





Mup Fight for Justice in Yonkers Killings

A fighting program to answer the racist insult delivered by a personal spokesman for Cov. Devey and to win state action in the killing of James and Wyatt Blacknall in Yonkers, was adopted vesterday by the Committee To Secure Justice in the Blackwall Case. The commiller called for wires to Cov. Dewey demanding the death penalty for the killer, Stanley LaBenskey, and immediate removal of Kent Brown's Dewey's while supremacist personal reprosentative Brown had vilely in-sulted a delegation of 75 leading Negro and white citizens, including a Catholic priest, a Unitarian minister, a missionary bishop, and trade union and civic leaders. The delegation had presented a petition detailing the incidents of police violence and brutality against Negroes over the past four years and demanding a state investigation, as well as state action on the Blacknall, murder. The racist official rejected the petition with a mild apology for the police involved and countered with a white supremacist epithet. Equating "lad" cops with Negro people, Brown said, "there is always a near in the wood pile."





Like these top "leaders." Lerner feels it necessary to do his bit to call the Jewish people off the case. He is reaffirming the line of these "leaders"—that the anti-Semitic issue was "injected" by the "communists" for Machiavellian ends.

In the current (July) issue of Jewish Life, I have indicated that certain Jewish top "leaders" are playing into the hands of those who are trying to bring a police state to our country and are doing their utmost to immobilize the Jewish people from resisting ominous, anti-Semitic trends.

SUCH top 'leaders' are unmoved by the fact that not one Jew served on the jury in the Rosenberg case, in a city one-third Jewish. Nor do they

notice the fact, which they well know, that this case, together with other "atom spy" cases, is bringing forth volumes of anti-Semitic filth.

Lerner simply does not deal with the evidence for auti-Semilism in the case. He merely asserts that the fact that the Rosenbergs are Jewish "had nothing to do" with what happened to them. His answer to the view that Judge Kaulman's imposition of the death sentence-imprecedented in the annals of American jurisprudencewas an appeasement of the anti-Semites, is the evasive and quite irrelevant sneer: "I wondered how loudly the Communists would shout out sometime if the judge had not happened to be Jewish."



By ROBERT FRIEDMAN Union Square rang yesterday with the cry, "The Rosenbergs Must Not Die!" The cry came from representatives of Catholic, Protestant and Jewish faiths, and from union ists, Negro and white, who spoke at the "Appeal to the President" rally there in behalf

of executive clemency for Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. It was echoed in the cheers of thousands of New Yorkers who crowded the 17 St. side of the Square to join in the fight to save the lives of the young Jewish-American couple framed as spies in America's version of the

Drevius Case.

A crowd officially estimated at 7,500 underscored its intense determination to win life for the Rosenbergs, by remaining through a two-hour meeting despite the raw cold and late October winds which whipped the Square.

The growd tendered an ovition to the venerable Rabbi Dr. Meyer Sharti, leading Orthodox rabbi oil Brooklyn, as he left the speaker platform, when chairman Joseph' Brainin announced that Rabbi Sharff would appeal to President Trumon in person for elemency for the Rosenbergs, David Alman, executive secre-

tary of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, spousors of the rally, aunounced the initiation of a "Million Message campaign to Truman urg-ing that the Rosenbergs may live. (Continued on Page 8)

The purpose of the rally and of the immediate struggle, however, was as Brainin stated: "We are going to save the lives of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg and then we are going to fight on to vindicate, them."

Mrs. Bessie Mitchell, sister of Collis English, one of the two remaining jailed Negro victims of the Trenton Six frame-up, doclared: "I am joining this movement to secure justice for the Rosenbergs because I know what injustice is."

Trade unionist speakers, including Sol Tischler, president, Local 140, United Furniture Workels, ClO, and Bob Edwards and Herb Frank; includers of District 65, DFOW, emphasized that the fight to win elemency for the Rosenbergs is in the great tradition of workingmen's struggles against frame-ups.

ups.
Tischler charged: "This was a frame-up, not just against the Rosenbergs but against the Jewish people"

Frunk, speaking as a rank and file unionist, urged the crowd to bring this case into your shops, into your neighborhoods."

Calif. Churchinen Urge Truman To Save Rosenbergs

OAKLAND, Cal., Nov. 10.—A group of East Bay churchmen and doctors added their voices to the thousands protesting the death sentences pronounced on Ethel and Julius Ros-

enberg and in support of the campaign for executive elemency.

Rev. A. E. Williams, secretary of the state Baptist convention and pastor of Greater Faith Baptist church of Stockton, said:

"Personally I feel that the President should consent to reversal of the Rosenbergs' sentence on grounds that death for a charge of espionage has never been imposed on any American citizen."

Rev. G. J. Williams of Richmond, Vice president of the Sunday School and Baptist training union of the state Baptist convention said:

"I don't like a spy even in church. If these people are guilty, they should be punished. But I don't think we should set a precedent by giving these people the death penalty, especially when it seems that sufficient evidence has not been presented against them."

Rev. J. L. Johnson, a pastor of St. John Baptist church of Vallejo, said in a letter, which he wrote to President Truman. I feel the linsenbergs tre leing treated injustly before God and man... You as President liave the power to grant executive elemency and save their lives.

Rev. Johnson's letter briefly reviewed the case for the President and quoted scriptures from the Bible.

Dr. C. I. Collins of Vallejo said: "It sels an extremely dangerous precedent when a civil courtcan pronounce a death sentence because of someone's way of thinking. It sounds the death knell for American democracy."

Delphine Palm of Vallejo said: "As a practicing pediatrioian I am appalled at this attack on free thinking American motherhood."

NEWARK, N. J., Nov. 10.—An audience of more than 400 at Wideway Hall here voted unanimously to send a telegram to President Truman urging executive clemency for Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. The crowd, many of whom also sent individual telegraphed appeals to the President, also contributed \$1,000 to the defense of the framed "spy" trial victims.

The meeting was sponsored by the New Jersey Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs.

A day prior to the meeting, a quarter-page ad by the committee appeared in the "Newark Evening News." Citing the 10 and 12-year jail terms for the war-time traitors, Axis Sally and Toyko Rose, as compared to the death sentences for the Rosenbergs, the ad urged the public to write and wire appeals for elemency to the Jewish-American couple to Truman.

The meeting, chaired by Dr. Leonard, Lushnet, chairman of the New Jersey Committee, heard Dr. Harry F. Ward, professor emeritus, Union Theological Seminary; Yuri Sulli, author, of "One Foot in America," and Mrs. Endly Afnan, of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.



"And I said that was why Judge Kaufman had handed down the bestial sentence of death to two Jews... for lesser craces than those for which others, in time of sanity, have received comparatively light prison sentences—or have gone scot free."

Einstein Asks Truman To Save Rosenbergs

Dr. Albert Einstein asked President Truman yesterday to commute the death senof Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, it was learned as the Daily Worker went to press. Seletter to the President, Einstein cited the reasons "set forth so convincingly by my distinguished colleague, Harold C. Urey."

The State Department is beeling the tremendous pressure of world opinion for the commutation of the death sentence in the case of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg. The Ottawa Citizen, a conservative paper, asks Washington for clemency for the Rosenbergs who were scheduled to be executed January 14, but whose plea to President Truman is now in his hands and await action.

By ART SHIELDS Two hours on a vigil line for the Rosenbergs is an inspiring experfence. So many men and women expressed their sympathy as we marched back and forth in front of the Locw's Delancey St. theatre with Rosenberg pla-

pards and leaflets! And only three folks out of hundreds said any unpleasant things as they Dassed. The Rosenberg vigil line had

been winding back and forth for hours by midnight last night. It hasn't stopped for a minute since it began at 8 p.m. last Friday, And it has brought its appeal to save the lives of the brave young couple to many thousands of people in these four days.

The marchers pace back and Youth on Delancey Street betwom Norfolk and Suffolk Speets. This is in the heart of

Chevrolet Local Asks Rosenberg Clemency

By MILTON HOWARD

The executive board of the large Chevrolet local 659 of the CIO United Auto Workers voted 9-2 to ask President Truman to grant elemency to Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, East Side mother and father who

East Side mother and father who, for the first time in American history, has been sentenced to death in peace time for alleged espionage. The local has 20,000 members.

A copy of the resolution was forwarded to the UAW international offices.

At the same time, the weekly New Republic, came out editorially for Presidential elemency. The magazine says it believes "that the Rosenbergs' sentence should be commuted to life imprisonment", not because it questions their guilt but "for the sake of America's worldwide position. Millions of non-Communists in countries allied with us are troubled by the severity of these sentences." The weekly magazine The Nation has similarly urged elemency though expressing more doubt about the verdict itself.

Observers watching the progress of the people's cardination for exceptive elemency have noted with alarm that with every day, every hour crucial, there has been a certain falling-off of activity for elem-

This coincides with the appearance of an organized "let-them-die" campaign which clearly comes from high quarters. The "let-them-die" drive was announced with the apperance a week ago of a top committee which included C. Samuel Rosenman, and Dr. D. Poling.

Since then, a tremendous newspaper campaign in the Hearst and Scripps-Howard press has been, unloosed based on the falsehoods of the Oliver Pilat series in the New York Post. All of this propaganda is based on the unsupported and unproved story of the one key government witness, David Greenglass, and on the hysterical myth-of an "atomic secret." That there was not one piece of evidence to corrobocate Greenglass, or that nothing was ever submitted to show that the Rosenbergs had ever engaged in any espionage or had ever met any agents of a foreign power is conveniently overlooked in this "kill-the-Rosenbergs" propaganda.

This propaganda is having its effect, however, some leading participants in the elemency fight note. They cited yesterday the fact that some leading trade unions whose top leadership had privately expressed their desire elemency still failed to take action as a result of the new pressure against elemency.

At the same time, in addition to the 1,500 leading Protestant clergymen, Dr. Albert Einstein and Dr. Harold Urey, atomic scientists, who have asked President Truman to commute the death sentence, another large group is expected to make a similar appeal.

THE PROTESTS MOUNT

THE STATE DEPARTMENT and the press have joined in hysterical outcries to cover up the Project X nurder plot in Moscow. This is intended in part, at least, to stem and to dissolve the now world-wide movement on behalf of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

Ten days ago the State Department brought Benjamin Bradlee, press attache in the Paris embassy, to the U.S. to prepare a massive propaganda drive to justify the execution of the innocent couple facing death in Sing Sing's execution chamber. Bradlee prepared a campaign document which has been distributed to 40 countries with a view to countering the sentiment for elemency. (For reasons best known to the State Department, this document has not been made available in the U.S.)

But the State Department's efforts abroad have been in vain. Instead of the tunult being stilled, it has risen. Instead of world public opinion being silenced, new voices have joined in the plea for executive elemency.

The State Department, the Scripps-Howard and Hearst press—which have headed the campaign for destroying Ethel and Julius Rosenbergs—are attempting to twist Moscow revelations to their own criminal purposes. They aim to deluge the growing movement for elemency with thousands of words in which they try to transform the uncovering of a Project X murder into anti-Semitism.

In respect to both issues—the plot in Moscow, and the Rosenberg case—the State Department does not face an ignorant public.

People in Europe will recall that another recent Project X enterprise—exposed only a few months ago—the proposed murder of German right-wing Socialists by a group of Nazis.

Is it beyond the possibility of doubt, people in Europe will ask, that the Project X directors who could foster a Nazi gang-whose stated purpose was to nurder West German Socialist leaders-would not utilize every possible avenue to murder Soviet leaders?

The people of the 40 countries to which the State Department has circulated its kill-the-Rosenbergs document will not be swayed—by the most slippery arguments—from the thought that the cry for the Rosenbergs death sounds chillingly like an echo out of Europe's Nazi past.

But the State Department's propaganda failure in Europe will not of itself save Ethel and Julius Rosculorg. These are crucial days. It is here in the U. S. that the issue—life, not death, for the Rosenbergs—must be resolved. It can only be resolved if the campaign for elemency mounts with each passing day.

What Rosenberg Case Means to Labor

THIS IS BEING WRITTEN as minutes tick away towards the life or, death deadline for the Rosenbergs. Until quite recently, the movement to save the Rosenbergs seemed small. Even some progressives in labor leadership, I am sorry to say, limited their opinions to private tircles. But the protest movement that seemed like a trickle a few short weeks ago is fast swelling into a forrent of anger. The close proximity of death for the condemned couple has moved the conscience of millions.

Albert Einstein, the great scientist, summarizes the feeling that has come over great masses when he wrote the President "My conscience compels me to urge you to commute the death sentence of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg."

A pro-clemency petition signed by 1,500 leading Protestant clergymen of the country is reconceivable without a ground swell of support for the movement. The novement for clemency is just as strong among Jewish rabbis and people in science, art, and other fields of culture.

So fremendous is the nowement for clemency that even Walter Winchell who has been screaming death for the Bosenbergs, put out a story that clemency is likely. Winchell may mean it, or he may be interested in putting down the growing tide of protest. The important point is that the Rosenberg case has become an issue on the front pages of every newspaper in the country. The dam is broken. It no longer takes special comage to speak out on the Bosenberg issue.

BUT WHY are the leaders of labor still timid? With the exception of a very small minority, with as yet not a single oue of the top ClO or AFL heads among them, only a handful of unions or union leaders have spoken out.

You hear occasionally of some leaders whose minds are twinbled, who say they will intercede with the President or a judge, but God lorbid that any-



Clemency Plea Shifts To Pres. Eisenhower

The world-wide elemency campaign to commute the death sentence in the Rosenberg case shifted last week to the new President, Dwight Eisenhower.

Eisenhower will withhold his decision on the elemency plea pending a recommendation from his new Attorney.

General Herbert Brownell, the White House said.

HARRY TRUMAN LEFT the White House Jan. 20 without hecding the pleas of millions the world over that he commute the death sentence in the case of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

But neither did he find it possible to speed the execution by flatly

denying clemency.

He simply dumped the case into the lap of his successor. Presidentelect Eisenhower. The original date for execution was Jan. 14.

Eisenhower will get a Department of Justice study which will contain recommendations to the chief executive. Departing U.S. Attorney General McGranery told the press that the D. of J. had not yet completed its study.

MRS. ELEANOR ROOSEVELT told an audience at St. Olal's College in Northfield, Minn. (Jan. 19): "I think there is a great deal of hope" that Presidential elemency may be granted. She said that "never before have we executed anyone for treason in this country in times of peace." The Rosenbeigs were not tried for treason but for "conspiracy to commit espionage." The Constitution de-

pionage." The Constitution defines treason very carefully as giving aid and confort to the enemy in time of war. Acts of treason must be confirmed by two witnesses. There was no confirming evidence in the Rosenberg case.

THE JERUSALEM POST, largest paper in Israel, editorially joined the plea for elemency (Jan. 7). Said the Post:

"Humane opinion looks to the President of the United States to commute the capital sentence on Ethel and Julius Rosenberg marked out to bear a burden of punishment far beyond the beingusness of their crime."

The Post noted the fact that "a sentence has been passed which in the opinion of very many people is not justified by the circumstances."

THE NATIONAL COMMITTEE to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case said it would probably announce details of another Washington Vigil to be held Jan. 26. More than 2,500 persons from 22 states marched in such a elemency vigil around the East gate of the White House Jun, 5. The vigil continued day and night for 21 days.

William L. Patterson, chairman of the Civil Rights Congress sharply criticized Truman for failing to save the lives of the Rosenbergs. He warned that the incoming Eisenhower administration "care no more for the lives of the Rosenbergs than the Truman mink coat and deep freeze brigade. He said that "the people remain the decisive force in this case" and urged that community leaders on all levels be visited with requests that they come out for elemency.

From Milwaukee, Wisc., came news that the official organ of the Catholic Diocese, the La Crosse Register, had editorially come out for clemency (Jan. 15). The Catholic paper did not question the verdict, but said "our national interests as well as the ends of Justice" would be served commuting the death penalty.

They also urged that unions, churches and other groups send personal delegations to visit the President with new pleas for reconsideration of the death penalty, the first that will ever be enforced in the history of the United States by a civil court in peacetime for such an alleged crime.

The Vigil Train will leave for Washington Saturday morning at 8:00 a.m. at Pennsylvania Station and will leave Washington at 5:55 return. Round trip tickets at \$12 are available all day today at the Committee's headquarters, 1050 Sixth Ave., New York City, BR-9-9694.

Defense Attorney Emanuel Bloch said yesterdal he is attempting to arrange to take the two Rosenberg childen, Michael, 9, and Bobby, 6, to see their parents in the death house on Saturday.

The Committee recalled that the Rosenbergs were "hours away from death" several weeks ago, but that "millions of Americans of all religious faiths and stations in life, prayed and appealed for clemency, with the result that the administration under which the Rosenbergs were convicted did not carry out the death sentences.

"We believe that the Rosenbergs can still obtain Presidential elemency, providing that millions of our fellow citizens reiterate their sentiments by conveying, by telephone, wire and letter, a plea for reconsideration to Presi-

QUESTIONS and ANSWERS on the Rosenberg Case

Q. Were the Rosenbergs convicted of "giving atomic secrets to Russia" as every paper in the U.S.A. says?

A. No This is a falsehood. The Rosenbergs were charged with and convicted of "conspiracy to commit espionage" for a foreign power. They were not even charged with intent to harm the United States. The government used the "conspiracy" charge because it did not have the slightest proof or evidence that the Rosenbergs ever contacted any Russian at any time. There is nothing in the trial record to show that they had ever done so. There is not one piece of evidence in the entire case to prove that any "information" about an "atomic secret" had ever actually been transmitted by the Rosenbergs to anybody.

Thus all the talk of "treason" which fills the press is not supported by a single fact in the trial record itself. The talk of "Russia" and "treason" comes from propaganda planted in the press by the government, notably FBI boss J. Edgar Hoover and U. S. prosecutor Irving Saypol.

Q. How did the case start?

A. On June 15, 1950, a mechanic, David Greenglass decided to become a government witness. Greenglass, who was in fear of his life because of FBI charges, decided to "finger" his sister Ethel, and his brother-in-law Julius Rosenberg as "Soviet spies." On July 16, 1950, the Rosenbergs were arrested. They denied the accusations categorically.

Q. What is the proof against the Rosenburgs?

A. There is none. There is only the word of one man, David Greenglass. Greenglass could not ploduce a single corriborating witness, or a single tangible item of evidence to back up his story. The FBI questioned all the members of Julius

Rosenberg's CCivy class and found one, Max Elitcher, against whom they said they had proof that he committed perjuty in signing a loyalty oath. Elitcher never met Greenglass and did not know him. Elitcher testified that Rosenberg, after not meeting him for several years, had spoken to him about espionage. He had nothing to confirm this. This and this alone is the "case" against Ethel and Julius Rosenberg. To brille up this "case," the FBI found a photographer, Pen Schneider, whom they smuggled into the court illegally in order to rehearse his identification of Julius the next day. This fact was hidden from the court at the time. Schneider swore on onth he had never seen the Rosenbergs between the time he allegedly took their pictures "los passports" and the time he Identified them as an FBI witness. He could produce not one single item of contrete evidence to back up his story.

Q. What was the atomic data which Greenglass says he gave to the Rosenbergs?

A. It consisted solely of a freehand drawing made by him allegedly from memory six years after he seen it at Los Alamos. The drawing was of an implesion has a used in atomic research. The government had promined to produce top atomic scientists to prove the truth and importance of the "atomic secret." They never did.

Top atomic scientist, Dr. Barold E. Urey of the University of Chicago, and a leader in heilding the atomic bomb ridiculed the idea of such a "secret." Greenglass failed to pass a single one of nine science courses he took at a polytechnic school. Dr. Edward N. Condon, top U. S. scientist in a letter to Judge Kaufman flatly said that the freehand drawing of such a lense would be meaningless and worthless since "the essence of the lense lies in the precise shape which Greenglass did not know and could not have transmitted by a freehand sketch in any case."

CHICAGO, Feb. 16.-Spokesmen for 2,300 clergymen who have sent a special plea to President Eisenhower to reconsider the appeal for clemency in the Rosenberg case today awaited a reply from the White House on their request to speak to the President personally on the case. Dr. Bernard M. Loomer, dean of the University of Chicago Divinity School,

forwarded the new appeal to Eisenhower which "earnestly questions the political and spiritual wisdom of the sentence" of death against: Julius and Ethel Rosenberg.

A group of leading churchmen who signed the appeal are ready to go to Washington at a moment's notice, said Dean Loomer.

Following is the text of the letter signed by Dean Loomer which Eisenhower received yesterday:

"I urge you to reconsider your refusal to commute the death sentence of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg.

"Together with nearly 2,500 other clergymen, I signed a letter asking for executive elemency. We assume that our letter is included in the material prepared for your attention by the Instice Department.

"Our unaffiliated group represents an important segment of the Shristian clergy of this country. Among us are members of 28

communions and citizens of all 48 states, the District of Columbia, the territories of Alaska, Hawaii and the Canal Zone and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.

"Many of the signers are spiritual and executive leaders in their respective denominations. Included are presidents, deans and professors of numerous theological schools and colleges and important members of inter-denominational organizations. All of us, as pastors, are in intimate touch with our people; it is fair to conclude that our opposition to the death sentence is shared by a much larger number of conservative and thoughtful citizens.

"It is difficult in a short letter to convey adequately the sense the considerations which led us to make our original appeal. (Continued on Page 6)

(Continued from Page 1) Sertainly one major consideration is the fact that the Roseniers case has become an occasion that catches up within itself ell kinds of attitudes, forces and movements which are operating within our society.

"For this reason, we suggest that the Rosenberg case cannot be looked at simply in terms of itself. For this reason, the death sentence in this instance is an Indication of pur national weakness rather than our national strength. It is a reflection of our own

growing hysteria, lear and insecurity.

"When looked at in this symbolic way, the death sentence itself further reduces the range of our freedom to think and act. It contributes to a paralysis of critical thought. It furthers the mood of suppression that becomes increasingly characteristic of our way of life.

"We are not questioning the justice of the trial, but we earnestly question the political and spiritual wisdom of the sentence.

"Surely we as a country are strong enough to endure the kind

of tension involved in the Rosenberg case.

"Since this is an inadequate summary of our views, I respectfully ask on behalf of all of the signers that you grant an appointment at which some of our number can present to you personally the considerations which moved us to join in a common plan for mercy.

Silverman, British MP, to Speak Here At Clemency Rally

Sydney Silverman, Labor member of Parliament and vice-chairman of the World Jewish Congress, will be a leading speaker for elemency in the Rosenberg case, at a banquet to be held March 18, it was announced yesterday.

Silverman, a British leader in Jewish affairs, cabled Prof. Stephen Love of the University of Chicago that he would be "delighted" to come to the USA to speak for elemency.

Silverman had been falsely quoted in news services and papers here several weeks ago as having attacked the Rosenberg elemency campaign and the trials of the spies in Prague.

In a letter to defense counsel Emanuel Bloch Silverman called these reports dishonest and unscruptions. He said that far from attacking the clemnecy campaign he felt that it is not the Bosenbergs but the Washington government which is on trial before the world. He also denied the Prague trials were anti-Scinitic.

Silverman's acceptance of the invitation to speak coincided with the request by four prominent Labor Members of Parliament for executive commutation of the death sentence. The four are John Rankin (Tradeston) M. K. Macmillan (Western Isles) Cyril Bence (Dupbartonshire East) and James Carpichael (Bridgeton).

Scores of placards, many of them declaring "President Eisenhower Can and Must Reconsider His Decision to Let the Rosenbergs Die," dotted the line as the marchers circled in the crisp winter synshine while hundreds of onlookers passed to watch,

It was the largest public demonstration yet staged here on behalf of the young couple, sentenced to death for alleged "one.

The French Robbis | Clemency Plea That Gov't Suppressed

The text of the suppressed message by the chief rabbis of France to former President Truman urging elemency for the Rosenbergs has become available in this country. The pressure, expressing the belief that

the "extreme severity" of the death scutence is "without precedent in the West," was sent on Jan. 2.

This was learned from the British Embassy in Washington, by the Rosenberg Clemency Committee, spousors of the dinner, slated for tonight (Wednesday) at the Hotel Capitol in New York.

Silverman was quoted in the London Telegraph of March 11 as saying that the provision of the McCarran Law under which he was excluded "refers to anarchists, atheists, Communists, totalitarians

and a variety of other people, none of whom could apply to me."

A member of the world executive of the World Jewish Congress, Silverman also stated that the American Jewish Congress was "much perturbed" by the U. S. Covernment's action.

It was learned here that the congress had protested the visa refusal as had a number of other U. S. organizations in opposition to the McCarran Law.

A Reuters dispatch from WashIngton quoted State Department
spokesman Joseph Reap as denying that the visa refusal had anything to do with Silverman's connection with the Rosenberg Case.
In any case, Reap reportedly said,
"he would still be ineligible to
outer the country."

The Rosenberg Clemency Dianer Committee, wired this protest to both the State Department and the Department of Justice.



Pope's New Mercy Plea Read to 10,000 at Rally

With the possibility that the U.S. Supreme Court might hand down its decision on the Rosenbergs today, many thousands of New Yorkers and out-of-towners gathered at Randall's Island Stadium yesterday to hear startling new revelations showing the crude character of the frameup.

They heard with amazement the reading of an original document in the handwriting of David Greenglass in which critical statements made by this key witness during the 1951 trial were flatly controlleted by what Greenglass wrote a year before.

They also heard:

A new statement by the Pope through the official Vatican paper, Osservatore Romano emphasizing and justilying his "intervention" in the case for reasons of mercy and obarity.

A new statement by Nobel Prize winner, atomic expert, Dr. Ifarold C. Urey, reiterating his plea for elemency and a new trial on the basis of enormous gaps in the case against the pair now awaiting execution in the death house at Sing Sing, New York.

A complete analysis of the flimsiness of the case against the Rosenbergs by the nationally noted legal authority, Prof. Stephen Love of forthwestern University and of the Illinois Supreme Court Committee for Fitness.



In particular, that a woman should wait in a death chamber for the moment of execution is in itself an event as tragic as it is rare and is such as to arouse instinctively a sense of horror. When their two children, Michael, nine years old, and Robert five, are involved in this tearful fate, many hearts can be melted, before two little innocents on whose soul and destiny the death of their parents would forever leave sinister scars. No one can deny bow this circumstance at least gives reason to the heartielt insistence of the mothers who wanted to bring their agonized pleas to the Vicar of Him who dearly loved children."

Dr. Urey, whose statement was read to the rally, said:

"The new data relative to the console table published recently in the Guardian, if it can be substantiated, countries my impression relative to this part of the testimony."

Dr. Urey was referring to the Macy console table which an affidavit proves was bought by the flosenbergs at the time they said they bought it, and was not a "gift" from the Soviet Union for microfilm work as one government witness testified after he was shown not the actual table in court, but photographs.

that the government has much evidence against the Rosenbergs involving vital secret data which cannot be disclosed in open court, and hence that the conviction and sentence are justified regardless of the evidence. I reject this theory and practice of justice as exceedingly dangerous and contrary to the historical justice of the United States.

"If our secrets are so important, then criminals should not be tried and condemned to death without public presentation of the evidence, and in this case criminals must go free. Personally, I would like to see this evidence, and until I can see it and discuss it in public it does not exist for the purposes of my discussion of this case,

I should like to see a new trial granted to the Rosenbergs. Such a trial would give much information about this whole affair and would be worth all the cost even if the verdict and sentence were the same, because the cloud and unfertainty of the present situation

HE NEW EVIDENCE ROSENBERG

We begin today the publication of the "New Evidence in the Rosenberg Case." issued by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.

INTRODUCTION

Since the Spring of 1951, when Ethel and Julius Rosenberg were sentenced to death and Morton Sobell to 30 years at Alcatran at the conclusion of a hurried ten-day trial, an ever growing debate has developed throughout the

country as to the facts in the case.
In March, 1952, the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case published the entire trial transcript. On the basis of these transcripts, thousands of which were sold throughout the country, the national debate on the facts in the Rosenberg case assumed tremendous pro-

portions. Dr. Harold Urey, Prof. Albert Einstein, Prof. Stephen Love, and many attorneys, educators and religious leaders called for clemency. More and more people became convinced that grave doubt exists as to the guilt of the Rosenbergs and Morton Sobell and that the short ten-day trial did not contain the necessary guarantees of a fair trial under the American Constitution. Eighty thousand Americans signed an anicus brief, requesting a new trial for the Rosenbergs and Morton Sobell. Many more thousands appealed to the President of the United States to grant elemency to the Rosenbergs.

Now, in the Spring of 1953, new documents have come to light, throwing serious doubt on the testimony of David and Ruth Greenglass, chief witnesses against the Rosenbergs. These documents, first published in France, were presented to the American people at a public rally of 10,000 people at Randall's Island Stadium in New York on May 3, 1953.

In the interest of seeking the truth in the Rosenberg Case, guaranteeing American justice, and preventing the trogic execution of two people who to this day maintain their complete innocence, we present these documents to the American people.

THE DOCUMENTS

The documents received by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case arrived from the French Rosenberg Com-

mittee in the form of photostats.

The first document consists of three pages written in Bavid Greenglass' own handwriting.

The three pages were later authenticated by a foremost handwriting expert, Mrs. Elizabeth Me-Carthy, of Boston, Mass. The document is dated "Saturday, June, 1950." It purports to be a statement of recapitulation of what David Greenglass told the F.B.L.

.. The importance of this document lies in the contradiction it gives to Greenglass' courtroom testimony; it is written in the language of a man inventing a story rather than telling a truthful narrative; it contains serious and inexplicable omissions, and finally, confesses that he permitted the F.B.I. to "remember" for him events he could not himself recall.

The second document, dated June 18, 1950, is a typewritten one, also of three pages, which appears to be a memorandum from an attorney for his files. It concerns a discussion between members of the law firm and relatives of David. Greenglass. This second document is likewise of extreme importance because in it Mrs. Ruth Greenglass, David's wife, contradicts vital aspects of her husband's written statement and courtroom testimony and portrays her husband as an hysteric and liar. This document provides evidence that Greenglass committed perjury.

These two documents do not deal with peripheral or secondary matters in the case. They go to the heart of the case, and therefore raise fundamental doubts, which, when taken in the context of other doubts-particularly the absence of a single document linking the Rosenbergs to a "conspiracy to commit espionage"—cause the trial to be viewed in an altogether new light.

The following pages present a comparison of the newly discovered documents with the Greenglass testimony.

TENDENCY TO HYSTERIA'

In a decision of the U. S. Court of Appeals, Judge Jerome N. Frank said: "Doubtless if that (Greenglass) testimony were disregarded the conviction (against the Rosenbergs) could not stand.

One of the new documents, the typewritten lawyer's memorandum describing an interview with Ruth Greenglass, David's wife, gives an intimate account of what kind of a parson Greenglass is. Here, is a report of what Greenglass' wife has to say about him:

"As to her husband, she stated that he had a 'tendency to hysteria.' At other times he would become delirious and once when he had the grippe he ran nude through the hallway, shriek-

ing of 'elephants,' and 'lead pants.'

"She had known him since he was ten years old. She said that he would say things were so even if they were not. He talked of suicide as if he were a character in the movies but she didn't think he would do it."

GREENGLASS ADMITS LIE

In a document in Greenglass' handwriting, hefraukly admits making statements he did not renember to be true, and directly lying to the F.B.L. He writes, describing a statement to the F.B.L.: "I stated that I met Gold in N. M. at 209 Hick St., my place. They told me that I had fold him to come back later because I didn't have it ready. I didn't remember this but I allowed it in the statement."

Thus he admits letting the F.B.I. put words in his mouth. Then he adds:

"But this I'll tell you, I can honestly say the information I gave Gold may be not at all what I said in the statement."

The language Greenglass uses throughout his written document is that of a man fabricating a story. "I made sure to tell the F.B.I.," "I established the approximate meeting place," "I definitely placed"—these are the kind of phrases he uses.

SUMMARY-Dr. Harold C. Urey, nuclear scientist, said after reading the transcript of the trial: "I found the Rosenberg testimony more believable than the Greenglass."

David Greenglass, a hysteric and a self-confessed liar, is the mun on whose word two persons have been sentenced to die.
