Miss AVIS DELIMN advised that she believes that MAXWELL FINESTONE may have mentioned "VIV" or VIVIAN when he informed her that two sisters had planned to join him and his associate on a trip to Mexico which he took January-March, 1952, but that they were married suddenly and did not go. The sudden marriage of subject and her sister ELEANOR in January, 1952 recalled. Subject's brother MILTON vacated subject's husband's former apartment at 217 East 19 Street, NYC, on 11/1/52. DETAILS:

DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, have advised that they were recruited into the Soviet espionage apparatus by JULIUS ROSENBERG, a brother-in-law of DAVID GREENGLASS. DAVID

GREENGLASS is now serving a fifteen year sentence for transmitting certain classified data relating to the atomic bomb project at Los Alamos, New Mexico, to HARRY GOLD, a confessed Soviet spy now serving a thirty-year sentence for espionage. JULIUS HUSENBERG and his wife, ETHEL, were sentenced to death in April, 1951 in the Scutnern Listrict of New York for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS learned through conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG during the period 1946 to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage in connection with which he was using as a conspiratorial headquarters and for the purpose of microfilming documents and making espionage contacts an apartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City, and an apartment in the vicinity of Twelfth Street and avenue E.

Information obtained from MAX/ELITCHER, who admits that ROSENEERG attempted to recruit him for Soviet espionage, indicates that the Greenwich Village apartment was located at 65 Morton Street, New York City. This apartment was rented in the name of ALFRED SARAET from October, 1943 to January, 1950.

advised on that Julius Rosenberg mentioned an apartment rented by a student ostensibly used for studying on

Morton Street where he, JOED ARR and 'BILL' used to meet in secret to discuss their plans. ROSENBERG did not identify "BILL" at this time, but from other conversations informant had with ROSENBERG, "BILL" is believed by T-1 to be WILLIAM PERL.

On T-1 stated that ROSENBERG informed that his apartment was ostensibly rented for a student to have a place to study but that the real purpose was to have a place for meetings. ROSENBERG said that he had typed for many hours on various occasions in the Morton Street apartment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table legs and would let the water run in the bathroom. ROSENBERG advised T-1 that he paid the rent on this apartment.

Was a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist Party in 1943-1944 and believes that he met JULIUS ROSENBERG through a mutual friend named JCEL BARR. SARAKT has denied that RESENBERG was ever in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, but MAX ELITCHER has advised that JULIUS ROSEMBERG, JCEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL (also known to him as WILLIAM WITTERPERL), and ELITCHER and his wife, HELENE, were together in SARAKT'S apartment, number 6-I, at 65 Morton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.

ROSS and moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946 at which time the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, was taken by his friend, JOEL BARR. It was arranged that BARR would send him the rent for the apartment in Ithaca, New York, and that SARAHT would then pay the Landlord of 65 Norton Street by check.

SARAIT has advised that WILLIAM FERL, who was a friend of both SARAIT and JOHL BARR, used the apartment subsequent to JOHL BARR under the same rental paying arrangement and that PERL in sending the last money order payment in January, 1950 attached a note requesting SARART to relinquish the apartment as PERL-no longer had any use for it.

ALFRED SARANT, following his interview by Bureau agents in July-August, 1950 fled the United States into Hexico, entering under an assumed name. His present whereabouts are unknown.

WILLIAM PERL has been identified as a Soviet agent by ROSENBERG to Confidential Informant T-1. PERL is at present under indictment for perjury before the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

JUEL BARR was identified as a Loviet agent by RUSEN-BERG to DAVID GREENGLASS following JUEL BARR'S sailing from the United States for Europe in January, 1948. ROSENBERG advised DAVID-CREENGLASS that BARR was going to Europe to continue his aspionage work in European countries.

ALFRED SARANT has advised that JOEL BARR had a girl-friend named vivian GLASSMAN and that he believes that VIVIAN GLASSMAN sent him the first few rental payments in the form of money orders for the apartment rent at 65 Morton Street, New York City.

The Albany Office advised on July 22, 1950 that a money order number 988487 issued at the Church Street Station Post Office, New York City, on August 8, 1949, payable to-ALFRED SARANT from VIVIAN CLASSIAN, 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, as a remitter, was located in the account of ALFRED SARANT in the First National Bank of Ithaca, New York. This money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bore a deposit date of august 11, 1949.

VIVIAN GLASSIAN has advised upon interview that she was the former figures of JULL BARR and that she had sent money orders to alfred SARAIT in payment of the rent on 65. Morton Street in July and August, 1948. She also admitted that she had made an airplane trip to Cleveland, Ohio on July 22, 1950 to contact william PERL with \$2,000.00 in cash and to give instructions to PERL to leave the United States and go to Mexico. She stated that she received the \$2,000.00 and the instructions from PERL from an unknown man who contacted her at

her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. GLASSMAN claimed that the identity of the man who contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist agents to identify him.

Confidential Informant T-l advised that in conversation JULIUS ROSENBERG stated that on a holiday weekend, which the informant believes may have been the Fourth of July weekend, 1949, WILLIAM PERL removed some secret files from a laboratory located at Columbia University and that PERL took these files to ROSENBERG'S apartment at Knickerbocker Village, New York City, where ROSENBERG, PERL, a third unidentified individual who was called in from out of town, and a fourth man, together spent fourteen to seventeen hours with two cameras photographing the material that PERL had obtained in order that PERL could return the material at his earliest convenience to Columbia University. ROSENBERG indicated to T-1 that the third man was MICHAEL-SIDOROVICH, who he described as a member of his espionage organization.

Confidential Informant T-1 stated that the rourth man was a definite member of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus; that he is the man who subsequently contacted VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950, to arrange with her to proceed to Cleveland, Ohio, to contact WILLIAM PERL and give him \$2,000.00 in order to facilitate his flight from the United States to Mexico.

The informant advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG indicated that the Russians sent his last recruit to contact VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950 and that the last individual that JULIUS ROSENBERG recruited into his Soviet espionage ring was a man who lived with the son of a wealthy family. The informant stated that the son of the wealthy family owned a black convertible Buick automobile and that he had loaned his Buick to the last JULIUS ROSENBERG recruit who drove ROSENBERG to Ithaca, New York, to see ALFRED SARANT and make a pickup of espionage material.

Concerning the identity of the two individuals described above by T-1, investigation to identify the last

recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG who lived with the son of a wealthy family and who owned a 1949 or 1950 black Buick convertible automobile with a white top, indicates that one MAXWELL FINESTONE, with alias MAX FINESTONE, was the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG and that EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN, commonly known as JAMES KEINSTEIN, was the individual with whom he lived.

JAMES WEINSTEIN is the son of JOSEPH ASINSTEIN, President of the Versailles Garment Corporation, 470 Seventh Avenue, New York City, a ladies' garment manufacturing firm. JAMES WEINSTEIN, in an interview with Eureau agents on August 21, 1950, produced a New York State automobile registration dated January 19, 1950 for a 1949 Buick convertible.

JAMES WEINSTEIN resided at 418 East Ninth Street, New York City, with MAX FINESTONE from February, 1950 to about October-November, 1950.

BOSTON, Massachusetts, is a graduate of Cornell University having graduated in September, 1949 and is a close friend of LOUISE (PUSS) SARANT.

On April 5, 1951 VIVIAN GLASSMAN was observed by Sa John J. Doen Er and the writer leaving her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, with a man the was subsequently identified as MAX TRESTONE.

INFORMATION INSTCATING SUBJECT'S ACQUAINTENCE WITH MORTON SOBELL

MORTON SOZELL was indicted with JULIUS and EINEL ROSENBERG for conspiracy to commit estimage against the United States and was tried with the ROSENBERGS in the Southern District of New York in March, 1951. He was convicted and sentenced to thirty years imprisonment. Testimony during the course of the trial by JULIUS ROSENBERG reflects that VIVIAN GLASSMAN was acquainted with MORTON SOBELL. On March 22, 1951

in the afternoon court session of the trial of the ROSENBERGS and HORTON SOBELL, JULIUS ROSENBERG testified on direct examination that MORTON SOBELL and his wife had visited at the ROSENBERG'S nome in Knickerbocker Village, 10 Monroe Street, New York City, about Christmas, 1947 or 1948; that other people were present but that the only other person that ROSENBERG could remember was VIVIAN GLASSMAN.

### JULIUS ROSENBERG'S TESTIMONY REGARDING VIVIAN GLASSMAN

court

At the morning/session on March 26, 1951 under cross examination by the United States Attorney, Southern District of New York, IR/ING SAYPOL, JULIUS ROSENBERG testified that he knows VIVIAN GLASSMAN and was introduced to her by JOEL BARK many years ago at a place that he no longer remembers. He believed that it might have occurred at a union headquarters. He stated that he had seen VIVIAN GLASSMAN off and on since 1939. He was unable to state how many times a year he saw her.

ROSENBERG stated that subject was JULL BARR'S sweetheart and that BARR sometimes brought ner to ROSENBERG'S home and that on other occasions ROSENBERG saw her at musicales. ROSENBERG testified that JUEL BARR left the country about the end of 1947 or the beginning of 1948 and that since that time he has seen VIVIAN GLASSMAN at his own home or at his shop but had never seen her at any gatherings.

ROSENBERG testified that in 1950 he had seen VIVIAN GLASSMAN a number of times and had seen her for the last time a couple of months before his arrest. He stated that VIVIAN GLASSMAN was a social worker and that he had discussed his problem child with her and that as a result of this discussion treatment of MICHAEL ROSENBERG was undertaken at the Jewish Bourd of Guardians. ROSENBERG denied giving VIVIAN GLASSMAN any money or sending her on a trip to Cleveland, Ohio. He stated that he had never heard of this trip or of the money before it was mentioned in the courtroom. He specifically

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denied giving GLASSMAN \$2,000.00 to take to Cleveland.
ROSENEERG admitted that he may have read of VIVIAN GLASSMAN
in a case in the newspaper a few weeks before. He testifed
that he did not read however that he had given her any money.

ROSENBERG admitted knowing ALFRED SARANT and saw him for the last time in late 1949 or early 1950. He testified that he saw SARANT at SARANT'S apartment and had gone there to borrow \$300.00 from him. he stated that SARANT gave him this sum and that he now owes SARANT a total of \$400.00.

ROSENBERG stated that he was introduced to ALFRED SARANT by JOEL BARR at an apartment that they were sharing in Greenwich Village. He recalled the number of the house was 65 but could not remember the street. He recognized Morton Street when the United States Attorney suggested it to him. ROSENBERG testified that his wife ETHEL was with him once when he went to the 65 Morton Street, New York City, apartment but he denied ever going there with MORTON SOBELL.

### INTERVIEW OF MISS AVIS DELMAN

On September 19, 1952 Miss AVIS DELMAN, 65 Morton Street, New York City, Apartment 6H, was interviewed by SA Robert F. Royal in regard to her knowledge of MAXWELL FINESTONE and his associates. She advised that in about April-May, 1952 one WALTER MYSS, 96-24 215 Street, Queens Village, Long Island, New York, contacted her regarding a market research job for a Chicago research firm and that in connection with this job she met FINESTONE. Thereafter, FINESTONE dated her on several occasions prior to and subsequent to a trip that he made to Canada in May-June, 1952. (FINESTONE left New York City from Idlewild Airport on May 14, 1952 destined for Montreal, Canada and returned about two weeks later).

Miss DELMAN advised that she recalls that FINESTONE had once mentioned that he had visited at 65 Morton Street, New York City, where she resides at present. She stated that she assumed that this someone was a girl and did not pry further concerning the identity of this individual.

It is recalled that ALFRED SARANT rented Apartment of at 65 Morton Street, New York City, from October, 1943 to January 31, 1950, and that subsequent to SARANT'S departure from New York City to Ithaca, New York, in September, 1946 with his wife LOUISE, he allowed JOEL BARR, WILLIAM FERL, HENRIETTA SAVIDGE, RERL'S present wife, and FINESTONE to use his apartment during parts of the period between September, 1946 and January 31, 1950.

This is the same apartment building utilized by JULIUS ROSENBERG in connection with his espionage apparatus. Miss DELMAN said that she did not recall FINESTONE ever mentioning the names of WILLIAM PERL, JOEL BARR, ALFRED or LOUISE SARANT, JULIUS or ETHEL ROSENBERG or MORTON SCELL, in conversation. She did recall that he may have mentioned the name "VIV" or VIVIAN in connection with information which he had furnished to her concerning two sisters who were allegedly planning to join FINESTONE and WALTER WYSS on a trip that FINESTONE and WYSS took to Mexico during January-March, 1952. She stated that FINESTONE advised her that these two sisters and possibly some other people were going with FINESTONE and WYSS and that at the last moment both were "married very suddenly".

It is recalled that VIVIAN GLASSLAN married ERNEST PATAKI and that her sister ELEANOR married EUGENE E. HUTNER on January 19th and January 20, 1952 respectively in New York City. Information obtained at subject's place of employment, Long Island College Hospital, Brooklyn, New York, at the time of her marriage reflected that subject's marriage was very sudden and that she apparently had had no anticipation of the matter. Miss DELIAN advised that she is personally acquainted with MURIEL-BOUDIN, who is the divorced wife of ARTHUR C. BGUDIN.

She said that MURIEL had claimed that she was never happy in her marriage to ARTHUR BOUDIN and desired a second chance; that she is now aspiring to be an actress and is residing at 505 west 52 Street, New York City. Missuelian

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stated that MAX FINESTONE either mutually shares or owns an automobile with ARTHUR BOUUIN. It is noted that VIVIAN GLASSIAN was observed on April >, 19>1 leaving her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, with MAX FINESTONE and to enter an automobile which was ascertained to be registered to ARTHUR BOUDIN.

A physical surveillance of FINESTONE has revealed that he is residing with ARTHUR BOUDIN at 500A Grand Street, New York City. ARTHUR BOUDIN is the brother of LEONARD B. BOILIN, the lawyer consulted by VIVIAN GLASSIAN immediately after her interview by Bureau agents on August 3, 1950.

Concerning herself, Miss DELMAN advised that the name AVIS DELMAN is a stage name and she declined to furnish her legal name. She indicated that she was formerly married . to an un-named man in Buffalo, New York during 1939-1940: they were subsequently divorced. She stated that while in Buffalo she was connected with a local theatrical group. She indicated that she had formerly lived with her family in Brooklyn, New York and had attended Brooklyn College for approximately three years. In approximately 1942 or 1943 she moved from New York to Los Angeles, California and for approximately one year had attempted to "break into" the movies but did not get past the screen test stage. While in Los Angeles, she was employed by SOL LESSER, a producer doing publicity and secretarial work. She admitted knowing EavID FRESSMAN and indicated that she knew one "AL" HANMER but that she definitely did not recall BEA AMMER.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised in June, 1943 that information had been received in the form of a letter directed to the Communist Party Headquarters, 121 Haight Street, San Francisco, California, concerning one AVIS DELMAN. This letter was directed by the Communist Party of Los Angeles County to the Communist Party headquarters at San Francisco, California and stated that AVIS DELMAN who had been residing in Los angeles for two months had come there from New York City where she was a member of the Theatre Section of the Communist Party. AVIS DELMAN

edvised the Membership Director of Los Angeles County that she came without her transfer; that she had previously joined the Communist Party in Euffalo, New York and that for verification of her membership in that Party, BEA HAMMER and DAVID PRESSMAN should be contacted.

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised in February, 1944 that the name of AVIS DELMAN, also known as TULIP CHESSMAN, appeared on the rolls of the Communist Party, USA as a member of Branch 1 which is a Communist branch composed mostly of people residing around the Wilshire Boulevard and Fairfax Avenue Area, Los Angeles, California; in 1943, she had Communist Farty book number 26695 having transferred from New York in June, 1943. Miss Dellan was asked if she was a member of the Communist Party, USA in Los Angeles in 1943, a member of the Theatrical Group of the Communist Party in New York City and the Communist Party in Euffalo, New York prior to that time but she refused to discuss it.

## CORRESPONDENTS OF SUBJECT

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised that the subject received correspondence from the LaFonda Indian Shop, Sante Fe, New Mexico on September 30, 1952.

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised that on May 9, 1952 one E. HUTNER, lift Henry Street, Brooklyn, New York, was the addressor of correspondence to ARTHUR BOUDIN, 500A Grand Street, New York City. E. HUTNER is believed to be identical with ELEANOR GLASSMAN HUTKER, subject a sister, who resides at the above address. ELEANOR GLASSMAN married EUGENE HUTNER of 335 East 17 Street, New York City, on January 20, 1952.

### SUBJECT IN ATTENDANCE AT YOUNG PROGRESSIVES OF AMERICA DANCES

On March 24, 1952 Confidential Informat T-b, of known reliability, advised SAS ROBERT F. ROYAL, JOSEPH V. WATERS and the writer that JAMES WEINSTEIN, a roomnate of MAX. FINESTONE, at 418 East Ninth Street, New York City, was an

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active member of and the Chairman in 1950-1951 of a club of the Young Progressives of America organization which held its meetings at 95 Avenue B. New York City, in a meeting hall on the top floor. (JAMES WEINSTEIN was an associate of MAX FINESTONE when both were students at Cornell University in 1949).

T-6 identified a photograph of VIVIAN GLASSMAN and ELEANOR GLASSMAN, subject's sister, as individuals that he had seen at the Tompkins Park Playground, Eighth Street and Avenue B, New York City, and at Young Progressives of America dances. T-6 stated that VIVIAN GLASSMAN was also at a "peace vigil" neld at the Central Palace Hall on the lower East Side of New York City during Christmas Week, December, 1951. T-6 stated that JAMES WEINSTEIN was also there but that he did not see WEINSTEIN and the GLASSMAN sisters speaking to each other and could not therefore state that they were acquainted with each other. T-6 could not identify photographs of ERNEST PATAKI, husband of VIVIAN GLASSMAN or of MAXWELL FINESTEIN.

Concerning the Young Progressives of America organization, mentioned above, Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that after Labor Day, 1945, a member of the RAY FRIEDLANDER Club of the Communist Party was instructed to organize the Tompkins Square Club of the Young Progressives of America and that the organizer recruited nearly all of the members of the Tompkins Square Club. T-7 stated that instructions were to see that not more than 55 or 60 per cent of the Executive Committee of the Young Progressives of America were Communist Party members in order that the group might more effectively fight the tag of Communist.

INTERVIEW OF THOMAS BISHOP 217 East 19 Street New York City\_

Mr. THOMAS LISHOP, Superintendent, 217 East 19
Street, New York City on October 29, 1952 advised that the subject's brother MILTON GLASSMAN, has been residing at this address in apartment 4A, which was formerly occupied by ERNEST PATAKI, without payment since April, 1952.

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Mr. BISHOP stated that the owner of the building, Mr. PHILIP KASSIER, had instituted court proceedings in May, 1952, to force MILTON GLASSMAN out of the apartment and that the court had issued an order for GLASSMAN to vacate the premises in forty-eight hours, but that GLASSMAN had an attorney appear in court and that the vacating order was amended to give GLASSMAN ninety days within which to vacate.

Mr. BISHOP stated that MILTON GLASSMAN does not appear to be employed as he is seen at the apartment day and night and that his personal appearance seems to indicate that he drinks alcoholic liquors heavily. Mr. BISHOP has noticed no visitors during the day or night and had not seen the subject at the apartment building within recent weeks.

On November 19, 1952, Mr. Thomas Bishop advised that a Sheriff's Order had been obtained on September 15, 1952 ordering PATAKI and MILTON GLASSMAN to vacte the premises at 217 East 19 Street by November 1, 1952.

Mr. BISHOP stated that on November 1, 1952 he had observed ERNEST PATAKI assisting MILTON GLASSMAN to move his effects out of the apartment and that they were placing furniture and other personal effects in a two-door Ford sedan bearing New York 1952 license No. 9024G.

Mr. BISHOP stated that ne had observed PATAXI'S wife, the former VIVIAN GLASSMAN, at the apartment within recent weeks but did not recall whether or not she was present when PATAXI and GLASSMAN were emptying the apartment.

Mr. BISHOP stated that ERNEST PATAKI and MILTON GLASSMAN were being sued by PHILIP KASSIER, owner of the building, for non-payment of rent for the period between April, 1952 and November 1, 1952.

Mr. BISHOP stated that shortly before GLASSMAN and PATAKI vacated the spartment MILTON GLASSMAN had informed him that upon his arrival home one evening he had noticed that his apartment door had been "jimmied" open and that he was missing a portable radio and typewriter.

Mr. PISHOP stated that he believes this occurred some time in ate October, 1952 or early November, 1952, and that presumply GLASSMAN made a police report in this matter.

At the New York Motor Vehicle Bureau it was ascertined that New York 1952 license No. 9024G was registered on Ocober 20, 1952 to MILTON GLASSMAN, 217 East 19 Street, No. York City. The registration reflected that the automobile a 1936 Ford sedan, color black, Serial No. 2355911.

# PRESENT EMPLOYMENT AND RESIDENCE OF VIVIAN \*\*\* CHTBAUH\*\* CARLIN

On October 10, 1952 the Newark Division advised that a check of the records of the Credit Bureau of Passaic and Bergen Counties, Passaic, New Jersey, reflected that BENSON CARLIN and his wife, VIVIAN, reside at 0-67 Fairlawn Parkway, Pairlawn, New Jersey; that prior to moving to this address they resided at 6 west 75 Street, New York City. BERSON CARLIN was reported employed as an engineer for the Smith Meeker Engineering Company, 157 Chambers Street, New York City. His wife VIVIAN was reported employed by the United Service for New Americans, New York City, as a Vocational Counselor. Newark reported that numerous unsuccessful attempts had been made to contact VIVIAN CARLIN at her residence in order that she might be interviewed and that in view of the fact that she was believed to be presently employed in New York City that the New York Office conduct the interview of her at her place of employment.

At United Service for New Americans, 15 Park Row, New York City, it was ascertained from Miss ELEANOR IN TZ, Personnel Director, that VIVIAN CARLIN, 0-67 Pairiawn Parkway, Fairlawn, New Jersey, was no longer employed by this organization, having terminated her employment on October 10, 1952.

# RESULTS OF SURVEILLANCE OF SUBJECT

On October 13, 1952 the United States Supreme Court denied legal counsel for JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL, writs of certbrari. A physical surveillance of subject was conducted following this court decision with the following results:

October 13th through October 17, 1952

On October 13, 1952 no activity was noted

October 14, 1952 - SAS RICHARD A. MINIHAN and PAUL J. BLASCO - 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

At 11:07 a.m. the subject left her residence at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, and boarded a North bound bus at the corner of Avenue A and Seventh Street, New York City, and left the bus at Eighth Avenue and 14 Street. She boarded an uptown Independent Eighth Avenue subway and left the train at the 168 Street stop where she boarded a bus bound for Fairlawn and Paterson, New Jersey.

At 12:40 p.m. she Left the bus at Fairlawn, New Jersey and entered the Fair Spot Luncheonette, 32 Street and Broadway, Fairlawn, New Jersey, where she remained about ten minutes. She then walked to a residence at 0-67 Fairlawn Parkway, Fairlawn, New Jersey, where she entered at 12:53 p.m.

At 7:20 p.m. the subject was observed by SAS RICHARD E. BRENNAN and ROBERT W. COHOLAR to leave 0-67 Fairiawn Parkway, Fairlawn, New Jersey, with an unidentified woman. VIVIAN GLASSMAN boarded a New York bound bus at Fairlawn Parkway and Broadway and the unidentified woman returned to the residence. GLASSMAN returned to her home by the same route and had previously taken and entered her residence at 8:50 p.m.

October 15, 1952- SAS ROBERT W. COROLLAN and GEORGE M. OWEN

At 6:05 p.m. GLASSMAN was observed leaving ner residence and entering a delicatesson at 129 East Seventh Street where she remained for five minutes and returned to her residence.

October 16, 1952 - SAS ARNOLD E. BRANDT and WILLIAM D. WRIGHT III

At 7:40 p.m. subject was observed to leave her are residence and board a North bound crosstown ous at Avenue A and East Eighth Street, New York City. At 14 Street and Seventh Avenue she left the bus and entered the IRT subway station

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boarding a downtown Seventh Avenue express train. She left the train at the Clark Street station in Brooklyn and walked to and entered an apartment building at 144 Henry Street, Brooklyn, at 5:15 p.m. She left 144 Henry Street at 9:15 and walked to an apartment house at 70 Pierrepont Street, Brooklyn, New York. At 12:10 a.m. she left 70 Pierrepont Street, Brooklyn and walked to the St. George Hotel at Henry and Clark Streets, where she boarded an IRT West Side express train and rode to the 14 Street stop in Manhattan. At 12:40 a.m. she boarded an East bound bus and was observed leaving the bus at East 5 Street and Avenue A and to enter her residence at 131 East 7 Street at 12:45 a.m.

It is known that the subject's sister ELEANUR GLASSMAN HUTNER resides at 144 Henry Street, Brooklyn, New York. It is also recalled that subject is acquainted with Dr. NATHAN ARENOWITZ whose residence is at 70 Pierrepont Street, Brooklyn, and whose office is at 1 Hanson Place, Brooklyn, New York.

October 17, 1952 - SAS ARNOLD E. BRANDT and GEORGE M. OWEN

At 5:15 p.m. the subject was observed leaving her apartment with a man answering the description of her husband, ERNEST PATAKI. They walked along Avenue A to the corner of Norfolk and belancy Street, new York City, where at 5:35 they joined a group listening to speeches at a street rally conducted by the Committee to Secure Justice for the ROSENBERGS and the American Labor Party. At 10:00 p.m. the street rally was brought to a close and subject and her husband walked to the corner of Clinton Street and East Houston Street where they entered Weissberg's Soda Fountain and Luncheonette and were observed eating at the counter. At 10:30 p.m. they left the luncheonette and returned to their residence entering at 10:40 p.m.

The American Labor Party was cited as a Communist front by the Un-American Activities Committee of the United States House of Representatives on March 29, 1944.

Following the denial of the ROSENBERGS' petition to the Supreme Court for a Writ of Certiorari which was denied on October 13, 1952 the ROSENBERGS' legal counsel petitioned the

A physical surveillance of the subject was conducted from November 17th to November 23, 1952 but no unusual activity on the part of the subject was noted between these dates.

DETAILS

DAVID GREHNGLASS and his wife, BUTH GREENGLASS, mayo advised that they were recruited into the Soviet espionage apparatus by JULIUS ROSENBERG, a brother-in-law of DAVID GREENGLASS. DAVID

TREENGLASS is now serving a fifteen year sentence for transmitting certain classified data relating to the atomic bomb project at Los Alamos, New Hexico, to HARRY GULD, a confessed Soviet spy now serving a thirty-year sentence for espionage. Julius Hussindship and his wife, ETLEL, were sentenced to death in April, 1951 in the Southern District of New York for sonspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

DAVID and RUTH OREBIGIASS learned through conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG during the period 1946 to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage in connection with which he was using as a conspiratorial headquarters and for the purpose of microfilming documents and making espionage contacts an apartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City, and an apartment in the vicinity of Twelfth Street and Avenue B.

Information obtained from MAX BLITCHER, who admits that ROSENBERG attempted to recruit him for Soviet espionage, indicates that the Greenwich Village apartment was located at 65 Norton Street, New York City. This apartment was rented in the name of ALFRED BARANT from October, 1943 to Junuary, 1950.

confidential informant T-1, of known reliability, advised on that JULIUS ROBERBERG mentioned an apartment rented by a student estensibly used for studying on

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-Morton Street where he, JUEL BARR and 'BILL' used to meet in secret to discure their plans." ROSENRERG did not identify "BILL" at this time, but from other conversations informant had with ROSENBURG, "BILL" is believed by T-1 to be WILLIAM PERL.

That his apartment was estensibly rented for a student to have a place to study but that the real purpose was to have a place for meetings. HUSENBERG said that he had typed for many hours on various occasions in the Morton Street apartment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table legs and would let the water rum in the bathroom. ROEEHBERG advised I-1 that he paid the rent on this apartment.

ALFRED SARAYT, upon interview, has advised that he was a member of the Greenwich Village Brunch of the Communist Party in 1943-1944 and believes that he sat JULIUS ROSERHING through a mutual friend named JUEL Bank. FARAKT has denied that RUSENBERG was ever in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, but MAK ELITCHER has advised that JULIUS RUSENBERG, JCEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL (also known to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL), and ELITCHER and his wife, HELENE, were together in SARAHT'S apartment, number 6-1, at 65 Morton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.

In 1945 ALFRED START married LOUISE JACCLELINE RUBEL-BOSS and moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946 at which time the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, was taken by his friend, JOSL BAHR. It was arranged that BARR would send him the rent for the apartment in Ithaca, New York, and that SARAHT would then pay the landlord of 65 Morton Street by check.

BARART has advised that William Pial, who was a friend of both EARART and JUEL BARR, used the apartment subsequent to JUEL BARR under the same rental paying arrangement and that PERL in sending the last money order payment in January, 1950 attached a note requesting SARART to relinquish the apartment as PERL no longer had any use for it.

ALPRED EARANT, following his interview by Bureau agents in July-August, 1950 fled the United States into Mexico, entering under an assumed name. His present whereabouts are unknown.

by RGERBERG to Confidential Informant I-1. PERL is at present under indictment for perjury before the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

BERG to DAVID GEREBULASE following JOEL BARR'S sailing from the United States for Europe in January, 1948. ROSE:BERG advised DAVID GREENGLASE that BARR was going to Europe to continue his espionage work in Furopean countries.

ALFRED SARANT has advised that JULL RANR had a girlfriend named VIVIAR CLASSIAR and that he believes that VIVIAR CLASSIAR sent him the first few rental payments in the form of money orders for the apartment rent at 65 Norton Street, New York City.

The Albert Office advised on July 22, 1950 that a money order number 988487 issued at the Church Street Station Post Office, New York City, on August E, 1949, payable to ALFRED SARALT from VIVIAN GLASSIAN, 131 hast leventh fitnest, New York City, as a remitter, was located in the account of ALFRED SARALT in the first National Bank of Ithaca, New York. This money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bore a deposit date of August 11, 1949.

VIVIAL GLASSFAN has advised upon interview that ahe was the former liances of Johl BARR and that ahe had sent money orders to alfRED BARRET in payment of the rent on 65 Morton Street in July and August, 1948. The also admitted that she had made an airplane trip to Gleveland, Ohio on July 22, 1950 to contact WILLIAM FERL with \$2,000.00 in each and to give instructions to PERL to leave the United States and go to Mexico. She stated that she received the \$2,000.00 and the instructions from PERL from an unknown man who contacted her at

her apartment at 131 Best Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. GLASSMAN claimed that the identity of the man who contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist agents to identify him.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that in conversation JULIUS ROSERBERG stated that on a holiday weekend, which the informant believes may have been the Fourth of July weekend, 1949, WILLIAM PERL removed some secret files from a laboratory located at Columbia University and that FERL took these files to ROSEBERG's apartment at Enickerbocker Village, New York City, where ROSENBERG, FERL, a third unidentified individual who was called in from out of town, and a fourth man, together spent fourteen to seventeen hours with two cameras photographing the material that FERL had obtained in order that PERL could return the material at his earliest convenience to Columbia University. ROSENBERG indicated to T-1 that the third man was MICHAEL SIDOROVICH, who he described as a member of his espionage organization.

Confidential Informant I-1 stated that the fourth man was a definite member of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus; that he is the san who subsequently contacted VIVIAR GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950, to arrange with her to proceed to Cleveland, thio, to contact WILLIAM PERL and give him \$2,000.00 in order to facilitate his flight from the United States to Mexico.

- The informant advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG indicated that the Russians sent his last recruit to contact VIVIAN GLASSKAR on July 21, 1950 and that the last individual that JULIUS ROLKEBERG recruited into his Soviet espionage ring was a man who lived with the son of a wealthy family. The informant stated that the son of the wealthy family owned a black convertible Buick automobile and that he had loaned his Buick to the last JULIUS ROSENBERG recruit who drove ROSENBERG to Ithaca, New York, to see ALFKED SARAHI and make a pickup of espionage material.

Concerning the identity of the two individuals deseribed above by T-1, investigation to identify the last " MY 65-15385"

recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG who lived with the son of a wealthy family and who owned a 1949 or 1950 black Buick convertible automobile with a white top, indicates that one MAIWELL FIRESTORE, with alias MAX #IRESTORE, was the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG and that EDWARD JAMES WEINSTRIM, commonly known as JAMES REINSTRIM, was the individual with whom he lived.

JAMES WRIESTEIR is the son of JOSEPH WEIRSTEIN, President of the Versailles Garment Corporation, 470 Ecventh Avenue, New York City, a ladies' garment manufacturing firm. JAMES WEIHSTRIN, in an interview with Bureau agents on August 21, 1950, produced a New York State automobile registration dated January 19, 1950 for a 1949 Buick convertible.

JAMES WRINGTEIN resided at 418 Bast Binth Etreet, New York City, with MAX FINESTOKE from February, 1950 to about October-November, 1950.

MAX PINESTONE who was born on July 26, 1922 at Boston, Massachusetts, is a graduate of Cornell University baving graduated in September, 1949 and is a close friend of LOUISE (PUSS) SAKAWI.

On April 5, 1951 VIVIAN GLASSMAN was observed by BA JOHN J. DORRMER and the writer leaving her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, with a man who was subsequently identified as MAX. INSE TONE.

INFORMATION INUICATING SUBJECT'S ACQUAINTANCE WITH MORTON CORELL

MORTOR SOBELL was indicted with JULIUS and RIHEL ROSEMBERG for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States and was tried with the ROSEMBERGS in the Southern District of New York in March, 1951. He was convicted and sentenced to thirty years imprisonment. Testimony during the course of the trial by JULIUS ROSELBERG reflects that VIVIAN GLASSMAN was acquainted with MORTON SOBELL. On March 22, 1951

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in the afternoon court session of the trial of the ROSENBERG and MORTON BOBBLL, JULIUS ROSENBERG testified on direct examination that HOETON BOBELL and his wife had visited at the ROSERVERG'S home in Enickerbooker Village, 10 Monroe Street, New York City, about Christmas, 1947 or 1948; that other people were present but that the only other person that ROSENBERG could remember was VIVIAN GLASSMAN.

## JULIUS ROSENBERG'S TECTIMONY REGARDING VIVIAN GLASSMAN

court

At the morning/session on March 26, 1951 under cross examination by the United States Attorney, Scuthern District of New York, Inviso Saypol, Julius Roseneers testified that he knows VIVIAN GLASSMAN and was introduced to her by JCEL BARR many years ago at a place that he no longer remembers. He believed that it might have occurred at a union headquarters. He stated that he had seen VIVIAN GLASSMAN off and on since 1939. He was unable to state how many times a year he saw her.

HOBEMBERG stated that subject was JUEL DARR'S sweetheart and that BARR sometimes brought her to ROSENBERG'S home and that on other occasions ROSERBERG saw her at musicales. ROSERBERG testified that JUEL BARR left the country about the end of 1947 or the beginning of 1948 and that since that time he has seen VIVIAN GLALSMAN at his own home or at his shop but had never seen her at any gatherings.

RUSHNERG testified that in 1950 he had seen VIVIAR GLASSMAN a number of times and had seen her for the last time a couple of months before his arrest. He stated that VIVIAR GLASSMAN was a social worker and that he had discussed his problem child with her and that as a result of this discussion treatment of MICHAEL HOTERERG was undertuken at the Jewish Board of Guardians. ROSENBERG denied giving VIVIAR GLASSMAN any money or sending her on a trip to Cleveland, Ohio. He stated that he had never heard of this trip or of the money before it was mentioned in the courtroom. He specifically

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denied giving GLASKAN \$2,000.00 to take to (leveland. RUSERLENG admitted that he may have read of VIVIAR GLASSKAN in a case in the newspaper a few works before. he testifed that he did not read however that he had given her any money.

HOSINLERC admitted knowing ALIRED SAMANT and saw him for the last time in late 1949 or early 1950. He testified that he saw SAMANT at SAMANT'S apartment and had gone there to borrow \$300.00 from him. he stated that SAMANT have him this sum and that he now over SAMANT a total of \$400.00.

RUSINDERE Stated that he was introduced to ALFRED
SAMANT by JULL LARM at an apartment that they were sharing in
Greenwich Village. He recalled the number of the nouse was
65 but could not remember the atroct. He recognized Morton
Street when the United States Attorney suggested it to him.
RUSENDERC testified that his wife ETALL was with him once when
he went to the 65 Norton Street, New York City, apartment but
he denied ever goin, there with MORTON SULL.

#### INTERVIEW OF PIDS AVIS DELMAN

Btreet, New York City, Apartment 6H, was interviewed by AA Robert F. Hoyal in regard to her knowledge of MAXWALL PINESTURE and his associates. The advised that in about April-May, 1952 one WALTER WYD;, 96-28 215 Street, Queens/Village, Long Island, Lew York, contacted nor regarding a market research jub for a Chicago research firm and that in connection with this job she met FIRESTURE. Thereafter, FIRESTURE dated her on several occasions prior to and subsequent to a trip that he made to Canada in May-June, 1952. (FIRESTURE left New York City from Idlewila Airport on May 14, 1952 destined for Montreal, Canada and returned about two weeks later).

Miss pelman advised that she recalls that PINESTONE had once mentioned that he had visited at 55 morton Street, New York City, where she resides at present. She stated that she assumed that this someone has a girl end wid not pry further concerning the identity of this individual.

It is recalled that ALIRED ENRART rented Apartment 61 at 65 Norton Etreet, New York City, From October, 1943 to January 31, 1950, and that subsequent to EARCHT'S departure from Eaw York City to Ithnes, New York, in September, 1946 with his wife LOUTE, he allowed JOTL BURR, WILLIAM PERL, MENRIETTA SAVIDOE, PERL'S present wife, and FINESTONE to use his apartment during parts of the period between September, 1946 and January 31, 1950.

This is the same apartment building utilized by JULIUS RODENHERG in connection with his espionage apparatus. Miss DELMAN said that she did not recall FINESTONE ever mentioning the names of WILLIAM PERL, JORL BARR, ALPRED of LOUISE BARANT, JULIUS or ETEML ROSEMBERG or MCKTON SCEELL, in conversation. She did recall that he may have mentioned the name "VIV" or VIVIAM in connection with information which he had furnished to her concerning two sisters who were allegedly plunning to join FINESTONE and WALTER WYSE on a trip that FINESTONE and WYSE took to Mexico during January-March, 1952. The stated that FINESTONE advised her that there two sisters and possibly some other people were going with FINESTONE and WYSS and that at the last moment both were "married very suddenly".

It is recalled that VIVIAN OLASSMAN married BRNEST PATAKI and that her sister FLKANOR married EUGLAR I. HINER on January 19th and January 20, 1952 respectively in New York City. Information obtained at subject's place of employment, Long Island College Respital, Brooklyn, New York, at the time of ner marriage reflected that subject's parriage was very sudden and that she apparently had had no anticipation of the matter. Miss DELMAN advised that the is personally acquainted with MURIKL BOULIN, who is the divorced wife of ARTHUR C. BOUDIN.

Ehe said that MURIFL had claimed that she was never happy in her marriage to ARTHUR BOUDIN and desired a second chance; that she is now aspiring to be an actress and is residing at 505 West 52 Street, New York City. Him DELMAN

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stated that MAX FINESTONE either mutually shares or owns an automobile with ARTHUR BOUDIN. It is noted that VIVIAN GLASSMEN was observed on April >, 1951 leaving nor apartment at 131 Bast Seventh Street, New York City, with MAX PIESTONE and to enter an automobile which was ascertained to be registered to ARTHUR BOUDIN.

A physical surveillance of PINESTONE has revealed that he is residing with ARTHUR BOUDIN at 500A Grand Street, New York City. ARTHUR BOUDIN is the brother of LECHARD B. BOUDIN, the lawyer consulted by VIVIAN GLASSKAN immediately after her interview by Bureau agents on August 3, 1950.

Concerning herself, Miss DELMAN advised that the name AVIS DELMAN is a stage name and she declined to furnish por her legal name. She indicated that she was formerly married to an un-named man in Buffalo, Hew York during 1939-1940; they were subsequently divorced. Ene stated that while in Buffalo she was connected with a local theatrical group. indicated that she had formerly lived with her family in Brooklyn, New York and had attended Brooklyn College for approximately three years. In approximately 1942 or 1943 she move from New York to Los Angeles, California and for approximately one year had attempted to "break into" the movies but did not get past the screen test stage. While in Los Angeles, she was employed by SOL LESSER, a producer doing publicity and secretorial work. She admitted knowing DAVID PRESSPAR and indicated that she knew one "AL" HAMMER but that she definitely did not recall BEA HAMMER.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised in June, 1943 that information had been received in the form of a letter directed to the Communist Party Headquarters, 121 Haight Street, San Francisco, California, concerning one AVIS DELMAN. This letter was directed by the Communist Party of Los Angeles County to the Communist Party Headquarters at San Francisco, California and stated that AVIS DELMAN who had been religing in Los Angeles for two months had come there from New York City where she was a member of the Theatre Section of the Communist Party. AVIS DELMAN

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advised the Membership Director of Los Angeles County that sne came without her transfer; that she had previously joined the Communist Party in Huffalo, New York and that for verification of her membership in that Party, BEA HAMMER and UAVID PRESSMAN should be contacted.

Considential informant T-3, of known reliability, advised in Pebruary, 1944 that the name of AVIS DELMAN, also known as TULIP CEESSMAN, appeared on the rolls of the Communist Party, USA as a member of Branch 1 which is a Communist branch composed mostly of people residing around the Wilshire Soulevard and Fairfax Avenue Area, Los Angeles, California; in 1943, and has Communist Party book number 26695 having transferred from New York in June, 1941. Miss DELMAN was asked if she was a member of the Communist Party, USA in Los Angeles in 1943, a sember of the Theatrical Group of the Communist Party in Ruffalo, New York prior to that time but she refused to discuss it.

# CORRECTORDENTS OF EUBJECT

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised that the subject received correspondence from the LaFonda Indian Shop, Sante Po, New Mexico on September 30, 1952.

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised that on May 9, 1952 one E. HUTNER, 144 Henry Street, Brooklyn, New York, was the addressor of correspondence to ARTHUR BOUDIN, 500A Orand Street, New York City. E. HUTNER is believed to be identical with ELEANUR GLASSMAN HUTNER, subject's sister, who resides at the above address. ILEANOR GLASSMAN married EUGHNE HUTNER of 335 Bast 17 Street, New York City, on January 20, 1952.

# EUBJECT IN ATTENDANCE AT YOUNG PROGRESSIVE OF AMERICA DANCES

On March 24, 1952 Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised PAS ROBERT F. HOLAL, JOSEPH V. WATERS and the writer that JAMES WEINSTEIN, a reconsiste of MAI FINESTONE, at 418 East Binth Street, New York City, was an

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active member of and the Chairman in 1950-1951 of a club of the Young Progressives of America organization which held its meetings at 95 Avenue P. New York City, in a meeting hall on the top floor. (JAMES WEINGTHIN was an associate of MAN PINESTONE when both were students at Cornell University in 1969).

T-6 identified a photograph of VIVIAN CLASSMAN and ELEANIR GLAISHAN, subject's sister, as individuals that he had seen at the Tomprins Park Playground, Eighth Street and Avenue L, New York City, and at Young Progressives of America daces. T-6 stated that VIVIAN CLASSMAN was also at a "peuce vigit" held at the Central ralace ball on the lower Mast Side of New York City curing Christmas Seek, December, 1951. T-6 stated that JAMES EXINSTEIN was also there but that he did not see -WEINSTEIN and the GLASSMAN sisters speaking to each other and sould not therefore state that they were acquainted with each other. T-5 could not identify photographs of ERBEST PATANI, hus and of VIVIAN GLASCHAN or of MAXWELL FIRESTEIN.

Concerning the Young Progressives of America organisation, mentioned above, Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that after Labor Day, 1945, a member of the RAY FRIEDLANDER Club of the Communist Party was instructed to organize the Tumpains Square Club of the Young Progressives of America and that the organizer recruited nearly all of the members of the Tompains Square Club. T-7 stated that instructious were to see that not more than 55 or 60 per cent of the executive Committee of the Young Pro ressives of America were Communist Party members in order that the group might more effectively fight the tay of Communist.

INTLKVIEW OF THUMAS I INDUP 217 Last 19 Street Rew York City

Mr. Thims blokip, Superintendent, 217 bast 19
Stroct, New York city on Detaber 29, 1952 advised that the
subject's britner MILTIN GLANDMAN, has been residing
at this address in apartment 44, which was formerly occupied
by LandST FAIACI, without payment since April, 1452.

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Mr. FISHOP stated that the owner of the building, Mr. Philip MASSIEM, had instituted court proceedings in May, 1952, to force MILTON CLASUMAN out of the apartment and that the court had issued an order for GLASUMAN to vacate the prexises in forty-eight hours, but that GLASUMAN had an attorney appear in court and that the vacating order was smended to give GLASUMAN ninety days within which to vacate.

Mr. BISEOP stated that MILTON CLASSMAN does not appear to be employed as he is seen at the apartment day and night and that his personal appearance seems to indicate that he drinks alcoholic liquors neavily. Ar. FISHOF has noticed no visitors during the day or hight and had not seen the auticat at the apartment building within recent weeks.

Jn Rovember 19, 1952, Mr. Thomas bishup advised that a Sheriff's Order had been obtained on September 15, 1952 ordering PATAKI and MILTON GLASSMAN to vecte the promises at 217 hast 19 Street by November 1, 1952.

Fr. 1735.7 states that on november 1, 1952 he had observed ERMEST PATALL assisting FILT A SLASSMAR to move his effects out of the apartment and that they were placing furniture and other personal effects in a two-door ford sedan bearing New York 1952 license No. 9024G.

Mr. bishup stated that we had observed PATARI'S wife, the former viviah (LABORAN, at the apartment within recent weeks but aid not recall enetter or not she was present when PATARI and CLABORAN were emptying the apartment.

Mr. BISHER stated that HUNGST PATAMI and MILTON GLASSIAN were being such by Phillip MASSIAN, Owner of the building, for non-payment of rent for the period between April, 1952, and November 1, 1952.

Mr. Figure stated that shortly before GLASNER and PATALI vacated the spartment HILTED SLA HARN had informed him that upon his arrival none one evening he had noticed that his apartment door had been "jimmind" open and that he was missing a portable radio and typewriter.

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Mr. BISHOP stated that he believes this occurred some time in late October, 1952 or early lovember, 1952, and that presumably GLASCHAN made a police report in this matter.

At the New York Motor Vehicle Sureau it was ascertained that New York 1952 license No. 9024G was registered on October 20, 1952 to HILTON GLASSMAN, £17 East 19 Street, New York City. The registration reflected that the automobile was a 1936 lord soden, color black, Serial No. 2355911.

# PRESENT EMPLOYMENT AND RESIDENCE OF VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM CARLIN

On October 10, 1952 the Newark Division advised that a check of the records of the Credit Bureau of Fassaic and Bergen Counties, Passale, New Jersey, reflected that BENSON CARLIN and his wife, Vivian, reside at 0-67 fuirlawn farkway, Fairlawn, New Jersey; that prior to moving to this address they resided at 6 West 75 Street, New York City. BEHSON CARLIE was reported employed as an engineer for the Smith Meeker Engineering Company, 157Chambers Street, Mew York City. His wife VIVIAN was reported employed by the United Corvice for New Americans, New York City, as a Vocational Counselor. Hewark reported that numerous unsuccessful attempts had been made to contact VIVIAN CARLIN at her residence in order that she might be interviewed and that in view of the fact that she was believed to be presently employed in New York City that the New York Office conduct the interview of her at her place of employment.

At United fervice for New Americans, 15 Park Row, New York City, it was ascertained from Miss ELEANOR EATZ, Personnel Director, that VIVIAN CARLIB, 0-67 Fairlawn Parkway, Fairlawn, New Jersey, was no longer employed by this organization, having terminated her employment on October 10, 1952.

RESULTS OF SURVEILLANCE OF SUBJECT

On October 13, 1952 the United States Supreme Court denied legal counsel for JULIUS and STHEL HOSENBERG and MORTON SCHELL, write of certiorari. A physical surveillance of subject was conducted following this court decision with the following results:

At 12:40 p.m. she left the bus at Pairlaun, New Jersey and entered the Pair Spot Luncheonette, 32 Street and Broadway, Fairlaun, New Jersey, where and remained about ten minutes. She then walked to a residence at 0-67 Fairlaun Parkway, Fairlaun, New Jersey, where she entered at 12:53 p.m.

At 7:20 p.m. the subject was observed by Eas RICHARD E. BRENNAN and ROBERT W. COHOLAR to leave 0-67 raiplawn Parkway, Pairlawn, New Jersey, with an unidentified woman. VIVIAH GLASSFAH boarded a New York bound bus at Fairlawn Farkway and Breadway and the unidentified woman returned to the residence. GLASSFAH returned to her home by the same route she had previously taken and entered her residence at 8:50 p.m.

October 15, 1952- BAB ROBERT W. COHOLAN and GBURGE M. OWEN

At 6:05 p.m. GLASSMAN was observed leaving ner residence and entering a delicatessen at 129 East Seventh Street where she remained for five minutes and returned to her residence.

October 16, 1952 - SAE ARNOLD E. BRANDT and WILLIAM D. WRIGHT III

At 7:40 p.m. subject was observed to leave her residence and board a North bound crosstown bus at Avenue A and East Eighth Street, New York City. At 14 Street and Seventh Avenue she left the bus and entered the IRT subway station

boarding a downtown Seventh Avenue express train. She left the train at the Clark Street station in Erocklyn and walked to and entered an apartment building at lift henry Street, brooklyn, at E:18 p.m. She left lift Henry Street at 9:15 and walked to an apartment house at 70 Pierrepont Street, brooklyn, Hew York. At 12:10 a.m. she left 70 Pierrepont Street, brooklyn and walked to the St. George Hotel at henry and Clark Streets, where she boarded an IRT West Side express train and rode to the lif Street atop in Manhattan. At 12:10 a.m. she boarded an East bound bus and was observed leaving the bus at East E street and Avenue A and to enter her residence at 131 East 7 Street at 12:45 a.m.

It is known that the subject's sister ELLAM R GLASSMAN BUTGER resides at lim Henry Street, Procklyn, New York. It is also recalled that subject is acquainted with Dr. NATHAN ERLHUSITZ whose residence is at 70 Pierrepont Street, Brooklyn, and whose office is at 1 Hanson Place, Ercoklyn, New York.

At 8:15 p.m. the subject was observed leaving her apartment with a man answering the description of her husband, KRNLST PATA(I. They walked along Avenue A to the corner of Norfolk and belancy Street, hew York City, where at 8:35 they joined a group listening to spaceues at a street rally conducted by the Committee to Secure Justice for the EublighenGS and the American Labor Party. At 10:00 p.m. the street rally was trought to a close and subject and her has end walked to the corner of Clinton Street and heat houston Street where they entered Heissberg's Soda Fountain and Junchemette and were observed eating at the counter. At 10:30 p.m. they left the lunchemette and returned to their residence entering at 10:40 p.m.

The American Labor Part: was cited as a Communist front by the Un-American Activities Committee of the United States House of Representatives on Sarch 29, 1944.

Pollowing the denial of the Radulli-RCS: petition of to the Supreme Court for a writ of Certiorari which was decied on October 15, 1952 the houselesse! legal counsel petitioned the

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United States Supreme Court for a re-hearing of their original application which was denied by the Supreme Court on November 17, 1952.

A physical surveillance of the subject was conducted from November 17th to November 23, 1952 but no unusual activity on the part of the subject was noted between these dates.

DAVID GREEKGLASE and his wife, BUTE GREEKLASE. have advised that they were recruited into the Soviet espionage apparatus by JULIUS ROSKEBERS a brother-in-law of imvib onlesonass. David GREEGIASS is now serving a fifteen year sentence for trunsmitting cortain classified data relating to the atomic bomb project at Les Alamos, New Nextee, to RARRY GULD, a somfessed Soviet spy now serving a thirty-year sentence for espionage. Julius Rosenserg and his wife, Byhil, were sentenced to death in April, 1951 in the Southern District of New York for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

DAVID and BUTH SREWOLASS Learned through conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG during the period lique to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage in connection with which he was using as a conspiratorial beadquarters and for the purpose of microfilming documents a making espionage contacts an apartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City, and an apartment in the vicinity of Twelfth Street and Avenue B.

Information obtained from MI MINGER, the edults that Boskkeiko attempted to recruit him for Soviet espionage, indicates that the Greenwich Village apartment was located at 65 Norton Street, New York City. This apartment was rented in the name of Alyrku Baraki from October, 1943 to January, 1950.

Confidential Informent T-1, of move reliability. that Julius Rosessero mentioned on advised on apartment rested by a student estensibly used for studying or

Morton Street where he, JOEL BARR and 'BILL' used to meet in secret to discuss their plans." ROSLEBERG did not identify "BILL" at this time, but from other conversations informat had with ROSERBERG, "BILL" is believed by T-1 to be billiam PERL.

On The Total Total that ROSENBERG informed that his apartment was estensibly rented for a student to have a place to study but that the real purpose was to have a place for meetings. ROSENBERG said that he had typed for many hours on various occasions in the Morton Street apartment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table logs and would let the water run in the bathroom. ROSENBERG advised Tol that he paid the rent on this apartment.

ALFRED SAKAFT, upon interview, has advised that he was a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist Party in 1943-1944 and believes that he met JULIUS ROSENBERG through a mutual friend mused JOEL BARK. SAKANT has denied that RUSERBERG was ever in his apartment at 65 Norton Street, but MAI ELITCHER has advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR, VILLIAM PERL (also known to him as VILLIAM NUTTERPERL), and ELITCHER and his wife, MALERE, were together in SARAKT'S apartment, mumber 6-1, at 65 Morton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.

In 1945 ALPRED BARAYT married LOUISE SACCHELINE RUBLE-BOSS and moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946 at thich time the spartment at 65 Norton Etreet, New York City, was taken by his friend, JOHL BARK. It was arranged that BARK bould send him the rent for the apartment in Ithaca, New York, and that BARANT would then pay the landlord of 65 Norton Street by check.

SARAHT has advised that WILLIAM PERL, who was a friend of both Sakaht and John Bakk, used the apartment subsequent to JUEL BARK under the same rental paying arrangement and that PERL in sending the last money order payment in January, 1950 attached a note requesting SaBAKT to relinquish the apartment as PERL no longer had any use for it.

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MY 65-15385

ALPRES BARKET, following his interview by Bureau agents in July-August, 1950 fled the United States into Besies, entering under an assumed name. His present thereabouts are unknown.

WILLIAM FARL has been identified as a Seviet agent by RCSERBERG to Confidential Informant 9-1. PERL is at present under indistant for perjury before the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

JOEL BARR was identified as a seviet agent by BOSES-BERG to DAVID GREENLASS following JOEL BARR'S sailing from the United States for Europe in January, 1946. BOSESBERG advised DAVID CRIENGLASS that BARR was going to Europe to continue his espienage work in European countries.

ALPRED SARAET has advised that JUEL BARR had a girlfriend maned vivian CLASUKAN and that he believes that VIVIAN GLASSKAN sent him the first few rental payments in the form of money orders for the apartment rent at 65 Norten Street, New York City.

The Albany Office advised on July 22, 1950 that a money order musber 988487 issued at the Church Street Etation Fest Office, New York City, on August 5, 1949, payable to ALFRED SARAKT from VIVIAN GLASSHAN, 131 hast seventh Street, New York City, as a remitter, was lessted in the account of ALFRED SARANT in the First National Bank of Ithasa, new York. This money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bore a deposit date of August 11, 1949.

VIVIAN GLASIKAN has advised upon interview that she was the fermer fiances of Juli Bakk and that she had sent money orders to Alfred Sarahi in payment of the yent on \$5 Morton Street in July and August, 1948. She also admitted that she had made an airpiane trip to Gleveland, Ohio on July 22, 1950 to contact william FERL with \$2,000.00 in each and to give instructions to FERL to leave the United States and go to measure. She stated that she received the \$2,000.00 and the instructions from PERL from an unknown man who contacted her st



her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. CLASSKAR claimed that the identity of the man who contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist agents to identify him.

Genfidential Informent T-1 savised that in conversation JULIUS ROSEKBERG stated that an a holiday weekend, which the informent believes may have been the Fourth of July weekend, 1949, VILLIAN PERL removed some secret files from a laboratory located at Gelumbia University and that PERL took these files to ROSEKBERG'S apartment at Eniskerbocker Village, New York City, where ROSEEBERG, PERL, a third unidentified individual who was called in from out of town, and a fourth man, together spent fourteen to seventeen hours with two emerse photographing the material that PERL had obtained in order that PERL could return the material at his carliest convenience to Gelumbia University. ROSEMERG insidated to T-1 that the third man was KICHAEL SIDUROVICE, who he described as a member of his ospicage organisation.

Genfidential Informant 7-1 stated that the fourth man was a definite member of the MOSKEBERG espionage apparatus; that he is the san who subsequently contacted VIVIAS GLASHAR on July 21, 1950, to arrange with her to proceed to Cleveland, thie, to contact WILLIAM PARL and give him \$2,000.00 in order to facilitate his flight from the United States to Mexico.

The informant advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG indicated that the Russians sent his last respuit to contact VIVIAE GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950 and that the last individual that JULIUS ROSENBERG respuited into his Soviet espienage ring was a man who lived with the son of a wealthy family. The informant stated that the son of the wealthy family cured a black convertible Buick automobile and that he had loaved his Buick to the last JULIUS ROSENBERG recruit who drove ROSENBERG to Ithesa, New York, to see ALFRED SAKANT and make a pickup of espionage material.

Genoerning the identity of the two individuals deseribed above by T-1, investigation to identify the last

recruit of JULIUE ROSEBBERG who lived with the son of a wealthy family and who ewned a 1949 or 1950 black Bulck convertible automobile with a white top, indicates that one MANDELL FIRESTORE, with alias MAI PIRESTORE, was the last recruit of JULIUE ROSEBBERG and that EDWARD JAMES WEIBSTEIN, commonly known as JAMES REIBSTEIN, was the individual with whom he lived.

JAKEL WRISETRIE is the son of JOSEPH WRIBETEIN, President of the Versailles Garment Corporation, 470 Seventh Avenue, New York City, a ladies' garment manufacturing firm. JAMES WRINETRIE, in an interview with Bureau agents on August 21, 1950, produced a New York State automobile registration dated January 19, 1950 for a 1949 Bulck convertible.

JAMES WEINSTEIN resided at 418 East Binth Street, For York City, with MAX PINKSTONE from February, 1950 to about October-November, 1950.

MAX FINESTONE who was born on July 20, 1922 at Boston, Massachusetts, is a graduate of Cornell University having graduated in September, 1949 and is a close friend of LOUISE (PUSS) SARANI.

On April 5, 1951 VIVIAR SEASEMAN was observed by BA SOME J. DOERMER and the writer leaving her apartment at 131 Rast Seventh Street, New York City, with a sun who was subsequently identified as SAL FIRESOME.

THEORY STOR INDICATING SUBJECT'S ACCUAINTANCE WITH MORTON SORELL

MORTOR SOBELL was indicted with JULIUS and BIELL ROSERBERG for conspiracy to commit carionage against the United States and was tried with the ROSERBERGS in the Southern District of New York in March, 1951. He was convicted and sentenced to thirty years imprisonment. Testimony during the course of the trial by JULIUS ROSERBERG reflects that VIVIAN GLASSMAS was acquainted with MORTON SOBELL. On March 22, 1951

in the afternoom court session of the trial of the BOSEKBERG and MORTOS SCHELL, JULIUS ROSEKBERG testified on direct examination that MORTON SCHELL and his wife had visited at the ROSEKBERG'S home in Enickerbooker Village, IC Hourse Street, New York City, about Christmas, 1947 or 1948; that other people were present but that the only examples of that ROSEKBERG could remember was VIVIAR GLASSMAN.

# TOUTE BOSINGERS SETTINGER SULLE BANKE ALONG THE SALES ALONG TOUTS

At the morning/session on March 26, 1951 under cross areainstion b, the United States Attorney, fouthern District of New York, IR. ING SAYFOL, JULIUS ROSENBERG testified that he knows VIVIAE CLASSKAE and was introduced to her by JUEL MARK many years ago at a place that he mo longer remembers. He believed that it might have escurred at a union headquarters. He stated that he had seen VIVIAE CLASSKAE aff and on since 1939. He was unable to state how many times a year he saw her.

ROSIVERS stated that subject was JOIL BARR'S sweetheart and that BAFR scretizes brought her to ROSIBERS'S home and that on other secasions ROSETBIES saw her at musicales. ROSERBIRG testified that JOEL BARR left the country about the end of 1947 or the beginning of 1948 and that since that time he has seen VIVIAE GLALSMAN at his own home or at his shop but had never seen her at any gatherings.

ROSEREERG testified that in 1950 he had seen VIVIAN ELASKAN a mumber of times and had seen her for the last time a couple of months before his arrest. He stated that VIVIAN ELASKAN was a cotial worker and that he had discussed his problem child with her and that as a result of this discussion treatment of NICHAEL BOCHEBERG was undertaken at the Jovian Board of Guardians. BOSEMBERG denied giving VIVIAN GLASSAN and memory or conding her on a trip to Gleveland, Ohio. Me stated that he had never heard of this trip or of the money before it was mentioned in the courtrows. He apositically





denied giving \$LASSMAN \$2,000.00 to take to Cleveland.
ROSENTERS admitted that he may have read of VIVIAN GLASSMAN in a case in the newspaper a few weeks before. he testifed that he did not read however that he had given her any money.

ROSINDERS admitted knowing ALPRES RATAUT and saw him for the last time in late 1949 or early 1950. Be testified that he saw SARAST at SARAKT'S apartment and had gone there to berrow \$300.00 from him. he stated that SARAKT gave him this swe and that he new eves SARAKT a total of \$400.00.

BUSINEERS Stated that he was introduced to ALFRED SARANT by JUEL EARS at an apartment that they were sharing in Greenvieh Village. He recalled the number of the house was to but could not remember the street. He recognised Norten Street when the United States Attorney suggested it to him. BUSINEERS testified that his wife NYALL was with him once when he went to the 65 Norten Street, New York City, apartment but he denied ever going there with MORTEN BUSINES.

## Interview of Mias Avis Delkan

On September 19, 1952 Niss AVIS DELMAN, 65 Norten Street, New York City, Apartment 6h, was interviewed by AA Retert 7. Reyal in regard to her knowledge of MAIWALL PINASTURE and his associates. 



DAVID GREENGLASE and his wife, BUTH GREENGLASE have advised that they were recruited into the Soviet espionage apparatus by JULIUS BOSERSENA a brother-in-law of invit onlesonass. David GRIEFGIASS is now serving a fifteen year sentence for trucanitting cortain classified data relating to the atomic bomb project at Les Alamos, New Mexico, to RARRY GGLD, a confessed beviet spy now serving a thirty-year sentence for espionage. Julius Robersand and his wife, Briel, were sentenced to death in April, 1951 in the Southern District of New York fo conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

MALO and MITE GREEK CLASS LOAMON Shrough conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG during the period 1946 to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Seviet espionage in connection with which he was using as a conspiratorial beadquarters and for the purpose of microfilming decusents making espienage contacts an apartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City, and on apartment in the Vicinity of Twolfth Street and Avenue B.

Information obtained from MAI BLITCHER, the admits that ROSLIBERO attempted to recruit him for Soviet ospionage, indicates that the Greenwick Village apartment was located at 65 Borton Street, Bow York City. This apartness was rented in the man of Alykku Baraki from October, 1943 so Japuary, 1950.

Confidential Informent T-1, of move reliability. that Julius ROSEBSERG sentioned on advised and apartment feated by a student estensibly used for studying o

On The Table Table that ROSENBERG informed that his apartment was estensibly rented for a student to have a place to study but that the real purpose was to have a place for meetings. ROSENBERG said that he had typed for many hows on various occasions in the Horton Street apartment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table legs and would let the water run in the bathroom. EGLEBERG advised Table that he paid the rent on this apartment.

ALIRED BARAFT, upon interview, has advised that he was a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist Party in 19.3-19.44 and believes that he met JULIUS ROSEBBARG through a mutual friend mused JOEL BARR. BARAFT has denied that RUSEBBARG was ever in his apartment at 65 Norton Street, but HAI ELITCHE has advised that JULIUS ROSEBBARG, JOEL BARR. WILLIAM PERL (also known to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL), and ELITCHER and his wife, ELLERK, were together in SARAHT'S apartment, mumber 6-1, at 65 Norton Street, New York City, In 1963-1966.

In 1945 ALPRED BARAYT married LOVIER SACCHELINE RUBEL-BOSS and moved to Ithaea, New York, in about September, 1946 at which time the spartment at 65 Norton Street, New York City, was taken by his friend, JOEL BARR. It was arranged that BARR bould send him the rent for the spartment in Ithaea, New York, and that SARAYT would them pay the landlord of 65 Norton Street by check.

SARAHT has advised that WILLIAM PERL, who was a friend of both SARAHT and JOHL BARK, used the apartment subsequent to JOHL BARK under the same rental paying arrangement and that PERL in sending the last money order payment in January, 1950 attached a note requesting SARAHT to relinquish the apartment as PERL no longer had any use for it.

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#### MY 65-15385

ALPRED BARLET, following his interview by Bureau agents in July-August, 1950 fled the United States into Bexios, entering under an assumed name. His present whereabouts are unknown.

WILLIAM PARL has been identified as a Seviet agent by RCSEFBERO to Confidential Informant 8-1. PARL is at present under indistant for perjury before the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

JOEL BARR was identified as a Seviet agent by MOSES-BERG to DAVID GREENLASS following SOIL BARR'S sailing from the United States for Europe in January, 1948. BOSEEBERG advised DAVID CREENGLASS that BARR was going to Europe to continue his espienage work in European countries.

ALPRED SARAKT has advised that JOEL BARE had a giplfriend maned vivial GLASCKAR and that he believes that VIVIAN GLASSKAR sent him the first few rental payments in the form of money orders for the apartment rent at 65 Norton Street, New York City.

The Albany Office advised on July 22, 1950 that a money order musber 955487 issued at the Church Street Station Fest Office, New York City, on August 5, 1949, payable to ALPRED SARAKT from VIVIAN GLASSHAN, 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, as a remitter, was lessted in the account of ALPRED BARANT in the First National Bank of Ithasa, New York. This money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bore a deposit date of August 11, 1949.

VIVIAN GLASSKAN has advised upon interview that the was the former fiances of Jull Bark and that the had sent money orders to ALFRED BARANI in payment of the rent on the Norten Street in July and August, 1948. She also admitted that the had made an airpiane trip to Cleveland, Chio on July 22, 1950 to contact william PERL with \$2,000.00 in each and to give instructions to PERL to leave the United States and go to Mexico. She stated that she received the \$2,000.00 and the instructions from PERL from an unknown man who contacted her at

her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. CLASSKAN claimed that the identity of the man the contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist agents to identify him.

Genfidential Informant T-1 advised that in conversation JULIUE BOLINBERG stated that on a holiday weekend, which the informant believes may have been the Fourth of July weekend, 1949, William PERL removed some secret files from a laboratory located at Columbia University and that PERL took these files to ROSEEBERG'S apartment at Eniskerbooker Village, Bow York City, where ROSEEBERG, PERL, a third unidentified individual who was called in from out of town, and a fourth man, together apent fourteen to seventeen hours with two cameras photographing the material that PERL had obtained in order that PERL could return the material at his carliest convenience to Columbia University. ROSEEBERG indicated to T-1 that the third man was RICHAEL SIDOROVICE, who he described as a member of his capionage organisation.

Sensidential Informant ?-1 Stated that the fourth man was a definite number of the MORENERS espicance apparatus; that he is the man who subsequently contacted VIVIAE CLASHAE on July 21, 1950, to arrange with her to proceed to Cleveland, thie, to contact WILLIAM PARL and give him \$2,000.00 in order to facilitate his flight from the United States to Mexico.

The informant advised that FULIUS ROSKYBERS indicated that the Russians sent his last recruit to centact VIVIAR GLASKAR on Fuly 21, 1950 and that the last individual that FULIUS ROSKYBERS recruited into his Soviet espicance ring was a man the lived with the sen of a wealthy family. The informant stated that the sen of the wealthy family cured a black convertible Buick automobile and that he had leared his Buick to the last JULIUS ROSKYBERS recruit who drove ROSKYBERS to Ithaca, New York, to see ALPERD SARARY and make a pickup of espicance material.

Generaling the identity of the two individuals described above by 3-1, investigation to identify the last

pecrait of Julius Rosseberg who lived with the son of a wealthy family and who sweed a 1949 or 1950 black Buick convertible automobile with a white top, indicates that one market Flacefore, with alias MAX PIRESTORE, was the Last recruit of Julius Rosseberg and that EDWARD JAMES VEINSTRIE, commonly known as JAMES brisstrie, was the individual with whom he lived.

JAMES WRINGTRIN is the son of JOSEPH WRINGTEIN, President of the Versailles Garment Corporation, 470 Seventh Avenue, New York City, a ladies' garment manufacturing firm. JAMES WRINGTRIN, in an interview with Bureau agents on August 21, 1950, produced a New York State automobile registration dated January 19, 1950 for a 1949 Bulek convertible.

JAMES WEINSTEIN resided at 418 East Binth Street, Bow York City, with MAX PINESTONE from February, 1950 to about October-November, 1950.

MAX FINESTONE who was born on July 25, 1922 at Boston, Massachusetts, is a graduate of Cornell University baving graduated in September, 1949 and is a close friend of LOUISE (PUSS) SARANI.

On April 5, 1951 VIVIAN CLASSMI was observed by SA JOHN J. DOKEMER and the writer leaving her apartment at 131 Bast Seventh Street, New York City, with a man the was Subsequently identified as MAI FINESTONE.

Information Indicating Subject's Acquaintance with morton bornell

MORTOR SOBELL was indicted with FULTUS and RIMEL ROSKEBERG for conspiracy to commit explanage against the United States and was tried with the ROSEBBERGS in the Southern Bistriet of New York in March, 1951. He was convicted and contended to thirty years imprisonment. Testimony during the course of the trial by FULTUS ROSEBERG reflects that VIVIAN GLASHAR was acquainted with MORTON BORNIL. On March 22, 1951

in the afternoom court session of the trial of the BOSEKBERG! and MORTON BOBELL, JULIUS ROSEKBERG testified on direct examination that MORTON BOBELL and his wife had visited at the ROSEKBERG'S home in Enickerbooker Village, it Monroe Street, now York City, about Christmas, 1947 or 1948; that other people were present but that the only examples that ROSEKBERG could remember was VIVIAN GLASHAR.

# Sulius rosindero's estimont Regarding vivial glassman

At the morning/session on March 26, 1951 under cross Axamination b, the United States Attorney, Southern District of New York, IR.186 SAYPOL, FULIUS ROSERBERG testified that he knows VIVIAS CLASSMAN and was introduced to her by JOEL BAFR many years ago at a place that he me longer remembers. So believed that it might have securred at a union headquarters. So stated that he had seen VIVIAN GLASSMAN off and on since 1939. He was unable to state how many times a year he saw her.

ROSEYBERG stated that subject was JOEL BARR'S gweetheart and that BARR sometimes brought her to ROSEKBERG'S home and that on other secasions ROSEKBERG saw her at musicales. ROSEKBERG testified that JOEL BARR left the sountry about the end of 1947 or the beginning of 1948 and that since that time he has seen YIVIAE GLALSHAH at his own home or at his shop but had never seen her at any gatherings.

ROSKEERS testified that in 1950 he had seen VIVIAN CLASSMAN a number of times and had seen her for the last time a couple of months before his arrest. He stated that VIVIAN CLASSMAN was a social worker and that he had discussed his problem child with her and that as a result of this discussion treatment of NICHAEL ROSEBBERS was undertaken at the Jowish Board of Guardians. ROSEBBERS denied giving VIVIAN CLASSMAN any memory or sending her on a trip to Claveland, Ohio. He stated that he had never heard of this trip or of the money before it was mentioned in the courtroom. He specifically

denied giving GLASSMAR \$2,000.00 to take to Cleveland.
ROSLHLEG admitted that he may have read of VIVIAE GLASSMAR
in a case in the mewspaper a few weeks before. he testifed -that he did not read however that he had given her an; money.

ROSLECERO admitted knowing ALPRES RARAFT and paw him for the last time in late 1949 or early 1950. He testified that he saw SAFAFT at SARAFT'S apartment and had gone there to berrow \$300.00 from him. he stated that SARAFT gave him this sum and that he new even SARAFT a total of \$400.00.

ANSINEERS stated that he was introduced to ALFRED SARAHT by JULL EARE at an apartment that they were sharing in Greenvieh Village. He recalled the number of the house was 65 but could not remember the street. He recognised Horton Street when the United States Attorney suggested it to him. RUSLHUERS testified that his wife HTELL was with him once when he went to the 65 Norton Street, New York City, apartment but he denied ever goin, there with HORTON SUBLIC.

#### TETARVIEW OF MISS AVIS DELKAN

On September 19, 1952 Niss AVIS DELPAN, 65 Norten Street, New York City, Apartment &i, was interviewed by SA Retert F. Royal in regard to her knowledge of MAIWALL PINASTUNE and his associates. She advised that in about Aprilary, 1952 one WALTLE WYS;, 96-24, 215 Street, Queens Village, Long Island, New York, contacted her regarding a market research job for a Chicago research firm and that in connection with this job she met FINASTUNA. Thereafter, FINESTUNE dated her on several occasions prior to and subsequent to a trip that he made to Canada in May-June, 1952. (FIRESTUNE left Nork City from Idlewild Airport on May 14, 1952 destined for Montreal, Canada and returned about two weeks later).

Hiss DEIMAL advised that so recalls that PIRESTONS and once mentioned that he had visited at 65 Morton Street, New York City, where she resides at present. She stated that she assumed that this someone was a girl and did not pry further concerning the identity of this individual.

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It is possiled that ALPRED SARAHT posted Apartment di at 65 Morton Etreet, New York City, from October, 1943 to January 11, 1950, and that subsequent to Sakuli's departure from New York City to Ithaca, New York, in September, 1946 with his wife LOUISE, he allowed JOHL BARK, blumlak Fiki, MERRIETTA SAVIDOR, PREL'S present wife, and FIBERIONE to use his apartment during parts of the period between September, 1946 and January 11, 1950.

This is the same spartment building utilised by SULIUS ROSSMERES in commestion with his espiciage apparatus. Hiss DELKAN said that are did not recall PINESTONE ever mentioning the sames of blillan PIRL, SCEL BARK, ALPHED or LOUISE SAHANT, JULIUS or WINEL ROSERBERS or NURTUM SCENEL, in conversation. She did recall that he may have mentioned the mane "VIV" or VIVIAN in connection with information which he had furnished to her concerning two sisters who were allegedly plunning to join FINESTUNE and WALTEN VYES on a trip that FINESTONE and WYES took to Mexico during January-March, 1952. The stated that PINESTONE advised her that these two sisters and possibly some other people were going with PINESTONE and WYSS and that at the last moment both were "married very suddenly".

It is recalled that VIVIAE GLASSKIE married ERECT PATALL and that her sister ELEABOR married EUGENE E. M. INER on January 19th and J-muary 20, 1952 respectively in New York City. Information obtained at subject's place of employment, Long Island College Rospital, Brooklyn, New York, at the time of her marriage reflected that subject's marriage was very sudden and that she apparently had had no anticipation of the matter. Miss DELNAH advised that she is personally acquainted with MURIEL BOULIE, the is the divorced wife of ARINUR C. BOUDIE.

She said that MDRIKL had claimed that she was never happy in her marriage to ARTHUE BOUDIN and desired a second chance; that due is now aspiring to be an actress and is residing at 505 Yest 52 Street, New York City. Mim DELMAN

stated that MAI FIREFORE either putually shares or owns an automobile with ARTEUR BOUDIN. It is noted that VIVIAN ELASSING was observed on April 5, 1951 leaving her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, with MAI FIREFORE and to enter an automobile which was ascertained to be registered to ARTHUR BOUDIN.

A physical surveillance of FIRESTONE has revealed that he is residing with ARTHUR BOUDIN at 500A Grand Street, Bow York City. ARTHUR BOUDIN is the brother of LEGHARD B. SOUDIN, the lawyer consulted by VIVLAN GLASSKAN insediately after her interview by Bureau agents on August 3, 1950.

Generating berself, Miss BELMAN savised that the mane AVIS DELIKAN is a stage mame and she declined to furnish her legal mane. She indicated that she was formerly married so on un-perced man in Buffalo, Now York during 1939-1940: they were subsequently divorced. The stated that while in Buffale she was connected with a local theatrical group. The indicated that the had formerly lived with her family in Brocklyn, New York and had attended Brocklyn College for appresinately three years. In approximately 1942 or 1943 she moved from New York to Les Angeles, Galifornia and for approximately one year had attempted to "break into" the movies but did mot get past the serven test stage. While in Les Angeles, she was employed by BOL LESSER, a producer doing publicity and peerstariel work. She admitted knowing DAVID PRESSME and Indicated that she knew one "AL" MAKKE but that she definitely did not recall BRA BAMER.

Genfidential Informant T-Z, of known reliability, edvised in June, 1943 that information had been reserved in the form of a letter directed to the Communist Party Beadquarters, 121 Enight Street, San Francisco, California, Sencerning one AVIS DELMAN. This letter was directed by the Communist Party of Los Angeles County to the Communist Party Beadquarters at San Francisco, California and Stated that AVIS DELMAN who had been residing in Los Angeles for two months had some there from New York City Where she was a member of the Theatre Section of the Communist Party. AVIS DELMAN

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saviged the Nembership Director of Les Angeles County that she case without her transfer; that she had previously joined the Commist Party in Buffalo, New York and that for verification of her membership in that Party, BEA HAMMER and DAVID PRESSKAR should be contacted.

Confidential Informant 8-3, of known reliability, advised in Pebruary, 19th that the name of AVIS DELMAS, also known as TULIP CHESEMAS, appeared on the relia of the Communist Party, VSA as a member of Branch I which is a Communist branch composed mostly of people residing around the Vilshipe Boulevard and Pairfax Avenue Area, Los Angeles, Californias in 19th, and hat Communist Party book number 20695 having transferred from New York in June, 19th. Hiss DELMAS was asked if she was a sember of the Communist Party, VSA in Los Angeles in 19th, a member of the Theatrical Group of the Communist Party in North Party in North Party in North Party in North Party in Sev York prior to that time but she perused to discuss it.

## CORRESPONDENTS OF SUBJECT

Confidential Informant T-b, of known reliability, advised that the subject received correspondence from the Larenda Indian Shop, Santo Po, New Mexico on September 30, 1952.

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised that on May 9, 1952 one E. EUTEER, like Homy Street, Brooklyn, Bow York, was the addressor of correspondence to ARTHUR BOUDIE, 5004 Grand Street, How York City. E. HUTEER is believed to be identical with ELELHOR GLASSMAN BUTEER, publication sister, who resides at the above address. ELELHOR GLASSMAN married EUGLER HUTEER of 115 East 17 Street, How York City, on January 20, 1952.

#### SUBJECT IN ATTENDANCE AT YOUNG PROGRESSIVE OF AMERICA DANCES

On March 24, 1952 Confidential Informent T-6, of Anom reliability, edvised BAS RODERT P. ROTAL, SOSEPH V. WATERS and the writer that SAMS WRISCTEIN, a room-ate of MAX PIRESTONE, at \$18 East Binth Street, New York City, was an

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active member of and the Chairman in 1950-1951 of a club of the Young Progressives of America organization which hold its meetings at 95 Avenue B. New York City, in a meeting hall on the top floor. (JAMES MAISOTAIN was an associate of MAX PIRESTIME when both were students at Cornell University in 1949).

T-6 identified a photograph of VIVIAN GLASMAN and BLEAN A GLASMAN, subject's sister, as individuals that he had seen at the Tompkins Park Playground, Eighth Street and Avenue B, New York City, and at Young Progressives of America denses. T-6 stated that VIVIAN GLASMAN was also at a "peace vigit" held at the Central Palace hall on the lower Nest side of New York City during Caristnas Week, December, 1951. T-6 stated that JAMES WEINSTELN was also there but that he did not see WEINSTELN and the GLASSMAN sisters speaking to each other and sould not therefore state that they were acquainted with each other. T-6 sould not identify photographs of ERNEST PATAXI, has and of VIVIAN GLASSMAN or of KAINELL PIRESTEIN.

Concerning the Young Progressives of America organization, mentioned above, Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that after Labor May, 1945, a member of the RAY PRINDLANDER Club of the Communist Party was instructed to organize the Tompains Square Club of the Young Progressives of America and that the Organizer recruited meanly all of the members of the Tompains Square Club. T-7 stated that instructions were to see that not more than 55 or 60 per cent of the Executive Committee of the Young Progressives of America were Communist Party members in order that the group might more effectively fight the tag of Communist.

INTERVIEW OF TEJIAS BISLOP 217 East 19 Street Sew York City

Mr. Trinab BINEDP, Superintendent, 217 hast 19 Street, New York City on October 29, 1952 advised that the subject's brother HILTH GLASHAR, has been residing at this address in spartment AA, which was formerly ecoupled by SHNAST PATACI, without payment since April, 1952.





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Mr. 513h3P stated that the owner of the building, Mr. PHILIP MASSIER, had instituted court proceedings in May, 1952, to force HILTH GLASCKAE out of the apartment and that the court had issued an order for GLASCKAE to vacate the premises in forty-eight hours, but that GLASCKAE had an attorney appear in court and that the vacating order was amended to give GLASCKAE minety days within which to vacate.

Mr. DIBLO? Stated that MILTON GLASSYAK does not appear to be employed as he is seen at the apartment day and might and that his personal appearance seems to indicate that he drinks alconolic liquers heavily. Mr. BISHOP has noticed no visitors during the day or might and had not seen the subject at the apartment building within recent weeks.

On November 19, 1952, Mr. Thomas Bighop advised that a Sheriff's Graer had been obtained on September 15, 1952 ordering PATASI and MILT # GLASSMAN to vacto the premises at 217 East 19 Street by November 1, 1952.

Mr. BISEOF stated that on November 1, 1952 he had observed MREAST PATAKI assisting MILTOS GLASSMAN to move his effects out of the apartment and that they were placing furniture and other personal effects in a two-deer Ford sedan bearing New York 1952 license No. 90246.

Rr. BISHUP stated that me had observed PATAKI'S wife, the former VIVIAN GLASSMAN, at the apartment within recent weeks but did not recall whether or not she was present when PATAKI and GLASSMAN were emptying the apartment.

Mr. biseof stated that ERREST PATAKI and MILTON GLASSHAR were being sued by Philip EASSIER, exper of the building, for mon-payment of rent for the period between April, 1952 and November 1, 1952.

Mr. DISEOF stated that shortly before CLASSTAN and PATALI vecated the apartment MILTON CLASSMAN had inferred him test upon his arrival home one evening he had noticed that his apartment door had been "jimmled" open and that he was missing a portable radio and typewriter.

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Mr. BISHOP stated that he believes this commred some time in late October, 1952 or early Movember, 1952, and that presumably GLASSFAN mode a policy report in this matter

Alamos, New Mexico, to HARRY GOLD, a confessed Soviet spy now serving a thirty year sentence for espionage. JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife, ETHEL, were sentenced to death in April, 1951 in the Southern District of New York for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS learned through conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG during the period 1946 to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage in connection with which he was using as a conspiratorial headquarters and for the purpose of microfilming documents and making espionage contacts an apartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City and an apartment in the vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue B.

Information obtained from MAX ELITCHER, who admits that ROSENBERG attempted to recruit him for Soviet espionage, indicates that the Greenwich Village apartment was located at 65 Morton Street, New York City. This apartment was rented in the name of ALFRED SARANT from October, 1943 to January, 1950.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised on that JULIUS ROSENBERG "mentioned an apartment rented by a student ostensibly used for studying on Morton Street where he, JOEL BARR and BILL' used to meet in secret to discuss their plans." ROSENBERG did not identify "BILL" at this time, but from other conversations informant had with ROSENBERG, "BILL" is believed by T-1 to be WILLIAM PERL.

On T-1 stated that ROSENEERG informed that his apartment was estensibly rented for a student to have a place to study but that the real purpose was to have a place for meetings. ROSENBERG said that he had typed for many hours on various occasions in the Morton Street apartment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table legs and would let the water run in the bathroom. ROSENBERG advised T-1 that he paid the rent on this apartment.

ALFRED SARANT, upon interview, has advised that he was a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist

Party in 1943-1944 and believes that he met JULIUS ROSENBERG through a mutual friend named JOEL BARR. SARANT has denied that HOSENBERG was ever in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, but MAX SLITCHER has advised that JULIUS ROSUNBERG, JOEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL, (also known to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL), and ELITCHER and his wife, HELENE, were together in SARANT's apartment, number 6-1, at 65 Morton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.

In 1945, ALFRED SARANT married LOUISE JACQUELINE RUBEL-ROSS and moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946 at which time the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, was taken by his friend, JOEL BARR. It was arranged that BARR would send him the rent for the apartment in Ithaca, New York, and that SARANT would then pay the landlord of 65 Morton Street by check.

SARANT has advised that WILLIAM PERL, who was a friend of both SARANT and JOEL BARR, used the spartment subsequent to JOEL BARR under the same rental paying arrangement and that PERL in sending the last money order payment in January, 1950 attached a note requesting SARANT to relinquish the apartment as PERL no longer had any use for it.

ALFRED SARANT, following his interview by Bureau agents in July-August, 1950, fled the United States into Mexico, entering under an assumed name. His present whereabouts are unknown.

WILLIAM PERL has been identified as a Soviet agent by ROSENBERG to Confidential Informant T-1. PERL is at present under indictment for perjury before the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

JOEL BARR was identified as a Soviet agent by ROSENBERG to DAVID GREENGLASS following JOEL BARR's sailing from the United States for Europe in January, 1948. ROSENBERG advised DAVID GREENGLASS that BARR was going to Europe to continue his espionage work in European countries.

- ALFRED SARANT has advised that JOEL BARR had a girl-friend named VIVIAN GLASSMAN and that he believes that VIVIAN

GLASSMAN sent him the first few rental payments in the form of money orders for the apartment rent at 65 Morton Street, New York City.

The Albany Office advised on July 22, 1950 that a money order number 988487 issued at the Church Street Station Post Office, New York City, on August 8, 1949, payable to ALFRED SARANT from VIVIAN GLASSMAN, 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, as a remitter, was located in the account of ALFRED SARANT in the First National Bank of Ithaca, New York. This money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bore a deposit date of August 11, 1949.

VIVIAN GLASSMAN has advised upon interview that she was the former fiancee of JOEL BARR and that she had sent money orders to ALFRED SARANT in payment of the rent on 65 Morton Street in July and August, 1948. She also admitted that she had made an airplane trip to Cleveland, Ohio, on July 22, 1950 to contact WILLIAM PERL with \$2,000.00 in cash and to give instructions to PERL to leave the United States and go to Mexico. She stated that she received the \$2,000.00 and the instructions for PERL from an unknown man who contacted her at her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. GLASSMAN claimed that the identify of the man who contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist agents to identify him.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that in conversation JULIUS ROSENBERG stated that on a holiday weekend, which the informant believes may have been the Fourth of July weekend, 1949, WILLIAM PERL removed some secret files from a laboratory located at Columbia University and that PERL took these files to ROSENBERG's apartment at Knickerbocker Village, New York City, where ROSENBERG, PEPL, and a third unidentified individual, who was called in from out of town, and a fourth man, together spent fourteen to seventeen hours with two cameras photographing the material that PERL had obtained in order that PERL could return the material at his earliest convenience to Columbia University. ROSENBERG indicated to T-1 that the third man was MICHAEL SIDOROVICH, who he described as a member of his espionage organization.

Confidential Informant T-1 stated that the fourth man was a definite member of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus; that he is the man who subsequently contacted VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950 to arrange with her to proceed to Cleveland, Ohio, to contact WILLIAM PERL and give him \$2,000.00 in order to facilizate his flight from the United States to Mexico.

The informant advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG indicated that the Russians sent his last recruit to contact VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950 and that the last individual that JULIUS ROSENBERG recruited into his Soviet espionage ring was a man who lived with the son of a wealthy family. The informant stated that the son of the wealthy family owned a black convertible Buick automobile and that he had loaned his Buick to the last JULIUS ROSENBERG recruit who drove ROSENBERG to Ithaca, New York, to see ALFRED SARANT and make a pickup of espionage material.

Concerning the identity of the two individuals described above by T-1, investigation to identify the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG, who lived with the son of a wealthy family and who owned a 1949 or 1950 black Buick convertible automobile with a white top, indicates that one MAXWELL VEINESTONE, with alias MAX FINESTONE, was the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG and that EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN, commonly known as JAMES WEINSTEIN, was the individual with whom he lived.

JAMES WEINSTEIN is the son of JOSEPH WEINSTEIN, President of the Versailles Garment Corporation, 470 Seventh Avenue, New York City, a ladies garment manufacturing firm. JAMES WEINSTEIN, in an interview with Bureau agents on August 21, 1950, produced a New York State automobile registration dated January 19, 1950 for a 1949 Buick convertible.

JAMES WEINSTEIN resided at 418 East Ninth Street, New York City, with MAX FINESTONE from February, 1950 to about October-November, 1950.

MAXVFINESTONE, who was born on July 28, 1922 at Boston, Massachusetts, is a graduate of Cornell University,

...

having graduated in September, 1949 and is a close friend of LOUISE (PUSS) BARANT.

On April 5, 1951 VIVIAN GLASSMAN was observed by SA JOHN J. DOERMER and the writer leaving her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, with a man who was subsequently identified as MAX FINESTONE.

Subject Unknown to T-10 as a Member of the Young Progressives of America (YPA) or the Communist Party

On March 24, 1952, Confidential Informant T-1 advised that VIVIAN GLASSMAN and her sister, ELEANOR, were noted at the Tompkins Square Park Playgrounds, Eighth Street and Avenue B, New York City, and in attendance at YPA dances and that they attended a "peace vigil" at Central Palace Hall, New York City, in December, 1951.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, who advised that some time after Labor Day, 1948, a member of the Ray Friedlander Club of the Communist Party was instructed to form the Tompkins Square Club of the YPA and to see that not more than 55 per cent or 60 per cent of the membership were Communist Party members in order that the club might fight more effectively the tag of Communism, advised on January 23, 1953 that neither the subject nor the subject's husband, ERNEST PATAKI or her sister, KLEANOR, were known to informant to have been members of the YPA or of the Communist Party.

T-2 also viewed photographs of other suspected members of the ROSENBERG espionage apparatus, but did not recognize any of them.

1941 De Soto Automobile Registered to Subject's Husband

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised on January 12, 1953 that it was noted that at about 11:30 p.m., that date, a man bolieved to be the subject's husband, ERNEST PATAKI, was blowing the horn of a coupe

automobile outside the subject's residence and that GLASSMAN dropped him a key from her window.

At the Motor Vehicle Bureau, New York City, it was ascertained by SE CLINTON E. POLLOCK that the subject's husband, ERNEST PATAKI, had a 1953 automobile registration for a 1941 De Soto coupe, color blue, engine number, 877071, serial number 5T57675, New York 1953 license plate 9N-4946. PATAKI had a 1952 registration for a 1950 Hudson sedan, plate number QE6344.

### Bank Data

On December 30, 1952 at Manufacturers Trust Company, 230 Second Avenue, New York City, Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised that no deposits or withdrawals had been made in the subject's joint checking account during the month of December, 1952 and that the funds in the account amounted to \$371.20, and that they were subjected to a "hold" court order on December 1, 1952.

T-4 stated that PHILIR KASSIER and PAULINE KASSIER, judgment creditors, recovered a judgment against ERNEST PATAKI, judgment debtor, in the Municipal Court, Borough of Manhattan, First District, on November 26, 1952, in the sum of \$321.00. The Manufacturers Trust Company, 230 Second Avenue, New York City, was served with a third party subpoens on December 1, 1952, and the order was returnable December 12, 1952 at 52 Chambers Street, New York City. JEROME J. GREILSHEIMER, 110 Williams Street, New York City, was attorney for the KASSIERS.

T-4 advised that the subject and her husband, ERNEST PATAKI, were notified on December 1, 1952 of the court order on the bank to hold \$371.00, the balance then in the PATAKIS account, subject to further order of the court.

Attorney REUBEN M. COHEN, associate of JEROME J. GREILSHEIMER, attorney for judgment creditors, requested the court to grant the order on December 17, 1952. Notice was served by GREILSHEIMER on December 17, 1952, that the court would be asked to turn over to judgment creditors the sum of



On February 13, 1953, Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised that the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation would be notified if any substantial amount of money was withdrawn from this account, or if it were closed.

Information obtained from Confidential Informants T-4, T-5 and T-6 is not to be made public except in a usual proceeding, following the issuance of a subpoena.

### Correspondents

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that the subject received correspondence from the following:

January 21, 1953 - TOEPLITZ, 33 Monroe Place, Brooklyn, New York and February 19, 1953, FREDERICK F. GREENMAN, 20 Pine Street, New York City.

The Manhattan Telephone Directory, 1953, reflects that FREDERICK F. GREENMAN, 20 Pine Street, New York City, is an

attorney at law at this location.

The Indices of the New York Office were negative on this name.

The Brooklyn Telephone Directory, 1953, reflects that RICHARD H. TOEPLITZ resides at 33 Monroe Place, Brooklyn, New York.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, advised on February 11, 1947 that RICHARD and IRENE TOEPLITZ, 36 Connecticut Avenue, Long Beach, Long Island, New York, signed a petition for candidates for the American Labor Party election, November, 1946. The informant did not know whether or not this individual was identical with the RICHARD TOEPLITZ residing at 33 Monroe Place, Brooklyn, New York.

On May 29, 1940, an anonymous letter was received by the Bureau reporting that RICHARD TOZPLITZ, employed by L. W. Dumont and Company, Crude Rubber Brokers, 342 Madison Avenue, New York City, and formerly employed by Hecht, Levis and Kahn, Incorporated, New York City, and by Avia Company, New York City, was a Soviet informer, conveying such information through the Amtorg Corporation, New York City; that he boasts of being the one who engineered recent big purchases of crude rubber for Russia through Amtorg and works very closely with members of Amtorg.

The American Labor Party, mentioned above, was cited as a Communist front by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, report of March 19, 1944.

Investigation for Second Clandestine ROSENBERG Apartment

It is recalled that DAVID GREENGLASS advised in 1950 that through conversations which he had with JULIUS ROSENBERG he learned that ROSENBERG had an apartment located somewhere in the vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue B, New York City, which he used for possible microfilming work and as a place for contacting individuals who were connected with his espionage apparatus. This apartment was described by ROSENBERG

to GREENGLASS as being located on the fourth floor of either a walkup or an elevator apartment building and consisted of two and a half or three and a half rooms. The apartment was offered to GREENGLASS by ROSENBERG approximately two years after GREENGLASS was discharged from the Army in 1946.

The subject's apartment at 131 East Seventh Street,
New York City, is located in the general vicinity of 12th
Street and Avenue B; its exact location being at Seventh
Street and Avenue A and consists of two rooms and a small
kitchen. VIVIAN GLASSMAN moved into this apartment in July,
1947.

Investigation to ascertain the occupants of the apartment prior to that date reflected that the immediate previous occupants were acquaintances of VIVIAN GLASSMAN, one CARLA SMALL, who was a co-worker of the subject at ABrooklyn State Hospital, Brooklyn, New York, having rented the apartment. in November, 1945.

CARLA SMALL married STEPHEN LOUIS JAVNA in December, 1945 and they resided at this apartment, according to CARLA, until August, 1946.

Mrs. JAVNA stated: that commencing August, 1946, after she moved, that a co-worker from Brooklyn State Hospital named GRACE NICHOLS who married JOHN KARWOSKI, moved into the apartment and lived there until approximately // December, 1946, after which her brother-in-law, JONAS JAVNA, who was married in 1946, moved into the apartment and lived there until some time in the summer of 1947.

Mrs. JAVNA stated that she accidentally met VIVIAN GLASSMAN at that time, told her that the apartment was available and that GLASSMAN thereupon rented it. Mrs. JAVNA advised that due to the critical housing situation and difficulty in obtaining telephones, the apartment was kept in the name of Mr. and Mrs. JAVNA as were the utilities.

Investigation was conducted at the Consolidated Edison Company to determine the identity of the individuals to whom service was rendered at Apartment 4A at 131 East Seventh Street, New York, on July 24, 1950.

Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised that the records of the Consolidated Edison Company reflected that Apartment 4A at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, was occupied by Miss LENA BALKER from May 28, 1941 to June 20, 1943, at which time she moved from Apartment 4A to 4B at this address.

On August 12, 1943, Mrs. SOFI MELNYK's utilities were connected and she resided there until November 17, 1945. The utilities for this apartment were again connected on November 27, 1945 for Miss CARLA SMALL and a "turn on order" was used to change the name of this account as of June 20, 1946 from Miss CARLA SMALL to Mrs. S. L. JAVNA. A "turn on order" issued March 12, 1948 indicated responsibility for the account had been changed from Mrs. STEVE L. JAVNA to Miss VIVIAN GLASSMAN on February 2, 1948.

Consolidated Edison Company, dated March 18, 1948, to Miss VIVIAN GLASSMAN, 131 East Seventh Street, New York 9, New York, was located in the files of the Consolidated Edison Company. The bottom of this letter contained questions to be filled in by consumers to be used in determining the credit standing of the consumer. GLASSMAN stated that the address where she used electric and gas last was at 131 East Seventh Street, Apartment 4A and that the apartment utilities were then in the name of CARLA SMALL JAVNA. She indicated that this account was closed as of April 1, 1948 and was to be reopened at that time in her name.

T-9 stated that that a letter appearing in Consolidated Edison files from Miss CARLA SMALL reflects as follows:

"MAGNETIC DEVICES CORPORATION

"P.O. Box 112 Palisades Park, N.J. Geonia 4-4244

March 3, 1948

"Conselidated Edison Co. of New York, Inc. 4 Irving Place . --- New York, New York.

### "Gentlemen:

"Please discontinue gas and electric service at 131 East 7th St., New York City, effective April 1st. Will you kindly arrange to read the meters at this time and forward the bill in care of Miss Vivian Glassman, 131 East 7th Street, New York City.

"Please refund deposit #120536-3 (\$10.00) to me at Box 112, Palisades Park, New Jersey.

"Very truly yours, Carla Small (Miss) Carla Small."

The following letter was addressed by the Consolidated Edison Company to CARLA SMALL on March 10, 1948:

\*March 10, 1948 Re 131 East 7th St. Apt. 4-A 1-357B-158

"Miss Carla Small Box 112 Palisades Park, N.J.

"Dear Miss Small,

"Our records show that you discontinued using our service at 131 East 7th St., on June 3, 1946.

"Our records show that a check in refund of your deposit was mailed to you on Dec. 17, 1947 but was returned by the Post Office Department.

"Enclosed is our check #121918 for \$10.79 in refund of your deposit #120536-3 with accrued interest of seventy nine cents. We shall appreciate it if you will cash or deposit this check at your earliest convenience.

Personal Service Division.

There also appears inquiring memorandums in the files of the Consolidated Edison Company which were time stamped at 9:11 a.m., 1:25 p.m., and 4:38 p.m., on November 18, 1946 which indicated that STEVE JAVNA, Apartment 4A, telephone GR 3-8216, called Consolidated Edison and advised that all lights were out in his apartment.

It is noted that from the Consolidated Edison Company letter to CARLA SMALL, dated March 10, 1948, the records reflect that she discontinued Consolidated Edison services at 131 East Seventh Street on June 3, 1946 and that Consolidated Edison services for this apartment were not resumed until March 12, 1948, according to the date of the turn on order; however, it is also noted that an individual using the name of STEVE JAVNA telephoned Consolidated Edison Company three times on November 18, 1946 advising that all lights were out in the apartment, indicating that this individual was unaware that the electricity had been disconnected for Apartment 4A.

The records of the Consolidated Edison Company would indicate that utility services were not utilized in this apartment during the period of June 3, 1946 to March 12, 1948, which does not agree with the information obtained in the interview of CARLA SMALL JAVNA.

Investigation to clarify the continuity of service by the Consolidated Edison Company to Apartment 4A at 131 East Seventh Street, New York, to the aforementioned individuals is being continued.

### Information from MILTON KLEIN

It will be recalled that when VIVIAN GLASSMAN made her plane trip to Cleveland, Ohio, on Saturday, July 22, 1950, to contact WILLIAM PERL to give him \$2,000.00 in cash and instructions to leave the United States and go to Mexico, she left New York at about 1:30 p.m. and arrived in Cleveland, Ohio, about 3:30 p.m. She contacted Mrs. LOREE WATSON and her mother, Mrs. C. A. MIDDLETON at 16802 Larchwood, Cleveland, Ohio, where PERL had formerly rented a room, at about 4:00 p.m. and inquired for PERL and was referred to PERL at his new address.

Mrs. WATSON offered her the use of her phone to telephone PERL, but the subject refused, stating that she would go to see him directly; however, GLASSMAN did not appear at PERL's apartment at 666 East 103rd Street, Claveland, Ohio, until around noon on Sunday, July 23, 1950. The reason for the lapse of time from about 4:00 p.m., Saturday, July 22 to noon on Sunday, July 23, 1950, before the subject made her contact with PERL was unknown; GLASSMAN, upon interview, having stated that she was interested in job prospects, although she would not state who she had contacted for a job on Saturday afternoon and night.

From information obtained from MILTON KLEIN, it would appear that GLASSMAN probably attempted to make her contact on Saturday, but was unable to find PERL at home.

MILTON M. KLEIN. 2690 Morris Avenue, Bronx, New York. instructor in Physics at New York University, a close friend of WILLIAM PERL' and a college classmate in 1934-1938 at the College of the City of New York of JULIUS ROSENBERG and of JOEL BARR, former flance of VIVIAN GLASSMAN, informed SA MAURICE W. CORCORAN in February-March, 1953 that he worked with WILLIAM PERL at the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics (NACA) at Langley Pield, Virginia, in about July, 1942 and that subsequently in about July, 1948, they resided at the same address on Franklin Avenue in Cleveland; that both were employed as engineers by NACA; that PERL helped him to get the job in Cleveland; that KLEIN, PERL and JOEL BARR went to BARR's home in about 1938-1940, believed to possibly have been in Brooklyn, New York, where BARR showed some radio equipment he was interested in as he was a radio "ham", or amateur operator; that PERL was a very good friend of BARR, although KLEIN claimed to know BARR only casually at City College.

KLEIN said in reference to VIVIAN GLASSMAN's visit to PERL in July, 1950 that he was unaware that VIVIAN GLASSMAN had contacted PERL in Cleveland, Ohio, until some time in the summer of 1951, when he learned from STANLEY KANAREK, an associate of RAYMOND NISE, PERL's lawyer, of record, that she had done so. KANAREK contacted KLEIN in Cleveland, Ohio, and requested him to be a character witness for PERL.

KLEIN stated that he had never met VIVIAN GLASSMAN and when shown a photograph of her did not recognize her as anyone that he had ever known. KLEIN advised that he believes on the night of July 22, 1950, a Saturday, a friend, BERT RIBNER, staged a party at his house to which he and PERL were invited.

(KLEIN stated that about 11:00 a.m. on Saturday. July 22, 1950, PERL telephoned him at his home and advised him that he did not believe that he would go to the RIBNER party that night as he was having some difficulty with the Federal Bureau of Investigation and that he believes that his wires are tapped and that he is being followed. He said that he was calling from an outside phone booth instead of from his apartment. PERL concluded by stating that he would stop over to see KLEIN later in the day. PERL appeared at KLEIN's apartment early that evening and explained that he was being investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation for disloyalty, but did not explain, according to KLEIN, what the disloyalty investigation was based on other than that the Federal Bureau of Investigation was interested in his acquaintance with JULIUS ROSENBERG and the fact that he had rented the apartment of JOEL BARR. They spent about thirty minutes together and then PERL left.

KLEIN subsequently proceeded to and met PERL at the apartment of a girl named GLENDON BENNETT, upon whom PERL was calling. He placed the time as around 7-8 o'clock that evening and they proceeded to the party and stayed until about 1:00 a.m. They then took their dates home, each going in his own automobile.

On Sunday, July 23, 1950, according to KLEIN, an outdoor picnic was scheduled and PERL accompanied the group.

KLEIN stated that PERL did not tell him that the subject had contacted him in the early afternoon of Sunday, July 23, 1950, at any time that day while they were on the picnic, or thereafter, and the purpose of her visit was unknown to him until PERL's lawyer told him about it.

KLEIN advised that he had received no telephone calls from anyone, local or long distance, to contact PERL with a message nor had anyone called him for information concerning PERL and had no knowledge of GLASSMAN having been in Cleveland on July 22,23, 1950.

KLEIN did not recognize photographs of MICHAEL SIDOROVICH or MAXWELL FINESTONE.

A physical surveillance of WILLIAM PERL, on July 22, 1950 in Cleveland, revealed that PERL entered KLEIN's residence at 7:09 p.m. on July 22, 1950.

Alamos, New Mexico, to HARRY GOLD, a confessed Soviet spy now serving a thirty year sentence for espionage. JULIUS ROSENBE D and his wife, ETHEL, were sentenced to death in April, 1951 in the Southern District of New York for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS learned through conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG during the period 1946 to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage in connection with which he was using as a conspiratorial headquarters and for the purpose of microfilming documents and making espionage contacts an apartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City and an apartment in the vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue B.

Information obtained from MAX ELITCHER, who admits that ROSENBERG attempted to recruit him for Soviet espionage, indicates that the Greenwich Village apartment was located at 65 Morton Street, New York City. This apartment was rented in the name of ALPRED SARANT from October, 1943 to January, 1950.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised on that JULIUS ROSENBERG mentioned an apartment rented by a student ostensibly used for studying on Morton Street where he, JOEL BARR and 'BILL' used to meet in secret to discuss their plans." ROSENBERG did not identify "BILL" at this time, but from other conversations informant had with ROSENBERG, "BILL" is believed by T-1 to be VILLIAM PERL.

On T-1 stated that ROSENBERG informed that his apartment was estensibly rented for a student to have a place to study but that the real purpose was to have a place for meetings. ROSENBERG said that he had typed for many hours on various occasions in the Morton Street apartment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table legs and would let the water run in the bathroom. ROSENBERG advised T-1 that he paid the rent on this apartment.

ALFRED SARANT, upon-interview, has advised that he was a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist

Party in 1943-1944 and believes that he met JULIUS ROSENBERG through a mutual friend named JOEL BARR. SARANT has denied that ROSENBERG was ever in his apartment at 65 Morton Street, but NAX ELITCHER has advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL, (also known to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL), and ELITCHER and his wife, HELENE, were together in SARAHT's apartment, number 6-1, at 65 Morton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.

In 1945, ALFRED SERANT married LOUISE JACCUELING RUBEL-ROSS and moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946 at which time the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, was taken by his friend, JOEL BARR. It was arranged that BARR would send him the rent for the apartment in Ithaca, New York, and that SARANT would then pay the landlord of 65 Morton Street by check.

of both SARANT and JOEL BARR, used the spartment subsequent to JOEL BARR under the same rental paying arrangement and that PERL in sending the last money order payment in January, 1950 attached a note requesting SARANT to relinquish the apartment as PERL no longer had any use for it.

ALFRED SARANT, following his interview by Bureau agents in July-August, 1950, fled the United States into Mexico, entering under an assumed name. His present whereabouts are unknown.

WILLIAM PERL has been identified as a Soviet agent by ROJENBERD to Confidential Informant T-1. PERL is at present under indictment for perjury before the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

JOEL BARR was identified as a Soviet agent by ROSENBERG to DAVID GREENGLASS following JOEL BARR's sailing from the United States for Europe in January, 1948. ROSENBERG advised DAVID GREENGLASS that BARR was going to Europe to continue his espionage work in European countries.

friend named VIVIAN GLASSMAN and that he believes that VIVIAN

GLASSMAN sent him the first few rental payments in the form of money orders for the apartment rent at 65 Morton Street, New York City.

The Albany Office advised on July 22, 1950 that a money order number 988487 issued at the Church Street Station Post Office, New York City, on August 8, 1949, payable to ALFRED SARANT from VIVIAN GLASSMAN, 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, as a remitter, was located in the account of ALFRED SARANT in the first National Bank of Ithaca, New York. This money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bore a deposit date of August 11, 1949.

VIVIAN GLASSMAN has advised upon interview that she was the former fiances of JOEL BARR and that she had sent money orders to ALFRED SARANT in payment of the rent on 65 Morton Street in July and August, 1948. She also admitted that she had made an airplane trip to Cleveland, Ohio, on July 22, 1950 to contact WILLIAM PERL with \$2,000.00 in cash and to give instructions to PERL to leave the United States and go to Mexico. She stated that she received the \$2,000.00 and the instructions for PERL from an unknown men who contacted her at her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. GLASSMAN claimed that the identify of the man who contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist agents to identify him.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that in conversation JULIUS ROSENBERS stated that on a holiday weekend, which the informant believes may have been the Fourth of July weekend, 1949, WILLIAM PERL removed some secret files from a laboratory located at Columbia University and that PERL took these files to ROSERBERS's apartment at Knickerbocker Village, New York City, where ROSENBERG, PERL, and a third unidentified individual, who was called in from out of town, and a fourth man, together spent fourteen to seventeen hours with two cameras photographing the material that FERL had obtained in order that PERL could return the material at his earliest convenience to Columbia University. ROSENBERG indicated to T-1 that the third man was MICHAEL SIDOROVICH, who he described as a member of his espionage organization.

Confidential Informant T-1 stated that the fourth man was a definite member of the ROSENFORG estionage apparatus; that he is the man who subsequently contacted VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950 to arrange with her to proceed to Cleveland, Ohio, to contact WILLIAM PERL and give him \$2,000.00 in order to facilizate his flight from the United States to Mexico.

The informant advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG indicated that the Russians sent his last recruit to contact VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950 and that the last individual that JULIUS ROSENBERG recruited into his Soviet espionage ring was a man who lived with the son of a wealthy family. The informant stated that the son of the wealthy family owned a black convertible Buick automobile and that he had losned his Buick to the last JULIUS ROSENBERG recruit who drove ROSENBERG to Ithaca, New York, to see ALFRED SARANT and make a pickup of espionage material.

Concerning the identity of the two individuals described above by T-1, investigation to identify the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG, who lived with the son of a wealthy family and who owned a 1949 or 1950 black Buick convertible automobile with a white top, indicates that one MAXWELL PINESTONE, with alias MAX PINESTONE, was the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERG and that adward JAMES WEINSTEIN, commonly known as JAMES WEINSTEIN, was the individual with whom he lived.

JAMES WEINSTEIN is the son of JOSEFII WEINSTEIN, President of the Versailles Germent Corporation, 470 Seventh Avenue, New York City, a ladies garment manufacturing firm. JAMES WEINSTEIN, in an interview with Bureau agents on August 21, 1950, produced a New York State automobile registration dated January 19, 1950 for a 1949 Buick convertible.

JAMES WEINSTEIN resided at 418 dast Ninth Street, New York City, with MAX FINESTONE from February, 1950 to about October-November, 1950.

Boston, Massachusetts, is a graduate of Cornell University,

having graduated in September, 1949 and is a close friend of LOUISE (PUSS) SARANT.

On Spril 5, 1951 VIVIAN GLASSMAN was observed by SA JOHN J. DOERNER and the writer leaving her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, with a man who was subsequently identified as MAX FINESTONE.

Subject Unknown to T-10 as a Member of the Young Progressives of America (YA) or the Communist Party

On March 24, 1952, Confidential Informant T-1 advised that VIVIAN GLASSMAN and her sister, ELZANOR, were noted at the Tompkins Square Park Playgrounds, Zighth Street and Abenus B, New York City, and in attendance at YPA dances and that they attended a "peace vigil" at Central Palace Hell, New York City, in December, 1951.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, who advised that some time after Labor Day, 1945, a member of the Ray Priedlander Club of the Communist Party was instructed to form the Tompkins Square Club of the YPA and to see that not more than 55 per cent or 60 per cent of the membership were Communist Party members in order that the club might fight more effectively the tag of Communism, advised on January 23, 1953 that neither the subject nor the subject's husband, ERNEST PATAKI or her sister, ELEANOR, were known to informant to have been members of the YPA or of the Communist Party.

T-2 elso viewed photographs of other suspected members of the RCSENBERS espionage apparatus, but did not recognize any of them.

19hl De Soto Automobile Registered to Subject's Husband

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised on January 12, 1953 that it was noted that at about 11:30-p.m., that date, a man believed to be the subject's husband, ERNEST PATAKI, was blowing the horn of a coupe

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automobile outside the subject's residence and that GLASSMAN dropped him a key from her window.

At the Motor Vehicle Bureau, New York City, it was ascertained by SE CLINTON E. POLLOCK that the subject's husband, ERNEST PATAKI, had a 1953 automobile registration for a 1941 De Soto coupe, color blue, engine number, 877071, serial number 5T57675, New York 1953 license plate 9N-4946. PATAKI had a 1952 registration for a 1950 Hudson sedan, plate number QE6344.

### Bank Data

On December 30, 1952 at Manufacturers Trust Company, 230 Second Avenue, New York City, Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised that no deposits or withdrawals had been made in the subject's joint checking account during the month of December, 1952 and that the funds in the account amounted to \$371.20, and that they were subjected to a "hold" court order on December 1, 1952.

T-4 Etated that PHILIP KASSIER and PAULINE KASSIER, judgment creditors, recovered a judgment against ERNEST PATAKI, judgment debtor, in the Municipal Court, Borough of Manhattan, First District, on November 26, 1952, in the sum of \$321.00. The Manufacturers Trust Company, 230 Second Avenue, New York City, was served with a third party subpoena on December 1, 1952, and the order was returnable December 12, 1952 at 52 Chambers Street, New York City. JEROME J. CREILSHEIMER, 110 Williams Street, New York City, was attorney for the KASSIERS.

T-4 advised that the subject and her husband, ERNEST PATAKI, were notified on December 1, 1952 of the court order on the bank to hold \$371.00, the balance then in the PATAKIS account, subject to further order of the court.

Attorney REUBEN M. COHEN, associate of JEROME J. GREILSHEIMER, attorney for judgment creditors, requested the court to grant the order on December 17, 1952. Notice was served by GREILSHEIMER on December 17, 1952, that the court would be asked to turn over to judgment creditors the sum of

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\$321.00 on deposit in the Manufacturers Trust Company, pursuant to Section 79k of the Civil Practices Act, on January 6, 1953, in Special Term Part I Court, 52 Chambers Street, New York City.

On January 30, 1953, T-1; advised that FATAKI paid the above mentioned Judgment with a certified check dated January 6, 1953, in the sum of \$321.00.

The Brooklyn Telephone Directory, 1953, reflects that RICHARD H. TORPLITZ resides at 33 Monroe Place, Brooklyn, Hew York.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, advised on February 11, 1947 that RICHARD and IRENE TOEPLITZ, 36 Connecticut Avenue, Long Beach, Long Island, New York, signed a petition for candidates for the American Labor Party election, November, 1946. The informant did not know whether or not this individual was identical with the RICHARD TOEPLITZ residing at 33 Monroe Place, Brooklyn, New York.

On May 2%, 1940, an anonymous letter was received by the Eureau reporting that RICHARD TOMPLITZ, employed by L. W. Dumont and Company, Crude Rubber Brokers, 342 Madison Avenue, New York City, and formerly employed by Hecht, Levis and Kahn, Incorporated, New York City, and by Avia Company, New York City, was a Soviet informer, conveying such information through the Amtorg Corporation, New York City; that he boasts of being the one who engineered recent big purchases of crude rubber for Russia through Amtorg and works very closely with members of Amtorg.

The American Labor Party, mentioned above, was cited as a Communist front by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, report of March 19, 1944.

Investigation for Second Clandestine ROSENZERS Apartment

It is recalled that DAVID GREENGLASS advised in 1950 that through conversations which he had with JULIUS ROSENBERG he learned that ROSENBERG had an apartment located somewhere in the vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue B, New York City, which he used for possible microfilming work and as a place for contacting individuals who were connected with his espionage apparatus. This apartment was described by ROSENBERS

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to GREENGLASS as being located on the fourth floor of either a walkup or an elevator apartment building and consisted of two and a half or three and a half rooms. The apartment was offered to GREENGLASS by ROSENBERG approximately two years after GREENGLASS was discharged from the Army in 1946.

The subject's apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, is located in the general vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue B; its exact location being at Seventh Street and Avenue A and consists of two rooms and a small kitchen. VIVIAN GLASSMAN moved into this apartment in July, 1947.

Investigation to ascertain the occupants of the apartment prior to that date reflected that the immediate previous occupants were acquaintances of VIVIAN GLASSMAN, one CARLA SMALL, who was a co-worker of the subject at Brooklyn State Hospital, Brooklyn, New York, having rented the apartment in November, 1945.

CARLA SMALL married STEPHEN LOUIS JAVNA in December, 1945 and they resided at this apartment, according to CARLA, until August, 1946.

Mrs. JAVNA stated; that commencing August, 1946, after she moved, that a co-worker from Brooklyn State Hospital named GRACE NICHOLS, who married JOHN KARWOSKI, moved into the apartment and lived there until approximately December, 1946, after which her brother-in-law, JONAS JAVNA, who was married in 1946, moved into the apartment and lived there until some time in the summer of 1947.

Mrs. JAVNA stated that she accidentally met VIVIAN GLASSMAN at that time, told hor that the apartment was available and that GLASSMAN thereupon rented it. Mrs. JAVNA advised that due to the critical housing situation and difficulty in obtaining telephones, the apartment was kept in the name of Mr. and Mrs. JAVNA as were the utilities.

Investigation was conducted at the Consolidated Edison Company to determine the identity of the individuals to whom service was rendered at Apartment 4A at 131 East Seventh Street, New York, on July 24, 1950.

There also appears inquiring memorandums in the files of the Consolidated Edison Company which were time stamped at 9:11 a.m., 1:25 p.m., and 4:38 p.m., on November 18, 1946 which indicated that STEVE JAVNA, Apartment 4A, telephone GR 3-8216, called Consolidated Edison and advised that all lights were out in his apartment.

It is noted that from the Consolidated Edison Company letter to CARLA SMALL, dated March 10, 1948, the records reflect that she discontinued Consolidated Edison services at 131 East Seventh Street on June 3, 1946 and that Consolidated Edison services for this spartment were not resumed until March 12, 1948, according to the date of the turn on order; however, it is also noted that an individual using the name of STEVE JAVNA telephoned Consolidated Edison Company three times on November 18, 1946 advising that all lights were cut in the spartment, indicating that this individual was unaware that the electricity had been disconnected for Apartment 4A.

The records of the Consolidated Edison Company would indicate that utility services were not utilized in this apartment during the period of June 3, 1946 to March 12, 1948, which does not agree with the information obtained in the interview of CANLA SMALL JAVNA.

Investigation to clarify the continuity of service by the Consolidated Edison Company to Apartment 4A at 131 East Seventh Street, New York, to the aforementioned individuals is being continued.

# Information from MILTON KLEIN

It will be recalled that when VIVIAN GLASSMAN made her plane trip to Cleveland, Ohio, on Saturday, July 22, 1950, to contact WILLIAM PERL to give him \$2,000.00 in cash and instructions to leave the United States and go to Mexico, she left New York at about 1:30 p.m. and arrived in Cleveland, Ohio, about 3:30 p.m. She contacted Mrs. LOREE WATSON and her mother, Mrs. C. A. MIDDLETON at 16802 Larchwood, Cleveland, Ohio, where PERL had formerly rented a room, at about 4:00 p.m. and inquired for PERL and was referred to PERL at his new address.

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Krs. WATSON offered her the use of her phone to telephone PERL, but the subject refused, stating that she would go to see him directly; however, GLASSMAN did not appear at PERL's apartment at 656 East 103rd Street, Cleveland, Ohio, until around noon on Sunday, July 23, 1950. The reason for the lapse of time from about 4:00 p.m., Saturday, July 22 to noon on Sunday, July 23, 1950, before the subject made her contact with PARL was unknown; GLASSMAN, upon interview, having stated that she was interested in job prospects, although she would not state who she had contacted for a job on Saturday afternoon and night.

From information obtained from MILTON KLEIN, it would appear that GLASSMAN probably attempted to make her contact on Saturday, but was unable to find PERL at home.

MILTON M. KLEIN, 2690 Morris Avenue, Bronx, New York, instructor in Physics at New York University, a close friend of WILLIAM PERL and a college classmate in 1934-1938 at the College of the City of New York of Jillus Mosenberg and of Joel Barr, former fiance of VIVIAN GLASSMAN, informed SA HAURICE W. CORCOMAN in February-March, 1953 that he worked with WILLIAM PERL at the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics (NACA) at Lengley Field, Virginia, in about July, 1942 and that subsequently in about July, 1946, they resided at the same address on Franklin Avenue in Cleveland; that both were employed as engineers by MACA; that FERL helped him to get the job in Cleveland; that KLEIN, PERL and Joel BARH went to BARR's home in about 1938-1940, believed to possibly have been in Brooklyn, New York, where BARR showed some radio equipment he was interested in as he was a radio "ham", or amateur operator; that Perl was a very good friend of EARK, although KLEIN claimed to know BARR only casually at City College.

KLEIN said in reference to VIVIAN GLASSMAN's visit to PERL in July, 1950 that he was unaware that VIVIAN GLASSMAN had contacted PERL in Cleveland, Ohio, until some time in the summer of 1951, when he learned from STANLEY KANAREK, an associate of RAYMOND WISE, PERL's lawver, of record, that she had done so. KANAREK contacted KLEIN in Cleveland, Ohio, and requested him to be a character witness for PERL.

KLEIN stated that he had never met VIVIAN GLASSMAN and when shown a photograph of her did not recognize her as anyone that he had ever known. KLEIN advised that he believes on the night of July 22, 1950, a Saturday, a friend, BERT RIBNER, staged a party at his house to which he and PERL were invited.

KLEIN stated that about 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, July 22, 1950, FERL telephoned him at his home and advised him that he did not believe that he would go to the RIBNER party that night as he was having some difficulty with the Federal Bureau of Investigation and that he believes that his wires are tapped and that he is being followed. He said that he was calling from an outside phone booth instead of from his apartment. PERL concluded by stating that he would stop over to see KLEIN later in the day. PERL appeared at KLEIN's apartment early that evening and explained that he was being investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation for disloyalty, but did not explain, according to KLEIN, what the disloyalty investigation was based on other than that the Federal Bureau of Investigation was interested in his acquaintance with JULIUS ROSENBERG and the fact that he had rented the spartment of JOHL BARR. They spent about thirty minutes together and then PERL left.

RLEIN subsequently proceeded to and met PERL at the apartment of a girl nemed GLENDON BENKETT, upon whom PERL was calling. He placed the time as around 7-8 o'clock that evering and they proceeded to the party and stayed until about 1:00 a.m. They then took their dates home, each going in his own automobile.

On Sunday, July 23, 1950, according to KLEIN, an outdoor pionic was scheduled and PERL accompanied the group.

KLEIN stated that PERL did not tell him that the subject had contacted him in the early afternoon of Sunday, July 23, 1950, at any time that day while they were on the picnic, or thereafter, and the purpose of her visit was unknown to him until PERL's lawyer told him about it.

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KLEIR advised that he had received no telephone calls from anyone, local or long distance, to contact PERL with a message nor had anyone called him for information concerning PERL and had no knowledge of GLASSMAN having been in Cleveland on July 22,23, 1950.

KLEIN did not recognize photographs of MICHAEL SIDOROVICH or MAXWELL PINESTONE.

A physical surveillance of WILLIAM PERL, on July 22, 1950 in Cleveland, revealed that PERL entered KLEIN's residence at 7:09 p.m. on July 22, 1950.

Alams, New Nextee, to BARRY COLD, a confessed Soviet spy mow serving a thirty year sentence for espionage. JULIUS ROSANBERG and his wife, ETHAL, were sentenced to death in April, 1951 in the Southern "istrict of New York for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

DAVID and RUTH GRESHILLSS learned through conversation with JULIUS ROSEMBERS during the period 1946 to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage in connection with which he was using as a conspiratorial headquarters and for the purpose of microfilming documents and making espionage contacts an epartment in the Greenwich Village section of New York City and an apartment in the vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue B.

Information obtained from MAI ELITCHER, who admits that ROSEMBERS attempted to recruit him for Soviet estionage, indicates that the Greenwich Village apartment was located at 65 Morton Street, New York City. This epartment was rented in the name of ALPRED SARAHI from October, 1943 to January, 1950.

Confidential Informant 2-1, of known reliability, advised on that JULIUS ROJERBIRD mentioned an apartment rented by a student estensibly used for studying an Morton Street where he, JOEL BARR and "BILL" used to meet in secret to discuss their plans. ROSERBIRD did not identify "BILL" at this time, but from other conversations informant had with ROSERBIRD, "BILL" is believed by T-1 to be VILLIAM PLRL.

that his apartment was estensibly rented for a student to have a place to study but that the real purpose was to have a place for meetings. ROSENBERD said that he had typed for many hours on various escasions in the Morton Street apartment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table legs and would let the water run in the batherom. ROSENBERD advised T-1 that he paid the rent on this spartment.

ALPRED SARAKT, upon interview, has advised that he was a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist

Party in 1943-1944 and believes that be met JULIUS ROSEWELRS through a mutual friend named JOEL BARR. SARART has denied that ROSENBERS was ever in his apartment at 65 Norton Street, but NAX ELITCHER has advised that JULIUS ROSEBERS, JOEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL, (also known to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL), and ELITCHER and his wife, BELENE, were together in SARART'S apartment, number 6-1, at 65 Norton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.

In 1945, ALPRED SARAHT married LOUISE JACCUALIEL RUBEL-ROSS and moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946 at which time the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City, was taken by his friend, JOLL BARR. It was arranged that BARR would send him the rent for the apartment in Ithaca, New York, and that SARAHT would then pay the landlerd of 65 Morton Street by check.

SARAHT has advised that VILLIAM PERL, who was a friend of both SARAHT and JOEL BARR, used the spartment subsequent to JOEL BARR under the same rental paying arrangement and that PERL in sending the last money order payment in January, 1950 attached a note requesting SARAHT to relinquish the apartment as PERL no longer had any use for it.

ALFRED SARAST, following Ms interview by Bureau agents in July-August, 1950, fled the United States into Mexico, entering under an assumed name. His present whereabouts are unknown.

WILLIAM PERL has been identified as a Soviet agent by \$03885685 to Confidential Informant T-1. PERL is at present under indictment for perjury before the Pederal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

JOEL BARR was identified as a Soviet agent by ROSEXBERG to DAVID OR.XEGLASS following JOEL BARR's sailing from the United States for Europe in Jenuary, 1946. ROSEXBERG advised DAVID GREENGLASS that BARR was going to surope to continue his espionege work in European countries.

ALFRED SARANT has advised that JOHL BARR had a girlfriend maned VIVIAN OLASHAR and that he believes that VIVIAN

SLASSMAN sent him the first few rental payments in the form of money orders for the apalment rent at 65 Norton Street, New York City.

The Albany Office advised on July 22, 1950 that a money order number 988487 issued at the Church Street Station Post Office, New York City, on August 8, 1949, payable to ALFRED SARAHT from VIVIAN OLASSMAN, 131 Mast Seventh Street, New York City, as a remitter, was located in the account of ALFRED SARAHT in the First National Bank of Ithaca, New York. This money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bore a deposit date of August 11, 1949.

VIVIAN GLASSKAN has advised upon interview that she was the former fiances of JOEL BARR and that she had sent money orders to ALPRED BARRET in payment of the rent on 65 Morton Street in July and August, 1948. She also admitted that she had made an airplane trip to Cleveland, Obio, on July 22, 1950 to contact WILLIAM PERL with \$2,000.00 in each and to give instructions to PERL to leave the United States and go to Mexico. She stated that she received the \$2,000.00 and the instructions for PERL from an unknown man who contacted her at her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. QLASSKAX claimed that the identify of the man who contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist agents to identify him.

Confidential Informent T-1 advised that in conversation SULIUS ROSLEBLES stated that on a holiday weekend, which the informent believes may have been the Fourth of Suly weekend, 1949, WILLIAK PLEL removed some secret files from a laboratory located at Columbia University and that PEEL took these files to ROSEHBLES's apartment at Enickerbooker Village, New York City, where ROSEMBSRS, PREL, and a third unidentified individual, who was called in from out of town, and a fourth man, together spent fourteen to seventeen hours with two dameras photographing the material that PEEL had obtained in order that PEEL could return the material at his earliest convenience to Columbia University. ROSEMBERS indicated to T-1 that the third man was NICHASL SILOROVICH, who he described as a member of his explenage organisation.

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Confidential Informant T-1 stated that the fourth man was a definite member of the ROSEBERG empionage apparatus; that he is the man who subsequently contacted VIVIAE GLASSKAN on July 21, 1950 to arrange with her to proceed to Cleveland, Onio, to contact VILLIAM FARL and give him \$2,000.00 in order to facilize his flight from the United States to Mexico.

The informant advised that JULIUS ROSENTIRO indicated that the Russians sent his last recruit to contact VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950 and that the last individual that JULIUS ROSENTERS recruited into his Seviet espionage ring was a man who lived with the son of a wealthy family. The informant stated that the son of the wealthy family exact a black convertible Buick automobile and that he had loaned his buick to the last JULIUS ROSENTERS recruit who drove ROSENTERS to Ithmea, New York, to see ALPRED SARAHT and make a pickup of espionage material.

Concerning the identity of the two individuals described above by T-1 investigation to identify the last recruit of JULIUS ROSEMBERS, who lived with the son of a wealthy family and who sweed a 1949 or 1950 black Buick convertible automobile with a white top, indicates that one MAXWELL PIMESTOME, with alias MAX FIMESTOME, was the last recruit of JULIUS ROSEMBERS and that adward JAMES WEIMSTEIM, commonly known as JAMES WEIMSTEIM, was the individual with whom he lived.

JAMES WEINSTRIN is the son of JOSNYH WHINSTRIN, President of the Versailles Garment Corporation, \$70 Seventh Avenue, New York City, a ladies' garment manufacturing firm. JAMES WEINSTAIR, in an interview with Bureau agents on August 21, 1950, produced a New York State automobile registration dated January 19, 1950 for a 1949 Buick convertible.

JAMES WEINSTEIR resided at \$18 East Winth Street, New York City, with NAX FINESTONE from February, 1950 to about October-November, 1950.

MAX FINISTONE, who was born on July 28, 1922 at Boston, Massachusetts, is a graduate of Cornell University,

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having graduated in September, 1949 and is a close friend of LOUISE (PUBS) BARANT.

On Spril 5, 1951 VIVIAN GLASSHAN was observed by SA JOHN J. DOERNER and the writer leaving her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, with a man who was subsequently identified as MAX PIESTORE.

Subject Unknown to T-Das a Nember of the Young Progressives of America (YPA) or the Communist Party

On March 24, 1952, Confidential Informent T-1 advised that VIVIAN GLASSMAN and her sister, ELEANOR, were noted at the Tempkins Square Park Playgrounds, Nighth Street and Avenue B, New York City, and in attendance at YPA denses and that they attended a "peace vigil" at Central Palece Mall, New York City, in December, 1951.

Confidential Informant 7-2, of known reliability, who advised that some time after Labor Day, 1948, a mamber of the Ray Priedlender Club of the Communist Party was instructed to form the Tompkins Square Club of the YPA and to see that not more than 55 ps r cent or 60 per cent of the membership were Communist Party members in order that the club might fight more effectively the tag of Communism, advised on January 23, 1953 that neither the subject nor the subject's husband, ERHEST PATAKI or her sister, ELEANOR, were known to informant to have been members of the YPA or of the Communist Party.

7-2 also viewed photographs of other suspected members of the ROSEBERS espionage apparatus, but did not recognise any of them.

1941 De Sote Automobile Registered to Subject's Husband

Confidential Informant 8-3, of known reliability, advised on January 12, 1953 that it was noted that at about 11:30 p.m., that date, a man believed to be the subject's husband, EREAST PATAKI, was blowing the horn of a coupe

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automobile sutside the subject's residence and that GLASSMAN dropped him a key from her window.

At the Motor Vehicle Bureau, Hew York City, it was ascertained by SE CLINTON B. POLLOCK that the subject's busbend, BREST PATAKI, had a 1953 automobile registration for a 1941 De Soto coupe, color blue, engine number, \$77071, serial number \$757675, New York 1953 license plate 98-4946. PATAKI had a 1952 registration for a 1950 Budson sedan, plate number QESTAL.

#### Bank Data

On December 30, 1952 at Mammfasturers Trust Company, 230 Second Avenue, New York City, Confidential Informant Tol, of known reliability, advised that no deposits or withdrawals had been made in the subject's joint checking account during the month of December, 1952 and that the funds in the account amounted to \$371.20, and that they were subjected to a "hold" court order on December 1, 1952.

T-4 Stated that PHILIP KASSIER and PAULINE KASSIER, judgment areditors, recevered a judgment against ERNEST PATAKI, judgment debter, in the Municipal Court, Borough of Manhattan, First District, on November 26, 1952, in the sum of \$321.00. The Manufacturers Trust Company, 230 Second Avenue, New York City, was served with a third party subpoens on December 1, 1952, and the order was returnable December 12, 1952 at 52 Chambers Street, New York City. SUROME J. GREILSHEIMER, 110 Villiams Street, New York City, was atterney for the KASSIERS.

7-4 advised that the subject and her husband, BREET PATAKI, were metified an December 1, 1952 of the court order on the bank to hold \$371.00, the balance then in the PATAKIS! account, subject to further order of the court.

Attorney REUBEN N. COREN, associate of JERONE J. GREILBHEIMER, attorney for judgment ereditors, requested the court to grant the order on December 17, 1952. Notice was served by GREILSHEIMER on December 17, 1952, that the court would be asked to turn ever to judgment creditors the sum of

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\$321.00 on deposit in the Hanufacturers Trust Company, pursuant to Section 794 of the Civil Practices Act, on January 6, 1953, in Special Form Part I Court, 52 Chambers Street, New York City.

On January 30, 1953, T-4 advised that PATAKI paid the above mentioned Judgment with a certified check dated January 6, 1953, in the sum of \$321.00.

On Pebruary 13, 1953, Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised that the Ber York Office of the Pederal Bureau of Investigation would be notified if any substantial amount of money was withdrawn from this account, or if it were closed.

Information obtained from Confidential Informants T-4, T-5 and T-6 is not to be made public except in a usual proceeding, following the issuance of a subpoena.

### Correspondents

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that the subject received correspondence from the following:

January 21, 1953 - TOEPLITZ, 33 Monroe Place, Brooklyn, New York and February 19, 1953, PREDERICK F. GREENMAN, 20 Pine Street, New York City.

The Manhattan Telephone Directory, 1953, reflects that PRIDERICK F. GREEKAE, 20 Pine Street, New York City, 1s an

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attorney at law at this location.

The Indices of the New York Office were negative on this name.

The Brooklyn Telephone Directory, 1953, reflects that RICHARD R. TORPLITE resides at 33 Monroe Place, Brooklyn, New York.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, advised on February 11, 1947 that RICHARD and IRLBE TOEPLITZ, 36 Connecticut Avenue, Long Beach, Long Island, New York, signed a petition for candidates for the American Labor Party election, November, 1946. The informant did not know whether or not this individual was identical with the RICHARD TOEPLITZ residing at 33 Konree Place, Brooklyn, New York.

On May 27, 1940, an anonymous letter was received by the Eureau reporting that DICUMB TOZFLITZ, employed by L. W. Durint and Company, Crude Rubber Brokers, 3:2 Madison Avenue, New York City, and formerly employed by Mecht, Levis and Rahn, Incorporated, New York City, and by Avia Company, New York City, was a Soviet informer, conveying such information through the Amtorg Curporation, New York City; that he boasts of being the one who engineered recent big purchases of crude pubber for Russia through Amtorg and works very closely with members of Amtorg.

The American Labor Party, mentioned above, was eited as a Communist front by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, Perort of March 19, 1944.

Investigation for Beeond Clandestine ROSELIBLES Apartment

It is recalled that D VID ORE MOLASS advised in 1950 that through conversations which he had with JULIUS MOSIMERS he learned that ROSEMERS had an apartment located conswhere in the vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue B. New York City, which he used for possible microfilming work and as a place for contacting individuals who were connected with his espionage apparatus. This apartment was described by ROSEYBERS

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to GREEKJLABS as being located on the fourth floor of either a walkup or an elevator spartment building and consisted of two and a half or three and a half rooms. The apartment was offered to GREEBILABS by ROSEMBIRG approximately two years after GREEBILABS was discharged from the Army in 1946.

The subject's apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, Sew York City, is located in the general vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue S; its exact location being at Seventh Street and Avenue A and consists of two rooms and a small kitenen. VIVIAN GLASSXAN moved into this apartment in July, 1947.

Investigation to ascertain the occupants of the apartment prior to that date reflected that the immediate previous occupants were acquaintances of VIVIAE GLASSHAE, one CARLA SHALL, who was a so-worker of the subject at ABrooklyn State Rospital, Brooklyn, New York, having rented the apartment in Sovember, 1945.

GARLA SHALL married STEPHEN LOUIS SAVNA in December, 1945 and they resided at this spartment, according to GARLA, until August, 1946.

Rrs. JAVAL stated: that commencing August, 1946, after she moved, that a co-worker from Brooklyn State Hospital maned GRACE MICHOLS, who married JOHE KARDOKI, moved into the spartment and lived there until approximately December, 1946, after which her brother-in-law, JOHAS JAVAL, who was married in 1946, moved into the spartment and lived there until some time in the summer of 1947.

Mrs. SAVEA stated that she secidentally met VIVIAN GLASSKAR at that time, told her that the spartment was available and that GLASSKAN thereuron rented it. Mrs. SAVEA advised that due to the critical housing situation and difficulty in obtaining telephones, the spartment was kept in the name of Mr. and Mrs. SAVEA as were the utilities.

Investigation was conducted at the Consolidated Edison Company to determine the identity of the individuals to whom service was rendered at Apartment &A at 131 East Seventh Street, New York, on July 24, 1950.

Confidential Informent T-9, of known reliability, advised that the records of the Consolidated adison Company perfected that Apartment ha at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, was eccupied by Miss LEMA BALKER from May 28, 1941 to June 20, 1943, at which time she moved from Apartment has to be at this address.

On August 12, 1943, Mrs. SOPI MELYN's utilities were connected and she resided there until Bovember 17, 1945. The utilities for this apartment were again connected on Bovember 27, 1945 for Riss CARLA SHALL and a "turn on order" was used to change the name of this account as of June 20, 1946 from Miss CARLA SHALL to Mrs. S. L. JAVNA. A "turn on order" issued March 12, 1948 indicated responsibility for the account had been changed from Mrs. STEVE L. JAVNA to Miss VIVIAN GLASSHAN on February 2, 1948.

A letter to welcome new customers from the Consolidated Edison Company, dated March 18, 1948, to Miss VIVIAK GLASSMAE, 131 East Seventh Street, New York 9, New York, was located in the files of the Consolidated Edison Company. The bottom of this letter contained questions to be filled in by consumers to be used in determining the credit standing of the consumer. GLASSMAE stated that the address where she used electric and gas last was at 131 East Seventh Street, Apartment the and that the apartment utilities were then in the name of GARLA SMALL JAVEA. She indicated that this account was closed as of April 1, 1948 and was to be responded at that time in her name.

T-9 stated that that a letter appearing in Consolidated Miles from Nies CARLA SHALL perfects as follows:

The fellowing letter was addressed by the Consolidated Balson Company to CARLA SHALL on March 10, 1948:

\*\*Nareh 10, 1948 Re 131 East 7th St. Apt. 4-A 1-3578-158

\*Niss Carle Small Box 112 Palisades Park, N.J.

Dear Miss Small,

Four records show that you discontinued using our service at 131 East 7th St., on June 3, 1946.

"Our records show that a check in refund of your deposit was mailed to you on Doc. 17, 1947 but was returned by the Post Office Department.

"Knelosed is our check \$121918 for \$10.79 in refund of your deposit \$120536-3 with accrued interest of seventy mine cents. We shall appreciate it if you will each or deposit this shock at your earliest convenience.

> "Very truly yours, O. F. Dickhut Personal Service Division."

There also appears inquiring memorandums in the files of the Consolidated Edison Company which were time stamped at 9:11 a.m., 1:25 p.m., and 4:38 p.m., an Eovember 18, 1946 which indicated that STEVE JAVEA, Apartment 4A, telephone GR 3-8216, called Consolidated Edison and advised that all lights were out in his apartment.

It is noted that from the Consolidated Edison Company letter to CAMLA SMALL, dated March 10, 1948, the records reflect that she discentized Consolidated Edison services at 191 East Seventh Street on June 3, 1946 and that Consolidated Edison services for this spartment were not resumed until March 12, 1948, according to the date of the turn on order; however, it is also noted that an individual using the name of STEVE JAVNA telephoned Consolidated Edison Company three times on November 18, 1946 advising that all lights were out in the apartment, indicating that this individual was unswere that the electricity had been dissonnected for Apartment \$4.

The Pecords of the Consolidated Edison Company would indicate that utility services were not utilised in this spartment during the period of June 3, 1946 to March 12, 1948, which does not agree with the information obtained in the interview of CARLA SHALL JAVNA.

Investigation to clarify the continuity of service by the Consolidated Edison Company to Apartment 4A at 111 East Seventh Street, New York, to the aforementioned individuals is being continued.

# Deformation from

It will be recalled that when VIVIAH GLASSMAN made ber plane trip to Cleveland, Ohio, on Saturday, July 22, 1950, to contact WILLIAM PERL to give him \$2,000.00 in each and instructions to leave the United States and go to Mexico, she left New York at about 1:30 p.m. and arrived in Cleveland, Ohio, about 3:30 p.m. She contacted Mrs. LORKE WATSON and her mother, Mrs. G. A. HIDDLETON at 16302 Larehmood, Cleveland, Ohio, where PERL had fermerly rented a room, at about \$100 p.m. and inquired for PERL and was referred to PERL at his new address.

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Mrs. WATSOM offered her the use of her phone to telephone Pirl, but the subject refused, stating that she would go to see him directly; however, OLASSMAN did not appear at PERL's spartment at 666 East 103rd Street, Cleveland, Ohio, until around noon on Sunday, July 23, 1950. The reason for the lapse of time from about 4:00 p.m., Saturday, July 22 to noon on Sunday, July 23, 1950, before the subject made her contact with PERL was unknown; JLASSIAE, won interview, having stated that she was interested in job prospects, although she would not state who she had contacted for a job on Saturday afternoon and might.

From information obtained from MILTON ELEIH, it would appear that GLASSHAN probably attempted to make her contact on Saturday, but was unable to find PERL at home.

MILTON N. KLEIN, 2690 Morris Avenue, Bronx, Bew York, instructor in Physics at New York University, a close friend of VILLIAN PLEL and a college classmate in 1934-1938 at the College of the City of New York of JULIUS ROSKHBLES and of JOEL BARR, former fiance of VIVIAN OLASSMAN, informed SA MAURICE W. OPROPRIS in Pebruary-March, 1953 that he worked with WILLIAM PERL at the National Advisory Committee for Aeronauties (NACA) at Langley Field, Virginia, in about July, 1942 and that subsequently in about July, 1948, they resided at the same address on Franklin Avenue in Cleveland; that both were employed as engineers by MACA; that PERL helped him to get the jeb in Cleveland; that ELEIN, PERL and JOAL BAR: went to MARR's home in about 1938-1940, believed to possibly have been in Brooklyn, New York, where BARR showed some radio equipment he was interested in as he was a radio "ham", or amateur operator; that PERL was a very good friend of BARR, although ELEIN claimed to know BARK only easually at City College.

ELEIR said in peference to VIVIAN OLASSKAN's visit to PERL in July, 1950 that he was unavare that VIVIAN GLASSKAN had contacted PERL in Cleveland, Ohio, until some time in the summer of 1951, when he learned from STANLEY KANARK, on associate of RAYMUKO WISE, PERL's lawyer, of record, that she had done so. KANARK contacted KLEIN in Cleveland, Ohio, and requested him to be a character witness for PERL.

ELETS stated that he had never met VIVIAN GLASSHAN and when shown a photograph of her did not recognize her as anyone that he had ever known. KLYIN advised that he believes on the night of July 22, 1950, a beturday, a friend, BERT RIBERR, staged a party at his house to which he and PERL were invited.

(KURIF stated that about 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, July 22, 1950, PERL telephoned him at his home and advised him that he did not believe that he would go to the RIBHAR party that night as he was having some difficulty with the Federal Bureau of Investigation and that he believes that his wires are tapped and that he is being followed. He said that he was calling from an sutside phone booth instead of from his apartment. FERL concluded by stating that he would stop over to see KLKIR later in the day. PERL appeared at KLKIR's spartment early that evening and explained that he was being investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation for disloyalty, but did not explain, according to KLEIN, what the disloyalty investigation was based on other than that the Federal Bureau of Investigation was interested in his accusintance with JULIUS ASSANIERS and the fact that he had Pented the apartment of JOHL BARR. They spent about thirty minutes together and then PERL left.)

ELHIP subsequently proceeded to and met PARL at the apartment of a girl named GLENDON BANKETT, upon whom PERL was calling. He placed the time as around 7-5 e'clock that evening and they proceeded to the party and stayed until about 1:00 a.m. They then took their dates home, each going in his our automobile.

On Sunday, July 23, 1950, according to KLKIE, an outdoor pienic was scheduled and PaRL accompanied the group.

MLHIE stated that PERL did not tell him that the subject had contacted him in the early afternoon of Sunday, July 23, 1950, at any time that day while they were on the picule, or thereafter, and the purpose of her visit tens takened to him until PERL's lawyer told him about it.



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Fill advised that he had received no telephone sells from anyone, local or long distance, to contact PERL with a message nor had anyone called him for information concerning Fill and had no knowledge of GLASSMAN having been in Cleveland on July 22,23, 1950.

ELETH did not recognise photographs of NICHAEL BIDOROVICE or NAWALL FIRESTAR.

A physical surveillance of WILLIAM PERL, on July 22, 1950 in Cleveland, revealed that PERL entered ELEIE's residence at 7:09 p.m. on July 22, 1950.

Alamos, New Mexico, to HARRY GOLD, a confessed Soviet apy now serving a thirty year sentence for espionage. JULIUS ROSANBERD and his wife, ETHL, were sentenced to death in April, 1951 in the Southern Mistrict of New York for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States.

DAVID and RUTH GREABSLASS learned through conversation with SULIUS ROSEMBERS during the period 1946 to 1950 that he was extensively engaged in Soviet espionage in connection with which he was using as a conspiratorial headquarters and for the purpose of microfilming documents and making espionage contacts an epartment in the Greenwich Villago section of New York City and an apartment in the vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue B.

Information obtained from NAI ELITCHAR, who admits that ROSENRARS attempted to recruit him for Soviet es-ionage, indicates that the Greenwich Village apartment was located at 65 Norton Street, New York City. This apartment was rented in the name of ALPRED SARAHT from October, 1943 to January, 1950.

Confidential Informant 2-1, of known reliability, advised on that JULIUS ROSKHERS mentioned an apartment Pented by a student estensibly used for studying on Morton Street where he, JOKL BARR and 'BILL' used to meet in searet to discuss their plans." ROSKRERS did not identify "BILL" at this time, but from other conversations informant had with ROSKEBERS, "BILL" is believed by T-1 to be VILLIAN PERL.

that his apartment was estensibly rented for a student to have a place to study but that the real purpose was to have a place for meetings. ROSEBERS said that he had typed for many hours on various occasions in the Norton Street apartment and that to reduce the typing sounds he placed rubber pads under the typewriter table legs and would let the water run in the bath-room. ROSEMBERS advised T-1 that he paid the rent on this apartment.

ALPRED SARAKT, upon interview, has advised that he was a member of the Greenwich Village Branch of the Communist

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Party in 1943-1944 and believes that he met JULIUS ROSENBERS through a mutual friend mamed JOEL BARR. SARAHT has denied that ROSENBERS was ever in his apartment at 65 Norton Street, but MAX ELITCHER has advised that JULIUS ROSENBERS, JOEL BARR, WILLIAM PERL, (also known to him as WILLIAM MUTTERPERL), and ELITCHER and his wife, RELEME, were together in SARAHT'S apartment, number 6-1, at 65 Norton Street, New York City, in 1943-1944.

In 1945, ALPRED SARAFT married LOUISE SACCUALIES RUBEL-ROSS and moved to Ithaca, New York, in about September, 1946 at which time the apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York Gity, was taken by his friend, SOEL BARR. It was arranged that BARR would send him the rent for the apartment in Ithaca, New York, and that SARAFT would then pay the landlerd of 65 Morton Street by check.

SARANT has advised that VILLIAM PARL, who was a friend of both SARANT and JOEL BARR, used the spartment subsequent to JOEL BARR under the same rental paying arrangement and that PERL in sending the last money order payment in January, 1950 attached a note requesting SARANT to relinquish the apartment as PERL no longer had any use for it.

ALPRED SARANT, following Ms interview by Bureau agents in July-August, 1950, fled the United States into Mexico, entering under an assumed name. His present whereabouts are unknown.

WILLIAM PARE has been identified as a Seviet agent by ROSEMBERG to Confidential Informant T-1. PARE is at present under indistant for perjury before the Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

JOHL BARR was identified as a Soviet agent by ROSEKBERG to DAVID OR MEGLASS following JOHL BARR's sailing from the United States for Europe in January, 1946. ROSEKBERG advised DAVID ORKEFOLASS that BARR was going to Europe to continue his espionage work in European countries.

ALFRED SARAHT has advised that JOIL BARR had a girlfriend maned VIVIAH GLASSMAN and that he believes that VIVIAH MY 65-15385

SLASSMAR sent him the first few rental payments in the form of money orders for the apament rent at 65 Norton Street, New York City.

The Albany Office advised on July 22, 1950 that a money order number 988487 issued at the Church Street Station Post Office, New York City, on August 8, 1949, payable to ALFRED SARANT from VIVIAN OLASSMAN, 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, as a remitter, was located in the account of ALFRED SARANT in the First National Bank of Ithaca, New York. This money order was in the amount of \$45.00 and bore a deposit date of August 11, 1949.

VIVIAN GLASSKAR has advised upon interview that she was the former fiances of JOEL BARR and that she had sent money orders to ALPRED BARAKT in payment of the rent on \$5 Norton Street in July and August, 1948. She also admitted that she had made an airplane trip to Cleveland, Ohio, on July 22, 1950 to contact WILLIAM PARL with \$2,000.00 in each and to give instructions to PERL to leave the United States and go to Mexico. She stated that she received the \$2,000.00 and the instructions for PERL from an waknown man who contacted her at her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, on the evening of July 21, 1950. GLASSMAK claimed that the identify of the man who contacted her was unknown to her, but refused to assist agents to identify him.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that in conversation
JULIUS ROSLYBERS stated that on a holiday weekend, which
the informant believes may have been the Fourth of July weekend,
1949, WILLIAK PLRL removed some secret files from a laboratory
located at Columbia University and that PEFL took these files
to ROSEMBLED's apartment at Enickerbooker Village, New York
City, where ROSEMBLEG, PETL, and a third unidentified individual,
who was called in from out of bown, and a fourth man, together
spent fourteen to seventeen hours with two cameras photographing the material that PERL had obtained in order that PERL
could return the material at his carliest convenience to
Columbia University. ROSEMBERO indicated to T-1 that the third
man was MICHAEL SILOROVICH, who he described as a member of
his espienage organisation.

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Confidential Informant T-1 stated that the fourth man was a definite member of the ROSEBERG espionage apparatus; that he is the man who subsequently contacted VIVIAE GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950 to arrange with her to proceed to Cleveland, Onio, to contact VILLIAM FARL and give him \$2,000.00 in order to facilizate his flight from the United States to Mexico.

The informent advised that JULIUS ROSENTIRO indicated that the Russians sent his last recruit to contact VIVIAN GLASSMAN on July 21, 1950 and that the last individual that JULIUS ROSENTERS recruited into his Soviet espionage ring was a man who lived with the son of a wealthy family. The informant stated that the son of the wealthy family exmed a black convertible Buick automobile and that he had loaned his Buick to the last JULIUS ROSENTERS recruit who drove ROSENTERS to Ithmea, New York, to see ALFRED SARAHT and make a pickup of espionage material.

Concerning the identity of the two individuals described above by T-1 investigation to identify the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERS, who lived with the son of a wealthy family and who owned a 1949 or 1950 black Buick convertible automobile with a white top, indicates that eme MAXWELL PIERSTONE, with alies MAX PIERSTONE, was the last recruit of JULIUS ROSENBERS and that aDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN, commonly known as JAMES WEINSTEIN, was the individual with whom he lived.

JAMES WEISSTRIN is the son of JOSEPH WEISTRIN, President of the Versailles Garment Corporation, \$70 Seventh Avenue, New York City, a ladies garment manufacturing firm. JAMES WEINSTAIK, in an interview with Bureau agents on August 21, 1950, produced a New York State automobile registration dated January 19, 1950 for a 1949 Buick convertible.

JAMES WEINSTEIN resided at \$18 East Winth Street, New York City, with NAI FINESTONE from February, 1950 to about October-November, 1950.

MAI PINESTONE, who was born on July 28, 1922 at 18 Boston, Massachusetts, is a graduate of Cornell University,

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having graduated in September, 1949 and is a close friend of LOUISE (PUBS) BARANT.

On Spril 5, 1951 VIVIAH GLASSHAN was observed by BA JOHN J. DOERNER and the writer leaving her apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, with a man who was subsequently identified as MAX PINESTORE.

Subject Unknown to T-Das a Member of the Young Progressives of America (YPA) or the Communist Party

On March ZL, 1952, Confidential Informant 3-1 advised that VIVIAN GLASSHAN and her sister, ELEANOR, were noted at the Tompkins Square Park Playgrounds, Highth Street and Avenue B, New York City, and in attendance at YPA denses and that they attended a "peace vigil" at Central Palece Mall, New York City, in December, 1951.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, who advised that some time after Labor Day, 1948, a member of the Ray Friedlander Glub of the Communist Party was instructed to form the Tompkins Square Glub of the YPA and to see that not more than 55 pp reent or 60 per cent of the membership were Communist Party members in order that the club might fight more effectively the tag of Communism, advised on January 23, 1953 that neither the subject nor the subject's husband, ERMEST PATAKI or her sister, ELEANOR, were known to informant to have been members of the YPA or of the Communist Party.

T-Z also viewed photographs of other suspected members of the ROSENBERS espionage apparatus, but did not recognise any of them.

1941 De Sote Automobile Registered to Subject's Husband

Confidential Informant T-J, of known reliability, advised on January 12, 1953 that it was noted that at about 11:30 p.m., that date, a man believed to be the subject's busband, EKEAST PATAKI, was blowing the horn of a coupe

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automobile satelde the subject's residence and that GLASSMAN dropped him a key from her window.

At the Motor Vehicle Bureau, New York City, it was ascertained by SE CLIMTON E. POLLOCK that the subject's husband, ERMEST PATAKI, had a 1953 automobile registration for a 1941 De Soto coupe, color blue, engine number, 877071, serial number 9757675, New York 1953 license plate 98-4946. PATAKI had a 1952 registration for a 1950 Budson sedan, plate number QE6344.

## Bank Date

On December 30, 1952 at Mammfasturers Trust Company, 230 Second Avenue, New York City, Confidential Informant Tail, of known reliability, advised that no deposits or withdrawals had been made in the subject's joint checking account during the month of December, 1952 and that the funds in the account amounted to \$371.20, and that they were subjected to a "held" court order on December 1, 1952.

T-4 Stated that PHILIP KASSIER and PAULINE KASSIER, Judgment areditors, recovered a judgment against ERNEST PATAKI, judgment debtor, in the Municipal Court, Borough of Manhattan, First District, on Bovember 26, 1952, in the sum of \$321.00. The Manufacturers Trust Company, 230 Second Avenue, New York City, was served with a third party subpoens on December 1, 1952, and the order was returnable December 12, 1952 at 52 Chambers Street, New York City, Jerome J. Greilsmeimer, 110 Villiams Street, New York City, was atterney for the KASSIERS.

T-4 advised that the subject and her husband, BRKEST PATAKI, were motified on December 1, 1952 of the court order on the bank to hold \$371.00, the balance then in the PATAKIS' account, subject to further order of the court.

Attorney REUBER M. COREN, associate of JEROME 3. GREILSHEIMER, attorney for judgment creditors, requested the court to grant the order on December 17, 1952. Notice was served by GREILSHEIMER on December 17, 1952, that the court would be asked to turn over to judgment creditors the sum of

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\$321.00 on deposit in the Manufacturers Trust Company, pursuant to Section 794 of the Civil Practices Act, on January 6, 1953, in Special Form Part I Court, 52 Chambers Street, New York City.

On January 30, 1953, T-4 advised that PATAKI paid the above mentioned Judgment with a certified check dated January 6, 1953, in the sum of \$321.00.

T-4 furnished the following information from the ledger sheet, reflecting the activity in subject's account:

On Pebruary 13, 1953, Confidential Informant 8-6, of known reliability, advised that the New York Office of the Pederal Bureau of Investigation would be notified if any substantial amount of money was withdrawn from this account, or if it were closed.

Information obtained from Confidential Informants T-4, T-5 and T-6 is not to be made public except in a usual proceeding, following the issuance of a subposus.

# Correspondents

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that the subject received correspondence from the following:

January 21, 1953 - TORPLITZ, 33 Monroe Place, Brooklyn. New York and Pebruary 19, 1953, PREDERICK P. GREENAN, 20 Pine Street, New York City.

The Hanhattan Telephone Directory, 1953, reflects that FREDERICE P. GREEKAR, 20 Pine Street, New York City, is an

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attorney at law at this location.

The Indiess of the New York Office were negative on this name.

The Brooklyn Telephone Directory, 1953, reflects that RICHARD E. TOKOLITE resides at 33 Monroe Place, Brooklyn, New York.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, advised on February 11, 1947 that RICHARD and IRLE TOEPLIZ, 36 Connecticut Avenue, Long Beach, Long Island, New York, signed a petition for candidates for the American Labor Party election, Bovenber, 1946. The informant did not know whether or not this individual was identical with the RICHARD TOEPLIZZ residing at 33 Konree Flace, Brooklyn, New York.

On May 27, 1940, an anonymous letter was received by the Eureau reporting that DICLARD TOZFLITZ, employed by L. W. Dunmt and Company, Crude Rubber Brokers, 3.2 Madison Avenue, New York City, and formerly employed by Meeht, Levis and Eshn, Incorporated, New York City, and by Avia Company, New York City, was a Soviet Informer, conveying such information through the Amtorg Curporation, New York City; that he bosats of being the one who engineered recent big purchases of crude Pubber for Russia through Amtorg and works very closely with members of Amtorg.

The American Labor Party, mentioned above, was eited as a Communist front by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, report of March 19, 1944.

Investigation for Second Clandestine ROBALBURG Apartment

It is recalled that D.VID ORE MOIASS advised in 1950 that through conversations which he had with JULIUS SUSSEMBLES he learned that ROSEMBLES had an apartment located somewhere in the vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue B. New York City, which he used for possible microfilming work and as a place for contacting individuals who were connected with his espionage apparatus. This apartment was described by ROSEMBLES.



to GRESTLASS as being located on the fourth floor of either a walkup or an elevator apartment building and consisted of two and a helf or three and a half rooms. The apartment was offered to GRESTILASS by ROSENBIRG approximately two years after GRESTLASS was discharged from the Army in 1946.

The subject's apartment at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, is located in the general vicinity of 12th Street and Avenue S; its exact location being at Seventh Street and Avenue A and consists of two rooms and a small kitenen. VIVIAH GLASSXAN moved into this apartment in July, 1947.

Investigation to ascertain the occupants of the apartment prior to that date reflected that the immediate previous occupants were acquaintances of VIVIAE GLASSMAE, one CARLA SMALL, who was a co-worker of the subject at Abrooklyn State Hospital, Brooklyn, New York, having rented the apartment in Sovember, 1945.

GARLA SHALL married STEPHEN LOUIS SAVEA in December, 1945 and they resided at this spartment, according to GARLA, until August, 1946.

Mrs. JAVMA stated; that commencing August, 1946, after she moved, that a co-worker from Brooklyn State Mospital named GRAGE MICHOLS, who married JOHE KAR-DEKI, moved into the apartment and lived there until approximately December, 1946, after which her brother-in-law, JOHAS JAVMA, who married in 1946, moved into the apartment and lived there until some time in the summer of 1947.

Mrs. JAVEA stated that she secidentally met VIVIAN CLASSKAN at that time, told her that the apartment was available and that GLASSKAN thereuron mented it. Mrs. JAVEA advised that due to the critical housing situation and difficulty in obtaining telephones, the apartment was kept in the name of Mr. and Mrs. JAVEA as were the utilities.

Investigation was conducted at the Consolidated Edison Company to determine the identity of the individuals to thom service was rendered at Apartment &A at 131 East Seventh Street, New York, on July 24, 1950.

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Confidential Informant 7-9, of known reliability, advised that the records of the Consolidated Edison Company reflected that Apartment &A at 131 East Seventh Street, New York City, was eccupied by Miss LEMA BALKAR from May 28, 1941—to June 20, 1943, at which time she moved from Apartment &A to &B at this address.

On August 12, 1943, Mrs. SOFI MELTYK's willities were connected and she resided there until November 17, 1945.

The willities for this apartment were again connected on November 27, 1945 for Kiss CARLA SHALL and a "turn on order" was used to change the name of this account as of June 20, 1946 from Miss CARLA SHALL to Mrs. S. L. JAVNA. A "turn on order" issued March 12, 1948 indicated responsibility for the account had been changed from Mrs. STEVE L. JAVNA to Miss VIVIAN GLASSMAN on February 2, 1948.

A letter to welcome new gustamers from the Consolidated Edison Company, dated March 18, 1948, to Miss VIVIAE GLASSMAE, 131 East Seventh Street, New lork 9, New York, was located in the files of the Consolidated Edison Company. The bottom of this letter contained questions to be filled in by consumers to be used in determining the credit standing of the consumer. GLASSMAE stated that the address where she used electric and gas last was at 131 East Seventh Street, Apartment &A and that the apartment utilities were then in the name of GARLA SMALL JAVNA. She indicated that this secount was glosed as of April 1, 1948 and was to be respond at that time in her mame.

T-9 stated that that a letter appearing in Consolidated Edison files from Miss GARLA SMALL Peffects as follows:

Please refund deposit \$120536-3 (\$10.00) to me at Sox 112, Palisades Park, New Jersey.

"Yory Sruly yours, Garla Small (Miss) Carla Small."

The fellowing letter was addressed by the Consolidated Scison Company to CARLA SMALL on March 10, 1948:

Phiss Carls Small Box 112 Palisades Park, N.J.

Dear Miss Small,

Four records show that you discontinued using our service at 131 East 7th St., on June 3, 1946.

"Our records show that a check in refund of your deposit was mailed to you on Dec. 17, 1947 but was returned by the Post Office Department.

"Knelesed is our check \$121918 for \$10.79 in refund of your deposit \$120536-3 with accrued interest of seventy mine cents. We shall appreciate it if you will cash or deposit this check at your earliest convenience.

> "Very truly yours, O. F. Diekhut Personal Service Division."

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There also appears inquiring memorandums in the files of the Consolidated Edison Company which were time stamped at 9:11 a.m., 1:25 p.m., and 4:38 p.m., an Bovember 18, 1946 which indicated that STRVE JAVEA, Apartment 4A, telephone GR 3-5216, called Consolidated Edison and advised that all lights were out in his apartment.

It is moted that from the Consolidated Edison Gempany letter to CAMLA SMALL, dated March 10, 1948, the records reflect that she discontinued Consolidated Edison services at 131 East Seventh Street on June 3, 1946 and that Consolidated Edison services for this spartment were not resumed until March 12, 1948, according to the date of the turn on order; however, it is also noted that an individual using the name of STEVE JAVNA telephoned Consolidated Edison Company three times on November 18, 1946 advising that all lights were out in the spartment, indicating that this individual was unaware that the electricity had been disconnected for Apartment 4A.

The records of the Consolidated Edison Company would indicate that utility services were not utilized in this apartment during the period of June 3, 1946 to March 12, 1948, which does not agree with the information obtained in the interview of GARLA SMALL JAVNA.

Investigation to clarify the continuity of service by the Consolidated Edison Company to Apartment &A at 131 East Seventh Street, New York, to the aforementioned individuals is being continued.

# Information from

It will be recalled that when VIVIAH GLASSMAH made her plane trip to Cleveland, Ohio, on Saturday, July 22, 1950, to contact VILLIAM PERL to give him \$2,000.00 in each and instructions to leave the United States and go to Mexico, aho left New York at about 1:30 p.m. and arrived in Cleveland, Ohio, about 3:30 p.m. She contacted Mrs. LORKE VATSOH and her mother, Mrs. C. A. HIDDLETON at 16302 Larehmood, Cleveland, Ohio, where PERL had fermerly rented a room, at about \$:00 p.m. and inquired for PERL and was referred to PERL at his new address.

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Mrs. WATSIE offered her the use of her phone to telephone PERL, but the subject refused, stating that she would go to see him directly; however, GLASHAN did not appear at PERL's apartment at 656 fast 103rd Street, Cleveland, Ohio, until around noon on Sunday, July 23, 1950. The reason for the lapse of time from about \$100 p.m., Saturday, July 22 to noon on Sunday, July 23, 1950, before the subject made her contact with PERL was unknown; JLASE AE, won interview, having stated that she was interested in job prospects, although she would not state who she had contacted for a job on Saturday afternoon and night.

From information obtained from MILTON KLEIN, it would appear that GLASSHAN probably attempted to make her contact on Saturday, but was unable to find Park at home.

MILTON N. KLEIN, 2690 Morris Avenue, Bronz, New York, instructor in Physics at New York University, a close friend of VILLIAM PLRL and a college classmate in 1914-1938 at the College of the City of New York of JULITS ROSENBLED and of JOEL BARR, former fiance of VIVIAH GLASSMAN, informed SA MAURICE W. GORCORAN in Pebruary-March, 1953 that he worked with WILLIAM PERL at the National Advisory Committee for Aeronauties (NACA) at Langley Field, Virginia, in about July, 1942 and that subsequently in about July, 1946, they resided at the same address on Franklin Avenue in Cleveland; that both were employed as engineers by NACA; that PERL helped him to get the job in Cleveland; that KLEIN, FERL and JOAL BAR: went to BARR's home in about 1938-1940, believed to possibly have been in Brooklyn, New York, where BARR showed some radio equipment he was interested in as he was a radio "ham", or amateur operator; that PERL was a very good friend of BARR, although KLEIN claimed to know BARK only essually at City College.

ELLIE said in reference to VIVIAE GLASSKAR's visit to PERL in July, 1950 that he was unavare that VIVIAE GLASSKAR had contacted Parl in Cleveland, Ohio, until some time in the summer of 1951, when he learned from STANLEY KANAREK, on associate of RAYMOKO VISE, PERL's lavyer, of record, that she had done so. KANAREK contacted ELLIE in Cleveland, Ohio, and requested him to be a character witness for PERL.

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ELETS stated that he had never met VIVIAN GLASSMAN and when shown a photograph of her did not recognize her as anyone that he had ever known. KLEIN advised that he believes on the night of July 22, 1950, a beturday, a friend, BURT RIBULR, staged a party at his house to which he and PERL were invited.

(KLRIF stated that about 11:00 a.m. on Baturday. July 22, 1950, PERL telephoned him at his home and advised him that he did not believe that he would go to the RIBBER party that night as he was having some difficulty with the Federal Bureau of Investigation and that he believes that his wires are tapped and that he is being followed. He said that he was ealling from an outside phone booth instead of from his apartment. PERL concluded by stating that he would stop over to see KLKII later in the day. PERL appeared at KLKIR's apartment early that evening and explained that he was being investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation for disloyalty, but did not explain, according to KLRIM, what the disloyalty investigation was based on other than that the Pederal Bureau of Investigation was interested in his acquaintance with JULIUS ASSARLERS and the fact that he had Pented the spartment of JOHL BARR. They spent about thirty minutes together and then PKRL left.)

ELEIS subsequently proceeded to and met PERL at the apartment of a girl named GLENDNE BANKETT, upon whom PERL was calling. He placed the time as around 7-5 e'cleak that evening and they proceeded to the party and stayed until about 1:00 a.m. They then took their dates home, each going in his own automobile.

On Sunday, July 23, 1950, according to KLETE, an "outdoor pienic was scheduled and PaRL accompanied the group.

ELETE stated that PERL did not tell him that the subject had contacted him in the early efferness of Sunday, July 23, 1950, at any time that day while they were on the pistic, or thereafter, and the purpose of her visit tax takenom to him until Parl's lawyer told him about it.



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TLUE advised that he had received no telephone calls from anyone, local or long distance, to contact PARL with a massage nor had anyone called him for information concerning FERL and had no knowledge of GLASSWAM having been in Cleveland on July 22,23, 1950.

ELETH did not recognise photographs of MICHAEL BIDOROVICE or NAVALL FIRESTONE.

A physical surveillance of WILLIAM PERL, on July 22, 1950 in Cleveland, revealed that PERL entered ELEIN's Posidence at 7:09 p.m. on July 22, 1950.
