THOMAS L BLACK, WA., ESPIONAGE R. DURING THE COURSE OF THE INTERVIEW WITH THOMAS L. BLACK, HE STATED THAT HE WAS ACQUAINTED WITH ONE ROLAND KAPP, WHO WAS THEN EMPLOYED WITH THE NATIONAL OIL PRODUCTS COMPANY AND IS PRESENTLY HEAD OF THE FINE CHEMICAL DIVISION OF NOPCO CHEMICAL COMPANY. HE DESCRIBED KAPP AS BEING A GRADUATE OF COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY. IN NINETEEN THIRTY THREE, BLACK STATES THAT HE TOLD KAPP HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE CP. AT THAT TIME, KAPP TOLD BLACK THAT HE HAD BEEN A MEMBER AT ONE TIME OF THE WORKERS PARTY AND THAT AN OLD FRIEND OF HIS WAS ENGAGED IN UNDERGROUND ACTIVITY AT THAT TIME FOR THE CP. AT THAT TIME KAPP DID NOT IDENTIFY HIS FRIEND WHO WAS ENGAGED IN UNDERGROUND ACTIVITY. IN NINETEEN THIRTY NINE, BLACK ATTENDED THE TROTSKYITE CONVENTION IN CHICAGO AND LEARNED FROM FELIX MORROW OF THE DEFECTION OF WHITTAKER CHAMBERS AND HIS REVEALING HIS SOVIET ESPIONAGE ACTIVITY TO ARMY INTELLIGENCE. THOMAS L BLACK, ESPIONAGE R. GOLD ADVISED TODAY THAT HE RECALLED BLACK

RELATING TO HIM AN ASSIGNMENT BLACK RECEIVED FROM THE SOVIETS TO AS-
CERTAIN THE RESIDENCE OF MAN WHOM BLACK DESCRIBED AS TROTSKY-S

PRINCIPAL AGENT IN THE US. BLACK TOLD GOLD THAT THIS MAN WENT UNDER

VARIOUS ALIASES AND WAS A YOUNG MAN. BLACK SAID THAT HE FREQUENTLY

TAILED THIS MAN IN AN ATTEMPT TO ASCERTAIN HIS RESIDENCE. ON ONE

OCCASION BLACK TOLD THAT HE HAD TAILED A MAN AWAY FROM A MEETING AND

WATCHED HIM GET IN A CAR AND BLACK OBTAINED THE LICENSE NUMBER.

GOLD WILL BE QUESTIONED TOMORROW FOR FURTHER DETAILS CONCERNING HIS ASSOCIATION WITH KANE.

There is attached a memorandum to the Attorney General requesting the Department's views as to what further action should be taken with respect to Thomas L. Black in view of their ruling that insufficient evidence was available on which to initiate prosecutive action against Black, and their recommendation that the interviews which had been conducted on June 15 and 16, 1950, should be terminated in order that any admissions made by Black would be thereafter admissible.

It is believed that the thought McInerney, Whearty and Kneip had in mind when they recommended discontinuance of the interview with Black on June 16, 1950, was that, through such discontinuance, any subsequent claim by Black or his attorney that he was in custody during the questioning would be nullified because his return to his home and the cessation of the interview would clearly reflect that he was not in custody and any statements made by him were made voluntarily and not as a result of his being in custody, technically or otherwise.

At 8:30 PM on June 16, 1950, the Philadelphia Office was telephonically instructed to discontinue the interview with Black. The interview was discontinued at approximately 7:00 PM on June 16, 1950, and Black was placed under surveillance at once. It is noted that by teletype dated June 17, 1950, the Philadelphia Office referred to information obtained from Black. This information was furnished by Black prior to the discontinuance of the interview on June 16th.

It might be noted that Black called the Newark Office at 1:45 AM on June 17, 1950, at which time he stated he did not desire to be picked up for interview on Monday morning by the Philadelphia Agents, and that he wished to come to the Philadelphia Office at his convenience during the early part of the week in that he had obligations to his job and that he wanted to be rested so that he could think clearly in the interest of truth and be able to organize his thoughts. He stated he desired to be interviewed further and wished to make corrections and additions to previous statements and also to make statements regarding things which he previously had not mentioned but which had come to his mind since the interview was terminated.

On the morning of June 16, 1950, Mr. Ladd, Supervisor Lamphere and Mr. Belmont consulted with Mr. James McInerney, Mr. Raymond P. Whearty and Mr. George Kneip, of the Department, relative to the case of Thomas L. Black. The memorandum to the Attorney General, setting forth available information concerning Black, dated June 16, 1950, was furnished to Mr. McInerney. All three Department representatives studied the information contained in the memorandum to the Attorney General. They were all in agreement that there was insufficient information at this point to file charges against Black for violation of the Espionage Statute, inasmuch as in their opinion Black as yet has not admitted intent, nor espionage activities, particularly of a nature that would come within the wartime Espionage Statute. They were likewise of the opinion that the concealment from authorities by Black of his knowledge that Gold was the American contact with Fuchs was insufficient to enable successful prosecution for misprision of a felony. They based their opinion on the fact that previous court decisions have held that an affirmative act on the part of the defendant is necessary showing concealment of evidence and that the mere concealment of knowledge is insufficient to stand up under the Statute.

Mr. McInerney, et al, were advised that we started questioning Black on the morning of June 15, and continued our questioning until the night of June 15, at which time Black, in writing, expressed the desire to remain with Agents of the Bureau until he had furnished all information in his possession. As a consequence, Black stayed at the Benjamin Franklin Hotel in Philadelphia last night in the company of Agents. They were informed that Agents are continuing the interview with Black in the Philadelphia Office this morning.

Mr. McInerney was asked whether the Department would consider it advisable to file charges against Black if he should furnish additional information today which, in effect, constituted an admission on his part of espionage activities which would not be barred by the Statute of Limitations. All three Department representatives were of the opinion that even though Black has remained voluntarily with the Agents, the period of time since Agents first started to question him would mitigate against the admissibility of any statement he might make at this time. They advised, however, that should Black give a statement, admitting espionage activities, this statement would be admissible if Black were released for a period after the statement was given and charges placed against him subsequent to his release. They suggested that the questioning continue as long as Black voluntarily desired to give information, at least for today. They further suggested that it would be desirable to cease the questioning, perhaps tonight, and resume questioning on a voluntary basis on Monday morning. They were of the opinion that any statement Black might give yesterday, today or when the questioning is resumed, would thus be admissible.

In the event you agree, the Philadelphia Office will be advised to adopt this course. In such event, a physical surveillance will be maintained, over the week-end, of Black.

Instructions have been given to the Philadelphia Office to interview Ferdinand Heller, who, you will recall, was associated with Black and who very probably will be in a position to furnish information concerning Black's activities. Instructions have also been given to the Philadelphia Office to fully explore every investigative lead concerning Black and to handle such leads with other offices by telephone or teletype for immediate attention.

In the event you agree with the above procedure, please advise.

KIDDER. BLACK INTRODUCED HELLER TO VERA KANE. IN THIRTYTHREE, HELLER
AND BLACK BECAME INTERESTED IN GOING TO THE SOVIET UNION TO SECURE
EMPLOYMENT. HELLER WENT TO AMTORG AND LATER TOOK BLACK TO MEET

AND SHOW HIM THE TYPE OF WORK THAT THEY WERE WORKING ON AT THEIR CURRENT EMPLOYMENT. IN THIS CONNECTION, BLACK ADMITTED SECURING THE DESCRIPTION OF PROCESSES THAT WERE AVAILABLE TO HIM AT THE NATIONAL OIL PRODUCTS CO: PARENS NOPCO PARENS. BLACK WOULD FURNISH TO HELLER, WHO AT THAT TIME WAS UNEMPLOYED, THE FORMULA, THE PROCEDURE FOR MIXING, AND THE SALES LITERATURE DEMONSTRATING THE USE OF THE MATERIAL AND A SAMPLE OF THE PARTICULAR MATERIAL. HELLER WOULD WRITE A COMPREHENSIVE REPORT FROM BLACK-S NOTES AND THE FINAL REPORT WOULD BE TYPED BY VERA KANE. BLACK AND HELLER WOULD THEN TURN THE FINISHED PRODUCT OVER TO OVAKIMIAN EITHER AT AMTORG OR AT SOME PREARRANGED RESTAURANT OR MEETING PLACE. BLACK ADMITS THAT HE MET OVAKIMIAN ABOUT TWELVE TIMES AND THAT HELLER MET HIM ABOUT NINE TIMES. OVAKIMIAN BECAME IMPATIENT AS THE PREPARING OF THESE REPORTS WAS TIME-CONSUMING, AND CAME TO VERA KANE-S APARTMENT ONE NIGHT WHILE KANE, HELLER AND BLACK WERE PRESENT AND TOOK ALL OF THE MATERIAL THAT BLACK HAD SECURED FROM NOPCO, STATING THAT IT WAS TAKING THEM TOO LONG, AND THAT THE SOVIETS HAD COMPETENT CHEMISTS WHO WOULD ~~BE~~ BE ABLE TO PREPARE THE REPORT. COULD FILL SPECIFIC ASSIGNMENTS HAVING TO DO WITH CHEMISTRY. AS AN EXAMPLE, HE ASKED FOR A DEMULSIFIER OF PETROLEUM EMULSIONS. BLACK FURNISHED A REPORT ON THIS FROM LIBRARY RESEARCH AND REFUSED PAYMENT FOR IT. PRIOR TO THE TIME HELLER LOST INTEREST, HE HAD SUGGESTED TO BLACK THAT THE PENNSYLVANIA SUGAR COMPANY HAD A NUMBER OF PROCESSES IN WHICH THE SOVIETS MIGHT BE INTERESTED AND THAT SECURING THESE PROCESSES MIGHT HELP IN THEIR CAMPAIGN TO GET RUSSIAN EMPLOYMENT. IN THIRTYFOUR, HELLER, THEREFORE, SUGGESTED THAT HARRY GOLD, WHO WAS AGAIN EMPLOYED AT PENN SUGAR, MIGHT BE ABLE TO FURNISH THIS INFORMATION. HELLER CONTACTED GOLD, WHO SHOWED AN INTEREST. GOLD THEN CAME TO NEW YORK, WHERE BLACK MET HIM. HELLER WAS NOT ~~ON~~ PRESENT HAVING BY THIS TIME DROPPED OUT OF THE SCHEME. BLACK INTRODUCED HARRY GOLD TO

PETERSEN AND DOES NOT THINK THAT GOLD EVER MET OVAKIMIAN. PRIOR TO THE INTRODUCTION OF GOLD, BLACK SUBMITTED A ~~BLACK~~ BACKGROUND SKETCH OF GOLD TO PETERSEN. BLACK SAID AT THIS POINT EVENTS TOOK PLACE RATHER RAPIDLY AND THAT THE CHANGE FROM OVAKIMIAN TO PETERSEN AS THE CONTACT, BLACK-S INTRODUCTION TO PETERSEN AND HARRY GOLD-S INTRODUCTION TO PETERSEN ALL TOOK PLACE WITHIN A VERY SHORT PERIOD. EARLY IN HIS CONTACT WITH BLACK, PETERSEN DISCUSSED PAYMENT FOR SERVICES RENDERED AND LEFT NO DOUBT IN BLACK-S MIND THAT HE EXPECTED BLACK TO ENGAGE IN ESPIONAGE WORK FOR THE SU. SINCE BLACK HAD REFUSED CASH PAYMENTS, PETERSEN OFFERED TO PAY HIS EXPENSES AND TO MAKE GIFTS. PETERSEN GAVE HIM, PROBABLY AT THE SUGGESTION OF HARRY GOLD, A SET OF QUOTE THE CHEMISTRY AND TECHNOLOGY OF OIL, FATS AND WAXES UNQUOTE, A STANDARD CHEMICAL PUBLICATION, PUBLISHED BY THE MAC MILLAN CO. A SIMILAR SET WAS GIVEN TO GOLD BY PETERSEN. PETERSEN ALSO SPECIFICALLY REQUESTED BLACK TO SUBMIT BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES ON FIVE PEOPLE. THESE WERE BLACK HIMSELF, FRED P. ~~HELLER~~, DR. CARL T. STEIK, RUSSIAN-BORN DIRECTOR OF RESEARCH AT INOPCO,

VERA KANE AND ERNEST ~~SEGESSEMAN~~. CLAIMS HE FEARED REPRISALS BY SOVIET AGENTS DURING HIS CONFINEMENT. AFTER HE HAD ~~WENT TO~~ SUFFICIENTLY RECOVERED, HE CALLED HARRY GOLD BY TELEPHONE AT PHILA., ASKING HARRY TO VISIT HIM AT HOSPITAL. DURING GOLD-S VISIT BLACK ASKED GOLD TO TELL SOVIETS WHERE HE WAS AND THAT HE WOULD NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR SOME TIME. GOLD MADE ~~ENR~~ SECOND VISIT WHICH WAS PURELY SOCIAL. AND IN HAVING BLACK HEAL AS RAPIDLY AS POSSIBLE BECAUSE HE HAD A VERY IMPORTANT ASSIGNMENT. HE ASKED IF BLACK NEEDED MONEY AND WAS TOLD NO. SCHWARTZ INSISTED ON BLACK HAVING CONSULTATION WITH BEST AVAILABLE DERMATOLOGIST OR PLASTIC SURGEON. SAID MONEY WAS NO OBJECT. GAVE BLACK ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS ~~STAX~~ CASH IN TEN DOLLAR BILLS.

TO ILLUSTRATE THAT HE DID NOT INTEND TO ESCAPE WHILE PRESENT INTERVIEWS ARE IN PROGRESS AND THAT HE COULD HAVE ESCAPED SOMETIME AGO, BLACK RELATED FOLLOWING STORY. ON A DATE WHICH HE BELIEVES WAS MONDAY, MAY TWENTYSECOND LAST, HE RECEIVED BUT NOT DIRECTLY A TELEPHONE CALL AT THE BERG LABORATORIES FROM A MISS WATKINS. AFTER SOME INSISTENCE BY CONTACT JACK, BLACK TURNED OVER TO JACK A REPORT ON THE MANUFACTURE OF SORBITOL FROM SORBOSE, THE SOURCE OF VITAMIN C. BELIEVES THIS REPORT TURNED OVER IN NINETEEN FORTYTHREE. BLACK ALSO ACCOMPANIED THIS REPORT WITH A CULTURE OF SORBITOL: INFO FOR REPORT SECURED FROM BLACK- S CONTACT WITH FELLOW EMPLOYEE AT NOPCO WHO HAD NO IDEA BLACK PREPARING REPORT. BLACK- S INFO INCOMPLETE DUE TO SECRECY EMPLOYED BY FELLOW EMPLOYEE.

BLACK GAVE REPORT TO JACK AT NEW YORKER HOTEL IN FALL OF FORTYTHREE, WHERE BLACK REGISTERED USING OWN NAME AND CORRECT ADDRESS, SEVENTEEN HUDSON ST., NEWARK, N. J. BELIEVES REGISTERED AT HOTEL ON FRIDAY NIGHT NEXT DAY BLACK TURNED OVER TO JACK IN AN ITALIAN RESTAURANT ON TWELFTH STREET THE CULTURE OF SORBITOL, WHICH WAS PACKED IN ICED CULTURE TUBE IN FIVE GALLON THERMOS JUG. JACK HAD MADE ARRANGEMENTS TO SHIP THIS JUG BY AIR TO RUSSIA. BLACK CLAIMS ONLY PAYMENT RECEIVED FOR THIS REPORT WAS ACTUAL EXPENSES OF EIGHT OR NINE DOLLARS, FIVE DOLLARS OF WHICH REPRESENTED COST OF JUG. JACK PLEASED WITH REPORT AND ASSIGNED BLACK TO REPORT ON PRODUCTION OF PENICILLIN AND PURIFICATION FOR MEDICAL USE. THIS WAS SHORTLY AFTER ANNOUNCEMENT OF DISCOVERY OF PENICILLIN IN PRESS. BLACK SPENT LONG PERIOD READING AVAILABLE LITERATURE AND PREPARING REPORT WHICH HE SAYS WAS INCOMPLETE. ACTUALLY TURNED OVER SERIES OF SHORT SUMMARIES OF TECHNICAL LITERATURE BEFORE FINAL REPORT. ALSO MADE MICROFILM COPIES OF MEDICAL LITERATURE ON PENICILLIN USING THIRTYFIVE MM. CONTAX CAMERA. BLACK ALSO GAVE JACK CULTURES OF PENICILLIUM NOTATUM IN TUBES WHICH JACK SAID HE WOULD HAVE PACKED FOR SHIPMENT. EXCHANGE OF REPORT TOOK PLACE AT CHILD- S RESTAURANT IN FORTYSECOND STREET AREA OF NY. JACK PAID BLACK ACTUAL EXPENSES AMOUNTING TO LESS THAN TEN DOLLARS.

FOLLOWING THIS REPORT THERE WAS PERIOD OF INACTIVITY, DURING WHICH JACK PRINCIPALLY URGED BLACK TO LEAVE NOPCO AND GET JOB IN KEY CHEMICAL PLANT.

IN JUNE FORTYFOUR BLACK DISCHARGED BY NOPCO FOR POOR WORK CAUSED, ACCORDING TO BLACK, BY HIS NERVOUS CONDITION RESULTING FROM PRESSURE FROM JACK. FOLLOWING DISCHARGE BLACK LIVED ON INCOME AS CONSULTANT FOR FINE ORGANICS, AMOUNTING TO THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS PER YEAR PAID IN QUARTERLY INSTALLMENTS OF SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS. BLACK SAYS JACK DID NOT KNOW OF FINE ORGANICS EMPLOYMENT AND ASSUMED HE WAS UNEMPLOYED. JACK OFFERED MONTHLY PAYMENTS TO FINANCE BLACK SO HE COULD TAKE ALL TIME NECESSARY TO GET ACCEPTABLE JOB. JACK PARTICULARLY URGED APPLICATION AT KELLEX, THIS TIME GIVING INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING PERSON TO SEE AND STORY TO TELL. FROM THIS BLACK BELIEVES THAT SOVIETS EITHER HAD PLACED MAN IN KELLEX OR THEIR AGENTS HAD APPLIED AND KNEW PROCEDURE. LAST CONTACT WITH JACK IN THIS PERIOD WAS IN LATE SUMMER NINETEEN FORTYFIVE AT STEWARTS PAREN PHONETIC PAREN CAFETERIA, SEVENTH AVE. AND TWENTYTHIRD ST., NYC. THIS WAS SHORT MEETING. THOMAS L. BLACK was interviewed at the Philadelphia Office on the evening of July 11, 1950. He had not been interviewed on the previous night. On July 11, BLACK advised the interviewing agents that FRED HELLER had told him the previous day that Dr. JOSEPH SKILTON committed suicide on Friday, July 7. BLACK said that the SKILTON family had made every attempt to keep the story quiet and no indication of it had appeared in the newspapers beyond a routine death notice which first appeared on Saturday night, July 8.

Upon examination of the July 8 issue of the Philadelphia "Evening Bulletin," a death notice was found which said that Dr. JOSEPH D. SKILTON died suddenly at his home at 26 Roseland Avenue Fox Chase Manor, and that the funeral would be held Tuesday, July 11.

BLACK said he had not been to the funeral but that he had attended the viewing at a funeral parlor on the evening of July 10. He had been able to secure few details of the circumstances except that SKILTON had locked himself in the bathroom of his home and stabbed himself in the abdomen. BLACK also said that he had known SKILTON for a good many years and was convinced that SKILTON was a manic depressive, subject to fits of extreme despondency. In addition, BLACK said that he knew that for a number of years SKILTON had been addicted to the use of nitrous oxide (laughing gas) as a drug. He explained that inhalation of nitrous oxide produces a "jag." BLACK knew of no reason why SKILTON should have committed suicide except what he might have imagined.

BLACK had learned from HELLER that SKILTON had come to the conclusion that BLACK's purpose in giving him some air-conditioning equipment for his office was to provide an excuse for BLACK to use the office as a meeting place for espionage activities. BLACK also said that SKILTON seemed to believe that HELLER addressed a letter to BLACK from Europe in care of SKILTON in order to make SKILTON's home a mail drop.

It appeared from BLACK's story that SKILTON considered himself the victim of a plot concocted by BLACK and HELLER.

At the conclusion of the interview with BLACK on July 11, he said he wished to take up the matter of FRED HELLER. He then explained that he was convinced that HELLER seriously contemplates suicide. He explained that he had once before seen HELLER in the same state of mind. This was about 1934 when HELLER broke up his affair with VERA KANE and was in an extremely depressed state of mind, drinking heavily and threatening suicide. At that time BLACK persuaded him not to.

According to BLACK, HELLER has a completely neurotic personality. HELLER's brother told BLACK on July 10 that for at least a week HELLER has been drinking as much as two bottles of liquor a day. BLACK emphasized that when HELLER gets under the influence of liquor he is completely unaccountable and may do almost anything. For the past several days HELLER has been having a continuing quarrel with his mother, blaming her for all of his present troubles. HELLER claims that had he been properly brought up he would not be in his present situation. HELLER's wife, whom he married about ten days ago, probably knows nothing of HELLER's present state of mind and BLACK is sure that HELLER has not confided in her about his past activities. BLACK said on the evening of July 11 that he would make an attempt to see HELLER and have a talk with him, attempting to persuade him that there was no necessity of suicide.

On the morning of July 12, BLACK advised Agent HOLMES that he had been unsuccessful in persuading HELLER to talk with him. HELLER said he plans to spend a couple of weeks in the mountains and if he is unable to regain control of himself, will "take the same step that JOE did."

BLACK appeared to feel that there is nothing further that can be done, since none of HELLER's family have any influence over him.

This pamphlet reflected this conference was to be held at 1016 North Dearborn Street and that the hotels to be used by the delegates to this conference were the Mark Twain Hotel, 111 West Division Street, Chicago, and the Wacker Hotel, 109 West Huron Street, Chicago, Illinois.

Chicago T-2, of known reliability, advised that the names THOMAS L. BLACK or TOM JONES were not among the known delegates to this plenum conference of the SWP held in Foresters' Hall, 1016 North Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois, on September 27, 28, and 29, 1940. The informant advised that some of the delegates to this conference were known to have stayed at the Wacker Hotel, 109 West Huron Street, and at the Mark Twain Hotel, 111 West Division Street, both Chicago, Illinois.

Mr. LEON BLONBERG, manager of the Wacker Hotel, 109 West Huron Street, and Miss NORA HALVERSON, Clerk, Mark Twain Hotel, 111 West Division Street, made available the registrations of the delegates to the SWP plenum conference held on September 27, 28, and 29, 1940 which registrations did not reflect the names TOM JONES or THOMAS L. BLACK nor did any of these registrations reflect the address of 17 Oxford Street, Newark, New Jersey.
