





Results of exemination:

It was concluded that the handprinting on specimen Qul of this case was prepared by VIVIAN GLASSMAN, whose known handprinting is found on K5 listed above and also on specimen Kcl previously submitted. It should be noted that both K5 and Kcl were necessary in order to make this identification.

A definite conclusion cannot be removed whether the handwriting on specimen Go2 was written by VIVIAN GLADELLY, because of variations which still remains unaccounted for on the basis of the available known handwriting. It should be noted that the sandwriting on specimen 362 is very limited and appears to have been written quite rapidly.

Specimens Kel and Qel, referred to above were received from your office with a letter flated August 23, 1950. Specimen Qe2 was substitted by the Cleveland office with a letter dated August 7, 1950.

The evidence is retained.

ERSONAL ATTEMTION

-VIVIAN GLASSVAN, WA. -ESPICHASS - R

You are aware that as a result of the investigation of this matter, as well as the case involving the subjects in the Resemberg of espionage network, definite information was developed showing that a Glassman was closely associated with Joel Barr and Julius and Sthel of Resemberg. In addition, it was learned that she was acquainted and in contact with other members of the network, such as William Perl, Albert Sarant and David and Buth Groenglass.

According to Glassman's own statement, she was contacted in July, 1950, by an unknown individual who advised her of his acquaintance with Barr and Rosenberg, and she thereafter made a trip to Claveland, the Chio, to furnish Perl with money and to give him instructions as to leaving the country by way of Mexico. You will also recall that Rosenberg, in recently referring to Classman's trip during his conversation with Jeromo Rugene Tartakow, advised that his Russian contact had colected Glassman for this assignment and he mentioned that he thought this selection was unfortunate, as Glassman was too moll-known as a Communister 11 19 19 334 137

In view of the above information and the apparent importance of Glassman in this Seviet espioning network, you are cognisant of the inreads corious responsibility of maintaining adequate coverage so that the Bureau will be kept currently advised as to her contacts and activities. It is believed essential that every effort should be made to identify any of her known contacts, bearing in mind that one of these persons may be identical with Resemberg's Russian contact whom he referred to as "Dennia."

It is requested that you give this matter your personal promotionation and furnish the Eureau with your observations and suggestions as to your future healing of this investigation, in order to assure that the Eureau's responsibility is fulfilled.

This matter should be given your immediate attention.

SARANT, 65 Morton Street, New York City, N. Y., bears a return ad lress of SANDERS, c/o MAHN, B25 No. Hobart Blvd, Hollywood, California. On the reverse side of this envelope is a pencilled notation which was presumably placed thereon after its receipt at 65 Morton Street and may have been made by one of the SARANTS. This notation which was referred to in referenced teletype has a return address which upon close scruting appears to be GLADYS GLASSMAN, WEISMAN, 4437 Ambrose Ave., H, 27, California. It would appear that this would be interpreted to mean that the SARANTS had this address for GLADYS GLASSMAN in care of WEIGMAN, 4437 Ambrowe Avenue, Hollywood 27, California.

Photographs of this letter as well as all of the other letters from EFTTT SANDERS were furnished to the New York office by letter on July 29, 1950 in the case entitled "ALFRED SARANT, Espionage - R". The original letter is being forwarded as an " enclosure with this communication. The remainder of the letters from HETTY SAMPLES are being maintained by the Albany office since there is a good possibility that BETTY SANDERS may have been implicated in the ROSENBERG case.

Indemuch as this investigation is closely tied in with the investigation of WILLIAM PORE, ALFAED SOCIALT and JOHN, BERG, for espionage, close liaison is being maintained with developments in those cases which would prove of value in involving GLOSSEAN in the espionage conspiracy.

It would appear from a review of VIVIAN GLASSMAN'S employment since the she left Hunter College in 1939 that she apparently was not used to obtain national defense information through employment in an industrial installation or other vital facility. Her only employment of such nature was at the U.S. Army Signal Corps at Pt. Monmouth, N.J. from May 1942 to September 1, 1943. She returned to the study of social work at the New York School of Social Work from October 1943 to February 1947 having filed an entrance applicant in June 1943 and then went to work at the Jewish Board of Guardians, the National Maritime Union and the United Service for New Americans as a social service worker at each organization. If she were being used to furnish national defense information, it is unlikely that she would have been permitted to return to school and remain there until 1947 and then engage in social service work. Her place in the network it would appear was therefore apparently not that of furnishing national defense information except possibly from kay 1942 to september 1943.

The likelihood of her being used as a courier, as a typist, or for microfilming is the most obvious conclusion that can be drawn from known information concerning her.

Viewed, however, in the light of ROSENBERG'S statement to TARTAKOW that he believed the choice of VIVIAN GLASSMAN by his hissian contact, to act as courier to contact PLEE, was very unwise since GLASMAN was too well known as a Communist to be used in this capacity it might be concluded that ROSENBERG did not use her as a courier. If this statement by ROSENBERG is indicative of ROSENBERG'S opinion of GLASSMAN'S usefulness it may be speculated that GLASS AN'S only act as a courier on the July 22, 1950 trip to Cleveland.

This trip is an overt act which this investigation is endeavoring to connect through interview of associates of RUSENBERG and GLASSMAN with other acts of members of the RUSENBERG group or with an agreement by GLASSMAN with a member of the conspiracy to violate the espionage statute.

Spot check surveillances are being instituted to check subject's contacts and activities and her mail and tell calls are also being covered to identify her centacts. Every effort will be exerted to identify the unknown man who contacted her on July 21, 1950, who may possibly be identical with the individual named DENNIS" mentioned by RUSENBERG as his Russian contact to TALTAKOW.

The possibility of CLASSAAN attempting to flee the jurisdiction of the United States has been recognized and stops have been placed on the name VIVIAN CLASSAAN with the Airline reservation offices in New York City; with the Immigration and Naturalization Service; U.S. Customs and the State Department. In audition, a neighbor of GLASSAAN'S who is willing to keep notes on the time that she hears GLASSAAN enter and leave her apartment has been developed and will be kept in touch with to keep as close a check on GLASSMAN'S presence at home as possible.







Through a trash cover made by Special Agent GILBERTG. BENJAMIN on May 8, 1951, there were obtained two envelopes and two letters addressed to subject RAY PINKSON, 316 Peabody Street, N.W. Each letter was signed with the name ELLIE. One of the envelopes bore the return address Z. GLASSMAN, 343 East 8th Street, New York City. This material was collected by District of Columbia Sanitation Truck #340 on May 8, 1951. The personnel on this truck included F. E. GREEN, driver, and JACK KING, WILLIE STODDARD, JOHN W. BRADSHAW, and ARTHUR I. WILSON, helpers. It is noted that both envelopes bore New York postmarks and were mailed via air mail. One was postmarked 7:00 P.M., April 24. 1951, and the other 6:30 P.M., March 5, 1951. The letters are as follows:

"Sunday

"Dear Ray,

"Hello!

"A social service office is not the most secluded spot for unexpected long distance calls -- especially at closing time on Saturday morning. So I hope I didn't sound too cold or abrupt.

ROSENBERG, as reported to the New York Office by DAVID GREENGLASS.

MANES stated that he had no recollection of visiting the ROSENBERGS during 1946 or 1947, but that he did recall being at the ROSENBERG apartment on several occasions during October and November 1945, during which period he was employed on a fellowship at Duke University, Durham, North Carolina. MANES advised that sometime during October 1945 he had burned his right arm while conducting research at Duke University and, being unable to continue his studies, decided to spend several days visiting relatives in New York City. He said that about Thanksgiving (late November)1945 he again spent several days at New York City after his mother had suffered a serious stroke. According to MANES he visited the ROSENBERGS several times during the two trips; however, he said he could recall only one occasion when there were more than himself and the ROSENBERGS present, and it was his belief that this occasion was during his second visit, or during November, 1945.

The meeting in question, MANES continued, was merely an informal get-together between himself, the ROSENBERGS, and some of the latter's close friends. MANES stated that the meeting took place one evening at the ROSENBERG's apartment and he recalled the following as being present:

JULIUS ROSENBERG,
ETHEL ROSENBERG,
DAVID GREENGLASS and possibly his wife,
RUTH GREENGLASS,
BERNARD GREENGLASS and his wife, and one of

MANES could not definitely recall which of his two brothers, DANIEL or LAWRENCE, was present at the meeting, but thought it was probably LAWRENCE.

No other information of value was furnished by MANES during this interview.

#### AT BRIDGEVILLE, PENNSYLVANIA

On June 11, 1951, Mrs. CAROL FREEMAN MANES was interviewed at her home, 356 Rock Hill Road, Bridgeville. Mrs. MANES stated that she had no recollection of being present at the meeting held at the ROSENBERG apartment in New York City in November, 1945, at which DAVID GREENGLASS, BERNARD GREENGLASS, JULIUS ROSENBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG, and her husband, MILTON MANES, were present. She said that she only visited the ROSENBERG apartment a few times and had never met either DAVID or RUTH GREENGLASS at the ROSENBERG residence. Mrs. MANES specifically recalled one visit with her husband to the ROSENBERGS about November, 1945, at which time both ROSENBERGS as well as LAWRENCE MANES were present. She described this meeting as only a brief social call and stated that she was certain that neither DAVID nor RUTH GREENGLASS was present on this occasion.






