DETAILS

By communication dated July 27, 1976, the Kansas City Office of the FBI advised as follows:

Continuous contact has been maintained with the Butler, Missouri, Police Department and the Missouri State

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Highway Patrol, Butler, Missouri, and periodic surveillance of [redacted] residence has been negative.

On July 20, 1976, [redacted] [redacted] Sunset Drive, Butler, Missouri, was interviewed and furnished the following information:

[redacted] advised she is aware that [redacted] [redacted] and was wanted by law enforcement authorities. She advised she has not seen nor heard from [redacted] since [redacted] and had no idea where he was but speculated that he was somewhere in South Dakota.

[redacted] advised that on the Fourth of July weekend that [redacted] brother, [redacted] also known as [redacted] wife, [redacted] her sister, [redacted] and [redacted] came to Butler from Wagner, South Dakota, to spend Fourth of July weekend with them. [redacted] stated that they drove to Butler in a Dodge Coronet and that [redacted] was not with them.

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According to [redacted] the family discussed [redacted] over the Fourth of July weekend but no one talked like they knew where he was. [redacted] stated that she and [redacted] who resides in Appleton City, Missouri, are close to [redacted] but doubted [redacted] would come see either of them because he would be afraid of causing problems for the [redacted] in the event of an arrest by law enforcement authorities.

[redacted] advised that [redacted] would probably not cooperate with the FBI and [redacted] stated that she would not turn [redacted] in but would try to talk him into turning himself in if she were to get in contact with him. Kansas City is conducting no further investigation at this time, however, will be alert to the possibility of subject's appearance in either Butler or Appleton City and will maintain contact with law enforcement officers in these cities.

On July 31, 1976, RUBEN HUBER, Sheriff, Charles Mix County, Lake Andes, South Dakota, telephonically contacted Special Agent (SA) WALTER P. J. QUIGLEY and advised that on the previous evening his office had received positive information that subject was in the vicinity of Lake Andes Housing and that he was traveling in one of two vehicles, a brown two tone (brown vinyl over

brown) 1970 Plymouth, South Dakota License [redacted] damaged on the right rear door rear end shackled up, which belonged to one of the [redacted] with whom [redacted] has stayed previously. The second vehicle was described as a late model black Ford van with orange mural type painting on the sides and three rectangular windows in the rear which bore North Dakota License [redacted]

Sheriff HUBER responded with his Deputy [redacted] and South Dakota Highway Patrolman [redacted]. They spotted the [redacted] Plymouth, it took off and they lost it following a chase. They determined the following day that [redacted] was in the car but that one of the [redacted] had let him out when they lost the pursuing police and [redacted] ran off into a corn field.

Sheriff HUBER continued that he has recently obtained a warrant on [redacted] a cousin of [redacted] and that on July 31, 1976, [redacted] who is trying to make the best deal he can with HUBER, told him that [redacted] was a participant in a burglary in Wagner about [redacted] (a State case) in which a [redacted] stolen. [redacted] further told him that at least [redacted] had been taken by [redacted] south of Wagner. As far as [redacted] knows, the [redacted] are still at [redacted] house.

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HUBER requested assistance since he indicated he believed [redacted] was still in the area, he had a list of autos of [redacted] friends with whom he has been known to be riding recently and his belief that the subject would be located in Indian housing at either Lake Andes or Wagner on the night of July 31, 1976, or early morning of August 1, 1976.

Spot checks and fisur of logical locations by Bureau Agents to locate subject were unsuccessful during late night of July 31, 1976, and early morning of August 1, 1976.

South Dakota Highway Patrolman [redacted] furnished the following list of autos in which he indicated the subject has been seen during the past two weeks or his sources speculate would be logical vehicles to look for him in:

Sheriff HUBER continued that [redacted] has
told him that he intends to actively attempt to locate
[redacted] and advise him and HUBER indicated he would continue
to keep SA QUIGLEY apprised of any positive information.

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By communication dated August 5, 1976, the
Kansas City Office of the FBI advised:

[redacted] husband of subject's [redacted]
[redacted] telephonically contacted SA [redacted]
July 27, 1976, from Appleton City, Missouri. [redacted]
stated he returned home after going to a movie and found
that all of his furniture, personal belongings of [redacted]
and his .22 caliber revolver were missing. He found a
note which stated [redacted] Go home. I am gone for good.
[redacted]

[redacted] advised that [redacted] had recently been
drinking and started talking about her brother, [redacted]
and during that occasion made some comment that she would
be willing to travel to a new city, sell all of her belongings
and assume a new identity if she could help the subject.

[redacted] was requested to keep SA [redacted] advised
if he found his wife or subject and to advise the Kansas City
Division of his whereabouts.

On July 29, 1976, contact with [redacted]
[redacted] employer, Appleton City, advised [redacted] departed
for either Iowa or South Dakota in an attempt to locate
his wife and had no idea if he would return or not.

[redacted] told SA [redacted] that he would probably kill the subject if he found him and determined that he caused his marriage to break up.

The following investigation was conducted in the vicinity of Lake Andes and Wagner, South Dakota, by SAs WALTER P. J. QUIGLEY and [redacted] on the dates indicated:

On August 26, 1976, September 10, and September 27, 1976, contacts with Sheriff RUBEN HUBER, Charles Mix County, Lake Andes, South Dakota, and Detective [redacted] [redacted] Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), Wagner, South Dakota, determined that [redacted] definitely remained in the Wagner area and was being hidden and supported by most of the local population. Both the Sheriff and Detective [redacted] advised they were in daily contact with their numerous contacts in the area and would continue attempts to locate him.

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On October 12, 1976, Detective [redacted] advised that he had received an anonymous call from an individual who advised that [redacted] was running with [redacted] an individual being sought on state charges, and that the two were staying on the [redacted] place south of Dante, South Dakota, and if not located there he could most probably be found at either [redacted] near Wagner or his father's, [redacted] near Greenwood, South Dakota.

On October 12, 1976, Bureau Agents assisted by BIA personnel and Charles Mix County Sheriff's Deputies, conducted extensive surveillances and searches of the aforementioned locations. The subject was not located, however, it was apparent that individuals probably identical to [redacted] and [redacted] had been sleeping in abandoned wrecked cars on the [redacted] place. Observations at [redacted] residence determined the presence therein of baby clothes and stereo tapes of the rock and roll variety and it was thereupon noted by Detective [redacted] that he had learned that [redacted] had been living with one of the [redacted] of Wagner and had a baby by her. From the available information and observations, it was speculated that [redacted] had, in fact, been staying at [redacted] and his father's during the period immediately preceding October 12, 1976.

Contacts have been maintained with Sheriff HUBER and Detective [redacted] the most recent being on November 19, 1976. Both continue to advise that [redacted] is definitely in the Wagner - Marty - Lake Andes area of South Dakota as they continue to receive reports to that effect.

A subject who was in the kitchen was notified by FBI that he was wanted for questioning, and was asked if anyone else was in the house or upstairs. He said "no, just his dog".

I started to go upstairs as did [redacted] and [redacted] called out to us that he learned there were some men upstairs.

[redacted] AND I entered a west bathroom and observed three male Indians lying in bed. We identified ourselves and ordered all three to stand up and put their hands behind their head, which they did. All three were removed to main floor.

I observed a weapon which appeared to be a rifle laying along side of one of the beds, and a revolver and holster sticking out from between the mattress and box spring. These weapons were removed, and check disclosed both were loaded. The rifle was M-1 30 caliber and the revolver a five shot 38 caliber. These weapons were then unloaded.

All four male subjects were removed to the station and booked for the FBI.

A personal check of each subject's pants pockets revealed several rounds of 38 caliber, 39 caliber and 22 caliber ammunition.
