SYNOPSIS OF FACTS: Subject, a housewife, resides at 2270 Belmont Avenue, Long Beach, with husband who is an engineer at U.S. Naval Dry Docks, Terminal Island, Calif. Confidential sources advise subject presently a member of Long Beach CP Club, transferring her membership from Branch 6, Section 8, Bronx, N.Y., in June, 1943, where her CP book was 16267. Personal dat. and description set forth.

DETAILS:

This report is predicated upon information from confidential sources that the subject is presently a member of the Long Beach Communist Party Club and that during the first of 1943 she transferred her membership to the Harbor Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, from Branch 6, Section 8, Bronx, New York.

NAME

Source 1 advised that one SYLVIA DANZIGER is presently a member of the Long Beach Communist Party Club.

Source 2 advised that the husband of SYLVIA DANZIGER is named WILLIAM DANZIGER.

Source 1 has ascertained that the Communist Party membership book of SYLVIA DANZIGER bears in parentheses following the name DANZIGER, the name TUCKER.

RESIDENCE

Source 3 advised that the membership roster of the Long Beach Communist Party Club bore the name of SYLVIA DANZIGER with the address 2270 Belmont Avenue, Long Beach, California.

Source 2 advised that one WILLIAM DANZIGER resided at this address, and that the name of his wife was SYLVIA DANZIGER.

OCCUPATION

Source 1 ascertained that the subject is a housewife.

NATIONALISTIC TENDENCIES

Sources 1 and 4 advised that subject is presently a member of the Communist Party and that subject was a member of the Party in Bronx, New York, prior to the time of her arrival in Los Angeles.

SUMMARY OF ACTIVITY

Source 4 advised on June 23, 1943 that one SYLVIA DANZIGER had transferred her membership in the Communist Party from New York to Long Beach in the Harbor Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party.

On July 27, 1943, Special Agent HAROLD P. TRAPP conducted a surveillance at 315 East Eleventh Street, Long Beach, California, on the occasion of a meeting of the Communist Party in Long Beach. It is noted that confidential sources have advised that JEANNE KATZ, who served as Section Organizer of the Long Beach Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party prior to the time of the incorporation of the Long Beach Section into the Harbor Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party has stated this address was the regular meeting place of the Communist Party in Long Beach during the greater part of the year 1943.

Upon the occasion of this meeting, surveilling Agent observed a woman to alight from a Chevrolet Sedan bearing California license 78 R 192, and ascertained that she entered the place of meeting at 315 East Eleventh Street. It was subsequently determined that the above automobile was registered in the name of WILLIAM DANZIGER, who at that time resided at 905 Senate Drive, San Pedro, California.

On June 12, 1943, Source 5 made available an assignment card issued by the Communist Party, which bears the name of the subject and the address at 2270 Belmont, showing a transfer of subject from Branch 6, Section 8, Bronx, New York, to the Harbor Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party. This

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assignment card reflects that subject reported to the Los Angeles headquarters of the Communist Party on June 8, 1943. The same source made available a portion of a Communist Party transfer card which noted the book number of the subject as being Communist Party book #16267, and under date of March 29, 1943, reflects the transfer of subject from Branch 6, Section 8 (Br. So.). It is noted that the assignment card herein above described bears the following notation: "Wife. do not write in our name or address."

On January 4, 1944, Source 3 made available the membership mailing list of the Long Beach Communist Party Club, which reflects the name of the subject as receiving the mail sent out by said club.

[redacted] advised that a meeting of the Long Beach Communist Party Club was held at 1705 East Anaheim Street, Long Beach, California, on the evening of January 28, 1944, and that said meeting was the occasion for the election of officers for this club for the year 1944. This source advised that the subject was present at this meeting and participated in the election of officers. It is noted that at the time of this meeting CHARLES McLAUGHLAN, with aliases, was elected Chairman, RUTH TESTER was elected Membership Director, and CHARLOTTE BENOWITZ was elected Educational Director of the club. It is noted that the above individuals are presently serving as officers of this club. (b) 7 (d)

This source further advised that during the course of the meeting, GEORGE SANDY discussed the problems of recruiting new members into the Communist Party and suggested that the membership of the club should be placed in small groups which would engage in recruiting according to the area in which the members of the club reside. By way of identification, it is noted that GEORGE SANDY is presently the Financial Director of the Los Angeles County Communist Party, and that he has for some time and continues to serve as a liaison representative of the Los Angeles County Communist Party headquarters to the Long Beach Communist Party Club, and that he is presently carried on the roster of the Long Beach Communist Party Club.

[redacted] advised that a meeting of the Long Beach Communist Party Club was held at 1705 East Anaheim Street, Long Beach, on the evening of February 11, 1944, and that the subject was present upon the occasion of this meeting. This source ascertained that those present included CHARLES McLAUGHLAN, CHARLOTTE BENOWITZ and RUTH TESTER, all of whom have been identified above. (b) 7 (d)

This source further ascertained that GEORGE SANDY, referred to above, discussed the question of the change in the name of the Communist Party, and stated that the Party was now entering the fourth period of its political life in which it claimed general recognition by the people.

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On April 28, 1944, Source 1 made available the membership roster of the Long Beach Communist Party Club, and the name of the subject, together with the address 2270 Belmont Avenue, appeared upon such membership roster.

PERSONAL DATA

Source 2 advised that WILLIAM DANZIGER was the husband of the subject and presently resided at 2270 Belmont Avenue, Long Beach, California. This source advised that the former address of WILLIAM DANZIGER had been 905 Senate Drive, San Pedro, California. This source stated subject's husband was presently employed as an electrical engineer (P.4) at the United States Naval Dry Docks, Terminal Island, California, having transferred from the United States Navy Yard, New York, on March 31, 1943, where he had been employed in the Industrial Department, Planning Division, Navy Yard, New York, New York. This source further ascertained that his prior employment included that of a draftsman in the United States Navy Yard, New York, and employment from November, 1938 until August, 1941 in the Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C. as a Junior and Assistant Engineer.

This source further ascertained that WILLIAM DANZIGER was born at New York City, April 18, 1918, his parents being AARON DANZIGER and TILLIE SCHICKMAN DANZIGER, both of whom were born in Poland and apparently became naturalized United States citizens in May, 1920. This source advised that WILLIAM DANZIGER was registered under the Selective Training and Service Act with Local Draft Board 24, 1219 Good Hope Road, Washington, D. C.

Source 6 ascertained that WILLIAM DANZIGER, whose wife was named SYLVIA, became owner of the premises at 2270 Belmont Avenue, Long Beach, on or about May 28, 1943.

The title of this case has been marked changed to include the alias of SYLVIA SANDRA EHRLICH, the full maiden name of the Subject, and her married name, SYLVIA EHRLICH DANZIGER. Both of these names were obtained from personnel records of the Hecht Company, Seventh and F Streets, N. W., where the Subject was formerly employed.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that at one time, the Subject's name appeared on the membership list of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. Confidential Informant T-1 likewise advised that the Subject's husband's name, WILLIAM DANZIGER, also appeared on the same list.

Confidential Informant T-2 advised that the names of both the Subject and her husband appeared in the active indices of the Washington Chapter of the American Peace Mobilization.

A review of the Selective Service file of WILLIAM DANZIGER at Local Board #24, 1217 Good Hope Road S.E., reflected that the Subject and her husband were married at New York City, on November 27, 1938. It is noted that WILLIAM DANZIGER was placed in class 1-A by Local Board #24 on May 31, 1944, and this may mean that the Subject of instant investigation may change her address in the near future.

Miss GIOFFY in the personnel office of the Census Bureau at Sutland, Maryland, was telephonically contacted by the personnel office at the Department of Commerce Building, Fourteenth and Constitution Avenue, N. W., at which time Miss GIOFFY advised that records of the Census Bureau indicated that the Subject was born January 3, 1919, at New York City, and that she was employed as a card punch operator from November 20, 1940 to February 11, 1941. She resigned at this time because she felt that the hours of her employment interfered with her health and education.

The personnel records of the Hecht Company, Seventh and F Streets, N. W., were reviewed, and it was ascertained that the Subject was employed as a saleslady by that company from March 8, 1940, to November 14, 1940, and from July 30, 1941 to August 8, 1941, at which time she resigned because she was leaving the City. The records of the Hecht Company indicate that the Subject's full married name was SYLVIA EHRLICH DANZIGER, and that she was born January 3, 1919, at New York City. The Subject's maiden name was given as SYLVIA SANDRA EHRLICH. Her husband was listed as WILLIAM DANZIGER, and Washington, D. C. addresses were listed as 2517 K Street, N. W., 2819 S Street, S. E. Her Social Security number was given as 050-14-4152. The records also indicated that the Subject graduated from Morris High School in New York City, and that she attended but did not graduate from Hunter College in New York City. It is noted that the application blank of the Subject on file at the Hecht Company appears to be in her own handwriting, and should the Los Angeles office not have specimens of her handwriting, consideration should be given to securing photographic copies of the application blank on file at the Hecht Company. Records of the Hecht Company also indicate that the Subject had been employed by the Census Bureau and by the Railroad Retirement Board.

RUTH FREYER is the Membership Director of said club and CHARLOTTE BENOWITZ is the Executive Secretary of said club.

GEORGE SANDY is presently Financial Director of the Los Angeles County Communist Party, and has for a period of some months served as a liaison representative of the Los Angeles County Communist Party to the Long Beach Communist Club.

It is noted that JEANNE KATZ served as organizer of the Long Beach Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party prior to the time said section was incorporated into and became a part of the Harbor Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party.

Source 1 ascertained that the principal program of the meeting on this date included a talk by GEORGE SANDY regarding the political activities of the Communist Club in the California primaries, which were held on May 16, 1944, and that a discussion included the means of effecting a better organization for the political campaign in the November elections.

Source 1 ascertained that a regular meeting of the Long Beach Communist Club was held at 1705 East Anaheim, Long Beach, California, on the evening of June 6, 1944, and further ascertained that the subject was present on the occasion of this meeting. This source ascertained that among other persons present at this meeting were CHARLOTTE BENOWITZ, RUTH FREYER, and JEANNE KATZ, all of whom have been heretofore identified. This source further ascertained that one CHARLOTTE HULL was present at this meeting. By way of identification, the said CHARLOTTE HULL has for approximately one year, last past, served as manager of the Walt Whitman Book Store in Long Beach, California, one of several book stores sponsored and operated by the Los Angeles County Communist Party as outlets for propaganda and literature.

This source further ascertained that GEORGE LOHR, with aliases, was present on the occasion of this meeting and gave a report and discussion of the recent National Convention of the Communist Party, New York City. By way of identification, the said GEORGE LOHR is presently the Executive Secretary of the San Pedro Communist Club and is a functionary of the Los Angeles County Communist Party.

Source 1 further ascertained that a regular meeting of the Long Beach Communist Club was held at 1705 East Anaheim Street, Long Beach, California, on the evening of June 21, 1944, and that the subject was present on the occasion of said meeting. It was further ascertained by this source that among other persons present at said meeting were CHARLOTTE BENOWITZ, RUTH

KEETER, JAMES KATZ, and CHARLOTTE HULL, all of whom have been heretofore identified.

Source 1 ascertained that the principal program of the evening included a speech by one PATTIS FERRY, who discussed the place of the Communist Political Association in society, and its position in vital issues of the United States. By way of identification, FERRY, who is a Negro, is Chairman of the Los Angeles County Communist Party.

Source 1 has ascertained that the subject of instant case is to assist the Long Beach Communist Club in its proposed political activities in the 1944 election campaign.

The New York office advised Washington Field and Los Angeles by letter dated June 11, 1945 that it had been learned through a reliable confidential source in New York that one SYLVIA TUCKER had transferred from the Long Beach Branch of the Los Angeles County CPA to Washington, D. C., on March 20, 1945, her transfer number being 22518, membership book number 46429.

For the information of the Bureau and the Washington Field and New York offices, SYLVIA TUCKER is an alias of SYLVIA MELICH DANZIGER, subject of a Security Matter - C case in the Los Angeles office. She came to Long Beach, California in 1943 from New York City, where she had been a member of Branch 6, Section 8, of the Communist Party in Bronx, New York. Her husband, WILLIAM DANZIGER, was employed in 1944 as an electrical engineer at the U. S. Naval Dry Docks, Long Beach, California, having been transferred from the U. S. Navy Yard at New York City in 1943, where he had been employed as a draftsman. Prior to that, WILLIAM DANZIGER was an Assistant Engineer at the Bureau of Ordnance, U. S. Navy Department, Washington, D. C.

Investigation of SYLVIA DANZIGER, alias Sylvia Tucker, by the Los Angeles office, reveals she was active in Communist Party affairs of the Long Beach Branch during 1943-44 and was carried on the membership rolls of this Communist club as late as March 15, 1945.

No investigation has been conducted concerning her husband, WILLIAM DANZIGER, due to his employment by the Navy, and it is not known whether he, too, is a member of the CPA. However, on June 22, 1942, contact with the U. S. Navy Dry Docks at Long Beach reveals that WILLIAM DANZIGER was transferred to the Bureau of Ordnance, Washington, D. C., U. S. Navy Department, on April 30, 1945.

By memorandum dated November 15, 1944, the Bureau declined the preparation of a Security Index card relative to the subject at that time. However, a review of the file reveals that the New York and Washington Field Offices were furnished copies of the summary report of Special Agent HAROLD F. TRAPP, dated at Los Angeles, May 20, 1944. The New York Field Office file is 100-61653, and the Washington Field Office file is 100-3195.

The above is being furnished to the New York office for information purposes in case SYLVIA DANZIGER, alias Sylvia Tucker, should return there where she was a former member and for the further purpose of identifying SYLVIA TUCKER with the proper New York file.

In view of the employment of WILLIAM DANZIGER as an engineer with the Bureau of Ordnance, U. S. Navy Department, Washington, D. C., and his wife's

known Communist affiliations, it is requested that the Washington Field Office attempt to establish subject's present residence address through contact with the appropriate Navy authorities.

SYLVIA DANZIGER was interviewed 5/17/56, at her residence, 817 Doughty Ave., Franklin Square, LI, by SAs DONALD F. LORD and JOSEPH F. DIFFEY.

SYLVIA DANZIGER was unable to identify a photograph of MIRIAM ZEITLIN nor was she able to recall ever having heard of MIRIAM ZEITLIN or MIRIAM SEBORER. She indicated that she entered Bunter College in 1936, and when advised that MIRIAM ZEITLIN entered Hunter College in 1935, she stated that because of the large numbers of students in each class (approximately 900), she would have had no occasion to associate with MIRIAM ZEITLIN.

SYLVIA DANZIGER was also unable to identify photographs of OSCAR SEBORER, STUART J. SEBORER, or ANNA ZEITLIN.

WILLIAM DANZIGER was interviewed on 5/17/56, by SAs LORD and DIFFEY at the Continental Vending Machine Co., 956 Brush Hollow Road, Westbury, LI, where he is currently employed as an engineer in an administrative capacity.

DANZIGER attended CCNY from 1934 to 1939. STUART J. SEBORER attended CCNY from 1934 through 1939.
