SYNOPSIS OF FACTS: On 6/30/55, Department advised institution of prosecution against subject for failure to comply with registration provisions of Foreign Agents Registration Act not warranted at this time.

DETAILS: On June 30, 1955 the Department of Justice advised that the institution of prosecution against subject for failure to comply with the registration provisions of the Foreign Agents Registration Act is not warranted at this time. The Department of Justice pointed out that investigation has failed to establish that the person who directed the subject to go to Cleveland, Ohio, for the purpose of warning a member of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus, was in fact a member of that espionage group.

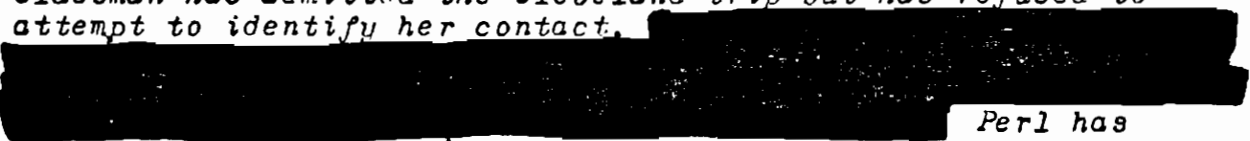

By attached report SA Walter P. Gavin made at New York 9-21-55 New York office places the instant case in a closed status. (u)

Glassman born 1-30-19 in New York City of Russian-born parents. Obtained B.A. degree from Hunter College, New York City, and M.A. degree from Columbia University School of Social Science in 1946. Employed U. S. Army Signal Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, Jewish Board of Guardians, United Service for new Americans and Long Island College Hospital, Brooklyn, New York. She is married to Ernest Pataki, an engineer. (u)

Subject was a close friend of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, executed Soviet agents. Was fiancee of Joel Barr and close friend of Alfred Sarant, members of the Rosenberg network. In July of 1950 an unknown man contacted subject gave her \$2,000 cash and instructions for fleeing the U. S. and told her to deliver both items to William Perl in Cleveland, Ohio. Subject, under an assumed name, flew to Cleveland and contacted Perl who refused to accept either the money or the instructions. Glassman has admitted the Cleveland trip but has refused to attempt to identify her contact.



Perl has substantiated Glassman's story of the Cleveland trip. Glassman was a member of the Young Communist League and admitted to an informant in 1951 she was a member of the Communist Party (S)

The Department requested subject's registration under the terms of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938 and she did not reply. The Department advised the evidence (u)

In accordance with memorandum to all Supervisors in the Domestic Intelligence Division dated April 13, 1956, consideration has been given to the possibility of use of the terms of the Immunity Act in connection with the investigation of persons involved in the Rosenberg espionage ring. By letter to Mr. Tompkins dated September 3, 1954, his attention was called to the Rosenberg espionage ring and it was suggested he might wish to consider utilizing the terms of this bill in connection with this ring. (u)

In connection with this review, it is believed Vigian Glassman, Pataki and William Perl could possibly furnish information concerning the operations of the Rosenberg apparatus. Pataki was utilized as a courier to contact Perl in Cleveland, Ohio, and furnish him with money and instructions on how to flee the U.S. She has admitted making this trip to Cleveland upon instructions of an unknown man. She has refused to identify this person and has refused to make any attempt of an identification. She was formerly the fiancée of Joel Barr, member of the Rosenberg ring who left the United States in 1948. She was a close associate of Alfred Sarant who fled the U.S. in 1950 after preliminary questioning by Bureau Agents. She was also a close friend of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. (u)



He denied knowing Rosenbergs and Sobell when testifying before a Federal Grand Jury and was convicted of perjury in 1953. He is now serving a 5-year term. (S)

He could furnish us with information concerning his espionage operations and his method of transmitting his information to Rosenberg. Glassman, it is believed, would be able to furnish information concerning the activities of Barr, Sarant and the Rosenbergs. (u)

It is felt since this matter has been called to the attention of the Department prior to this time that it is not necessary at this time to furnish information about specific cases to the Department. (u)

Mrs. ERNEST PATAKI, resides in apartment 3F, 62-15 53rd Avenue, Maspeth, Long Island, New York, with her husband and child. Mr. BURSELL added that this address is designated as building number 3 in the Ridgewood Gardens project.

Mr. BURSELL stated that the PATAKI's pay \$74.25 rent per month for their apartment and appear to be quiet tenants. Mr. BURSELL stated that he notices subject about the premises of the project quiet frequently and believes her duties as housewife and mother occupy her full time. He further stated that nothing has come to his attention which would indicate subject was engaged in any subversive activity.

T-1, who has known VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM for many years, but contact with whom has been insufficient to judge reliability, advised on May 9, 1956, that VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM is a Communist or Communist sympathizer. T-1 stated that VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM would take the part of Soviet Russia in any discussion and had solicited signatures for the Stockholm Peace Petition.

T-1 further stated that ANITA FRUCHTBAUM SALISBURY, VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM's sister, was divorced from Dr. BRUCE SALISBURY in December, 1954, but she continues to use her former husband's name. N 11

T-1 stated that VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM and VIVIAN GLASSMAN were close friends and had worked together at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. T-1 further stated that ANITA FRUCHTBAUM SALISBURY had met VIVIAN GLASSMAN several times on social occasions through her sister, VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM.

T-1 learned that sometime in 1949, VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM told ANITA FRUCHTBAUM SALISBURY that she had mailed a package for JUDY COPLON at the request of VIVIAN GLASSMAN. T-1 stated that ANITA FRUCHTBAUM SALISBURY chided VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM for having anything to do with COPLON, but VIVIAN stated she would do what she pleased.

In connection with ANITA FRUCHTBAUM SALISBURY, T-1 stated that she shares the same political views as her sister, but is less vocal about it.

A Communist - sympathizer

On March 13, 1953, Mrs. VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM CARLIN was contacted at her residence, 0-67, Fairlawn Parkway, Fairlawn, New Jersey, by SAS WINFRED ELDER JESTER and STUART E. CHALIFOUX. When advised of the identity of the agents, VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM CARLIN requested to know the nature of the interview and when advised that they wished to talk to her concerning persons she had been employed with at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, in 1942 and 1943, she stated that this employment had taken place so long ago, that she did not feel she would be able to furnish the agents with any information.

The agents thereupon advised her that they would like to ask her some questions concerning VIVIAN GLASSMAN. Mrs. CARLIN again stated that it had been so long since she had worked with GLASSMAN, that she did not feel she would be able to furnish any information. At this point, the agents requested that she at least give them the opportunity of asking her the questions, to which she again gave the same answer. Mrs. CARLIN was then asked if she would prefer not to speak to the agents at all and she answered yes.

ANITA FRUCHTBAUM SALISBURY, 425 Central Park West, New York City, was interviewed at her place of employment, J. P. Foley and Company, 50 East 42nd Street, New York City, on June 26, 1956, by SAS RICHARD T. HRADSKY and ROBERT W. COHOLAN. Mrs. SALISBURY stated that she met VIVIAN GLASSMAN through her sister, VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM. She advised that during the war, her sister and GLASSMAN worked at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, and lived together. She would meet GLASSMAN when she visited her sister. She stated she did not get to know GLASSMAN very well, and has not seen her for over ten years.

In response to an inquiry whether she knew if GLASSMAN was a Communist, she stated it was a ridiculous question as she would have no way of knowing GLASSMAN's political beliefs. She was also asked whether her sister, VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM, was a Communist. She stated that this also was a ridiculous question as her sister entertained no Communist beliefs whatsoever, and no one was in a better position to know this than she.

She further stated that neither her sister nor VIVIAN GLASSMAN knew JUDITH COPLON. It was pointed out that they could be friends of COPLON without her knowledge, but she scoffed at this and stated that it would be extremely unlikely.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," dated May 14, 1951, prepared and released by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., contains the following concerning the Stockholm Peace Petition:

"Stockholm Peace Petition

- "1. Cited as Communist.
(Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities, interim statement issued on the Communist 'Peace Petition' Campaign July 13, 1950.)"

JUDITH COPLON was found guilty June 30, 1949, in the District of Columbia of violating Sections 793 and 2071, Title 18, United States Code.

The Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia on June 1, 1951, remanded the case for a hearing on whether there had been an interception of telephone calls between COPLON and her attorney. This hearing has not been held.

JUDITH COPLON was convicted in the Southern District of New York on March 7, 1950 and was sentenced March 9, 1950 for violating Section 794, Title 18, United States Code and conspiracy to violate Section 793, 794 and 2071, Title 18, United States Code. These convictions involved espionage activities for Soviet Russia.

With regard to the above conviction the Circuit Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit reversed the conviction on December 5, 1950 and remanded the case for a new trial.

The United States Supreme Court on January 28, 1952 refused to review either decision on Writs of Certiorari.

JUDITH COPLON has not been retried.

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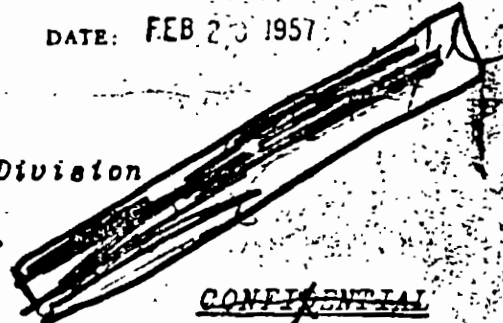

Reference is made to your memorandum dated January 16, 1957, concerning the captioned matter in which you advise this Division that in the event further interview of William Perl is desired, such interview should be handled by Department representatives.

A review of the material available concerning the Rosenberg espionage apparatus, including separate reports on Vivian Glassman Pataki and Maxwell Finestone, has been conducted for the purpose of determining the status of the individuals concerned under the provisions of Public Law 893, 84th Congress, 2nd Session, enacted August 1, 1956; and whether the Immunity Act, 18 U.S.C. 3486, as amended, should be utilized in an effort to obtain evidence which would warrant the solicitation of registration under Public Law 893, of any of the individuals allegedly involved in this apparatus.

In this connection, it was deemed advisable to consider the feasibility of interviewing William Perl while he was still in custody for the purpose of offering him immunity from prosecution in exchange for his cooperation in furnishing information which might establish that Vivian Glassman Pataki and Maxwell Finestone were acting under an espionage assignment.

However, in the light of the information contained in your memorandum with reference to the feasibility of interviewing William Perl, while still in custody, it is felt that no useful purpose would be further served by conducting such interview.

Accordingly, no attempt will be made to solicit the registration under Public Law 893 of any of the individuals allegedly involved in the Rosenberg group unless additional information is received which would establish that such individuals come within the purview of the aforesaid statute.

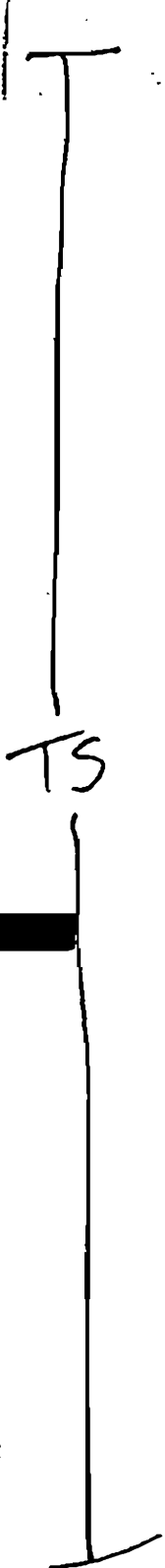
