


DETAILS:

Nikolai Nikolaevich Erchov was born in Russia on April 16, 1907. From 1930 to 1937, he attended and was a research analyst at the Research Institute in Moscow. He entered the United States at New York City on January 19, 1938, for the purpose of studying at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, from which he was graduated in 1940. From 1940 until his departure in 1942, he was an employee of the Amtorg Trading Corporation in New York City and as such is known to have been in Seattle, Washington; White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia; and Chicago. He departed from New York City for the Soviet Union on September 16, 1942.

Thomas L. Black, an admitted Soviet agent, has advised that during 1939 and 1940 he was in contact with a Soviet superior known only to him as "John." Black has identified his "John" as being identical with Erchov. According to Black, Erchov's chief interest was Trotskyite activity. He was not interested in securing information concerning industrial processes.

Photographs of Erchov were shown with negative results to various confidential informants with a knowledge of certain phases of Soviet espionage during the late 1930's and early 1940's, such as Elizabeth Bentley, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] investigation in the vicinity of Erchov's residences in the United States failed to establish any evidence of subversive activity on his part. On 7-26-54, [REDACTED] identified a photograph of [REDACTED] b7D

Since Erchov and his family departed from the United States for Russia in 1942, and since his exact whereabouts is unknown, he has not been placed on the Security Index. In view of this subject's departure from the United States in 1942, for the USSR, this case has not been presented to the Internal Security Division for prosecutive option. Pertinent reports in this case have been disseminated to PAB, State, and CIA. Inserts on Erchov for the [REDACTED] have been received and will be given the usual dissemination. Stops against the subject's re-entry into the United States were placed with the Bureau of Customs and INS on 8-9-54. → 1

By letter 10-5-54 New York advised its case on Erchov was considered closed. Review of Bureau references, as well as the subject's main file, failed to locate any information requiring further investigation.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the above, since all logical leads appear to have been covered and since the subject has been absent from the United States since 1942, it is recommended that this case be closed and that this memorandum be made a part of the subject's main file, 65-61847.

sure" that Nikolai Nikolaevich Erchov was [redacted] in

The Bureau has also noted that Erchov was identified
by Thomas L. Black as his Soviet superior who was known as
"John." He stated that "John" was his Soviet superior for
a short period in either 1939 or 1940 and it is noted that
the time element involved in the case of Thomas L. Black and
[redacted] corresponds. The type of information in which
"John" was interested, according to Thomas L. Black, also
corresponds with information furnished by [redacted] concerning Nikolai Erchov. b7D

In addition, [redacted] who was formerly
involved in Soviet espionage, has identified Erchov as a
Soviet agent known [redacted]

In view of the above facts and in the absence of
more concrete information that might indicate that [redacted] Erchov
was known to [redacted] the Bureau feels that
there is nothing to be gained by interviewing [redacted]
at this time. It should be kept in mind that [redacted] ten

The Bureau will be interested in any information that may be developed or received through any other sources that might serve as a sound basis for reinterviewing [redacted] in this matter. b7D

NOTE:

NY has raised the question as to whether there is a possibility that Akhmerov may have been the Soviet superior of [redacted]. NY letter indicates [redacted] was hesitant in identification of Erchov and never positively identified him. A review of the investigation involving [redacted] as well as the case involving Erchov indicates [redacted] in a signed statement indicated [redacted] "reasonably sure" that Erchov was the individual [redacted] in NY. It is also of interest to note that THOMAS L. BLACK had a Soviet superior who was known as "John" and that Black positively identified Erchov as "John." The same is true of [redacted] who identified Erchov as a Soviet agent [redacted]. b7D

In the absence of some concrete indication and due to the lapse of ten years time, it is not felt that there is anything to be gained by raising a question with [redacted] as to the possibility that Akhmerov rather than Erchov was [redacted]. b7D
