"Seventy per cent of our workers are married and have children and 70 per cent of these are married to their first wives," he said. "Our divorce rate is 29.9 per cent while nationally divorce averages 40 per cent."

Communism, he pointed out was an infinitesmal force in Hollywood.

"They ask us to fire people because of their political beliefs which happens to be against the law," REAGAN continued, "then when we did fire some communists, our own courts awarded two of them \$90,000 damages."

A testimonial rally was held on October 15, 1947, at the Shrine Auditorium in Los Angeles, California, in honor of the nineteen subpoensed who were leaving on the following day for Washington, D. C., to testify. Summaries of the testimony offered by the various witnesses appearing before the House Un-American Activities Committee hearings are set out in this report. Concerning the hearing it mentions Chairman Thomas remarked that he also wanted to say that the Committee was not holding the hearing s to smear the industry or the people in the industry, and further that the Committee has no intention to do anything or suggest that the Committee or the government censor the screen. Mr. Menjou (actor) went on to tell the Committee of the Screen Actors Guild meeting he had attended to discuss the strike in Hollywood. He said that RONALD REAGAN, president of the Guild at the time of the strike, described for more than an hour and a half his efforts to get the strik settled, and his final conclusion was that the strike was a jurisdictional one which Mr. Herbert Sorrell did not want to settle. REAGAN asked for freedom from censorship for the pix industry, asserting that he, as an individual, is willing to have his children see all pix turned out by the industry, and if some are bad, to counteract the evil by his personal, life and actions within his own home. "The freedom and dignity of the individual is at stake." he declared.

"REAGAN called upon the press, radio and other segments of the communications industries to come to the aid of the motion picture industry in its fight to keep free.

Defending Hollywood against its attackers, he declared the community has an extremely low crime rate; that 70% of the actors are still married to their first wives, and that the divorce rate is 29.9% as compared to the national rate of 40%. The admish scale on pix has gone up less than on any other commodity today. he stated.

THE STORY OF CONALD REAGAN—

Governor of Nation's Biggest State

Political powers in both parties, nationwide, are watching how Ronald Reagan tackles the job of governing California.

Victory over a two-term Democrat in his first try for public office is drawing wide attention to the former sportscaster, movie actor and television personality. What is Mr. Reagan's political background? Where does he stand on the big problems and issues, locally and nationally?

Will he be a front runner for the Republican presidential nomination in 1968?

Here is the full story of Ronald Reagan, who now is appearing in a new role.

California's Governor-elect Ronald Reagan

In the pre-presidential year of 1967, a rising political star takes over in California—now the most populous State in the nation, with perhaps the most diverse array of social and economic problems.

The new Republican Governor-elect—Ronald Reagan—defeated the heretofore unbeatable Edmund G. ("Pat") Brown in the last election by nearly a million votes, sweeping out of office a "liberal" Democratic regime that had dominated the Golden State for eight years.

In a State where registered Democrats outnumber Republicans 5 to 3, politicians observed that Mr. Reagan's million-vote majority reflects the ballots of Democrats who wanted a change of policy and management in State government.

A legacy of woes. The new Governor, however, inherits formidable problems from the departing Brown regime: a budget deficit estimated on the order of 700 million dollars... the highest volume of crime of any State in the nation... the heaviest burden of State and local taxing and spending... immigration of nearly 300,000 newcomers a year... mounting relief rolls... smog, freeways, housing, jobs, traffic congestion, highway safety, and civil disorders ranging from race riots to student demonstrations to "kooky" cults and "beatnik" orgies.

If Mr. Reagan, as Governor, can make any progress in finding practical solutions for these problems in the next two years, then—automatically—he becomes a figure to be reckoned with in considerations affecting the U.S. Presidency.

Yet the general public—outside of California—knows little about Mr. Reagan, except that he used to be an actor in motion pictures, and that he made what many persons regard as the best television speech of the 1964 presidential campaign for Barry Goldwater.

Thus there is great curiosity: Who is Ronald Reagan? What has he done? What does he stand for? And what is he trying to accomplish?

Mr. Reagan's "success story" is in the typically American

"poor boy makes good" tradition. Ronald Reagan was born on Feb. 6, 1911, at Tampico, Ill. He lived the first half of his life in the Middle West, in Illinois and Iowa. His father—John Edward Reagan—was a shoe salesman. His father's ancestors came from County Cork in Ireland. His mother, Nellie Wilson Reagan, was of Scottish and English descent; from her he received his middle name, Wilson.

Going to high school at Dixon, Ill., Ronald played football and basketball and worked during the summer as a lifeguard

at a resort near Dixon.

With the aid of a scholarship that paid half his tuition, he worked his way through Eureka College, a small school at Eureka, Ill., about 20 miles from Peoria. He waited on table at a fraternity house, coached the swimming team, and was elected president of the student body. Majoring in economics and sociology, he got an A.B. degree in 1932, and won three varsity letters—in football, track, and swimming.

After graduating from college, he worked as a sports announcer for five years for a radio station in Des Moines, Iowa, covering Big Ten football and major-league baseball.

Warner Brothers signed him to a motion-picture contract in 1937. During his film career, he appeared in 50 full-length pictures, including "King's Row," "The Voice of the Turtle," "Dark Victory," "Brother Rat," and "The Girl From Jones Beach." Ronald Reagan usually played the "good guy" in the movies. More recently, he was host on a TV series called "Death Valley Days."

Before World War II, Mr. Reagan was a second lieutenant in the Cavalry Reserve. On the outbreak of war, he was called to active duty and assigned to the U.S. Army Air Corps. He served from April 14, 1942, to Dec. 9, 1945, rising

to the rank of captain.

Early foe of Reds. After the war, Mr. Reagan was elected president of the Screen Actors Guild, and served six one-year terms at various times. He succeeded his friend George Murphy, who is now a Republican Senator from California, as head of the Actors Union. Mr. Reagan used his influence to help prevent a take-over of the motion-picture industry by Communist-dominated unions. In a guest newspaper column, he wrote on July 24, 1947:

"We are violently opposed to indiscriminate Red-baiting, but believe that every union in our country must awaken to the menace of Communist Party members, who are seeking

to destroy our trade unions by boring from within."

In 1949 he was elected president of the Motion Picture Industry Council, representing 35,000 members of nine major acting, labor and management groups.

During the late 1950s and early 1960s, for eight years, he was associated with General Electric Company as a public-affairs official, doing advertising and promotion and making speeches on the free-enterprise system to plant workers and civic groups around the country.

In 1940, early in his Hollywood career, Mr. Reagan married Jane Wyman, an actress. They were divorced in 1948. He was married again in 1952 to Nancy Davis, whose father,

Dr. Loyal Davis, is a neurosurgeon in Chicago.

The Reagans have a modern house in the \$100,000 price range on the Pacific Palisades northwest of Los Angeles, overlooking the ocean. A 300-acre ranch, where he used to raise thoroughbred horses, recently was sold to Twentieth Century-Fox, which owned adjoining property.


The Governor-elect has four children—two by his first wife, two by his second. The older children are Mrs. David Sills, 25, housewife, who lives at Anaheim, Calif., and Michael E. Reagan, 21, a dispatcher for a Los Angeles trucking firm. The younger two are Ronald, Jr., 9, in school at Pacific Palisades, and Patricia, 13, who is in the Orme School in Mayer, Ariz.



Guild, the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists, the Friars' Club in New York, the Lions Club, the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association, and Tau Kappa Epsilon, his college social fraternity. The Reagans attend the Hollywood-Beverly Christian Church, belonging to the same denomination as President Johnson.

Personality and outlook. What is Ronald Reagan like as an individual? He stands 6 feet 1 inch tall, weighs 185 pounds, has blue eyes and brown hair, and is somewhat near-sighted. He does not smoke, but takes a social drink—a vodka martini.

An aide says he reads newspapers, periodicals, "everything he can get his hands on, but he likes political-science stuff—not fiction." He pays attention to editorials and magazine articles. His favorite comic strip is "Peanuts."

"The Washington Post" described Mr. Reagan in a news story on November 13 as a "pleasant" and "sincere" man. "The New York Times" observed on June 9: "He is credited with an alert and precise mind for detail in State programs and budgets."

A close associate said: "He doesn't make snap judgments. He thinks a while before making up his mind." A veteran political operator in the State Capitol at Sacramento called Mr. Reagan "a sincere, dedicated crusader" but "not a vindictive person"—a man who "is good at building on things people can agree on, rather than disagree."

A California newspaper editor commented: "I am impressed with him. He has a good perception of problems and issues. He recognized the need for having good advice, and that is one mark of a good executive. He is still fairly thinskinned, sensitive to public opinion and the press. But I believe he is an honest and highly principled man. As to his executive ability, I just don't know. We will have to wait and see."

From his experience as an actor and a public-affairs spokesman for General Electric, Mr. Reagan acquired stage presence and an effective speaking capacity on television and on the political stump.

Entering the Covernor's office at the age of 55, Ronald

- Four years younger than Governor George Romney of Michigan.
 - Three years younger than President Johnson.
 - The same age as Vice President Hubert Humphrey.
- Two years older than former Vice President Richard Nixon.
 - Fourteen years older than Senator Robert F. Kennedy.

Political evolution. During his adult life, Mr. Reagan has experienced an evolution in his political thinking, and a disillusionment with panaceas offered by doctrinaire "liberals" for dealing with practical problems of the American society and the national economy.

Originally a "New Deal" Democrat, Mr. Reagan voted for President Truman in 1948, and supported former Representative Helen Gahagan Douglas in her unsuccessful bid for the U.S. Senate in 1950 against Richard Nixon.

In 1952, Mr. Reagan became a "Democrat for Eisenhower." He campaigned for Mr. Nixon for President in 1960, and for Governor of California in 1962. He changed his registration from Democratic to Republican in 1962. In the 1964 campaign, he worked for George Murphy for Senator and Barry Goldwater for President. In a dramatic nationwide TV broadcast on Oct. 27, 1964, Mr. Reagan said:

"I have spent most of my life as a Democrat. I recently have seen fit to follow another course. I believe that the issues confronting us cross party lines. . . . I have an uncomfortable feeling that this prosperity isn't something upon which we can base our hopes for the future.

"No nation in history has ever survived a tax burden that reached a third of its national income.

"Today, 37 cents out of every dollar earned in this country is the tax collector's share, and yet our Government continues to spend 17 million dollars a day more than the Government takes in.

"We haven't balanced our budget in 28 out of the last 34 years. We have raised our debt limit three times in the last

This union represents approximately two million drivers and equipment operators nationwide, including about 3,500 in Central Florida.

5. AMERICAN FEDERATION OF TV AND RADIO ARTISTS

No current representation in Orlando. This union represents approximately 67,000 TV and radio performers nationwide, including approximately 900 in the State of Florida.

In recent years, competition between two (2) labor groups intensified as they crossed more and more into each others territories. The IATSE now works on a number of TV shows and NABET has garnered an increasing share of motion pictures. NABET, however, claims that the IATSE is raiding its membership to maintain a monopoly in Florida. Specifically, a recent situation during the production of a non-union TV show in South Florida allegedly documented NABET's claim. In this instance, members of the unions, as well as non-union employees, were working last year on the set of B. L. STRIKER, an ABC series produced in West Palm Beach by BLUE PERIOD PRODUCTIONS, INC.. IATSE decided to organize the show and picketed to get the producer to negotiate a contract. As a result, according to

NABET has indicated that they prefer the State's RIGHT TO WORK LAW clarified so that the producers will know what to expect when they come to Florida. IATSE indicates that the law does not prohibit unions from organizing on a production. not been active in Communist circles but has supported some organizations suspected of being Communist front organizations, such as Russian War Relief; that it has furnished musicians free of charge to such organizations as the Russian War Relief. He further stated that it is one of the sponsors of the Hollywood Canteen and furnished a great deal of the music, and perhaps all of the music, that is given at the Canteen for entertainment purposes. He stated positively that it has not sponsored such organizations as the Hollywood Writers Mobilization for Defense.

Source has stated that Screen Actors Guild is the only labor union in Hollywood which does not function under a charter from an international group affiliated with the A.F. of L. Being the only group of its kind, that is a union of Screen Actors, it exists only in Hollywood and for this reason it functions by a direct charter from the A.F. of L. through the Actors Equity Association.

SCREEN ACTORS GUILD

Source has stated that KENNETH THOMPSON, Executive Secretary of the Screen Actors Guild, performs his duty as Executive Secretary of the Guild and does not take part in any activities outside the needs of the guild as a labor union. He does not object to the Communists functioning in the union, neither does he support them. He has never been referred as a Communist or fellow traveller. JEFF KIBRE in 1939 stated with respect THOMPSON: "THOMPSON is vacillating and cannot be held in line."

Source has stated that the affairs of the Screen Actors Guild are conducted in a different manner from the rest of the unions in the Hollywood motion picture industry. He stated that all matters are in the hands of the elected officers and Board of Directors; that this union does not hold membership meetings regularly; that it has a called meeting when something special is called in order that the membership may vote on some specific question, but he stated that this occurs only on rare occasions and that the only regular meeting is the one which is called once per year for the purpose of electing officers.

Source further stated that due to this arrangement whereas the membership acting as a body can take no action on such affairs, Communist Party members, fellow travellers, and sympathizers among the Hollywood Actors carry on their work through other organizations such as "fronts". They act as individuals without the Official sanction of the union, the Screen Actors Guild.

JAMES CAGNEY Source stated that CAGNEY has contributed large sums of cash to the Communist Party. This feature is being treated elsewhere in this report.

First Vice-Fresident, is very friendly with the C.I.O. and PHIL A. COMMALLY, President of the C.I.O. and Secretary of the L.A.I.U.C. He stated that he considers MURPHY very sympathetic to the Communist cause but that he would not be willing to call him a fellow traveller.

Source further stated that PAUL HARVEY, WALTER ABELL, LUCILLE GLEASON and FORTER HALL have not been active even in any front organizations.

FRANCHOT TONE. Source stated that FRANCHOT TONE has been very active in Communist front organizations, has contributed large sums of money to the Communist Party, and has been very active in matters in which the Communist Party has been involved (W)

RICHARD LaPAN. Source stated that LaPAN in about 1935 or 1936 was the collector for the Communist Party amongst the motion picture people. At that time LaPAN stated that he had collected large sums of money from JALES CACHEY and others in the Screen Actors Guild. He stated that in 1934 LANCING ROSS was Secretary of the Communist Party in Los Angelos County

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and on one occasion he sent a hurried call to Hollywood insisting that IOUIS HEIFETZ see JAMES CAGNEY at once and get \$200.00 as he needed it immediately. A presumption grew from this bit of information that CAGNEY might at any time be subject to-call-for Communist funds. (X) (16)

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CONTUNIES INVILIBATION OF PROJUCTION UNIONS

The studio unions in Hollywood have set up the "Conference of Studio Unions." This includes the following:

1. Studio Painters, Local 644.

2. Screen Office Employees' Guild.

3. Screen Cartoonists' Guild.

4. Ecreen Set Designers' Guild.

5. Laboratory Technicians, Local 633, of the International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees.

6. Studio Machinists, Local 1185, of the International Association of Eachinists.

It will be noted that thirty-one members of the Coreen Office Employees! Guild are in Branches MI and M2 of the Northwest Section of the Communist Party. It will also be noted that nine members of the Ecreen Set Designers! Guild are in Branch Q of the Northwest Section. Twenty-five members of the Laboratory Tachnicians, Local 633, are in Branch R of the Ecrebwest Section.

The President of the Conference of Studio Unions is Herbert K. Sorrell, the business representative of Studio Painters, Local 644. He has long been a member of the Communist Party and is reported to hold a position among the labor groups in Hollywood, comparable to that held by Earry Bridges in the Earltime Unions of the CIO in the State of California.

The Chairman of the Conference of Studio Unions is Horval D. Crutcher, who is also the Secretary-Treasurer of Laboratory Technicians, Local 683. Crutcher is reported to be a very active number of the Communist Party who was recruited into the Party on September 20, 1937, as a number of the Studio Unit of the Industrial Section, which Section has since been abandoned due to reorganizational steps. Crutcher is employed at the Harner Drothers Ctudio and was one of the organizers of the Cinema Post of the American Legion, which was reportedly set up in order to counteract the general policy of the American Legion in its condemnation of Communist propaganda pictures. The Cinema Post expected to obtain a permanent charter from the American Legion in August, 1943 but the American Legion revoked the temperary charter which had been given the post and the organization is now defunct.

The influence of Herbert Forrell extends to the American Federation of Lusicians, Local No. 47, thirty-six members of which are in Branch O of the Northwest Section of the Party.


These branches will for the most part function secretly. However, one branch of people connected with the motion picture indistry who are in a position to function more or less openly will be organized:

Puckner. During 1934 and 1935 Duckner was located in Moscow, Musuia, as a correspondent for the London Daily Mail. He was brought to Hollywood by Marner Erothers in 1933 as a screen writer. Duckner personally selected J. Leyda to act as Technical Director for "Mission to Moscow." Leyda had been in Moscow at the same time as Buckner, where Leyda had been connected with the Bureau of Revolutionary Literature and the Coviet Motion Picture Industry. J. Leyda is known to be a number of the Communist Party of the USA and the Los Angeles Office of the Bureau has a copy of the transfer paper transferring Leyda from New York City to the Mos Angeles, California organization of the Party. Leyda is active in the League of American Writers and lectures at the Mollywood Kriters School, aforementioned. The actual writer of the screen play, "Mission to Moscow" was Erskine Caldwell. Caldwell has been a member of the Losgue of American Writers for many years and has made several trips to the Coviet Union. Caldwell has been an Acsociate Editor of "Coviet Russia Today," published by the Friends of the Soviet

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J. K. (SPIKE) MALLACE is the president and business representative of this organization. The Communist line activities of this union are expressed through its President, who supports the Conference of Studio Unions, which is completely Communist controlled and is under the leadership of HERBERT K. SORRELL, the Communist leader in the labor unions in Hollywood in the motion picture industry. This union passed a resolution about October 1, 1942 demanding that a second front be opened in Western Europe.

WALLACE was a delegate to Labor Unity for Victory Committee meeting, a Communist dominated group, when that organization went on record as supporting the Committee for the Care of Children in War Time, a Communist sponsored group. WALLACE takes a great deal of oredit for the establishment of the Hollywood Canteen, which is controlled from behind the scenes by a group of Communists and fellow travelers in Hollywood.

Screen Actors Guild:

Source A has further informed that all matters relating to this guild are in the hands of the elected officers and Board of Directors and the membership never has a meeting except once a year for the purpose of electing officers. This source stated that JAMES CAGNEY, GEORGE AND FRANCHOT TONE and RICHARD TAPAN actually control and run the affairs of this guild without the official sanction of the guild. This source further stated that CAGNEY is very sympathetic toward the Communist Party and in the past he has contributed large sums of money to the Communist Party and its activities.

GEORGE A. MURPHY is the first vice president of this union.
He is very friendly with PHILIP M. CONNELLY, President of the State CIO.
Secretary of the Los Angeles Industrial Union Council and a member of the
American Newspaper Guild. FRANCHOT TONE has been very active in Communist
front organizations and has contributed large sums of money to the Communist
Party and its activities.

RICHARD LAPAN was at one time, about 1936, the collector for the Communist Party in Los Angeles and Hollywood, and in many other ways has been very active in the Communist Party and the Communist front activities.

There are also the following independent unions in Hollywood which do not have a complete official set up for negotiation purposes. They follow along with HERBERT K. SORRELL, and in a way SORRELL acts as the bargaining agent for those unions for the reason that they have very little influence when acting independently and for themselves.

JOSEPH/STERNAD is a delegate to the Conference of Studio Unions. He is President of the Screen Set Designers Guild and a follower of the Communist Party Line.

GEORGE E. BODLE was the attorney for the Conference of Studio Unions until he was appointed to the War Manpower Commission in the West Coast district. He is a Communist Party line follower and may be a Communist.

LOUIS H. STEIN has succeeded GEORGE E. BODLE as the attorney for the Conference of Studio Unions. He could not have obtained this position without being a Communist or a Communist Party line follower.

Source A further informed that while there are many other unions in the studies, this group is the dynamo. It is the spearhead of Communist influence and for some unaccountable reason seems to be favored by the top structure of the Hollywood industry, that is the producers themselves:

The influence of this group extends to other unions, which, although they are not so completely under communist leadership, do follow the lead of HERBERT K. SORRELL and his group in political activities promoted by the line of the Communist Party. Those unions are as follows:



DETAILS: AT LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA.

Source A has observed the activities of the labor unions in the motion picture industry during the past ninety days and has reported that the Communists are very active within these unions. Following is a short summary of the Communist activities in the motion picture field:

OF HOLLYWOOD MOTION PICTURE INDUSTRY

Source A has stated that as a part of an over-all plan laid down by the Communist Party some ten years ago to take over and control the labor unions in the motion picture industry, with the purpose in view of influencing the production and content of motion pictures favoring Communism and the foreign policy of the Soviet Union, that Party has now been so successful that it dominates and controls the majority of such labor groups in Hollywood. Progress toward this end has been particularly accelerated within the last six months. Taking advantage of the present social and political line of the Communist Party, which is one of an extreme patriotism and all-out prosecution of the war, the Communists in the labor unions, with the assistance of many highly paid writers, actors, and some producers, have been able to take over a sufficient number of key crafts so that they are in virtual control of the labor union groups in the Hollywood studios, and as a consequence of this control are able to dominate matters of employment. This control of employment in those crafts where the Communists have taken over the unions is such that they are able to say who works and who does not work. In addition, this Communist influence is bringing into the studios many known Communists and

fellow travelers from other sections of the country and refugees from foreign countries, placing them in the trade unions and thus strengthening constantly their hold on working crafts of the industry.

At the present time the Communist Party, working through its known members and fellow travelers, has control of the following trade unions in the motion picture industry in Hollywood. It will be noted that the greater number are A.F. of L. unions, some are independent, that is, not affiliated with the A.F. of L.) while the others are affiliated with the A.F. of L. (There are no CIO unions in the Hollywood studios.)

This program, when carried out, will enable Communist influences to dominate the entire Southern California sector of the labor movement. All of these activities are interlocked in such a manner that the cultural fields of activity cooperate with the labor unions. The labor unions support the propaganda of writers and directors. All groups most on the political field and support the political pressure organizations in their campaign to influence legislation.

The combined and coordinated efforts of all these sectors have a tremendous influence on the motion picture industry and have been so successful that Hollywood is being Europeanized to a startling extent.

Source A has informed that this picture is a Samuel Goldwyn production. WILLIM CAMERON HENZIES, associate producer, produced the picture. He is a fellow traveler of the Communist Party. He works in cooperation with the LEAGUE OF AMERICAN WRITERS and is an instructor and lecturer in the HOLLYWOOD WRITERS SCHOOL. Both the League and this school, which is its offspring, are completely dominated by the influence of the Communist Party.

LEWIS MILESTONE directed the picture. He has been active in Communist affairs over a period of ten to twelve years. He was born in Russia. He has been sponsor of and active in a great number of Communist front organizations. He is considered by the Communist Party to be one of its foremost supporters in Hollywood. He made a trip to Russia with LAWRENCE -STALLINGS, author of Red Square." He contributes liberally to the Communist cause and is a constant follower of the Communist Party line. He supported the New Theater League, which was affiliated with the International Union of Revolutionary Theaters, the headquarters of which were in Moscow, Russia. He wrote for the New Theater Magazine in 1937. He was a member of the Executive Board of the MOTION PICTURE SPANISH AID COMMITTEE, a Communist front. He signed the letter of "150" which was in protest against the Moscow purge trials. He is a sponsor of the HOLLYWOOD THEATER ALLIANCE, a Communist organization. He has engaged in many other Communist activities. He is a director of motion pictures and a fellow travelers and may be a member of the Communist Party. He is a member of the Executive Board of the MOTION PICTURE ARTISTS COMMITTEE and a member of the LEAGUE OF AMERICAN WRITERS.

Source B advised on December 27 that an official of the LOS ANGELES WORKERS SCHOOL, which is operated by the Communist Party, was told by ROBERT (BOB) SA ROBINSON, Executive Secretary of the LOS ANGELES WORKERS SCHOOL, that "The North Star" is the most wonderful picture he had ever seen, and that it was the best motion picture the Communist Party had ever sponsored.

He was a member of the THEATER COMMITTEE FOR THE DEFENSE OF THE effairs. He was sponsor for the THEATER COMMITTEE FOR THE FEDERAL SPANISH REPUBLIC. He was a member of the HOLLYWOOD COMMITTEE FOR THE FEDERAL THEATER. He was also a member of the HOLLYWOOD COMMITTEE FOR WRITERS IN COMMITTEE (TAC), also a sponsor of the HOLLYWOOD COMMITTEE FOR WRITERS IN EXILE. He was extremely active in the AMERICAN PEACE MOBILIZATION and all other Communist-controlled groups which opposed entry of the United States into the war up until the time Soviet Russia was attacked, whereupon he reversed his position and became an ultra-patriot.

pashiell Hammett, writer of the screen play, is one of the most fanatical Communists in the so-called cultural division of that movement. She was a sponsor of the HOLLYWOOD THEATER ALLIANCE, also of the FRIENDS OF THE ABRAHAM LINCOLN BRIGADE," in 1939. He was Vice Chairman of the AMERICAN PEACE MOBILIZATION. He was also a member of the HOLLYWOOD ANTI-NAZI LEAGUE and the HOLLYWOOD LEAGUE FOR DEMOCRATIC ACTION.

JAMES WONG-HOWE, cameraman, is a Chinese and long active in Communist affairs. He likewise follows the lead of the Communist Party and has been a member of and sponsor for many Communist fronts. He has a long record of such activity. He lives with SANORA BABB, a member of the Communist Party, who is a member of the MOTION PICTURE COOPERATIVE BUYERS GUILD and a member of the HOLLYWOOD ANTI-NAZI LEAGUE.

section, and all his contacts are with Communists or those close to that Party. He was a sponsor for the reception to MIKHAIL KALATAZOV, Russian film representative, on August 22, 1943, at the Macombo. He also sponsored the LOS ANGELES COUNCIL OF AMERICAN SOVIET FRIENDSHIP.

DUDLEY NICHOLS is the writer of the screen play. He has been active in the Communist causes for many years. He is a member of the LEAGUE OF AMERICAN WRITERS. He sponsored a reading, "Bury the Dead," at the Woman's Club in Hollywood on March 29, 1942. He was very active in the JOHNAREED CLUB and was a member of the SCREEN WRITERS GUILD. The JOHN REED CLUBS were the forerunners of the SCREEN WRITERS GUILD. He was a charter member of the Hollywood Chapter of the LEAGUE OF AMERICAN WRITERS. He has a long record. of Communist activity in the SCREEN WRITERS GUILD and the LENGUE OF AMERICAN WRITERS. He signed the call for the Fourth Writers Congress, which endorsed the AMERICAN PELCE-MOBILIZATION. He was Secretary of the HOLLYWOOD LEAGUE FOR DEMOCRATIC ACTION and was a member of the Executive Board of the MIOTION PICTURE. ARTISTS COMMITTEE, which collected hundreds of thousands of dollars for Loyalist Spain and recruited several thousand young Americans to go to Spain "for the glory of the Communist cause." 

VON CUBE, IRMGARD. According to information in the Los Angeles Office, VON CUBE is an associate of the German Communist sympathizers, such as FRITZ LANG and LEO MITTLER. She is also believed to be an acquaintance of OTTO KATZ, reported Communist leader now in Mexico.

WEISBERG, BRENDA. advised that WEISBERG had been active in the Hollywood Anti-Razi League, the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, and is currently active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee. He described her as a rank-and-file person who had never been a loader in any of these organizations. He did not know if WEISBERG is an actual Party momber.

WEXLEY, JOHN. "Variety" (daily trade publication), November 15, 1944, issue, reflects that WEXLEY had just returned from military service and was assigned by RKO to handle the screen play, "Cornered," for Producer ALLAN SCOTT. According to WEXLEY was a member of Branch A, Group 2, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A., in 1943, and held 1943 membership book #36005 and 1944 CP-USA book #48640. He was given special leave by the Party to go into the United States Army. He made a trip to Europe, and according to dispatches in the "People's World," was in Russia but returned about the first of November 1944 and is now in Hollywood and has been discharged from the United States Army. His wife, known as COOKIE WEXLEY; is a member of Club C, Northwest Section. She is foreign born but was recently naturalized.

V. ACTORS AND ACTRESSES AT RICO

It should be stated here that RKO has no contract "star players," but the studio employs what are known as stock players generally hired for a period of six months, and as a result the players' roster is continually changing.

The "star players," when used in an RKO release, are signed only for the picture and are not regular contract players of RKO. A review of the RKO feature pictures released from January 1, 1942, to date reveals approximately 160 different actors and actresses in leading roles. As of November 1, 1944, RKO had 55 stock players on its roster. There are being listed below the actors and actresses who have taken the leading picture parts produced or released by RKO from January 1, 1942, to date, who have

He is also active in the Actors! Laboratory, alleged Communist actors! Work shop. His wife, DOROTHY BRIDGES, was also a member of Branch F, CP-USA, and is now a member of Branch F, CPA.

DROOKS, JEAN.

advised that JEAN BROOKS was a member of Branch F (Actors), Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A., and held 1943 membership book #48194 and 1944 CP-USA book #48972.

She is also a subscriber to the "People's World." Her husband, DICK BROOKS, a former screen writer, is now reportedly in the United States Army and was on special leave from Club A-3, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A.

ERUCE, VIRGINIA, a motion picture actress, was born in Minnesota, informed that she became active in Communist affairs in 1938, to his personal knowledge; also that she was a member of the Screen Actors Guild. Informant further advised that she was a member of the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League after the Stalin-Hitler pact and was very active in its affairs until it was dissolved. She was a member of the Imergency Committee

of the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League to save that organization, as many deserted the cause of the Stalin-Hitler pact. She was a member of the Motion Picture Democratic Committee and the American Peace Mobilization. She was also a member of the Motion Picture Artists' Committee (Spanish Aid Committee). She is also a sponsor for the Free World Association of Hollywood and is a member of the Executive Council of the Hollywood Democratic Committee. She joined in a telegram by the Hollywood Democratic Committee to the United States Senate Judiciary Committee relating to the poll tax legislation then pending. Proof of membership in the Communist Party is not available.

CARNOVSKY, MORRIS. According to CARNOVSKY and his wife, known professionally as PHOEBE BRAND, were transferred from New York to the Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A., in early 1944, and were assigned to Branch F, Northwest Section. He held 1944 CP-USA membership book #48975 and now holds 1944 CPA membership card #46951, and is attached to Branch F, Northwest Section.

CARRADINE, JOHN. According to CARRADINE was active in the Committee of Foreign Agricultural Workers and contributed money to this organization, which this informant described as a Communist controlled organization. He knew of no other activity of a Communist nature in which CARRADINE had participated, stating he believed CARRADINE was neither a Communist nor a Communist sympathizer, and his activity in this committee was because of his sympathetic interest in the particular group involved. CARRADINE, it is to be noted, is a Shakespearean actor.

He was active in the 1944 Musicians Congress, reportedly organized and controlled by the Communists, and has contributed to various other Communist sponsored rallies in a musical way. He has lent his name to many front organization rallies, is a member of the Joint Anti-Pascist Refugee Committee, and spoke at the Philharmonic Auditorium for the Joint Anti-Pascist Refugee Committee. He is a product of the Actors' Laboratory, reported Communist work shop, and is currently active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee.

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DE HAVILLAND, OLIVIA is a motion picture actress, born in Japan.

Inship is unknown. Her citizenship is unknown. knowledge she began showing sympathy for the Communist cause in Hollywood in 1942, and since that time has taken an active part in various Communist front activities, such as the Hollywood Committee for Writers in Exile, Free People's Dinner honoring PAUL ROBESON, attended the reception at the Soviet Vice Consulate in 1942 in Los Angeles, which was attended by many Communists. is a sponsor for the Joint Anti-Fascist Réfugee Committee. She signed the protest which was sent to the State Department protesting the detention of JESUS HERNANDES TOWAS, Spanish Communist held by the Immigration authorities at Seattle, Washington, in 1943. She attended the celebration of the 26th anniversary of the Russian Revolution. She also attended the reception in honor of MIKHAIL KALATOZOV, Soviet motion picture representative, at the Mocambo Cafe on August 22, 1943. She is sponsor for the Los Angeles Council for American Soviet Friendship, a member of and active in the Russian American Club in Hollywood, a sponsor of the Free World Association of Hollywood, a member of the Executive Council of the Hollywood Democratic Committee, and is very active in that organization. She was prohibited, along with ORSON WELLES and REX INGRAM, from making a speech during the Los Angeles Street Railway strike in August 1944, on the grounds that "they were too red."

DEL RIO, DOLORES. According to DEL RIO, a Mexican actress, was involved in the Salinas, California, strike in 1934 or 1935, along with ELLA WINTER, notorious cultural Communist. Informant stated that he believed DEL RIO was just duped into lending financial aid to this strike because of the Mexican laborers involved, and he knew of no other instances of activity by DEL RIO indicating any Communist sympathy.

GARFIELD, JOHN, alias JACOB GARFINKEL.

fas informed that GARFIELD is a citizen and had his name officially changed to JOHN GARFIELD. He is a screen actor and a member of the Screen Actors' Guild. He has been very active in Communist front activities, to his personal knowledge, for the past six or seven years, and he teaches at the Hollywood Writers' School. Informant further advised that he is a sponsor for or active in the following Communist front groups: Hollywood Committee for Writers in Exile, Hollywood Anti-Nazi League, New Theater League, Hollywood League for Democratic Action, Russian War Relief, Hollywood Canteen, Hollywood Democratic Committee; also he was a sponsor for the reception to MIKHAIL KALATOZOV, Soviet film director, at the Mocambo Cafe on August 12, 1943. Informant further advised that GARFIELD returned about May 1 from the Italian front, where he had been on an entertainment tour. At this time GARFIELD gave out the information that he had interviewed "TITO" while over there and eulogized

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
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COMMUNIST PENETRATION INTO MOTION PICTURES AT HOLLYWOOD THROUGH ODD ESTABLISHED UNIONS ON THE PART OF JEFF KIBRE WHO SOUGHT INSTRUCTIONS FROM NATIONAL COMMUNIST PARTY FUNCTIONARIES

JOHN L. LEECH in 1934, Organizational Secretary, Los Angeles County Communist Party gave testimony before the Los Angeles County Grand Jury on August 14, 1940, and stated that JEFF KIBRE was a member of the Communist Party in Hollywood in 1934. JOHN L. LEECH stated that one JOHN E. JEFFREY, a Communist member, had first introduced JEFF KIBRE to him.

JOHN L. LEECH stated that V. J. JEROME (VICTOR J. JEROME -- true name ISAAC ROMAINE) was sent to Hollywood the latter part of 1935 by the Communist Party Central Committee, New York to improve cultural work, taking over these duties from STANLEY IAWRENCE. LEECH states that V. J. JEROME helped organize study clubs and co-ordinated party work between Hollywood and Downtown Communist Sections. LEECH stated that V.J. JEROME raised money in Hollywood and also brought JOHN HOWARD LAWSON to Hollywood (JOHN HOWARD LAWSON is presently a writer at Hollywood and hereinafter wild be more fully identified). LEECH stated that V.J. JEROME was a member of the Central Committee of the National Communist Party and a co-editor of its monthly Communist magazine known as "The Communist". In January, 1939, issue of "The Communist" the editors are listed as EARL BROWDER, ALEX BITTLEMAN, and V.J. JEROME. "The Communist" when discontinued was supplanted by a monthly magazine known as "Political Affairs". Its editor is listed as MAC WEISS, also known as MAX WEISS with V.J. JEROME as managing editor. MAC WEISS will later be identified in connection with JEFF KIBRE.

JOHN L. LEECH stated V.J. JEROME had the aid of JEFF KIBRE in setting up plans for capturing the Hollywood Motion Picture Industry for the Communist Party. LEECH states that after V.J. JEROME arrived in Hollywood the latter part of 1935 plans were made to establish an underground Communist Unit among the film elite. All dues and contributions as well as reports were to go direct to Mational Communist Party Headquarters in New York according to LEECH.

Confidential Source T-12 states that during 1935 and subsequent years all important personages in the Hollywood Motion Picture Industry who were members of the Communist Farty were considered as Members At Large, attached either to the New York Headquarters Section or to the Headquarters Section of District 13 at San Francisco (At that time Los Angeles County Communist Party was a subsection of District 13 according to Source T-12)

The Communist Branches and Sections were later reorganized in Holly-wood about 1942 according to Source T-12 by the formation of a section known as Northwest Section and Source T-12 states that until this time (1942), the Los Angeles County Communist Forty had no jurisdiction over important Communists in Hollywood but did have prior to this time a few street Units in Hollywood whose members were employed in nominal capacities in the studios. The Communist Party organization of the Northwest Section and the identity of its Communist members will be considered in another part of this report.

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one portion it states this process envisages the formation of a Federation as the decisive method of breaking the control of the Internationals (I.A.T.S.E.) and in turn giving the workers a sense of their mass power within the industry.

This JEFF KIBRE report further states "Our Corps of Contacts" in the various crafts led by the Studio Painters Union from the outside broke down the Do-Nothing policy of the leader-ship." (HERBERT SORRELL, President of the Studio Painters Union, now engaged in strike at Hollywood is also president of the newly formed group known as "Conference of Studio Unions". Some of the Unions attached to this group are presently on strike). The I.A.T.S.E. Union, the A.F.L. Teamsters and the Screen Actors' Guild were never apart of JEFF KIBRE's Studio Unemployment Conference. JEFF KIBRE in his report states that the Brioss in the Studio Unemployment Conference were:

JEFF KIBRE states that a formation of a new Federation is a stage toward an industrial union affiliated with CIO. It is noted that JEFF KIBRE signed this report as Field Representative for Hollywood and indicated that his title and activities were to be kept confidential.

B. Exhibit No. 2 of the I.A.T.S.E. report is a JEFF KIBRE letter to BOB REED, 136 W. 13th Street, New York, dated February 9, 1938. JEFF KIBRE writes, "Well, one thing about the Reds, they seldom write except on business." In this letter JEFF KIBRE states that he is "Undercover Field Representative for CIO in Hollywood". JEFF KIBRE states, "In the meantime I wish you would discuss the matter of "I.A." (I.A.T.S.E.) action with JACK STACHEL, the necessity of my getting in touch with contacts in the various cities. I have taken it up with PAUL CLINE, but he feels a personal appeal by you or V.J. (V.J. JEROME), rather than communication through official channels

PROGRESSIVE CITIZENS OF AMERICA

According to Source T-1, the Southern California Chapter of the Progressive Citizens of America was organized on February 11, 1947 when two previously active clubs-The National Citizens Political Action Committee and the Hollywood Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions-were combined. A leaflet, which was distributed in Los Angeles prior to February 11, 1947, announced that a meeting would be held on that date at the Embassy Auditorium in Los Angeles for the purpose of organizing the Progressive Citizens of America in Southern California. The leaflet urged the Progressive Citizens of America "to organize the brass tacks of politics in every precinct and in every Assembly District !-- to organize every profession, talent, skill, craft, occupation—to fight for a program of peace, prosperity, and freedom in one world." The leaflet announced that JOE DAVIDSON, National Chairman of the PCA, would be the principal speaker and included as other active participants in the meeting ROBERT KENNY, DR. LINUS PAULING, GENE KELLY, and CAREY MC WILLIAMS. This leaflet listed the address of the Progressive Citizens of America as being 1515 Cross Roads of the World, Hollywood, 28, California. (W)

Source T-103 reported that EUWARD MOSK acted as Chairman of the organizational meeting of the Progressive Citizens of America which was held in Los Angeles on February 11, 1947. MOSK outlined the purpose of the meeting and introduced DR. LINUS PAULING. According to Source T-103, PAULING discussed the production of atomic energy and the atomic bomb and its significance to world government. Source T-103 stated that JOHN CROINELL, retiring Chairman of HICCASP, commented regarding the consolidation of the two organizations which are to form the Progressive Citizens of America, after which JOE DAVIDSON, National PCA Co-Chairman, explained the purposes of the new organization. Following DaVIDSON's remarks, election for Directors of the new PCA Chapter ensued. As a result of this election, one hundred Directors were chosen and ROBERT W. KENNY, former Attorney General of California, was elected Chairman. Vice Chairmen elected were ELWARD MOSK, HOWARD EOCH, DR. LINUS PAULING, LENA HORNE, SENIEL GETROW and GENE KELLY, and Mrs. WILLIAM DIETERLE, Secretary.

Of the one hundred Directors elected, the following individuals are known to the Los Angeles Field Division to be members of the Communist Party:



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LOREN MILLER—Source T-12 advised that LOREN MILLER, a Negro attorney in Los Angeles, was affiliated with the Communist Party in 1937 and held Communist Party book number 75393. According to this source, MILLER's Party name was LAURENCE ROSSMORE. MILLER is affiliated with the Lawyers Guild but has not been active in the Communist Party for several years.

ADRIAN SCOTT- According to Source T-2, ADRIAN SCOTT, who is a motion picture producer in Hollywood, California, was affiliated with the Northwest Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party on August 31, 1944, January 8 and 16, 1945, February 26, 1945 and November 19, 1945, Paccording to a review of the Selective Service file of ADRIAN SCOTT at Local B oard #246, 450 North Crescent Drive, Beverly Hills, California, it is shown that he was born on February 6, 1911 at Arlington, New Jersey. During 1942 SCOTT was employed as a writer by RKO Studios in Hollywood, California and was an alternate member of the Board of Directors of the Screen Writers Guild. SCOTT attended Mercersberg Academy for one year and later attended Amherst College for four

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SCREEN ACTORS GUILD

On April 10, 1917, Special Agents RICHARD D. AUERBACH and FRED G. DUPUIS interviewed RONALD REAGAN and his wife, JANE WYMAN, at their home, 9537 Cordell Avenue, Hollywood, California. REAGAN is President of the Screen Actors Guild and his wife has been active in the Guild and regularly attends the Guild meetings. They had requested that they be interviewed by Bureau Agents in order that they might furnish information regarding the activities of some members of the Guild who they suspected were carrying on Communist Party work.

REAGAN advised that the Screen Actors Guild had twelve officers, and that the work of the Guild is carried on principally through the Executive Board composed of the twelve officers plus past presidents. REAGAN and JAME WYMAN advised for the past several months they have observed during Guild meetings there are two "cliques" of members, one headed by ANNE REVERE and another by KAREW MORLEY which on all questions of policy that confront the Guild, follow the Communist Party line. REAGAN stated REVERE and MORLEY do not appear to be particularly close, but whenever an occasion arises necessitating the appointment of some member to a committee or to an office, the two "cliques" invariably either nominate or support the same individual. JANE WYMAN mentioned that while she had no factual information on which to base her conclusion, she had gained the definite impression that MORLEY and REVERE, during Guild meetings, were carrying out instructions and policies provided them prior to coming to the meeting, and that on many occasions, the arguments these two presented simply did not appear to have originated with them. RONALD REAGAN also pointed out that REVERE and MORLEY headed the faction within the Guild which agitated to have the Guild leadership nominate the Screen Actors Guild to support the recent strike in the Motion Picture Industry, which was called by the Conference of Studio Unions.

REAGAN and WYMAN listed the following actors and actresses as supporting REVERE and MORLEY:

REAGAN and his wife also mentioned that LARRY PARKS has also supported this group on several occasions.

REAGAN also advised that recently an actor by the name of LLOYD GOUGH, who appeared to be a particularly close friend of KAREN MORLEY's, has been regularly attending the Guild meetings and very vociferously supporting ANNE REVERE and KAREN MORLEY. He said GOUGH has recently been named chairman of a "clique" within the Guild which calls itself the "Combined Actors Committee." According to REAGAN, this committee includes in its membership the element of the Guild which he and his wife generally consider to be the radicals, and the group apparently meets separately prior to the Guild meetings and agrees upon the policy it will follow at the Guild meetings on the business and questions that are to come up.

Informants T-3 and T-5 have furnished information to establish the Communist Party membership of LLOYD GOUGH as of May, 1947.

Informant T-2 has furnished the names of 71 Communist Party members who are listed as actors or actresses by the Party and of this number, 54 have been verified through the Guild as/members, 42 of which are in current status. This verification was made on July 31, 1947, by Special Agent FRED G. DUPUIS through the assistance of JOHN DALES, JR., Executive Secretary of the Screen Actors Guild. Mr. DALES advised that the Guild has approximately 8,500 members.

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The following 42 persons, currently in good standing with the Screen Actors Guild, are known to be members of the Hollywood Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party.

COUNCIL OF HULLYWOOD GUILDS AND UNIONS

I. HISTORICAL SKETCH


A. EVENTS LEADING TO FORMATION

The above organization was formed originally as the "Emergency Committee of the Hollywood Guilds and Unions" to combat the so-called "Fascist Motion Picture Alliance for the Preservation of American. Ideals" and held its first meeting on Wednesday, June 28, 1944 at 8:00 P.M. at the Women's Club of Hollywood, 7078 Hollywood Boulevard. The announcement of this meeting was first published as a full page advertisement in the June 23, 1944 issue of the HOLLYWOOD REPORTER and was signed by the Emergency Committee, Hollywood Guilds and Unions. purpose of the meeting as stated in the announcement, a copy of which is in the office of the Los Angeles Division, was "representatives of 17 guilds and unions of the motion picture industry....coming together to set up a constructive program for the Hollywood Guilds and Unions during and after the war, and to take action to protect industry and its workers from anti-labor, semi-fascist attacks". The original announcement further stated that "in the latter connection, the meeting will consider the recent activities and statements of spokesmen for the "Motion Picture Alliance for the Preservation of American Ideals", which latter organization had contended that there is "widespread impression that this industry is made up of an dominated by Communist radicals and crackpots", having declared itself at the time of its earlier formation in February, 1944 in sharp revolt against a rising tide of Communism, Fascism, and kindred beliefs",

"The Motion Picture Alliance for the Preservation of American Ideals" hereinafter will be referred to as the MPA.

The MPA in a Statement of Principles, a copy of which is on file in the Los Angeles Division, had previously declared a belief and a fondness for the American way of life; the freedom to speak, think, live, watch, work, and govern as individual free men in sharp revolt against Communism, Fascism, and kindred beliefs that sought by subversive means to undermine and change the American way of life.

Indicative of the concern of certain elements within the motion picture industry over the formation of the MPA is the activity engaged

an official of one of the Unions within the motion picture industry. information was furnished by Source T-96 on July 24, 1947.

On January 20, 1947, Source T-97 stated that then there were seven unions affiliated with the Conference of Studio Unions which belonged to the Council and that there were two I.A.T.S.E. locals, two independent unions, and one A.F.L. Union, which comprised the membership of the Council at that time. These were:

Source T-97 stated that the Council had lost mainly because of difficulties over the current film strike, The Screen Actors Guild, The Screen Office Employees Guild, a Musicians Local #47, to which all musicians in the motion picture industry beonged. (W)

III. ESTIMATE OF FUNCTION OF COUNCIL OF HOLLYWOOD GUILDS AND UNIONS

Source T-96 stated that the Council has the support of all "left-wing, radical elements within the labor movement". Source, who himself is a labor union official, stated on July 24, 1947 that this "radical element packed the first meeting of the Council and took control". Source expressed the opinion that the council was "strictly Communist dominated" and that although the Council was relatively "dormant" at the present time, it must still be regarded as a "force in the radical labor wing and will probably spring out soon in support of the third party movement ()

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

Informant said that such political utterances as made by HUMPHREY BOGART, who was described as "an alcoholic bum," likewise did not do the motion picture industry any good.

In speaking of DOHE SCHARY, T-1 said that SCHARY was "told in no uncertain terms to carry out the policies of the Board of Directors of RKO or else submit his resignation". Informant continued that the attitude taken by the directors of both FOX and RKO left no doubt as to where the stockholders of these organizations stand. They wanted the Communists discharged and at once. This permits the studio heads to adopt the stand that they themselves "are employees like anyone else and have been told to carry out orders".

With WANCER, as pointed out above, L. B. MAYER stood up and said. "For the first time in my life I am forced to disagree with my old friend, CECIL Demille". MAYER then went on in the meeting saying, "If you could have seen how they treated me CECIL," speaking of the Un-American Committee. MAYER went on to defend to some extent WANCER's criticism of the Un-American Committee and its methods of procedure. In any event, the informant said that GEORGE STEVENS, who had had a couple of drinks before the meeting, finally reason behind the producers action to eliminate Communists from the industry. STEVENS asked, "Are you taking this action for economic reasons or for patriotism?" MAYER replied that the action was taken for economic reasons.

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This remark of MAYER's caused consternation, and the Directors Guild, which had taken a positive stand the night before, fell that much of the good which the Producers Committee could hope to do was automatically nullified by MAYER's statement.

The unions present at this meeting were: Screen Directors Guild, Screen Actors Guild, and Screen Writers Guild. After recess was declared these organizations broke up into separate units to discuss the matter of cooperating with the producers and eliminating Communists. A certain member of the Actors Guild passed a note to the informant on which he had written, "What now?".

WALTER WANGER took the floor immediately after MAYER's statement referred to above, and said that economic and patriotic reasons were one and the same; that American motion pictures are the emissaries of the American way of life, and that if they are not good and the box office does not reflect approval of the pictures they naturally will not be successful and will not be sent abroad. Thus, the American message would not be seen by the people whom it should reach.

However, in the opinion of

WANGER's apology

"was too late. The damage had been done".

Both EDDIE MANNIX and HENRY CINSBERG attempted to follow up WANGER's talk and take the sting out of what MAYER had said, but, in the opinion of the informant and other members of the Directors Guild with whom he discussed the matter, nothing could ever be done to erase the impression L. E. MAYER created.

The entire purpose of this meeting was a desire on the part of the producers to be sure that the guilds would support their position in expelling Communists. In the course of the discussions, JOE SCHENK made the remark from the floor, "I don't hate them like CECTL DEMTLLE hates them, but I don't like Communists". Informant said that DeMILLE immediately got to his feet and challenged SCHENK's statement, saying that it was impossible not to adopt a positive stand; that it simply boiled down to whether or not a man was for America or against it, and that there is no middle ground.

As a result of this meeting it was agreed to form a Committee, each guild to be represented by two members who would report back to their own guild the joint actions taken by the group. In this manner each guild would be kept informed at all times as to steps taken by the producers in controlling Communism and expelling its adherents.

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In speaking of the meeting referred to above, wherein nished the following report which had been drawn up by an informant who attended the meeting:

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"IT was appalled at the lack of honest attempt to get rid of the Communists. Felt it opened everyone's eyes to the producers' attitude, so short sighted. Actors' group had been in the mood to take it on the chin if need be for a while until the Guild had been cleaned up—but with the producers' liberal stand, everything the right group on the Actors' Board had accomplished has been undone. There is a strong leftist group on the Actors' Board so the other side has full representation at every meeting, to keep them under control—they openly particular quarrel with the others on the Board—their job is to object and keep any action from being taken.

DORE SHARY has not turned over a new leave; he is in bad with the bankers and directors of RKO and is trying to pacify them and yet keep faith with his liberals—believe SHARY would re-employ the men in a minute if he could do so. Big relief on everyone's part when DeMILLE straightened out what McCAREY wanted to say. Big lesson to learn from his method; Don't argue but listen and then get up and clearly make your stand. I felt the whole meeting last night would have dissolved into the producers' hands if DeMILLE hadn't been there.

WANGER came out more in the open than usual last night. He is a bad

"Before DeMILLE arrived WANGER and the crowd were tearing at the

"I think MAYER as Chairman for the producers a very bad choice—no one to balance his actions. Can't the JOHNSTON office put some better men on the committee. They had to do it in the ACTORS' GUILD to over-

"HARRY COHN could not go last might and asked later how it went. He was told that 'our hero, Mr. DeMILIE' came in at the crucial moment."

COHN said, 'He always does; C. B. always crashes through when you need him.

"A distinct feeling of the leftists feeling they were not as whipped as they thought they were the night before by both the DIRECTORS!

In speaking of this Guila, T-8 said that there is a movement going on at Disney Studios to more or less take over the Cartoonists' Guild inasmuch as workers in that studio had banded together, realizing that they constitute the largest single group within the Guild.

The Screen Actors' Guild

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

advised the following information:

The Screen Actors' Guild appears to be waging a successful fight to keep out radical actors and actresses from executive positions. She said that there were a few, however, who mysteriously seemed to remain in positions of prominence within the organization, which enabled the radical group to bring about discord. Some of the radical actors and actresses identified as possible Communists were HOWARD DEASTLYA. LLOYD COFF, LARRY PARKS, ALEXANDER KNOX, KAREN SORIEY, HULE CRONYN, and ANNEXEVERE.

Theorem Actors' Guild appears to be waging a successful actors and to radical members out of controlling positions.

Informant's attention was attracted to JANE STRUDWICK, also known as JANE SHEPPARD, wife of JOHN SHEPPARD, actor. STRUDWICK had the reputation of being very influential behind the scenes in directing Communist policy for various organizations in Hollywood, particularly in American Veterans' Committee, Beverly Hills Post. Informant subsequently identified STRUDWICK as being identical with JANE SEAD, a person whom she knew during the early part of World War II when MEAD was actively engaged in raising funds for the Russian War Relief. MEAD was at that time allegedly raising \$175,000 for this relief organization at a Shrine Auditorium gathering during the early part of the war. MEAD has always been suspected of being a Communist but there was no documentary proof available to informant. The belief was based primarily upon the associations of LEAD, who is known to be close to HOWARD da SILVA and HERBERT BIBERNAW, et al., in the Hollywood left wing circles.

It was thought that JANE STRUDWICK, nee LEAD, now being married to an actor, might be one of the persons behind the scenes manipulating communistic activity in the Screen Actors' Guild. One thing of possible interest to the FBI concerning JANE STRUDWICK, according to informant, is that the former specifically claims to be associated with the British Ministry of Information, commonly referred to as the "BMI." STRUDWICK is known to be a contact of numerous British visitors to Hollywood, particularly the theatrical group, which informant thinks are Communists or Communist fellow travelers. It is not known whether STRUDWICK is actually employed by or is merely working with the BMI.



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Of the individuals mentioned by informant above, the following are known to this office as members of the Communist Party:

HOVARD DASILVA
LARRY PARKS
TAREN MOBLEY
ANNE BEVERE
HERBEST BIBERMAN
TLOYD GOFF
JANE LEAD

Concerning STERLINGARAYDEN, informant discussed recent press releases given to HAYDEN's alleged social contact with a daughter of a prominent Tashington, D. C. family, at which time he was supposed to indoctrinate the girl with his Communist philosophy. Informant said that even though HAYDEN denied this accusation in the Hollywood trade press, the story must be true as HAYDEN had handed out similar "lines" in Hollywood.

Informant mentioned that WAFFICH YOUPKINS, a close friend of HAYDEN and a personal acquaintance of informant, had recently expressed apprehension over HAYDEN's being subpoensed before the House Committee as it was felt HAYDEN might "break," and if he did he would spill enough information "to hang us all, "including "a lot of high Government officials.", Informant is of the opinion that both HAYDEN and TOMPKINS are members of the Communist Party, but he has no documentary proof.

CONF. INPUT TOMPKINS has been identified as a member of the Communist Party by in 1944 at Sausalito, Marin County, California, and by in Lest Los Angeles in 1947.

has been the purpose of which allegedly is to "purge" the motion picture industry of Communist Party members, which committee was an outgrowth of the WHOMAS Committee hearings in Washington and the subsequent meeting of motion picture producers in New York City:

With regard to the hearings in Washington, T-10 stated that he somewhat regretted the "whole affair" because he did not feel the hearings were conducted in the most desirable manner possible. He also felt that the questioning of the unfriendly witnesses could have been better planned and designed to bring out more pertinent information. He was of the opinion the men should have been allowed to make any statement they cared

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to make, with a possible limitation as to its length, because he felt in this way these men would have condemned themselves in the eyes of the American public far more efficiently than the Committee was able to do.

One incident which lessened his respect for the Committee involved the Committee's Chief Investigator, SIRIBLING. T-10 advised that the night before he was scheduled to testify, STRIBLING came to his hotel room and asked him numerous questions, some of which led T-10 into a "pretty good defense of the motion picture industry", although by no means a defense of the Communist element therein. However, the following day when he was on the stand STRIBLING failed to ask him any of these questions which would have enabled him to get in a good word for the motion picture industry as a whole.

try to formulate a policy for eliminating Communists from the motion picture industry, T-10 stated that his opinion (and he was confident that it was also the opinion of the Executive Board of the Screen Actors Guild) was that such a program was not sound. He stated he did not feel it was within the authority or ability of any single man or group of men within the motion picture industry to be able to determine accurately and fairly who should be fired and who should not be fired. He made the statement, "Do they expect us to constitute ourselves as a little FBI of our own and determine just who is a Commie and who isn't?".

He stated that in the Screen Actors Guild, for instance, he is virtually positive in his own mind that certain members are members of the Communist Party, but he definitely would not be able to prove this conclusively, and he felt this situation was equally true in the other guilds, and also in the studio as a whole.

should declare, first of all, by statute, that the Communist Party is not a legal Party, but is a foreign-inspired conspiracy. Secondly, Congress should define what organizations are Communist-controlled so that membership therein could be construed as an indication of disloyalty, He felt that lacking such a definitive stand on the part of the Government it would be very difficult for any committee of motion picture people to conduct any type of cleaning of their own household.

With regard to the Screen actors Guild, there has been no unusual difficulty at guild meetings with the Communist element, However, the provisions of the TAFT-HARFLEY Law did create an issue, in that ANNE REVERE, the Guild's treasurer, recently resigned rather than sign a

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non-Communist affidavit. He also stated that the recently concluded elections, which resulted in LARRY PARKS and ANNE VIRE being elected members of the Executive Foard, may create a similar issue-inasmuch as these individuals will also be required to sign non-Communist affidavits. However, this has not yet materialized.

D. Screen Writers Guild

On December 15, 1947, a meeting was called of the Screen Writers Guild, where the members of that organization were to discuss cooperating with the Producers Committee concerning some stand on the employment of Communists within the industry.

On December 14, 1947, BILLIE DAVENPORT, mother-inlaw of screen writer WALDO SALT, told Informant T-11 that WALDO had just
advised her that his option had not been taken up at RKO, and that he would be
out of a job after finishing the script for the coming picture. "Ivanhoe".

She stated that DONE SCHARY, executive producer at RKO, talked to WALDO for
more than an hour and a half, and had explained to him that RKO's action was
not for political reasons but because it had been necessary to cut down.

According to BILLIE DAVENFORT, WALDO was not taken in by this talk and was
certain in his own mind that DONE had been told to get rid of him.

In a humorous vein she mentioned that DORE SCHARY receives a salary of \$8000 a week, so WALDO was quite flattered that SCHARY should spend a full hour and a half talking to him about the matter.

On the same date, WALDO SALT advised Informant T-12 that he was reminding a few people of the Guild meeting scheduled for Monday night, December 15, 1947, inasmuch as he did not want the Screen Writers Guild to have the same difficulty the Screen Directors Guild encountered at its meeting. On this occasion WALDO stated he had conferred with DORE SCHALY, and that SCHARY was really frightened. He stated SCHARY wanted to secure everyone's opinion and was urging them not to criticise the producers, and assuring people this matter of firing and blacklisting would happen only to the five so far involved.

SALT stated SCHARY explained his change of attitude from a month ago to him by remarking, "Back in 1938 we had the worst mudding of our waters, 'peace in our time,' and I think the producers just say 'peace in our time'". SALT told informant he could not help but agree that SCHARY's stand was his only way out.

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COMMUNIST INFILTRATION INTO THE LEGITIMATE THEATER

Actors Equity Association

Confidential Informant T-12, of known reliability, advised that at present within actors Equity there is a jurisdictional fight going on. He stated that something had to be done concerning television due to the fact that talent in the television industry was being paid poor salaries. According to the informant, television producers take the other side and believe that if a price scale is put into effect it will inhibit the development of television. The Equity membership at the present time is trying to sell an equal scale to the member unions, but it is being opposed by the "left element" according to the informant. That element wants a high scale placed on shows and by so doing hope to do away with television entirely. The informant further pointed out that it is impossible to have the full membership of Equity present when important matters are placed for a vote, but he stated the "left element" always maintains a very large contingent who veto important matters put up by the conservatives.

T-12 went on to state that they are trying to reach a compromise by setting up a television authority known as TVA. He added that a card in any one of the entertainment unions will entitle an individual to employment in TVA. It is planned that a governing board will be selected from each of the unions and at the end of two years it is further planned that a national congress will be assembled, at which time it will be decided whether to continue or discontinue TVA.

With regard to the jurisdictional dispute, the informant stated that Equity claims jurisdiction because actors are involved. The American Federation of Radio Artists claims jurisdiction because the program goes over the air. The American Guild of Variety Artists claims jurisdiction because a variety show is placed on television. The American Guild of Music Artists claim jurisdiction because music is involved. The Actors Guild, as well as the Screen Extras Guild, claim jurisdiction in view of the fact that actors and actresses are used on television shows. It was learned that the Screen Actors Guild refuses to accept TVA because that organization is afraid of being out-voted by the Eastern unions who have more members on their boards. The Screen Actors Guild maintains that it is in a better position to negotiate contracts due to the fact that it has contracts with every studio producing films and they want control of all television on film.



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According to the informant it is important that <u>TVA</u> be formulated quickly as at present there is 82% unemployment in Equity. He also stated that <u>American Federation of Radio Artists</u> has had a drop in employment because there are very few new radio programs being invented and constantly radio programs are being dropped. He added that unless <u>TVA</u> is accepted producers will put on the lowest shows obtainable. Therefore there will be little if any financial interest for actors and actresses. The informant feels that if TVA is not accepted it will mean the collapse of the entire theatrical profession.

At present the Screen Actors Guild and the representative unions are endeavoring to compromise. T-12 said that the "left element" in the East Coast unions set up TVA as a sorry compromise. He feels that it is the aim of the East Coast "leftists" to integrate all organizations within one union. He pointed out that there are a number of "leftists" within the Screen Actors Guild. According to the informant there are few Communist sympathizers in the East Coast union; however, with the large majority that are on the coast, he pointed out that if the unions were combined the Communists would have full control.

The informant went on to state that the conservatives in Actors Equity were lackadaisical and unfortunately most of the council meetings are attended by Communist sympathizers.

F. XScreen Actors Guild


The publication, "Variety", of March 21, 1951, reported that the Board of Directors of the Screen Actors Guild had notified GALE SONDERGAMO, in answer to a letter from her concerning her subpoens for appearance before the House Committee on Un-American Activities, that while it "will fight against any secret blacklist created by any group of employees," it would not attempt to force the hiring of any actors whose "actions outside of union activities have so offended American public opinion that he has made himself unsalable at the box office." It was further reported that the Screen Actors Guild letter to SONDERGARD indicated that her attacks of the House Committee hearings as an "inquisition" was "typical Communist Party line" and that "we recognize its obvious purpose of attempting to smear the hearings in advance and to create disrespect for the American form of government ("U)

II. *Communist Infiltration of Intellectual and Entertainment Groups

A American National Theatre and Academy

On September 18, 1950 Confidential Informant T-14, of unknown reliability, reported that ANTA came into existence in 1935 through a national charter from Congress. Its aims included the establishment of a national theatre throughout the country. Its headquarters are located at 139 West 45th Street, New York City. XANTA claims to represent the entire American theatre, and is active in sponsoring various benefits and regional projects, as well as radio and television shows. Its goal is the establishment of a theatre in every state of the union. It is also active in the little community theatre movement and the college theatre movement, it being active in the drama departments of approximately 500 colleges throughout the United States. In addition, it is international in scope

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D. "They Came to a City" (Play)

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of known reliability, reported that on December 27, 1950, he had witnessed a play, "They Came to a City", which was presented by the Yiddish Theatre Ensemble at the Barbizon Plaza Theatre in New York City. The informant described this play as Communist propaganda in that it glorified Communism and denounced the American way of life. According to the informant, the play takes place at a junction of several roads, and all the members of the cast meet there, at which point they do not know where to go, when suddenly a gate opens and they see a city, after which one by one they enter that city, wherein Communism is a way of life. The informant furnished a program of the play, which reflected it was written by J. B. PRIESTLEY and directed by PAULYMANN. It is noted that Confidential Informant T-27, of known reliability reported on November 24, 1950, during the time he was active in the Cultural Section of the Communist Party in New York, from 1944 to 1946, he knew PAUL MANN as a member of that Section of the Party.

In addition, the program indicated that the scenery suggestions were by RALPH ALSWANG, who, according to information furnished by Confidential Informant T-1 on February 24, 1949, is a scenic designer and among the group in the entertainment field who have had a number of Communist front connections.

IV. Investigation of Communist Activities in the Motion Picture Industry by the House Committee on Un-American Activities

The New York "World Telegram and Sun" of January 12, 1951, reported that on that date, Representative FRANCIS E. WALTER, a member of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, had proposed a renewed Congressional inquiry into any Communist influence in Hollywood, which inquiry should be expanded to include the entire entertainment world. Representative WALTER was reported to have said he wanted to clear entertainment personalities unjustly accused of Communist sympathies, as well as to expose any who are "Reds". The article referred to

The "Daily Worker" of April 10, 1951, page 11, column 1, contained another article by DAVID PLATT, which was captioned, "Where Are the Big Stars Who Once Opposed the Un-Americans?" In this article, PLATT asks as to where were all the famous Hollywood stars who attacked the first hearings of the House Committee in 1947, and asked as to why they were silent about the "attacks" on HOWARD DA SILVA, GALE SONDERGAARD, WALDO SALT, PAUL JARRICO and tho others whose cases were coming up in the following week. PLATT wanted to know why ROBERT YOUNG did not speak up, and pointed out that three years previous, YOUNG had been critical of the House Committee for its "witch hunt". addition, PLATT wanted to know why MYRNATOY did not lift her voice as she had in 1947 when she stated that "we question the right of Congress to ask any man what he thinks on political issues ... In addition, PLATT referred to a statement made by LUCILLE BALL in 1947 that "all of us agree that the Constitution of the United States must be defended ... ", and wanted to know why LUCILLE BALL was silent today. PLATT further referred to the statement made by FREDRIC MARCH in 1947, wherein he was critical of the House Committee, and wanted to know why he did not make such a statement today. The article further mentioned the names of FRANK SINATAA, RICHARD CONTE, JOSEPH COTTEN, GENE XKELLY, MARGARETXSULLAVAN, WILLIAM WYLER, BURTX CANCASTER, ROBERTATION and CORNEL WILDE, all of whom had once made etrong statements against the House Committee. The article also criticized GREGORYAPECK for failing to speak up at this time, particularly in view of the fact that three years previous he had been critical of the House Committee hearings

The New York "Times" of April 11, 1951, reported that on April 10, 1951, STERLING HAYDEN, the motion picture actor, testified before the House Committee that he had been a member of the Communist Party from June to December of 1946. In his testimony, HAYDEN stated he had joined the Party at the request of BELAWINTERS, a secretary at his booking agency, and that after he had quit the Party, the one who had tried to persuade him to return was KAREN MORLEY, the film actress. He claimed that he knew the complete name of only one other individual in his "cell" and that was ROBERT LEES, the Hollywood writer. He further testified that

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one of his assignments while with the Party was to try to line up members of the Screen Actors Guild behind the strike of artisans, but claimed he made little, if any, progress because the Guild was under the management of RONALD H. REAGAN, "a one man battalion against anything Communistic."

COMPIDERIOR

The official transcript of testimony before the House Committee on April 11, 1951, reflects that MARTIN.

POPPER appeared before the Committee on that day as attorney for J. EDWARD BROMBERG. It is here noted that POPPER has been described by Confidential Informant T-20 as "concealed Communist". It is also noted that on August 4, 1950, Confidential Informant T-28 reported that J. EDWARD BROMBERG was a motion picture and stage actor, who was a member of the Communist Party in Hollywood, but was now located in New York City. Confidential Informant T-30, of known reliability, reported on October 18, 1950, that BROMBERG was at present a member of the Board of Directors of People's Drama, Inc., which organization has been previously identified.

MARTIN POPPER, in appearing before the House Committee on April 11, 1951, made application to have the subpoena for BROMBERG vacated on the ground of his serious physical condition in that he was suffering from a rheumatic heart disease. The Committee agreed to make further investigation and would undertake to designate some physician to check up as to BROMBERG

The New York "Times" of April 12, 1951, reported that on April 11, 1951, WILL GEER, stage and screen actor, and ROBERT LEES, screen writer, refused to tell the House Committee whether they were or had ever been Communists, their refusals being based on grounds of possible self-incrimination. The article mentioned that WILL GEER acknowledged that HAROLDAWARE, who had been identified by WHITTAKER CHAMBERS as the leader of the Communist cell, was the uncle of his wife, but claimed that he had never met WARE. He also stated that Mother ELLA REEVENBLOOR, a Communist Party leader, was the grandmother of his wife. The article further reported that ROBERT LEES testified that the Committee had

"destroyed" his Hollywood writing career, and it was pointed out that LEES had been identified as a Communist Party member on a preceding day by STERLING HAYDEN in his testimony. The article also mentioned that the Committee Counsel read the numbers of three Communist Party cards, which he said that LEES held from 1943 through 1945, but LEES refused to discuss the matter.

Concerning WILL GEER mentioned above, it is noted that Confidential Informant T-6 reported on February 1, 1951, that he knew him to have been a member of the Communist Party, and concerning ROBERT LEES mentioned above, it is noted that Confidential Informant T-28 has reported that LEES had been a member of the Communist Party in Hollywood for a number of years and probably still was such a member.

The New York "Times" of April 13, 1951, reported that on April 12, 1951, RICHARD J-COLLINS, motion picture writer. testified before the House Committee, at which time he identified a number of his former Hollywood associates as having been members of the Communist Party with him in They included BUDDASCHULBERG author; the last decade. ROBERT ROSSEN; producer; FRANK TUTTLE A director; and RING XLARDNER FIR., screen writer. Other writers cited by COLLINS, who said that he had joined the Party in 1938 and continued therewith until 1947, as having also been members of the Communist Party were PAUL JARRICO, GORDON, KAHN, LEWALDO SALT, ABEXPOLONSKI, MARTIN, BERKLEY, LEONARDOX BERCOVICI, LEONARDOX BER PAULINE LAUBER FINN FELIZABETH GLENN CHARLES GLENN CAL JOHN BRIGHT CEHe also identified former actor, HERBERT BALCHE, and his wife, NORMATHALLGREN Pas having been members of the Communist Party. COLLINS further testified that V. J. JEROME had been head of the Communist cultural activities in Hollywood, and that MADELEINE AUTHVEN and CARL WINTER had been organizers. COLLINS told the Committee that he did not know the present status of those he had named as Party members. He further testified that Communist writers made few, if any, attempts to inject Party line matter into motion pictures, but that there was some influence in racial matters. He also testified that among the higher paid personnel, it was customary, in addition to requiring dues,



to make special assessments which ran about four per cent of the salary after the payment of the customary agent's fee. These assessments and dues went to the Party. COI COLLINS contended that the Communist element had largely been eliminated from the Screen Writers Guild before he left the Party, and he estimated that about 25 per cent of the Communists in Hollywood during the time he was a member, had broken with the Party either completely or as active members.

The "Daily Worker" of April 13, 1951, page 11, column 1, contained a column entitled, "Why are They Silent Today?", which was written by DAVID PLATT. In this column PLATT mentioned that during 1947, when the House Committee hearings were being held, the Screen Writers Guild and the Screen Directors Guild had issued a joint resolution wherein they resolved to defend the "reputation of the industry in which we work against attack by the House Committee on Un-American Activities ...". The article pointed out that subsequently the Committee for the First Amendment was formed, which represented a broad cross section of Hollywood and many national leaders in the cultural field. Within 48 hours after its founding early in October of 1947, writer, GORDON KAHN, in his book, "Hollywood on Trial", issued a public statement to the effect that the signers of that statement were "disgusted and outraged by the continuing attempt by the House Committee on Un-American Activities to smear the motion picture industry ... ". The article claimed that this statement was signed by virtually every important personality in films, literature and in public life, including four United States Senators. The article also mentioned that before the film personalities representing the Committee for the First amendment left Washington, they presented a petition for "redress of grievances" to the Clerk of the House of Representatives, in which it was charged that the investigative function of the House Committee on Un-American Activities had been "perverted from fair and impartial procedures to unfair, partial and prejudiced methods." T-2 recalled that CARLISLE, a writer in the film industry in Hollywood during the 1940's, was regarded as an important member of the Communist Party and one who was the teacher of a number of Communist schools for new members.

CARLISLE was given a standing ovation when he was introduced as the speaker at the meeting. He told some stories about alleged incidents at Terminal Island, where he along with others had been held by the Immigration authorities. He related an alleged incident about a Chinese alien being beaten senseless and placed in a straitjacket because of his resistance to being deported to Formosa. He told of a South American who risked being placed in solitary confinement for talking to CARLISLE. CARLISLE charged that most of the individuals held for deportation were being deported for offenses which were not considered deportable offenses at the time they were committed. He thanked everyone present for their work and support in his behalf and urged them to continue. He maintained that the Justice Department was trying to link criminals with subversives as being one and the same.

COMMUNIST INFILTRATION IN HOLLYWOOD GUILDS AND UNIONS

According to the estimate of T-2 and T-11, the influence of the Communist elements in the Hollywood guilds and unions and in Hollywood labor generally at the present time is negligible.

Screen Actors Guild (SAG)

T-12 advised that in the past sixty days the members of the SAG adopted by an overwhelming majority a new bylaw prohibiting any member of the Communist Party from joining the SAG. The vote favoring the bylaw was 3,769, with 152 opposed. According to T-12, this was one of the largest votes ever cast in the history of the SAG.

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The new bylaw reads as follows:

"No person who is a member of the Communist Party or of any other organization seeking to overthrow the government of the United States by force and violence shall be eligible for membership in the Screen Actors Guild.

"The application for Guild membership shall contain the following statement to be signed by the applicant:


"'I am not now and will not become a member of the Communist Party nor of any other organization that seeks to overthrow the government of the United States by force and violence.'"

Screen Directors Guild (SDG,)

According to T-13, an applicant for membership in the SDG was requested to execute a loyalty oath to the effect that the applicant is "not now a member of the Communist Party." This loyalty provision was invoked in 1950 after a bitter struggle between the Executive Board members of SDG and SDG's president. The Board had originally recommended that the loyalty oath be much more extensive and should include a statement to the effect that the applicant "is not now nor ever has been a member of the Communist Party." However, the recommendation of the SDG board was defeated by the general membership and the loyalty oath limited to the wording as noted above.

American Federation of Television and Radio Artists (AFTRA)

T-14 advised that with regard to the position of AFTRA on the subject of the Communist Party, it should be noted that in recent months the AFTRA membership passed a resolution that "Any member of the Los Angeles local of AFTRA who is asked by the Un-American Activities Committee of the U.S. House of Representatives or by any other duly constituted committee of the Congress of the United States to state whether or not he is or ever has been a member of the Communist Party is hereby



Screen Actors Guild's board of directors unanimously rejected overtures from American Federation of Television and Radio ATISTS for a merger for a number of Teasons, one of them being a strong belief that "AFTRA spokesmen and publications have made clear that AFTRA policy is to promote five to at the expease of two motion pictures," prexy Walter

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Pidgeon of SAG stated vesterday in a "white paper" sent the mem-

SAG at the same time denounced AFTRA for seeking jurisdiction in DuMont Electronicam, terming this an "invasion" of the Guild's jurisdiction. SAG contended that had it "succumbed to AFTRA's arguments and pressures years ago, in all probability there would be little employment for actors in twinotion pictures today." The Guild described AFTRA's attitude to ward vidfilms as "inequitable," and said it would "adversely affect" the thousands of actors currently working in telepix and teleplurbs under SAG contracts.

Vidfilms provide at least 50% of the total employment of actors in the film field, and thesis in twoix are receiving over \$1,000,000 a year in residual checks, while others are receiving millions of dollars animally in payments for teleblurbs, the Guild stated.

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




