

Mimeographed letter from MYRA TARRER WEISS, dated 6/14/57, which set forth that she was enclosing a document setting forth the legal issues involved in the appeal of the sobell case in the Supreme Court. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG Case maintains national headquarters in Room B, 940 Broadway, New York City, N. Y., and the mail box servicing this office is lareled "SOBELL Committee."

JULIUS ROSENBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951 of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. The ROSENBERGs were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951 of MORTON SOBELL to 30 years imprisonment on the same date. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, N. Y., on June 19, 1953, and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the United States Peritentiary, Alcatraz, California.





According to the informant, both were willing to work together on such a meeting.

On September 12, 1957, Confidential Informant advised that as of September 1957 JOSEPH ROBERTS was the Executive Secretary, CPEPD.





On May 17, 1957, Confidential Informant furnished a flyer captioned "Justice for MORTON SOBELL." This flyer indicated that on Friday, June 7th at 8:15 P.M., a meeting would be held at Roberts Hall, 205 South 13th Street. The speakers

for this affair were to be HELEN SOBELL, wife of MORTON SOBELL, MYRA TANNER WEISS, staff writer for "The Militant," and JEAN FRANTJIS, Philadelphia Chairman, Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL. The film strip, "Was Justice Done?," "new film material on the ROSENBERG-BOBELL Case" was to be shown for the first time in Philadelphia. This flyer indicated that the meeting was being held under the auspices of the SWP, Philadelphia Branch, and that the proceeds were to go to the Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL.

On June 24, 1957, Confidential Informant advised that he attended the Justice for MORTON SOBELL Meeting held on June 7, 1957 at 205 South 13th Street, Philadelphia. The chairman for this affair was DAVID WEISS and the speakers were HELEN SOBELL, wife of MORTON SOBELL, MYRA TANNER WEISS of "The Militant," and JEAN FRANTJIS, Chairman of the Philadelphia Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL. The film strip, "Was Justice Done?," was shown.

DAVID WEISS, chairman of the meeting, said that the purpose behind the meeting was to join the fight against "the awful injustice which had been done" and to campaign for a new trial for MORTON SOBELL to prove his innocence and to set him free. WEISS remarked that he had been in the Socialist movement for 25 years and knew what it was like to be in jail. JEAN FRANTJIS gave an impassioned talk concerning the execution of the ROSENBERGs in which she said that the history of the United States was the history of one frameup after another which occurred when Government power avtempted to capture the minds of men for hefarious purposes. She said that the "cruel sentence of SOBELL was done in the interest of the cold war and that his freedom will unfreeze the cold war."

HELEN SOBELL spoke along lines which attempted to arouse sympathy for her husband. She spoke of his imprisonment and how he had been imprisoned because he refused to sacrifice his ideals or his friends. She said that on September 4, 1957 a petition would be filed to secure a review of his case, and

that in freeing her husband the United States will be freed from the cold war. She said that "we" are in a hopeful position at the present, but need help in keeping the case before the public. According to her, the public approach can make a living issue of the case and support for the defense is obtained by personal contact.

The final speaker, MYRA TANNER WEISS, attacked the witnesses in the trial of the ROSENBERGS and SOBELL and capitalism in general. She said that she did not know whether the ROSENEERGs were innocent or guilty, but did know that they did not receive a fair trial because it was impossible to have a fair trial in an atmosphere such as prevailed at that time. She stated that she had been ignorant of the facts of the case until reading books which had been given to her by HELEN SOBELL. After reading these books, she had never seen anything so hideous as the frame-up that killed the ROSENBERGs and She said that the whole case rested sent SOBELL to prison. on whether the ROSENBERGs or GREENGLASS was telling the truth. and after the trial it was proved that all the accusers had lied, "GREENGLASS and the FBI the worst of all." WEISS stated that this shows how American justice can close its eyes to perjured evidence and thereby keep its victims in jail. She then went into a further discussion on how the witnesses were "lying" and how this fact had been known to the FBI. finished her speech by making a plea for all working class people to join together to fight for civil liberties.





The National Committee To Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case maintains national headquarters in Room D, 1940 Broadway, New York City, and the mailbox servicing this office is labelled "Sobell Committee."

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951 of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. The ROSENBERGS were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951, and MORTON SOBELL to thirty years' imprisonment on the same date. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953, and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California.

advised in January, 1952 that the National Committee To Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case was formed on January 2, 1952 for the purpose of obtaining a new trial for the ROSENBERGS.

An informant on May 9, 1956 advised that the National Committee To Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case was attempting to keep alive the ROSENBERG case and to fight for the release of MORTON SOBELL. He stated that the Communist Party took an extremely active part in assisting the committee.

The "Milwaukee Journal," a daily Milwaukee newspaper, in its issue of September 16, 1957 quoted JOHN GILMAN, Chairman of the Milwaukee unit of the Committee To Secure Justice for Morton Soboll, as stating that the Milwaukee unit of the Sobell Committee was reactivated about six weeks previously to attempt to obtain a new trial for MORTON SOBELL.

"There is one injustice that particularly pains the conscience of America, continued imprisonment in Alcatraz, after seven years, of Morton Sobell. Sobell was unjustly sentenced under the same witch-hunt hysteria that sent the Rosenbergs to their doom. The facts cry out for a fair trial for the evidence proclaims his innocence.

"You can help right this injustice by acquainting yourself with the facts in the case and giving them the widest circulation. More immediately you can help by signing the Amicus Curiae (friend of the court) Brief, which must be in the courts hands by Sept. 4th.



On the Curine Brief on Behalf of Morton Sobell," which was passed out by the Milwaukee Sobell Committee and read as follows:

"By signing this Amicus Brief, you inform the United States Supreme Court of the deep interest that you share with many thousands of Americans in seeing justice done for Morton Sobell.

"Historically, Americans have availed themselves of the privilege of acting as Friends of the Court in cases which concern their common well-being. We respectfully bring to the attention of the Supreme Court of the United States our grave concern with the serious legal and moral issues in the case of Morton Sobell.

"Since his arrest seven years ago, Morton Sobell has steadfastly sought to prove his innocence of 'conspiracy to commit espionage,' the charge on which he was sentenced to 30 years and imprisoned in Alcatraz. People throughout the country, and in many nations abroad, have seen the integrity of American justice challenged by his conviction and imprisonment.

"Morton Sobell's appeals offer documentary evidence that the presecution knowingly used fraud and perjury to obtain his conviction. None of the new evidence has been refuted. Clearly a court review is required. We look hopefully to the Supreme Court to resolve the issues raised in accordance with the Court's traditional vigilance over our system of justice.

"We therefore request that the case of Morton Sobell be reviewed and a hearing granted, and we authorize the inclusion of our names in an Amicus Curiae Brief."

The "Milwaukee Journal," a Milwaukee daily newspaper, in its issue of September 16, 1957, carried an article entitled, "Retry Sobell as Spy, Plea - Claim New Evidence." This article read as follows:

. "Sentenced to 30 Years

- "John Gilman, 2851 N. 1st st., is chairman of the Milwaukee unit which he headquarters at 914 N. Plankinton av. He also formarly needed the Wisconsin Civil Rights congress which had headquarters at the same address. The Civil Rights congress for many years was the Communist party's principal 'front' organization in the state.
- "Gilman said that the Milwaukee Sobell unit was 'reactivated' about six weeks ago.
- "Sobell was sentenced to 30 years imprisonment for his part in the alleged Soviet atom spy conspiracy which also involved Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. The Rosenbergs were executed in 1953.

"Give \$89 to Defense

- "Perkins said that eminent lawyers and intellectual leaders were becoming convinced that Sobell was innocent and was a victim of mass anti-Communist hysteria.
- "He said there was a strong possibility that evidence against Sobell was 'invented' by FBI and police witnesses.
- "'It is also possible,' he said, 'that if all the facts were known, it might develop that the Rosenbergs might be guilty but Sobell still be innocent.
- "The chances for a new trial for Morton Sobell now look bright, but they depend a lot upon people just as you are making yourselves heard on his behalf."
- "The audience contributed \$89 to Sobell's defense."

V. ACTIVITIES OF ORGANIZATION PRIOR TO REACTIVATION OF SOBELL COMMITTEE

General Activities

On June 17 1953 Confidential Informant advised that approximately forty-three persons from Wistonsin Edtended the ROSENBERGS: vigil in Wishington, D.G., on June 14, 1953.

On June 19, 1953
Allis-Chalmers Manufacturing Company, Milwaukee, furnished a leaflet entitled, "The Provisional Committee To Commute the Death Sentence for the Rosenbergs," which was passed out at the main gate of the Allis-Chalmers Plant on June 17, 1953 and which reads in part as follows:

"Dear Friend:

"It is late -- BUT NOT TOO LATE -- to save the lives of the Rosenbergs who are scheduled to die on June 18, the day of their fourteenth wedding anniversary. THEIR time is growing short, but you still have precious time to do something to save two lives.

"All legal processes are not exhausted. New evidence keep pouring in. Help them in the name of humanity and luman conscience to present this evidence while they still live.

"Pop! Pius XII has asked mercy for these parents of two sons. Prof. Malcolm Sharp of the University of Chicago Law School declares the Pope's mercy plea 'has reinforced the criticism made by many Americans of the severity of the sentence' and declares the new evidence now available 'shakes the confidence' in the guilty verdict. Prof. Albert Einstein asks mercy and joins Dr. Harold Urey, Nobel Prize winner and foremost atomic authority, in casting doubt on some of the evidence that convicted the Rosenbergs. Twenty-three hundred Protestant Cleigymen and countless Rabbis ask mercy and Americans from coast to coast have appealed to President Eisenhower for clemency.



"McCARTHY COMES OUT IN THE OPEN!

"We have stated before that the Rosenberg case was McCarthyism in its most extreme form.

- "Why are the McCarthys now trying to revive the whole frameup and attempting to make a spy out of anyone who happened to be in a class room or had an acquaintenance with Julius Resemberg?
- "Why are we being flooded with stories of how 'poor' Judge Kauthonn suffered why are they trying to convince us again and again that the Rosenbergs 'must' have been guilty?
- "Why have they hidden the fact that the Rosenbergs never did have their day in court that the U.S. Supreme Court never reviewed the record of the case that only three justices in the very last minutes before the execution read the record?
- "This plot, based primarily on hysteric and fear and not on evidence, was needed in 1950 to create support for the unpopular Korcan war. The McCarthys are trying to work up a war fever again.
- "Hundreds of millions of people, including some of America's top anomic scientists such as Dr. Harold Urey, are convinced that the Rosenbergs were the innocent victims of a frame-up. The dignity with which they went to their death convinced millions more.
- "And today, no satisfied with the execution of the mother and father, the McCarthyites are bounding the two children, 7 and 11, from their school. Words fail to convey the degradation of this act. Even the MILWAUKEE SENTINEL protests it as inhumans and not in the spirit of Americanism....

"Morton Sobell - Support a New Trial

- "Morton Sobell is asking for a new trial where he will testify and bring in new evidence. We ask every worker and every trade union to support fair play, justice and truth by supporting a new trial for Sobell. A new trial will help to defeat McCarthy's new plots against the democratic rights of the American people.







On March 19, 1957, Confidential Informant made available a three-page mimeographed memorandum dated February 8, 1957, entitled "Sobell Argument Delayed Until March 4, As Sobell's Mexican Attorney Fights For Visa". Page 3 of this memorandum showed, that it was prepared by "Committee to Secure Justice For Morton Sobell, 940 Broadway, New York 10, New York."

This memorandum states that the United States Court of Appeals postponed until March 4, the argument on

This delay resulted from interference by United States State Department with the efforts of SOBELL's Mexical attorney, Dr. LUIS SANCHEZ PONTON, in obtaining a visa of This memorandum in part states as follows: "Dr. LUIS SANCHEZ PONTON is one of the attorneys representing MORTON SOBELL in his legal motions charging that the Prosecution knowingly used perjured testimony to convict him of conspiracy to commit espionage. 'Dr. PONTON, an authority of international law, was engaged because much of the new evidence concerns events in Mexico. Dr. PONTON was formerly Minister of Education in Mexico, Ambassador to numerous countries, and is now Professor of Law at the University of Mexico.

"Dr. PONTON applied to the United States Embassy in Mexico for a visa to visit the U.S. for professional reasons. He was told to come to the U.S. Embassy on Feb. 1 and his visa would be ready. When he arrived as instructed, he was kept waiting two hours, then ushered in to speak with an official. When the exact nature of his professional services was asked for, Dr. PONTON clearly, stated that he was to appear in court in behalf of MONTON SOBELL. It was at this point that the Embassy told Dr. PONTON it would not issue the visa as promised, but would have to conduct an investigation. Dr. PONTON protested that this would interfere with his trip, since he had to be a in court on Monday, Feb. 4th. Nevertheless this visa was withheld.

"Upon learning of these developments, Mrs. MORTON SOBELL* sent telegrams to President Elsenhower, Attorney General BROWNELL, and Secretary of State JOHN FOSTER DULLES, asking their intervention to see that her husband's right to counsel was not restricted."

This memorandum, in part, further states as follows: "We will continue to keep you informed on all developments. Judge MEDINA relied on Judge IRVING KAUFMAN's previous refusal to hold a hearing on the new evidence submitted by MORTON SOBELL to prove his innocence. Which he has steadfastly maintained.

"We now have a situation where the new evidence-which admittedly raises issues of deep moral and legal
significance--has not been rejected as false. Instead,
Judges MEDINA and KAUFMAN contend in their opinions that
even if all of the new evidence is valid, they cannot conclude that MORTON SOBELL should be freed or given a new
trial.

"We do not believe such reasoning can prevail before the Supreme Court. Certainly in a case of this magnitude (The Columbia Law Review referred to it as the 'outstanding "political trial" of this generation'), it is essential to the public as well as to MORTON SOBELL that the case be carefully examined and new evidence be given a full court hearing.

"Why have the lower courts refused a new trial, and how do they explain it?

- "6. Proof that the Mexican government had nothing whatsoever to do with the abduction of SOBELL, and in fact protested to the U.S. authorities.
- "7. Proof that the kidnapping violated our; extradition treaty with Mexico and therefore the court lacked the sovereign power to try SOBELL.

"1. Judge MEDINA recognizes that the firsty between the U.S. and Mexico provides in its for privaditing persons accused of certain crimes. But he says that the kidnapping of SOBELL did not violate the treaty because there is no clause in the treaty specifically barring the 'abduction by one party of criminals found in the territory of the other.'*****The reader can judge for himself the immorality of such reasoning. The entire premise of an extradition treaty is to establish between civilized nations rules for extradition to avoid exactly such situations as the kidnapping of SOBELL. For a federal judge to claim that the treaty was not violated because there was no specific anti-kidnapping clause would seem unworthy of our courts and country. Furthermore, for Judge MEDINA to imply that MORTON SOBELL could have been considered a 'criminal' in Mexico even before an arrest, indictment, trial or any legal proceedings whatsoever, is contrary to the American tradition that every man is innocent until proved guilty.

Judge Medina relied on Judge Irving Kaufman's previous refusal to holding a hearing on the new evidence submitted by Merton Sobell to prove his innocence, which he has steadfastly maintained.

"We now have a situation wherein new evidence--which admittedly raises issues of deep moral and legal
significance --- has not been revoked as false. Instead,
Judges Medina and Kaufman contend in their opinions that
even if all of thenew evidence is valid they cannot
conclude that Morton Sobell should be freed or given
a new trial ---

"Evidence obtained after intense and prolonged investigation reveals that the prosecution's attempt to prove Sobell a fugitive was based on fraud. The new evidence consists of: 1) Proving that the prosecution kidnapped Morton Sobell from Mexico. 2) Proof that the prosecution surpressed evidence that would have emposed those and illegal acts. 3) Proof that the prosecution used very illegal acts in the trial to make it appear that Sobell was a fugitive and had to be forced to return -- even though the prosecution knew this to be false. 4) Proof that the prosecution lied to the jury and the courts by claiming that Sobell Advisor had been legally deported by the Mexican Government. 5) Proof that United States Immigration Inspector Huggins knowingly lied when he testified that Sobell had been deported, and proof that Huggins had been told before the trial that this was false. 6) Proof that the Mexican Government

"had nothing whatever to do with the abduction of Sobell and in fact protested to the United States authorities. 7) Proof that the kidnapping violated our extradition treaty with Mexico and therefore the court lacked the sovereign power to try Sobell ---.

"Judge Kaufman complained that an 'inordinate amount of time, money, effort and ingenuity' had gone into Sobell's appeals. We say that no amount of energy is 'inordinate' where the freedom of a human being and the principles of justice are concerned. We trust that the carrying of the appeals to the Supreme Court will be made possible by the continued interest, moral support, and financial assistance of all who have helped thus far".

AMERICAN LABOR PARTY

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of January 2, 1957, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the American Labor Party:

- "I. For years, the Communists have put forth the greatest efforts to capture the entire American Labor Party throughout New York State. They succeeded in capturing the Manhattan and Brooklyn sections of the American Labor Party but outside of New York City they have been unable to win control. (Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 1311 on the CIO Political Action Committee, March 29, 1944, p. 78.)
