All persons who are citizens and residents of this State, now employed in the Emergency Relief Bureau of this city, who are presently or hitherto have been assigned to work which is fundamentally of a clerical nature, (exclusive of work as telephone operator, type copyist, stenographer, secretary-stenographer, calculating or tabulating machine operator), will be admitted to this examination without regard to the preliminary requirements hereinafter set forth. Eligibles who meet the preliminary requirements as to age and education will be certified from the eligible list in order of their standing to positions in the Emergency Relief Bureau or its successor in the Department of Public Welfare or to positions in other city departments. Those who do not meet such preliminary requirements will be certified when reached in their regular order for positions in the Emergency Relief Bureau, or its successor, only.

In addition, under the terms of the decision of the court in Grout vs. Finegan, N. Y. Law Journal, Dec. 28, 1936, persons who do not meet the preliminary requirements hereinafter set forth, but who have had "experience with" although not employed by the Department of Public Welfare or the B. of Child Welfare and are now with said departments as Clerks, may file applications within the time specified. Such persons will be given CONDITIONAL ADMISSION to the examination, the condition being that in the event that the decision in Grout vs. Finegan is finally reversed upon appeal such conditional admissions will be voided, and the names of such persons stricken from any eligible list promulgated as a result of this examination.

Salary: Grade 2, \$1200 to but not including \$1800 per annum; Grade 1, below \$1200, usually \$840; pension; fair leave.

Vacancies: Occur from time to time in all city departments in Grade 2, \$1200. There are approximately 3200 positions in Grade 1 and Grade 2 in the Emergency Relief Bureau at salaries ranging from \$78 to \$145 monthly. There were 186 appointments from the last list at Grade 1, and 186 at Grade 2.

Ages: 18 through 25 on closing date of receipt of applications.

Duties: Under supervision, to perform clerical tasks, such as filing of various kinds, preparing or checking records, reports, involving entry or tabulation of figures, making simple graphs, answering questions, or giving information in person or by telephone, and other general clerical work as required; or under supervision, to direct the work of a small group of clerks in the performance of clerical work of a similar character but of a lesser degree of difficulty.

Requirements: Applicants must be graduates of a senior High School or have its equivalent.

Subjects and Weights: Written examination, Wt. 7, 75% required on each part; Experience, Wt. 3; 75% general average required. The written examination will include tests of mental alertness, reasoning ability, capacity to follow written directions, office forms and practice, spelling, grammar, vocabulary, arithmetic, tabulation and simple graphic representation, knowledge of civic affairs and other appropriate information and abilities; ability to write an acceptable report in legible handwriting will be required.

One councilman shall be elected for every twenty-five thousand voters. 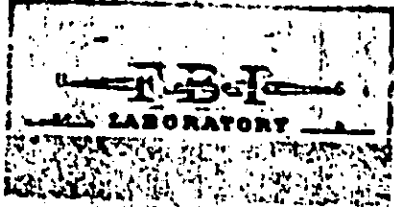
