
As you are aware, there has not been an opportunity to date to institute the program against Helen Sobell and her work for captioned committee which was the subject of relet. The Bureau is still keenly interested in the possibilities of this action and still feels that effective steps can be taken to neutralize her work.

Each office should advise the Bureau by return mail of current information indicating Helen Sobell's itinerary insofar as this itinerary is known. New York should remain particularly alert to any information which would shed light on her future activities. Los Angeles should continue to maintain close contact with in an effort to obtain the desired information in this letter.

The success of this operation will depend entirely upon the development of Helen Sobell's future itinerary in sufficient time to institute effective countermeasures.

On August 31, 1959 ANN ZIELINSKI stated that HELEN SOBELL arrived in San Diego by plane and was met by MILTON LESSNER at the airport. ANN ZIELINSKI said they decided that someone on the Sobell Committee should be with HELEN SOBELL when she met with the ministers at the Reverend ALBERT M. SMITH's church, Trinity Methodist, 3030 Thorn Street, San Diego, California. Accordingly, DON ZIELINSKI drove HELEN SOBELL to the meeting.

On August 31, 1959 there was a meeting of the SDSC at the home of MILTON LESSNER, 4273 Ridgeway Drive, San Diego. Among others in attendance was HELEN SOBELL. HELEN SOBELL spoke of her visits to her husband in Georgia and how his morale is good and that she hopes to get him out, with the help of others, the first of December. HELEN SOBELL went on to say that that afternoon she had had a good meeting with three ministers in San Diego and that about ten ministers in San Diego had consented to have their names listed as being against her husband's imprisonment and to demand his immediate release. She also stated that writing to the President was not effective but urged that pressure be put on congressmen, senators, and representatives, who in turn would bring effective pressure to bear on the President.

At the meeting, HELEN SOBELL read aloud a letter from VANZETTI's sister; and she, HELEN, told the group that she had answered the letter by inviting VANZETTI's sister to come to this country. According to HELEN SOBELL, VANZETTI's sister will be able to visit the United States any time after January, 1960 and would be happy to do so. Thereafter, the San Diego Sobell Committee made a pledge to raise \$300.00 by December to help finance VANZETTI's sister's trip to America and to also, as HELEN suggested, pay for a companion to travel with her.

I Remember Distinctly -- A Family Album of the American People 1918-1941 assembled by AGNES ROGERS with running comment by FREDERICK LEWIS ALLEN published by Harper & Brothers Publishers, New York and London, at Page 95 reflects: "In April 1920, a paymaster in South Braintree, Massachusetts, was shot by holdup men; and two Italian-American radicals, NICOLA SACCO and BARTOLOMEO VANZETTI were arrested and soon convicted of the crime. But many people thought they had been railroaded; the case was re-investigated and debated everywhere; the demeanor of VANZETTI in particular was admirable and his statements most impressive; and even after the two men were at last electrocuted on August 22, 1927, millions believed them to have been innocent."

On September 1, 1959 HELEN SOBELL wrote her husband: "Yesterday was a long day in San Diego and we did many things. I met with a group of ministers and they are going to invite all of the clergymen in the area to join with them. I also had dinner with the UREYS (not further identified) who sent their warmest regards and were wonderfully hospitable."


The October 19, 1959 final edition of The San Diego Union carried an article captioned "Sobell Conviction Unjust, Urey Says", which article reflected that Dr. HAROLD C. UREY spoke at a forum at the First Unitarian Church, 4190 Front Street, San Diego, California, on October 18, 1959. In his speech, UREY stated "I believe an injustice was committed in the case of Sobell. . . The Rosenberg-Sobell trial was worthy of Communist Russia and the evidence brought out during it was very doubtful and uncorroborated by anyone except accomplices of the Rosenbergs. . . He (SOBELL) returned to his home in Mexico City and was accosted by Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation who forced him into a car and extradited him illegally across the border. The FBI has never denied kidnapping him." According to the article, UREY won the 1934 Nobel Prize in chemistry for his discovery of deuterium, which led to the development of the atomic bomb. He is now a chemistry professor-at-large at the University of California at La Jolla.







NATIONAL GUARDIAN CLUB, San Diego, California, Aka Guardian Angel Club, National Guardian Club of San Diego, National Guardian Readers Group

A confidential source advised on December 2, 1955 that instant organization was formed on November 19, 1955 by a group of Communist Party (CP) sympathizers and suspected CP members, to support the "National Guardian" by subscriptions, donations, and programs designed to arouse interest in the issues being favored by the "National Guardian".

This source advised on May 17, 1956 that the Guardian Angel Club continues to operate as outlined above. On May 17, 1957, however, this source advised the Guardian Angel Club has been completely inactive since June 17, 1956.

This source advised on May 29, 1959 that this is not a membership organization. On September 19, 1958 it was reactivated. On November 2, 1958, at which time it was known as the National Guardian Club of San Diego, a handbill was sent out announcing a meeting November 7, 1958, describing the organization as "Proudly sponsored by the National Guardian Club of San Diego, which aims to promote the National Guardian, a socialist newspaper of honest and intelligent world coverage". This source further advised that this organization is currently known as the National Guardian Readers Group, but has been inactive since approximately February of 1959 because of difficulty in obtaining speakers.

The 1949 report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities cited the "National Guardian" as a publication launched in New York in 1948, aiming at national circulation, which it found to be from its inception notoriously Stalinist in its staff, writers, management and content. (1949 report of the California Senate Fact Finding Committee on Un-American Activities, page 394)

The masthead of the "National Guardian", issue of May 14, 1956, reflects that it is published weekly by Weekly Guardian Associates, Incorporated, 197 East 4th Street, New York City.

A confidential source advised on May 1, 1957 that the San Diego Schell Committee (SDSC), Aka Morton Sobell Defense Committee, San Diego Committee To Secure Justice For Morton Sobell, was organized on April B, 1956, at San Diego, California, to help obtain a new trial for MORTON SOBELL, convicted in 1951 for conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. Source further advised that the SDSC is an adjunct of the National Committee to Secure Justice For Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case, Aka National Sobell Committee, New York, New York, which directs activities, policy and obtains financial support from the various Sobell committees throughout the country.

Another source on December 2, 1959 advised that as of that date MILTON HENRY LESSNER was chairman of the SDSC and that the SDSC was at that time active.

A third source on December 2, 1959 advised that as of that date MILTUN HENRY LESSNER was a member of the San Diego County Communist Party (SDCCP) and past literature director of the SDCCP.



The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case - a communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October 1953 and 'then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg case' ...."

In order to make the Bureau's plans effective it will be necessary for your office to determine exactly Sobell's itinerary in the Miami area. Promptly alert confidential informants and sources in an effort to determine her schedule and the identity of the groups she plans to address. Maintain an extra close check of newspapers and other press media in the Miami area for announce—ments concerning her visit.

As soon as any concrete developments are obtained from your checks furnish such data to the Bureau by airtel. Follow this matter very closely as it appears that the Bureau may in this instance have sufficient time to counteract the work of Helen Sobell in furtherance of the program to assist her husband. 





The Committee To Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, the National Committee To Secure Justice for Morton Sobell and the Sobell Committee will be referred to by the initials CSJMS, NCSJMS, and SC where appropriate in this report.

The Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA) and the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

## B. LOCATION, PURPOSE AND STAFF

On January 18, 1960 furnished the following \$2 evaluation of the CSJMS:

"The Committee To Secure Justice for Morton Sobell is an organization founded for the purpose of securing the release of MORTON SOBELL from prison. The Committee expects to do this by obtaining either a new trial for SOBELL or by obtaining a Presidential pardon or commutation of his sentence to the time already served.

"The National Headquarters of the Sobell Committee is at Room D, 940 Broadway, New York City, which is also the location of the 'ew York Sobell Committee.

"There is no formal membership in the SC and there are no dues. People volunteer their services and are affiliated with the Committee for varying periods of time and often reaffiliate with the Committee after being inactive for periods of time.

"The paid staff members of the SC are believed to be: AARON KATZ, LEAH SCHNEIDER, TED JACOBS, HELEN SOBELL and one BERTHA (LNU) who is employed on a part time basis. The members of the National Staff of the CSJMS are as follows: TED JACOBS, who handles publicity, plans campaign and contacts other Sobell Committees; LEAH SCHNEIDER, who it is believed manages the office; AARON KATZ, who is an East Coast Organizer and, HELEN SOBELL, who travels throughout the country making fund raising speeches. The members of the New York Sobell Committee include all of the above and:

"BEN RATNER, Chairman; JENNIE RATNER, EVELYN HARAP, Co-chairman: BELLA HALEBSKY, MARGARET BLAU; MURIEL (believed to be WEISS or WEISSMAN); and GEORGE (INU).

"There are SC branches in most larger cities such as Boston, Chicago, Atlanta, Los Angeles, San Francisco and Philadelphia.

"The National Committee suggests policies and plans campaigns for the local Committees, but they are general autonomous and self-supporting and do not have to follow the suggestions of the National Committee. It is to be pointed out that the exception to this is that the "Clergy Appeal" originated in the San Francisco SC.

"The current campaign for the release of SOBELL includes a petition to the President of the United States signed by the Clergymen of varying faiths.

"All local Sobell Committees send, when possible, funds to the New York Office and most of the printing is sent out from the New York Office.

"The New York or the National Committee raises much of the funds for the CSES by private solicitations and through private house parties. The Committee needs funds badly and printing, mailing, back salaries and lawyer's fees have not been paid because of lack of funds."







On page 7 of the August 24, 1959 issue of the NG is apaid advertisement under the heading, "Los Angeles" which announces that a "Bar-B-Que" would be held in Los Angeles on August 29, 1959, and that a donation of \$1.25 per person would be charged.

On page 7 of the August 31, 1959 issue of the NG is a paid advertisement entitled, "Los Angeles" which announces that a dimer under the sponsorship of the "Valley SC to Welcome HELEN SOBELL" would be held May 9, 1959, in Van Nuys, California, and that on September 6, 1959, an informal get-together would be held in Altadena, California.

On page 7 of the September 7, 1959 issue of the NG is a paid advertisement entitled, "Los Angeles" which announces that a dinner to honor HELEN SOBELL would be held in West Los Angeles on September 12, 1959.

On page 3 of the October 19, 1959, issue of the NG is a lengthy article entitled, "An Interview with HELEN SOBELL' If Every Guardian Reader Sent a Letter'" which reports that great progress was being made in the Campaign to secure HELEN SOBELL's husband's freedom, that HELEN SOBELL was petitioning the Director of Federal Prisons in order to be allowed conjugal visits with her husband, and, requesting all readers to send a letter to the President asking for MORTON SOBELL's freedom.

On page 13 of the November 13, 1959 issue of NG is a photograph and accompanying text reporting that ROSE SOBELL, mother of MORTON SOBELL, was sending an Appeal for funds for her son to Washington, D.C.

On page 5 of the November 30, 1959 issue of NG is a paid advertisement entitled, "Los Angeles" which announces an evening of "Fun and Entertainment" in Los Angeles on December 5, 1959.

On page 11 of the December 7, 1959 issue of the NG is paid advertisement entitled, "Philadelphia, Pennsylvania" which announces that HELEN SOBELL would have the sponsorship of the Philadelphia SC on December 10, 1959, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and that a donation would be requested.

On page 11 of the December 7, 1959 issue of the NG is a paid advertisement entitled, "Los Angeles" which announces that a memorial concert would be held in Los Angeles on December 13, under the sponsorship of the Los Angeles SC.

On page 3 of the December 28, 1959 issue of the NG is an article accompanied by photographs entitled, "In this Season of Good Will - Raise Your Voice for MORTON SOBELL" which reviewed the ROSENBERG - SOBELL convictions and reports "8 years and 4 months later fellow victim of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG waits in Atlanta Penitentiary for vindication both for the dead and the living". This article requests readers to write to the President of the United States asking for executive clemency for MORTON SOBELL.

On page 3 of the September 30, 1959 issue of the "New York Daily News", a New York City daily newspaper, is a newspaper story, "Nix Plea of Spy's Wife for Child by Prisoner" which reports that the Government had rejected the appeal by HELEN SOBELL to live with MORTON SOBELL in Atlanta Penitentiary long enough to conceive a child.

On page 3 of the September 30, 1959 issue of the "New York Mirror", a New York City daily newspaper, is a similar story.

The April, 1959 issue of "The Intercollegian". self-identified as the publication of the National Student Council of the YMCA and YWCA, is an article entitled, "Issue of the month - The Case of MORTON SOBELL" which is quoted in part as follows:

The Sixth Assembly of the Student YMCA-YMCA.... At the Assembly both Dr. PAUL LEHMANN Dr. GARDNER MURPHY called attention to the MORTON SOBELL trial and sentence. Student Christian Associations should study the record of this case. Wherever a possible serious malfeasance of justice in any society exists, that society could not go long without examining its behavior and practice.

There follows the statement on the SOBELL case by REINHOLD NIEBUHR, JOHN C. BENNETT, GERHARD O. W. MUELLER, EDMOND CAHN DANIEL DAY WILLIAMS, PAUL RAMSEY and JEROME NATHANSON.

This statement is then followed by comments on the MORTON SOBELL Case by Dr. PAUL LEHMAN of the Harvard Divinity School:

"The Christian's concern for justice is a basic response to what God revealed to us..... MORTON SCBELL was convicted and sentenced to prison in the wake of the trial, convictions and sentencing of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. His case has been called "the outstandingexample of the serious lasting effects of the spy scare".... MORTON SOBELL was sentenced to prison for a 30 year term in 1951. First in Levenworth and then in Alcatraz, symbols of American punitive power at its worst, SOBELL has been serving his sentence amidst rising doubts in the body politic of the United States about the evidence upon which he was actually convicted and remanded to prison.... Whether one come to the conclusion that the SOBELL case should be reviewed or not, that MORTON SOBELL should be pardoned by executive clemency or not, a serious study and discussion of the issues and the significance of MORTON SOBELL's ordeal may well serve as an unforgettable undergraduate experience in what it takes to be and to stay a human being in this kind of world....."

On page 91of the June 22, 1959 issue of "Christianity and Vrisis" - a Christian journal of Opinion" is an article entitled, "A new look at the SOBELL Case" which reports that a group of lawyers and religious leaders had petitioned the President of the United States to commute the sentence of MORTON SOBELL. The article advises that the Committee does not question SOBELL's guilt or involvement in the ROSENBERG crime and adds that the Committee felt that a 30 year sentence is excessive.

made available a printed throwaway of the CSJMS entitled, "A Wrong to be Righted", which is a reprint of an article first printed on the West Coast and "26 other labor newspapers". This is quoted in part as follows:

".... August 16 is a bitter anniversary for Mrs. HELEN SOBELL who is now on a speaking tour of California. It marks the beginning of the 10th year ofher husband's imprisonment for a crime she says he could not possibly have committed ...... Their spirits have been bouyed up by the fact that in recent years thousands of people -





A physical surveillance of "Thrift Shop" operated by personnel and friends of the Sobell Committee at 1553 St. Nicholas Avenue, New York City, by SAS of the FBI on January 12, 1960 reflected that the store operated at irregular hours.

JOHN PAUL JONES, Ashfield, Mass., under Educators, the name of Prof. JAMES LUTHER ADAMS, Harvard, under Writers, the names WALDO FRANK, Truro, Mass., WILLIAM HARRISON, Editor, Boston Chronicle, Boston, Mass., Dr. SCOTT NEARING; author. Camp Rosier, Maine. Under "Other Eminent Signers was the name EMILY G. BAICH, Nobel Prize Winner, Wellesley, Mass.

On the back page was an article entitled: "Harvard Divinity Professor calls Sobell "Symbol of Christian's Concern for Justice." This is a report of the fact that Dr. Paul LEHMAN of Harvard Divinity School had written a statement on the SOBELL case for the "Intercollegian," a national student publication of the YMCA-YWCA.






