At 2:25 PM, 3/2/73, Personnel Officer [redacted] called. The Bureau would like this Division to furnish immediately ten Special Agents on special. They are to fly as soon as possible directly to Rapid City, South Dakota, and check in with the RA there. They are to bring appropriate clothing, keeping in mind that it can and does go below zero and should bring their firearms. He asked that one of the men also bring a Starlight Scope if we have one available.

Mr. [redacted] stated we could select the men, but we should keep in mind that this was not an intelligence operation and that probably Agents with some training or experience in riot control, defensive tactics, administrative firearms, etc., would be most adequate for this assignment.

We are to confirm by nitel this evening to the Bureau and Minneapolis the names of the Agents who are going and the expected time of their arrival which the Bureau hopes will be this evening.

He mentioned incidentally that they have had 40 men on special there for about one week and that at the moment he is rounding up five from San Francisco, five from Detroit, and he is trying to get 30 others who are close enough that they can drive and bring cars.

The list of 20 demands is not from the American Indian Movement (AIM) alone. It is from all the Indian organizations that participated in the Trail of Broken Treaties. These demands came out from a stack of paper of 5,000 pages of all the organizations of one cause to show what was needed by all the organizations.

"Trail of Broken Treaties"--Renewal of Contracts; Reconstruction of Indian Communities; And Securing An Indian Future In America!!!

1. Restoration of Constitutional Treaty Making Authority.
2. Establishment of Treaty Commission to Make New Treaties.
3. Presidential and Indian Address to American People and Joint Congress.
4. Commission to Review Treaty Commitments and Violations.
5. Resubmission of Unratified Treaties to the Senate.
6. All Indians to be Governed by Treaty Relations.
7. Mandatory Relief Against Treaty Rights Violations.
8. Judicial Recognition of Indian Right to Interpret Treaties.
9. Creation of Congressional Joint Committee on Reconstruction of Indian Relations and Programs.
10. Land Reform and Restoration of 110-Million-Acre Native Land Base.
 - A. Priorities in Restoration of Native American Land Base.
 - B. Consolidation of Indians' Land, Water, Natural and Economic Resources.
 - C. Termination of Leases and Condemnation of Non-Indian Land Title.
 - D. Repeal of Menominee, Klamath and Other Indian Termination Acts.

The foregoing are titles to proposals advanced in a series of study, discussion, and issue workshops conducted by several hundred Indian people from numerous, diverse Indian communities and joined in the "Trail of Broken Treaties" Caravan. The proposals are discussed with minimal essential detail, sometimes rationales and justifications are included. In brief, and taken together, they provide concrete proposals for positive, constructive and necessary change for America's relationships and dealings with the

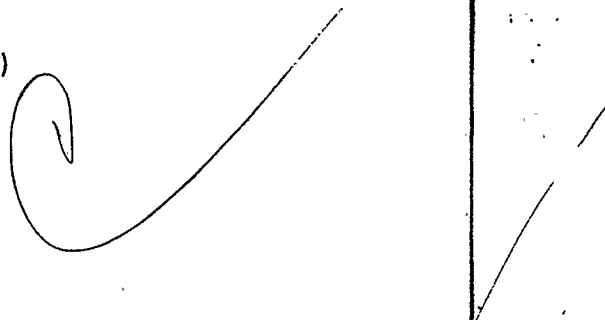

first people of the American land. They present an outline for Indian and non-Indian actions -- and an agenda for the next Congress and Administration of the United States Government -- an agenda that must be accepted and acted upon, if the basic obligations of a government to a people are not to be forever denied.

1. We demand that we get the Executive and Legislative action on our twenty (20) point solution papers.
2. We demand that John Crow be relieved of his duty as Deputy Commissioner.
3. We demand that Harrison Loesch be relieved of his duty as Assistant Secretary.
4. We demand that Louis Bruce be given back his authority as Commissioner until such executive and legislative actions are implemented on our twenty point solutions papers.
5. We demand proper housing and facilities during our stay in D.C.
6. We demand that commitments made to Indian people over the Johnson-O'Malley Issue in Oklahoma be honored and be written to the people.
7. We demand that urban and landless Indians be given proper services entitled to them same as treaty Indians (medical, etc.).
8. We demand that all bones and artifacts of our ancestors be restored to our people for reburial.
9. We demand that Bob Robertson be relieved of his duty as Director of National Council on Indian Opportunity and be replaced by an Indian.
