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

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

As of April, 1968, the LACEMS was composed solely of the Los Angeles Area Chapter and is commonly called the Los Angeles Sobell Committee.

II. CHARACTERIZATION

The LACENS (See CEMS Appendix) is the Los Angeles, California, affiliate of the CEMS

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were convicted in United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951, on a charge of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. The ROSENBERGs were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951, and MORTON SOBELL was sentenced to thirty years imprisonment on the same date. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953, and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the Federal Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania.

III. AIMS AND PURPOSES

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Between October, 1967, and April, 1968, the aim and purpose of the LACFMS was to work in behalf of MORTON SOEELL and obtain support and publicity for further legal action to obtain his freedom.

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


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As of April, 1968, there was no headquarters of the LACFAS and the committee receives its mail at Post Office Box 8652, Los Angeles, California, 90008.



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
JEAN SINCLAIR

DAVID L. SOLTKER

The files of the Subcommittee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, as reviewed August, 1943, reflected that the name DAVID SOLTKER appeared as a signer to the Communist Party (CP) Election Petition submitted to the State of Illinois in 1940.

On October 21, 1960, DAVID SOLTKER was in attendance at a public meeting sponsored by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC) entitled "Report from Cuba" held at Chicago. Featured speakers were ROBERT TABER, former CBS correspondent and Executive Secretary of the National FPCC, and CARLTON BEALS, Chairman of the National FPCC.

On May 21, 1967, the CSC held a theatre fund raising performance in Chicago at the Columbia School of Drama, 510 North Lake Shore Drive, Chicago. Approximately 80 persons attended the performance and no speeches were made.

On May 10, 1968, source advised the CSC holds only one or two affairs a year, such as a white elephant sale or a theatre party in order to raise funds.



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On October 5, 1967, a source furnished a letter from the CSC, 192 North Clark Street, Room 714, Chicago, dated September, 1967. This letter was addressed Dear Collector and signed by GERTRUDE SOLTKER for the committee. The letter was an appeal for funds to be supplied to the national office to fight SOBELL's legal battles. It mentioned that the legal fight to free SOBELL was on its way to the Supreme Court and funds were needed to aid in this battle.

CHICLGO COMMITTEE TO DEFEND THE SILL OF RIGHTS

The Chicago Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights (CCDBR) maintains headquarters in Rooms 801-803, 431 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois.



He outlined its aims and purposes as being to obtain mass support to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities and to defend Smith Act and Taft-Hartley victims. He said there would be no formal affiliation with any other national organization having the same purposes.

A second source advised on October 31, 1960, that the CCDBR was formerly organized on October 26, 1960, with RICHARD CRILEY as Executive Secretary after he motivated organizing the meeting of October 26, 1960.

A third source advised on May 15, 1967, that the original stated purposes of the CCDBR continue to be adhered to, with CRILEY continuing as the motivating force behind the Committee. The Board of Directors, however, now includes many individuals in the religious, educational and labor fields who are not known as CP members.

CHICAGO COMMITTEE TO PLIEND DEMOCRATIC RIGHTS Formerly known as Chicago Joint Defense Committee to Defeat the Smith Act

A source advised on April 15, 1958, that the Chicago Joint Defense Committee to Defeat the Smith Act (CJDC) was formed by the Communist Party (CP) in March, 1956.

the name of the CJDC was changed to the Chicago Committee to Defend Democratic Rights (CCDDR). The purpose of the CCDDR, according to its "Statement of Principles and Organization" was to "...defend and extend the human rights embodied in the Bill 670 of Rights...and to put an end to the political and racial persecution which threaten American democracy today".

The second source further advised on May 18, 1960, that as of May, 1960, the CCDDR continued to function within the framework of its stated principles and that in accordance with its "Statement of Principles and Organization" had a number of "Working Committees" which included the Chicago Smith Act Families Committee, South Side Freedom Committee, and Taft-Hartley Working Committee. The source further stated that as of May, 1960, RICHARD CRILEY was serving as the Executive Secretary of the CCDDR.

This same source advised on February 1, 1961, that the CCDDR continued to operate until October 26, 1960, when the Chicago Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights (CCDBR) was formed and the offices and assets of what was formerly the CCDDR were taken over by the CCDBR. At the October 26, 1960, meeting, a referendum for approval of the above described action was called for, and subsequently votes were solicited from "associates" of the old CCDDR. The source further advised that no formal dissolution meeting of the CCDDR was ever held, but for all intents and purposes, the CCDDR ceased to exist on October 26, 1960, and CRILEY, its Executive Secretary, since that time.

RICHARD CRILEY, according to a third source, was a member of the State Committee, CP of Illinois, as of February, 1961.

In August, 1966, the name "Committee to Free Morton Sobell" appeared on literature issued by the Committee in New York.

A second source advised on May 8, 1964, that DAVID L. SOLTKER appeared to be the guiding force behind this Committee and is assisted by GERTRUDE SOLTKER, his wife.

A third source advised on February 17, 1967, that the CSC maintains a bank account at the Amalgamated Trust and Savings Bank, 111 South Dearborn, Chicago, and that DAVID SOLTKER is listed in this bank account as the Secretary of the CSC.

The above information cannot be made public except in the usual proceedings following issuance of a subpoena duces tecum.

FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE, CHICAGO CHAPTER

A source advised in October, 1960, that the Chicago Chapter of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC) was formed during the summer of 1960 at Chicago, Illinois, under the direct guidance and leadership of RICHARD CRILEY, a member of the State Committee, Communist Party (CP) of Illinois.

A second source in August, 1960, furnished a leaflet entitled "What Is Really Happening in Cuba?" distributed by the FPCC in Chicago. The aims and purposes of the FPCC as set forth in this leaflet include the following: "To disseminate the truth, to combat untruth; to publish and distribute factual information which the United States mass media suppresses. In general, to contribute to foundations for peace, friendship, and understanding between ourselves and the Cuban people." The leaflet reflects the FPCC plans to accomplish these aims: "By mailing of information bulletins; organizing public meetings and forums; providing speakers, movies, and slides for meetings of interested organizations, placing ads in newspapers; to visit Cuba and see for themselves what conditions really are."

A third source advised on March 9, 1964, that there has been no activity of the FPCC in Chicago since late November, 1963, and for all intents and purposes the organization is defunct.

The mailing address for the FPCC, Chicago Chapter, is Post Office Box 4474, Chicago 80, Illinois.


FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contained a full-page advertisement captioned "What Is Really Happening in Cuba," placed by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC). This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. CHARLES A. SANTOS-BUCH identified himself and ROBERT TABER as organizers of the FPCC. He also testified he and TABER obtained funds from the Cuban Government which were applied toward the cost of the aforementioned advertisement.

On May 16, 1963, a source advised that during the first two years of the FPCC's existence there was a struggle between Communist Party (CP) and Socialist Workers Party (SWP) elements to exert their power within the FPCC and thereby influence FPCC policy. This source added that during the past year there had been a successful effort by FPCC leadership to minimize the role of these and other organizations in the FPCC so that their influence as of May, 1963, was negligible.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The November 23, 1963, edition of "The New York Times" reported that Searter THOMAS J. DODD of Connecticut had called FPCC "the chief public relations instrument of the Castro network in the United States." It is to be noted that Senator DODD was a member of the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee which twice conducted hearings on the FPCC.

The December 27, 1963, edition of "The New York world Telegram and Sun" newspaper stated that the pro-CASTRO FPCC was seeking to go out of business and that its prime activity during its lifetime had been sponsorship of pro-CASTRO street rallies and mass picket lines, and the direction of an active propaganda mill highlighting illegal travel-to-Cuba campaigns. Its comparatively brief span of life was attributed to mounting anti-CASTRO American public opinion, the 1962 Congressional hearings which disclosed FPCC financing by CASTRO's United Nations Delegation, and ultimately, the bad publicity which the FPCC received from disclosure of activities on its behalf by suspected presidential assassin LEE H. OSWALD.

On February 6, 1964, the previously mentioned second source advised that V. T. LEE had recently remarked that the FPCC was dead and that there were no plans to organize another similar organization.

On April 13, 1964, a third source advisor, that there had not been any FPCC activity in many months and that the FPCC had been dissolved.

MIDWEST COMMITTEE FOR PROTECTION OF FOREIGN BORN

A source on Docember 17, 1965, advised that the Midwest Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (MCPFB) from March, 1962, to the latter part of 1965 maintained an office in Room 422, 431 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, 111 mais.

advised that the MCPFB was founded at a contribute in Chloque Illinois, on May 25, 1947, and was to operate as the wider organization of the American Committee for Protections of Foreign Born (ACPFB).

A second source on May 5, 1955, novised that the MCPFB in a "Statement of Principles" issued in April, 1955, noted that "The purpose of the Midwest Committee shall be to seek to perpetuate for the foreign born the fundamental concepts of equality, regardless of race, color, creed, nationality, political belief or place of birth, and to preserve the basic ideals of liberty and hospitality which serve as the guarantees of democracy for all Americans."

According to a third source, as of September, 1965, the MCPFB was still functioning as the midwest organization of the ACPFB but was considering the possibility of disself and turning over its work and responsibilities to the Chirago Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights (CCDBR).

This same source on December 27, 1965, savised that the MCPFB had ceased activity and had turned over its office and responsibilities to the CCDBR and for all intents and purposes was defunct.

The ACPFB has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

NATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD CHICAGO CHAPTER

A source advised on May 9, 1967, that it was how understanding that the National Lawyers Guild (NLG) was formed around 1936 in New York City, and that the Chirak Chapter of the NLG (CCNLG), which is affiliated with the national group in New York, was formed shortly therefore possibly in 1937 by a group of liberal progressive lawyers in protest against activities of the American Bar Association which they claimed was a non-liberal, non-progressive organization. The CCNLG has no established headquarters of liberature.

(Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 3123 on the National Lawyers Guild, September 21, 1950, originally related September 17, 1950.)

-"3. 'To defend the cases of Communist lawbreakers, fronts have been devised making special appeals in behalf of civil liberties and reaching out far beyond the confined of the Communist Party itself. Among these organizations are the * * National Lawyers Guild. When the Communist Party itself is under fire these offer a bulwark of protection.'



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Morton Sobell Files for Retrial


A new motion to set aside the 1951 conviction of Morton Sobell as an atom spy was filed yesterday by his lawyers in U. S. District Court in Foley Square.

Sobell, 50, is serving a 30-year sentence in Lewisburg, Pa. for conspiring with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg and others to sell American atomic secrets to Soviet agents from 1940 to 1950.

The Rosenbergs were executed after being convicted.

In yesterday's motion, the lawyers asked that Sobell's conviction be set aside and he be set free or a new trial be ordered and he be released in bail.

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15th anniversary of Rosenberg execution

June 19 was the 15th anniversary of the executions of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, convicted as traitors to the United States who had given the secrets of the atom bomb to the Soviet Union.

Morton Sobell, a co-defendant of the Rosenbergs, is completing his 18th year in prison but is expected to be released sometime next year. The many appeals of Sobell's conviction are proving in the federal courts that the Rosenbergs were executed for a crime they didn't commit. During one of these appeal motions, in August, 1966, affidavits of top scientists who worked on the bomb established that the "atom-bomb chart" the Rosenbergs allegedly stole and gave to the Russians was "worthless" and only a "caricature."

A book published last year on their case-"Invitation to an Inquest," by Walter and Miriam Schneir and published by

Doubleday—explains that the Rosenbergs were not even charged in their indictment with stealing atom bomb secrets. A key government witness later admitted that he had lied under oath many times and agents of the FBI were involved in forging one of the most vital pieces of "evidence," according to the Schneirs.

Irving Saypol was the prosecutor of the Rosenbergs and Sobell. Roy Cohn, who later became famous as Senator Joe McCarthy's chief counsel, was his special assistant.

The Eisenhower administration ignored protests from all over the world and carried out the executions on June 19, 1953. Judge Irving Kaufman said he sentenced the Rosenbergs to death because he considered the "theft" had enabled the Russians to build their own atomic bomb and launch the Korean War.

On Colober 31, 1987, a second source advised that at the 22nd Mational Convention of the SWP held in New York City from October 26, 1987, to October 29, 1987, it was stated that the YSA remained as the main recruiting ground for new SWP members.


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

CHARACTERIZATION

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The LACFIIS (See CFMS Appendix) is the Los Angeles, California affiliate of the CFMS.

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York on March 29, 1951, on a charge of Conspiracy to Commit Espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. The ROSENBERGS were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951 and MONTON SOBELL was sentenced to 30 years imprisonment on the same date. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing-Sing Prison, Ossining, New York on June 19, 1953, and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the Federal Penatentiary in Lewisburg, Pennsylvania.

AIMS AND PURPOSES



Between April, 1968, and October, 1968, the aim and purpose of the LACFMS was to work in behalf of MORTON SOBELL and obtain support and publicity for further legal action to obtain his freedom.





EMMA LAZARUS FEDERATION OF JEWISH WOMEN'S CLAUSES

A source advised on May 1, 1968, that the Emma Lazarus Jewish Women's Clubs of Los Angeles (ELJWC of LA) are affiliated with the Emma Lazarus Federation of Jewish Women's Clubs with beadquarters in New York, New York. The ELJWC of LA have been active from the early 1950's to the present time. Prior thereto the organization was known as the Emma Lazarus Division of the Jewish People's Fraternal Order (JPFO). The JFFO has been designated by the Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The ELJWC of LA is controlled by officers who are either current members of the Southern California District Communist Party (SCDCP) or who have had past affiliations with Communist Party dominated organizations. The Jewish Commission, SCDCP, exercises influence over the ELJWC of LA inasmuch as the President of the ELJWC of LA is also a member of the SCDCP Jewish Commission and the organization closely follows the Communist Party line.




