SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

STANLEY ROBERT RICH reinterviewed at Hartford, Conn., and claims to be unable to associate subject definitely with YCL activities at CCNY. Admits attendance at two to six meetings of YCL during senior year, 1937-1938, and that subject may have been in attendance at some, but not definite on this point.

DETAILS:

STANLEY ROBERT RICH was reinterviewed at Hartford, Conn., on August 2, 1951, and affirmed his previous statement that he was a member of the Steinmetz Club, the unit of the Young Communist League at the College of the City of New York during the school year 1937-1938.

RICH described the subject as a studious type of individual with whom he was associated on numerous laboratory experiments during the senior year of the course in Electrical Engineering at CCNY. He related that he held no office in the Steinmetz Club, and attended from two to six meetings of the organization. **RICH** stated that the subject may have been in attendance at some of these meetings, but claimed to be unable to be certain on this point.

RICH was of the opinion that the subject's interests in his studies overshadowed all other activities at CCNY, and that if he became interested in "left wing activities" it was after the period of his attendance at CCNY.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

Deposit tickets at Merchants National Bank, Hampton, Virginia on March 28, 1941 reflect two deposits totaling \$470.00 in cash. Another cash deposit of \$250.00 made on 2/16/42, on February 17, 1942, \$90.00 deposit to account of subject. This \$90.00 was part of salary government check for \$104.53. Examination of ledger sheets for subject's account from May 16, 1939 through January 11, 1941 reflects normal ~~semi-monthly~~ deposits other than a \$190.00 cash deposit on July 20, 1940. No record located for subject at Langley Memorial Aeronautics Laboratory Credit Union. Bank authorities, Hampton, Virginia, believe subject closed out his account by notation on check dated January 3, 1944 in the amount of \$40.00. They also advised that general correspondence file failed to reflect any information regarding subject or subject's forwarding address or forwarding bank.

DETAILS:

AT HAMPTON, VIRGINIA

A check of the records of the Credit Union Office, Langley Memorial Aeronautics Laboratory, failed to reflect the name of the subject as having had any account with the Credit Union. According to authorities at the Credit Union the subject could have either cashed a check or made a payment to the Credit Union in someone else's name.

A check of the deposit tickets available at the Merchants National Bank with reference to the subject's depositing \$470.00 on March 28, 1948 reflected that these were two cash deposits totaling this amount. There was nothing on the deposit slip to indicate the origin of the money deposited. Another cash deposit of \$250.00 made on February 16, 1942 was reflected on a deposit slip. On February 17, 1942, \$90.00 was deposited to the account of the subject. According to the deposit slip this \$90.00 was part of a salary government check for \$104.53. This check was located on recordak film at the bank.

Regarding the activities of the subject's account prior to January 1941 ledger sheets from May 16, 1939 to January 11, 1941 showing subject's checking account activities at the Merchants National Bank were located in the old vault located on the second floor of the bank. An examination of these ledger sheets reflected that the semimonthly deposits not exceeding \$80.00 at any time. However, it was noted that one of the semimonthly deposits was made on July 17, 1940. This was in the amount of \$88.45. The deposit slip located in the attic of the bank reflected that this \$88.45 was made by government check. On July 20, 1940 there was a deposit of \$190.00 made to the account of the subject. At this time the bank balance of the subject was \$282.29. An examination of the deposit slip for July 20, 1940 reflected that the deposit was made in cash. There were no withdrawals noted above \$30.00 during the period in question. The subject's checking account balance as of January 11, 1941 was \$57.09. The highest balance for the account during the pertinent period was \$308.00 as of October 17, 1939.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that the check dated January 3, 1944 drawn on Merchants National Bank payable to WILLIAM NUTTERPERL and signed WILLIAM NUTTERPERL was probably mailed by the subject to the bank. This check was located by the reporting agent on recordak film and there was a notation on the check which was probably in the handwriting of the subject, "to close account". There was a clearing house stamp on the base of the check. However, this stamp was illegible. T-1 stated that the check was most likely mailed by the subject to the Bank at Hampton, Virginia, in view of the notation regarding the closing of the account and in view of the Federal Reserve stamp on the base of the check.

During the discussion, Mr. Bell advised that he had recently learned that there had been a previous comprehensive report on the NEPA project prior to the "Lexington Report," this earlier report being referred to as NEPA #4 which came out in late 1947, or early 1948. This information is of interest in view of the present investigation to determine the exact nature of the mathematics on NEPA which Rosenberg informed Greenglass he had received in 1948.

Reference is made to your memorandum dated August 23, 1951, your reference JMW:JJG:arn, 146-41-15, requesting that this Bureau advise as expeditiously as possible of any observations regarding three cases which the Atomic Energy Commission desires to include in its report to the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy.

The status of these cases is noted as follows:

Unknown Subject: Approximately 100 grams of plutonium missing in DP West Site, Los Alamos Atomic Energy Project.

The status of this investigation is pending. You may wish to refer to the report of Special Agent J. Jerome Maxwell, dated July 10, 1951, at Albuquerque, New Mexico, a copy of which was furnished to you on August 9, 1951.

William Perl:

The status of this case is pending. As you are aware, subject, Perl, was indicted on March 15, 1951, for perjury and has been released on a \$20,000 bond. The date of trial has not as yet been set.

Lazar Wilburn Lenderson:

The status of this investigation is pending. You may wish to refer to the report of Special Agent Lawrence Bracken, dated July 13, 1951, New York, N.Y., a copy of which has been previously furnished to you.

that he attended a conference at the Curtis-Wright Research Laboratory, Buffalo, New York, at which time the Army Air Force disclosed the plans for power plants TG-100 and I-40. He advised that he was of this opinion since the plane designated as XP80, which was powered by an I-40 engine had made its test flight during the month of April, 1944, and since it had taken the Lockheed Aircraft Company six months to build this plane, they evidently had the plans some time during the latter part of 1943 at the same time he was also given the information.

At the meeting in Buffalo, New York he stated that he believed that at that time one copy of the plans were earmarked by the Army for the Curtis-Wright Corporation and that after the laboratory had studied them they were sent to St. Louis.

He stated that the Curtis-Wright Corporation had worked on the Project XC-113, which consisted of installation of the TG-100 power plant in a C46 plane, however, after working on this for some time, the project was transferred to Buffalo, New York and later to Columbus, Ohio.

He advised that the person in charge of the Curtis-Wright Research Laboratory at the time of the meeting concerning instant power plants, was a Dr. FURNACE who still remained there after it was taken over by the Cornell University. He added that he was of the opinion that documentary evidence would be available through Dr. FURNACE which would reflect the exact date the plans were made available.

E. M. FLESH, formerly First Project Engineer, Curtis-Wright Corporation, now Engineer, McDonnell Aircraft Company, stated that he concurred in the opinion of Mr. HURKAMP, however, his actual participation in Project XC-113 did not begin until the latter part of 1944 or the early part of 1945.

The files of the WFO contain no derogatory information concerning SOLOMON HENRY TURKEL. TURKEL was interviewed at the Operations Research Office, Johns Hopkins Institute, 6110 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., at which time he evidenced a desire to cooperate with this office in any investigation. According to TURKEL he had been employed at the Argonne Laboratory, Chicago, up to the spring of 1946 at which time he went to Cleveland to visit the NACA establishment having in mind the possible obtaining of employment at the latter place. During this visit he was referred to ALFRED BOBROWSKI a physicist and apparently in charge of a section of the laboratory. BOBROWSKI showed TURKEL through the laboratory during the course of the visit and quite possibly introduced him to some employees there although TURKEL could not recall the names of any such employees. In July 1946 TURKEL was employed with NEPA at NACA at Oak Ridge and subsequently had occasion to correspond with the NACA at Cleveland by letter in the course of his duties but did not thereafter visit the Cleveland laboratory.

TURKEL categorically stated that he could not recall ever having heard the name of subject and is certain that the latter had never requested of him nor received any information whatsoever, including the "Lexington Report" or concerning the NEPA project. You will recall that by letter dated March 16, 1951, I furnished you with a memorandum concerning the above individual. This memorandum furnished you a summary of information available with respect to the background and alleged espionage activities of Perl together with the fact of his arrest in the Southern District of New York on the charge of perjury.
