#### VI. ACTIVITIES

The informant did not know the location of the meeting.

On September 17, 1960, Special Agents (SAs) of the FBI observed eight people enter the residence of ETHEL and JOSEPH WEICHBROD\*, 8321 Tahona Drive, Silver Spring, Maryland, between the hours of 7:24 p.m. and 8:23 p.m. Four of the eight were identified as DAVID HAMMOND\*, SARAH HAMMOND\*, Dr. IRVING WINIK\* and HELEN WINIK\*.

At 7:47 p.m., an unidentified couple parked a blue Rambler with 1960 District of Columbia License ER 460 and enter WEICHBROD's\* home.

The District of Columbia Motor Vehicle Bureau Registration Book reflects that 1960 District of Columbia License ER 460 was registered to ABRAHAM BLOOM, # 3313 Harrell Street, Silver Spring, Maryland. BLOOM's wife is ANNE BLOOM.\*

At 7:36 p.m., SAs of the PBI observed an unidentified man and woman arrive in a gray Plymouth with 1960 Maryland License DJ 1399. They parked the car and entered WEICHBROD!s\* home.

that a 1960 Maryland License DJ 1399 was registered to DOROTHY TODD\* 24 Bryn Mawr, Glen Echo, Maryland.



On October 31, 1960, advised that the West Ballroom of the Shoreham Hotel, Connecticut Avenue and Calvert Street, N.W. had been reserved for the CSJMS for November 18, 19, 20, 1960. Arrangements were made by Mrs. SARAH HAMMOND\*, 8802 Glenville Road, Silver Spring, Maryland, and confirmed by TED JACOBS\*, Publicity Director of the CSJMS.

furnished a brochure dealing with the weekend of November 18, 19, 20 and 21, 1960, entitled, " A Convening of Americans United in the Request That MORTON SOBELL be Granted a Commutation of Sentence During the Traditional Christmas Amnesty Period." This brochure indicated that there would be a specially assembled national exhibit at the Shoreham Hotel from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m., Friday, November 18 through Sunday, November 20, 1960. On November 19, 1960, at 5:30 p.m., there was to be a reception at the Shoreham Hotel for visitors and honored guests. On the evening of November 19, 1960, there was to be a banquet. The chairman for which was to be GERHARD VAN ARKEL, Attorney, Washington, D.C. According to the brochure the invocation at the banquet was to be given by WELSON C. PIERCE, Palisades Community Church, Washington, D.C. BURNS CHALMERS of the American Friends Service Committee was listed as an honored speaker.

The brochure indicated that on Sunday, November 20, 1960, at 2 p.m., there was to be a panel discussion and a group discussion on the SOBELL case. On the evening of November 21, 1960, there was to be a sundown prayer at the White House.

The brochure stated that arrangements for the weekend were being made by Mrs. MORTON SOBELL# and Mrs. ROSE SOBELL# Co-chairman CSJMS, 940 Broadway, New York City.



On November 21, 1960, advised that at the CSJMS banquet on November 19, 1960, the invocation was given by Reverend NELSON C. PIERCE, Palisades Community Church, Washington, D.C.

The program listed GERHARD VAN ARKEL, Attorney, Washington, D.C., as Chairman of the banquet. However, it was announced that he was unable to be present and had sent a telegram explaining that conflicting legal work prevented his attendance.

On October 30, 1960, furnished a brochure which listed the following people from the Washington, D.C. area who as sponsors invited participation in a national appeal for freedom for MORTON SOBELL which was to be held in Washington, D.C., November 19-21, 1960:



WF T-11 advised during November, 1960, that there was an Executive meeting of the Jewish Mutual Aid Society (JMAS) at 4402 Georgia Avenue, N.W., on November 2, 1960. ETHEL WEICHBROD\* appeared at the meeting to ask for support for the SOBELL dinner.

After Mrs. WEICHBROD's\* departure, there was a discussion of the extent of support the JMAS should give the SOBELL affair. One member was very outspoken and wholeheartedly supported the activities of the SOBELL affair to the extent of changing another meeting. recommended that the JMAS give \$25 to the SOBELL Committee. The member who recommended the wholehearted support was told that it would have been good if they all felt the same way he did about the SOBELL affair, but the truth of the matter was that the majority of them did not feel that way. One member said that the people who wished to attend the SOBELL banquet may do so, but he saw no reason to postpone anyother activities because of it. Another member said that he had refused to go to the SOBELL banquet and was not ashamed to say so. This person seemed to resent that they had been invited to attend the affair to fill up the quota.





"The Washington Evening Star" December 19, 1960, page A 14, contained a letter to the editor signed AARON KATZ\*. The letter and the editors note following it read as follows:

#### "For Freeing SOBELL

"It is a tribute to our free America and to our traditions of liberty and love of justice, that thousands of clergymen, legal scholars, statesmen and educators should join together to urge a new trial or Christmas amnesty for MORTON SOBELL. Some commentators noted that with the release of GREENGLASS after 10 years in prison, it didn't make sense to keep SOBELL in jail.

"The Star pointed out editorially that the sentences were different and the circumstances were different: That SOBELL, affirming his innocence, had been sentenced to 30 years while GREENGLASS, admitting his guilt and making amends by 'talking' received a 14 year sentence.

"This point was well taken: the cases are different. But what kind of moral or ethical standards permits the release of one who provided, so he testified, the secret of the A-bomb for the Russians, while prolonging the imprisonment of another who, it is agreed, had no connection

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
whatever with atomic espionage? A man who, the trial record will confirm, was never even accused of giving or receiving any classified information?

"Legal students unite in the belief that SOBELL's conviction and sentence, during the Korean War at the height of McCarthyism, were based on emotion and hysteria rather than reason or justice. Each of five major law reviews which noted study of the case has shown that SOBELL did not receive justice. No law review has held otherwise.

"MORTON SOBELL is a prisoner on our conscience. He is a symbol of our yearning for justice. America's conscience can never be free while SOBELL remains in prison."

#### "AARON KATZ"

"(Editor's Note: SOBELL's conviction for espionage conspiracy was upheld by appellate courts and the Supreme Court. Appellate courts have rejected his appeals seven times and the Supreme Court has refused to review his case seven times.)"







These groups subsequently became the PPDC. On December 17, 1951, advised that the PPDC, during the years 1948 and 1949, was dominated and controlled by the CP of the District of Columbia.







"The Lamp", official organ of the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (ACPFB), in its August, 1949, issue reported that the Northwest Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (NWCPFB) was established at Seattle, Washington in July, 1949, as a part of the ACPFB. The ACPFB has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Mrs. BARBARA HARTLE, admitted member and officer of the Communist Party in Washington State during the period 1934 to 1954, testified on December 13, 1956, that the NWCPFB in 1954 changed its name and became the Washington Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (WCPFB); that the NWCPFB, the WCPFB and the ACPFB were parts of the same organization; that the WCPFB was controlled lock, stock and barrel by the Communist conspiracy; and that WCPFB officers MARION KINNEY, Executive Secretary; CECELIA CORR, Treasurer; and CLARA A. PAULSON, Recording Secretary, were each known to her as a "Communist".

A mimeographed letter disseminated in November, 1956, with the return address of the WCPFB, stated that, "The Committee is an unaffiliated non-partisan body devoted to the preservation of democratic rights of all foreign born residents of the United States. Its program is to arouse widespread and unceasing public protest against the application of the hundreds of unfair and inhumane provisions of the Walter-McCarran law... We work to effect repeal of the law and to secure enactment of a humane democratic immigration code. We help provide legal defense and public support to any foreign born person requesting our assistance."

The album containing the photographs secured on 11/19/60 during the photographic surveillance was exhibited to fourteen informants of the NYO active in CP or other Communist front groups in Manhattan, Bronx, Brooklyn and Queens sections of the CP, and who, by their activity and knowledge of CP personages in their area, could be expected to add to the number of persons already identified. It should further be noted that Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING JR., Atlanta, Georgia, and founder of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, a pro-integration organization having headquarters in Atlanta, was identified as a sponsor at a Washington appeal for Christmas amnesty for MORTON SOBELL.



Reference is made to Bureau letter, February 9, 1960, captioned as above, which instructed the Atlanta Office to review its files for any indication that an active committee affiliated with the National Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL was in existence in the Atlanta area.

By letter dated February 19, 1960, Atlanta Office set forth its recommendations in this regard pointing out there was insufficient evidence of a committee functioning to warrant investigation pursuant to Section 87E of the Manual of Instructions.

Considering all information furnished by and other sources in this area, it is still not apparent there is actually a committee operating and functioning in the Atlanta area. It is noted that HELEN SOBELL continues to visit her husband at the United States Penitentiary, Atlanta, and on the occasions of these visits has established contacts and associates, however, there is no indication to date they are operating as an adjutant of the national committee as indicated by the failure of this group to follow up in solicitations and appeals to some of the people that HELEN SOBELL has contacted such as It is believed that the majority of the persons

are those persons who apparently are Irlends and social acquaintances of those individuals with whom HFLEN SOBELL has spent several days on the occasions of visits to her husband.





"On Sunday May 7, 1961 at 2P.M. I attended a Concert at the Jordan Hall N.E. Conservatory. This was a meeting & concert sponsored by the United Shevchenko (Chev-en-ko) Committee of Boston. This was to celebrate the 100 year anniversary of the death of Tarus Shevchenko - poet painter - (composer?) and great revolutionary democrat of his time. Supposedly he dedicated his life and genius to the liberation of the Serfs against the Czarist Region in Russia and particularly to the peasants of the Ukraine.

"The program was opened by the Chorus of about 50 voices: The Ukrainian Leontovich Chorus, Womens Choral Ensemble & Newark N.J. 'Dnepro' Chorus. They were supposedly directed by F. O. Olchuk --however my impression was that the director was a substitute. The chorus sang one number -- which sounded like a medley and then left the stage.

"A couple of men were taken from the audience and brought to the platform and introduced as the permanent Ukraine delegates to the United Nations. Also a woman with them was removed to a seat in the first row left. I had expected to see her on the platform but the little man who got them to move to the platform sat with her until they finally all left (i.e. the delegates) the platform and returned to their original seats,

"There was a speaker first who gave a little history of Shevchenko. The program was to express also the great unity & friendship between the Ukrainian people & the U.S.S.R.

"During this time the two delegates sat on the platform -- The young one to the left of the older one -- quite erect and somewhat military -- never a muscle or foot or hand moved. You might say he put on his expression and then just wore it.





Washington, D.C., advised a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) that he has received information to the effect that David Andrews, Director of the Methodist Student Center, Boone, North Carolina, was planning to come to Washington, D.C., on June 29, 1961, if Morton Sobell has not been released from prison by that date. Andrews Indicated he will kneel outside the iron fence of the White House indefinitely, or until Sobell is released.

Morton Sobell was convicted in March, 1951, with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg in the Federal District Court, Southern District of New York, for conspiracy to commit espionage. The Rosenbergs were executed in June, 1953, and Sobell was sentenced to thirty years' imprisonment.

COMMUNISM INFILTRATION OF THE FIRST UNITARIAN CHURCH OF LOS ANGELES, 2936 West Eighth Street, Los Angeles, California

A source advised on May 3, 1961 that the premises of the First Unitarian Church of Los Angeles have been utilized for meetings by Communist Party members and sympathizers over a period of years. Speakers and lacturers at the church frequently espouse Communist causes or follow the Communist Party line. Communist Front group literature is distributed at the church. The church is used by some Communist Party members for "mass concentration" work.

This same infiltration extends to adjuncts of the church such as the Unitarian Fublic Forum and the Unitarian Fellowship for Social Justice.

STEPHEN H. FRITCHMAN has been minister of the church since 1943.

Reverend STEPHEN H. FRITCHMAN is described in the Fourth Report, Un-American Activities Committee in California, 1948, page 115, as a very active "Communist fronter" and connected with numerous "Communist front organizations and activities".

Membership in the First Unitarian Church does not of itself connote membership in or sympathy with the Communist Party.

"The Jewish Fraternalist" dated October, 1947, self identified as the official publication of the Jewish People's Fraternal Order (JPFO) of the Interantional Workers Order (IWO), on page 6, contained an article which reflected that the Emma Lazarus Division (ELD) of the JPFO was to hold its first national convention in New York City on November 15, and 16, 1947, after having been first established at a National Women's Conference called three years previously by the JEFO.

The "Morning Freiheit" on January 25, 1951, contained a report on the National Convention of the ELD of the JPFO which took place in New York City on January 20, and 21, 1951. At this convention it was noted the ELD changed its name to Dmna Lazarus Federation of Jewish Women's Clubs (ELF) and adopted a new constitution.

The address of the national office of the ELF is 160 Fifth Avenue, Room 911, New York City.

Both the IWO and the JPFO have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications", revised and published as of January 2, 1957, to supersede Guide published on May 14, 1951, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., contains the following concerning the "Morning Freiheit":

- "1. A 'Communist Yiddish daily.'
  (Attorney General FRANCIS BIDDLE, Congressional Record, September 24, 1942, p. 7686.)
- "2. 'The Freiheit has been one of the rankest organs of Communist propaganda in this country for almost a quarter of a century.'
