Reference report reflects that ALICE KATZ BARSKY advised that VIVIAN GLASSMAN resided at 320 Ocean Avenue, Long Branch, N.J. in 1942-43 with ~~ELIZABETH GLASSMAN~~; ~~ESTHER BALSAN~~, nee LUTTAN; ~~VIVIAN CARLIN~~, nee FRUCHTBAUM; ~~JUDITH GROLLMAN~~; ~~GLADYS SIEGEL~~; ~~MILHARD CANTOR~~, nee BLOCK; ~~ALFRED ROSEN~~, nee GOLD and ALICE KATZ and a lead to interview these former room-mates of subject is set out.

The indices of the New York Division reflect no references to VIVIAN FRUCHTBAUM; VIVIAN CARLIN or to GLADYS SIEGEL.

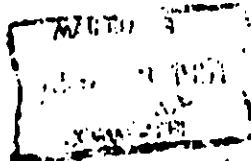

Specimens: K5 One Property Pass; one Request for Admittance; a photographic copy of a letter of resignation and a photographic copy of an Application for Position all bearing the known handwriting and handprinting of VIVIAN GLASSMAN.

Results of examination:

It was concluded that the handprinting on specimen Qc1 of this case was prepared by VIVIAN GLASSMAN, whose known handprinting is found on K5 listed above and also on specimen Kc1 previously submitted. It should be noted that both K5 and Kc1 were necessary in order to make this identification.

A definite conclusion cannot be reached whether the handwriting on specimen Qc2 was written by VIVIAN GLASSMAN, because of variations which still remain unaccounted for on the basis of the available known handwriting. It should be noted that the handwriting on specimen Qc2 is very limited and appears to have been written quite rapidly.

Specimens Kc1 and Qc1, referred to above were received from your office with a letter dated August 23, 1950. Specimen Qc2 was submitted by the Cleveland office with a letter dated August 7, 1950.

You are aware that as a result of the investigation of this matter, as well as the case involving the subjects in the Rosenberg espionage network, definite information was developed showing that Glassman was closely associated with Joel Barr and Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. In addition, it was learned that she was acquainted and in contact with other members of the network, such as William Perl, Albert Sarant and David and Ruth Greenglass.

According to Glassman's own statement, she was contacted in July, 1950, by an unknown individual who advised her of his acquaintance with Barr and Rosenberg, and she thereafter made a trip to Cleveland, Ohio, to furnish Perl with money and to give him instructions as to leaving the country by way of Mexico. You will also recall that Rosenberg, in recently referring to Glassman's trip during his conversation with Jerome Eugene Tartakow, advised that his Russian contact had selected Glassman for this assignment and he mentioned that he thought this selection was unfortunate, as Glassman was too well-known as a Communist.

In view of the above information and the apparent importance of Glassman in this Soviet espionage network, you are cognizant of the Bureau's serious responsibility of maintaining adequate coverage so that the Bureau will be kept currently advised as to her contacts and activities. It is believed essential that every effort should be made to identify any of her known contacts, bearing in mind that one of these persons may be identical with Rosenberg's Russian contact whom he referred to as "Dennis."

It is requested that you give this matter your personal consideration and furnish the Bureau with your observations and suggestions as to your future handling of this investigation, in order to assure that the Bureau's responsibility is fulfilled.

This matter should be given your immediate attention.

Referenced report sets out a lead to report the contents of the letter obtained in the permissive search of ALFRED SARANT'S residence on July 29, 1950 which bore a return address of GLADYS GLASSMAN WEISMAN.

Albany teletype to Director, New York and Los Angeles on July 29, 1950, which appears to be the communication referred to in referenced report, refers to letters received by the SARANTS from BETTY SANDERS. There are no letters from GLADYS GLASSMAN WEISMAN. One of these letters which was postmarked October 14, 1945, at Los Angeles, California, and is addressed to Mr. and Mrs. A. SARANT, 65 Morton Street, New York City, N. Y., bears a return address of SANDERS, c/o MAHN, B25 No. Hobart Blvd, Hollywood, California. On the reverse side of this envelope is a pencilled notation which was presumably placed thereon after its receipt at 65 Morton Street and may have been made by one of the SARANTS. This notation which was referred to in referenced teletype has a return address which upon close scrutiny appears to be GLADYS GLASSMAN WEISMAN, 4437 Ambrose Ave., H, 27, California. It would appear that this would be interpreted to mean that the SARANTS had this address for GLADYS GLASSMAN in care of WEISMAN, 4437 Ambrose Avenue, Hollywood 27, California.

Photographs of this letter as well as all of the other letters from BETTY SANDERS were furnished to the New York office by letter on July 29, 1950 in the case entitled "ALFRED SARANT, Espionage - R". The original letter is being forwarded as an enclosure with this communication. The remainder of the letters from BETTY SANDERS are being maintained by the Albany office since there is a good possibility that BETTY SANDERS may have been implicated in the ROSENBERG case.

It is noted that as a result of a surveillance it was developed that Glassman contacted an individual driving an automobile which was registered to Arthur C. Brudin, 500-A Grand Street, New York City. Check of Bufiles has failed to reflect any information concerning this individual. Your office is requested to immediately conduct an investigation for the purpose of determining the background, business connections and activities of this individual.

It is also suggested that at the time of a future interview with Glassman you might be in a position to use to advantage certain of the information furnished by informant Jerome Eugene Tartakow as a method of possibly enlisting her cooperation. In this respect it is believed that you might particularly confront her with the information obtained to the effect that the \$2,000 which was given to her for Perl was never actually returned to the individual who provided her with the money. It is also believed that you might question her as to whether she has had any contact with Perl, Perl's attorney, or the Rosenberg attorney, it being noted that Tartakow recently advised that Rosenberg's attorney, Block, has been in contact with Glassman.

Reference letter reviewed the facts in this investigation regarding VIVIAN GLASSMAN'S admitted close association with JOEL BARR and JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, Soviet Agents, and her statement to Bureau agents that she was contacted in the evening of July 21, 1950 by a man whose identity was unknown to her, who advised her of his acquaintance with JOEL BARR and that she thereafter made a trip to Cleveland, Ohio, to furnish WILLIAM PERL with money and instructions to leave the United States by way of Mexico. GLASSMAN'S acquaintance and contact with other members of the ROSENBERG network such as ALFRED SMART and DAVID and RUTH ROSENGLASS was also mentioned.

Reference letter reflects that GLASSMAN stated that the unknown man that contacted her on July 21, 1950 advised her of his acquaintance with BARR and JULIUS ROSENBERG and that she thereafter made the trip to Cleveland, Ohio, to furnish WILLIAM PERL with money and instructions to leave the country by way of Mexico.

It has been noted that GLASSMAN would not admit that the stranger told her that he was directed to her by JULIUS or ETHEL ROSENBERG to request her to make the trip to Cleveland, Ohio, to contact PERL, nor would she divulge the details of the conversation she had with the stranger although she was pressed for details of this phase of her story. She refused to admit that she made the Cleveland trip with the understanding that JULIUS ROSENBERG wanted her to tell WILLIAM PERL to flee the jurisdiction of the FBI and denied that the stranger mentioned ROSENBERG's name.

If she made this admission, it is believed it would have warranted her apprehension as a member of the ROSENBERG conspiracy.

Since no admission has been obtained from GLASSMAN that she agreed to make the Cleveland trip in behalf of, or at the request of JULIUS or ETHEL ROSENBERG, conveyed to her through the stranger, the following information has been obtained which would tend to support the conclusion that she did make the Cleveland trip with knowledge that she was acting in ROSENBERG'S behalf and possibly at his request and that her actions were those of a conspirator:

1. She made airplane reservations on United Airlines in a false name and refused to give her telephone number or address when requested to by the Airline.

2. She registered under an alias at the Regent Hotel, Cleveland, Ohio on 7/22/51.

3. The statement of WILLIAM PERL dated July 28, 1950 which reflects that he stated that VIVIAN GLASSMAN appeared at his apartment on July 23, 1950 and upon entering she reached for some paper lying on a table and for a lapboard nearby; motioned to PERL to sit next to her and wrote that she had been instructed to talk to him by writing rather than talking; that she had been instructed to go to Cleveland and give him money and instructions which she had memorized as to how he and a friend were to leave the country; that for identification she was to mention a ship incident in which she was concerned with JOEL BARR and also the name "JOHN"; that she also wrote to the effect that she knew JULIUS ROSENBERG.

4. Testimony of JEROME EUGENE TARTAKOFF that ROSENBERG stated that he furnished his Russian contact with the name of PERL among others as a person to be helped to flee the United States and that his contact selected VIVIAN GLASSMAN as a courier for the job.

Investigation is being directed toward development of additional sources who can testify that VIVIAN GLASSMAN was aware of ROSENBERG'S espionage conspiracy and performed other acts in furtherance thereof.

In this connection, DAVID GREENGLASS was recently re-interviewed regarding his recollection of some incident which might reflect that VIVIAN GLASSMAN had performed some espionage services for ROSENBERG and his interview will be set forth in a report in this matter which is being prepared. In addition, Assistant United States Attorney, Southern District of New York JOHN M. FOLEY, has agreed to call witnesses known to have been associated at the 65 Morton Street apartment for information connecting VIVIAN GLASSMAN with photographic activities there. Proof of knowledge on this part of GLASSMAN of the actual Commission of Acts of Espionage by a member of the network is considered an essential element in this investigation and investigation being pointed toward developing this requisite through detailed interviews with cooperative individuals connected with ROSENBERG which might bring GLASSMAN within the provisions of other statutes such as Misprision of a Felony, Commission of an Act in Furtherance of the Conspiracy to Commit Espionage and the Internal Security Act of 1950 as well as the Espionage Statute itself.

Inasmuch as this investigation is closely tied in with the investigation of WILLIAM PERL, ALFRED SWEAT and JOHN BARR, for espionage, close liaison is being maintained with developments in those cases which would prove of value in involving GLASSMAN in the espionage conspiracy.

It would appear from a review of VIVIAN GLASSMAN'S employment since she left Hunter College in 1939 that she apparently was not used to obtain national defense information through employment in an industrial installation or other vital facility. Her only employment of such nature was at the U.S. Army Signal Corps at Ft. Monmouth, N.J. from May 1942 to September 1, 1943. She returned to the study of social work at the New York School of Social Work from October 1943 to February 1947 having filed an entrance applicant in June 1943 and then went to work at the Jewish Board of Guardians, the National Maritime Union and the United Service for New Americans as a social service worker at each organization. If she were being used to furnish national defense information, it is unlikely that she would have been permitted to return to school and remain there until 1947 and then engage in social service work. Her place in the network it would appear was therefore apparently not that of furnishing national defense information except possibly from May 1942 to September 1943.

The likelihood of her being used as a courier, as a typist, or for microfilming is the most obvious conclusion that can be drawn from known information concerning her.

Viewed, however, in the light of ROSENBERG'S statement to TARTAKOW that he believed the choice of VIVIAN GLASSMAN by his Russian contact, to act as courier to contact PERL, was very unwise since GLASSMAN was too well known as a Communist to be used in this capacity it might be concluded that ROSENBERG did not use her as a courier. If this statement by ROSENBERG is indicative of ROSENBERG'S opinion of GLASSMAN'S usefulness it may be speculated that GLASSMAN'S only act as a courier was on the July 22, 1950 trip to Cleveland.

This trip is an overt act which this investigation is endeavoring to connect through interview of associates of ROSENBERG and GLASSMAN with other acts of members of the ROSENBERG group or with an agreement by GLASSMAN with a member of the conspiracy to violate the espionage statute.

Spot check surveillances are being instituted to check subject's contacts and activities and her mail and toll calls are also being covered to identify her contacts. Every effort will be exerted to identify the unknown man who contacted her on July 21, 1950, who may possibly be identical with the individual named "DENNIS" mentioned by ROSENBERG as his Russian contact to TARTAKOW.

The possibility of GLASSMAN attempting to flee the jurisdiction of the United States has been recognized and stops have been placed on the name VIVIAN GLASSMAN with the Airline reservation offices in New York City; with the Immigration and Naturalization Service; U.S. Customs and the State Department. In addition, a neighbor of GLASSMAN'S who is willing to keep notes on the time that she hears GLASSMAN enter and leave her apartment has been developed and will be kept in touch with to keep as close a check on GLASSMAN'S presence at home as possible.

ROSENBERG, as reported to the New York Office by DAVID GREENGLASS.

MANES stated that he had no recollection of visiting the ROSENBERGS during 1946 or 1947, but that he did recall being at the ROSENBERG apartment on several occasions during October and November 1945, during which period he was employed on a fellowship at Duke University, Durham, North Carolina. MANES advised that sometime during October 1945 he had burned his right arm while conducting research at Duke University and, being unable to continue his studies, decided to spend several days visiting relatives in New York City. He said that about Thanksgiving (late November) 1945 he again spent several days at New York City after his mother had suffered a serious stroke. According to MANES he visited the ROSENBERGS several times during the two trips; however, he said he could recall only one occasion when there were more than himself and the ROSENBERGS present, and it was his belief that this occasion was during his second visit, or during November, 1945.

The meeting in question, MANES continued, was merely an informal get-together between himself, the ROSENBERGS, and some of the latter's close friends. MANES stated that the meeting took place one evening at the ROSENBERG's apartment and he recalled the following as being present:

JULIUS ROSENBERG,  
ETHEL ROSENBERG,  
DAVID GREENGLASS and possibly his wife,  
RUTH GREENGLASS,  
BERNARD GREENGLASS and his wife, and one of  
MANES' brothers, either DANIEL or LAWRENCE  
MANES.

He further stated that other persons may have been present briefly, but said that he had no recollection of any specific person and the names, VIVIAN GLASSMAN and JOEL BARR, were not known to him. Moreover, when photographs of GLASSMAN and BARR were exhibited to MANES, he stated that he had never seen either

of these individuals, either at the ROSENBERG apartment or at any other time.

MANES had a vague recollection of BERNARD GREENGLASS recounting his experiences in the United States Army, and of DAVIS GREENGLASS making a passing reference to the fact that he had formerly been employed on the Atom Bomb Project at Los Alamos, New Mexico, but he could not recall any other details of the meeting. MANES could not definitely recall which of his two brothers, DANIEL or LAWRENCE, was present at the meeting, but thought it was probably LAWRENCE.

No other information of value was furnished by MANES during this interview.

#### AT BRIDGEVILLE, PENNSYLVANIA

On June 11, 1951, Mrs. CAROL FREEMAN MANES was interviewed at her home, 356 Rock Hill Road, Bridgeville. Mrs. MANES stated that she had no recollection of being present at the meeting held at the ROSENBERG apartment in New York City in November, 1945, at which DAVID GREENGLASS, BERNARD GREENGLASS, JULIUS ROSENBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG, and her husband, MILTON MANES, were present. She said that she only visited the ROSENBERG apartment a few times and had never met either DAVID or RUTH GREENGLASS at the ROSENBERG residence. Mrs. MANES specifically recalled one visit with her husband to the ROSENBERGS about November, 1945, at which time both ROSENBERGS as well as LAWRENCE MANES were present. She described this meeting as only a brief social call and stated that she was certain that neither DAVID nor RUTH GREENGLASS was present on this occasion.

Photographs of VIVIAN GLASSMAN and JOEL BARR were exhibited to Mrs. MANES and she stated that she had never seen either of these persons, either at the ROSENBERG apartment or at any other time.
