN, Jr., advised him that SARANT is back in apartment 6I. Mr. GARLOCK said that approximately two months later, he received a letter from SARANT, dated January 23, 1950, which has been previously set forth, in which SARANT advised GARLOCK that he wished to give up occupancy of apartment 6I. Mr. GARLOCK said that when he received this letter he told FLOYD ELWYN, Jr. to check the apartment, and he said that Mr. ELWYN later advised him that he found the apartment occupied.

GARLOCK said that he asked ELWYN to ask the occupant to move out a few days before the rent was up, so the apartment could be redecorated. Mr. GARLOCK said he had no other contacts with SARANT, but those he had related, and that he had no knowledge of any individual named JOEL BARR or the identity of any other of the alleged sub-tenants in apartment 6I.

Among numerous photographs displayed to Mr. GARLOCK were photographs of ALFRED SARANT. SARANT'S photographs were the only ones he identified, although he stated that a photograph of HENRIETTA SAVIDGE "looked familiar to him."

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Confidential Informant T-15, of known reliability, advised on February 13, 1945 that the name ROBERT GARLOCK, 310 East 55th Street, New York City, telephone PLaza 3-5993, appeared on a list of businessmen evidently prepared for solicitation in the March-June campaign of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee in connection with the United American Spanish Aid Committee.

It is to be noted that the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee and the United American Spanish Aid Committee have been declared by the Attorney General as "Communist", and within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Mrs. JOANNE BOUDREAU, Secretary at the 65 Morton Street Realty Company, advised that the former secretary of this company two years prior to December, 1949 was ELEANOR ERICSON, 23-59 92nd Street, Jackson Heights, Long Island, New York, telephone number PLaza 3-5993.

In addition to the information previously reported, Mrs. BOUDREAU made another search of the 65 Morton Street Realty Company files, and located an Application for Lease of ALFRED SARANT, dated September 19, 1943, and two memorandums pertaining to SARANT on letterhead paper of the F. Le Grand Real Estate Broker, 271 West 11th Street, New York City. The Application for Lease, dated September 19, 1943, indicated that SARANT'S one year lease would start on October 1, 1943, that his address at that time was 93 West 34th Street, Bayonne, New Jersey, and his employment was the Western Electric Company, Bayonne, New Jersey. He gave as a reference the Bayonne Savings Bank, Bayonne, New Jersey.

The first memorandum, on stationery of the F. Le Grand, dated September 27, 1943, indicates the names of two personal references, J. R. BOETTNER, President of the Universal Concrete Form Company, 101 Park Avenue, New York City, and J. ROBINSON, Chief Engineer, Communication Measurements Laboratory, 120 Liberty Street, New York City.

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The second memorandum, which was undated, is a handwritten copy of substantially the same information as appears on the first memorandum dated September 27, 1943.

B. Interview of HENRY GEORGE HAYWOOD

HENRY GEORGE HAYWOOD, Superintendent of 76 Charles Street, New York City, advised SA HERMAN C. LITTLEJOHN, Jr. and the writer on November 18, 1950 that he had formerly worked with FLOYD BLYNN, Sr. as Assistant Superintendent at 83-89 Barrow Street, an apartment house, from 1927 to 1941. He stated that at this time a Mr. HARRISON (deceased) was superintendent at 63-69 Morton Street building which adjoined the Barrow Street building, and both buildings were owned by the same realty company.

Mr. HAYWOOD stated that in the winter of 1943 or 1944 he worked as a fireman at the 63-69 Morton Street building. He advised that he had no knowledge of any tenants in apartment 6I at 65 Morton Street.

Photographs of SARANT, BAER, and numerous others were exhibited to HAYWOOD without any identification.

C. Results of FBI Examination

The FBI Laboratory has examined the typewritten letter on the stationery of ALFRED SARANT, General Contractor, to Mr. ROBERT GARLOCK, New York, with the typewritten signature ALFRED SARANT, dated January 23, 1950. A definite conclusion could not be reached as to whether the typewriting was prepared on the typewriter owned by SARANT because of variations which could not be accounted for on the basis of the available known typewriting samples. The Laboratory examinations suggested the possibilities that the variations could be due to the condition of the ribbon at the time the known specimens were prepared, and also to the fact that some of the letters on the typewriter are dirty and therefore clear impressions are not made of these particular letters.

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VIII. ADDITIONAL INVESTIGATION RE BOOK
ENTITLED "MICRO WAVE TRANSMISSION
DESIGN DATA - SPERRY", SERIAL NO.
4964

Mr. JOHN WEIDERT was interviewed on November 8, 1950 by SA WILLIAM A. JOHNSON at the Sperry Gyroscope Plant, Lake Success, New York, where he is employed. He has been employed there as a Project Engineer since May 19, 1941.

Declassified by [unclear]

WEIDERT explained that he was a Sales Engineer back in 1944 and 1945 with the Company. He stated that the book entitled "Micro wave Transmission Design Data - Sperry" was at first classified information. However, around 1944 or 1945 the book was taken off the classified list through the efforts of the Army and Navy. After the book had been declassified it was widely advertised as it would have been of considerable interest and informational value to electrical engineers. Due to that fact, lots of books were dispatched to various responsible people after the clearance had been granted for that person to receive them. These people who received these lots of books were such men as were working at Massachusetts Institute of Technology or Camp Evans Signal Laboratory, and books were not sent to them until Sperry had received clearance on them.

Mr. WEIDERT advised that at least 600 of these books were sent out, and it would be impossible to know what happened to these books after they were sent out to these cleared people. He stated that he had no recollection as to what happened to the book, bearing serial number 4964. He stated that he did not know JOSEPH BRUGER of the Engineering Division at Western Electric, but stated that it was quiet possible that a book had been sent to someone at Western Electric. He was not familiar with the name of ALFRED SARANT.

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IX. INTERVIEW OF MAX AND GERTRUDE DOEBELI
ON SEPTEMBER 8, 1950

On September 8, 1950 SAS ALFRED B. CLARK and NORBERT T. DEMBINSKI interviewed MAX DOEBELI at 149 East 81st Street, New York City, telephone number RH 4-2709. DOEBELI identified a photograph of ALFRED SARANT, and stated that he was a former tenant of his at a rooming house which he and his wife, GERTRUDE, operated at 114 Norwood Avenue, Long Branch, New Jersey, from 1937 to 1945.

DOEBELI related that SARANT occupied a furnished flat at the above address with two other young men, whose names he could not recall. He added that SARANT was, at the time, attending the Stevens Institute of Technology, Hoboken, New Jersey, and experimented with some type of unidentified machine in his apartment. DOEBELI continued that when he sold the above property in 1945, no records of the past tenants were maintained. Consequently he could not furnish the exact dates of SARANT'S tenancy. He did state, however, that SARANT and his two companions resided at the above Long Branch, New Jersey, address sometime in 1941.

DOEBELI further stated that he and his wife moved to New York City following the sale of their property, and later departed for Switzerland in the Fall of 1947. Upon returning to New York City in January of 1948, he said he and his wife again resided at their present address. DOEBELI advised that he is a retired member of the Bureau of Statistics, United States Customs, New York City, and that his wife is presently engaged as a nurse.

As you know, investigative reports in this matter are being furnished to the Criminal Division of the Department and to the USA, SDNY, and must be prepared and reviewed carefully. Special Agent Royal's report should be revised in accordance with the foregoing observations and it is suggested that the data specified above to be reported under an "Administrative" caption be set out on new pages numbered to follow immediately after the revised "Details" section of the report, thereby making unnecessary to renumber the entire report. Corrected pages should be furnished promptly to the Bureau and interested divisions.

DETAILS:

DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, have advised that they were recruited into the Soviet espionage apparatus by JULIUS ROSENBERG, a brother-in-law of DAVID GREENGLASS. DAVID GREENGLASS is now serving a fifteen year sentence for transmitting certain classified data relating to the atomic bomb project at Los Alamos, New Mexico, to HARRY GOLD, a confessed Soviet spy now serving a thirty-year sentence for espionage. JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife, ETHEL, were sentenced to death in April, 1951 in the Southern District of New York for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS learned through conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG during the period 1946 to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage in connection with which he was using as a conspiratorial headquarters and for the purpose of microfilming documents and making espionage contacts an apartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City, and an apartment in the vicinity of Twelfth Street and Avenue B.

Information obtained from MAX ELITCHER, who admits that ROSENBERG attempted to recruit him for Soviet espionage, indicates that the Greenwich Village apartment was located at 65 Morton Street, New York City. This apartment was rented in the name of ALFRED SARANT from October 1943 to January 1950.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised on ~~10/23/51~~ that JULIUS ROSENBERG "mentioned an apartment rented by a student ostensibly used for studying on Morton Street where he, JOEL BARR and 'BILL' used to meet in secret to discuss their plans." ROSENBERG did not

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identify "BILL" at this time, but from other conversations informant had with ROSENBERG, "BILL" is believed by T-1 to be WILLIAM PERL.

On July 10, 1951 T-1 stated that ROSENBERG informed that this apartment was ostensibly rented for a student to have a place to study but that the real purpose was to have a place for meetings. ROSENBERG said that he had typed for many hours on various occasions in the Morton Street apartment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table legs and would let the water run in the bathroom. ROSENBERG advised T-1 that he paid the rent on this apartment.

ALFRED SARANT, upon interview, has advised that he was a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist Party in 1943-1944 and believes that he met JULIUS ROSENBERG through a mutual friend named JOEL BARR. SARANT has denied that ROSENBERG was ever in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, but MAX ELITCHER has advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL (also known to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL), and ELITCHER and his wife, HELENE, were together in SARANT'S apartment, number 6-I, at 65 Morton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.

In 1945 ALFRED SARANT married LOUISE JACQUELINE RUBEL-ROSS and moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946 at which time the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, was taken by his friend, JOEL BARR. It was arranged that BARR would send him the rent for the apartment in Ithaca, New York, and that SARANT would then pay the landlord of 65 Morton Street by check.

SARANT has advised that WILLIAM PERL, who was a friend of both SARANT and JOEL BARR, used the apartment subsequent to JOEL BARR under the same rental paying arrangement and that PERL in sending the last money order payment in January, 1950 attached a note requesting SARANT to relinquish the apartment as PERL no longer had any use for it.

ALFRED SARANT, following his interview by Bureau agents in July-August 1950, fled the United States

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into Mexico, entering under an assumed name. His present whereabouts are unknown.

WILLIAM PERL has been identified as a Soviet agent by ROSENBERG to Confidential Informant T-1. PERL is at present under indictment for perjury before the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

JOEL BARR was identified as a Soviet agent by ROSENBERG to DAVID GREENGLASS following JOEL BARR'S sailing from the United States for Europe in January, 1948. ROSENBERG advised DAVID GREENGLASS that BARR was going to Europe to continue his espionage work in European countries.

ALFRED SARANT has advised that JOEL BARR had a girl friend named VIVIAN GLASSMAN and that he believes that VIVIAN GLASSMAN sent him the first few rental payments in the form of money orders for the apartment rent at 65 Morton Street, New York City.

The Albany Office advised on July 22, 1950 that a money order number 988487 issued at the Church Street Station Post Office, New York City, on August 8, 1949, payable to ALFRED SARANT from VIVIAN GLASSMAN, 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, as a remitter, was located in the account of ALFRED SARANT in the First National Bank of Ithaca, New York. This money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bore a deposit date of August 11, 1949.

VIVIAN GLASSMAN has advised upon interview that she was the former fiancée of JOEL BARR and that she had sent money orders to ALFRED SARANT in payment of the rent on 65 Morton Street in July and August, 1948. She also admitted that she had made an airplane trip to Cleveland, Ohio on July 22, 1950 to contact WILLIAM PERL with \$2,000 in cash and to give instructions to PERL to leave the United States and go to Mexico. She stated that she received the \$2,000 and the instructions for PERL from an unknown man who contacted her at her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. GLASSMAN claimed that the identity of the man who contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist agents to identify him.

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Confidential Informant T-1 advised that in conversation JULIUS ROSENBERG stated that on a holiday weekend, which the informant believes may have been the Fourth of July weekend, 1949, WILLIAM PERL removed some secret files from a laboratory located at Columbia University and that PERL took these files to ROSENBERG'S apartment at Knickerbocker Village, New York City, where ROSENBERG, PERL, a third unidentified individual who was called in from out of town, and a fourth man together spent fourteen to seventeen hours with two cameras photographing the material that PERL had obtained in order that PERL could return the material at his earliest convenience to Columbia University. ROSENBERG indicated to T-1 that the third man was MICHAEL SIDOROVICH, who he described as a member of his espionage organization.

Confidential Informant T-1 stated that the fourth man was a definite member of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus; that he is the man who subsequently contacted VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950, to arrange with her to proceed to Cleveland, Ohio, to contact WILLIAM PERL and give him \$2,000 in order to facilitate his flight from the United States to Mexico.

The informant advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG indicated that the Russians sent his last recruit to contact VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950 and that the last individual that JULIUS ROSENBERG recruited into his Soviet espionage ring was a man who lived with the son of a wealthy family. The informant stated that the son of the wealthy family owned a black convertible Buick automobile and that he had loaned his Buick to the last JULIUS ROSENBERG recruit who drove ROSENBERG to Ithaca, New York, to see ALFRED SARANT and make a pickup of espionage material.

Concerning the identity of the two individuals described above by T-1, investigation to identify the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG who lived with the son of a wealthy family and who owned a 1949 or 1950 black Buick convertible automobile with a white top, indicates that one MAXWELL FINESTONE, with alias MAX FINESTONE, was the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG and that EDWARD JAMES

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WEINSTEIN, commonly known as JAMES WEINSTEIN, was the individual with whom he lived.

JAMES WEINSTEIN is the son of JOSEPH WEINSTEIN, President of the Versailles Garment Corporation, 470 Seventh Avenue, New York City, a ladies' garment manufacturing firm. JAMES WEINSTEIN, in an interview with Bureau Agents on August 21, 1950, produced a New York State automobile registration dated January 19, 1950 for a 1949 Buick convertible.

JAMES WEINSTEIN resided at 418 East Ninth Street, New York City, with MAX FINESTONE from February 1950 to about October-November 1950.

MAX FINESTONE who was born on July 28, 1922 at Boston, Massachusetts, is a graduate of Cornell University having graduated in September 1949 and is a close friend of LOUISE (PUSS) SARANT.

On April 5, 1951 VIVIAN GLASSMAN was observed by SA JOHN J. DOERMER and the writer leaving her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, with a man who was subsequently identified as MAX FINESTONE.

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INFORMATION CONCERNING WORKERS PERSONAL SERVICE
BUREAU

During an investigation to locate a banking record for the subject prior to 1948, information was received from the Manufacturers Trust Company, 55 Broad Street, New York City, which firm absorbed the Fulton Street Branch of the Brooklyn Trust Company in 1950, which indicated that VIVIAN GLASSMAN had converted a United States Savings Bond at the Brooklyn Trust Company on October 19, 1945. At that time she exhibited an identification reflecting she was employed at the Workers Personal Service Bureau of Columbia University.

At the New York School of Social Work, 2 East 91 Street, New York City, which is the Social Service School of Columbia University, ~~WALTER J. JAMES~~, Dean's Office, advised that the Workers Personal Service Bureau was a Social Service Organization to which students of the New York School of Social Work were sent to work to gain some experience in social work. She stated that this field work was part of the school's training program and that the students received no salary from the organization to which they were attached and they were considered voluntary workers. She did not know the address of the Workers Personal Service Bureau.

~~WALTER J. JAMES~~ stated that VIVIAN GLASSMAN'S file reflected she had also been assigned for field experience to the Jewish Community Service in Queens and Nassau Counties, New York, which is a family case work agency, and the the American Red Cross, New York City, during the time she was a social service student. She graduated in February, 1946.

The July 1945 issue of the "Transmitter", publication of Radio Local 430, United Electrical Radio and Machino Workers of America, Volume 3, Number 8, reflects an article regarding the Workers Personal Service Bureau, 391 Fulton Street, Brooklyn, New York. The article indicated that the Workers Personal Service Bureau had been endorsed by the Greater New York CIO Council, by prominent American Federation of Labor officials and by the City's Health and Welfare Agency through the Welfare Council of New York City;

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that it was available with advice to all working men and women who had problems of a financial, medical or personal nature at no cost; that the Bureau was a union staffed agency and knew all the answers to workers' problems. Its telephone number was reflected as Main 4-6892.

On ~~July 27, 1945~~ Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised that one ALFRED H. KATZ had informed her that he was Director of the Workers Personal Service Bureau; that the organization had been in existence for approximately ~~two~~ months and operated as a referral bureau for persons seeking employment and a sort of vocational guidance organization. T-2 stated that the organization operated on a \$10,000 budget and that there were two or three girls in the office of the Bureau in addition to KATZ.

The informant stated that ALFRED H. KATZ was a member of the Communist Party and that KATZ' wife is MARIE KATZ who was an organizer for the Communist dominated Social Service Employees Union, a part of the United Office and Professional Workers of America, CIO.

T-2 stated the belief that the Workers Personal Service Bureau was a Communist front organization.

On November 7, 1945, Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, furnished the following information concerning the Workers Personal Service Bureau:

"This afternoon I interviewed Mrs. GLASSMAN who is a social service counselor for the Workers Personal Service Bureau, 391 Fulton Street, Brooklyn. The WPSB, she said, was formerly a committee created by the U.E. during the war to advise members on personal problems of family illness, finances, citizenship, need for child care while the mother worked, etc.

"Its successful application in the union, she went on, prompted officials to enlarge the committee's activity to embrace problems of workers and veterans regardless of union affiliation. It seems that a conference was

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"initiated by several Stalinist-controlled unions in the early months of this year. With the usual quota of dupes for window-dressing, they prevailed upon the Greater New York Fund to foot the operation of this agency.

"Established at its present address last March, the WPSB is affiliated with the Welfare Council of New York City. Under this arrangement it continues to receive funds from the Greater New York Fund for rent, salaries and whatever else is necessary for its maintenance. Inasmuch as it is sponsored by the Greater New York CIO Council and various well-meaning civic organizations, I gathered from her remarks that the sales talk to the GNYF dealt with its social good. Therefore, its financial support really stems from the CIO unions and civic organizations.

"Mrs. GLASSMAN, who is a member of the party-dominated Social Service Employees Union, told me her agency has been advising many veterans in the past two months, and more are coming for advice every day. Their problems usually revolve around jobs. Depending upon his particular skill or aptitude, the veteran is sent either to the USBS or a CIO union that can place him. Other problems are referred to various agencies, depending upon their specific nature. In all cases clients are given to understand the WPSB is definitely pro, not anti-labor. She intends to stock such literature as The New Veteran, The CIO and the Veteran and similar pamphlets published by the National CIO War Relief Committee, which recently changed its name to the National CIO Community Service Committee.

"As no other branch exists in New York City, Mrs. GLASSMAN serves as counselor to the UAW, 709 8th Avenue, every Wednesday evening. It is hoped, she said, that the agency can open a branch or two in others boroughs. The enclosed leaflet, containing a list of the board of directors, is the only piece of literature issued by this agency.

"In addition to Mrs. GLASSMAN another woman and a man occupy the rather small office. I chatted a while with both women but mostly with the former, and am convinced they are Stalinists. If this is not a front in the formal sense, there are sufficient Stalinists on the board of

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"directors and as staff counselors to direct policy and advice in accordance with their line."

On April 18, 1952, Reverend J. EMMET MC DONALD, Director of Catholic Charities, 191 Joralemon Street, Brooklyn, New York, and former Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Workers Personal Service Bureau, advised that he had served as Chairman of the Board of Directors for about two years or from about 1945 to 1947. He stated that the Workers Personal Service Bureau had its office located at 391 Fulton Street, Brooklyn, New York, and he recalled that the office staff consisted of ALFRED KATZ, who was the Director, and a woman named CAMILLE JONES, who assisted KATZ. He recognized a photograph of VIVIAN GLASSMAN as that of a woman who also assisted in the office as a counselor. He stated that he was not certain but believes VIVIAN GLASSMAN was probably a paid staff worker.

Reverend MC DONALD advised he did not have the employment records of the Workers Personal Service Bureau nor the cancelled checks used to pay the salaries of the office workers and did not know what disposition was made of these records when the Workers Personal Service Bureau disbanded. He expressed the opinion that they were probably taken by the Brooklyn Council of Social Planning, 30 Third Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, under whose sponsorship the Workers Personal Service Bureau functioned.

Reverend MC DONALD did not recall the identity of the bank used by the Workers Personal Service Bureau to deposit and disperse operating funds. He stated that Mr. EDWIN WILSON, Editor of the "Brooklyn Eagle" newspaper, was treasurer of the Workers Personal Service Bureau and would have this information.

On April 18, 1952, Mrs. LOUISE SIMSAR, Executive Secretary of the Brooklyn Council for Social Planning, YWCA, 30 Third Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, advised she was associated with the Workers Personal Service Bureau in 1946-1947 and served on the Board of Directors. She stated that her contact with the staff members of this organization was infrequent, being limited to meeting staff members only if they attended

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a planning conference. The only staff member she remembered was ALFRED KATZ who was in charge of the organization's office at 391 Fulton Street, Brooklyn. Shown a photograph of VIVIAN GLASSMAN, she advised she did not recognize her and did not know if GLASSMAN was a staff member.

Mrs. SIMSAR stated that the New York School of Social Work of Columbia University would send trainees to the organization for experience but that these trainees were not considered members of the staff and received no monetary compensation; that if GLASSMAN was serving as a trainee her name would not be found in the records of the organization as an employee and no pay checks would have ever been issued to her.

Mrs. SIMSAR stated that the Workers Personal Service Bureau had no other offices than that located at 391 Fulton Street, Brooklyn, New York; that the organization was dissolved in about 1948 due to lack of funds, and that the records of the organization are now at the Welfare and Health Council of New York City 44 East 23 Street, New York City.

On April 24, 1952, Miss CATHERINE FARRA, Welfare and Health Council of New York, 44 East 23 Street, New York City, advised that the Workers Personal Service Bureau was formerly sponsored by the Brooklyn Council for Social Planning which organization in turn was responsible to the Welfare and Health Council of New York; that it functioned during World War II as an aid to men and women gainfully employed who needed advice and assistance with their personal problems. The organization was closely connected with the CIO Union and was supposed to receive substantial financial support from the CIO but that CIO support was not given on a scale that would carry it and it was found necessary to contribute welfare money to continue its functioning.

Miss FARRA stated she did not know VIVIAN GLASSMAN; that she was acquainted with only one individual of the operating staff whose name was ALFRED KATZ and she had not met any other staff member.

She stated that when the Workers Personal Service Bureau discontinued its service in about 1947-1948, the

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records were sent to the Welfare and Health Council of New York. Miss FARRA, upon checking the employment records of the Workers Personal Service Bureau, advised that VIVIAN GLASSMAN'S name did not appear thereon and that she was therefore not a paid employee of the staff and had received no pay checks. Miss FARRA stated that VIVIAN GLASSMAN was very likely a college student who served voluntarily two days a week for practical social work experience.

Miss FARRA did not know the identity of the bank used by the Workers Personal Service Bureau.

Mr. EDWIN WILSON, Editor of the "Brooklyn Eagle" newspaper, Brooklyn, New York, telephonically advised that he served as Treasurer for the Workers Personal Service Bureau from May 22, 1945 to about December, 1946. He stated that he had no records of this organization other than the minutes of several meetings that he had attended and that he is not certain but he believes that the bank used by the Workers Personal Service Bureau was either the Brooklyn Trust Company or the Lafayette National Bank, Brooklyn, New York.

Mr. WILSON stated that he did not know any of the staff members of this organization other than ALFRED KATZ.

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BANKING DATA

At Manufacturers Trust Company, 230 Second Avenue, New York City, Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, made available the ledger sheet for March 1952 for the joint checking account of VIVIAN GLASSMAN and her husband, ERNEST PATAKI, 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, which reflected as follows:

On April 8, 1952 at the Bankers Trust Company, 176 Broadway, New York City, Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised that the account of VIVIAN GLASSMAN, 131 East Seventh Street, had been closed on February 19, 1952, by the withdrawal of the entire balance in this account in the amount of \$1,545.20. The deposit and withdrawal record for the subject's account was reflected as follows:

On February 25, 1952, Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised SA ROBERT F. ROYAL that VIVIAN GLASSMAN, 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, had closed her checking account at the Bankers Trust Company, 16 Wall

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Street, New York City, with a check drawn to cash in the amount of \$73.13 on February 19, 1952 and that there was no record at this bank of the opening of a new account for her under her married name of PATAKI.

The above information obtained from Confidential Informants T-4, T-5, T-6 and T-7, is not to be made public except in a usual proceeding following the issuance of a subpoena.

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BACKGROUND OF RUTH ROSENBAUM, nee GASSEL

STEPHAN JAVNA, who operates the Magnetic Devices Corporation, 103 South Van Brunt Street, Englewood, New Jersey, and who has advised that he had known JULIUS ROSENBERG at the College of the City of New York and had given JULIUS ROSENBERG a contract in 1946 to manufacture caps and cores for a solenoid for which he, JAVNA, had contracts to manufacture for the armed services, also stated he had been introduced to VIVIAN GLASSMAN in 1945 by a mutual friend named RUTH ROSENBAUM. RUTH ROSENBAUM'S whereabouts were unknown to JAVNA at the time of his interview on January 17, 1952.

He stated she was married to LEON ROSENBAUM, a friend of JAVNA and a student in 1935 at the College of the City of New York, and that ROSENBAUM graduated from Stuyvesant High School, Brooklyn, New York, in 1935. LEON ROSENBAUM, according to JAVNA, served in the United States Army from about 1942 to 1946.

JAVNA stated that in 1946 RUTH ROSENBAUM advised him that she and LEON had been divorced.

On April 24, 1952, at the College of the City of New York, the records of the Registrar's Office reflected that ~~LEON ROSENBAUM~~, 218 South Third Street, Brooklyn, New York, had enrolled at the College in January, 1935. The records reflect that he was born on May 23, 1917, Brooklyn, New York; that his father was ABRAHAM ROSENBAUM, born in Russia, naturalized in 1911; and that his father's business address was 174 Havemeyer Street, Brooklyn, New York. LEON ROSENBAUM attended Junior High School Number 50 and Stuyvesant High School, Brooklyn, New York. In January, 1935 he enrolled in the mechanical engineering course at the College of the City of New York where he attended until he transferred to New York University for a course in architecture on March 14, 1938.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, advised that LEON ROSENBAUM, 218 South Third Street, Brooklyn, New York, was registered at Local Draft Board Number 193, Brooklyn, New York, and that he registered on October 16, 1940

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at which time he was a student at New York University in the School of Architecture; that he was born on May 23, 1917 in Brooklyn, New York; and that on November 12, 1941 he was residing at 95 Christopher Street in Greenwich Village, New York City. The informant advised that LEON ROSENBAUM was married on October 25, 1941; that his wife's maiden name was RUTH GASSEL, age 21, employed at Face Contours, 730 Fifth Avenue, New York City; that they were married at the Bronx City Court House; and that as of August 1, 1942, LEON ROSENBAUM was employed by the War Department, Corps of Engineers, Fort Totten, New York.

T-8 stated that LEON ROSENBAUM enlisted in the United States Army on September 11, 1942 and entered on active duty on July 16, 1943 at New York, New York. His Army Serial Number is 12142058. He was separated from the armed services with an honorable discharge on January 5, 1946 at Fort Dix, New Jersey, for the convenience of the Government.

At the New York Telephone Company, West Street, New York City, telephone directories for 1940 through 1945 did not reflect a listing for RUTH or LEON ROSENBAUM on Christopher Street, Greenwich Village, New York City.

The 1951-1952 New York Manhattan Directories reflect no listing for LEON or RUTH ROSENBAUM or RUTH GASSEL.

The Credit Bureau of Greater New York was negative on RUTH and LEON ROSENBAUM and RUTH GASSEL.

Records of the Marriage License Bureau, Bronx, New York were checked by SE DENNIS CAVINESS and reflect that LEON ROSENBAUM and RUTH GASSEL were married at Borough Hall, Bronx, New York, on October 25, 1941, certificate number 11812. The following background information was reflected on this certificate:

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INTERVIEW OF JUDY MOGIL

In September, 1941 Miss MELISANDE "NONNY" CONGDON, who resides at the Evangeline Residence, 123 West 13 Street, New York City, advised that one JUDY MOGIL or MOGIL had attended a house-warming party at the residence of EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN, 418 East Ninth Street, New York City, in the early months of 1950. Miss CONGDON stated that she had known JUDY MOGIL at Smith College. WEINSTEIN at that time had residing with him MAX FINESTONE and GARETH "GARY" PICKARD.

GARETH PICKARD, whose last reported residence was 711 Seventh Street, Las Vegas, Nevada, advised that he had attended the house-warming party and that he saw WILLIAM PERL and ELEANOR GLASSMAN, the subject's sister, there. Upon viewing a photograph of VIVIAN GLASSMAN, PICKARD also advised that he recalled he had seen the subject but he could not place her at the house-warming party.

On February 29, 1952, JUDY MOGIL, who resides at 205 West 10th Street, New York City, was contacted at the National Opinion Research Center, 98 Fifth Avenue, New York City, by SA ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer and a request was made for an appointment for an interview. Miss MOGIL advised that her immediate time was taken up with appointments but that she would telephonically contact the agents on March 3, 1952 to arrange for an interview.

Miss MOGIL failed to call at the appointed time and she was telephonically recontacted on March 20, 1952 by the writer at which time she advised that she had not returned the telephone call as previously arranged as she had decided that she did not want to be interviewed. She stated she does not want to be involved with other people that the FBI might be interested in or investigating and although she does not know the nature of the Bureau's interest or who the agent's inquiry may concern, she did not want to inform on her friends. She stated she felt certain the FBI could accomplish its investigation without the necessity of interviewing her. Miss MOGIL acknowledged that she had formerly attended Smith College in Northampton, Massachusetts.

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The New York Office indices were negative on JUDY MOGUL and JUDY MOGIL.

Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised that in January, 1952 JUDY MOGIL, 205 West Tenth Street, New York City, had corresponded with EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN at 418 East Ninth Street, New York City.

INFORMANT CHECK

The following Confidential Informants were contacted for information concerning VIVIAN GLASSMAN and her husband, ERNEST PATAKI, with negative results:

WHEREABOUTS OF SUBJECT'S PARENTS

On February 25, 1952, Confidential Informant T-13, of known reliability, advised that CLARENCE RAUCH and SADIE RAUCH, mother and step-father of the subject, who reside on Route 202 in Lincolndale, New York, had left Lincolndale in the latter part of January, 1952 and had proceeded to Miami, Florida, where they could be reached in care of M. M. LOWENSTEIN, 3145 Pinetree Drive, Miami Beach. The informant stated that they had indicated they would be in Miami, Florida, for approximately three months.

Confidential Informant T-14, of known reliability, advised that on January 30, 1952 VIVIAN GLASSMAN had received a postcard signed "Mother and CLARENCE" with a postmark of Savannah, Georgia.

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CONTACTS

Previous inquiry at the subject's former place of employment, United Service for New Americans, 15 Park Row, New York City, revealed that a payroll check of the subject dated December 15, 1948 in the amount of \$125.87 bore an endorsement of ELLA D. HAMMER through which a line had been drawn.

The 1950-1951 Manhattan telephone directory reflects a listing for one ELLA D. HAMMER at 542 Sixth Avenue, New York City.

Confidential Informant T-15, of known reliability, advised that ELLA D. HAMMER, 542 Sixth Avenue, New York City, was a social worker for the Jewish Community Council in Essex City, New Jersey, as of April 30, 1948. T-17 advised that ELLA HAMMER had a bank account at the Industrial Bank of Commerce, City Hall Branch, New York City. The informant advised that there was no further record of ELLA D. HAMMER at her residence address after November 29, 1951.

The Credit Bureau of Greater New York advised by report dated December 5, 1950 that ELLA D. HAMMER, 542 Sixth Avenue, New York City, had formerly resided at 200 West 58th Street, New York City, where she had shared an apartment with one Mrs. KAY PERPER. The informant advised that ELLA D. HAMMER was about 39 to 40 years old, that she was believed to be a widow and that her husband's name was unknown. ELLA HAMMER was formerly employed with the United Service for New Americans, Inc., 15 Park Row, New York City, as a case worker. She had left that organization in 1950 when the staff was cut.

The New York Indices were negative on the name ELLA D. HAMMER.

On September 12, 1951, Confidential Informant T-16, of known reliability, advised that an automobile bearing New York license plates for the year 1951 number 6C1828, stopped at the subject's apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, on August 5, 1951 and VIVIAN GLASSMAN and ERNEST PATAKI entered this car.

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The records of the New York Bureau of Motor Vehicles reflected that this automobile was registered to HILLER KAHN, 344 West 72 Street, New York City. His operator's license reflected that he was born August 23, 1916 and that his business was located at 200 West End Avenue, New York City. His former business was reflected as the Motorola Company, 33 West 60 Street, New York City.

The 1951 Manhattan telephone directory reflects that 200 West End Avenue is the location of the West End Radio Sales and Service Corporation and the York Radio Corporation, both having telephone number EN 2-8743.

Confidential Informant T-17, of known reliability, advised that the York Radio Corporation, 200 West End Avenue, New York City, was chartered in New York State in 1944 and was acquired by the present officers in December 1949. The present officers were HILLER KAHN, President, and SAMUEL JAFFY, Secretary-Treasurer. The corporation has a net worth of \$3,877. T-17 advised that the original incorporator was WILLIAM SAUSBIER who sold his interest in the corporation to the present officers in December, 1949 for \$3500 cash; that the present officers are also principals of the West End Radio and Sales Corporation, 215 West End Avenue, New York City, which corporation was merged with the York Radio Corporation in or about December, 1949.

HILLER KAHN was described by T-17 as age 34, single, native born. He served in the United States Army from 1941 to 1946 and after his discharge was employed as a salesman by the Motorola Radio Corporation, New York City.

SAMUEL JAFFY was described as age 42, married, and born in Russia. He came to the United States at an early age and was variously employed as a radioman until 1936 when he established a business individually as Sam's Radio Service at 239 West 60 Street, New York City. He continued that business until 1943 when he was inducted into the United States Army where he served until 1945.

The York Radio Corporation is engaged, according to T-17, in radio service and as a retailer of radios.

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The indices of the New York Office were negative on HILLER KAHN.

VIVIAN GLASSMAN drew a check dated September 15, 1951 for \$25.00 on the Bankers Trust Company, 16 Wall Street, New York City, payable to NATHAN BRENOWITZ. She also mailed a toy on September 5, 1951 to Master GENE BRENOWITZ, 70 Pierrepont Street, Brooklyn, New York, from the Fox Printing Company 47 West Eighth Street, New York City.

The 1951 Brooklyn telephone directory reflects a listing for Dr. NATHAN BRENOWITZ, a dentist, at 70 Pierrepont Street, Brooklyn, New York.

The records of the Board of Elections for the Tenth Assembly District, Seventh Election District, Brooklyn, New York, reflect that in 1951 NATHAN BRENOWITZ, 70 Pierrepont Street, Brooklyn, New York, registered for the American Labor Party. He was described as age 36, born in the United States, married, residing in New York State and New York County 36 years and in the election district three years.

Also registered from the same address was RUTH BRENOWITZ who registered for the American Labor Party. She was described as age 33, born in the United States, married, residing in New York State and New York County 33 years and in the election district two and one-half years.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York were negative on RUTH and NATHAN BRENOWITZ.

The indices of the New York Office were negative on RUTH and NATHAN BRENOWITZ.

On December 21, 1951 a spot check surveillance of the subject was conducted by SA ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer and she was observed to leave the Long Island College Hospital, Henry and Pacific Streets, Brooklyn, New York, where she was employed in the Social Service Department, accompanied by another woman employee of the hospital at 7:00 PM

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They walked north on Henry Street to the Hotel St. George where they entered a drug store and were observed eating at the soda fountain. At 7:45 PM they left the drug store and entered the Clark Street Subway Station and boarded an uptown IRT express train. The subject left the express train at Times Square Station and took an uptown local to 59th Street where she transferred to the Independent Subway Line and rode an E train to the Woodhaven Station. The subject left the station and was observed to walk to and enter a building at 93-40 Queens Boulevard at 8:35 PM.

The address of 93-40 is the residence address of the subject's sister HORTENSE SKOLNICK.

A twenty-four hour surveillance was conducted of the subject on February 25, 26, 27 and 28, 1952.

On February 25, 1952, at 6:10 PM, the subject and her husband, ERNEST PATAKI, left their residence at 131 East Seventh Street and walked to the intersection of Seventh Street and Avenue A. ERNEST PATAKI boarded a north-bound Seventh Avenue bus and the subject walked to Sixth Street and Avenue A where she boarded a south-bound bus. She left the bus at Delancy Street and walked to a Woolworth Store at Norfolk and Delancy Streets where she shopped until 6:35 PM. She then walked to 500 Grand Street, Building B, and took an elevator to the eleventh floor. At 11:00 PM she left 500 Grand Street and after a brief stop in a bakery, she boarded an Avenue A bus at Clinton and Delancy Street and returned to her home at 11:30 PM.

A check of the building directory reflects that WILLIAM and VERN SALKIND reside at 500 Grand Street, Building B, Eleventh Floor.

VERNA and WILLIAM SALKIND are known to be friends of the subject, through observation on previous surveillances.

The records of the Board of Elections for Manhattan, Tenth Assembly District, 37th Election District, reflect that WILLIAM SALKIND registered as a Communist on October 10, 1936, giving his residence address as 25 West 19 Street, New York City, Apartment 2.

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Confidential Informant T-18, of known reliability, advised that in 1944 CHARLOTTE ~~YOUNG~~, a member of the Communist Political Association in the District of Columbia and former Chairman of the Membership and Finance Committee of the Communist Party of the District of Columbia, had invited one VERNA, later identified as VERNA SALKIND, to attend a meeting at the home of GERTRUDE HURNEY, 6202 12 Street, N.W., Washington, D. C., a member of the White Collar Unit of the Communist Political Association.

On June 14, 1944, VERNA SALKIND was observed by SA ROBERT K. MC QUEEN leaving the residence of GERTRUDE HURNEY with CHARLOTTE YOUNG at 11:30 PM, after which they proceeded to her residence at 2149 K Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. In addition to CHARLOTTE YOUNG, ALBERT S. ~~YOUNGMAN~~ and JOHN and ROSE ~~ANDERSON~~, all members of the White Collar Unit in the Communist Political Association, District of Columbia, were observed as being present at the HURNEY residence at the time VERNA SALKIND was observed.

On February 26, 1952, at 2:25 PM, VIVIAN GLASSMAN left her residence and walked to the Stuyvesant Post Office Station, 14 Street and Avenue A, where she was observed to mail several letters and to make a telephone call on the Post Office public telephone.

At 2:55 PM she left the Post Office and walked to the corner of Avenue A and 14 Street where she boarded a cross-town bus and got off at Fourth Avenue and 14 Street. She there entered the Paterson Silk Store. at 3:04 PM. At 3:45 PM she left the Paterson Silk Store and walked west on 14 Street. At the corner of 14 Street and Broadway, she boarded a north-bound bus and got off at Herald Square, 35 Street and Broadway where she entered a Woolworth Store at 4:00 PM. She left the Woolworth Store at 4:27 PM and proceeded to Macy's Department Store where she shopped, returning to her home at 6:20 PM.

At 8:35 PM, VIVIAN GLASSMAN was observed to leave her residence with her sister, ELEANOR, and walk to a bus stop at St. Mark's Place and Avenue A where her sister boarded a north-bound bus at 8:38 PM. The subject then returned to and entered her residence at 131 East Seventh Street.

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On February 27, 1952, at 3:40 PM VIVIAN GLASSMAN was observed leaving her residence and to walk south on Avenue A to Sixth Street where she turned west to Second Avenue. She walked south on Second Avenue to Fifth Street turning east to Avenue A and south on Avenue A to Rivington Street. She then walked in and around the vicinity of Rivington Street and Houston Street. At 4:05 PM she entered the Katz Delicatessen, 205 East Houston Street, New York City. At 4:15 PM she was observed to leave Katz Delicatessen talking with an unknown man. At 4:16 PM they parted and the subject walked to Broome Street and Essex Street where she was observed shopping in the vicinity. At 4:45 PM she boarded a north-bound bus at Essex and Delancy Streets and returned to her residence at 4:55 PM.

At 6:50 PM she left her residence and boarded a south-bound bus at Sixth Avenue and Avenue A and rode to Broome and Willette Streets. She there entered a building known as 500 B Grand Street at 7:09 PM. At 1:00 AM the subject was still visiting WILLIAM and VERNA SALKIND at 500 Grand Street, Building B.

On February 28, 1952, at 2:09 PM, VIVIAN GLASSMAN left her residence and walked to the Automatic Launderwell at 128 First Avenue, New York City. She left the Launderwell at 2:22 PM and boarded an uptown bus at the corner of First Avenue and St. Mark's Place. She left the bus at First Avenue and 18 Street and was observed shopping in this vicinity. At 2:45 PM she boarded a cross-town bus at First Avenue and 14 Street and rode to Fourth Avenue and 14 Street where she entered the S. Klein Department Store and was observed shopping.

No further activity was noted by the subject on this date.

In connection with the surveillance of the subject on February 27, 1952, when she was observed leaving the Katz Delicatessen at 205 Houston Street with an unknown man at 4:15 PM, a surveillance of the unknown man revealed that he had walked to the Second Avenue Station of the Independent Subway and had boarded a north-bound train at 4:30 PM. At

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4:46 PM he changed to an IRT subway at 59th Street and proceeded to 96th Street arriving at 5:00 PM. He then walked to the Hanscom Bakery, 97 Street and Broadway where he made a purchase and then walked to and entered the service entrance of the Hotel Paris located at 752 West End Avenue. This man was subsequently identified as BEN BELKIN, a guest at the Paris Hotel.

Paris Hotel records reflect that Mr. and Mrs. BEN BELKIN, 120 First Street, Troy, New York, registered on January 9, 1952 at 4:18 PM and occupied Room 1737. The records reflected that they were former guests of the Paris Hotel and that they had previously registered on July 11, 1948 giving a residence address as 115 Washington Avenue, Endicott, New York. Mr. BELKIN'S employment was reflected as the B and E Shoe Company. Mr. and Mrs. BEN BELKIN remained at the Paris Hotel July 11 and 12, 1948.

Mr. JOHN F. O'DOWD, Night Manager, advised that Mr. BELKIN had indicated that he would be a guest at the Paris Hotel for approximately two months. There is no record of any outgoing telephone calls made by Mr. and Mrs. BEN BELKIN.

The indices of the New York Office were checked on the name BEN BELKIN with negative results.

On February 29, 1952, the Buffalo Office advised that the indices of that office were negative on BEN BELKIN, 115 Washington Avenue, Endicott, New York.

On March 1, 1952, the Albany Office advised that the records of the Troy, New York Credit Bureau reflected BENJAMIN BELKIN resided at Troy, New York, from 1931 to 1935 with his parents, SAMUEL and BESSIE, at 120 First Street. BELKIN was employed as a shoe clerk in Troy, New York, at Muhlfelder's Store from 1936 until after 1940. He was in the military service prior to 1945 and married NAOMI, maiden name unknown, while in the service. He was employed at the Cancellation Shoe Store, Albany, New York, in 1945. This was his last known Albany or Troy, New York employment. Troy Credit Bureau records reflect that he intended to go into partnership sometime after 1945.

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A Certificate of Partnership was filed in the Broom County Clerk's Office, Binghamton, New York, dated July 1, 1947 by BEN BELKIN, 120 First Street, Troy, New York and CHARLES B. ENGLE, 43 South Lake Avenue, Troy, New York, to do business as the B and E Shoe Company, 115 Washington Avenue, Endicott, New York. A certificate of dissolution was filed September 18, 1948.

ESTHER IMMERMANN, 115 Washington Avenue, Endicott, New York, advised that BENJAMIN BELKIN, with the financial backing of ENGLE, sublet the Women's Shoe Department at ESTHER IMMERMANN'S Women's Clothing Store. She stated that she believed that after dissolution, BELKIN went to California and later to Florida and then took up employment in a Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania store.

The last known address of BENJAMIN BELKIN was 318 West Otterman Street, Greensburg, Pennsylvania, in October, 1949 when the Troy Credit Bureau received an inquiry from Greensburg.

ESTHER IMMERMANN stated that BENJAMIN BELKIN was in Endicott, New York, in the summer of 1951 and stated that he planned to go into business for himself.

~~ANNA ESPOSITO~~, Troy, New York Credit Bureau, learned from MILDRED BELKIN, 120 First Street, Troy, New York, sister of BENJAMIN BELKIN, that BELKIN, until recently, was residing in Pennsylvania and had visited in Troy, New York a few weeks previously. MILDRED stated that BELKIN was now staying in a New York Hotel; that she did not know his plans; and that she knew of no plan to start a business of his own.

The Albany indices were negative on both BEN BELKIN and CHARLES ENGLE.

There is no criminal record of BELKIN at Troy or Endicott, New York.

On March 3, 1952, the Pittsburgh Office advised that the Greensburg Credit Bureau records on BEN BELKIN contained only the address 318 West Otterman Street, Greensburg,

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Pennsylvania; employment by S. W. Rose and Son, Inc., operators of the Bon Ton Department Store, Greensburg, Pennsylvania, and information obtained from the Troy, New York Credit Bureau.

The records of the S. W. Rose and Son, Inc. reflect that BELKIN came to Greensburg September 19, 1949 as an employee of the David Kay Shoe Company, 174 Fifth Avenue, New York City, which leased the shoe department of the Bon Ton Department Store from ROSE; that KAY terminated the lease in February, 1950 but BELKIN continued at the Bon Ton Department Store as an employee of the Rose Company until July 15, 1951, when ROSE again leased the shoe department to the Wohl Shoe Company. BELKIN then left the Rose Company and Greensburg.

The Pittsburgh Office indices were negative on BEN BELKIN.

Confidential Informant T-15 advised that PHILIP SLANER, 45 Mc Dougal Street, New York City, was employed as a teacher at the High School of Music and Arts, 135 Street and Convent Avenue, Bronx, New York. He had an account at the Public National Bank, 161 Street and Jerome Avenue, New York City.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York reflect that PHILIP and HELEN SLANER, his wife, resided at 1011 Carroll Place, Bronx, New York, in 1945 and he was employed by the New York Board of Education, 110 Livingston Street, Brooklyn, New York, as a teacher in the high school of Music and Arts. He was described as about 30 years old and married.

The indices of the New York Office were negative on PHILIP and HELEN SLANER.

JAY ZIMMET

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York reflect that JAY ZIMMET was married to BEATRICE ROTH and that as of January, 1948 they resided at 25 Christopher Street, New York City. Their former residences were reflected as 98 Perry Street, New York City, and 202 Eighth Avenue, New York City. He was described as being in his late 20's, married, no children and a writer by profession; that in the past he was identified with Fact Finders Inc., 400 Madison Avenue, New York City, where he did research field work from 1941 to 1945.

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BEATRICE ROTH ZIMMET was reported to be an actress under her maiden name of BEATRICE ROTH.

JAY ZIMMET'S bank reference was given as the Corn Exchange Bank, no address.

Under date of October 12, 1950, Confidential Informant T-19, of known reliability, advised that information was received from [REDACTED]

that [REDACTED] and his wife, [REDACTED] who resided at [REDACTED] were active in Communist front organizations. [REDACTED] was described as about 30 years of age and a carpenter and printer by trade. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] was a leader in the Young Communist League which had an office at the Dome Building on Sixth Avenue between Ninth and Tenth Streets and that he was also active on behalf of the American Labor Party taking an active part in the campaign of BENJAMIN DAVIS.

[REDACTED] stated that he had been invited by [REDACTED] sometime in the winter of 1949-1950 to a party, supposedly non-political in nature, which was held on 16 Street between Second and Third Avenues. He did not know the name of the host except that he was supposedly an Anthropologist.

[REDACTED] stated that at the party two short skits written by [REDACTED] were enacted. One skit presented the poor working conditions in the garment workers shops and the other was described as anti-Truman, anti-Marshall Plan and had a sly undertone of what Russia did was right. [REDACTED] stated that the main purpose of the party, however, was recruiting and that the age-old system of matching "ugly ducklings with handsome mates" was used along with a back room. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED]'S plays are all in strict adherence to the Communist Party line of thought.

Confidential Informant T-20, of known reliability, on January 6, 1951 furnished a copy of the 1951 catalog of the Jefferson School of Social Science which reflected the name of BEATRICE ZIMMET in the list of instructors and lecturers.

The Jefferson School of Social Science has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

The indices of the New York Office reflect that LOUIS KESSLER, 85-14 135 Avenue, Ozone Park, Long Island, New York, was in correspondence with MAX FINESTONE on January 22, 1952 and with JAMES WEINSTEIN on March 6, 1952.

NATIONAL GUARDIAN

The 1949 report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities cited the "National Guardian" as a publication launched in New York in 1948 aiming at national circulation which they found to be from its inception notoriously Stalinist in its staff, writers, management and content. The "National Guardian" in January and February, 1952 was engaged in raising an appeal fund for JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG.

On February 14, 1952, a DANIEL MARIEN, 209 Clinton Street, New York City, Apartment 6C, was contacted by SA ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer at Schermerhorn Hall, Columbia University, where he is currently working toward a Doctor's Degree. MARIEN had been telephonically contacted at his residence during the late afternoon of February 13, 1952 by SA ROYAL and had suggested Schermerhorn Hall, Columbia University, as the place where he desired to be interviewed. However, on February 14, 1952, when agents appeared to interview him, he stated upon the mention of the name MAX FINESTONE, "I don't wish to answer any question or questions which would tend to incriminate me". He refused to explain how his answers might tend to incriminate him.

It is known that DANIEL MARIEN was formerly employed at the Long Island Biological Laboratory, Cold Spring Harbor, Long Island, New York, and that he was a former roommate of EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN in the fall of 1950.

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It is believed that the correspondent reported as ----- (illegible) IEN by Confidential Informant T-14 may be DANIEL MARIEN of the Marine Biological Laboratory, Woods Hole, Massachusetts.

The records of the Board of Elections for New York City reflect that one DANIEL MARIEN, 1916 Grand Concourse, Bronx, New York, appeared on a Communist Party Independent Nominating Petition, State of New York, dated August, 1946. The records of the Registrar's Office for the Graduate School, Columbia University, New York City, reflect that LEO and GRACE MARIEN, 1916 Grand Concourse, Bronx, New York, are the father and mother of DANIEL MARIEN.

The "Cornell Daily Sun", student newspaper at Cornell University, in its issue of May 11, 1947, reflects an article captioned "AYD....Elects Officers". The article states that at a meeting held May 16, 1947, DANIEL MARIEN of the class of 1950 was elected Representative-at-Large.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

MRS. BELLA WEINROTH, 1724 West Third Street, Brooklyn, New York, was interviewed [REDACTED] She advised that she has a son by the name of JOHN JACOB WEINROTH, who is a composer and is presently using the name LAN ADOMIAN. b7c

An examination of the subject's Selective Service file at Local Board No. 142, 1265 East 37th Street, Brooklyn, New York, revealed that he had registered on October 16, 1940, using the name LAN ADOMIAN, but indicated he was also known as JOHN JACOB WEINROTH. He was assigned Order No. 2588 and as a result of a physical examination, reflecting he had Tuberculosis, on June 18, 1941 he was placed in classification 4-F. He gave his address on the registration date as 2256 East Seventh Street, Brooklyn, but advised the Local Board of the following changes of address: 1724 West Third Street, Brooklyn, New York, and 53 West 72nd Street, New York City, his present address.

The subject was born on April 29, 1905 at Mogilev, Russia, and is a naturalized United States citizen. His file further revealed that he is a composer, conductor and arranger of music. His experience includes commercial conducting for HOWARD BARLOW and ANDRE KOSTELANETZ. He listed the following relatives on an affidavit filed January 30, 1943:

The subject listed the following education:

1. John Hopkins University - one term
2. Peabody Conservatory of Music - two years
3. Curtiss Institute of Music - two years.

On his Selective Service questionnaire, he indicated that he made approximately \$700.00 yearly as a result of his musical accomplishments and further indicated that he was divorced from his former wife, ISABELLE WEINROTH, nee KLEIMAN.

A check of the records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, 70 Columbus Avenue, revealed that JOHN JACOB WEINROTH, also known as JACOB WEINROTH and LAN ADOMIAN, became a naturalized United States citizen on March 26, 1940 in the United States District Court, Eastern District of New York. His naturalization file revealed that he filed his Declaration of Intention to Become a Citizen on December 10, 1936 in the United States District Court, Eastern District of New York; that he was born at Mogilev, Russia, on April 29, 1905; and that his last foreign residence was Cernauti, Rumania. The file revealed that he emigrated from Bremen, Germany, and entered the United States at New York City under the name JACOB WEINROTH on November 1, 1923 as a passenger aboard the SS PRESIDENT ARTHUR. His file contained an unused exit permit issued July 28, 1937 and also a permit issued January 22, 1938. He left the United States as a stowaway aboard the SS CHAMPLAIN in February of 1938 to join the Spanish Army in Spain and reentered the United States at New York City on December 30, 1938 as a passenger aboard the SS ALSONIA.

His file revealed that he had resided in New York from November of 1923 to November of 1924, in Baltimore, Maryland, from November of 1924 to April of 1926, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, from April of 1926 to February of 1928, and in New York City from February of 1928 to February of 1936, and in Brooklyn from February of 1936 to March of 1940. The witnesses for his naturalization were HILDA B. SIMON, Social Worker, 315 West 21st Street, New York City, and ABE DIFSENHOF, Upholsterer, 301 Palaski Street, Brooklyn, New York.

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Information was also contained in his file reflecting that he had married ISABELLE KLEIMAN on June 5, 1926 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, she having been born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in 1908; that they were divorced, the final report being filed in the Court of Common Pleas, No. 2, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on March 24, 1930, the cause being listed as cruel and barbarous treatment and indignities to the person.

MR. ABRAHAM SCHUMAN, 300 West End Avenue, advised he was manager of the apartment building located at 53 West 72nd Street, New York City. He stated that LAN ADOMIAN lives in Apartment 4-G with ABRAHAM DIESENHOF. He further stated that ALOMIAN spends most of his time in his apartment where he believes he does his work as a composer and arranger of music. He further stated that at no time has he received any complaint concerning the activities of ADOMIAN and that ADOMIAN has never given him any reason to doubt his loyalty to this country.

The New York indices revealed that one ABRAHAM DIESENHOF, on December 4, 1944, was a member of the HENRY FORD'S COMMUNITY CLUB, Communist Political Association, Manhattan. At the time, his address was 2372 West 21st Street, Brooklyn, and his occupation that of an upholsterer. Prior to this time, DIESENHOF resided at 301 Pulaski Street, Brooklyn, and was a member of the Membership Committee of the Jefferson Club, 11th Assembly District, Brooklyn, New York. He was born in Russia on July 14, 1906 and became a naturalized United States citizen on February 6, 1933 in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York.

It is noted that ABE DIESENHOF, Upholsterer, 301 Pulaski Street, Brooklyn, was a witness in ADOMIAN's naturalization proceedings. ABRAHAM ISAAC DIESENHOF is the subject of a closing Security Matter - C file in this office.

A check was made of the credit records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York in September of 1946 but failed to reveal any new information concerning DIESENHOF.

The bank account of LAN ADOMIAN at the Federation Bank and Trust Company, 34th Street and Eighth Avenue, New York City, was checked and revealed the following information:

MR. J. L. WILSON, of the above-mentioned bank, advised that ADOMIAN had opened an account on May 15, 1944 and that the account had an average

balance of \$100.00 for 1945 and \$50.00 for 1946. He indicated that in June of this year the balance of the account was in the neighborhood of \$250.00. MR. WILSON advised that ADOMIAN introduced himself at the bank and opened a regular checking account, giving his address as 1724 West Third Street, Brooklyn, New York, but that he had changed his residence and is now living, according to their records, at 53 West 72nd Street, New York. According to MR. WILSON, ADOMIAN is a musician and little is known about him because of his small account. He advised that the subject does not have a safe-deposit box in the bank.

An examination of the New York Herald Tribune newspaper, dated October 31, 1945, revealed that Page 18 was devoted to the Herald Tribune Forum which was being held at that time; that the Forum had decided that Soviet amity with the rest of the world was essential to lasting peace. The examination further revealed that one MARSHA SCOTT, wife of JOHN SCOTT, Time and Life correspondent, had recited her experiences on her first day in the United States. She indicated that she had spent her money right and left inasmuch as she had found an abundance of things to buy in this country, in contrast to those conditions that prevailed in Russia. It is also noted that DR. HENRY F. SINGER, Director of the Institute of History and Medicine, at John Hopkins University, also spoke on the same program as MARSHA SCOTT.

As a result of a surveillance, ADOMIAN was observed entering the Soviet Consulate at 2:15 p.m. on October 8, 1946. He and YAKOVLEV left the Consulate at 3:30 p.m. and proceeded to the Three Crowns Restaurant, 12 East 54th Street, which they entered but immediately left the restaurant, evidently being too late for lunch. They then proceeded to the Sheephead Bay Sea Food Restaurant, 871 Third Avenue, New York City, where they were observed eating lunch.

Surveillance on September 26th, 1946, revealed that ADOMIAN proceeded to Pennsylvania Station and that YAKOVLEV failed to appear. The subject took the 12:30 p.m. train to Washington, D. C. After his arrival at Union Station, Washington, D. C., the subject was observed making several telephone calls. He then proceeded to the Soviet Embassy, being surveilled by Special Agents of the Washington Field Division. It should be noted that on this occasion, a reception was in progress at the Soviet Embassy, given in the honor of the Soviet Delegates to the Third Annual Slav Congress. It is to be noted that while the subject was in Washington, Confidential Informant [REDACTED] whose identity is known to the Bureau, advised that CLAUDIA WINSTON had had a [REDACTED]

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The indices of the New York Field Office reveal that CLAUDIA IVANOVNA WINSTON GOREFSKY arrived at the Port of New York on August 18, 1943, accompanied by her seven-year-old son, ROLAND WINSTON, as a passenger

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aboard the SS CAPE UGAT. On the occasion of her arrival, CLAUDIA WINSTON was interviewed, at which time she stated she was born on February 4, 1913 at Kishensv, Bessarabia, and that she renounced her Russian citizenship on December 2, 1942. She further stated that while she resided in Moscow she was employed as an editor of chemical books and that by profession she was a chemical engineer. Her employer, while she was in Moscow, was the Educational Division of the Soviet Government. She further stated that in 1934 she had met JOSEPH WINSTON, whom she married in October of that year, and that in 1935 she accompanied her husband to New York for three months.

She explained that her husband was born in Russia but was brought to the United States as an infant and was educated in this country as a civil engineer and had gone to Russia in the early part of 1930, where he was employed as a civil engineer. She explained that her husband had returned to the United States for approximately six months in 1937 and had finally left Russia in 1939 and that since that time she has been trying to secure the necessary papers and permission to leave Russia and come to the United States. At this time, JOSEPH WINSTON, then residing at 102 West 85th Street, New York City, verified the above-mentioned information and further stated he had gone to Russia to assist in the Five Year Plan but returned to the United States and although he had considered returning to Russia had not been able to do so because of war conditions. On this occasion, JOSEPH WINSTON stated that he was employed by the Board of Water Supply as a civil engineer, his business address being in care of the New York City Board of Water Supply, 120 Wall Street, New York City.

CLAUDIA and JOSEPH WINSTON are now residing in Apartment 10-A, 160 West 87th Street, New York City.

The names CLAUDIA IVANOVNA WINSTON and JOSEPH WINSTON were checked through the records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York with negative results.

JOSEPH WINSTON was also the subject of a closed Internal Security - G case, which file reveals he was born on September 30, 1888 at Bessarabia and that he had come to the United States on or about the year 1891, becoming a naturalized United States citizen on May 23, 1911 at New York City.

POLYA HABICHT has been described as a die-hard pro-Soviet individual who maintains a casual contact with the Soviet Embassy as well as various Soviet Nationals in Washington.

Confidential Informant [REDACTED] whose identity is known to the Bureau, advised that the name LAN ADOLMIAN appeared on a mimeographed letter from the VETERANS OF THE ABRAHAM LINCOLN BRIGADE, advising of an Eastern Seaboard Conference to be held by the above-mentioned organization on February 9 and 10, 1946 at Manhattan Center, New York City. The letter was signed by several members of the ABRAHAM LINCOLN BRIGADE, including the name LAN ADOLMIAN. b7D

Efforts have been made to develop a highly confidential source of information at ADOLMIAN's residence, 53 West 72nd Street, New York City, but to date they have been unsuccessful.

Investigation has revealed that LAN ADOLMIAN filed an application with the New York Telephone Company, on July 2, 1946, for the installation of a telephone at his residence, apartment 4G, 53 West 72nd Street, New York City. Mr. SCHUEMAN, manager of the apartment building at the above address states that the subject spends most of his time in his apartment where it is believed he does composing and arranging of music. He further stated that the subject makes and receives numerous telephone calls using the apartment house telephone, the telephone number being INDICOTT 2-4860.

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ZOT IVANOVICH TCHERPOURNYK, employee of the U.S.S.R. Consulate, New York City, is a frequent contact of the subject. He is a public relations man at the Consulate and also handles all applications by Americans for visas to visit the Soviet Union. He has been observed in the company of ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEV, Vice-Consul, a suspected WTD Agent, and has made other contacts under suspicious circumstances. Accordingly a letter is being directed to the Bureau requesting authority to conduct an Internal Security-R investigation of ZOT IVANOVICH TCHERPOURNYK.

It is to be noted that MARCIA SCOTT mentioned in this report is not identical with MARCIA SCOTT. The latter name is the name JESSICA SCOTT uses when she writes articles for the publication entitled "Political Affairs".

Inquires failed to reveal the identity of the unidentified man who had lunch with the subject and YAKOVLEV on May 24, 1946 and who then proceeded to the office of Mrs. ZILMOTO, Philharmonic Symphony Society, on the 15th floor of the Steubway Hall Building, West 57th Street, New York City.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

Subject, an attorney, resides at 201 W. 16 St., NYC. KUNTZ shares an office at 207 4th Ave., Manhattan, NY, with MORRIS A. GREENBAUM, an attorney and certified public accountant who has done accounting work for numerous Communist organizations. Subject was ALP candidate for Municipal Court Judge for NYC in 1948, and was ALP candidate in 1949 for Judge of the Court of General Sessions. Subject has been active in legal defense of Communists, and has been active as a May Day functionary.

DETAILS:

Mr. ESPOSITO, 201 West 16 Street, New York City, advised on June 12, 1950, that subject resided at that address. The current Manhattan Telephone Directory lists the name of subject's wife BEATRICE KUNTZ (WA 9-7557) at 201 West 16 Street. Subject's name is listed at 207 Fourth Avenue, New York City (AL 4-7575).

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised Special Agent HERBERT P. JARSON that the subject had made a donation to the 1945 fund drive of the "Daily Worker," an East Coast Communist newspaper.

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Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised Special Agents E. G. BURKE and J. J. MANNING that subject, a Communist Party lawyer, marched in the Communist Party Section of the May Day Parade in 1946, behind conspicuous banners and placards identifying the Party group and section, and thereby publicly held himself out as a Communist Party member.

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised that subject marched in the 1950 May Day Parade.

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised Special Agent WILLIAM F. GEESLIN in November 1946 that subject and numerous other individuals had assisted in the campaign to reelect Congressman VITO MARCANTONIO on the American Labor Party ticket.

The American Labor Party was cited March 29, 1944 as a Communist front organization by the House Un-American Activities Committee.

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised Special Agent E. G. BURKE on August 8, 1947 that ED KUNTZ extended greetings from New York City to the Tenth Anniversary Journal of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade, 1937 - 1947.

It is noted that the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade have been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised that subject was a member of the New York Chapter of the National Lawyers Guild, 1946 - 1947.

It is noted that the National Lawyers Guild was cited as a Communist front organization by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, March 29, 1944, (pages 147, 149).

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The "Daily Worker" of September 21, 1948 reflected that EDWARD KUNTZ, attorney for the Morning Freiheit Association, was one of the attorneys defending "ALEXANDER BITTELMAN, veteran Jewish-American Communist leader who came here from Czarist Russia thirty-five years ago. BITTELMAN was being tried on a deportation charge.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that EDWARD KUNTZ was the candidate of the American Labor Party for Municipal Court Judge in the 1948 election. Informant furnished a pamphlet which reflected the following background information on subject:

"EDWARD KUNTZ, 54, lawyer, is a family man with three grandchildren. Born and bred in New York City.

"EDUCATION: Public and private schools. LL.B. Fordham Law School. LL.M. New York University Law School. Admitted to bar in 1918.

"HOUSING: Active in campaigns for low-rent housing projects.

"COMMUNITY: Active in all progressive movements throughout his career. General legal and social activity devoted to interests of labor and the underprivileged.

"LEGAL: Handled and tried many important criminal and civil cases involving labor, civil liberties, libel, and other actions.

"LABOR: For past 18 years participated in and tried many labor cases. Represented various trade unions and other organizations. Endorsed by Greater N.Y. CIO Council."

Confidential Informant T-1 advised Special Agent HERBERT P. LARSON on June 16, 1949 that subject was a nominee for Chairman of the American Labor Party Club, 3rd AD, So. at 313 Eighth Avenue, New York City. Informant stated that the club meeting was to be held on June 16, 1949 at 8:30 p.m. at the Club.

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Subject as Chairman of the 3rd AL, So., 313 Eighth Avenue with numerous American Labor Party leaders urged full registration of American Labor Party members in order to bring about an American Labor Party victory in the 1949 election, according to Confidential Informant T-1 on October 7, 1949.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that subject was the American Labor Party candidate for General Sessions Judge in 1949.

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that the National Lawyers Guild had endorsed subject's candidacy for General Sessions Judge.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, advised Special Agents LOUIS D. NELAN, G. EDWARD SMART, and JOSEPH C. LEARNED that subject had made a \$400 contribution to "The Challenge," a newspaper of Denver, Colorado.

"The Challenge," originally a weekly but subsequently changed to a bi-weekly newspaper, was published by the Rocky Mountain Foundation for a Free Press, Denver, Colorado, from March 24, 1946 to September 6, 1947. Investigation has determined and the signed statement of EDWARD J. CURRIE, former Business Manager of "The Challenge" and a self-admitted former Communist Party member, has substantiated the domination of the newspaper by the Communist Party.

The "Daily Worker" of December 1, 1949, page 3, column 1, reflects an article entitled "Savage Sentence Given 4 Arrested At DAVIS Rally", by ELIHU NICKS.

The four were sentenced by Judge HAMIE BUSWELL in the Washington Heights Magistrate Court to 60 days each in the workhouse for disorderly conduct at the "Welcome Home Parade" in October 1949 for BEN DAVIS, convicted Communist Party leader. Judge BUSWELL is quoted as having referred to the defendants as "political lice." "He also threatened to arrest one of the defense lawyers, EDWARD KUNTZ, for contempt of court."

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Confidential Informant T-3 advised that EDWARD KUNTZ, attorney, had been contacted by Mrs. ALEXANDER regarding the release of her husband JOHN PAUL ALEXANDER from the New York City prison. KUNTZ arranged for ALEXANDER'S release on bail. This bail was supplied by the Civil Rights Congress. Informant stated that it is common practice on the part of KUNTZ to have individuals released on bail supplied by the Civil Rights Congress.

According to Confidential Informant T-3, KUNTZ is Chairman of the 3rd Assembly District, South, American Labor Party, and is the attorney for the American Federation For Polish Jews.

On December 20, 1949 Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised that the American Federation For Polish Jews was now under the full control of the "left wing and progressive element."

Confidential Informant T-3 stated that KUNTZ was drawing up complaints against JOSEPH CURRAN of the National Maritime Union in connection with the recent ousters of members of the National Maritime Union.

Subject maintains an office at 207 Fourth Avenue, New York City, with MORRIS A. GREENBAUM, an attorney and certified public accountant. Informant advised that KUNTZ and GREENBAUM maintain a "left wing organization."

According to the informant GREENBAUM has done accounting work for the "Daily Worker," the Shoe Workers Union, International Workers Order, "New Masses," "New Century", and the "Morning Freiheit."

It is noted that the International Workers Order is cited by the Attorney-General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

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On February 27, 1948 the "Daily Worker" contained an article reflecting that:

"Masses and Mainstream," the new Marxist cultural monthly magazine, was a compilation of the thirty-seven year old tradition of the progressive movement's oldest Marxist publication, "New Masses," and the recently published "Mainstream."

The "Daily Worker" on August 23, 1946 contained an article by SAMUEL SILLEN, in which he stated that the New Century publishers issue most of the Marxist pamphlets in the United States, and added that the militant spirit of the workers today and the correctness of the Communist policy are reflected in the marked upswing of pamphlets in production and distribution.

The newspaper, "The Worker," the Sunday edition of an East Coast Communist newspaper, dated January 9, 1944, on page 3, sets forth an article by WILLIAM Z. FOSTER, Chairman of the Communist Party, U.S.A. This article states:

"The 'Morning Freiheit' is one of the many papers either owned or supported by the Communist Party."

The following Confidential Informants, who are familiar with various Communist Party activities in and around the New York area, were unable to furnish any information regarding the subject: T-10, T-11, T-12, T-13, T-14, and T-15.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York and the records of the Criminal Division of the New York Police Department reflected no information regarding the subject.

The Criminal records were searched by Special Agent AUGUST J. MICEK.

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Confidential Informant T-16, of known reliability, advised that the subject represented Communist Party members arrested March 6, 1948 for disorderly conduct resulting from a Times Square demonstration by the Communist Party.

The records of the Bureau of Special Services and Investigation were reviewed by SE A. J. TROWER, JR.

The Birth Records for New York City were reviewed by SE RICHARD F. O'HARA, who was unable to locate a record of subject's birth in the name of EDWARD KUNTZ.

It is possible that the following birth certificate reviewed by O'HARA is identical with subject:

Certificate #30025 for ELIZEKIEL KUNTZ, born June 27, 1894, Manhattan, to ABRAHAM KUNTZ, age 29, born Russia, and M. KATTY SHAPIRO, age 24, born Russia.

Confidential Informant T-5 advised that on April 22, 1946 subject stated that he would sign a statement to the effect that it was not illegal, and it was permissible, for veterans to march in uniform in the May Day Parade, but that he would sign as an individual rather than a representative of Local #65. He said that he could not sign as their representative unless he had first cleared through them.

It was observed that approximately three hundred veterans in full uniform marched under the banner of the Communist Party in the May Day Parade, May 1, 1946. Numerous other veterans in uniform marched with other organizations such as the union.

Confidential Informant T-17, of known reliability, advised that the Communist controlled Local #65 of the United Wholesale and Department Store Employees of America, C.I.O., had dropped EDWARD KUNTZ as its attorney. The informant believes that the reason for this change was that KUNTZ has always been close to EARL BROWDER, former Chairman of the Communist Political Association. Informant stated that KUNTZ has a long record of Communist Party affiliations, [REDACTED]

Confidential Informant T-18, of known reliability, advised that on January 11, 1945 when applying for the rating of Junior Assistant Purser, WILLIAM BERNARD BERG submitted a document signed by EDWARD KUNTZ, an attorney. This document was a certification that from KUNTZ'S personal knowledge BERG was of good character, temperate habits, and was a suitable person to be entrusted with the duties of the station for which he made application.

BERG was formerly active in the circulation and affairs of the "Daily Worker," according to Confidential Informant T-19, of known reliability.

Confidential Informant T-7 advised that SIMON SCHACHTER, editor of the official publication of the New York Chapter of the National Lawyers Guild, contacted EDWARD KUNTZ, the subject, September 19, 1949 regarding the non-payment of \$5.00 for an ad in the May 1949 issue of the "Guild Lawyer," which KUNTZ owed to the Guild. At this time SCHACHTER also suggested that KUNTZ pay his dues to the Guild.

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

GERVITZ is undoubtedly identical to HYMAN GUREWITZ who, [REDACTED] has previously pointed out, serves as liaison between the Miami Chapter and the old group which worked on behalf of the ROSENBERGs.

4. Leaflet entitled "Fact Sheet in the ROSENBERG Case."

Each of these leaflets had been issued by the National Committee to Secure Justice for the ROSENBERGS, 1050 Sixth Street, New York 18. The last, however, also bore a stamped notice reading "For further information or contributions, write Post Office Box 4246, Miami 26, Florida."

3. Letter dated March 13, 1953 from DAVID ALMAN urging that the "Amicus Brief" be returned by April 1, 1953 at the latest.

4. Letter dated March 15, 1953 by AARON D SCHNEIDER, Organization Secretary of the National Committee, enclosing a list of protestant ministers in Florida who "according to our information have signed a letter to President EISENHOWER for clemency for ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG." This letter stated these ministers should be approached without assumptions as to their commitments, and that the objective should be to involve them in some phase of the Committee work. A list of 39 ministers in Florida was enclosed in this letter.

"We believe that the trial of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL on a charge of conspiring to commit espionage which resulted in death sentences for the ROSENBERGs and a 30 year sentence for their co-defendant, lacked guarantees of fairness which all Americans have a right to expect under the Constitution.

"The U. S. Circuit Court of Appeals has called the Prosecutor's conduct 'reprehensible.' Justice JEROME N. FRANK stated, 'There are substantial questions of law. I would certainly not want to preclude their appeal to the Supreme Court. I would not want that to be on my conscience.'

"The F.B.I. admitted on December 2, 1952, that an important witness committed perjury under oath. Scientists all over the world call into doubt the scientific value of the alleged evidence and its credibility.

"We believe that transient political and social passions have no place in our courts; and to deprive even one American of the right to a fair trial is to injure the rights of all Americans.

"We therefore authorize the inclusion of our names in an Amicus Brief to the Supreme Court of the United States, petitioning that the verdict be set aside, and that a new trial be ordered based on Constitutional guarantees of impartiality and fairness in accordance with the best traditions of American justice."

DETAILS:

I. BACKGROUND

A. Birth Data

The records of the Department of Health, New York City, New York, reflect under Certificate No. 53327 that MARCUS POGARSKY was born on November 15, 1918 to DAVID and SARAH POLARIA POGARSKY, both of whom were born in Russia.

The records of the City Clerk of New York City reflect that the subject had his name legally changed on August 15, 1940 from MARCUS POGARSKY to MARK PAGE.

B. Education

From various employment files and checks made at the various schools, it was ascertained that the subject graduated from Seward Park High School, New York City, New York in 1934. He attended City College of New York from 1934 to 1938.

Professor S. B. WILTSIE, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Troy, New York, stated PAGE attended an engineering, science and management defense training course in the Evening Division from February 4, 1941 to February 11, 1942.

Subject attended New York University Electrical Engineering School for a half a year in 1944.

Miss FRANCES DENZLAR, Supervisor in the Office of the Recorder, School of Engineering, New York University Uptown Division, Evening Session, advised that in July, 1949 the subject was working toward his engineering degree which he would receive in the summer of 1950 and which he did receive.

C. Marital Status

From the records of various employments and Selective Service records it was ascertained that the subject was married to ~~STELLA HOPE MARKOWITZ~~ sometime prior to 1939. However, no marriage record has been located at the present time.

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D. Military Service

The Navy Service Record of MARK PAGE, USN 909371, Social Security No. 093-16-6753, located at Garden City, New York, reflects that he entered military service at New York on June 1, 1944, and that he was honorably discharged (dependency) as Seaman First Class at San Bruno, California on October 18, 1945. He was inducted through Local Board 2, 217 East Broadway, New York, and attended New York University, where he studied electrical engineering and left in 1944. He entered on military leave from June 21, 1945 until July 5, 1945, at which time he gave his leave address as 485 Newell Street, Barberton, Ohio.

It should be noted at this time that Mr. and Mrs. MORRIS RUDMAN advised that they had lived at Barberton, Ohio, and that the subject, although he gave their address for leave purposes, did not visit them but went directly to his wife in New Jersey.

E. Employment

Miss JANE KELLY, Personnel Office, Bulova Watch Company, 62-10 Woodside Avenue, Long Island, City, New York, advised their records reflect the subject, under the name of MARCUS POGARSKY, was employed from May 25, 1940 to January 13, 1941. He gave his previous employment as E. Greenglass, 64 Sheriff Street, New York City, from June, 1936 to June, 1937; Cuomo Aeronautics, 518 East 16th Street, New York City, from June, 1937 to June, 1938; Williams Aeronautics, 24 West 17th Street, New York City, from June, 1939 to March, 1940.

It should be noted that both the Cuomo and Williams Aeronautical Companies are not in existence.

Employment records of the George Scher Engineering Company were furnished by CHARLES SCHER, 115 First Street, New York City; the records of the Westinghouse Electric Company, Bloomfield, New Jersey, were furnished by WILLIAM GRANT, Public Relations Officer, and the records of the Manning, Maxwell and Moore Company, Jersey City, New Jersey, were furnished by CARL R. NELSON, Works Manager. These records reflected the following employment for the subject.

voluntarily for personal reasons.

Mr. WILLIAM HALPERIN, Plant Manager of the

1952 due to the company's desperate need for an engineer, and at
the present time is still employed there.

II. CONNECTION WITH COMMUNIST PARTY

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised in December, 1943 that MARK PAGE, 73 South Walnut Street, East Orange, New Jersey, was a member of the Orange Branch of the Communist Party.

The Communist Party was cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised in July, 1944 that the Communist Party listed PAGE as being "on leave".

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised in June, 1945 that PAGE had been a member of the Communist Party since 1935, and that instructions had been issued that no mail be sent to him by the Party.

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Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised on January 22, 1946 that PAGE was on the Veterans Commission of the Communist Party of New Jersey.

In June, 1945 Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised that the subject was a member of the Orange Club of the Communist Party in Essex County, New Jersey. b7D

On October 15, 1948, Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised that MARK PAGE was a member of the Professional Club of the Communist Party of New Jersey.

Confidential Informants T-7 and T-8, both of known reliability, advised that the Professional Club of the Communist Party of New Jersey is an underground organization of the Communist Party.

Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised in February, 1949 that AL EISENBERG, at that time, according to Confidential Informants [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] previously mentioned, the New Jersey State Educational Director of the Communist Party, b7D asked the subject if he would be interested in doing economic research for the good of the Communist Party. EISENBERG, according to Informant T-9, explained that the work would concern such plants as the Bell Telephone Company and public service. The informant stated that PAGE advised that he could contribute his engineering experience and training to the work inasmuch as he had been employed by large firms in New Jersey for the past 12 years.

In regard to the subject's wife, Confidential Informant T-10, of known reliability, advised on November 1, 1943, that STELLA HOPE PAGE was a paid-up member of the Communist Party as of September, 1943, and that she was a regular "Daily Worker" reader.

The "Daily Worker" is an East Coast Communist daily newspaper.

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Confidential Informant T-3, previously mentioned, advised on December 10, 1943 that STELLA HOPE PAGE was a member of the Orange Branch of the Communist Party.

Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, advised STELLA HOPE PAGE had been issued a membership card in June, 1944 for the Communist Political Association.

Confidential Informant T-3, previously mentioned, advised on June 21, 1945 that STELLA HOPE PAGE had been a member of the Communist Party since 1937, and that instructions had been issued that no mail be sent to her home at ~~45 South Walnut Street, East Orange, New Jersey.~~ (17)

Confidential Informants T-7 and T-8, previously mentioned, advised on February 28, 1946 that STELLA PAGE was a member of the Orange Branch of the Communist Party, and had been a member of the Party for nine years.

Confidential Informant T-5, previously mentioned, advised on January 8, 1947 that STELLA PAGE was a member of the Professional Group of the Communist Party.

Confidential Informant T-14, another government agency which conducts security and personnel investigations, made available photostatic copies of the Communist Party Nominating Petition for PETER V. CACCHIONE for the office of Councilman in Kings County, 1939, Page 1920 of this petition contains signatures, dated August 13, 1939, of ETHEL ROSENBERG, convicted Soviet espionage agent and wife of JULIUS ROSENBERG, and STELLA H. POGARSKY, both residing at 111 South Third Street, Brooklyn, New York.

Confidential Informant T-15, of unknown reliability, but who was generally acquainted with members of the engineering group of the Young Communist League, City College of New York, admitted he was a member of the Engineering Group of the Young Communist League at City College of New York; and had attended meetings of the group during the first six months of 1937. He also advised that MARK PAGE, also known as MARK POGARSKY, was an

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active member of the Engineering Group of the Young Communist League at City College of New York for at least the first six months of 1937. He advised PAGE was instrumental in organizing the activities of the Young Communist League. He also advised that it was his opinion, although he had no definite information and it was only from hearsay, that PAGE had subsequently "graduated" from the YCL to the Communist Party, and he primarily based this on the fact that PAGE was a close associate of JULIUS ROSENBERG.

EDWARD L. OGDEN, Supervisor of Industrial Relations, Westinghouse Company, Bloomfield, New Jersey, advised that he was suspicious concerning PAGE and these suspicions were of possible Communist affiliations on the part of PAGE. Specifically, OGDEN stated that these suspicions resulted from a meeting of a local of the United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America at Westinghouse concerning the signing of non-Communist Party affidavits, the signing of which the National Office of the UERINA opposed. However, OGDEN advised that the Westinghouse local wanted to sign these affidavits, and that PAGE was the only one at this meeting who opposed signing them.

Mr. OGDEN also advised that when PAGE was about to be put into another job because of seniority when Westinghouse was laying off some of its employees, he was asked to sign, which was required, a Personnel Security Questionnaire, and PAGE refused to fill out the form.

On his War Department Application, dated June, 1940, JULIUS ROSENBERG, convicted Soviet espionage agent, gave as a reference MARCUS POGARSKY, 86 Columbia Street, New York City, and advised that he and the subject both had attended City College of New York, at which time they became friendly. ROSENBERG further advised that both he and the subject worked together for PAUL WILLIAMS, who operated the Williams Aeronautical Company on West 17th Street, New York City.

Confidential Informant T-12, of known reliability, advised on November 25, 1941 that PAUL WILLIAMS, former employer

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of both ROSENBERG and PAGE, had told him that he had been a flyer for the Spanish Loyalist Army.

Confidential Informant T-13, another government agency which conducts investigations of a personnel and intelligence nature, advised on March 26, 1945 that WILLIAMS was reported to have been a director of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade.

The Abraham Lincoln Brigade was cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

In an interview conducted by the writer and SA JOHN W. LEWIS in New York City on September 11, 1950, Mrs. EMANUEL MELVIN GREENBAUM, nee RUTH MARKOWITZ, 73 Willet Street, New York City, sister of STELLA PAGE, admitted being a former member of the Communist Party from 1936 to 1938, at which time she left the Party. She advised that during the Spanish Civil War, MARK PAGE had recruited numerous persons to fight for Loyalist Spain, but when she asked him why he did not go to fight for Loyalist Spain himself, PAGE replied that he was much too important an individual and should remain in the United States to further his career.

III. POSSIBLE ESPIONAGE ACTIVITY

In signed statements furnished to the New York Office on June 15 and 16, 1950, DAVID GREENGLASS, admitted Soviet espionage agent, identified JULIUS ROSENBERG as the individual who recruited him for Soviet espionage. 11/2

RUTH GREENGLASS, wife of DAVID GREENGLASS, advised SAS WILLIAM F. NORTON and JOHN A. HARRINGTON that ROSENBERG had told her that he had attempted to recruit PAGE to furnish information to the Russians, and that PAGE had refused to work for him. Mrs. GREENGLASS stated ROSENBERG was apparently upset when PAGE refused to cooperate. 11/2

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Confidential Informant T-16, another government agency which conducts security and personnel investigations, advised on January 20, 1941 that JULIUS ROSENBERG was called in for a special hearing by another government agency and was questioned under oath.

At this hearing ROSENBERG advised that POGARSKY was one of his friends, and that he had attended college for about two years with him. He stated that both of them worked together for PAUL WILLIAMS, and that ROSENBERG and his wife lived about a year with POGARSKY and his wife. The arrangement was that POGARSKY rented a four room apartment and ROSENBERG and his wife rented one room from POGARSKY and furnished it. He also stated that he used to sell some Communist literature there and once the "Daily Worker" marked sample was shoved under the door and also some Communist leaflets.

Mr. MORRIS RUDMAN was interviewed at the New York Office by the writer and SA RICHARD A. MINIHAN on August 17, 1950, and he advised that at one time he went to JULIUS ROSENBERG's apartment at 10 Monroe Street, New York City, for the purpose of meeting DAVID GREENGLASS, but when he got there GREENGLASS was not present. However, PAGE and his wife were there, and although he stayed only for a few minutes PAGE or JULIUS ROSENBERG, Mr. RUDMAN could not be sure which, introduced him to PAUL WILLIAMS and told him that PAUL WILLIAMS had been a flyer for the Abraham Lincoln Brigade in Spain.

SAMUEL GREENGLASS was interviewed by SA JOHN W. LEWIS on September 12, 1950 at the New York Office and advised that he was a halfbrother of ETHEL and DAVID GREENGLASS. He identified the photograph of MARK PAGE as an individual he had met at a party at the ROSENBERG's. He recalled that the subject was at the party one hour and during this time PAGE agreed with JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG in every point that they made in a discussion of the "Worker" and concerning the general Communist Party line. The party was given on the occasion of the birth of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG's first child.

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IV. MISCELLANEOUS

On December 15, 1950 the subject refused to be interviewed by agents of the Newark Office or furnish any information concerning his knowledge of JULIUS ROSENBERG.

On February 18, 1953 SA RICHARD T. HEADSKY and the writer interviewed the subject at his place of employment, the Ideal Toy Company, 184-10 Jamaica Avenue, Jamaica, Long Island, and when he was informed that the Federal Bureau of Investigation was interested in his knowledge of JULIUS ROSENBERG, convicted Soviet espionage agent, he stated he would not talk about that matter as he did not wish to be involved in that "mess". He did state that as far as he was concerned the case against ROSENBERG was well handled and he received a fair trial and sentence.

He also refused to discuss or answer any questions concerning the Communist Party.

On March 12, 1953 MARK PAGE was recontacted and asked if he had decided to talk to the FBI and he again refused.

A review of the personnel records, Federal Records Center, General Services Administration, St. Louis, Missouri, for MARK PAGE indicates that he was employed on January 9, 1941 with the War Department, War Ordnance Department, Watervliet Arsenal, Watervliet, New York. This employment was terminated on January 9, 1942 as a senior tool designer for reason of resignation for personal reasons.

The records reflected that the subject had executed a personal affidavit on July 2, 1941 at Troy, New York, in which it was subscribed and sworn to that "it shall be unlawful for any person employed in any capacity by any agency of the federal government whose compensation or any part thereof, paid from funds authorized or appropriated by any Act of Congress, to have membership in any political party or organization which advocates the overthrow of our constitutional form of government in the United States".

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He also executed a United States Civil Service Commission Form 124b-Field, Declaration of Appointee, in which question number 15 states:

"Are you a member of any political party or organization which advocates the overthrow of our constitutional form of government in the United States?" to which he stated "No."

This was signed by the subject on January 1, 1941. However, the files contain only a copy of this form which does not contain the signature of the subject. The original copy of this form was forwarded to the Chief Ordnance, Washington, D. C. direct from Watervliet Arsenal on January 28, 1941.

V. DESCRIPTION

The following background and descriptive information was obtained from various records including employment records, school records and Navy records of the subject.

He stated that he does not know her husband at all.

In the above list, those last names underlined refer to individuals believed to have resided at 153 Manhattan Avenue, or at 3 West 108th Street or 64 West 108th Street, in the immediate neighborhood. Those names followed by an asterisk (*) are believed to represent individuals who have served in various Soviet installations as chauffeurs. Those names followed by the number sign (#) are believed to be those of individuals who have resided at 127 West 90th Street, 141 West 90th Street, or 143 West 90th Street, Manhattan. The first address is that of subject's most recent residence and the second neighborhood is that where he is believed to have resided upon his arrival in the United States; i.e. at 123 West 90th Street.

MR. and MRS. RENTA and MR. FRANK SIERRA advised that photographs of VASILII GRIGORYEVICH BORISOV, MIKHAIL ALEKSANDROVICH RYUKHACHEV, GALINA MIKHAILOVNA TITOVA,

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SERGEI DANILOVICH SIDOROV and MARIA SEMENOVNA RYUKHACHEVA appear familiar to them, but advised that they could not place these individuals, are not sure that they ever resided in the building, 153 Manhattan Avenue, and cannot definitely associate them with SARYTCHEV or his wife. They advised that the photograph of NIKOLAI DMITRIEVICH BASSOW also appears familiar to them and they believe that he resided in Apartment 51 in the building.

They stated that the photograph of MIKHAIL ALEKSANDROVICH RYUKHACHEV might be that of the first Russian tenant, whom they recall as occupying Apartment 51 in the building, but pointed out that if so they remember him as wearing glasses. They stated that the person they have in mind as the original Soviet National in that apartment has been seen in the neighborhood in the last few days at the grocery store at 155 Manhattan Avenue, accompanied by his wife, a boy about seven years, a boy about five and a half years, and a younger girl.

ROLAND SERRA advised that the only photograph of those listed above that seems at all familiar to him is that of ANASTASIA ALEKSEEVNA SIDOROVA, but said he could not provide any details.

MR. FREDERICK WEISS advised that he recognizes only the photographs of SERGEI DANILOVICH SIDOROV, whom he described as definitely a former customer in his store, MARIYA DMITRIEVNA STAROSTINA, whose photograph seems familiar, and ALEKSANDR KAPITONOVICH STARTSEV, whom he says he definitely knows as a customer still in the neighborhood.

MRS. HERNANDEZ advised that the photographs of IVAN ALEKSANDROVICH FILIPPOV, MIKHAIL IVANOVICH SHACHNEV, and VITALY PETROVICH NOVOZHILOV seem vaguely familiar to her and that the photograph of ANASTASIA ALEKSEEVNA SIDOROVA seems definitely familiar, as probably that of a tenant in Apartment 51, nextdoor to her.

She stated that she remembers the SARYTCHEVs and said that they, as well as the other Russian tenant, were

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extremely reserved in manner and kept the shades drawn at all times and permitted no one, except other Russian Nationals, to enter the apartment. She recalled that SARYTCHEV's wife was away all day and returned late at night, until the arrival of her second child. She stated that after the SARYTCHEVs left, the apartment was found to be in a filthy condition, with some of the furniture left behind.

MRS. HERNANDEZ said that she is unable to identify any associates or friends of the SARYTCHEVs, with the possible exception of those whose photographs she described as familiar. She did recall that the SARYTCHEVs were away from their apartment on a few occasions for perhaps as long as two weeks at a time, and that in their absence other Russians occupied their apartment.

MRS. ANNA SEGAL advised that photographs of the following were familiar to her, but were photographs of persons she could not definitely identify as tenants or otherwise:

She stated that NIKOLAI DMITRIEVICH BASSOW may have lived at 141 West 90th Street or 143 West 90th Street.

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She stated that she definitely knows VASILY GRIGORYEVICH BORISOV and MIKHAIL IVANOVICH SHACHNEV.

MRS. SEGAL stated that the photographs of NIKOLAI PROKOPIEVICH KARPEKOV are definitely familiar to her. She stated that she distinctly remembers seeing this person, possibly as a visitor, but remembers that he was a very handsome young man or excellent manners. She stated that he bowed politely in a manner which made her think of a German General.

MRS. SEGAL said that the photograph of TATIANA ALEKSEEVNA FEDOTOVA is very familiar and that, if she is a blond woman, about five feet five or six inches tall, weighing 125 to 130 pounds, of slim build, wearing about a size 14 dress, of fair complexion, she probably is the woman who at one time returned with a man, until then unknown to her, to try to get her to save an apartment for other Russian Nationals. She said that the apartment had been vacated by other Soviets, with no effort to reserve it, so that after some renovation she had rented it to non-Russian tenants.

She identified the photograph of VITALY PETROVICH NOVOZHILOV as possibly that of the man accompanying the woman. She said that the woman spoke excellent English, but with a slight accent, and acted as interpreter. She said that the man was polite and reasonable, but that the woman, after asking and then begging and offering additional rent, became angry and threatening and used profane and offensive language in criticizing her for not making the apartment available to her people. She recalled that the woman was well-dressed, with a modern hairdo and makeup. She described her as obviously sophisticated, unlike most of the Soviets with whom she had been in contact.

Information available from Confidential Informant T-2, another government agency which maintains personnel records, as of November 15, 1945, further identifies FEDOTOVA as a housewife residing at

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135 West 90th Street, Apartment 4-FW, New York City, who was born on July 12, 1922, at Sumy, USSR, and who entered the United States on July 28, 1945, on board the SS JAMES GUNN at New York. She is the wife of LEONID NIKOLAEVICH FEDOTOV, who was Secretary of the Consulate General of the USSR at 7 East 61st Street, New York City.

MRS. SEGAL recalled that she previously had tentatively identified the photograph of MARINA IVANOVNA KUZMINA as the wife of GRIGORI IVANOVICH KUZMIN, the latter of whom she definitely recalled as having been her tenant in the ground floor apartment at 141 West 90th Street. She pointed out, however, that the photograph of GALINA MIKHAILOVNA TITOVA is positively that of her tenant in that apartment.

She repeated that she knows GRIGORI IVANOVICH KUZMIN; that KUZMIN is definitely familiar to her and that she thought he had been a tenant. She said she is even more certain, however, that GALINA MIKHAILOVNA TITOVA was the tenant in that apartment.

It is noted, however, that she found the photograph of PETR IVANOVICH TITOV, the husband, only possibly familiar.

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She recalled that TITOVA had indicated that she would return to Russia with her children to the City of Kiev. MRS. SEGAL recalled that a neighbor of Latvian origin, who spoke Russian, had heard differently: that only the children were returning to Russia and that they were returning to Moscow or a city other than Kiev.

MRS. SEGAL stated that shortly before the family was to depart, numerous packages and large boxes containing presumably radio sets, refrigerators and even a bicycle were delivered to the house. She noted that these boxes were not addressed to Kiev. MRS. SEGAL said she pointed this out to her Latvian tenant, who remarked that the packages would probably be stolen when they reached the border anyway.

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As previously reported, MRS. SEGAL recalled that this family left the building and presumably sailed on the MS BATORY at the time GERHARDT EISLER fled the United States, aboard this ship. She remembered, however, that in approximately September or October, 1950, she ran into TITOVA near the corner of 104th Street and Columbus Avenue. At this time TITOVA was in the company of another woman. MRS. SEGAL said that she expressed surprise at seeing TITOVA, having thought she had returned to Russia. TITOVA was friendly and said she was then living in Brooklyn. Before the conversation could go any farther, however, the other woman interrupted, speaking Russian, obviously protesting against TITOVA's conversation with MRS. SEGAL, and almost forcibly hurried TITOVA away from MRS. SEGAL and into a taxicab, which she quickly hailed.

MRS. SEGAL stated that this meeting surprised her and that at this time she disbelieved TITOVA's statement about living in Brooklyn, primarily because both TITOVA and the other woman were carrying packages of groceries, giving her the impression that they lived in the immediate neighborhood. It was her impression at this time that TITOVA and the other woman took the taxi merely as a means of quickly avoiding her.

MRS. SEGAL stated that her suspicions concerning TITOVA and the other woman seemed confirmed approximately two weeks later when, while standing on the sidewalk at the corner of 106th Street and Columbus Avenue, she observed TITOVA and the same woman at the window of a second story apartment facing on 106th Street, a door or two East of Columbus Avenue. She said she did not believe that TITOVA or the other woman noticed her when she saw them.

She advised that the photograph of SERAFIMA KONSTANTINOVNA POPOVA seemed to be that of the woman with TITOVA on the two occasions referred to above, except that she remembered this woman as wearing her hair shorter.

MRS. SEGAL also recalled that when TITOVA first resided at 141 West 90th Street she appeared to be nothing

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more than the usual Russian housewife wearing nothing, but housedresses with no makeup, and remaining at home with her children most of the time. Later on, however, she appeared well dressed with a modern hairstyle and makeup and went off to work each day. She explained that she was working for the "Russian Embassy."

Mrs. SEGAL recalled that TITOVA'S apartment was always locked with the shades drawn and the lights on all day. She recalled that on one occasion one of her children locked herself out and the janitor was unable to open the window facing the street, finding it nailed or otherwise fastened shut.

She stated that no one except other Russians were known to have entered the apartment. She recalled that TITOVA had described SARYTCHLVA as her sister or cousin or other relative, and had at one time attempted to obtain an apartment for the SARYTCHLVA at 143 West 90th Street. ETS's wife

It is noted that NIKOLAI PAVLOVICH KARPLEKOV arrived in the United States on April 29, 1944, and departed on July 20, 1946, which is probably before Mrs. SEGAL acquired an interest in the property at 141 and 143 West 90th Street, New York City.

It is noted, however, that Mrs. SEGAL stated that she has for years been a close friend of Mrs. LALLON, owner of the premises and who managed the property previous to Mrs. SEGAL'S lease thereto. KARPLEKOV originally was a student at Columbia University and left the United States as the husband of FLORA DON WOVSEHIL, a close associate of JUDITH COPLIN. KARPLEKOV also is suspected of having engaged in Soviet espionage activities.

Information available from Confidential Informants T-2 and T-3, other government agencies which maintain personnel information, reflects the following

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concerning TITOV and TITOVA:

TITOV first arrived in the United States on August 23, 1943, as a student attending classes at Columbia University. He was born on August 15, 1915 (or August 5, 1915 or August 25, 1915, all three dates appearing). He first resided at 64 West 108th Street. While a student at Columbia University, he also worked at Amtorg, apparently as a civil engineer. He was also shown as residing at 32 East 35th Street, New York City.

It is not known when he departed from the United States following this first arrival, but he and TITOVA returned to the United States on December 1, 1947, arriving at New York City aboard the SS VILNIUS. They resided first at 104 Riverside Drive, Apartment 1B, and thereafter at 64 West 108th Street. TITOV again worked at Amtorg, 210 Madison Avenue, Manhattan, and is described as a group leader in charge of miscellaneous imports as of January 3, 1948.

Further concerning LITOV and possibly POPOV, the following is noted:

STANLEY C. WEYMAN, 2114 Albemarle Road, Brooklyn, made several contacts between April 5, 1949, and June 19, 1949, with SA RAYMOND P. WORTH and provided information to the following effect:

WEYMAN, an ex-convict who has been in the bristle business since his release on parole from prison, has a daughter with definite Communist Party friends and associates. Following interruption of commerce in bristles with China, WEYMAN made several contacts with the

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Amtorg Trading Corporation in an effort to obtain bristles. He was given no encouragement by Amtorg officials. Thereafter, following two pretext telephone calls to his wife for information about him, he discovered in late March, 1949, that he was under surveillance on several different days. He stated that on the second day of surveillance he turned suddenly and faced the man following him squarely, so that the latter realized WEYMAN knew he was being followed. He described the person following him as a man five feet eleven inches in height, of heavy build, broad face, brown suit, and wearing a hat with an unusually narrow brim.

It is noted that this description is described as almost identical with that made available by SA PAUL J. BLASCO following his original surveillance of POPOV.

Later, WEYMAN received a telephone call apparently referring to the earlier surveillances and received a visit by a Russian, who gave his name as REDOROV, who is described as a man six feet two inches in height, 190 pounds, about fifty years old, with a broad face, deep-set eyes and clean shaven cheeks. After his visit, this man directed WEYMAN to call Amtorg to "discuss a personal matter." Thereafter, WEYMAN had several contacts at Amtorg with one TITOV, who occupied a room at Amtorg, which had the telephone number listed to PETR IVANOVICH TITOV, who was in the Import Section with hair, fibres, bristles, and related commodities.

At his initial interview with TITOV, the latter neglected discussion of the bristle industry in favor of considerable conversation about WEYMAN's background and his willingness to leave the United States. WEYMAN stated that TITOV clearly possessed extensive background information concerning him and in his conversation gave the impression that he wanted to recruit him, probably for espionage purposes. WEYMAN, subsequently, at TITOV's request, got in touch with and was again interviewed, not concerning the bristle business, but concerning his, WEYMAN's,

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background by SERGEI STRIGANOV at the Soviet Embassy, in Washington, D. C. He was told by the latter to prepare a visa application form and provide photographs and six references and was told to return such documents to LEV S. TOLOKONNIKOV, also of the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D. C.

The latter official, it is noted, accompanied VALENTIN GUBITCHEV during the latter's trial as a Soviet espionage agent, and appeared to be assisting defense counsel in preparation of his defense, including the interrogation of witnesses at the trial.

WEYMAN was also in touch with CHARLES RECHT, New York attorney who has been registered as official attorney for the Soviet Embassy and various other Soviet agencies in this country for a number of years.

Information available from Confidential Informant T-2 indicated that as of July 1, 1949, ANASTASIA ALEKSEEVNA SIDOROVA resided at 153 West Manhattan Avenue, New York City.

It is noted that neighbors had previously stated that the wife of a previous tenant had stayed on after her husband's departure and lived in the apartment at 153 Manhattan Avenue for several months after the SARYTCHEVs became tenants there.

MR. and MRS. RENTA and MR. FRANK SERRA advised that photographs of VASILII GRIGORYEVICH BORISOV, MIKHAIL ALEKSANDROVICH RYUKHACHEV, GALINA MIKHAILOVNA TITOVA,

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SERGEI DANILOVICH SIDOROV and MARIA SEMENOVNA RYUKHACHEVA appear familiar to them, but advised that they could not place these individuals, are not sure that they ever resided in the building, 153 Manhattan Avenue, and cannot definitely associate them with SARYTCHEV or his wife. They advised that the photograph of NIKOLAI DMITRIEVICH BASSOW also appears familiar to them and they believe that he resided in Apartment 51 in the building.

They stated that the photograph of MIKHAIL ALEKSANDROVICH RYUKHACHEV might be that of the first Russian tenant, whom they recall as occupying Apartment 51 in the building, but pointed out that if so they remember him as wearing glasses. They stated that the person they have in mind as the original Soviet National in that apartment has been seen in the neighborhood in the last few days at the grocery store at 155 Manhattan Avenue, accompanied by his wife, a boy about seven years, a boy about five and a half years, and a younger girl.

ROLAND SERRA advised that the only photograph of those listed above that seems at all familiar to him is that of ANASTASIA ALEKSEEVNA SIDOROVA, but said he could not provide any details.

MR. FREDERICK WEISS advised that he recognizes only the photographs of SERGEI DANILOVICH SIDOROV, whom he described as definitely a former customer in his store, MARIYA DMITRIEVNA STAROSTINA, whose photograph seems familiar, and ALEKSANDR KAPITONOVICH STARTSEV, whom he says he definitely knows as a customer still in the neighborhood.

MRS. HERNANDEZ advised that the photographs of IVAN ALEKSANDROVICH FILIPPOV, MIKHAIL IVANOVICH SHACHNEV, and VITALY PETROVICH NOVOZHILOV seem vaguely familiar to her and that the photograph of ANASTASIA ALEKSEEVNA SIDOROVA seems definitely familiar, as probably that of a tenant in Apartment 51, nextdoor to her.

She stated that she remembers the SARYTCHEVs and said that they, as well as the other Russian tenant, were

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extremely reserved in manner and kept the shades drawn at all times and permitted no one, except other Russian Nationals, to enter the apartment. She recalled that SARYTCHEV's wife was away all day and returned late at night, until the arrival of her second child. She stated that after the SARYTCHEVs left, the apartment was found to be in a filthy condition, with some of the furniture left behind.

MRS. HERNANDEZ said that she is unable to identify any associates or friends of the SARYTCHEVs, with the possible exception of those whose photographs she described as familiar. She did recall that the SARYTCHEVs were away from their apartment on a few occasions for perhaps as long as two weeks at a time, and that in their absence other Russians occupied their apartment.

She stated that NIKOLAI DMITRIEVICH BASSOW may have lived at 141 West 90th Street or 143 West 90th Street.

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She stated that she definitely knows VASILY GRIGORYEVICH BORISOV and MIKHAIL IVANOVICH SHACHNEV.

MRS. SEGAL stated that the photographs of NIKOLAI PROKOPIEVICH KARPEKOV are definitely familiar to her. She stated that she distinctly remembers seeing this person, possibly as a visitor, but remembers that he was a very handsome young man of excellent manners. She stated that he bowed politely in a manner which made her think of a German General.

MRS. SEGAL said that the photograph of TATIANA ALEKSEEVNA FEDOTOVA is very familiar and that, if she is a blond woman, about five feet five or six inches tall, weighing 125 to 130 pounds, of slim build, wearing about a size 14 dress, of fair complexion, she probably is the woman who at one time returned with a man, until then unknown to her, to try to get her to save an apartment for other Russian Nationals. She said that the apartment had been vacated by other Soviets, with no effort to reserve it, so that after some renovation she had rented it to non-Russian tenants.

She identified the photograph of VITALY PETROVICH NOVOZHILOV as possibly that of the man accompanying the woman. She said that the woman spoke excellent English, but with a slight accent, and acted as interpreter. She said that the man was polite and reasonable, but that the woman, after asking and then begging and offering additional rent, became angry and threatening and used profane and offensive language in criticizing her for not making the apartment available to her people. She recalled that the woman was well-dressed, with a modern hairdo and makeup. She described her as obviously sophisticated, unlike most of the Soviets with whom she had been in contact.

Information available from Confidential Informant T-2, another government agency which maintains personnel records, as of November 15, 1945, further identifies FEDOTOVA as a housewife residing at

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135 West 90th Street, Apartment 4-FW, New York City, who was born on July 12, 1922, at Semy, USSR, and who entered the United States on July 28, 1945, on board the SS JAMES GUNN at New York. She is the wife of LEONID NIKOLAEVICH FEDOTOV, who was Secretary of the Consulate General of the USSR at 7 East 61st Street, New York City.

MRS. SEGAL recalled that she previously had tentatively identified the photograph of MARINA IVANOVNA KUZMINA as the wife of GRIGORI IVANOVICH KUZMIN, the latter of whom she definitely recalled as having been her tenant in the ground floor apartment at 141 West 90th Street. She pointed out, however, that the photograph of GALINA MIKHAILOVNA TITOVA is positively that of her tenant in that apartment.

She repeated that she knows GRIGORI IVANOVICH KUZMIN; that KUZMIN is definitely familiar to her and that she thought he had been a tenant. She said she is even more certain, however, that GALINA MIKHAILOVNA TITOVA was the tenant in that apartment.

It is noted, however, that she found the photograph of PETR IVANOVICH TITOV, the husband, only possibly familiar.

She recalled that TITOVA had indicated that she would return to Russia with her children to the City of Kiev. MRS. SEGAL recalled that a neighbor of Latvian origin, who spoke Russian, had heard differently: that only the children were returning to Russia and that they were returning to Moscow or a city other than Kiev.

MRS. SEGAL stated that shortly before the family was to depart, numerous packages and large boxes containing presumably radio sets, refrigerators and even a bicycle were delivered to the house. The POPOVs have a daughter, NATALYIA, who was born in 1944. POPOV and his family are still in the United States and presently reside at 932 Columbus Avenue.

Further concerning TITOV and possibly POPOV, the following is noted:

STANLEY C. WEYMAN, 2114 Albemarle Road, Brooklyn, made several contacts between April 5, 1949, and June 19, 1949, with SA RAYMOND P. WORTH and provided information to the following effect:

WEYMAN, an ex-convict who has been in the bristle business since his release on parole from prison, has a daughter with definite Communist Party friends and associates. Following interruption of commerce in bristles with China, WEYMAN made several contacts with the

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Amtorg Trading Corporation in an effort to obtain bristles. He was given no encouragement by Amtorg officials. Thereafter, following two pretext telephone calls to his wife for information about him, he discovered in late March, 1949, that he was under surveillance on several different days. He stated that on the second day of surveillance he turned suddenly and faced the man following him squarely, so that the latter realized WEYMAN knew he was being followed. He described the person following him as a man five feet eleven inches in height, of heavy build, broad face, brown suit, and wearing a hat with an unusually narrow brim.

It is noted that this description is described as almost identical with that made available by SA PAUL J. BLASCO following his original surveillance of POPOV.

Later, WEYMAN received a telephone call apparently referring to the earlier surveillances and received a visit by a Russian, who gave his name as FEDOROV, who is described as a man six feet two inches in height, 190 pounds, about fifty years old, with a broad face, deep-set eyes and clean shaven cheeks. After his visit, this man directed WEYMAN to call Amtorg to "discuss a personal matter." Thereafter, WEYMAN had several contacts at Amtorg with one TITOV, who occupied a room at Amtorg, which had the telephone number listed to PETR IVANOVICH TITOV, who was in the Import Section with hair, fibres, bristles, and related commodities.

At his initial interview with TITOV, the latter neglected discussion of the bristle industry in favor of considerable conversation about WEYMAN's background and his willingness to leave the United States. WEYMAN stated that TITOV clearly possessed extensive background information concerning him and in his conversation gave the impression that he wanted to recruit him, probably for espionage purposes. WEYMAN, subsequently, at TITOV's request, got in touch with and was again interviewed, not concerning the bristle business, but concerning his, WEYMAN's,

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background by SERGEI STRIGANOV at the Soviet Embassy, in Washington, D. C. He was told by the latter to prepare a visa application form and provide photographs and six references and was told to return such documents to LEV S. TOLOKOLNIKOV, also of the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D. C.

The latter official, it is noted, accompanied VALENTIN GUBITCHEV during the latter's trial as a Soviet espionage agent, and appeared to be assisting defense counsel in preparation of his defense, including the interrogation of witnesses at the trial.

WEYMAN was also in touch with CHARLES RECHT, New York attorney who has been registered as official attorney for the Soviet Embassy and various other Soviet agencies in this country for a number of years.

Information available from Confidential Informant T-2 indicated that as of July 1, 1949, ANASTASIA ALEKSEEVNA SIDOROVA resided at 153 West Manhattan Avenue, New York City.

It is noted that neighbors had previously stated that the wife of a previous tenant had stayed on after her husband's departure and lived in the apartment at 153 Manhattan Avenue for several months after the SARYTCHEVs became tenants there.

OUSPENSKY, his wife, TANIA, daughter, age nineteen, and TURY, son, age nine, departed together on June 15, 1947, from NYC

aboard the SS ROSSIA. The family is shown to have arrived in the United States at Seattle, Washington, on July 2, 1944. VERA, age forty-seven, is described as a bookkeeper.

Will attempt to ascertain whether TITOV and TITOVA had previous children from birth records of DMITRI, born at New York City on August 6, 1950.
