#### Morton Sobell - Ten Years Boilind Pars

(The intensified fight for his liberation. - National Conference in Mashington this Naturday. - A list with Morton Sobell's mother in Los Angeles.)

It is frightful to think that this victim of reging reaction and the cold war, Morton Sobell, has languabled behind prison bars for ten years, first in Alcatras, and recently in Atlanta, for a crime he never committed. Forton Sobell, a forgotten person?!

It is true that there are committees here and there in the country. From time to time there is an action, but public opinion in the country is far from sufficiently aroused. They have gotten accustomed to the idea. But there are things we dare never become accustomed to, and which it is a sin to forget for even one minute!

many times ten. The Sobell family - Helen, his wife, Mark, his son, and Rose, his mother, every day, every minute, they experience the hell of insecurity, of hope and anxiety and disappointment. His old mother wanders around the country and arounes and pleads for aid for her son, for her dear, innocent

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son - he must be saved. He has been away for ten unhappy years, sitting and waiting. Helen Sobell does not rest. Her cries of anguish, her appeal to wipe out the shame of conviction should reach every heart.

Morton is very brave - his dear ones report - he tries to console us. He has not lost his faith in people. He knows that outside the jail walls there are many friends. He has already studied the entire jail library. Today/Would be a scientist, a researcher, which he dreamed about. In the jail he is working in a weaving plant. It helps him pass the time.

A proud, suffering mother sits near me. She cays not enough is being done. People forget - that a person is behind bare. She takes a few letters out of her purse and reads:

"Mark! (his son) In the sixth grade already. I recall when I was his age. 1923-1960. Who could have predicted such a change in the world. When a plane flew by people would rush to the windows. Now look at Asia and Africa. Who would droam this. Three wonderful decades. And one of them I languished behind bars! It is unbelievable, thrk! It is difficult to draw this picture for him. When I was in Alcatraz I didn't even see him. It is often difficult to conceive reality.

Once a month - his mother says - we can see him. So we take turns, Helen and I. Mark is 11 already. He is beginning to understand the explanations. In Atlanta Penitentiary he is permitted to enter. He sees Morton, but it is difficult to tell what a child is thinking. He is 11 years old, but he matured before his time. He does a great deal of thinking.

The Sobell mother suffers for the whole family. She doesn't give up even when her feet give out. But when she is surrounded by friends and active workers, she is rejuvenated. Recently she came to Los Angeles as a guest of the local Morton Sobell Committee. The organization in this city represents the entire States of California, Arizona and Nevada. It is quite active. At the banquet in honor of

Rose Sobell, it was stated that the broad "clemency action" for Monton Sobell will come to a climax with a big mass meeting of delegates from the whole country in Washington, on November 19th, 20th and 21st. The President will be visited and a petition submitted.

Christmas is the traditional ammesty period and it is hoped that after 10 years in jail Morton Sobell deserves to be freed. Morton Sobell, the innocent victim, who is still young enough to serve his country and his people with knowledge and faithfulness! After all, they have just freed people who confessed to their guilt (Klaus Fuchs and Allan Nun May).

Prominent Americans, of all walks of life, are working for Norton's liberation. Among them are: Norman Thomas, Rodger Baldwin, Reverend Fritchman, Dr. Harold Urey, Carlton Bills, innumerable rabbis, civic and union leaders, and others.

It was learned, recently, that the fight for Sobell's liberation was joined by the well-known Negro Hinister and courageous fighter against racism, Dr. Hartin Luther King.

Morton Sobell is well-informed about everything that happens outside the jail walls. His is deeply concerned over the fact that fascism, the swastikes are not viewed with the necessary alarm. They are too lenient with former fascists. They try to white-wash them, to justify their acts and even to picture them to the American people as patriots of their country. Here is what Morton Sobell wrote in a letter to his mother:

"I see that they are making a movie about the faccict von Braun. They are making a hero of the creator of the German V-2" rocket. Von Braun's explanation was: Germany was his fatherland and it was his duty to help her! Such is the moral standard of society today. The murder of six million Jews is not included in the picture. Germany was his country and this explains everything. The time will come when such morality will no longer be acceptable and people will live with a morality which will not justify barbarism because of the accident of birth!"

I reread this paragraph. I listened to the patient believing mother and I believed that Morton Sobell, the victim of the frightful period of McCarthyism, will soon be free. Together with his wife and child, with his wonderful mother and all his friends throughout the country and throughout the world, with joy and faith, he will work for a new life, with a new, humane morality of justice and peace.

The clemency action, on November 19th, 20th, and 21st, and the gathering in Washington, D.C., dare not remain the activity of a committee or committees - it must permeate organizations, unions, clubs and rearouse the need for significant action - visit Congressmen, write to the Precident, invite speakers from the local Morton Sobell committees and raise as much financial support as possible - in order to advortise widely the new possibilities for the freeing of Morton Sobell.

The Communist Party, USA, has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.


The "Daily Worker" is a former East Coast communist newspaper which ceased publication on January 13, 1958.

BS T-3 advised on February 5, 1958 that RACHEL BUCKMAN was one of the leaders of the Dorchester group of the CP and was active therein as of March, 1957.

#### SALLY CHRISTIANSON, 117 Gladstone Street, East Boston - 20

BS T-4 advised on February 28, 1956 that SALLY CHRISTIANSON was then a current member of the Boston Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), but due to family responsibilities, she attended branch meetings infrequently. BS T-4 advised on July 29, 1958 that as of July, 1958 SALLY CHRISTIANSON was a member of the Boston Branch of the SWP.

BS T-5 advised on October 31, 1960 that the West Ballroom of the Shoreham Hotel, Connecticut Avenue and Calvert Street, N.W., Washington, D. C., had been reserved for the Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL for November 18, 19 and 20, 1960.

BS T-5 furnished a brochure which dealt with the weekend of November 18, 19 and 20, 1960 and was entitled, "A Convening of Americans United in the Request that MORTON SOBELL be Granted a Commutation of Sentence During the Traditional Christmas Amnesty Period."

In the above mentioned brochure, it was shown that one Reverend JOHN PAUL JONES, Ashfield, Massachusetts, was listed as one of the honored speakers.

The Boston Sunday Herald, a weekly newspaper published in Boston, Massachusetts, on page 12, carried the following article:

#### "Ashfield Minister Joins Plea to Free Atom Spy Sobell

"Washington (AP) - A Massachusetts clergyman said Saturday the release of MORTON SOBELL could be a work of healing and redemption for America."

"The Rev. JOHN PAUL JONES, Ashfield, Mass., was one of the speakers at a banquet attended by persons urging commutation of sentence for SOBELL, now in the 11th year of a 30-year sentence after conviction on the charge of conspiracy to commit espionage.

"SOBELL, tried in 1951 with atom spies JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, has maintained innocence. He is now in the Atlant2 federal prison.

"Backers of the appeal for SOBELL say 1,200 W.S. Glergymen are urging a commutation of sentence for him. Representatives of the clergy group will take an appeal to the White House Monday asking a presidential commutation for SOBELL during the traditional Christmas amnesty period."

LOUIS BUDENZ, a former member of the Communist Party, in his book, "Men Without Faces" on page 217 identifies one Reverend ELLIOT WHITE as a Communist Party member who was recruited by BUDENZ. BUDENZ also states that Rev. WHITE was the author of a letter asking thousands of Protestant ministers to contribute to the Red Defense Funds.

HERBERT PHILBRICK, a former member of the Communist Party, while testifying on July 6, 1953 before the House Committee on Un-American Activities, named Reverend ELLIOT WHITE as a member of the Communist Party.

#### II. <u>MISCELLANEOUS</u>

Informants, who have knowledge of phases of Communist Party activity in the Boston area, advised in November, 1960 that they had no information pertaining to any recent activity on the part of this organization.

#### APPENDIX:

#### Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL

"Following the execution of atomic spies ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG in June, 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon MORTON SOBELL, the ROSENBERGS' codefendent. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG case - a communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953 and 'then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL in the ROSENBERG case'...

("Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" dated January 2, 1957, issued by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, page 60.)

In September, 1954, the name "National Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL" appeared on literature issued by the Committee. In March, 1955, the current name, "Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL," first appeared on literature issued by the Committee.

The 1959-1960 Borough of Manhattan telephone directory lists the "Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL" as being located at 940 Broadway, New York, New York.

A source advised on March 11, 1953 that the Boston Committee to Secure Clemency in the Rosenberg Case had its inception in June, 1952.

Another source stated on February B, 1954 that during the fall of 1953 the Boston Committee to Secure Clemency in the Rosenberg Case changed its name to the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee. This same source stated on March 5, 1954 that the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee was last active in the Greater Boston, Massachusetts area in July, 1953.

A third source advised in February, 1958 that the Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell was activated during the first part of 1958 in Boston.

This third source stated that the aims and purposes of the above-captioned committee were to gain the release from Alcatraz of MORTON SOBELL, to gain his freedom and cancellatics of the remaining years of his sentence and to protest the conviction and confinement of MORTON SOBELL.

The first source stated on March 11, 1953 that the Boston Committee to Secure Clemency in the Rosenberg Case had been dominated and controlled by the Communist Party since the inception of this committee in June, 1952.

The Communist Party, USA, has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.

The third source indicated in February, 1953 that the Community Party had ignored MORTON SOBELL and referred to his appeal as "too hot for them to handle" lest their public support of his case cause embarrassment to the Communist Party.

This third source advised in January, 1959 and again in January, 1960 that the last meeting of the Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL took place in Sharon, Massachusetts on July 12, 1953.

"About 250 people attended the cocktail party and it was noted that everyone seemed to be drinking although no one appeared to be drinking to excess. The cocktail party was social in nature and the banquet in the West Ballroom of the Hotel Shoreham was scheduled to commence at 7:00 P.M., but did not start until about 7:30 P.M. About 300 people attended the banquet and the seating area consisted of a head table for the Chairman and speakers and circulars tables for the other guests, which tables accommodated about 10 people cach.

"There were four women representatives from the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom from Philadelphia, Pa., present at the banquet, but their identities were not known.

"GERHARD VAN ARKEL, Attorney, Washington, D.C., was listed in the program as Chairman, but he was not present and it was announced that he had sent a telegram stating that important legal work conflicted with his attendance at the banquet. He was replaced as Chairman by an attorney from Chicago who is affiliated with the National Lawyers Guild and whose name is STEPHEN LOVE.

"The following individuals were listed on the program as speakers but did not speak:

"BURNS CHALMERS, American Friends Service Committee, Washington, D. C.

"HAROLD A. CRANEFIELD, Attorney, Detroit, Michigan, who was not present.

"Rabbi JACOB J. WEINSTEIN, National Chairman of the Committee for Labor Israel, Chicago, Illinois, who was not present.

\*LOVE stated that he was very familiar with the MORTON SCHELL case and he feels deeply that SCHELL was innocent of the charge of conspiracy to commit espionage. LOVE said that if he had the slightest doubt of SCHELL's guilt he would not have associated himself with the SCHELL case.

"LOVE then introduced prominent clergymen who are among the sponsors of the National Committee for Clemency for MORTON SCHELL. He introduced about 15 or 20 ministers, among whom was Rev. PETER MC CORMICK, who was Protestant chaplain at Alcatraz Prison when SCHELL was a prisoner there. Each of the ministers stood up and acknowledged his introduction.

It was noted that there were no Negro ministers introduced and it was further noted that only about four or five Negroes were in attendance at any of the affairs over the weekend of November 19, 20 and 21, 1960.

"Chairman LOVE then introduced the principal speaker," Rev. JOHN PAUL JONES of Ashfield, Massachusetts, whom the Chairman referred to as a great religious leader.


JONES said that he has been following the MORTON SCHELL case very closely although he does not know MORTON SCHELL personally and, in fact, has never seen SCHELL. JONES continued that he did not believe that SCHELL was guilty of conspiring to commit espionage as had been charged by the United States Government.

JONES recalled that he had been stationed in Brooklyn, New York, at the time of MORTON SCHELL's arrest, and that HELEN SCHELL, the wife of MORTON SCHELL, contacted him and asked his opinion as to how she should arrange for her husband's legal defense. He added that he helped her in securing legal aid and also said prayers on behalf of MORTON SCHELL.


"Mrs. HELEN SCBELL was the last speaker of the evening. She said that she wanted to contact President EISEN-HCWER and persuade EISENHOWER to grant executive clemency to MORTON SCBELL so that he may be home with his family for Christmas and eventually have his name cleared completely.

"Mrs. HELEN SCBELL also said that she wanted to thank the wonderful people who had attended the banquet from such places as Massachusetts, New York City, Buffalo, New York, Cleveland, Chio, and San Francisco, California, and she particularly wanted to thank the Washington, D.C., Sobell Committee, which was the host committee, in arranging the National Appeal for Freedom for MORTON SCELL. The banquet ended at approximately 11:00 P.M.

"Arrangements had been made for Attorney LOVE to appear on STEVE ALLISON's radio show during the last evening of November 19, 1960, and, accordingly, LOVE left the banquet before it was over and Mrs. HELEN SCHELL acted as Chairman for the balance of the banquet.



"At 2:00 P.M., Sunday, November 20, 1960, a panel on the 'Facts and Issues in the Sobell Case' was scheduled in the West Ballroom of the Hotel Shoreham. This was the same room in which the banquet had been held the previous evening. Approximately 200 individuals were present at this affair and chairs were arranged in rows to accommodate those in attendance.



"Although the program described the Sunday afternoon affair as a panel, it actually consisted of a talk by Professor THOMAS EMERSON of Yale University Law School.

"The Chairman of the Sunday afternoon session was a minister from Seattle, Washington, whose identity was not learned.

"EMERSON, in his opening remarks, said that he did not know MORTON SCHELL personally and did not know enough about MORTON SCHELL to decide whether or not SCHELL was guilty of conspiracy to commit espionage as charged. EMERSON added, however, that he disagreed with the method employed by the United States authorities to return MORTON SCHELL from Mexico for prosecution.

"He said that MORTON SCBELL had been in Mexico on vacation with his family and had rented an apartment in his true name. While SCBELL and his family occupied this spartment, Agents of the Mexican Government broke into the apartment, beat up SCBELL, and hauled him off to prison. Subsequently, the Agents of the Mexican Government turned over SCBELL, his wife, and children to the United States immigration officials in the United States - Mexico border, at which place the FBI took SCBELL into custody, handcuffed him, and took him to jail.

"EMERSON said that he disagreed with the abduction of SCBELL by the Mexican Agents and he also disagreed with the Mexican Agents physically beating SCBELL even when SCBELL did not put up any resistance.

"EMERSON continued that SCBELL has now served almost ten years in prison of his thirty-year sentence. He said that it is customary, when an individual has been a model prisoner, that he be eligible for parole at the expiration of one-third of his sentence, but in SCBELL's case, even though he has been a model prisoner, he apparently has no hope for parole.

"EMERSON said that as far as he knows MORTON SCBELL has exhausted every legal avenue to obtain his freedom and EMERSON knows of no other legal means open to SCBELL to obtain his freedom. EMERSON said that the United States Supreme Court has turned down SCBELL's plea for a retrial.

"EMERSON claimed that, even though the United States Government made a mistake in convicting MORTON SCHELL, it cannot now admit this mistake because such an admission would imply that JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were not guilty of conspiracy to commit espionage for which they were executed. EMERSON said that the principal witness against SOBELL, MAX ELITCHER, was a notorious liar and that SCHELL's conviction should not be based on the testimony of such an individual.

"EMERSON talked for approximately one hour and was followed by Mrs. HELEN SCBELL. She said it was true that she and her husband went to Mexico, but she claimed that they went there on vacation and rented an apartment there in their true names. She did admit that she and her husband went to two other places in Mexico where they stayed under assumed names, but she claimed that this did not indicate guilt or flight. Mrs. SCBELL said that when she and her husband went to Mexico they did not know that they were under suspicion and that they had not been subpoensed. She said that she and her husband were not running away because as far as they knew they had nothing to run from.

"A question and answer period followed and one of the questions was why MORTON SCHELL failed to testify at his

"trial. HELEN SOBELL answered this by saying that MORTON SOBELL, himself, wanted to testify but that his attorney advised against his testifying because of the prejudiced atmosphere of the times. She added that if MORTON SOBELL knew then what he knows now he would have insisted on testifying on his own defense.

"Following the above meeting, approximately 100 of those in attendance rode in three or four chartered local Washington, D.C., buses to the vicinity of the White House where they participated in a prayer meeting outside the White House. This meeting was led by Rev. ALVA TOMPKINS who led a prayer that President EISENHOWER would grant executive clemency to MONTON SCHELL, which was followed by a silent prayer by those present. Following the prayer meeting, those participating paraded in front of the White House for a short time. Those participating in the parade carried no signs and created no disturbance. The prayer meeting and demonstration ended at about 6:00 P.M.

"Only a few individuals planned to remain through Monday, November 21, 1950, to contact congressmen and senators on behalf of MORTON SCHELL's release.

Ministers and two lawyers attempted to see President Elsenhower at the White House to present him with the volumes of signatures including 1500 elergymen who were requesting freedom for Morton Sobell. Since the delegation was unable to see the President they asked for a member of his staff with the result that because one of the eight ministers in the group was acquainted with the White House charkin the group met with the chaplain and gave him the volumes of signatures, which the chaplain, Reverend Fox, said he would refer to the Department of Justice.

Below Sobell spoke of the growd at this Washington, B.C. rally and how inspiring it was to see them marching around the White House. She also mentioned that while in Alcatram Morton Sobell had not been permitted to receive Christmas packages but after his transfer to the Atlanta penitentiary he was permitted to receive Christmas packages, a bible and books. Helen Sobell said that she and her two children planned to visit Morton Sobell for two hours on Christmas and two hours on New Year's.

A collection was made but the amount realized was not ennounced. A plea was made for volunteers to help the Philadelphia Sobell Committee in its work but no one was observed to respond.

### THILAUELPHIA SOBELL COMMITTEE

Philadelphia Police Department, advised that by letter dated 10/10/52, the Philadelphia Police Department had received notification of a meeting under the sponsorship of the Philadelphia Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case to be held in Philadelphia on 10/11/52.

On 4/14/53, the Supervisor, Division of Solicitations, Department of Public Instructions, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 812 Blackstone Building, Harrisburg, Fs., advised that by letter dated 2/17/53, JEAN D. FRANTJIS, as Executive Secretary of the Philadelphia Committee to Secure Justice in the Bosenberg Case, Fost Office Box 805, Philadelphia, Pa., had advised the Division of Solicitations that the Philadelphia Committee was an affiliate of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, and that the purpose of the local committee was to solicit money to be used to meet expenses in carrying on appeals in the Rosenberg Case and maintaining the Rosenberg children.

Literature issued by the Committee on the dates indicated reflects the following variations of the names of the Fhiladelphia Committee which have been utilised:

On 3/11/56, a source advised that the Thiladelphia Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case was being disbanded because of a lack of funds and a lack of activity on the part of the Committee.

On 4/8/58, this source advised that on 4/7/58, a meeting was held in Philadelphia to re-establish this Committee in Philadelphia, and that the Committee would be called the Philadelphia Sobell Committee.

Another source advised on 5/29/60, that the Philadelphia Sobell Committee continues to operate as a local affiliate of the Committee to Secure Justice for Norton Sobell. It is a non-membership organization which conducts its activities through a Planning Committee consisting of no set number of people, usually eight to twelve individuals.

SD T-4 advised on December 2, 1960, that he had received no information concerning any activity by the SDSC since the committee held its breakfast at the CUF in August, 1960.

SD T-4 advised on January 24, 1961, that he could furnish no information concerning recent activity on the part of the SDSC. SD T-4 stated that to the best of his knowledge, the SDSC has no regular membership and holds meetings only on occasions when the SORELL movement needs to raise funds or when someone such as SORELL's wife comes to San Diego for a speaking engagement. He said it is his understanding that announcements of pending activities of the SDSC Le usually made at the CUF meetings or meetings of the SDCCP.

SD T-1 advised on December 2, 1960, that MILTON IESSNER is chairman of the SDSC. SD T-1 said that it is his understanding that the SDSC has no regular membership but that it announces any scheduled activities through meetings of either the CUF or of the SDB-SWP. SD T-1 further said that the SDSC holds no regularly scheduled meetings, but only has meetings on isolated occasions when some dignitary of the Sobell Committee comes to the San Diego area to visit or speak, or when the national Sobell Committee needs additional funds. On January 16, 1961, SD T-1 advised he could furnish no information concerning recent activity on the part of the SDSC.

SD T-3 advised on January 23, 1961, that he could furnish no information concerning recent activity on the part of the SDSC. SD T-3 said that the SDSC is a loosely-knit organization headed by MILTON LESSNER; that the SDSC has no

organized membership, but rather announces at meetings of the SDCCP or at meetings of the CUF activities which it intends to hold. He also advised that the SDSC seldom holds any functions or has any meetings except in the event the national committee needs funds or someone such as HELEN SORELL visits in San Diego.

It was further noted that over 350 clergymen had joined the 'appeal to the President on behalf of MORTON SOBELL' which was the best response from any area in the U.S. It was noted that the foregoing activity had cost the committee \$592 and it further noted that the expense of the delegation of clergymen and representatives to the 'freedom week end' would be \$500.

It then noted that the above activities had left the committee 'strapped and in debt' and an appeal was made for funds.



On November 16, 1960, a source furnished a letter received by the source on the letterhead of Committee to Secure. Justice for Morton Schell. The letter read in part as follows:

#### "Dear Fellow Lawyer:

"I would like to call your attention to a Washington event of possible interest to lawyers.

"There has been an increasing belief that an injustice was done in the case of Morton Sobell, now in his lith year of confinement and under a 30-year sentence imposed on a charge of conspiracy to commit espionage in the Rosenberg case. An independent inquiry by a group that included Dr. Reinhold Niebuhr of the Union Theological Seminary and Professor Edmond Cahn of the New York University Law School resulted in the conclusion that the case against Mr. Sobell was 'vague in content and slender in proof' and that the sentence should be commuted."

The third paragraph stated that Professor THOMAS I. EMERSON of the Yale Law School had made a study of the case and will present his views in a panel discussion at Washington, D.C. on November 20, 1960. It mentioned that this was part of a national appeal for freedom of MORTON SOBELL. The author of the letter, MALCOLM SHARP, Professor of Law, University of Chicago, maintains in the letter that it was a matter close to his heart and he hoped that the addressees would avail themselves of the opportunity to hear the case discussed. The source was of the opinion that the letter was sent to the attorneys on the Lawyer's Directory.



# AMERICAN FORUM FOR SCCIALIST EDUCATION, Also Known as American Forum

According to an article appearing in the May 13, 1957 issue of the "Daily Worker", page 1, column 2, A. J. MUSTE, "well known pacifist," announced the formation of the American Forum for Socialist Education (AFSE). According to this article, the American Forum seeks to promote "study and serious untrammeled political discussions among all elements that think of themselves as related to historic socialist and labor traditions, values and objectives. ...however deep and bitter their differences may have been."

This article reflects that a forty member National Committee had been established and, according to MUSTE, these persons served as individuals and not as delegated representatives of any group.

MUSTE, according to this article, stated that the American Forum is not a membership organization and does not propose to promote united action by various parties or groups, mergers or new organizations.

The article reflects that among other purposes, the AFSE seeks to call attention to the various publications of the groups whose people engage in discussion; to publish bulletins or pamphlets; to organize regional and national conferences; contribute to the building of new morale and ethic, a spirit of fair play, labor militancy, determination and hope among the progressive and radical forces in this country.

The "Daily Worker" is an East Coast Communist daily newspaper which suspended operation on January 13, 1958.

On May 24, 1960, Reverend ALVA TOUPKINS, Chairman of the AFSE in Chicago, Illinois,

TONPKINS stated that while the AFSE originated in New York, no guidance or control has ever been exercised by the AFSE in New York over the AFSE in Chicago; however, the AFSE in Chicago has been guided by the precepts of the New York group.

TOMPKINS stated that the AFSE is a broad forum which includes members from various "liberal groups" on its executive committee including such persons as FRED FINE and JACK SPIEGEL.

According to a source, FRED FINE is a former member of the National Committee, Communist Party, USA (CP), who resigned in October, 1958, from the CP because of policy differences.

According to a second source, JACK SPIEGEL was a member of a shoe workers group in the Johnstone Section, CP of Illinois, until the latter part of 1955, at which time he officially dropped out of the Party because he had signed a Non-Communist affidavit with the National Labor Relations Board.

The CP, USA, has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.

#### CHICAGO COMMITTEE TO DEFEND THE BILL OF RIGHTS

The Chicago Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights (CCDBR) maintains headquarters in Room 811, 189 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

A source, on October 31, 1960, advised that the CCDBR was formally launched as an organization at a meeting held in Chicago, Illinois on October 26, 1960. Officers named at this meeting were Rev. WILLIAM T. BAIRD, Executive Director, and RICHARD CRILEY, Executive Secretary. The stated purpose of this new organization was the abolishment of the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA).

Concerning the Rev. WILLIAM T. BAIRD, it is noted that a letterhead of the Midwest Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (MCPFB) dated May 19, 1960, identifies BAIRD as Honorary Chairman of the MCPFB.

Concerning RICHARD CRILEY, it is to be noted that CARL NELSON, 3093 West North Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, on May 5, 1959, appeared before a Subcommittee of the HCUA at a hearing held on that date in Chicago, Illinois. During the course of his testimony, CARL NELSON admitted to Communist Party (CP) membership for the period from 1934 - 1949, and during the course of his testimony advised the Committee that RICHARD CRILEY was known to him as a member of the Section Committee of the CP of the Packinghouse Industry, while he, NELSON, was a member of the CP.

The first source, on October 27, 1960, advised that RICHARD CRILEY had commented that the Chicago Committee to Defend Democratic Rights (CCDDR) "is no more" and that soon a meeting of the CCDDR "associates" will be held and the CCDDR formally dissolved. All assets of the CCDDR will be turned over to the CCDBR and the new organization will continue to utilize the same office space, mailing address, and other facilities of the CCDDR.

A second source advised on October 28, 1960 as follows:



CRILEY noted that for the first time since the Civil Rights Congress (CRC) there has been created a nationally co-ordinated drive against the "eroding of the First Amendment in the American way of life." The concentration point in this drive is the HCUA since it is the "arch that ties all other things together."

It is to be noted that the CP, USA and the CRC are organizations which have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.

CHICAGO COMMITTEE TO DEFEND DEMOCRATIC RIGHTS, formerly known as the Chicago Joint Defense Committee to Defeat the Smith Act

The Chicago Committee to Defend Democratic Rights (CCDDR) maintains offices in Room 811, 189 West Madison Street, Chicago 2, Illinois.

A source advised on April 15, 1958, that the Chicago Joint Defense Committee to Defeat the Smith Act (CJDC) was formed by the Communist Party (CP) in March, 1956.

A second source advised on July 17, 1958, that at a working conference of the CJDC held on June 8, 1958, at Chicago, Illinois, the name of the CJDC was changed to the CCDDR. The purpose of the CCDDR, according to its "Statement of Principles and Organization" was to "....defend and extend the human rights embodied in the Bill of Rights....and to put an end to the political and racial persecutions which threaten American democracy today."

The second source further advised on May 18, 1960, that as of May, 1960, the CCDDR continued to function within the framework of its stated principles and that in accordance with its "Statement of Principles and Organization" had a number of "Working Committees" which included the Chicago Smith Act Families Committee, South Side Freedom Committee and Taft-Hartley Working Committee. The source further stated that as of May, 1960, RICHARD CRILEY was serving as the Executive Secretary of the CCDDR.

RICHARD CRILEY, according to a third source, was a member of the State Committee, CP of Illinois, as of May, 1960.

The CP, USA has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.

#### CHICAGO COUNCIL OF AMERICAN SOVIET FRIENDSHIP

made available in January, 1954, the "First Annual Report CCASF", an undated publication which stated that the Chicago Council of American Soviet Friendship (CCASF) was incorporated in July, 1943. This document stated, "The Council's affiliation with the National Council of American Soviet Friendship (NCASF) was validated August 11, (1943). The present name was adopted to conform to standard national practice. It should be noted, however, that the Chicago Council is entirely autonomous; the government of its affairs rests exclusively in the hands of its Chicago Executive Board."



This same source also advised on May 25, 1960, that the CCASF remains affiliated with the NCASF for the purpose of implementing its stated aims of peaceful co-existence and friend-ship with the U. S. S. R., but continues to consider itself autonomous in the government of its affairs and program for achieving these aims. Although the CCASF considers itself autonomous in this regard, the leaders of the CCASF are frequently in contact with and its program closely follows that of the NCASF.

The NCASF has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.





## CHICAGO SOBELL COMMITTEE, Also Known As Chicago Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell

On September 27, 1960, a source stated that the address of the above captioned organization is Room 309-1, 208 North Wells Street, Chicago, Illinois.

Source advised on May 23, 1960, that the Chicago Sobell Committee, which is also known as Chicago Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, and was formerly known as Chicago Rosenberg-Sobell Committee and Chicago Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, is a small group of volunteers who do Sobell fund raising and programing in the Chicago area. The Chicago Committee, since its inception in 1952, has been an affiliate of the Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, which is also known as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell and was formerly known as the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, with headquarters in New York.

Source said that to his knowledge this committee has no full-time employees nor any volunteers who have national positions or titles. DAVID SOLTKER and SYLVIA LEVINSON appear to be the guiding forces behind this committee and they are assisted by GERTRUDE SOLTKER, wife of DAVID SOLTKER, and former chairman of this committee who continues to be active in Sobell activities.

Another source advised during May 1960, that the Chicago Sobell Committee maintains a bank account at the Amalgamated Trust and Savings Bank, 111 South Dearborn, Chicago, Illinois, and that DAVID SOLTKER is listed in this bank account as the Secretary of the Chicago Sobell Committee.





# FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE CHICAGO CHAPTER

A source advised in October, 1960, that the Chicago Chapter of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC) was formed during the summer of 1960 at Chicago, Illinois, under the direct guidance and leadership of RICHARD CRILEY, a member of the State Committee, Communist Party (CP) of Illinois. The Chicago Chapter, FPCC, maintains no headquarters at Chicago, but receives mail through Post Office Box 4555, Chicago 80, Illinois. Its meetings are held in public halls or homes of individual members.

A second source, in August, 1960, furnished a leaflet entitled, "What is Really Happening in Cuba?", distributed by the FPCC, Post Office Box 4555, Chicago 80, Illinois. The aims and purposes of the FPCC as set forth in this leaflet include the following: "To disseminate the truth, to combat untruth; to publish and distribute factual information which the United States mass media suppresses. In general, to contribute to foundations for peace, friendship and understanding between ourselves and the Cuban people." The leaflet reflects the FPCC plans to accomplish these aims: "By mailing of informational bulletins; organizing public meetings and forums; providing speakers, movies and slides for meetings of interested organizations; placing ads in newspapers; to desit Cuba and see for themselves what conditions really are."



This same source advised that as of October, 1960, this Committee continued to exist, with the same aims and purposes and under the same direction.

The CP, USA has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.

#### FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

The April 6, 1960 edition of the "New York Times", a daily New York City newspaper, carried a full page advertisement captioned "What is Really Happening in Cuba?" The article maintained that the United States press has made certain charges against Cuba which are not true and the Fair Play for Cuba Committee was organized to tell the truth about Cuba in the interest of fair play. The advertisement closes with a note which states "This public appeal for fair play for Cuba has the support of a group of thinking individuals holding a variety of political persuasions, representing no one but themselves, linked here by a single common concern for the overriding principle of justice, which is always an issue whenever partisan interests clash with simple truth."

# COMMITTEE FOR FREEDOM OF THE PRESS, also known as Illinois Committee for Freedom of the Press

A source advised on May 23, 1960, that the Illinois Committee for Freedom of the Press (ICFP) was formed in the latter part of November, 1951, and then, as now, was composed of a band of Communist Party (CP) members and sympathizers, who activate when fund raising drives and subscription campaigns are necessary for the welfare of "The Worker".

Another source advised on May 23, 1960, that the Committee for Freedom of the Press, also known as the Illinois Committee for Freedom of the Press, cannot be separated from the CP itself. It is not an organization as such with a program, elected officers, offices, etc. In fact, it is an arm of the CP and in the main is used by the CP to further the subscription drives of "The Worker" and for the CP to utilize as a name only to sponsor CP meetings which otherwise would have to be held under the announced sponsorship of the CP.

This source advised in May, 1960, that the purpose of the use of the name Freedom of the Press Committee, instead of the CP, at meetings is to increase attendance by those individuals who otherwise would not attend if the meetings were in the announced sponsorship of the CP.

The CP, USA has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.

"The Worker" is an East coast Communist weekly newspaper.

#### ILLINOIS COMMITTEE FOR PEACEFUL ALTERNATIVES

Source, on May 20, 1960, advised that the Illinois Committee for Peaceful Alternatives (ICPA) was founded at the St. James Methodist Church, 4611 South Ellis Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, on May 29, 1950. Source stated that this committee was once an affiliate of the now defunct National Committee for Peaceful Alternatives (NCPA).

Source further advised that the ICPA was composed of intellectual and religious workers and its program called for negotiated peace and for peaceful settlement of all differences between nations. The committee advocated more friendship internationally and was opposed to the so-called "cold war" aggressive foreign policy of the United States.

The same source, on January 6, 1961, advised that the South Shore Committee for Peaceful Alternatives (SSCPA), the last remaining division of the ICPA, dissolved on December 18, 1960. Source said that DOROTHY HAYES was Chairman of the SSCPA at the time of its dissolution.

During July, 1960, another source advised that DOROTHY HAYES, as of that date, was a member of the State Committee of the Communist Party (CP) of Illinois.

that the NCPA was formed as a result of the Mid-Century Conference for Peace held in Chicago about May, 1950, with the initiating force being the Committee for Peaceful Alternatives (CPA) of New York. According to the source, subsequently local chapters were formed in various states, including Illinois, and the NCPA became known as the CPA. This national organization continued to exist in Chicago until about 1955, when it became defunct. According to the source, the stated purposes of the organization generally were to promote peace through negotiation, to prevent atomic wars, and promote peaceful coexistence. It was a broad cass organization consisting of people interested in peace, including ministers, intellectuals, scientists, etc. The organization was infiltrated by and used, but never controlled by the CP.

The CP, USA has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.

#### NATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD CHICAGO CHAPTER

A source advised on June 22, 1960, that it was his understanding that the National Lawyers Guild (NLG) was formed around 1936 in New York City and that the Chicago Chapter of the NLG (CCNLG) was formed shortly thereafter, possibly in 1937, by a group of liberal progressive lawyers in protest against the non-liberal, non-progressive American Bar Association. The CCNLG has no established headquarters but occasionally uses the return addresses of its officials on literature. The current CCNLG President is PEARL M. HART, who is also a member of the NLG National Executive Board.



The CP, USA has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.

#### NATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD

The National Lawyers Guild has been cited as a Communist front which "is the forewest legal bulwark of the Communist Party, its front organizations, and controlled unions" and which "since its inception has never failed to rally to the legal defense of the Communist Party and individual members thereof, including known espionage agents".

(Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 3123 on the National Lawyers Guild, September 21, 1950, originally released September 17, 1950.)

The Communist Party, USA, has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.

#### MIDWEST COMMITTEE FOR PROTECTION OF FOREIGN BORN

The Midwest Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (MCPFB) maintains offices at Room 406, 189 West Madison Street, Chicago 2, Illinois.

MCPFB was founded at a conference held in Chicago, Illinois, on May 25, 1947, and that the MCPFB was to operate as the Midwest organization of the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (ACPFB).

On May 5, 1955, a source advised that in a "Statement of Principles" issued in April, 1955, by the MCPFB, it was noted that "The purpose of the Midwest Committee shall be to seek to perpetuate for the foreign born the fundamental concepts of equality regardless of race, color, creed, nationality, political belief or place of birth, and to preserve the basic ideals of liberty and hospitality which serve as the guarantees of democracy for all Americans."

A second source, as of May 19, 1960, advised that the MCPFB continued to function as the Midwest organization of the ACPFB and still adhered to its "Statement of Frinciples" last published in 1955.

The ACPFB and the CP, USA, have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.



#### SOCIALIST WORKERS PARTY CHICAGO BRANCH

A source advised on July 12, 1960, that it was his understanding that the currently active Chicago Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) was one of the founding branches of the SWP at a 1938 Chicago Trotskyist Convention, and it follows the aims and principles of the SWP which maintains national headquarters in New York City.

Members of the Chicago Branch serve on the SWP National Committee and per capita membership dues and a sustaining fund quota are sent by this branch on a monthly basis to SWP National Headquarters.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.



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



brochure containing the program for the "Freedom Week" scheduled to be held in Washington, D.C. This brochure described the "Freedom Week" as a "convening of Americans united in the request that MORTON SOBELL be granted a commutation of sentence during the traditional Christmas amnesty". This brochure also contained a statement that the Central Labor Union Council of Minneapolis was on record favoring a new trial for MORTON SOBELL.

The November 6, 1960, issue of "The Worker" on page 12, in reporting on the "Freedom Week" stated in part as follows:

Widespread appeals in behalf of freedom for Morton Sobell, imprisoned scientist, will be climaxed by a national gathering in Washington, D.C., Nov. 19-21.

The participants are seeking a Presidential commutation during the traditional Christmas amnesty season this year.

An appeal to President Eisenhower, signed by more than 1,000 clergymen of different faiths, will be presented at the White House.

Those joining in the weekend activities will hold a sundown prayer for Sobell's Freedom at the White House on Sunday, Nov. 20.

Monday, Nov. 21, will be spent by delegations visiting government officials to request action on Sobell's behalf.

Representative speakers will address a banquet at the Hotel Shoreham on Saturday, Nov. 19, to urge a commutation of sentence for Sobell, who is now in the 11th year of a 30-year sentence on the charge of "conspiracy to commit espionage". He was tried together with Ethel and Julius Rosenberg in 1951.

There will be a panel discussion at the Shoreham on Sunday, Nov. 20, featuring a presentation of "Facts and Issues in the Sobell Case".

"The Worker" is an East Coast Communist publication.

The "Minneapolis Morning Tribune", a metropolitan newspaper in the Twin City area, on November 17, 1960, on page 19, reported the following:

A group of 69 clergymen from the Twin Cities area have signed an appeal asking President Eisenhower to commute the 30-year sentence of convicted atom spy Morton Sobell, sponsors of the appeal said Wednesday.

The Rev. Kenneth Beck, pastor of Christ Methodist church, maplewood, will join the national delegation of clergymen who will present a national clergy appeal to the President during a Washington convocation Saturday through Monday.

The group asks for commutation, noting that Sobell "has served 10 years of a 30 - year sentence imposed during a height of national tensions in this country.

of the White House Police, advised that on that day a petition was given to Reverend FREDERICK FOX of the White House Staff asking for clemency or new trial for MORTON SOBELL.

Advised that this petition was presented to Reverend TOX by a group of 11 individuals and that KENNETH BECK of St. Paul, Minnesota, was one of the individuals presenting the petition.

On the same date

petition requesting the release of MORTON SOBELL had been given to him that date. This petition having 16 pages of names, included among the signers Reverend KENNETH BECK, 2500 Hudson Road, St. Paul, Minnesota.

The December 9, 1960, edition of the "Minneapolis Star", a metropolitan newspaper in the Twin Cities area, carried in its section of letters to the editor the following letter written by JEAN BRUST:

The Minnesota Sobell Committee would like to call to attention that Jack Soble who several years ago confessed to being a Soviet spy and the Dr. Robert Soble who is at present being accused of espionage are in no way connected with Morton Sobell.

Morton Sobell, who is now in his 11th year of imprisonment of a 30-year sentence, has steadfastly maintained his innocence of the conspiracy to commit espionage charge on which he was convicted in the Rosenberg trial. Not only has he maintained his innocence of this charge, but many eminent people in the United States and the rest of the world, who have studied the trial record of Morton Sobell, have become convinced that he is innocent. One of the supporters, Dr. Harold Urey, after reading the trial transcript said, "I am astounded at how little there was about Sobell in the trial. You cannot tell what he is even supposed to have done."
