The New York baily News published a story on page 2, Saturday, 19 August 1990, which stated that the Federal Puresu of Investigation apprehended at Laredo, Jesus, Forton Tobell, New York-Electrical Engineer and Radar expert. Sobell was employed by the Reeves Instrument Corporation, 215 East 91st Street, New York City, from 1947 to 16 June 1950.

The Visitors Pegister, Fort Monnouth, Now Jersey reveals that one M. Scholl, representing the Reeves Instrument Corporation, visited the Evans Signal Laboratory on 26 June 1947, and signed as visiting Auron N. COLTMAN.

On 27 September 1946, forty eight classified documents, up to and including "SECRET", were recovered from the home of Auron COLUMAN.

COLUMN was temporarily designated a class "A" restrictee by this Headquarters in 1949. The restriction was subsequently removed.

According to a newspaper article appearing in the 23 September 1950 edition of the Evening Bulletin (Philadelphia newspaper) entitled "Kickback Hinted In Army Probe", a sub-committee of the U. S. Senate's Committee on Expenditures in the Executive Department, has, for the past several weeks, been investigating unlawful practices in the issuance of Government contracts by two employees of the Philadelphia Signal Depot. The newspaper account states that the sub-counittee, which is headed by Senator Clyde R. Hoey (D - MC), who on 22 September 1950, disclosed the existence of the impulry, has also requested the Department of the Army to enter the investigation. The text further indicates that Senator Hosy declined to disclose the identity of the two suspended civilian contracting! offices or any specific details surrounding the charges under investigation except the fact that the sem received gratuities for contracts issued through their office.

A Confidential Informant of known reliability, who is a mon-Government employee and not involved in the subject of investigation, voluntarily advised this Agent that he received information from a reliable source located in New York City as to the identity of the two snapended contracting offices. The Informent described them as PRITINGLIPHIE, TE., THE COST STREET, that IV WAS KNOW Company of Brooklyn, New York, who received the Government contract and was involved in the issuance of the gratuity payments.



BACKGROUND:

The Department of the Army has alleged that a "possible espionage ring" is operating in the electronics field, particularly in the installations in the above caption.

The Newark and New York Offices have reviewed Army dossiers on 677 individuals and have checked their office indices for derogatory information. The Bureau has also checked its indices for additional derogatory information and has advised Newark and New York of the results. Newark, the office of origin, is correlating all information and is submitting to the Bureau its recommendations as to what action is being taken on each individual. recommendations are being reviewed at the Bureau for approval or other action.

## ACTION TO BE TAKEN BY SUBSTANTIVE SUPERVISOR:

In some cases it will be necessary for the substantive supervisor in the Espionage, Internal Security or Security of Government Employees sections to approve the recommendation or take whatever action he deems necessary. The action taken by the supervisor or his approval should be noted below in the designated place.

There are attached one copy each of the Newark. New York and Bureau summaries together with Newark's recommendations. Indicate action taken and return. immediately to Supervisor F. L. Jones, Room 2710, Espionage Section, with the attachment.

#### ADDITIONAL DEROGATORY INFORMATION IN NEWARK FILES

Set forth hereinafter are the names of associates of ZUCKERMAN as furnished by CIC. Following the name of the individual is a brief statement of available derogatory information regarding that individual. The degree of association is not known unless indicated to the contrary in statement regarding each associate.

### JACK OKUN

Alleged to be CPA member of N. J. Shore Branch and associated with suspected CP members. LGE investigation did not substantiate allegation of CPA membership. OKUN was a member of the Executive Committee of the Monmouth County, N. J. Chapter of the UFWA and was editor of that organization's Newsletter publication. He was a subscriber to In Fact in 1949. His father, mother and brother registered with the A.L.P. in N.Y.C. in 1939 and 1940. His father signed a CP nominating petition in 1939 and 1940.

## HERBERT BENNETT

Allegedly registered as an A.L.P. voter in 1946. In 1947, received mail from the Eugene Dennis Defense Committee. In 1946 he executed a primary enrollment form in which he declared himself in general sympathy with the principles of the A.L.P. and that he intended to support the nominee of that party at the next general election. He attended C.C.N.Y. at the same time that many of the individuals involved in the Rosenberg Espionage ring were at C.C.N.Y. In trial testimony, JULIUS ROSENBERG, convicted espionage agent, stated that he went to school with, worked for, and tried to solicit business from BENNETT.

## HAROLD DUCORE

Has allegedly stated that he is in favor of any system of government which would do the most for the greatest number and if Communism is that form of government then he was in favor of it. DUCORE was unable to account for a secret document charged out to him at one time. On

another occasion he photographed an atomic weapon in violation of security regulations. His wife associates with AL SOCOL and LOUIS KAPLAN, both of whom are CP members. KAPLAN is presently full-time organizer for Monmouth and Ocean Counties, N. J.

### MORTON SOBELL

Subject is a former classmate of subject's at C.C.N.Y. and associated with him in later years.— SOBELL visited the subject at Watson Laboratory, Red Bank, N. J., and stayed overnight at the subject's home on at least one occasion.

MAX TITCHER, a self-admitted CP member and associate of both JULIUS ROSENBERG and SOBELL, stated that he was recruited into the CP by SOBELL. ELITCHER advised that ROSENBERG had informed him that SOBELL was aiding ROSENBERG in espionage work. ELITCHER further stated that SOBELL had attempted to enlist him in espionage work by turning over information to SOBELL obtained by ELITCHER in the course of his employment with the Navy Department, Bureau of Ordnance, Washington, D. C. ELITCHER stated that SOBELL requested him to furnish the names of possible recruits for purposes of engaging in espionage work.

SOBELL was an associate of BERNICE LEVINE, Department of Labor, Washington, D. C., who was named by ELIZABETH BENTLEY, New York informant, as an individual who had furnished information to Soviet espionage networks. Various classmates of SOBELL at CCNY identified him as "liberal" and "leftwinger" while attending the college.

SOBELL fled to Mexico in June, 1950, after the arrest of HARRY GOLD, one of the participants of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus in May, 1950. SOBELL was arrested by Bureau Agents on 8/18/50 at Laredo, Tex. On 10/10/50, the Grand Jury, SDNY, returned a true bill charging MORTON SOBELL, JULIUS ROSENBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG, ANNATOLI A. YAKOVLEV and DAVID GREENGLASS with conspiracy to commit espionage. SOBELL was tried and convicted and sentenced to 30 years' imprisonment on 3/29/51.

## BERNARD MARTIN

An associate of a known CP member, MARCELL ULLMAN, and permitted ULLMAN to have access to classified material to which ULLMAN was not entitled.

#### IRVING-STOKES

STOKES is described in CIC files as "an associate of many suspected subversives". An AEAA investigation of STOKES did not develop any derogatory information that reflected on his loyalty. Fellow employees

knew of no associations outside of work with suspected subversives although STOKES had contact with RAYMOND WEXLER while working. STOKES and his wife stated they were close associates of YAMINS and his wife. STOKES is presently employed at Ft. Monmouth.

## BENJAMIN BOOKBINDER

BOOKBINDER is a reference of JACK OKUN, also PETER ROSMOVSKY. BOOKBINDER supposedly had a "favorable by the FBI incident to Executive Order 9835", according to subject's file at Watson Laboratory. BOOKBINDER advised on interview that as a child he had frequent association with SOBELL and often was in his home. He visited SOBELL in 1942 and 1948 or 1949. Attended C.C.N.Y. at same time SOBELL but went nights, whereas SOBELL went days.

### RECOMMENDATION:

Newark will open a security case on the subject in order to ascertain his present activities.



In addition to the information appearing in the summaries received from Newark and New York, the report of SA Arthur V. Hart dated 4/9/51 at New York in the IGE investigation, a copy of which was furnished to Newark, reflects that Zuckerman had previously roomed in a house in Washington, D. C. with William Dunziger and Max Elitcher, both of whom are known to have been CP members and suspected to have participated in Soviet espionage activity. (121-29201-22)



New York letter to the Bureau, copy to Newark, in the LGE investigation of the subject, reflects that one of his references, Henry Jasik, was married to the sister of SIMON GERSON, a New York State CP official, and was a friend of MORTON SOBELL, on whom a separate blind memorandum has been submitted.

Bureau files reflect no additional pertinent information concerning the subject. Copies of reports in the IGE investigation were disseminated to the Civil Service Commission. To date, the Bureau has not been notified as to the disposition of the subject relative to loyalty.



In this connection, you will recall that the Richmond Office recently advised that a Mr. Leaverman was reported to have visited Richmond, Virginia, for the purpose of organizing the Richmond Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case and had indicated he was making a trip through the South in order to organize similar groups in that area.

A check of Bufiles has failed to locate any identifiable information concerning either Mr. Leaverman who was reportedly from New York City, or Maurice Pearlman (phonetic). However, it is noted in the case entitled "Martin Sherry, Army, LGE," reference is made in a teletype from San Francisco dated February 3, 1949, that one was carried in the files of G-2 as a known Communist due to his position as Executive Secretary of the Social Service Employees Union, CIO, New York City, which was reported as being Communist dominated.

MICHAEL SIDOROVICH is the subject of an Espionage - R investigation by the Cleveland Office on the basis that he and his wife ANNE SIDOROVICH were associated with JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and possibly part of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus.

SIDOROVICH admits membership in the YCL and IWO and having served 14 months in the Abraham Lincoln Brigade in Spain. He is alleged to have been present at 65 Morton St., New York City, in the apartment of ALFRED SARANT in July of 1949 with WILLIAM PERL, JULIUS ROSENBERG, and another unknown individual when these four persons spent 17 straight hours photographing documents of a highly classified nature.

An informant of unknown reliability has stated that he has heard JULIUS ROSENBERG describe SIDOROVICH as being involved in an espionage apparatus equal in importance to his own.

SIDOROVICH admits close friendship with FRED JOSEPH KITTY, subject of an espionage investigation, and is alleged to have introduced KITTY to JULIUS ROSENBERG. MICHAEL's wife, ANNE, according to testimony of the GREENGLASSES, was the person originally designated to contact DAVID GREENGLASS for information on the atomic bomb in 1945, a job subsequently handled by HARRY GOLD.

It is to be noted that both MICHAEL and ANNE SIDOROVICH have been interviewed by agents of the Cleveland Office and have repeatedly disclaimed any association with the ROSENBERG apparatus.

ALFRED SARANT - SAPANT is a known CP member and a close associate of the ROSENBERGE. An apartment rented by SARANT was used by ROSENBERG and others for photographing classified documents.

Both the GREEN GLASSES said that they were told by ROSE BREG that ANNE would contact them in New Mexico to get information from DAVID about the atom bomb.

## PAUL R. HANUSIAK (brother)

HAMUSIAK associated with sister and brother-in-law, MICHAEL and ANNE STUDFOVICH, living in their home at one time; associated with DAVID G-EMIGLASS, FREE J. KITTY, HULES CUPERA KITTY, JULIUS and ETHER RESERBERG, who are documented herein. HANDSTAK is employed by the United States Army.

## MICHAPL HANUSTAK (brother)

BICHAEL HANUSTAK employed as a field director, Iko, Pittaburgh, Pn., 1938-51, active in South Fide Club, Cf, Pittaburgh, Pa., since 1941, active in the American Slav Congress, Progressive Party, and Civil Rights Congress, and has attended meetings of the American Peace Crusade, Kational

#### On Associates

#### JULIUS and ETHEL MOSE: BERG

JULIUS and THEL ROSENBERG were members of a Puscian Repionage apparatus and were convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States. They were convicted in U.S. Federal Court, sentenced to death, and electrocuted on 6/19/53 at Sing Sing Prison, Ossing, N.Y.

## DAVID GREENGLASS

On 6/15/50, PAVII GREW.GLASS gave a signed statement to FBI Agents at N.Y.C., admitting he was recruited for Soviet Explonage by his wife, RUTH GREENOLASS, about 11/29/hh, at the request of his brother-in-law, JULIUS ROSENBERG. GREENGLASS stated he gave MARRY GOLD, in the Summer of 19h5, a sketch of a high explosive experimental lens mold then being used for experiments in arriving at critical uranium mass at Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project and information regarding personnel at Los Alamos.

GREENGLASS was indicted by U.S. Grand Jury, STNY, 10/10/50, for conspiracy to violate wartime Papionage Statute, Sub Section A, Section 32, Title 50, USC. JULIUS ECCHIBERO, ETHEL HOSDIBERO, ANTULI A. YAKOVLEV, and MORTON SOBELL were named as co-defendants. HARRY GOLD and RUTH GREENGLASS were named as co-conspirators. GREENGLASS plend guilty on 10/10/50 in the USIC, SINY. He was sentenced to Sifteen years imprisonment on 1/6/51 in USIC, SINY.

## WILLTAM PERL

PEPL was an associate and acquaintance of JULIUS ROS WHERG, who was tried, convicted, and executed for Espionage. He has been involved with and associated with many of the persons included in the ROSD/BFRG apparatus. PELL was indicted for perjury in connection with his testimony in the ROSD/BFRG case, and he is presently serving five years for perjury.

## FRED JOSEPH KITTY

Admittedly member of INO 1936 to 1935 or 1939, member of the TCL 1938 or 1939 to 1911, and attended CP rallies in N.Y.C., but said he was never a member. Signed CP petition in N.Y.C. in 1939. Registered to vote ALP in N.Y.C. 1939, 1910, and 1911. Sent classified information to associate while associate in Marine Corps. MICHAEL SIPOPRATCH and ANNE SIPOPROVICE advised FRED KITTI and wife good friends of theirs. IMVID TREFNOLASS has advised that ANNE SIPOPROVICH was once designated as a contact between him (GREENOLASS) and JULIUS ROSEUBPRO, while ORRENOLASS was at White Sande Proving Grounds in New Mexico.

#### PECOLOHENDATION

Cleveland, having all the information available, will continue the Espionage-R investigation on the subject.

Correlate information from summaries on husband, Michael Sidoroyich, and associates Julius and Rithel Rosenberg, David Greenglass, Filliam Ferl, Fred Joseph Kitty and relatives Faul Hanusiak, Vichael Hanusiak, Bertha Jane Hanusiak on whom separate memorandums have been submitted. Further Hemark memorandum sets forth information taken from C.i.G. files. There it is stated Hilliam Ferl was convicted of two counts of perjury in connection with testimony during the Risenberg trial. This is inaccurate in that the perjury was in connection with testimony given before the New York Grand Jury prior to the Rosenberg trial. It should further be noted that Rosenberg told the Greenglasses that Anne Sidorovich might be the person who would go to Albuquerque, New Mexico to secure information from David Greenglass.

## 1. On Subject

The CIC files reflect that ANNE S. DOROVICH is alleged to have come from a family that was associated with the IVO and to have lived at the same address as the Ukranian Labor Institute (222 Lafayette St., New Haven, Conn.) from 1929 to 1934, where leftist meetings were held.

She is alleged to have associated and been friendly with JULIUS and ETHFL ROSENHERG.

During Jamuary, 1945, ANNE SIDOROVICH is alleged to have met DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS at JULIUS ROSENBERG'S apartment so that DAVID or RUTH GREENGLASS would be able to identify her when she went to Albuquerque, New Mexico to get atomic bomb information from DAVID for JULIUS ROSENBERG. Subsequent information indicated ANNE SIDOROVICH never made the trip and the assignment was given to HARRY GOLD, who was convicted with the ROSENBERGS.

#### 2. On Associates

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG -- These individuals were convicted of espionage and were executed on 6/19/53 at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, N.Y.

DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS — These individuals are self-admitted Soviet agents and were part of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus.

WILLIAM PERL — PERL was convicted on two counts of perjury in connection with his testimony which he gave at the trial of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG.

According to testimony given by DAVID and FUTH GREENGLASS at the trial of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, ANNE SIDOLOVICH was the person originally designated by JULIUS ROSENGERG to meet with the GEVENGLASS'S in order to obtain the atomic bomb data which DAVID had collected.
