

RUTH ALSCHER BECURITY MATTER - C

PURPOSE:

To advise you of information in our files concerning the subject and to recommend that we not furnish any information concerning her to local authorities under this program.

DETAILS:

In the memorandum from Mr. Nichols to the Director dated October 13, 1952, showing the results of the Attorney General's conference at the Pepartment, information is set out to the effect that Mr. Malone of the Pepartment mentioned that Myles Lane, United States Attorney for the Southern District of New York, told him of a school teacher by the name of Ruth Alicher, who had been called as a witness in the Remington case but declined to testify, and he felt this should be given to the McCarran Committee. The Attorney General stated that he thought it should be given to the school authorities since the FBI has an errangement whereby it notifies officials of dangerous individuals. Concerning this matter the Pirector noted "See that the Alicher metter is properly handled."

The Bureau's files contain no record of the name Ruth Alicher. It was determined, however, that one Ruth Alscher a school teacher in New York City was chiled as a witness before the Grand Jury in the Julius Rosenberg Espionage case, at which time, according to confidential information furnished by Alistant United States Attorney John W. Foldy, she claimed privileges under the Pifth Amendment and the questioning was unproductive.

All references in our files concerning Ruth Alscher were checked and it was ascertained that the only information we have concerning her is information appearing in the Rosenberg and related cases, a summary of which is as follows:

Han Filtcher, who was an important Government witness in the Romanberg and Morton Sobell cases, in the brother-in-law of Ruth Alacher. Her Elitcher's brother, Mortis Alscher, married Ruth Polberthal in 17th while Mortis are in the United States Army. He is now deceased and left Ruth Alscher with three small children. She is employed as a school teacher in New York City.

During interviews with Max and Helene Elitcher it was brought out that in 1944 Max and Helene Elitcher visited his mother and sister-in-law, Ruth Alscher. At that time Ruth Alscher went with the Elitchers to a party at the Bird-In-Hand Restaurant in New York City, which party was attended by Julius Rosenberg, Joel Barr, William Perl and Samuel Perl. Nax Elitcher also recalled being at a party at the home of Joel Barr which party was attended by Ruth Alsoher.

Ruth Alseher, 1445 Madison Avenue, New York City, was contacted by Agents on January 10, 1951. She advised that her husband had recently died and left her with three small children, that she was working to support them and had no intention of becoming involved in anything. She said that she wanted to be left alone. Ruth Alseher was subpoensed before the Grand Jury on January 31, 1951. On the same date she advised Agents that she could not recall ever having been at the Bird-In-Hand Restaurant with her brother-in-law, Max Elitcher and the others. She denied knowing William Perl, Julius Wosenberg and the other individuals involved in the Rosenberg case with the exception of Morton Sobell whom she recalled meeting nine or ten years previously in an spartment in the Bronx. She said she could not recall enything concerning that meeting and never saw him thereafter.

on June 7, 1951, Alsoher was reinterviewed in the presence of Assistant United States Attorney John W. Foley. She refused to answer any questions. She appeared before the Grand Jury again on June 9, 1951, and Foley later confidentially advised the New York Office that Alsoher claimed privileges under the,

Elitaber advised that he tried to talk to him or to miles him to enter her home.

The New York Office advised that no other information concerning Alscher appeared in the New York files. Nothing further concerning her was located in the Bureau's files.

Since we have never conducted an investigation of the subject and her name is not in the Security Index, of course, we did not give any information concerning her to local authorities under the Responsibilities of the PBI in the Internal Security Field Program.

Since we have no information of a subversive nature concerning Alsoher, it does not appear that investigation is warranted. She refused to testify before the Grand Jury and to give any information to Bureau Agents, allegedly so she would not get involved in anything in view of her three children. It would not now appear desirable to furnish any information concerning her to local authorities.

ACTION:

If you agree with the above observation, it is suggested that Mr. Nichols acquaint Mr. Ross Malone with the true facts of this matter.

Pursuant to the Director's concurence with the recommendation of Mr. Belmont's memorandum of October 16. 1952, to the effect that I are Malone and advise him of the facts of the Alcher case, this is to record that I saw Malone this morning and furnished him the contents of Mr. Belmont's memorandum of October 16, 1952.

Malone stated that he had not advised Myles Lane of the Attorney_General's desire that Lane report these matters to the local school authorities. was very appreciative of the background information on Alcher and of knowing that we had not investigated her. He asked if we could furnish him with a short summary along the lines of my conversation with him.

It is suggested that the Domestic Intelligence Division prepare such a memorandum to Malone basing it upon his request to me, summarizing background on Alcher as set forth in Mr. Belmont's memorandum of October 16. Lam wondering, since we have not investigated her since. she_did_refuse_to-testify. whether we should not make a preliminary investigation to determine whether her statement that she had no intention of becoming involved by virtue of the fact that her husband had died leaving her with three small children, was in fact the real reason. for her failure to testify and whether there is any record of her being involved in subversive activities.

For your information the Bureau had an inquiry from the Department concerning the captioned individual. It was stated that Myles Lane, United States Attorney Southern, District of New York, had advised the Department that Ruth Alsoher refused to testify before the Grand Jury in the Resenberg case.

A review of the Bureau's files reflects the following information.

Ruth Alsoher is the sister-in-law of Max Elitoher who was a government witness in the Julius Rosenberg, Ethel Rosenberg and Morton Sobell cases. Max Elitoher's brother' Morris Alsoher married Ruth Holberthal in 1944 while Morris was in the United States Army. He is now deceased and Ruth Alsoher who has three children is employed as a school teacher in New York City.

During interviews with Max and Helene Elitcher it was learned that in 1944 they visited his sister-in-law, Ruth Alsoher, in New York City. On one occasion Ruth Alsoher went with the Elitchers to a party at the Bird-In-Hand Restaurant in New York City which party was attended by Julius Rosenberg, Joel Barr, William Perl and Samuel Perl. Max Elitcher Glso-FRINDevised that he remembered being at a party in the home of

The above is the substance of information in the Bureau's files concerning Alsoher.

It is desired that it be determined if the real reason that Ruth Alsoher refused to give information to Bureau Agents and to testify before the Grand Jury was because of the fear of becoming involved or if she herself may have been involved in some subversive activities.

Investigation to determine if the subject has been or to engaged in any subversive activities. Tou should give this matter expeditious attention and a report reflecting the results of your inquiries should be submitted to the Bureau by November 15, 1952.

Millar Carolle and Commenter

The subject attended Wadleigh High School, 114 Street and Seventh Avenue, New York City from 1936 to 1939, and from 1939 to 1943, she attended Hunter College, and received a BA degree. From 1943 to 1944, she attended Columbia University Teachers College, and received a MA degree.

T-l advised that the subject married MORRIS ALSCHER, also known as MORRIS ELITCHER, on July 4, 1944, and that he was born in June of 1916. In July of 1950, the subject was left as a widow as a result of the death of her husband.

The above informant advised that the subject received a temporary license to teach on October 9, 1945, and that she received her permanent appointment on February 6, 1946. She is presently a commerce teacher at Public School number 184, Menhattan, 31 West 116 Street, New York City.

According to T-1, the subject is presently residing at 2175 Fifth Avenue, New York City, and her former address is listed as 1445 Madison Avenue, New York City.

Affiliations With the Communist Party

Miscellaneous

On July 20, 1950, Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised that RUTH ALSCHER was present at a dinner party at the Bird-In-Hand Restaurant at 1659 Broadway, New York City in July or September of 1944. Other people attending this party were JULIUS ROSENBERG, WILLIAM PERL, SAM PERL and JOEL BARR. After dinner, according to the informant, Mrs. ALSCHER returned to her residence at 1445 Madison Avenue, New York City.

DAVID GREENGLASS, who was convicted in United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on April 6, 1951 as

a soviet espionage agent, advised SA JOHN A. HARRINGTON on various interviews that JULIUS ROSENBERG, a soviet espionage agent, who was convicted in United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on April 5, 1951, told him that JOEL BARR was a former contact of ROSENBERG's in the United States.

A perjury indictment was filed in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, in March 1951 against WILLIAM PERL. This perjury arose from PERL's denial that he knew JULIUS ROSENBERG and his associates.

SAM PERL is the brother of WILLIAM PERL, and is presently in Europe studying music under the GI Bill of Rights.

Confidential Informant T-2 advised on August 9, 1950 that RUTH ALSCHER was a close friend of BERNICE LEVIN.

On November 18, 1948, Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, furnished information which reflects that BERNICE LEVIN registered for Communist Party membership in Group 1 of the West Midtown Branch of the Communist Party, and indicated that she had been in the party for twelve years.

Mrs. RUTH ALSCHER, 1445 Madison Avenue, New York City, was contacted on January 10, 1951 by SA VINCENT J. CAHILL, who attempted to arrange a suitable appointment for an interview.

Mrs. ALSCHER stated that her husband MORRIS ALSCHER recently died, and that she was just recovering from the blow, that she has three young children to care for, in addition to going to business to support them, and that she was completely occupied now and had no intention of becoming involved in anything. She refused to be interviewed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and wanted to be left alone to bring up her family. She stated she never knew anyone named ROSENBERG, and refused to make any appointment for further interview.

On January 31, 1951, RUTH ALSCHER appeared in the office of Chief Assistant to United States Attorney MYLES J. IANE, Southern District of New York, At his request, a further attempt was made to interview Mrs. ALSCHER prior to her appearance before the Grand Jury. On this date, she advised SA VINCENT J. CAHILL that she was unable to recall ever having been present at the Bird-In-Hand Restaurant at a dinner party. She further denied acquaintance with WILLIAM PERL, JULIUS ROSENBERG, and other members of the soviet espionage ring with the exception of MORTON SOBELL whom she stated she recalled meeting nine or ten years ago at somebody's apartment in the Bronx. She could recall no details of her original acquaintance with SOBELL, whom she stated she had not seen since that time.

It is to be noted that MORTON SOBELL was convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on April 5, 1951 as a soviet espionage agent.

The records of the Clerk's Office, United States District Court, Southern District of New York, Foley Square, New York, reflected that Mrs. ALSCHER appeared before the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York, on January 31, 151.

On June 5, 1951, Assistant United States Attorney JOHN M. FOLEY, Southern District of New York, advised SA's MAURICE W. CORCORAN and VINCENT J. CAHILL that he had telephonically requested Mrs. RUTH ALSCHER to be present in his office for interview on that date. Mrs. ALSCHER first agreed to appear, but thereafter, cancelled the appointment by telephone.

The records of the Clerk's Office, United States District Court, Southern District of New York, Foley Square, New York, reflected that Mrs. ALSCHER was subpoensed to appear before the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York, on June 7, 1951. At that time, an attempt was made to interview her by SA's MAURICE W. CORCORAN and VINCENT J. CAHILL in the presence of Assistant United States Attorney JOHN M. FOLEY.

However, Mrs. ALSCHER remained silent to all questions asked by the agents and Mr. FOLEY, and would furnish no reason for her refusal to discuss metters relating to the Bird-In-Hand dinner party in New York City in July or September of 1944.

Confidential Informant T-2, previously mentioned in this report, advised on June 7, 1951 that the subject refused to see him, and would not let him enter her home.

The records of the Clerk's Office reflected that Mrs. ALSCHER did not appear before the Grand Jury until June 8, 1951.

Confidential Informants T-4, T-5, T-6 and T-7, all of known reliability, advised on October 10, 1952 and November 3, 1952 that the subject was unknown to them.

The files of the Bureau of Special Services and Investigation, New York City Police Department, contain no record for the subject.

<u>Miscella neous</u>

It is to be noted that an attempt was made by Bureau agents to interview Miss BERNICE LEVIN on October 3, 1950 in relation with the MORTON SOBELL case. It was noted that Miss LEVIN was very uncooperative, and refused to answer any questions asked by the interviewing agents, and refused to view photographs of individuals connected with the Rosenberg Espionage Network.

It is to be further noted that Mr. MAX ELITCHER, brother-in-law of the subject, advised in 1950 that the subject and BERNICE LEVIN were close friends. In this respect, it is to be noted that the subject, when an attempt was made to interview her by Bureau agents, reacted somewhat similar to Miss LEVIN as set forth above.

Mr. SAUL MOSKOFF, Assistant Counsel, New York City
Board of Education, advised SA LESTER F. LANGE on November 5,
1952 that the subject was requested, by registered mail, to
appear at his office on October 3, 1952 for an interview regarding her Communistic activities. He stated that this correspondence
was ignored, and that a telegram was subsequently sent to her
requesting her to appear on October 8, 1952. In response to
the latter request, the subject sent Mr. MOSKOFF a telegram stating
that she was ill, and unable to attend the interview. He stated
that the subject had been absent from school since October 8, 1952.

Mr. MOSKOFF further advised that an active investigation of the subject's subversive activities was contemplated in the very near future by their office, and that he would be very happy to furnish this office any information which he obtains.

Status of Health

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised on February 9, 1953 that the medical report for the subject dated November 20, 1952 reflected that the subject was admitted to the Hospital for Joint Diseases, 1919 Madison Avenue, New York, New York on October 22, 1952 for pelvic and bilateral leg traction.

T-2 further advised that the report reflected that the subject was discharged from the hospital on November 14, 1952 wearing a plaster of Paris body jacket which was to be worn three months. T-2 stated that the report indicated that the subject was totally disabled.

T-2 further advised that a medical doctor from the New York City Board of Education examined the subject in January 1953 and stated that the cast on the subject's body would not be removed until the latter part of February 1953.

AFFILIATION WITH THE COMMUNIST MOVEMENT

Communist Party Activities

Confidential Informant T-3, of unknown reliability, but who was a personal acquaintance of the subject, advised in 1950 that in 1943 RUTH HALBERTHAL told him that she was attending Communist Party meetings or rallies that were being held in New York City, but that she had never openly approached him to attend these meetings with her. He further advised that on one occasion he met the subject's mother and that the subject's mother appeared to be sympathetic with the Russians.

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised on December 19, 1952 that he has known the subject for several years and that it was his firm belief that she was connected with the Communist Party in some way. He stated that he was unable to furnish any specific information that would indicate that she was definitely a member of the Communist Party

or any of the Communist Party's front organizations. He stated that Communist Party activities were never discussed in any of the conversations that he has had with the subject but that he had always assumed that she knew of his Communist Party activities and that he had always felt that she was also associated in some way with the Forty.

Sympathies

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised on January 28, 1944 that RUTH HALBERTHAL, 1445 Madison Avenue, New York, New York, was known to have sent communications in 1943 to Governor DEWEY urging the release of MORRIS U. SCHAPPES.

The records of the Clerk of the General Sessions Court, County of New York, disclosed that MORRIS U. SCHAPPES, an instructor of English at the College of the City of New York, was dismissed from this position on March 15, 1944 following an investigation of Communism in the Educational System of New York by the Rapp-Coudert Joint Legislative Committee. At this hearing SCHAPPES admitted that he had been a member of the Communist Party and active as such on the college campus from 1935 to 1940. He testified specifically that during that period of his activity there were but four members of the City College unit of the Communist Party whereas other witnesses offered testimony showing that there were 50 members.

On the basis of this testimony SCHAPPES was indicted on four counts for giving false testimony before the Committee and was convicted on June 28, 1941 in the General Sessions Court, New York, New York, and was sentenced to serve 18 to 24 months in the State Prison.

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, in 1946 advised that RUTH HALBERTHAL was listed in the address book belonging to JOE and RAY ELSON. Contacted on June 22, 1947 by SAS R.F. O'KEEFE and J. R. SHINNERS, RAY ELSON admitted that she had been a member of the Communist Party for ten years.

Confidential Informant T-11, of unknown reliability, advised that one R. HALBERTHAL of 1445 Madison Avenue, New York City, contacted Mrs. LESTER KARG, Belmar, New Jersey in 1943.

Confidential Informant T-12, of known reliability, advised in 1945 that Mrs. LESTER KARG was a Communist Party member and that she was formerly one of the leading figures of the Shore Branch Communist Party of New Jersey.

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised on November 11, 1948 that RUTH HALBERTHAL had sent a communication to Federal Judge J. FOSTER SYMES, Denver, Colorado, urging the release of JANE ROGERS. The letter stated in part that it was demoralizing to realize that a young mother who seeks to protect her children's future by participating in political activities could suffer such a fate.

On September 23, 1948 JANE ROGERS was sentenced to four months in the custody of the Attorney General for criminal contempt by Judge J. FOSTER SYMES, United States District Court, Denver, Colorado because of her refusal to answer question propounded to her by the Federal Grand Jury.

Commencing immediately after the above sentence the New York "Daily Worker" and the "California Peoples World" carried the proceedings and instructed readers to write letters of protest to Judge SYMES requesting that he grant bail.

The "Daily Worker" is an East Coast Communist newsaper and the "California Peoples World" is the West Coast Communist newspaper.

SE CLINTON E. POLLOCK ascertained on January 15, 1953 that the records at the Board of Elections, Manhattan, New York, reflected the subject registered for the American Labor Party (ALP) for the years, 1944, 1947, 1948, 1949 and 1951. The records further reflected subject registered for one of the two major political parties in the years 1945, 1946 and 1950. No registration was indicated for 1952.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications", dated March 3, 1951, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., contains the following concerning the American Labor Party:

*American Labor Party

"1. 'For years, the Communists have put forth the greatest efforts to capture the entire American Labor Party throughout

"New York State. They succeeded in capturing the Manhattan and Brooklyn sections of the American Labor Party but outside of New York City they have been unable to win control. (Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, March 29, 1944, Page 78.)

*2. Among 'organizations that are victims of Communist domination.' (California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 1948, Pages 40 and 41.)

Confidential Informant T-4 advised on December 19, 1952 that the subject campaigned for VITO MARCANTONIO in the Campaign of 1949 or 1950 when MARCANTONIO was campaigning for re-election to Congress. The informant stated that the subject made a house to house campaign getting petitions signed and soliciting votes for MARCANTONIO.

VITO MARCANTONIO is a former American Labor Party Congressman from New York State.

MISCELLANEOUS

Confidential Informant T-2 advised on February 9, 1953 that he was unable to furnish any information of a subversive nature concerning the subject inasmuch as no definite action had been taken in the investigation of the subject due to the status of her health.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised on January 29, 1953 that an unknown lady told her in January 1953 that Mrs. ALSCHER must be a Communist because she had come to the lady's apartment in October 1952 crying and told her that she was being investigated by someone regarding her membership in some organization, which she belonged to when she was a child. The informant stated that she was told that Mrs. ALSCHER stated that she did not see why they were investigating her now for being a member and that she could not understand why the investigators were not trying to catch the "big fish."

T-1 further advised that she had no information at all concerning the organization that Mrs. ALSCHER referred to or any information about the so called "big fish." T-1 stated that she

did not recall the exact conversation with the lady but somehow she got the impression that Mrs. ALSCHER's job with the New York City Department of Education was in jeopardy and that the investigation was being conducted by the New York City Board of Education.

The following people were contacted in the neighborhood of 2175 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York, and they advised that they were unable to furnish any information concerning the subject's activities or any information that would indicate any disloyalty towards the United States by the subject.

Confidential Informants T-8, T-9 and T-10, all of known reliability, advised on February 27, 1953 that the subject was unknown to them.

The records of the Clerk's Office, United States District Court, Southern District of New York, Foley Square, New York, reflect that RUTH ALSCHER was subpoensed to appear before the Federal Grand Jury on February 27, and March 2, 1953.
