ACCORDING TO A CONFIDENTIAL SOURCE, WHO HAS GIVEN RELIABLE INFORMATION IN THE PAST, SUBJECTS BANKS AND MEANS, TWO OF THE MAJOR LEADERS OF AMERICAN INDIAN MOVEMENT (AIM) AT WOUNDED KNEE, HAVE DEPARTED PINE RIDGE RESERVATION, SOUTH DAKOTA, VIA HORSEBACK EN ROUTE TO ROSEBUD RESERVATION AND THEN REPORTEDLY PLAN TO GO TO CUBA. SUBJECTS ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE DEPARTED WOUNDED KNEE 3-26-73, IN POSSESSION OF APPROXIMATELY \$6,000 OBTAINED EARLIER IN A POST OFFICE BURGLARY. IN VIEW OF THE INFORMATION THAT SUBJECTS ARE BELIEVED TO BE HEADING FOR CUBA, ALTHOUGH THERE IS NO INFORMATION AVAILABLE INDICATING THEY PLAN TO HIJACK AN AIRCRAFT, THIS IS A DISTINCT POSSIBILITY. Source advised that at approximately 12:10 p.m., a person identified as RUSSELL MEANS, Leader of the American Indian Movement, addressed a press conference held at 600 South New Hampshire Avenue, Los Angeles, an address which houses the Indian Center, Incorporated.

According to source, MEANS initiated the press conference by stating that the United States Government had once again showed its stupidity and made him a martyr by revoking his bail, according to MEANS on a technicality.

According to source, when asked by a woman in the audience why he decided not to return to South Dakota for the hearing, MEANS stated he did not decide against it, but the airlines decided against it as they were booked up.

According to source, when asked the question would you give yourself up or would they have to come and get you, MEANS replied that the United States Government has seen fit to spend \$57,000 per day at Wounded Knee in an effort to starve out Indians and he hoped they could spend that much per day looking for him.

According to source, when asked if he thought he would be arrested when he left the Indian Center, MEANS replied "If they've got good fighters, I'll be arrested".

Source indicated that MEANS was asked whether he felt Federal Agents knew where he was at the moment. To this MEANS replied, "I believe they are surrounding the building right now, in fact, I can tell that they are, but I'm telling you, they're going to have to take me to jail either unconscious or dead.

Source advised that shortly thereafter, MEANS exited the Indian Center.

MEANS failed to appear and Judge BOGUE, upon completion of the hearing, revoked MEANS' bond and directed a bench warrant be issued. Bench warrant issued April 27, 1973 by Clerk, U. S. District Court, Rapid City, South Dakota, charging MEANS with failure to comply with conditions of bond of 4/16/73 and failure to appear, no code, title, or section set forth. Judge BOGUE ordered MEANS be arrested and returned to South Dakota. Judge BOGUE further indicated hearing date for MEANS would be set upon his return to South Dakota.

Following his arrest, RUSSELL MEANS was placed in the custody of the U. S. Marshal, Los Angeles, California.

He said the government had "always considered the option of using force to settle the siege a viable one." In another development, American Indian Movement leader Russell Means was returned from Los Angeles to jail in Sioux Falls, S.D., after his bond was revoked.

Means cites first casualty as hero

AIM spokesman hits government

"The first real hero of Wounded Knee is Frank Clearwater, a dead Indian," Russel Means, spokesman for the American Indian Movement (AIM), told a crowd of 300 people yesterday on Janss Steps.

Means' comments came on the heels of the first death as a result of wounds received during the now 58-day-old takeover of the hamlet of Wounded Knee, S.D. Clearwater, 47, a resident of the near-by Pine Ridge Indian Reservation, died Tuesday from a head wound received in a gun battle with federal and state authorities last week.

Means appeared as part of a day-long teach-in sponsored by the Community Services Commission of the Student Legislative Council. Just before delivering his scheduled speech, Means learned that his \$50,000 bail bond had been revoked by a federal district court in Rapid City, S.D. Facing an indictment stemming from the Wounded Knee seizure, Means told the audience he must surrender himself to federal officers within 24 hours. "I'm sure that when I go back to the airport tonight, I'm going to be busted," he said.

Hardships

The nationally renowned Indian militant recounted the hardships

presently being endured by the 295 Native Americans presently inside Wounded Knee. "Do you know what it is to have to eat cornstarch in order to survive, or to slaughter a cow and by answered by 4,000 rounds of federal ammunition?" Means asked.

Means emerged three weeks ago from the tiny community in order to sign an agreement reached between the Indians and the federal government. AIM leaders, however, have charged that the government tricked the leaders into signing an agreement in order to serve indictments. "I came out of Wounded Knee on a trick," Means said. "I have to go around begging for humanity on behalf of my brothers and sisters, so thank you for listening," he said.

"You don't really even give a shit that the President of the United States is acting on his own, that the Congress of the United States has been thrown out the window and the Constitution has no meaning for Indians," he said.

Abrogation

Much of the issue as professed by those Indians inside Wounded Knee surrounds the abrogation of the 1868 Fort Laramie Treaty which guaranteed to the northern tribes the right to maintain their traditional tribal government.

"If the United States of America refuses to live up to its treaty, its sovereign treaty commitments, then there is no use for every

person of color in these United States to live," Means said.

Means also charged that the federal courts have refused to review the many suits brought to them by Indians concerning the 317 treaties signed by the government and the various tribes. "We are in Wounded Knee because your government does not live up to its sacred agreements with the Indians. We are going to hold you to those treaties.

"I now face a total of 85 years in prison because of Wounded Knee.

If you don't take us seriously and live up to your Constitution, this is one man who isn't going to jail for 85 years," he said.

"Wounded Knee may not mean anything to you or your children, but is going to mean a lot to your unborn. That is why we are there — for our unborn," Means said.

"So take your U.S. President and your Department of the Interior and your Bureau of Indian Affairs and dump them in Lake Erie where they belong. Just leave us alone according to our treaty."

AIM is a militant American Indian organization.

Source two advised that Russell Means was scheduled to speak at 12:00 noon on April 26, 1973, on the campus of the University of California at Los Angeles, (UCLA).

Source three advised that Russell Means was to arrive Los Angeles, California, at Los Angeles International Airport, Continental Airlines Flight 191, from Tulsa, Oklahoma, at 9:18 p.m., on April 25, 1973.

RUSSELL CHARLES MEANS

On April 25, 1973, Special Agents of the FBI observed Russell Charles Means deplane Continental Airlines Flight 191, 9:20 p.m., at Los Angeles International Airport. Means was met by [redacted] [redacted] Los Angeles AIM activist, and subsequently departed Los Angeles International Airport at 9:40 p.m., in a 1972 Volkswagen with California license number [redacted]

A check with the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) reveals California license [redacted] to be registered to [redacted] at [redacted] Avenue, Los Angeles.

At 10:20 p.m., April 25, 1973, the 1972 Volkswagen, registered to [redacted] was observed at [redacted] [redacted] Avenue, Los Angeles.

Source four advised Means spent the evening at the [redacted] residence.

Source five advised that on April 26, 1973, Russell Means spoke at the Janss Steps, on the UCLA campus before approximately 200 to 250 students. Source provided a recording of the speech, a transcription of which follows:

UCLA

RUSSEL MEANS: I'm nobody to admire because I'm not inside Wounded Knee and everyone of you people that are, are not inside Wounded Knee are nobody to admire either. The one you should be admiring is FRANK, FRANK CLEARWATER. You know he's the uh the, as the headlines say, he's the first death at Wounded Knee, and then we start with the body count again. Who in the hell cares about body counts anymore? And to boot, and on the other side of the coin, it's just Indians, once again at Wounded Knee, and I know each and everyone of you and your descendants 80 years from now will read another book and feel guilty and ashamed, a book written by D. BROWN III. Bury my heart again at Wounded Knee. You know I, I came out of Wounded Knee on a trick. We signed another treaty April 5th and everybody ignored it, they just yawned because we couldn't meet with the White House. In the meantime, while we couldn't meet with the White House, a man by the name of FRANK CLEARWATER gets killed and everybody yawns again. And I have to go around begging, I have to go around begging for humanity. I have to go to Oklahoma City, Tulsa Oklahoma; I have to go to New York City, Washington, D. C. Cleveland, Ohio, and now UCLA. You know thank you for listening, thank you for knowing what it is to be inside Wounded Knee. You know, and we got some brothers and sisters here that have been inside Wounded Knee. They know what it is to eat starch.

They know what it is to go hungry. They know what it is the only radios we listen to are the white man's radios of South Dakota, and the white man's one TV station of South Dakota. We know what it means to try to kill a cow and receive 4,000 rounds from the Federal forces. We know what it means to hide in the church of God and have .30 caliber bullets go through the wall and ricochet around and land by our children. We know what it is to be in a Denby bunker and receives a thousand rounds of .30 and .50 caliber anti-aircraft weapon fire and uh see 8 by 8, 8 by 8 timbers made into toothpicks. We know what it is, you're nothing but bad news. We know what it is for the run across the street in fear of our lives. A nice sunny day. Beautiful. You can take your time to listen to the contemporary militant. Meanwhile, you and I are not inside Wounded Knee, where last night they backpacked 16, on their backs, 100 pounds of coffee, 20 packs of cigarettes, 100 pounds of potatoes, and sundry other items to the 296 people trapped inside Wounded Knee. And you don't even give a shit. That the President of the United States is acting illegally, that the Constitution of the United States has been thrown out the window, all you're worried about is where you're going this summer. All you're worried about, you know, taking pictures of the local militant. And I'm not even

a militant because I'm not inside Wounded Knee. They don't let the press in there, they don't let food and medicine in there, there's been a death, an Indian death. And the Constitution, your Constitution, not mine, I'm uh, I'm there at my tru--with my treaty rights. A piece of paper that says that, my treaty says that it is on par and equal to the Constitution of the United States of America, the law of the land. And if this time, if this time the United States of America refuses to live up to its treaty commitments, its sovereign treaty commitments, then there is no use for every person of color in this United States of America to live. Cause we haven't. we've got our land base. We've got our sovereignty as defined by the Supreme Court of the United States. We have a treaty, as good as your Constitution. And yet they surround us yomigos (phonetic). And your Federal Courts ignore and put off and postpone and continue our law suit citing case after case after case that it takes a proclamation from the United States of America to military surround any people. The last one to do it, the last two Presidents to do this, was Presidents KENNEDY and JOHNSON when they surrounded Blackfeet.-- But they issued a proclamation. Now I'm an Indian. And they haven't got the decency, even though we have a treaty, to issue a proclamation. They didn't do it, man. Now I'm not going to run through the, the atrocities and the

tyranny Indian people run through, and I'm not going to run through any goddamn statistics, because I know you already know about the 371 treaties. Your educational system has taught you that. I know this. I went through the same educational system. I know that the 371 treaties that I learned about came from your educational institutions. I also know that you do not violate the sacred laws of a democracy. You do not violate law and order. All I can relate to you; I don't want to compare nothing, you know I've got so much to say and so little time to say it in, that that in itself is an atrocity. I've got 25,000 years to explain to you in this hemisphere, I am the only one that I can say I am the evidence of the Western Hemisphere. And no one gives a damn about FRANK CLEARWATER. He's only a body count in the Herald-Examiner headlines--first death at Wounded Knee. You know a few of us came out. A few of us came out from Wounded Knee, facing 85, 85 years in the Federal Penitentiary. And tomorrow, you know, they're revoking my bond of \$50, 000, they're revoking it tomorrow morning at 9:00 o'clock this time; and so I go to prison. So what, another Indian. And I go to prison for 85 years. And your President is--you know--I know you can cite intellectually and academically all the times he violates the Constitution of the United States, but if you don't know what's going on at Wounded Knee,

then you don't know that it's going to happen here. Maybe not to you, maybe not to your children, but to your unborn. And that's the key. And that's why we are in Wounded Knee-- is for our unborn. You know those of you that are Vietnam veterans, you already know what fire fights are all about. Yeah, I don't know. I was never over in Vietnam. But I know what a fire fight's all about. I know about trip flares, sneaking through the lines, studying ambushes. It's only 296 Indian people, who cares? And you have to degrade me by making me stand up here. You know, I saw some more people just now that were inside Wounded Knee. And they know, you know what, what we're trying to say at Wounded Knee is what the American Indian has been trying to tell all it's life--that you don't live up to your own laws. And that, that this country cannot, in this point of time and history, live up to it's own sacred laws, then it can never relate to the rest of the world and you're really living in a vacuum. And there's no way really, personally, that I can relate to you what tyranny is all about. I mean complete, total tyranny. Whereas a male, you have no, no way to express your manner. It's completely emasculated from you. x And I can, you know, they've spent how many years in Vietnam? Indians are only what? A total of four tenths of one per cent of the total population anyway, who cares about the Indian? We care about Sitting Bull and Crazy Horse. We

care about Geronimo and Tecumseh. But the Indians today, they've got nothing to say. The Government takes care of them on the reservation remember. You know, in the minute way at Wounded Knee we're only 296 Indian people are involved. It's a, a complete, a complete parallel in the short 8 weeks that they've been there to the 15 years they were in Vietnam or whatever how many years. They escalate, de-escalate, escalate, de-escalate. Pour in more troopers, withdraw. They still haven't learned a goddamn thing. So the war's over. For you people. Thank God. Thank God that the U. S.-News and World Report can say 'now we have to go to work in the communities'. The peace movement has to go to work in the communities. And those communities don't even want you. Just want to be left alone. You know, take your goddamn tax money, and your Bureau of Indian Affairs and your Department of Interior and your White House, take it and do it, you know, put it in Lake Erie where it belongs. And leave us alone, according to our treaty. Because we hold that document sacred. And people and you know, I really never understood what an idealist is. Some, I came outside of Wounded Knee and someone called me an idealist. I had completely dif--different conceptions. Uh I didn't know idealists in their id--in setting forth their ideals went under fire and really, that's the way I believe.

They said an idealist is a mouse. And then the academic world, you know I just, I, I don't want to go through that whole scene. I just went through it at Oklahoma State University. And I know what our Chicano brothers are doing, the Chicano brothers I know. The ones that's been inside Wounded Knee and their friends. And I know our Black brothers, what they're going to do, who are few and far between, but a few of them I know. And I know what they're going to do. Because when Wounded Knee goes, you go. You might enjoy the next few summers, your children might enjoy the summers after that, but your unborn are going to have one hell of a time. And if we lose at Wounded Knee, I ain't spending no 85 years in prison, believe me. And whose ever the man out there that's following me around, I got to put a 48-hour written itinerary to the Federal courts of this country on every place I'm going to be and the contacts of where I can be reached. 48 hours in advance in written form. Just because I happen to be standing up to the Constitution of the United States. I'm not trying to militarily overthrow. And don't, don't misunderstand me when I say "I". When I say "I", I mean the total American Indian. And those sellouts, that claim to have Indian blood running through them, they're very fortunate because it was my grandfathers that raped their mothers. And Indian people have been protesting since you all came here. We did it militarily, we taught the world

about guerrilla warfare, and that we did it passively. We went to the alcohol, to the suicide, to the dropout, and now we're back doing it again. In this century, in 1973, after a decade of violent protests by blacks in the peace movement and whatever, we decided to take up the gun that the white man gave us. Inside Wounded Knee we have veterans from World War I, World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam War...are they enough that our most reliable scouts and recon people and hidden through the lines are our World War II and World War I vets. But it's only 296 people so you can walk away. You know, and that's exactly what I'm going to do right now.

RUSSELL CHARLES MEANS

Source four advised on April 25, 1973, that Russell Means was scheduled to hold a press conference at the Indian Center, 600 South New Hampshire, at 11:00 a.m., on April 27, 1973, in an attempt to make himself out a martyr.

At 10:00 a.m., April 26, 1973, a bond revocation hearing for Russell Means was held in U. S. District Court, Deadwood, South Dakota, with Andrew W. Bogue, U. S. District Judge presiding. Ramon Roubideaux, AIM Attorney, was present on behalf of Russell Means, but Means was not present. Roubideaux claimed he had been unable to contact Means to advise him he was to be in Court this date. Judge Bogue continued the hearing until 10:00 a.m., April 27, 1973, and advised Roubideaux to contact Means to advise him to be present.

On April 27, 1973, source four advised that Russell Means had spent the evening of April 26, 1973, at the residence of famed movie actor, Marlon Brando, Mulholland Drive, Beverly Hills, California.

On April 27, 1973, a bond revocation rehearing was held for Russell Charles Means, U. S. District Court, Deadwood, South Dakota, with Andrew W. Bogue, U. S. District Judge presiding. Again Means failed to appear and Judge Bogue, upon completion of the hearing, revoked Means' bond and directed a bench warrant be issued. A bench warrant was issued April 27, 1973, by the Clerk, U. S. District Court, Rapid City, South Dakota, charging Means with failure to comply with conditions of bond, April 16, 1973, and failure to appear, no code, title, or section set forth. Judge Bogue ordered Means to be arrested and returned to South Dakota. Judge Bogue further indicated a hearing date for Means would be set upon his return to South Dakota.

Source five advised on April 27, 1973, that Russell Means appeared at the Indian Center, 600 South New Hampshire Avenue, Los Angeles, California, for a press conference at approximately 12:15 p.m. Source provided a tape recording of this press conference, a transcription of which follows:

AIM

RUSSEL

MEANS: I'd like to start the Press as soon as possible as time is of the essence. Ah, this morning the United States Government once again showed its stupidity and is playing into our hands and has made, unfortunately, myself a martyr and they have said that they have revoked, revoked my bail on a piece of paper, a technicality, revoked my bail because my bondsman forgot to sign one of the pieces of paper that you are supposed to sign. And this is the honest to God truth. It just goes to show once again that Wounded Knee is all that they want. It's either put us in prison or kill us. Alright, they've already killed us, now they're putting us in prison.

Woman

in Audience: Why did you decide not to return to South Dakota for the hearing and things?

MEANS: I didn't decide against it. The airlines decided against my presence there. They were booked up. I can't even get into South Dakota today.

Man in

Audience: What do you expect to happen.....

MEANS: That was not the reason why they revoked my bond. They revoked my bond on a technicality. My bondsman actually forgot to sign a piece of paper.

Man and woman
speaking together in audience (Inaudible and cannot be understood)

MEANS: I expect to be arrested and placed in prison.

Woman: Is that what you want to happen?

MEANS: No.

Man: Would you give yourself up or would they have to come and get you?

MEANS: Sir, the United States Government has seen fit to spend \$57,000 per day at Wounded Knee in an effort to starve out Indians, I hope they can spend that much per day looking for me.

Man: While you were in Los Angeles did you talk to MARLON BRANDO?

MEANS: Yes, last night.

Man: Ah what did you talk about?

MEANS: Ah, its not for publication.

Man: Ah he, he has not come forward to the press to make any statement at all uh about uh the, the Oscar uh situation uh did he tell you anything about that at all?

MEANS: Ah, he's really, he's supporting us at Wounded Knee and that's all I can say about that situation.

Man: Is it true that he offered to uh charter a plane to let you go back to South Dakota?

MEANS: No.

Man: Where, where does that report originate then?

MEANS: I don't know.

Man: Did he indicate if he will give you personal support in the event you are arrested and require additional uh bail or whatever the proceedings will mean for you.

MEANS: I imagine he will.

Man: We've heard that you've been followed uh all the times that you left Wounded Knee. Were you followed here, do you think you'll be arrested when you leave?

MEANS: Uh, if they've got good fighters I'll be arrested. Uh I have to, see I have to file a 48 uh hour itinerary, I mean, an itinerary 40 hours in advance of wherever I'm going to be.

Woman: Did you file an itinerary to come to California?

MEANS: Oh yes, I filed an itinerary to be in Tulsa, Oklahoma wherever else I've been. And I'm due back in South Dakota today. And that's the itinerary, and the Federal Government know that. Like I say, they, they get it on a technicality. My bondsman, STAN ADELSTEIN (phonetic), who is a Jewish businessman in Rapid City, forgot to sign one of the piece of paper and consequently that's what they, they're going to bust me on.

Man: Well you said yesterday that the reason that they were arresting you is because of statements you've made to the press.

MEANS: Oh now that's really wild.

Man: Now say, in other words they're using that technicality to retaliate against you for your _____.

MEANS: They're uh effectively trying to uh imprison us or kill us (man tries to cut in) on technicalities.

Man: The airlines didn't have space, when did you try to book your flight?

MEANS: Uh day before yesterday.

Man: Mr. MEANS, some of the Oglala, Mr. MEANS, some of the Oglala Sioux have joined forces with the FBI and the U. S. Marshal surrounding Wounded Knee, what are your feelings about that?

MEANS: You notice this Government, even before the conception of the United States Government, has always effectively used the one or two or three sellouts _____ and the divide and conquer concept, you know, to their benefit. The United States Government has control of the press, and control of certain Indian people. I do not call half-breed mercenaries Indian people.

Man: Will you make an effort to try and get back to Wounded Knee or uh in the time that uh...

MEANS: I am going to make every effort I can to get back to the freedom of Wounded Knee.

Man: ... If you do not get back to Wounded Knee, what do you want the other Indians to do there? At Wounded Knee?

Do you want them to maintain their occupation?

MEANS: I would like, it is no longer in our occupation. I would like to see them expand the borders of the independent Ogala nation.

Man: Right on.

Man: And if this means a a major confrontation?

MEANS: It means, of course and we've always known that, death to the American Indian and any person of color. When we get off (at Wounded Knee, everybody gets off. We don't understand that, the press doesn't understand that.

Man: You will fight to the end, you say.

MEANS: _____, we bet our lives that we could create change for the American Indian.

Man: Mr. MEANS, uh would you summarize for us what you think is the state and the situation at Wounded Knee right now.

MEANS: Because of my arrest, the state and the situation at Wounded Knee cannot be, cannot resolve in a peaceful manner, and I'm, I feel very sad because the United States Government sees fit to imprison us rather than negotiate with us over our treaty rights and that's, that's the whole issue now, and I do know that Wounded Knee will not be peacefully resolved from this time forward, as soon as I step behind those bars.

Woman: You're seeking an independent nation for the _____

Oglala Sioux?

MEANS: Hey, you don't understand man. We have always been independent..nation, except the white man has refused to recognize his treaty with us.

Man: Mr. MEANS, you say the aim of the United States Government is to arrest, imprison, or kill, and you used the words kill you. You fear for your life if you're arrested?

MEANS: Sir, I have fear...feared for my life ever since I left Wounded Knee. Inside Wounded Knee all I had to worry about was dodging bullets that I knew were coming at me. Here, you have to dodge...fanatics.

Woman: Why did you leave Wounded Knee?

MEANS: By trickery of the Government. The April 5,th agreement, the last treaty signed between the United States and the Indian people.

Woman: Mr. MEANS, why did you leave Wounded Knee this time to come to California, if you understood.....

MEANS: I left Wounded Knee to go to Washington, D. C. to negotiate with the White House. The White House, after signing the agreement and saying we would meet, refused to meet. So I went back to South Dakota, they arrested me again, placed more restrictions on me, and that, and the result of those restrictions has, and the failure of my bondsman to sign a piece of paper, has put me in a position

to, to be arrested.

Woman: You didn't know of anything that you would be in that position once you arrived here?

MEANS: When I left Wounded Knee, it was agreed upon by the Federal Government that those of us, it was a _____ of us, our spiritual leader and our chief, that all three of us would be safely returned to Wounded Knee and a standing down of arms would take place.

Man: Mr. MEANS, uh since uh, since the holding of this news conference was granted wide publicity with the sayings _____ beginning yesterday, do you think its likely that the Federal Agents who know where you are right this....

MEANS: I believe they're surrounding the building right now, in fact I've been told that they are, but I'm telling ya, they're gonna have to take me to jail either unconscious or dead.

Man: Uh Mr. MEANS, what uh _____ this news conference?

MEANS: Pardon?

Man: Daily subcommittee of Indian Affairs?

MEANS: Hayes subcommittee on Indian Affairs?

Man: Daily's.

MEANS: I dont understand...

Man: Daily's subcommittee on Indian Affairs which will before Washington.....

MEANS: Oh that's hey _____.

Man: Congressman Haily. Chairman of the House Committee on Indian Affairs....

MEANS: He, the the subcommittee, the House Subcommittee on Indian Affairs epitomizes the Custer mentality facing Indian people in the Federal Government.

Man: Uh, Mr. MEANS, you supposedly left uh Sepulveda National at quarter to eleven. You get here at a quarter to 12, an hour and a half. Was that because you were involved in some uh uh tactics to try and prevent being arrested?

MEANS: Uh yeah, before I reached here.

Man: Before you reached here. You were followed while you were on your way here?

MEANS: I've been followed since I've been out of Wounded Knee, see.

Woman: How will you fight _____ than be arrested?

MEANS: Pardon?

Woman: How will you fight rather than be arrested?

MEANS: I went into Wounded Knee for the basic human rights for all Indian people. And when they try to im---imprison me over uh a piece of paper, they're going to have to put me down.

Woman: Couldn't a technicality like that be worked out in the courts...?

MEANS: It was the court that put that technicality on there.

Woman: (Unintelligible)

MEANS: Pardon?

Woman: What can we do to help in the Wounded Knee conflict?

MEANS: I would ask that everybody that can physically get to South Dakota, is to realize that there's body counts going on now and that we can help Box 147, Rapid City South Dakota...yeah yeah yea. Okay, well I'm sorry, I think I'm gonna attempt to get out of here.

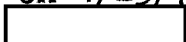

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At approximately 9:45 AM ASAC ENLOW of the Minneapolis Division, calling from the WX the Rapid City Resident Agency advised that the new clipping which was quoted in a Los Angeles teletype to the Bureau and Minneapolis on either 4/26/73 or 4/27/73 in which MEANS made a statement at a news conference in Los Angeles that he was not going to appear at a hearing in federal district court, Rapid City, South Dakota which resulted in his bond being revoked. ASAC ENLOW advised that the actual clipping was needed at a probable cause hearing scheduled for MEANS on 5/29/73.

A review of above captioned file reflects that a teletype was sent to ~~xxx~~ the Bureau and Minneapolis by Los Angeles on 4/27/73 (serial 11) relating a press release made by MEANS at American Indian Movement Office, Los Angeles, California on 4/27/73; However, there is no indication in the file that his press release was carried in any Los Angeles news papers.

Located in above captioned file was a press release (serial 19) carried in the UCLA "Daily Bruin", Los Angeles, Calif. on 4/27/73 in which reference was made by MEANS to his bond revocation in a speech to a crowd of 200 to 250 on 4/26/73 at Jans Steps Free Speech Area on the UCLA Campus. This was reported to Minneapolis in a teletype dated 4/26/73 to the Bureau and Minneapolis from Los Angeles file 70-7253 (serial 120) entitled WOUNDED KNEE.

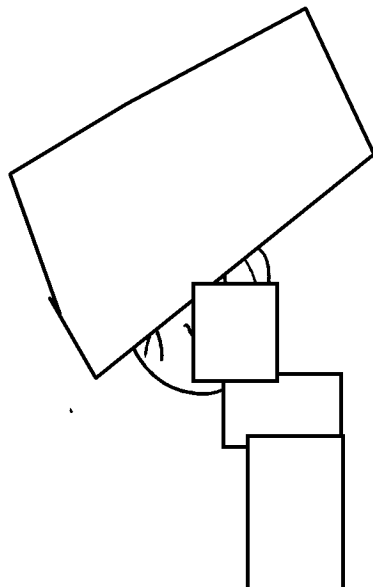

The American Indian Movement leader, RUSSELL MEANS, escaped from the village of Wounded Knee creating a split among those still inside.

Earlier, Sen. James Abourezk said he had been informed that a settlement had been reached in Wounded Knee, and that the American Indian Movement was no longer in leadership position.

Memo to ADIC Los Angeles, from Supervisor [redacted] dated 3/29/73, and captioned as follows:

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"WOUNDED KNEE"

"At 2:20 PM, 3/29/73, Bureau Supervisor John Swartz, Division 6, telephonically advised that he wanted to alert the Los Angeles Division to a situation at Wounded Knee.

Swartz said that Los Angeles television station KTTV [redacted] appeared at the roadblock at 1:00 AM, 3/28/73, and claimed that he had been held as a hostage by the insurrectionists for three days. [redacted] related the following events which Swartz wanted Los Angeles to know about:

(1) Dennis Banks and RUSSELL MEANS both returned to Wounded Knee 3/26/73 after an absence of approximately two days.

(2) At 11:00 PM, 3/27/73, MEANS and Banks confronted Pedro Bersonette regarding the situation there. MEANS and Banks contended that Bersonette's group had no right to negotiate the situation. A heated argument ensued and guns were drawn. After continued discussions, however, the dispute was apparently resolved."

Announcement of SPEAKERS AVAILABLE through the "MOVEMENT SPEAKERS," 917 15th Street N.W., Washington, D. C., which came to the University of Southern California in unmarked envelope.

This announcement sets out the names of speakers available through Movement Speakers, November 15th through January 15th.

On page 6, information concerning Speaker RUSSELL MEANS is set out as follows:

"National Coordinator for the American Indian Movement; organizing Indians throughout the country for the express purpose of self determination - to enable them to gain control over their own affairs; an Oglala Sioux; activist representative of Indians and their problems to national and local government officials."

On 12/8/72, [redacted], also known as [redacted] [redacted] Public Relations, Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), Los Angeles, California, provided the names of AIM national leaders and their residences. Among those names given was that of RUSSELL MEANS, Cleveland, Ohio.

"Review of Cleveland indices revealed that RUSSELL CHARLES MEANS, date of birth November 10, 1939, place of birth South Dakota, was arrested on March 24, 1970, by the Cleveland, Ohio, Police Department, along with three other Indians, on a trespassing charge. MEANS and his associates sat-in at the Cleveland, Ohio, Bureau of Indian Affairs Office, and declined to leave when requested by the police department. The Indians, representing

the Cleveland American Indian Movement, were involved in a demonstration in front of the Federal Office Building, carrying signs and passing out leaflets entitled "Grievances and Challenges of American Indians Across the Nation." MEANS was the spokesman for this group. Indices check also revealed that MEANS, a Sioux, was employed as Director of the Cleveland American Indian Center, 2600 Church Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio. MEANS' residence in 1970 was listed as 20255 Lorain Road, Cleveland, Ohio.

Indices check also revealed that MEANS had been interviewed by the Cleveland "Plain Dealer" newspaper on November 10, 1972. MEANS had just returned from Washington, D.C., where he and about 1,000 other Indians seized the Bureau of Indian Affairs. MEANS was quoted, "The frustration and suppression of Indian life has reached a point where we must react. We've been likened to the blacks, but we watched them during the 60's and we noted their mistakes. The Indian is not going to make the same mistakes. He's not going to destroy his community." Asked what form any action would take, MEANS replied, "The next move will come in 1976. It's the nation's birthday. If something isn't done for us by then, it will be an unhappy birthday.

Indices check revealed a photograph of MEANS had been published by the Cleveland "Plain Dealer" newspaper on November 16, 1972. The caption, entitled "Departure Sign", read, "RUSSELL MEANS, an American Indian Movement leader who formerly lived in Cleveland, signals the departure of an Indian caravan from St. Paul, Minnesota." This Caravan was on its way to Washington, D.C.

On January 3, 1973, a review of Cleveland, Ohio, Police Department records showed that RUSSELL CHARLES MEANS, date of birth November 10, 1939, place of birth Rosebud, South Dakota, height 6'1", weight 180 lbs., black hair, brown eyes, Social Security Account Number 569-54-5963, was cited for two traffic violations, and arrested on a trespassing charge.

On January 4, 1973, Detective Sergeant [redacted] Cleveland, Ohio, Police Department, Headquarters Intelligence Unit, advised that MEANS had been very active in affairs concerning Indians while he resided in Cleveland, Ohio, from July 22, 1963, until he departed Cleveland in 1971. [redacted] described MEANS as a militant individual who tried to stir up the local Indian population but left for more "fertile pastures" when he could not gain their support. [redacted] added that MEANS had at one time instituted a lawsuit against the Cleveland Indians baseball team in which he claimed the symbol was degrading, demeaning and racist. [redacted] also said that MEANS was the leader of the Cleveland AIM group until his departure in 1971.

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On January 10, 1973, Harold Whithorn, 12709 Arliss, Lakewood, Ohio, President of the Cleveland, Ohio, North American Indian Association, advised that he had heard that MEANS had been arrested around Thanksgiving, 1972, in either Pine Ridge or Rosebud, South Dakota, on a charge that he had threatened the lives of (FNU) [redacted] and family.

Someone said:

"Men who value freedom the most
Sometimes choose to give it up:"

This one statement summarizes best, the People of Wounded Knee, 1973.

The one time in my life that I felt truly free were those 38 days I spent as a citizen of the Independent Oglala Nation.

The treachery of the United States government continues in American Indian affairs unabated. The agreement of April 5, 1973 reached with the Department of Injustice epitomizes the true, treacherous policies of the United States of America in its dealings with sovereign people around the world. One has only to examine American Indian affairs throughout the history of the western hemisphere to explain the United States' dismal failures in its foreign policy maneuvers. Especially in the U.S. relationships with Third World Peoples. I could continue, on and on, with the subject, however, my intent is to write a tribute to the beautiful People of Wounded Knee, 1973.

With the Spirits of Big Foot and his People watching over those that came and went and those that chose to stay and with the power of the Sacred Pipe, only two, Laurence "Buddy" Lamont and Frank Clear Water were fortunate to find true freedom in the Land of "Crazy Horse and Sitting Bull and our Grandfathers." The rest of us are destined to teach our Brothers and Sisters and those yet unborn the beauty of following the ways of the Great Mystery and being a Redman and being Free!

It is difficult to put down on paper what is in one's heart. The Great Mystery moves in strange ways. While I sit here in solitude in the white man's prison I feel very strongly, the Spirit. It is a good and wonderful experience. It was the same in Wounded Knee when we danced the Ghost Dance again, when we prayed in the Sweet Lodge, when we smoked the Sacred Pipe, when we were in the Yuwipi Ceremony and when we were together.

The People of Wounded Knee, 1973, surrounded by the armed might of the United States of America and engaging that armament almost nightly and sometimes during the day, continued life as only the Redman can. There was always laughter and teasing and singing. Singing every nite, sometimes Redmen and Women from distant places and of different Nations sang their songs, including our Chicano brothers and our white friends.

To walk inside the 3 or 4 square miles of the Independent Oglala Nation was to walk in Freedom.

The Women inside Wounded Knee, 1973 were and are the strength. They knew, as every Red Woman should know, that the Redwoman carries

the future of the American Indian Nation which her. Always, I found them busy and concerned, not only with day to day happenings, but with the future and they were always willing to talk things out. Everyone realizes, or should realize, that without our Women, there would be no Chiefs.

The finest example of an American Indian is Sally. Sally is 70 some odd years old. Sally was there from the first night until the last day. She slept on the concrete floor of the basement of the church on the hill. She slept on wooden benches. She cooked and cleaned and washed. Sally never, not once, complained.

At this time I would like to give thanks.

Great Spirit, Grandfather, thank you for the sun for it gives us life.
Great Spirit, Grandfather, thank you for our Grandmother the Moon for she watches over our women and cleanses them every month.
Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the Universe for it is our Tabernacle.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for our Mother, Earth for she is the Mother of all things that are good and watches over her children.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the Four Quarters of the Universe for they bring us all things that are holy and sacred.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the East Wind, which is Red for it brings us the Morning Star and the new day to start anew.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the South Wind which is Yellow for it brings us the warmth to make things grow and gives life to the Sacred Tree and strengthens the Nation's Hoop.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the West Wind which is Black for it brings us the Thunder and Lightning to make us strong.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the North Wind which is White for it brings us the cleansing we need and the blanket to cover our Mother in winter.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the Four Sacred Colors; Red, Yellow, Black, White which represent the four races of man and when mixed together make the color Brown, the other race of man and the color of our Mother.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the Mountains which give us spiritual strength and direction.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the Water which also gives us strength to endure and helps to purify our bodies and our hearts.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the Rocks which give us medicine and help to purify our bodies and our hearts in the Sacred Sweat Lodge.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the Winged Things of the Air which help to give us direction and a role in life to play and especially the Eagle which can see the farthest and fly the highest and is faithful to its mate.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the Four-Leggeds which give us food, clothes, utensils and help to give us direction and a role in life and especially the Buffalo which is sacred and watches over us

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the Green Things which are sacred and give us food, shelter, medicine, direction and especially the sacred Tree of Life which represents the flower of Lakota life. Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the Things that Crawl and Swim for they too provide us with food, direction, and spiritual lessons.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for those that have gone before us and provided us with good examples of wisdom, generosity, love; strength, bravery and direction.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for our women for they are truly the strength of our Nation and carry the future of our generations.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the Sacred Pipe for it represents the truth and wisdom, our Mother Earth and the Great Spirit which is the breath of life.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for patience to endure and learn the mysteries of life.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, forgive my weakness for I know I am the weakest of all living things, for I am no more significant in the sacred cycle of life than to be a grain of sand in all the beaches of the world.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, forgive that all I have to offer the Mystery of the Spirit World and my People is my flesh and blood for I know anything less would insult Grandfather, Great Spirit and my People.

Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for the humble lessons of life for I know now, at this very moment, why I am in the white man's prison. It is a good and great lesson in the humbleness of life for tomorrow I will be released. This I know. Grandfather, Great Spirit, thank you for today!

What I say and do has been said and done before me. I am only a Mockingbird.

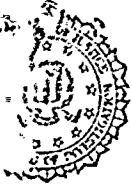

DENNIS BANKS indicated to [redacted] that he did not intend to return to South Dakota until such time as the necessary bail had been raised as he did not want to sit in "some rotten pokey" while bail was being raised. DENNIS BANKS according to [redacted] refused to give his location as he felt possibly [redacted] phone was bugged. [redacted] emphatically denied that DENNIS was in Los Angeles.

[redacted] advised that American Indian Movement (AIM) attorney, RAMON ROUBIDEAU, had warned DENNIS that if he failed to turn himself in by 10/4/73, he would forfeit the bond raised on previous charges. [redacted] indicated that of this bond money, in the neighborhood of \$110,000, the Methodist Church had furnished \$85,000 and a personal friend of DENNIS' had furnished the other \$25,000. [redacted] also indicated that another "church group", not further identified, had been approached for the bail money for DENNIS BANKS current bond and had tentatively agreed to furnish same.

[redacted] when queried as to the relationship of [redacted] to [redacted] stated that [redacted] who works in the same law office as [redacted] at 4419 Van Nuys Boulevard, Sherman Oaks, California, is DENNIS BANKS' attorney when in Los Angeles. He also indicated that [redacted] would not have any information concerning DENNIS' current location.

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When queried as to the role of GEORGE ROBERTS, Los Angeles AIM activist in the affairs of [redacted] [redacted] stated that ROBERTS is primarily a public relations expert and has not contributed, to his knowledge, to DENNIS' bail money.

[redacted] further offered that [redacted] who has always been somewhat trustworthy of white people, gets along fairly well with ROBERTS. He noted, however, that RUSSELL MEANS on the other hand, who distrusts all whites, does not confide in or trust ROBERTS.

[redacted] concluded stating that if DENNIS BANKS were to turn himself in at Los Angeles, he, [redacted] would notify the FBI prior to this happening.
